

Fear of Communists Gives Way to Scorn Among Vietnamese

LAEM SING, Thailand — Fear of the Communists has given way to disrespect and sometimes scorn among the cynical inhabitants of Saigon, which was renamed Ho Chi Minh City after the North Vietnamese conquest of South Vietnam in 1975.

"People just don't care any more," said Mrs. Le Van Thanh, 58, who worked for a French company that once bottled Coca-Cola in Saigon and now produces beer for export to the Soviet Union.

She is one of only 600 refugees at this quiet, picturesque camp overlooking the Gulf of Thailand. The camp population peaked at 3,000 last year but has been sharply reduced by transfers to resettlement processing centers in Indonesia and the Philippines.

But according to UN figures, Vietnamese refugees continue to arrive in various Southeast Asian countries, including Thailand, at the rate of 10,000 a month.

Fear Overcome

"At first we were afraid to talk," Mrs. Thanh said, "because we were afraid the people next door might be Communist spies. But now we know that the people next door feel the same as we do about the regime."

"So we talk among ourselves and say what we please. To you I say Ho Chi Minh City because that's what the Communists taught us to say. Among ourselves we still call it Saigon. But we stop talking when we see a policeman. The police are very powerful."

The mother of two small children — her husband is dead — Mrs. Thanh hopes to emigrate to Canada where she once attended school.

"What has happened is that the Communists have lost their power to intimidate," said Le Thanh Tung, 46, former editor of a South Vietnamese Army newspaper who also worked for a U.S. construction consortium during the war.

According to refugee accounts, whatever moral authority the Communists may have had at the start has been eroded by broken promises and corruption.

"It seems they [the Communists] try to do good, but they don't know how," Mrs. Thanh said. "They have lost control of the situation. People won't obey them unless directly threatened."

Sometimes, she said, "we argued with the cadres. You have to be clever to do that so they don't take offense. We will tell them they have strayed too far from Uncle

Ho [Ho Chi Minh, father of Vietnamese Communism]. We ask them why they don't practice what they preach. We say this policy or that has nothing to do with Max Lenin [Marx, Lenin]."

Twenty-two new arrivals reached this camp the other day, led by a smiling Nguyen Thanh Diem, 33, who said he "used to cut hair" for the Americans. He and other members of his group confirmed earlier reports that southern Vietnam, which had a bumper rice harvest last year, is being forced to ship large quantities of rice to the North, where there is a critical shortage.

One refugee, asked whether things were getting better or worse in Vietnam, paused for thought, then said: "Economically, conditions are worse, but in another way they are better because the pressure is not so bad as it was. The government has lost control over people's thinking."

"The cadres don't even believe themselves," he said.

A major problem that the Communists face is division within their own ranks, refugees reported. Traditional North-South animosity — which has no basis in ideology — has been sharpened by Hanoi's shabby treatment of southern Communists.

Source of Friction

Another source of friction is that some Vietnamese Communists are pro-Chinese while others are pro-Soviet — with the latter clearly in the ascendancy. A third source of friction lies in the generation gap between old-guard nationalist Communists and young Soviet-trained technocrats "who think they know everything."

Several refugees spoke knowingly of resistance groups in southern Vietnam led by former army officers. But it appears that for the most part resistance to the Communists is mainly passive.

One thing could change this, and that is collectivization of the land. Thus far Hanoi has been circumspect in talking land from the peasants in the South, apparently out of fear of the consequence. Less than 10 percent of the land in the South has been collectivized and peasants are still free to sell most of their rice on the free market.

But party planners have alluded to nationalization of land in the South with increasing frequency. "If there is anything that could provoke an uprising in the South," an analyst said, "it would be sudden collectivization."

Sihanouk, Khieu Samphan Fail to Set Agreement

PEKING — The former Cambodian head of state, Prince Norodom Sihanouk, has ended a first round of talks with Khmer Rouge leader Khieu Samphan without reaching agreement on forming an anti-Vietnamese united front, sources close to the exiled prince said Wednesday.

Mr. Samphan, premier of the ousted Peking-backed Khmer Rouge administration, refused to accept Prince Sihanouk's demand that all Cambodian forces be disarmed and that Vietnamese troops eventually leave the country, the sources said.

