## Second Opinion Found to Cut Medical Bills

NEW YORK — Programs that require patients to obtain a second doctor's opinion before undergoing elective surgery can avoid "surplus" surgery and save money, according to the findings of the oldest and largest such program in the United States.

Analyses of the eight-year-old program, conducted among union members in the New York area by

the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center, showed that at least \$2.63 was saved for every dollar spent in the mandatory second-opinion project. The savings were primarily a result of surgery that was not undertaken because a consulting surgeon said it was not needed.

The findings, presented Monday at a news conference at the medical center, are expected to encourage the growth of second-opinion

programs among health funds and government agencies seeking to curb rapidly rising medical costs without compromising the quality of care.

The findings have emerged at a time when the surgery rate is increasing four times faster than the population, and highlight the fact that there are no clear criteria for when to perform most operations.

The Cornell results contradicted

the suggestion from a related study by Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Greater New York that second-opinion programs may actually increase medical costs by encouraging patients to have needed operations they would otherwise have avoided.

That suggestion, released in December, challenged the financial wisdom of second-opinion programs, although the potential health benefits to the patients were not questioned.

But the director of the Cornell study, Dr. Eugene G. McCarthy, said no existing second-opinion program had yet determined whether patients who were told by two physicians that an operation was needed were more likely to have the surgery than if only one doctor gave such advice.

The Blue Cross-Blue Shield program is voluntary, and the health plan pays the costs of the surgical consultation for those who desire it. Only 2 percent to 4 percent of eligible patients have taken advantage of the Blue Cross-Blue Shield offer.

## Blacks in U.S. Form Right-Wing Group

WASHINGTON — Thomas Sowell, the outspoken black conservative and Reagan administration favorite, is forming a national black organization intended as a counterweight to the NAACP and other liberal civil rights groups.

"My purpose is to put forth my vision of the world and offer a forum for other views of the world," said Mr. Sowell, who has brought new controversy to the civil rights debate by arguing against such government programs as affirmative action and the minimum wage to help blacks, stressing instead old-fashioned virtues of self-reliance and hard work.

The Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post and The New York Times has been written about in Time and Newsweek and was featured in a recent CBS-TV Show.

**Key Figure**

In December he was the key figure at a first-time conference of black conservatives in San Francisco that drew about 125 black Ivy League professors, lawyers, physicians, dentists and commentators. The conference was sponsored by the Institute for Contemporary Studies, a conservative research organization established by former aides to President Reagan after he left the statehouse in Sacramento.

Edwin Meese 3d, Mr. Reagan's

counselor and top White House aide, has been a board member of the institute and attended the December meeting, praising the group for having a freshness of outlook on black problems.

Mr. Sowell and associates emphasize inadequate jobs, education and housing as the basic problems confronting black Americans, just as the liberal civil rights organizations do. They are sharply critical of the programs and policies advocated by the established rights groups, but they have not offered any solutions of their own. Mr. Sowell said that will be done next month when the conservative Hoover Institution sponsors a second conference and the new Black Alternatives Association Inc. is launched.

## Charles B. Ferster, U.S. Pioneer in Behavior Psychology, Is Dead

WASHINGTON — Charles B. Ferster, 58, a psychology professor at American University in Washington whose research in experimental psychology helped lay the groundwork for the psychotherapeutic technique known as behavior modification, has died of a heart attack.

Dr. Ferster, who died Tuesday at a Washington hospital, was the co-author, with psychologist B.F. Skinner, of "Schedules of Reinforcement," a leading textbook in the field of experimental psychology, and the author of more than 80 scientific papers and articles.

In the late 1950s, he established a major publication in the field of experimental research, the Journal of the Experimental Analysis of Behavior, while he was an assistant professor of psychology at the Indiana University School of Medicine.

her work as founder and chairman of Reading Is Fundamental, a nationwide program to encourage underprivileged children to read, died of cancer Tuesday at her home in Washington.

She was the wife of Robert S. McNamara, president of the World Bank and former secretary of defense in the Kennedy and Johnson administrations.

**Meeting With Lawyers**

## Music: Tangerine Dream and the Synthesized Message

PARIS — In the summer of 1967 an impoverished German rock group named The Doves played in Salvador Dali's garden in Cadaques, Spain. The occasion was an exhibition of sculpture Dali had constructed from old vegetable cans.

Edgar Froese, the 23-year-old keyboard player, spent a few hours discussing art and music with Dali, who said he had learned quite early in life never to say something was not possible because anything you can think about must be possible or you couldn't think about it.

