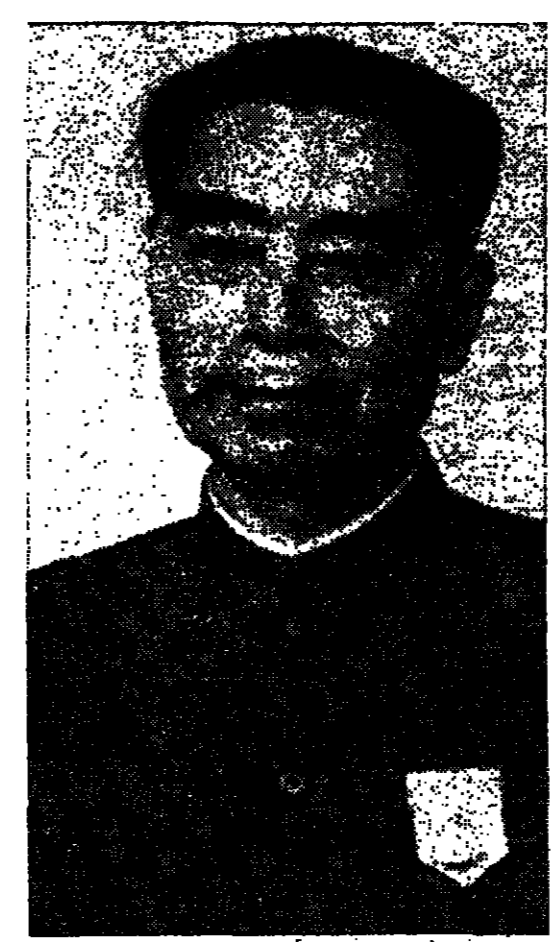

21 Years of Hostility Weigh Heavily on Nixon's China Trip

NEW YORK, July 16 (UPI).—President Nixon, in his "journey for peace" to Peking, will seek to break down a great wall of hostility that has for 21 years separated the United States from Communist China. His task will not be an easy one.

There was nothing in the summit announcement made by the President last night to suggest that his emissary Henry A. Kissinger had made any significant progress in the solution of the monumental problems dividing the two countries. Indeed, the agreement to meet before a time as late as May, 1972, suggests that both sides anticipate intensive exchanges to lay the groundwork for the summit meeting.

The great issue before the two leaders is not the war in Vietnam, although the meeting is likely to speed U.S. withdrawal from Indochina. In Peking, Chinese officials seem to take it for granted that it is only a matter of time until U.S. troops are out of the area.
