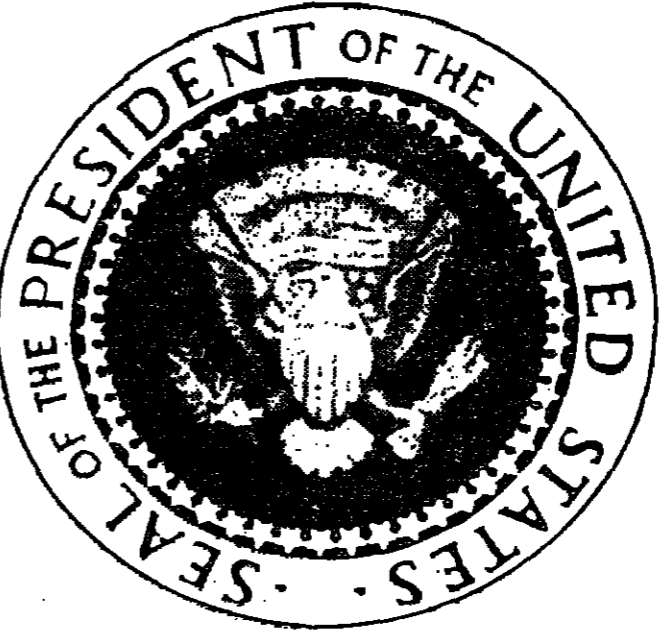

Basic Facts

Sometimes people tend to forget the real situation prevailing today. When considering Asia, the great problem is that every Communist Asia—excluding India and Pakistan—produces three times as much as China.

Nixon Doctrine

As I stated in first explaining the Nixon Doctrine, our idea is to create a situation in which those lands to which we have obligations or in which we have interests, if they are ready to fight a fire, should be able to count on us to furnish the hose and water.

Goals, No Heroes

And we found ourselves committed in Vietnam, in a war where there are no heroes, only goals. Our people became sick of Vietnam and supported our men there only in order to get them out after this period of change in mood.

Impatience

The point is, why has this happened? Why have many former internationalists developed neo-isolationist tendencies, at least in part of the answer is simply that Americans, like all idealists, are very impatient people.

Responsibilities

We used to look to other nations to do this job, once upon a time. But now only the United States plays a major role in this sort in the world. Our responsibilities are not limited to this great continent but include Europe, the Middle East, Southeast Asia, East Asia, many areas whose fate affects the peace of the world.

Those in Middle

In between there are those of us who stand in the middle of the crossfire. The superhawk feels it is his duty to support the President even if that same superhawk isn't sure he wants to see us do what we are doing.

Peace Role

It is not enough just to be for peace. The point is, what can we do about it? Through an accident of history we find ourselves today in a situation where no one who is really for peace in this country can reject an American role in the rest of the world.

The Polls

I am certain a Gallup poll would show that the great majority of the people would want to pull out of Vietnam. But a Gallup poll would also show that a great majority of the people would want to pull three or more divisions out of Europe.

Relative Peace

For obviously pragmatic reasons, therefore, we can see peace slowly slipping away. First, as we are doing, we must end the war in Vietnam. We must continue our Soviet negotiations and open the door of cooperation to China.

Berrigan Six Prosecutor Is Named by U.S.

WASHINGTON, March 10 (UPI)—The government named today William S. Lynch, a deputy attorney general, as prosecutor in the case against the Rev. Philip Berrigan and five others charged with conspiring to kidnap a key White House aide and bomb government buildings.

Mr. Lynch, 44, a Roman Catholic, has served in the Internal Security Division of the Justice Department and as chief of the Organized Crime Section.

Mr. Lynch said yesterday that he was "familiar with the case." But he declined to comment on how he felt about opposing Mr. Berrigan, who served as his superior at the Justice Department during the administration of President Lyndon B. Johnson.

The trial is not expected to begin for several months. In addition to Father Berrigan, who is now imprisoned at Danbury, Conn., Federal Penitentiary, the defendants are Sister Elizabeth McAlister of New York, the Rev. Joseph Wenderoth and the Rev. Neil McLaughlin, and Anthony Sobczak, all of Baltimore.

Lindsay Proposes Sharp Jump In N.Y.C. Income Taxes

NEW YORK, March 10 (UPI)—A "survival" fiscal plan for New York City which would impose additional taxes on individuals, especially commuters, was proposed yesterday by Mayor John V. Lindsay.

The \$880.7 million tax proposal, which Mr. Lindsay said would only maintain the present level of services, ranged from sharply increased payroll income taxes to a 500 percent hike in the cost of a ride on the Staten Island Ferry.

The key proposal which is certain to provoke the greatest uproar, especially at state levels, was the payroll tax which roughly would be doubled for city residents and tripled for out-of-towners.

Racist, He Says in 1st Lords Speech U.K.'s Black Peer Assails Immigration Bill

LONDON, March 10 (AP)—Lord Constantine, Britain's only black peer, spoke for the first time in the House of Lords today and launched an attack on "racial discrimination" in the government's new legislation to cut immigration.

