WASHINGTON — Eastern Europe's most liberal Communist politicians are publicly describing the recent Soviet party conference as a breakthrough for the cause of reform, but there is continuing concern in their ranks about the opposition facing the Soviet leader, Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

In Poland and Hungary, the two Warsaw Pact countries that have gone the furthest in liberalizing the Soviet-style economic and political systems, the four-day Moscow conference has been depicted as a decisive confirmation of Mr. Gorbachev's policies. "Four days that shook the world," was the summary of a Polish Politburo member, Szymon Czajka.

"What was my hope so far is now a certainty," said Imre Pozsgay, the leading liberal in Hungary's Politburo. "Radical change and reform are going on in the Soviet Union."

Both Mr. Czajka and Mr. Pozsgay predicted that the outcome of the conference, which adopted a number of resolutions outlining major reforms of the Soviet party, political system and economy.

Strike Begins in Armenia
MOSCOW — The airport in the Armenian capital of Yerevan has been closed after activists called a general strike in the republic over a territorial dispute with Azerbaijan, officials in the city said Tuesday.

"The airport is at a standstill," a spokesman for the Armenian Foreign Ministry said. The strike was organized by the government newspaper Izvestia and an official of the state airline Aeroflot. Yerevan residents said many factories in the city were closed Tuesday. "The situation is tense," an Armenian said.

Izvestia said the strike call came after mass meetings in Yerevan's Opera Square on Sunday and Monday to discuss the disputed region of Nagorno-Karabakh.