Froese went home to Berlin and started thinking. Berlin was bubbling with revolutionary ideas. Young people were forming communes, demonstrating on the streets, discovering Zen, listening to Indian ragas and free jazz, dropping acid, experimenting with various forms of liberation. How to express all this? He could start singing about all these things going on in the world but many musicians were already doing that. Some, like Bob Dylan, had actually brought about a few little changes. But Froese preferred to attract the listener's subconscious, nonverbally.

with Klaus Schulze, Michael Hoenig and the groups Can and Krautwerk — other young German musicians working in similar directions — Tangerine Dream began to adapt the hitherto exclusively studio-oriented synthesizer technology to the concert stage.

German cultural tradition had been suppressed after World War II, and Anglo-American pop culture descended on young Germans in a blitzkrieg. It invaded all of Western Europe, of course, but it went deeper and faster in West Germany, where soon the only pop culture was Anglo-American.

**Recovering Culture**

But by the late '60s, Froese's generation regarded fascism as no longer necessarily having uniquely to do with Germany. In fact, with the events in Vietnam, it was American culture that was appearing warlike and decadent. Radical young Germans began to try to recover their own culture.

Musical tradition is strong in Germany, as is technology. Since Anglo-American rock was moving toward increasing use of technology, Froese decided to work at a conscious welding of the two. He came up with something that came to be called Kraut Rock, otherwise known as Cosmic Rock.

From the Beatles' "Sergeant Pepper" he borrowed the name Tangerine Dream. Along

There were no tunes, structures or vocals, only Froese and a second keyboardist, Christoph Franke, improvising with stacks of hardware such as ring modulators, echo chambers, tapes, a floor full of miscellaneous pedals and a forest of wires to produce a floating, hypnotic, spacey, intellectual, Wagnerian electronic bath.

After 11 years, this sound has entered the mainstream of pop and the members of Tangerine Dream — now a quartet, having added a born player and drummer — have become the grand old men of synthesizer rock. While they have honed and enlarged their music, their records have placed in the top 10, and they have played at pop festivals

and recorded soundtracks for William Friedkin's film "Sorcerer" and the soon-to-be-released Michael Mann movie "The Thief," starring James Caan.

**Hours Thinking**

Edgar Froese is a soft-spoken, lucid man with a wild mane of straw-blond hair, who gives the impression of having spent many hours thinking about his art. Recently, before playing to an overflow crowd in Le Palais, he explained how maturity has affected his revolutionary philosophy: "Revolutionaries are absolutely senseless. What did the French or Russian revolutions mean? They brought temporary change but it all ended up the same, or even worse.

"People have a good time making revolutions. They feel they are actually changing things but historically when you look back it was like pouring coffee from a green to a yellow pot. It's still coffee. For centuries it's been the same. What can a little musician do to change that? You can just sit down and try to enjoy yourself and find another way through. We get thousands of letters every month, and people talk to us after concerts. They try and put into words what our music does for them, but it's difficult. What it amounts to is that for a certain time we have succeeded in moving their emotions in a certain direction."

Toward the end of 1977, Tangerine Dream played for 6,000 youths crammed into the cathedral of Reims, France. Overcrowding resulted in a certain disorder, and the group was banned from performing in Catholic churches. In February, 1980, they became the first Western rock group to play in East Germany (this concert went smoothly). They are just completing a two-month tour of Western Europe and next month will embark on an extended U.S. tour.

Froese smiles, apparently full of health and energy after so much travel. "I would like to play in China, Australia, Brazil, everywhere. I love to play music that brings something to people through the back door."

### Dutch Team Prepares Anne Frank's Diary in Full

AMSTERDAM — The State Institute for War Documentation plans to publish in full for the first time the diary of Anne Frank — a proposal that has brought opposition from Dutch readers and a protest from a member of the parliament.

da Wessel-Tuinstra, objected that Frank's consideration for what Anne wrote about should be respected.

She argued that Frank had left the original to the state primarily to allow for verification of its authenticity. "Let the scientists establish the irrefutable veracity of the document," she said. "And if it emerges that the papers cast a new light on the person Anne Frank, then let them be published to future years when there will be no one sure alive who is affected by Anne's comments."

However, Bauc van der Wal of the Amsterdam-based Anne Frank Foundation, which maintains the

house where the group was hidden, said the complete diary should be published as soon as possible, to "prove for once and for all that the diary is genuine."

The diary, a collection of exercise books and loose sheets, covered two years while the family and friends hid from the Nazis. Paape said the first version, begun in the summer of 1942, had a "rather childish character" to it. "But she developed very quickly and in the first months of 1943 she rewrote what she had done, and this, together with the remainder of the diary, became known as the second version," he said.

"After Anne and the others were taken from the house by German police, aided by Dutch collaborators, the diary was hidden by my friends and was given to Fran on his return to Amsterdam at the war."