The sources, contacted in the North Korean capital of Pyongyang by telephone, said Khieu Samphan took formal leave of the prince Wednesday and would probably leave Pyongyang Thursday. The discussions could possibly resume at a later date, the sources added.

Prince Sihanouk also wants Chinese military aid to build up his own small force of non-Communist guerrillas. And he wants an agreement for general elections to be held under international supervision.

The prince said Feb. 27 that he was shelving his plans for the front because of opposition from the non-Communist supporters of former Premier Son Sam, but later appeared to have changed his mind.

U.S. Nobel Laureate Max Delbrück Dies

PASADENA, Calif. — Max Delbrück, 74, Nobel laureate in physiology and medicine, died Monday in Huntington Memorial Hospital after a long illness.

Dr. Delbrück, professor emeritus of biology at Caltech, was trained as a physicist in his native Germany, but turned to biology and his research into virus and viral diseases earned him a share in the 1969 Nobel Prize.

In 1940, Mr. Person founded "Facts on File," the first news digest in the Western Hemisphere to have a cumulative weekly index, now widely used by editors and librarians.

Japan Sets Rice Sale to S. Korea As Strain in Ties Seems to Ease

TOKYO — Japan has agreed to sell more than 400,000 tons of surplus rice, valued at close to \$200 million, to South Korea following the failure of much of the 1980 Korean rice crop, Japanese government officials announced.

The agreement, which was apparently held up last year by political differences, was seen in Tokyo as a sign that the two nations are moving cautiously to patch up their disagreements. Since January, the Japanese have also offered to resume economic aid to South Korea. Last week Foreign Minister Masayoshi Ito went to Seoul in an effort to improve relations.

A Foreign Ministry spokesman said that "whether we like it or not," there had been a difficult atmosphere in relations with Seoul in the last few months, but he said the difficulties had been "at least somewhat smoothed out" by Mr. Ito's visit.

Japanese relations with Seoul had been strained by the death sentence given to South Korean opposition leader Kim Dae Jung by a military court last year. President Chun Doo Hwan's commutation in January of Mr. Kim's sentence to life imprisonment was followed by the lifting of a temporary suspension of \$92 million in economic aid to South Korea.

The improved atmosphere is likely to be welcomed by the Reagan administration, officials said, as evidence of timely Japanese support for Gen. Chun's newly established regime.

Mr. Ito represented Japan at the inauguration of Gen. Chun for a seven-year term in Seoul last week. During his visit he met with Foreign Minister Lho Shin Young and agreed to resume the regular meet-

ings at the ministerial level that were suspended in 1978.

Meanwhile, a meeting between Gen. Chun and Japanese Premier Zenko Suzuki is under consideration. "If it's possible," said the Foreign Ministry spokesman, "though not probable as yet."

Only three months ago, an effigy of Mr. Suzuki was burned in Seoul before a cheering crowd of tens of thousands. The rally, accompanied by anti-Japanese meetings throughout the nation and by demonstrations outside the Japanese Embassy in Seoul, was organized by the authorities to protest a reported remark by Mr. Suzuki to South Korean diplomats that there would be pressure here for talks with North Korea if Mr. Ito were executed.

Mr. Ito appears not to have been warmly received in Seoul, judging by the small amount of coverage his visit received. South Korea's government-controlled press, presumably because he has raised North Korea, and is considered by advisers of the Communist government.

The rice deal, with repayment to be made over 15 years, was announced after Mr. Ito returned to Tokyo. The agreement was considered a more important — if implicit — bargaining weapon than a mere aid in the dispute over Kim's case.

The U.S. supplied most of a rice, obtained from abroad, South Korea after the 1980, as fell some 30 percent below the annual level of 5 million tons. "They bought practically the entire California rice crop," said a U.S. official in Seoul, noting that the purchases of American rice were close to one million tons.

Negotiations on the rice supply for South Korea were coordinated by William H. Gleystein Jr., a U.S. ambassador to Seoul, and other officials. American rice growers had objected in recent years to sales of subsidized Japanese rice on world markets at prices one-third to one-sixth of the domestic price. Japan keeps its rice price high to help support dwindling farm population.