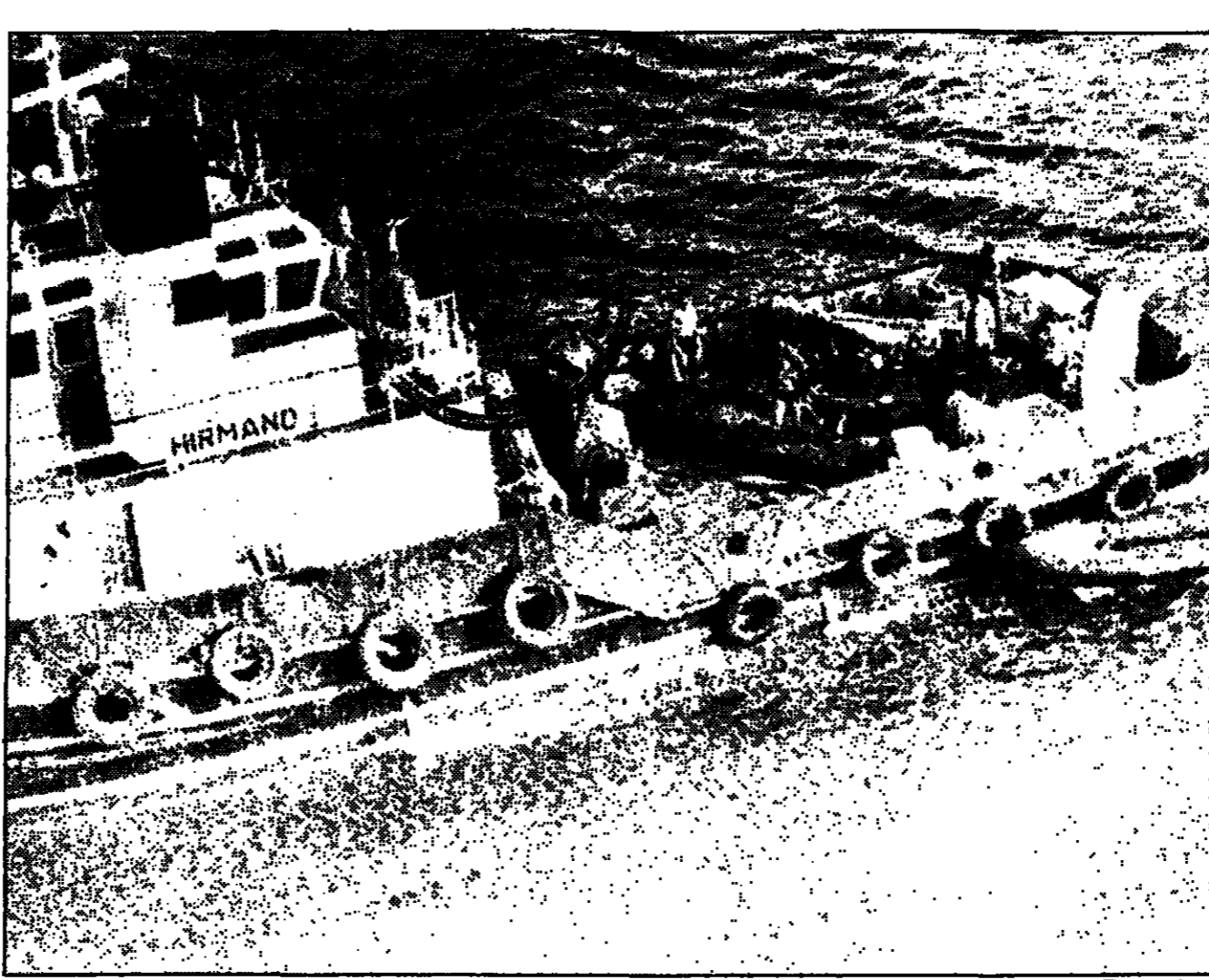

Iran Airliner Also Sent Code Used by F-14, Pentagon Says

WASHINGTON — Pentagon officials said Tuesday that the U.S. cruiser Vincennes fired two missiles at an Iranian passenger plane after the ship picked up and decoded an electronic message that indicated the craft was an Iranian F-14 fighter plane.

U.S. Defense Department officials said the Aegis guided missile cruiser, the most advanced in the U.S. Navy, detected both military and civilian electronic signals from the Iran Air A-300 Airbus.

A Defense Department spokesman, Dan Howard, said Pentagon officials did not know why the civilian plane was transmitting the military code, which must be manually set on the craft's electronic gear before it takes off.

However, the Iranian ambassador to the United Nations, Mohammed Jaafar Mahallati, said at a news conference in New York on Tuesday that, contrary to assertions by U.S. officials, the Iranian airliner was sending out "normal signals" to all radar that it was a civilian plane. The Associated Press reported.

The Defense Department spokesman said that a nearby U.S. frigate, the Sides, had detected only routine civilian aircraft signals from the Iranian airliner.

Admiral William J. Crowe Jr., chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, had refused on Sunday to elaborate on the "electronic messages" received by the Vincennes that indicated it was being approached by a potentially hostile aircraft, saying the information was secret.

Mr. Howard said Tuesday that his statement represented the first acknowledgment by the Pentagon that it has the ability to break the codes on the Iranian military attack planes.

He explained that all aircraft have an electronic system, called a Mode 3, which identify the aircraft as either military or civilian on air traffic control frequencies.

Mr. Howard said that only military aircraft, however, transmit coded electronic signals on a Mode 2 transponder. Both the civilian and military transponders emit electronic codes that may be picked up through electronic queries by a ship's IF system — for identification, friend or foe.

Pentagon officials said the electronic codes emitted by the Iranian aircraft's Mode 2 were "associated" with similar signals that have been detected from Iranian F-14 fighters.

Earlier, Pentagon sources had said that the skipper of the Vincennes, responding to volumes of electronic data spit from the ship's powerful radar and computer systems, received conflicting information on the approaching Iranian aircraft, prompting him initially to delay his decision to fire two Standard missiles.

While there were indications that the aircraft was displaying "hostile intent" — it headed straight toward the ship and failed to respond to continuous warnings, U.S. officials said — there were other contradictory characteristics, the sources said.

