U.K. Exports Hit Record, Trade Surplus Continues

LONDON, Oct. 13 (NYT).—British exports were at a new high last month, and September merchandise trade was in substantial surplus for the sixth straight month, the Department of Trade and Industry reported today.

The foreign exchange market has come to take British trade success for granted, and there was little reaction. The floating pound, which had touched \$2.4899 this morning, fell back to its overnight level—3.7 percent above par.

U.S. Offers Surtax Deal, EEC Reports

BRUSSELS, Oct. 13 (WFP).—Common Market officials confirmed today that the United States is putting pressure on the six member governments, urging them not to negotiate new trade pacts with the neutral countries of Europe and with developing nations of the British Commonwealth.

Upstaged by Germany
The markets paid far more immediate attention to the cut in the German bank rate. The market for government bonds was enlivened by conjecture that Britain might follow suit.

According to the same sources, the United States, in return, is holding out the possibility of a reduction or the limited application of the 10 percent import surcharge.

In anticipation, the prices for government bonds moved ahead smartly. The stock exchange was also buoyed by the favorable economic news.

However, it remains extremely unlikely that the EEC will exchange new trade concessions in return for a limited application of the 10 percent import surcharge.

September exports were a record \$797 million, up \$28 million over August. Part of the increase may have been due to accelerated shipments to beat the U.S. East Coast dock strike, experts suggested.

In a speech earlier this week, Franco Maria Malitadi, president of the executive commission, indicated the EEC's line of argument in future talks with the United States. He said that over the past six years U.S. farm exports to the EEC increased by 25 percent, while similar U.S. exports to the rest of the world increased by only 20 percent over the same period.

Imports for the third quarter, on a monthly basis, were up 2 percent over the monthly average in the first half, while exports were up 10 percent. All figures are stated on a seasonally adjusted balance-of-payments basis.

London, bankers predicted a 5 percent reduction in the 6 percent rate now prevailing.

With merchandise trade averaging \$20 million a month in the first nine months of this year, British seems on its way to a record current account surplus in goods and services on the order of \$240 million.

Chase Profits Rise 7.2 Percent in Quarter

NEW YORK, Oct. 13 (NYT).—Chase Manhattan Corp. today reported a 7.2 percent increase in operating earnings for the third quarter. The corporation earned \$38.6 million, or \$1.21 a share, before securities transactions in the quarter, up from \$36 million, or \$1.13 a share, in the 1970 period.

A spokesman said the federation would not change its stand, despite President Nixon's statement yesterday that the United States will impose quotas if no agreement is reached by Friday.

The spokesman said the JTF estimated that Japan's textile exports to the United States would drop 50 percent next year if the agreement is signed, while a U.S.-imposed mandatory quota would be "just as bad."

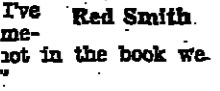
