'Fourth Party' A Possibility For McCarthy Friends Summoned To New York Meeting

WASHINGTON, July 23 (WP)—Former Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy summoned close friends and political associates to a six-hour meeting in New York Wednesday and told them that he was seriously considering announcing his candidacy for President by early October.

Participants in the meeting say that they expect Mr. McCarthy to enter the contest as a Democrat, run "a national campaign" and enter many of his party's primaries, including California and New York.

Conflict Between Art, Design

NICE (AFP)—Antoni Clavé, born in Barcelona 57 years ago, made himself a reputation as an illustrator and a stage designer before deciding, in 1954, to give all that up and devote himself to painting.

Clavé's work reveals a permanent conflict or tension between the artistic intensity he wants to achieve and the strong decorative talent and inclination that he cannot quite subdue.

Many of his works are, for this reason, "merely" aesthetic. Here and there, in two paintings set side by side we can see both inclinations made manifest.

Clavé is a man of great good taste, with a sense of color and a sense of proportion. He has the ability to produce a strong, sumptuous and decorative tapestry-collage. But his taste can be a problem because he often cannot help deferring to it when it suggests a decorative solution to an artistic problem.

Jean Kwiatkowski, who died this year at the age of 84, belonged to that species and sometimes suspect breed of painters one calls naïf, and the city of Nice is exhibiting some 80 of his works at the Galerie des Pochettes, 77 Quai des Etats-Unis to Aug. 29.

The Art Market: English Porcelains Come Into Their Own

ONDON, July 23 (NYT)—British porcelain, judged by the sale Tuesday at Sotheby's, has come into its own at last.

Another figure was put forward triumphantly, \$4,800 for a "Chinaman" (i.e., shaped as a historical) tea jar, 8 3/4 inches high, in Chelsea white porcelain—a world record for a single piece of English porcelain.

3 Claimants Seek Possession of El Greco Found in N.Y.

NEW YORK, July 23 (NYT)—Three claimants are seeking possession of a painting by El Greco stolen from a mansion in Madrid during the Spanish Civil War and recovered here by the Federal Bureau of Investigation last month.

The conflicting claims were revealed in a suit filed in Manhattan Federal Court by U.S. Attorney Whitney North Seymour Jr., asking the court to determine the painting's ownership.

The canvas, slightly more than 22 inches by 43 inches and valued at \$1 million by the FBI, was the artist's final sketch for "The Immaculate Conception," an altar

painting more than 10 feet high now owned by the Museo de Santa Cruz, Toledo, Spain.

At about the time of its recovery the painting was identified as the property of an elderly widow, Mrs. Manuela Fagalde de Selgas of Madrid, two other claimants have stepped forward. They are two sisters, acting as a party, Mrs. Manuela Fagalde Herce and Mrs. Carmen Fagalde Herce, also of Madrid, and Mrs. Eva Dumont, also known as Mrs. Eva McMillan, whose place of residence was not disclosed.

The paintings, now in a government vault, was voluntarily surrendered to the FBI by a Manhattan jeweler, Lee Rumsdorf, who said he was acting as agent for Mrs. Dumont. It had been the object of an FBI search since 1968 at the request of the Spanish government, which cited it as a "national treasure."

In its suit asking the court to determine ownership, the government said that it was "unable to ascertain the true, legal and rightful owner of the El Greco, and may be subject to liability by delivering it to a person other than its rightful owner."

It also asked that, pending outcome of the litigation, the painting be "given to a museum or other proper custodian" for public exhibition, "as an alternative to concealing it from public view."

LISBON, July 23 (AP)—Two paintings signed "El Greco" discovered in an old church 125 kilometers east of Lisbon in Estremoz, are being studied by art experts here to determine if they are genuine.

The paintings, on wood, were found behind an 18th-century Italian canvas by workmen restoring the walls of St. Mary of the Castles Church. One "El Greco" shows the assumption of the Virgin Mary; the other, her coronation.

THE KINGS OF VAIN INTENT. By Graham Shelby, Weybright and Talley. 307 pp. \$6.95. Reviewed by Thomas Lask

THE theme of Graham Shelby's historical fiction is found in its title. For although the book is a chronicle, expertly put together, of the Third Crusade, of Richard the Lion-Hearted's endeavors in the Holy Land and of the battles between Saracens and Christians, the idea it really expresses and illustrates is the way the ruling lords of Palestine, Europeans all, postured and jockeyed for power and wrestled with each other to the top of the greasy pole.