Reagan Hints Indemnity Is Possible

WASHINGTON — President Ronald Reagan said on Tuesday that he believed the United States had apologized sufficiently for the downing of an Iranian airliner by a U.S. warship.

But during a brief question-and-answer session with reporters, Mr. Reagan did not rule out U.S. compensation to families of the 290 people killed Sunday in the incident over the Gulf.

Asked if he thought the United States had apologized sufficiently for the downing of the Iranian plane, Mr. Reagan emphatically replied: "Yes."

On Sunday, he had expressed "regret" for "a terrible human tragedy."

Some Unanswered Questions About Flight 655

WASHINGTON — Critical questions about the downing of an Iranian airliner by the U.S. cruiser Vincennes on Sunday remain unanswered as the U.S. and Iranian authorities continue separate investigations of the incident.

Why did Iran Air Flight 655 not heed three warnings issued by the U.S. cruiser on civilian distress frequencies, as the United States has asserted? The warnings were monitored by vessels in the region, according to Italian Navy authorities.

Were the Iranian air traffic controllers and the pilot of the jetliner aware that they were flying into a area where fighting was taking place?

Why was the skipper of the Vincennes, a guided-missile cruiser, unable to confirm that the plane shot down was on a regularly scheduled civilian flight, information that was contained in the airline guide to scheduled flights? The plane was less than an hour off schedule.

If the plane was slightly off course and outside the normal commercial air corridor, as U.S. military officials have said, how had the flight gone astray? Pentagon officials have stressed that the plane was four to five miles west of the normal air corridor from Bandar Abbas to Dubai. The officials have cited this to justify the

Unwanted PLO Gunmen on Road Again

BEIRUT — The scene has become familiar: Palestinian gunmen being evacuated from one place to another. It has been repeated so many times that a radio station here advised the Palestine Liberation Organization it would save money by setting up its own travel agency.

"We've become the football of the Middle East, kicked around by Arabs, Israelis, and by our own kind," said Khaled Bishrawi, 22, who was among 120 guerrillas loyal to Yasser Arafat who were evacuated Tuesday from one refugee district in Beirut to another in southern Lebanon.

The evacuees, some accompanied by wives and children, were put on two trucks to make the 40-kilometer (25-mile) trip to Sidon. This time, their escorts were 26 Libyan military observers.

The Arafat loyalists had lost a 50-day battle with PLO opponents for control of the Chatila shantytown, and they were given a choice: Abandon Mr. Arafat or leave.

Italy Denies Ship Knew Jet Position

ROME — The Italian Navy denied Tuesday that one of its frigates in the Gulf had clearly fixed the position of the Iran Air airliner before it was shot down by the U.S. cruiser Vincennes.

Prime Minister Ciriaco De Mita rejected calls Tuesday, from opposition leaders in Parliament for the removal of Italian warships from the Gulf, but he said the fleet would not remain there "forever."

A navy statement said the officers of the Espero, which was on escort duty in the Strait of Hormuz at the time, "was 70 miles [110 kilometers] from the scene and never had reliable radar contact with the Iranian airliner."

On Monday, a Naval Ministry spokesman told Reuters that officers who had been monitoring radar screens aboard the Espero said the plane "appeared to be slightly outside the space reserved for commercial traffic," a statement that supported U.S. assertions.

New York Fed Fills No. 2 Post

NEW YORK — The Federal Reserve Bank of New York, the unit through which the U.S. central bank intervenes in currency markets, has named James H. Oltman first vice president and chief administrative officer, the No. 2 post.

Mr. Oltman, 57, will serve directly under E. Gerald Corrigan, the bank's president. Mr. Oltman succeeds Thomas M. Timlen, who took early retirement on July 1.

Mr. Oltman has been with the bank for 27 years. He was executive vice president and special counsel. In his new post, Mr. Oltman will be an alternate member of the monetary policy group.

