A FISTFUL OF SUGAR By Alan Goldstein. (Illustrated.) 299 pp. \$12.95. Coward, McCann and Geoghegan, 700 Madison Ave., New York 10016. Reviewed by Anatole Broyard

Linguistic Fire Drill

NEW YORK — The phrase "Chinese fire drill" which means "a state of frenetic confusion or wild disorder," has puzzled me for years. I remember working at the White House when nearly every day seemed like a Chinese fire drill.

Where does it come from? National slurs are common in English — from "drunk courage" (drunkenness) to "Mexican breakfast" (a glass of water and a cigarette) to "the English disease" (stagnation) — and the Chinese need not feel put upon. Perhaps the mysterious derogation comes from the vocabulary of the open road: In the December, 1962 issue of American Speech, Don Dempsey, a former traffic officer in the California Highway Patrol, compiled a glossary of traffic lingo and defined the term as "an accident scene of great confusion, such as a school-bus or cattle-truck upset."

Gerard Dalquist of Barnhart Books says that when he attended Lehman College in New York City in the late 1960s, the term was applied to a collegiate prank in which a group of students would jump out of a car as it stopped for a red light, run around the car several times and jump back in just as the light turned to green. Sol Steinmetz, the neologistic hawkshaw, observes that "it is interesting that motor vehicles are involved in both of these usages. But the relationship between vehicular confusion and a fire drill is obscure. I suspect, however, that the term originated in a disparaging ethnic joke implied in the facetious use of 'fire drill,' which is a very orderly and practiced activity, to mean a condition of great disorder and confusion. Why Chinese? "In the 1950s, when the term apparently originated, the Chinese were very much out of favor in this country."

meant a noisy, badly executed attack: the Chinese national anthem meant any loud explosion, especially of a bomb or shell not close enough to be taken seriously; and a Chinese landing, sometimes meant a plane crash. Why Chinese took on this derogatory meaning of confused or laughably unsuccessful I don't know — perhaps English-speaking servicemen found the Chinese language and ways of doing things very foreign and confusing.

None of these wordmen is (yes, none is) happy with having speculate about the origin of the phrase. If a member of the Lexicographic Irregulars can find a citation before World War II, or has another theory, it will be welcomed. Whenever this question is asked at a dictionary headquarters, it causes much disorganized scurrying about, which some Chinese visitors have taken to calling "an American fire drill."

FALL FASHION has pulled up lamé — that is, the metallic look has taken over. Ask for a "metal tape" and you don't know whether you're going to transport yourself into the frontiers of stereo recording or measure your hem.

These fabrics with an evil glint are part of the Opulent Era. (In fashionese, an "era" is a month or so; if it lasts a whole season, it is an "epoch." The ultimate length of time "age" is not used in the fashion industry, but "ice age" aptly describes that time of life when a woman feels free to wear all her diamonds.) Although ostentatious is derogated by snob dressing, "opulent" is a work-ethic word, from opus, "a work," which leads to riches. In this, fashion is once again leading politics, anticipating a return to the gold standard.

The Far East dominates the 1981 fashion line. Eleanor Lambert tells me: Samurai flashes with short barrel coats, full pleated knee pants, side-fastened bodices, all held together with bold and chunky belts and jewelry. A Chinese costume exhibit by the Costume Institute at the Metropolitan Museum of Art boosted the Manchurian, an embroidered jacket with narrow rim collar and kimono sleeves worn over neck-padded pants (narrow, cropped above the ankle), especially functional for those fashionable women who spend their days doing stoop labor in the fields.

A Dissent on California Wines

PARIS — I used to be among those who were constantly trying to write something perceptive and flattering about California wines. "The California miracle . . . 30 years ago an industry in ruins . . . up from the ashes of Prohibition . . . new wineries every week . . . better and better . . . more and more" — nothing original, but heartfelt.

Not surprisingly, a couple of years in Europe, away from that charged atmosphere, effects a few changes. Actually I started fairly early in my tour. Lonely travelers would appear bearing California wines in their kits. They — the wines, not the travelers — seemed to have lost some of their charm, the reds in particular. Was it some kind of latent snobism coming to the fore? Was it possible to become the Henry James of wine, eager to embrace the Old World and shuck off the New?

Unremitting Enthusiasm Then there were a couple of trips home and the concomitant access to plenty of California wine. Same results. I found myself asking, reluctantly, what all the fuss was about? The wines were good, some of them, and often delightful to drink. But the unremitting enthusiasm of their fans and promoters, the breathlessness, seemed excessive. The miracle seemed a bit more commonplace; it appeared that, having expressed our amazement that the dog could talk, it was time to determine what it might have to say.

A Load of Bricks Ask a professional marketing man about wine statistics and he will dazzle you with charts: huge increases in purchases, in per capita consumption; the United States becoming a wine-drinking nation. Then ask him about what the United States drinks. Wine dwindles into relative insignificance. Another batch of charts will show that while it is true that consumption has gone up, it is also true that the number of people who drink wine has not. In other words, a relatively small number of people are drinking more and more wine.

is highly prized by the cognoscenti, so much so that the wine maker-proprietor can sell everything he makes with his selling list. So desirable are these bottles that there is a second list of people waiting to get on the master list. My friend was ecstatic because he had been able to take over a place on the master list from a friend who had decided that he preferred drugs to wine.

This particular winery does produce good wines, but not all are worth getting in line for. The notion that one winery will turn out consistently superior wines, year in year out, the way Cartier does watches, is absurd. This is not wine drinking; it is a kind of bush-league elitism, like wearing clothes with someone else's name on them.

Not that elitism is confined to the customers. An astute Frenchwoman said years in the wine trade said recently: "I adore the California chardonnays, but I don't know what to do with them. They certainly don't go with meals." She was half right. They are meant to go with meals, but many of them do not. Like overbred dogs, they have gone beyond their original purpose. They are too aggressive, too alcoholic. They are showoff wines made by vintners who seem to be saying, "I can out-chardonnay any kid on this block."

We took one of those macho white wines from a famous North Coast winery to a dinner at a three-star restaurant in the French countryside. We matched it with a famous Burgundy. Both were chardonnays, from optimum vintages and in the same price range. At first the California wine was impressive and the
