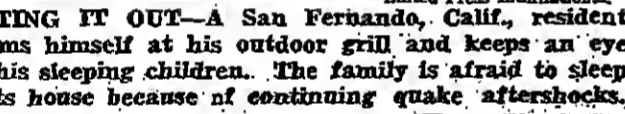

Manson Girl Immits Killing's Attacker

Prosecution Reportedly Aided to Slay Hippie

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 11 (Reuters)—Susan Atkins, who has confessed she killed Jim Starlin, told a court here today that she stabbed musician Hinman five or six times someone had to pull me off."

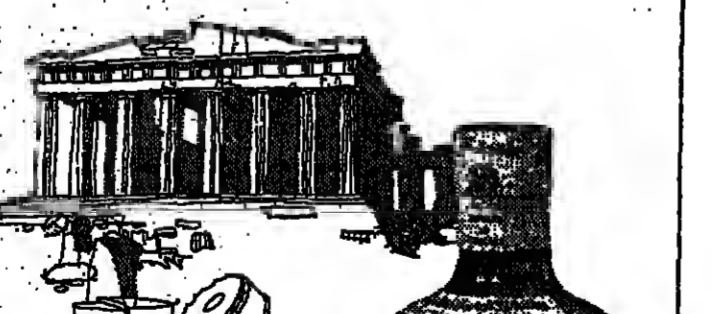
Two Yugoslavs, in Sweden, Free Hostages in Consulate

GOTHENBURG, Sweden, Feb. 11 (AP)—Two armed Croats, who had occupied the Yugoslav Consulate here for 24 hours, surrendered to police today without harming the three hostages they had threatened to kill.

The surrender came after police, who surrounded the building, talked the young gunmen into giving up through night-long telephone conversations. The Croats, Ivan Vuicovic, 23, and Blago Mirkovic, 24, walked out of the consulate a half hour after the 9 a.m. deadline they set for killing the Yugoslav hostages if the Yugoslav government did not free Miljenko Ericac, 23, another Croat sentenced to death in Belgrade for ferry bombings, and put him on a plane to Spain with \$100,000. The Yugoslav government refused.

The three hostages, shaken and pale, walked out unscathed after their ordeal. The young gunmen, allegedly members of the outlawed Ustashi movement which seeks independence for the Croatian zone of Yugoslavia, occupied the consulate yesterday morning. At least 40 policemen were sent to the consulate yesterday after the Swedish government ordered the occupation treated as an ordinary crime rather than a delicate diplomatic incident. Two policemen entered the consulate office shortly before the surrender.

Police in Calabria Scatter Demonstrators Who Defy Ban

REGGIO CALABRIA, Italy, Feb. 11 (Reuters)—Riot police used fire hoses, baton charges and tear gas grenades today to disperse 1,000 demonstrators who defied an Interior Ministry order banning all street demonstrations here.

The clashes quickly developed into running street battles with crowds of youths hurling gasoline bombs and stones at police and trying to erect street barricades. The outbreak occurred only two days after Reggio ended a 19-day general strike—the longest in its seven-month battle to be named capital of the Calabria region—following a call by the city's "Action Committee" for a protest demonstration today.

French Miners Back at Work In Many Areas

PARIS, Feb. 11 (Reuters)—The week-old French coal miners' strike began to crumble today, despite a general strike call yesterday by two powerful unions.

Management sources reported that about 65 percent of the miners showed up for work in the northeastern Lorraine basin, with a similar turnout in the Nord-Pas-de-Calais region. Unions representing more than one half the miners signed agreements with the government yesterday. Only the Fauquemont mine, center-point of the dispute over threatened future closures, remained idle for the seventh straight day.

The Fauquemont miners today lifted their occupation of some management offices in Merlebach, but continued their sit-in at another administrative building.

De Gaulle Relative, Ex-Aide Leave Party

PARIS, Feb. 11.—Two of Gen. de Gaulle's most faithful followers resigned unexpectedly from the Gaullist party today, unable to accept any more Gaullism under his successors.