Paape said the three versions he printed in full in the new book will be prefaced by an Introduction including statements from me attempting to the authenticity of the diary. He explained that the material from any one source will reject anything that looks like foreign propaganda.



It was partly because of that reason that TV was so slow coming to Burma. After rejecting British offer to set up a station in Rangoon, officials accepted a private Japanese offer of a broadcast system that cost the government almost nothing.

The Japanese company, Nishitsu, gave Burma a modern, fully equipped studio and transmitter along with 1,000 TV sets in exchange for the rights to set up a market. When those sets are reaching viewers someone else's, current black market price of up to \$4,600 should come down. But even at the expected price of \$1,076 a set, TV will remain far beyond the means of most of the million Burmese, whose average wage is less than \$2 a day.

The first 1,000 sets were distributed and cadres. (It is expected the new sets will be allocated as incentives for increased economic production and political cooperation.)

**Opera in Florence**

**Ronconi on a New Tack in 'Siegfried'**

FLORENCE — Gradually the Teatro Comunale is putting together its production of the complete Wagnerian "Ring." After mounting a brand-new "Rheingold," the Florence theater imported a "Walkure" from La Scala. And now — again with Zubin Mehta as conductor — the Comunale team of Luca Ronconi, director, and Pier Luigi Pizzi, designer, is responsible for the new "Siegfried," which is currently playing to capacity houses.

Ronconi and Pizzi created a "Siegfried" at La Scala in the early 1970s, but this Florence production is radically different. The differences are arresting and apparently signify changes in Ronconi's view of the whole Wagner cycle. In Milan, his thinking seemed much influenced by George Bernard Shaw (the dragon, for example, was a group of 19th-century plutocrats). There were also some jarring

cute aspects (Erda lived in a kind of Victorian lumber room surrounded by family portraits, including one of Wotan).

**Back to Tradition**

Now Ronconi and Pizzi have moved in the direction of tradition. The dragon is real and he lives in a real forest (a beautiful and effective set). Erda rises from the earth in a presumably outdoor milieu, though it resembles a section of a stadium. Here the tradition to which Ronconi has returned is Wieland Wagner's. Though these changes are welcome, the staging still has its distressing moments, especially the finale, where the hero and heroine were forced to sing their long duet on a perilous flight of steps that made both of them visibly uneasy.

Dunja Vejzovic was uneasy vocally as well. She is a good musician (as she proved in Florence several seasons ago in a memorable performance of Schoenberg's "Erwartung"), but the voice lacks the sheer power required for Brunnhilde. The high notes were often shrill, unpleasant to hear, though much of her singing was enjoyable. By this score Jean Cox's voice was also striking; still, his long experience and admirable musicality sustained him. Earlier he sang with lyric enthusiasm and purity, especially in the forest scene.

Here Mehta, too, was at his best. The Florence orchestra plays the music well, but it does not have Wagner under its skin. The richness of textures, the shifts of mood and pace were not always as well defined, as magical as one would

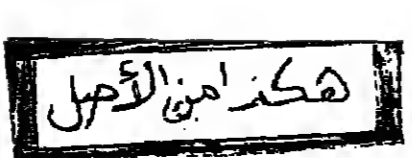

SEC Report Decried by Ex-Official

WASHINGTON — A former commissioner of the Securities and Exchange Commission has written to one of President Reagan's top advisers questioning the validity of a controversial transition team report which he claims, if followed, "might well destroy" the agency.

The letter, dated Jan. 29 and written by A.A. Sommer Jr., who served as an SEC commissioner between 1973 and 1974, was sent to Edwin Meese 3d, adviser to the president.

In the letter, Mr. Sommer said that although "the following reflections are essentially my own," they also "express the sentiments and convictions of a substantial number of lawyers who practice in the securities area."

Mr. Sommer said he was writing the letter after copies of the report had circulated and caused concern among attorneys at a recent securities conference in San Diego.

"It was the general belief of the group that the decentralization of enforcement activities to state administrators and commission regional offices would adversely affect the ability of the commission to carry out Congress' mandate that it enforce securities laws."

"Although the SEC's budget has grown largely as a consequence of inflation," the size of the staff has not: it is about 5 percent larger than it was in 1975. Cuts of the size suggested in the report would undermine the effectiveness of the SEC.

"A cut to 1,252 people," the report said, "would bring the commission back to its size in 1962 when the average volume on the New York Stock Exchange was \$3,818,077 in sales per day."

In reviewing the SEC budget, the administration should keep in mind that a large percentage of commission funds are raised by fees. "From 1970 through 1979, the percentage of its budget provided by fees has ranged from 42 to 71 percent and has averaged almost 60 percent."