The 69-year-old former professional cricket player, looking frail after a two-year illness, said the law would create "a patchwork of difficulties" for nonwhite people.

Referring to a possible anomaly in the new law, Lord Constantine, who was born in the West Indies, said:

"If Britain enters the European Common Market, since France has no colonies but an attachment to metropolitan France for Guadeloupe and Martinique, the freedom of movement of the Common Market would mean that black Frenchmen from Guadeloupe or Martinique would be able to come into London without reporting to the police, while those of us, British-born and bred, would have to report."

"Something to Consider" "This is something you have to consider. Either you make the black Frenchman report or you are discriminating further." Lord Constantine was speaking

Other peers listened attentively as Lord Constantine, wearing a plain lounge suit, pleaded for his fellow West Indians.

"The West Indian is a different person," he said. "He is in essence a black Englishman. When slavery took the African to the West Indies, the owners destroyed everything that was African."

Given British names The West Indians, he said, were given British names.

"My grandparents were Nigerian but I am named Constantine," he said. "The curriculum at school in the West Indies is the same as in this country. The games at school are the same as those played in this country."

"I do not know any other language, so it was easy for me to live in England," he said.

Lord Constantine, a former high commissioner in London for Trinidad and Tobago, called for special treatment for West Indian sportsmen, especially sugar if Britain joined the Common Market.

He said the traditional preferences which Britain had granted to these products in the past had proved "a sheet anchor" for most West Indian countries.

New Wave of Strikes in Italy; Autobianchi Plant Is Closed

ROME, March 10 (AP)—Italy was in the grip of a new wave of labor unrest today, with nationwide strikes closing state welfare agencies and museums and local walkouts hitting bakeries and gasoline stations.

The strike wave threatened to spread as the country's one million state employees warned that they might walk out again in their long-time dispute with the government over problems of career and pay.

Meanwhile, in industrial Milan the Autobianchi plant, which turns out 100,000 small cars and trucks a year, was shut down for a second day after clashes between workers and white-collar employees.

The management ordered the 4,000-employee plant closed until there are guarantees that "violence will be stopped for good."

It charged that two managers had been beaten in incidents over the workers' demands for fringe benefits.

The biggest strike was that of the country's 200,000 state-employee employees who walked out today in their second three-day work stoppage this month. They are demanding higher pay and new career and promotion scales.

The walkout closed social security offices, free-care medical clinics, Red Cross services and provincial tourist agencies.

Museums and archaeological sites throughout the country still were closed by a strike of state antiquity and fine-arts employees that started Monday. The employees want more pay for overtime and nightwork and job-involving danger.

ECORSE, Mich., March 10 (AP)—A blind man in this Detroit suburb has been granted a permit to own a handgun.

Police Lt. Louis Kozma said a check found nothing in Michigan law that required the holder of a gun permit to be able to see to aim.

Sgt. Edward Haven of the state police records bureau in East Lansing said, "Apparently, no one thought of a case like this when they made the law."

Sweden's Back-to-Work Bill Opposed, May Be Delayed

STOCKHOLM, March 10 (UPI)—Premier Olof Palme's bill to end six weeks of work stoppages involving 47,000 civil servants ran into opposition today, political sources said.

Mr. Palme's cabinet today approved the emergency bill at a special meeting with King Gustaf VI Adolf. Parliament was expected to pass it today or tomorrow.

The sources said the bill, which orders a six-week cooling period for strikes and lockouts to allow mediators to work out a compromise wage settlement, cannot now be signed into law until Saturday.

The three non-Socialist opposition parties supported Mr. Palme's unprecedented move when he introduced the emergency legislation last night.

But today, both Liberal and Conservative members of the Riksdag (parliament) said that they would introduce amendments rejecting the bill. The Communists said they would also introduce a motion rejecting the forced return to work for the government employees.

A Conservative spokesman said his party now opposed the bill because it "is aimed only against public officials."

The opposition did not place the passage of the bill in jeopardy, the sources said, since Mr. Palme's minority Social Democrats will be supported by the Center party.

But it could delay the bill, which was sent to committee without debate today and will return to the floor tomorrow morning.

Opposition to the government intervention, which constituted a break with Swedish tradition of government non-interference in labor relations, also grew in union circles even though Arne Geijer, the president of the Swedish Confederation of Trade Unions (LO), announced that he supported the government move.

Paris Theater '1789': An Exercise in Leftish Evangelism

PARIS, March 10.—When Jean-Pierre Laroche was administrator of the Théâtre National Populaire, he complained that his theater, the st. auditorium of the Palais de la Vallée, was in too elegant a quarter to attract a working-class audience. Since then, many principal theaters have opened in the workers' suburbs of Paris, and although they have presented some notable productions, the local inhabitants still prefer Hollywood westerns and French imitations of American gangster films on television.