Jacques Vendroux, 73, Gen. de Gaulle's brother-in-law and a deputy from Pas-de-Calais, and Christian Fouchet, 59, former interior and education minister, resigned to protest a partial reconciliation between the party and former Gaullist Jacques Soustelle. But their discontent clearly ran much deeper.

The resignations, limited as they were, were given significance by the importance of the principals. It is generally expected that Jacques-Philippe Vendroux, deputy from St. Pierre et Miquelon, who is Jacques Vendroux's son and Gen. de Gaulle's nephew, will follow suit.

Leaders of the opposition immediately described the resignations as the beginning of the splintering of Gaullism that they long have predicted would come when Gen. de Gaulle was gone. Francois Mitterrand, who is busy trying to reform the Socialist left, called it the first of Gaullism's "inevitable internal crises." Gaullist party leader Rene Tomassini said he "regretted" the resignations but said he did not think there would be more defections. Politically, it resembled the faux pas last year of Roger Souciol, Gaullist deputy from Nancy, who resigned his seat to protest a government highway decision. In a special election, Mr. Souciol soundly beaten by Jean-Jacques Servan-Schreiber, launching a political career the Gaullists prefer not to talk about.

'The Perfectibility of Man Is All That We Have to Sustain Us...'

WHO'S got the revolution?

When Christopher Jencks and David Riesman published the first of a projected two-volume study of American colleges and universities three years ago, they called it "The Academic Revolution."

of revolution were more liberating than a change of emphasis. They rediscovered Paul Goodman, calling for an end to formal education as such, and a return to the apprentice system.

Goodman even disapproved of the teaching of English: "Society is increasingly taken to be a kind of machine directed by a central will, and in this structure the teaching of English is turned into social engineering."

this continuum cannot survive in the classroom unless there is reality of encounter between the adults and the children. The teachers must be themselves, and not play roles. They must teach the children, and not teach 'subjects.'

Credos Basically Romantic

Joseph L. Featherstone went to England for The New Republic, and returned with a superb series of articles on allowing children to teach themselves "subjects" or relationships the way they taught themselves their native language.

Save our souls. With the possible, but not probable, exception of Silberman, the new prophets are romantics. They believe in the perfectibility of man. They see the schools—or at least education—as an agency of moral uplift and social change, perhaps because schools on every level are more vulnerable to

pressure than any other institution in our society, but more likely because the notion of a child being perfected corresponds so closely to the romantic dream of man, the perfectible.

And he had tried. Once upon a time, "they" had scared him, and his moment of fear had been therapeutic. In the emotional disability of confrontation, he had discovered things about himself—presumptions, indifferences—not altogether admirable.

He is right and he is wrong. He is right, because students—aged 8 or 18—weren't born knowing everything, only gradually to forget it the older they grow. He is wrong because the romantic notion of the perfectibility of man is really all we have to sustain us, however illusory it may prove to be.

The fox then proceeded to explain the advantages of certain rites, rituals and times of appearance that help in this delicate civilizing process, but which again arouse human impatience so that they are derided beligerently in colleges all over the land.

We have much to learn from the fox. It will take many ages to achieve the full taming of everyone but it is the most profound enterprise man has ever launched. It involves also the taming of nations, who are only enlarged men.

Man began his domestication unconsciously when he used words and spoke across the generations. This is what he sought when he kept his children about him and no longer drove them away into the forest. But the children, too, partook of the taming.

Taming, which is true civilization, has nothing to do with the New, or with E. It has only to do with growing. If the taming fails, then so does man, and man will be responsible forever just as the fox advised the prince.

BRIDGE By Alan Truscott

A majority of top-ranking experts and a substantial number of tournament enthusiasts use "limit jump raises."

In this style, three spades in response to one spade is an invitation to reach game rather than a guarantee. A problem is thereby created when the responder has good support for the opener's suit and the values for opening bid himself—a hand suitable for a traditional forcing jump raise.

A popular solution is to use a three no-trump response conventionally to show this type of hand. This conventional response was used by North in the diagrammed deal.

After the three no-trump response, South would normally bid four spades, ending the auction. The four-heart bid showed a side-suit and implied slam ambitions. North judged his controls good enough to raise the hearts and then continue to six spades when his partner signaled out in five spades, West doubled.