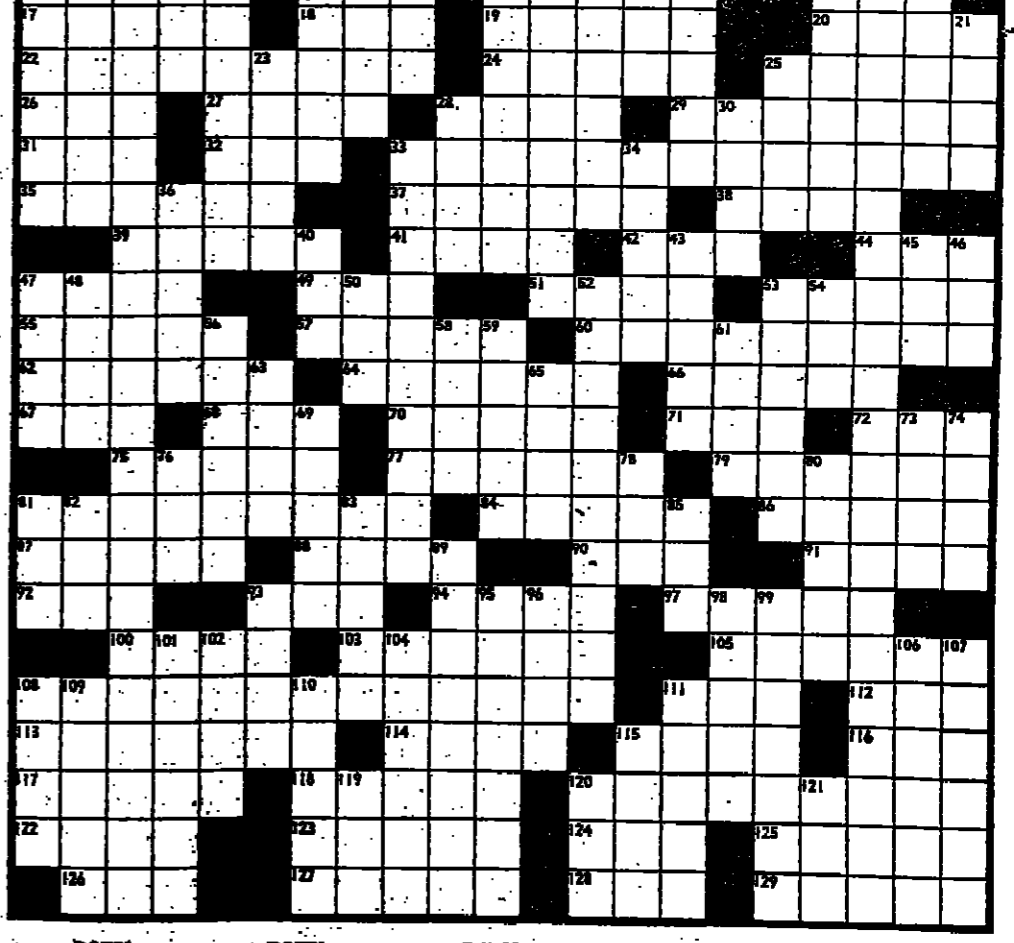
Under the banner of a religious cause, these knights and their followers acted as they would have back home. Worse if possible. They came to carve out fiefdoms for themselves and kidded each other that they were serving God in the process. They measured out kingdoms they wanted to govern, subjects they wished to tax. They were as touchy of precedent, honors and standing as if they had remained in their own boundaries. The allegiance of vassal knight and sworn retainer was to their immediate chief and not to the grand design. When a powerful prince died or departed the Holy Land, their men drifted away. 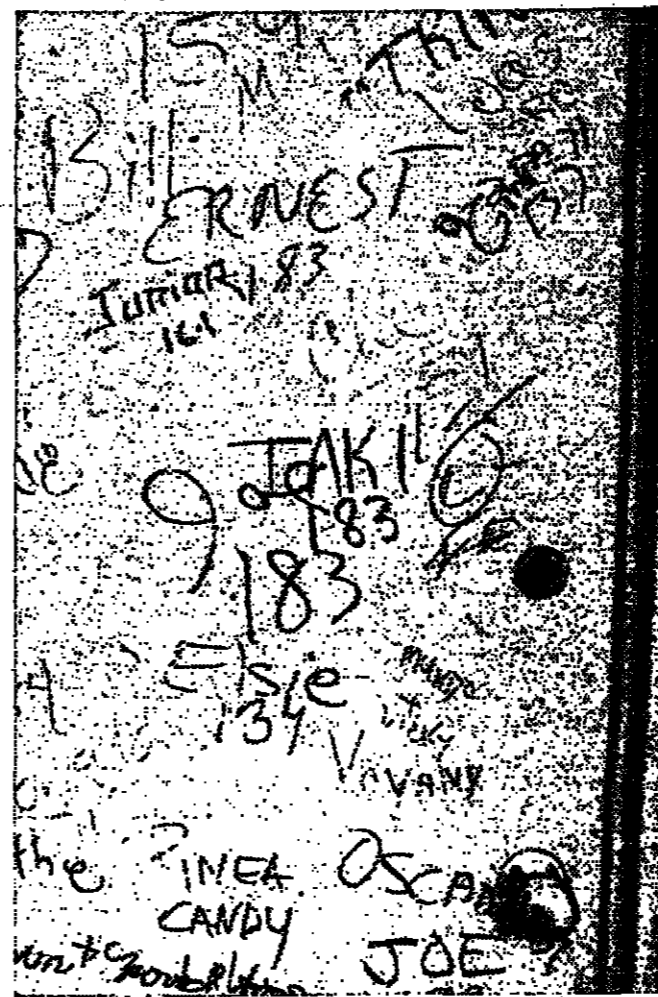