Prospects Brighten for Lower U.S. Interest Rates

NEW YORK — As the second half of the year begins, the prospects for lower U.S. interest rates over the next six months seem far brighter than most analysts thought possible even a month ago.

Given the volatility from January to June, when yields on 30-year Treasury bonds dipped as low as 8.29 percent in early February and moved as high as 9.35 percent in late May, the outlook presented by a number of economists is loaded with caveats.

More than a few analysts maintained that a strong economy and further increases in inflation mean that rates will be higher by the end of 1988.

At the end of a topsy-turvy week, the 30-year issue closed at a yield of 8.83 percent last Friday, down slightly from the 8.87 percent it returned on June 24.

Even the pessimists conceded that two recent developments — the rise in the value of the dollar and the decline in oil prices — should tend to offset the sharp rise in agricultural products and dampen inflationary expectations.

David Hale, chief economist at Kemper Financial Services in Chicago, said that until recently he had been a bear on bonds.

"I would have thought that double-digit bond yields would have been inevitable at some point in the next 12 months, and perhaps sooner," Mr. Hale said.

"Now, with the fall in the oil price and the rise in the dollar, they may stay well below that. That would be particularly true if this drop in oil prices prompts Congress to cut the federal budget deficit by passing an oil import tax."

The Federal Reserve System indicated earlier in the year that its monetary policy would not be influenced by a drop in oil prices.

With a stronger dollar, the oil-price drop makes it much less likely that the Fed will be forced to tighten policy and push up interest rates.

"The Fed is starting at the best of all possible situations as we move into the second half," said Edward Yardeni, chief economist at Prudential-Bache Securities Inc.

"The dollar certainly doesn't need any help, especially since the Toronto summit. The economy is chugging along at around a 3 percent rate. Wage gains are not too high. And if oil prices fall further, the Fed, regardless of what it says, could be forced to ease. There is a

good chance that yields on the long bond will be close to 8 percent by the end of the year."

In addition, election year pressures will start to build in the second half, acting as a further disincentive for the Fed to alter its policy mix.

"The Fed likes to keep its head down during election years," said David Wyss, chief financial economist at Data Resources Inc.

Pressures on the Fed could re-emerge in a hurry, however, particularly if the dollar either continues its upward run or if it comes under attack later in the year.

"A rise in the value of the dollar from 125 Japanese yen to 134 Japanese yen is not going to change the

world," said Donald J. Fine, chief market analyst at Chase Manhattan Bank.

He argued, however, that the Fed has to be worried about a surge in the dollar because it would probably bring a quick end to the capital-spending boom and hurt plans for the economy.

In its semiannual economic forecast, the American Bankers Association's economic advisory committee projects that economic growth in the second half will rise at a 2.8 percent rate, with a modest increase in inflation.

The analysis agree that for the next week or so, price movements in the bond market will remain choppy.

Bundesbank Says It Knows of No U.S.-Japan Dollar Pact

FRANKFURT — The vice president of the West German central bank said Tuesday that the Bundesbank is not aware of an agreement between the United States and Japan to allow the dollar to appreciate.

Heinrich Schlesinger, the Bundesbank's vice president, denied his institution knew of such an accord when asked to comment on currency market speculation that the two countries had agreed to allow the dollar to appreciate 10 percent from its levels at the end of 1987.

"No, we do not know of anything like that," Mr. Schlesinger said.

Mr. Schlesinger also restated the West German central bank's opposition to a weakening of the Deutsche mark from its current levels.

"Our aim is that if possible we want no further devaluation," he said.

The Bundesbank president, Karl Otto Pöhl, has said that a further devaluation of the mark is not desirable. The West German central bank has since raised interest rates, boosting its discount rate to 3 percent from 2.5 percent and its key securities repurchase agreement to 3.75 percent from 3.25 percent in a bid to defend the mark.

Mr. Schlesinger said he hoped these measures would help support the mark.