The declarer was immediately in control when West led the club king.

The king was captured by the ace, and a heart was discarded. A loser-on-loser play was then made: The club jack was led and another heart was discarded. West won with the queen, and shifted to a trump.

South won with the spade ace in dummy, and discarded her heart queen on the club ten. This paved the way for the development of a heart trick in dummy, thus removing the necessity to finesse in diamonds.

A heart was led to the ace and a low trump was led to dummy's eight. A heart was

ruffed and dummy's spade nine was used as another entry to permit a second heart ruff. This established the heart ten as a winner, and it provided a discard for the diamond queen, with the spade king available as the final entry.

It will be said—in fact I have already heard it said—that "Michael Douglas's" novel "Dealing" is a new breed of book—a unique excursion into Head Country, into the hearts and minds of America's spaced-out youth. And that it's strictly for the hipsters, because its heroes turn on and its villains are marijuana, speed, narcotics and other squares. But I wonder.

Admittedly, the novel has all the scales of Puff the Magic Dragon. Its hero and narrator is a semidropout who earns money in his spare time taking bundles of cash from Boston to Berkeley and running back bricks of Mexico's finest. It is filled with inside news and terminology. (A "brick" for instance, is two pounds or so of compacted, space-saving, easily portable marijuana.) When its plot stumbles, or time must be lapsed, it blows out insights on righteous highs; on why the "nerds" waste America's time, money and moral nerve chasing small-time grass-dealers instead of the big bad "hard-core" mobsters; on why parents just don't understand; and on other artifacts of youthfunk. "Dealing" is all the rage.

And admittedly, it is entertaining—sleek and cool and savvy. It races along as smoothly as a Flexible Flyer on snow. Michael Crickton—who is half its author and half its protagonist for "The Andromeda Strain" and "Five Patients"—has brought to it all the plot-splinting tricks he presumably picked up writing mysteries under the name of phume Jeffrey Hudson and John Lange. And whatever Douglas Crickton, his younger brother Ognce ("Michael Douglas"), contributed, it hasn't hurt.

But I wonder all the same if "Dealing" is really a drug-bure book, because if you stop and think about it, it's as square as a carton of booze. After all, when the going gets rough and the plot sticky, the characters blow the smoke away and act as tough, vindictive and reasonable as Dogie in the "A." O.K., so it doesn't matter that much. So "Dealing" was only meant to be fun—heads and Wards instead of Cops and Robbers. Let's just not pretend it's anything more. And let's say Head who digs it realize he's caught in the old, old game of power.

If you're seriously concerned with drugs (as who isn't these days, one way or the other), read Peter Marin's and Allan Y. Cohen's "Understanding Drug Use: An Adult's Guide to Drugs and the Young." The title may sound like the just one more of

those timely projects dreamed up by bored editors for the Monday-morning coffee wagon; but this one is special—very much worth putting on the bookshelf for future reference and even more worth reading now.

It's worth saving for consultation because it's filled with crucial information—a bibliography, a list of films on the subject of drug problems, a glossary, as well as 40 pages of specific information that clears up confusing terminology and places the hard evidence on harmful effects in perspective. For instance, cocaine is pharmacologically classified as a "stimulant" rather than a narcotic. For instance, marijuana is only one form of Cannabis, and a relatively benign one at that, whose dangers have been grossly exaggerated, the authors believe, but are still not to be trifled with.

The book is even more worth reading because Marin and Cohen acknowledge the present generation's pushing any panic buttons, and at the same time examine it as a reflection of our society without raising angry fists or dragging in devil theories.

Adolescents simply must explore new territories of experience, the authors contend—must undergo "rites of passage" into adulthood. But sensitive societies once formally legitimized, but that we today recoil from with hollow-eyed stares and rigid systems. Since children find outer space cold and unyielding—devoid of the potential wonder that they sense within themselves—they turn to inner space; and, emboldened by their drug.