Japanese moves to restore normal relations with Seoul reflect traditionally close economic ties between the nations. In 1980 the trade totaled \$9.2 billion, and Japan is by far the biggest foreign investor in South Korea with \$61 million out of a total \$1.16 billion in direct foreign investments there.

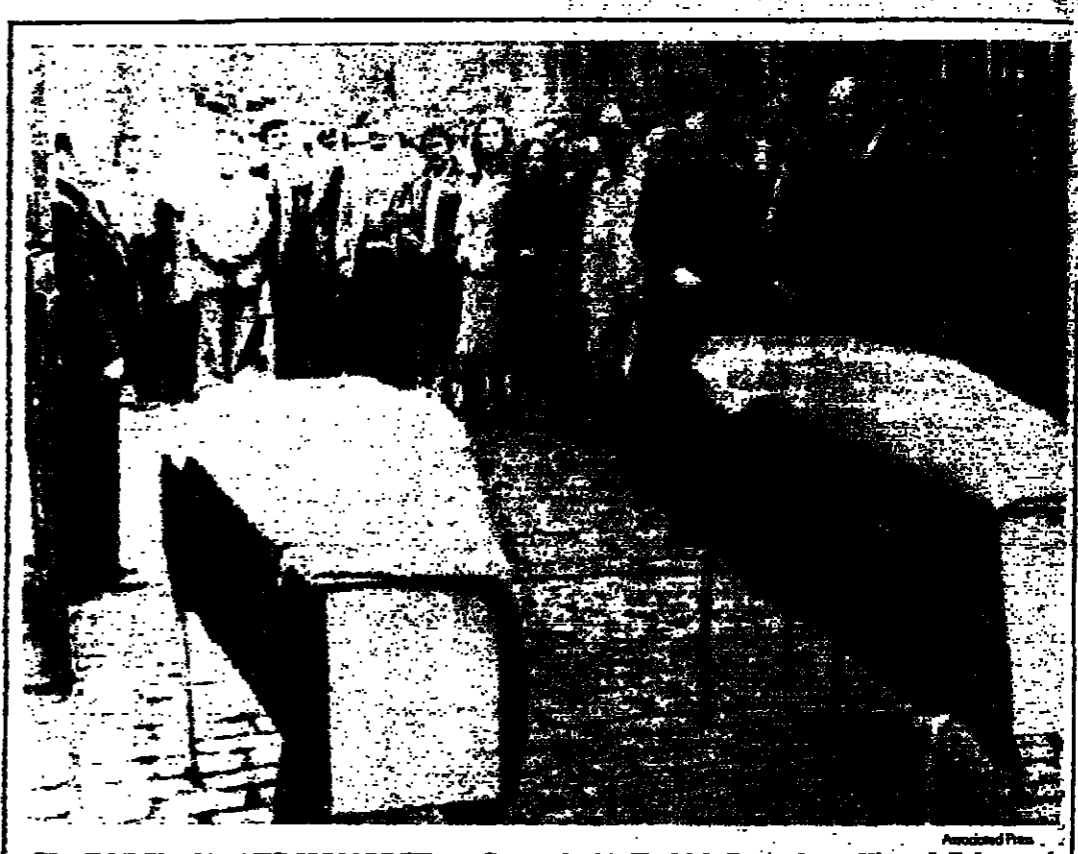
Ministers to Discuss North-South Summit

Turkey Welcomes Greek Move to Ease Restrictions on Airspace Over Aegean

ANKARA — Turkey has welcomed a Greek move to ease restrictions on airspace over the Aegean Sea as a positive "gesture of good will" before the resumption of talks next week between the two nations.

Last week, the Greek government announced a series of air traffic control measures that are expected to facilitate Turkish flights over the Aegean.

The Greek foreign minister, Constantine Mitsotakis, said the new regulations showed Greece's "sincere desire to change her relations with neighbor Turkey" because of mutual interests and friendship, according to the Turkish news agency Akajans.

Mr. Mitsotakis was quoted as saying that cooperation between the two nations would serve their common interests.

Cooperation

"Turkey's and Greece's cooperation within the framework of the NATO agreement helps not only their own interests but also the achievement of peace and security in the region," he reportedly said.

Turkish officials had complained that Greece had not responded to past Turkish goodwill gestures. Turkey abolished restrictions on Aegean flights a year ago and lifted its veto on Greece's return to the military wing of NATO.