The Bundesbank had already intervened heavily in the currency markets this year, he noted. At the end of the first half of 1988, the

West German central bank's dollar reserves totaled slightly more than \$45 billion, \$4.5 billion less than at the end of 1987.

Total net currency reserves had fallen by 12.6 billion DM in the first half of this year, Mr. Schlesinger said. These do not represent the full extent of currency intervention because of dollar inflows and other special transactions.

Intervention cannot achieve much, especially if a central bank is acting alone, Mr. Schlesinger said.

There has been concerted intervention with European central banks, and with the U.S. Federal Reserve Board, but it has not been very balanced, he said.

Mr. Schlesinger also said the Bundesbank does not need to re-

view its 1988 target for monetary growth, even though the West German money supply has been rapidly expanding.

Mr. Schlesinger said the central bank council would review its money supply target later this month, and he said it did not want to anticipate its conclusion.

"But the state of data seems to me to be such that the monetary target for this year has been correctly derived," he said.

The Bundesbank has set a target of 3 to 6 percent for the broad M3 aggregate this year.

Massive capital outflows so far this year, estimated by Mr. Schlesinger in the first half at 50 billion DM, have so far failed to dent

believes the agency will confirm the market's expectation that the crop will be 1.6 billion bushels, down from 1.9 billion bushels last year.

Mr. Schnitker's corn and wheat crop estimates are in line with those of Richard J. Feltes, research director of Refco, Inc., a leading commodities trading firm. Mr. Feltes also estimated last week that the soybean crop would be 1.52 billion bushels, somewhat less than Mr. Schnitker's estimate.

While prices in the commodities markets largely reflect Mr. Schnitker's estimate of the damage, the volatility is likely to continue in anticipation of and reaction to the government estimate.

Traders will also attempt to fine tune their positions to such variables as export sales and changes in domestic consumption brought about by the higher prices.

Such variables will include the augmentation of the corn crop, used largely as livestock feed, by the 4.1 billion bushels, of 56-pounds (25.3 kilograms) each, held in surplus from past harvests. This should be sufficient to meet domestic needs.

The supply should also be enough to meet export needs, which are expected to decline as rising prices force foreign buyers to either reduce purchases or seek other suppliers. About one-fifth of the U.S. corn crop is usually exported, compared with half the wheat and two-thirds of the soybeans and by-products produced each year.

"We believe the drought will have its greatest and most long-lasting impact on wheat and soybeans," Mr. Schnitker said. "As a result, ingredient costs on flour, baked goods, pasta, margarine and vegetable oils generally have and will continue to rise for a long time.

"But if the government continues to release more of the corn reserves, cost increases for corn users may be reduced — if we get some good rains soon."

As for the second largest U.S. crop, wheat, the harvest winter wheat, which is sown in the fall, accounts for 75 percent of the supply of this bread grain and in many areas the harvest has benefited from the dry weather.

But spring-sown wheat, particularly the high quality, protein-rich durum variety used for pasta, has been severely damaged by the drought. Even though the estimate of wheat production is 350 million bushels less than last year's 2.15 billion bushels, there is a surplus from previous harvests of 1.23 billion bushels.

The soybean situation is more critical because there is not as much surplus. There, the carryover is only 275 million bushels.