Does this foretell the end of Western Civilization? Marin and Cohen ask. No, it simply demands more flexibility from parents, more honesty, more trust, more sympathy, more intelligence. And family discussions, respect for children's privacy, a willingness to admit faults and change routines. And community programs, revised concepts of education, disposal of information on drugs and their effects, counseling on the law, and educational films and books. In other words, Mr. Marin and Mr. Cohen—the one a poet and educator, the other a psychologist and disillusioned disciple of Timothy Leary and Richard Alpert—rein in the apocalypse and show it all down to baby tracks and concrete programs. And in the process communicate a wonderful sense that we are dealing with something human and manageable.

This is an unusual book, the best I have seen in an overcrowded field—a rare blend of vision and practicality.

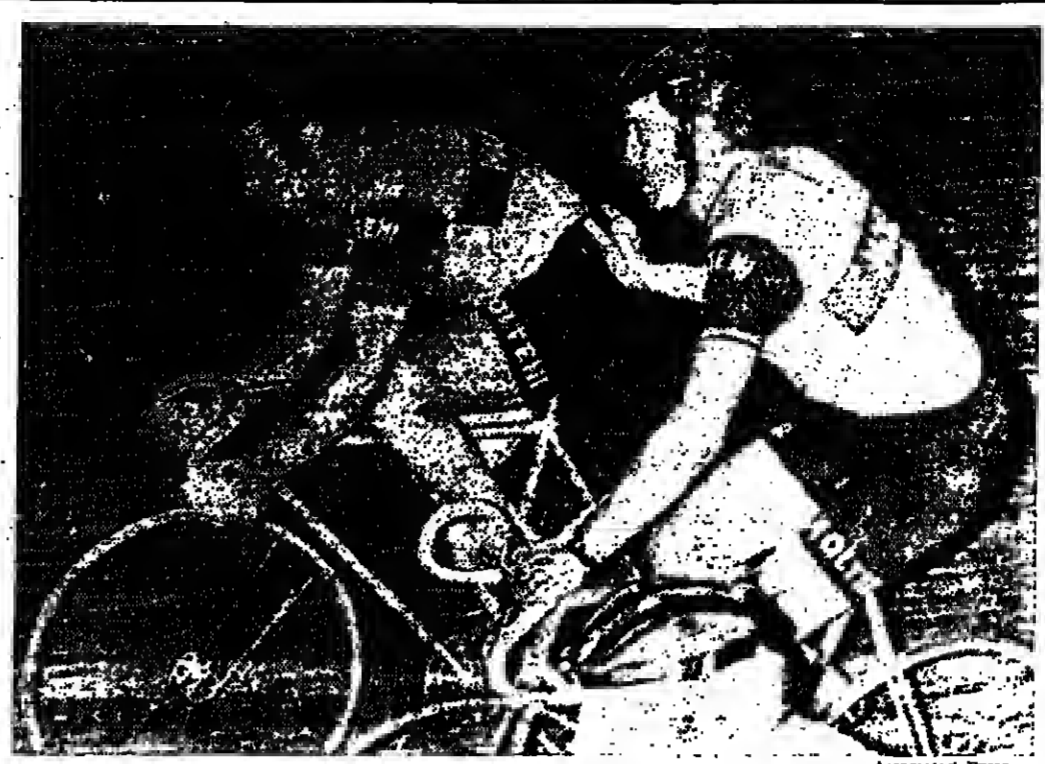

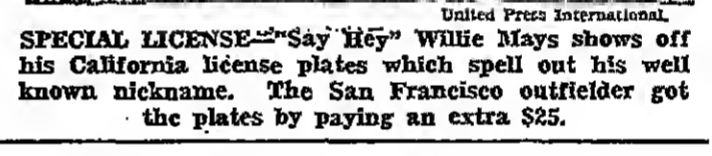

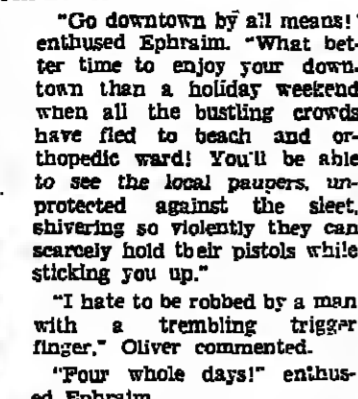