Foreign Minister Iler Turkmen expressed his government's disappointment nearly a month ago that Greece had not taken promised measures to ease control over Aegean airspace.

Both Greek and Turkish leaders had said that an accord on Aegean airspace could have a positive effect on other more complicated issues, such as sovereignty over the continental shelf and militarization of the Greek islands.

Greece's move to improve relations with Turkey includes these changes in restrictions on Aegean air traffic:

- The air control zone around the island of Lemnos at the mouth of the Dardanelles will be narrowed from 3,000 to 1,300 square miles.
- The flight ceiling of a north-south air corridor will be reduced from 25,000 feet to 15,000 feet, and the lower limit will be raised from 2,500 feet to 5,000 feet.
- Two flight lines over the Aegean will be merged, enabling direct Turkish flights to Libya over northern Cyprus.

The lower limits of several other flight lines will be raised.

The Turkish Foreign Ministry issued a statement over the weekend welcoming these measures as a step toward the solution of the Aegean airspace question and as a "gesture of good will." But it pointed out that the moves did not fully correspond to the request made by Turkey.

Greek-Turkish talks began last October with a meeting of the two foreign ministers in New York, followed by a meeting between the secretaries general of the Greek and Turkish Foreign Ministries — it begins here Monday.

The talks are clouded by recent reports that Greece has asked the United States to maintain the balance of power in the Aegean region and provide security guarantees.

"We cannot imagine that the guarantee Greece wants about its frontiers concerns the Greco-Turkish frontiers because it is illogical for two states in the same alliance to ask for a third country's guarantee," the Turkish Foreign Ministry said.

The Turkish defense minister Haluk Bayraktar, commenting on Greek demand that the United States preserve a 7-to-10 ratio in military aid to Greece and Turkey said, "It is difficult to understand."

"The best way for both countries is to coordinate efforts to defend themselves against the mutual threat within the alliance," the defense minister said in an interview published Monday by a Turkish magazine.

EEC Negotiations On Fish Policies Fail in Brussels

BRUSSELS — European Economic Community negotiations on a 1981 fishing policy collapsed after a Wednesday meeting and ministers said they would resume talks on April 6.

Britain, seeking to protect its waters and markets from encroachment by other countries, was opposed to proposals by the other EEC countries on most aspects of the complex and controversial fishing-rules package.

The primary obstacle in the negotiations is how much non-British fishing would be allowed in the waters near Britain. Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's government wants exclusive rights to the 12-mile limit and exclusion of trawlers from even bigger waters around parts of Scotland.

West German Agriculture Minister Josef Eril failed to get Britain to agree to lift a veto on an EEC-Canada fishing agreement in order to allow West German fishermen to make their customary spring runs into Canadian waters. The Canadian agreement is a small part of the whole package, but of vital interest to West Germany's trawler industry.

Japan-Albania Relations

TOKYO — Japan has established diplomatic relations with Albania, the Foreign Ministry announced Tuesday. Officials said details regarding the level of relations and exchange of envoys would be decided later. Japan established diplomatic ties with Albania in 1922 after World War I but severed them in 1939 after the country was annexed by Italy. Negotiations to re-establish relations were initiated in 1973.