Now the Théâtre du Soleil is attempting to magnetize the masses by visiting an abandoned candle-making factory in the vicinity of the Château de Vincennes, there to behold an in-the-round spectacle, "1789." The factory is in an isolated, wooded, clearing, and you must come by car, or a most convenient way to arrive is this no-man's-land. After the two-and-a-half-hour revolutionary camp-fire meeting in the courtyard, which is a theatrical battle without a pause for intermission, you may wonder whether the trip is necessary.

Source Account

One source account reported that the leftish evangelistic exercise attracted Parisian snobs in the end of the working-class. Snobs, Parisian or otherwise, were conspicuous by their absence at matinees which was attended chiefly by middle-class school children who arrived by busloads.

Cartoon

The action of the spectacle—of broad, cartoon nature—takes place on a set of platforms connected by runways, and the company of 30 fellows, overacts and gallops about over the heads of the spectators who have come too late to find seats in the grandstand.

Vincent Canby of The New York Times called it "something of an improvement" over the former film, but still "a decade away from 'Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow' and 'Divorce Italian Style.'" Loren-Mastroianni produce so good, in Canby's opinion, that they created "a new subcategory of film comedy."

"Wanda," written and directed by Barbara Loden, was called "a cinematic rarity" by Roger Greenspun of The Times who said that it is a movie that "really does get better—much better—as it goes along." The heroine, played by Miss Loden, is a "rather stupid" young woman from the Pennsylvania coal country who leaves her husband and children and wanders off into a series of minor misfortunes until she finds herself the accomplice of a small-time thief. The reviewer judged it "significantly a woman's film" in that "it never sensationalizes or patronizes its heroine, and yet finds her interesting." It would be hard to imagine, the critic said, a better "or more decently difficult" work for a first film.

"Red White and Black," Eric Bentley's revue at La Mama ETC Theater got a mixed report in The Times. Mel Gussow: "Eric Bentley's patriotic demonstration of his disaffection with America is structured as a dream parade, but that provides only the thinnest thread between songs. This is a revue, a radical revue such as one scarcely finds any more. It would fit fine in a political cabaret, if such a thing still existed. Brad Burg's score melds neatly with Bentley's tough lyrics. The music is played by a combo called 'The History of Russia,' with Mr. Burg himself on the piano."

The Sweet Life in Zurich

By Naomi Barry

ZURICH.—I went to the Zurich carnival hall in a costume made of 89 worth of hard candy and was complimented for my originality.

The inspiration came from the windows of Sprungli, a 126-year-old shrine devoted to the sweet life, in the city's chocolate district. The shop is a cornerstone of the Zurich way of life. It is crowded from 7:30 a.m. until early in the evening. The "gnomes" and their helpers ar-

rive before the banks open to fortify themselves with newspapers, coffee, rolls and miniature open sandwiches.

Names in Dialect

The rolls have endearing names in the Zurich dialect: *woggli*, *gipfel* and *semmlen*. The sandwiches consist of a generously buttered slice of bread pyramided with sliced radishes, cucumbers, dried beef, ham or salami. One delicacy is a fat roll with tapered ends which is made of cheese pastry. The roll is split and slathered with a creamy white cheese.

The Bahnhofstrasse shoppers drift in all day to meet each other over refreshments, light lunches and snacks. Baking goes on all day with continuous fresh supplies for the shop, the restaurant and home deliveries. There are 31 ovens going continuously at full blast.

There are 30 bakers, six of whom are apprentices. Every apprentice knows that if he is graduated from this food mill, he'll never want for a job. With the altruism of self-interest, Sprungli knows that only by training the young will it find the qualified artisans to perpetuate its kind of operation.

The day's supply of "truffles," balls of chocolate and fresh cream rolled in cocoa powder, are offered as free samples in the retail shop.

Two other Canadian composers, Jacques Hétu and Otto Joachim, are also represented, along with Beethoven and Haydn.

A youngster will get a cake topped with sugar replicas of his favorite toys and pets. An older will get a cake with sweet artifacts honoring all his hobbies and accomplishments.

It is quite common for a local architect, upon completion of a project, to ask Sprungli to bake a facsimile of the new building for the inaugural party. Consuming the masterpiece is considered the best of luck.

The Knight of Horror

LONDON.—Along Wardour Street, where film companies huddle together for comfort, Sir James Carreras is known, somewhat facetiously, as The Knight of Horror. It is a tribute to his aplomb, over the last 24 years, in making his company, Hammer Films, famous throughout the world for its movies of monsters and vampires.

Currently, as most film companies face crises, Hammer is busier than ever, with seven horror films in production. This preoccupation dates from an early hit with the film of a television serial, "The Quatermass Experiment," about an unpleasant blob from outer space.

Strangely, Michael Carreras deplores the effect of greater sexual freedom on horror movies. "The Vampire Lovers," a recent co-production by Hammer and their American rival AIP, has lesbian vampires. "Boobies all over the place," says Mr. Carreras. "I wasn't our usual style. I want to return to the Gothic flavor of our first horror films. It wasn't had this sudden unhealthy interest in sex, we might have had a much more natural progression to more and more violence."