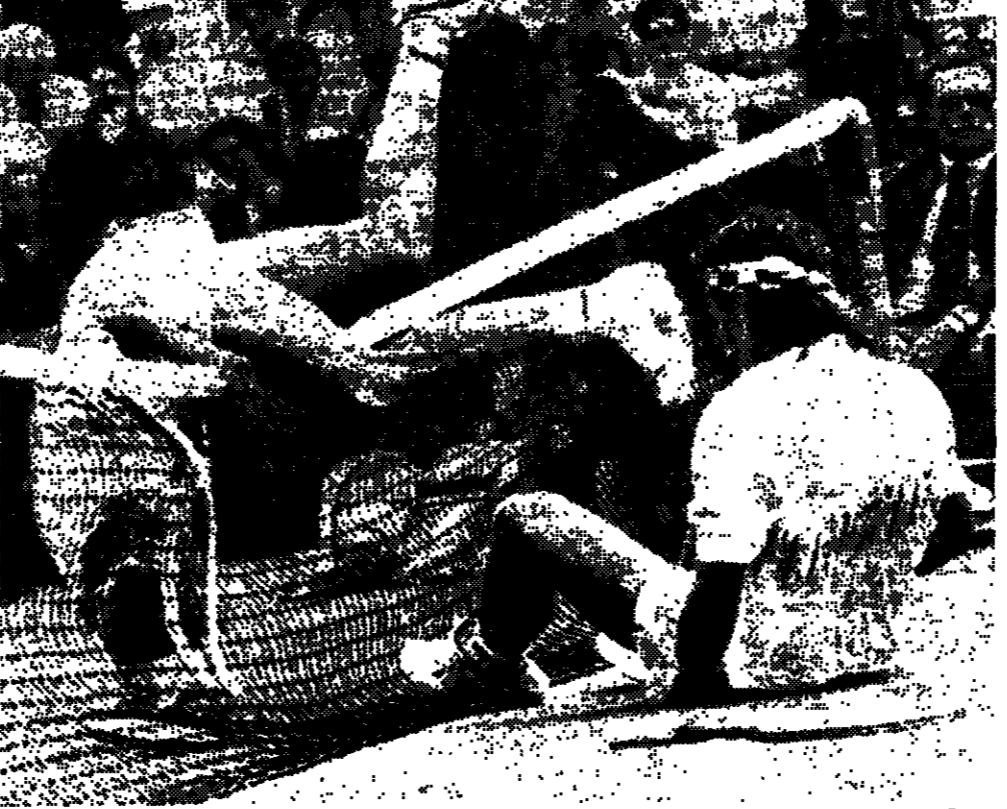

Crusader Delighted By Soccer Invasion

To the world outside the United States, the first revolution in the country's soccer history came with its 1-0 triumph over England in the 1950 World Cup, which was staged in Brazil.

The ultimate for Clive Toye, since he left England in 1967 to crusade for soccer in this country, has been to have the United States stage the World Cup, soccer's quadrennial extravaganza.

Like most of the game's purists, Keough is more interested in the showing of the U.S. team rather than the financial success of the tournament.

Although Toye was told of the decision along with the rest of the U.S. delegation at FIFA's headquarters, he could not quite believe it until he stopped over at London Monday night on his way home.

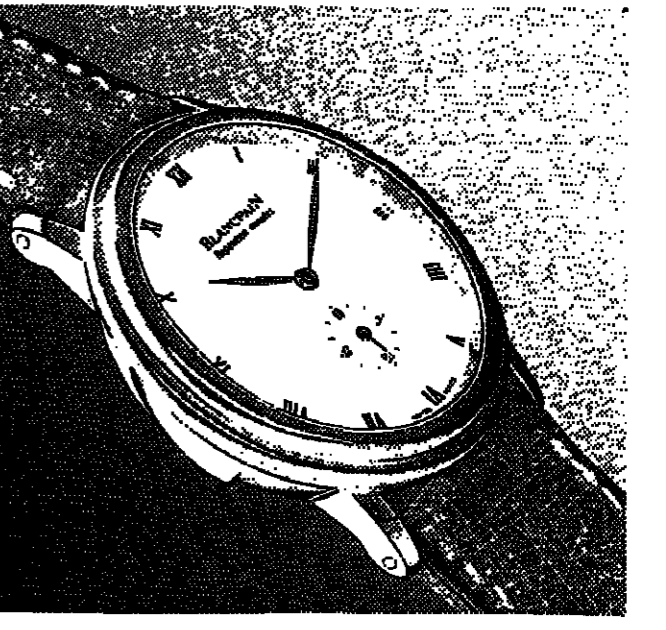