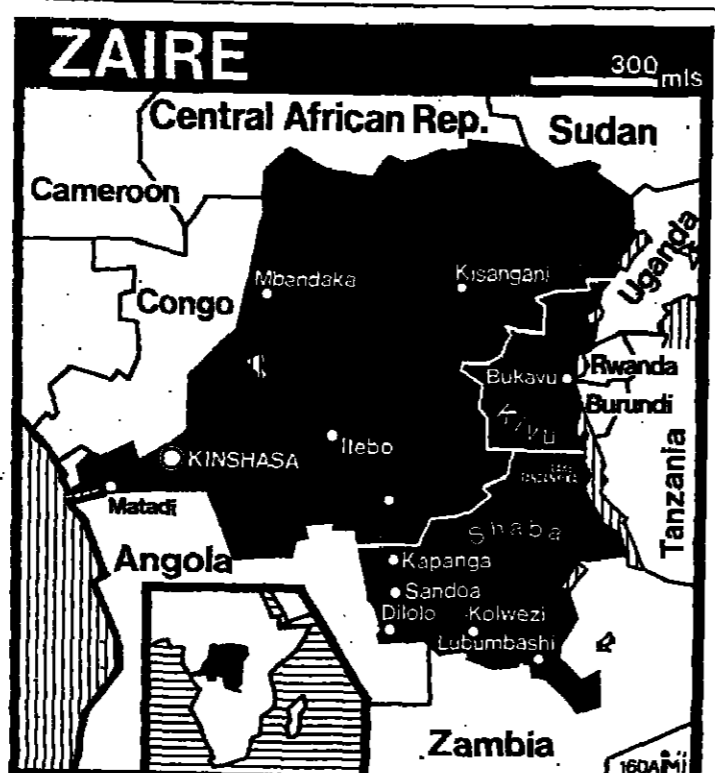

Israeli Tax Cuts Ignite Retail Buying Spree

Wholesalers cannot get the merchandise into the stores fast enough for the frenetic consumers, who literally snatch their reduced-price goods off the delivery trucks double-parked in the main shopping streets.

The docks at the port of Haifa are crowded with newly imported cars with 10 percent of the taxes slashed; the buyers line up at the showroom clutched checkbooks.

Meanwhile, the government has announced sweeping tax reforms, in which property and inheritance taxes are abolished.

In a dramatic reversal of its long-held Keynesian approach to economic control, in which increased income has been matched by increased taxes to restrain private spending, the government has unleashed an unprecedented buying spree by the public.

Depending on who is talking, it is either a case of a runaway train that will reach the already 130 percent annual inflation rate spiraling to mind-boggling highs, or a bold new "supply side" approach.

There has always been some effort to cury economic favor with Israeli voters around election time, although in the past it usually has been directed toward specific segments of the electorate.

Many Israelis laughingly liken it to the year-end sales by department stores. But the Likud's ratings in public opinion polls have been steadily climbing.

The new economic policy began on Feb. 1, two days after the swearing-in of Yoram Aridor, a 48-year-old lawyer and economist, as the third in a succession of finance ministers in the Begin cabinet.

IBM Chief Testifies AT&T Was Not Anti-Competitive

By James L. Rowe Jr... NEW YORK — Frank Cary, chairman of International Business Machines, testified Tuesday that American Telephone & Telegraph never tried to pressure IBM from competing in the telephone equipment market.

Mr. Cary acknowledged that the head of the IBM sales division was concerned as far back as 1972 that AT&T, IBM's biggest customer next to the government, might cut its IBM computers purchases if the company moved into direct competition in supplying large switchboards of the type that IBM was selling in Europe.

However, Mr. Cary said under questioning, to the best of his knowledge, the fear of retaliation was based merely on the opinion of the sales force and that he did not recall reports of AT&T threats.

CITIES OF THE RED NIGHT
By William S. Burroughs. Holt, Rinehart & Winston. 332 pp. \$14.95.
Reviewed by John Leonard

IT has now been almost 22 years since the publication of "Naked Lunch." According to the song of the birds in the publicity trees, "Cities of the Red Night" is William S. Burroughs' most ambitious novel since "Naked Lunch." I have walked around it for several days, in search of an excuse. At least it isn't one of his "cut-out" and "fold-in" jobs, nor does it consort with known Scientists. But if we are talking about Swift, the Swift we are talking about is Tom, not Jonathan.

These are three stories overlapping "Cities of the Red Night," and none of them is resolved. A private detective, right about now, looks for a couple of missing persons. A hardy band of pirates, gunsmiths and sodomites, in the early 1700s, seeks to seize South America from the Spanish and establish a permissive Utopia. Six cities in the Gobi Desert, approximately 100,000 years ago, after having achieved a remarkable level of civilization, are roughed up by either a meteor or a black hole, and find themselves inhabited by mutants, most of whom have red hair, inexplicably. They are almost as important to Burroughs as the noose, ozone and a contempt for women, although not quite as important as opium and twins. He exerts himself to describe just two of the six cities, and even so spends most of his time in a Casbah of "outlaws, a sort of garbage heap of time-warps because, naturally, one of the cities is a space-port, where you can't tell the black hole from the hologram.
