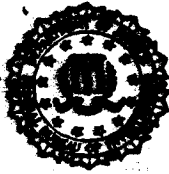

Although it has been rumored that a book on the IRA was being published, it was not known to the Information Office at the Embassy if such a book has actually been published and if HENNESSY is the author. The "Temple News," official newspaper of Temple University, Philadelphia, in its edition of October 22, 1969, contained an article indicating that Dominic Behan, poet, revolutionary, and former employee of the British Broadcasting Corporation, was scheduled to speak on the Irish struggle for freedom on that day. A copy of the announcement is attached hereto, lettered E.

The "Temple News" in its edition of October 23, 1969, contains an article captioned "Irish Fighter Blasts British Atrocities." A copy of this article is attached hereto, lettered F.

The Philadelphia Inquirer, a daily newspaper published in Philadelphia, in its edition for October 25, 1969, contains an article on Page 6 captioned "SDS Begins Three-Day Meeting in Temple Hall." The article reflected that Dominic Behan, spokesman for the Irish Republican Army, author, poet, and brother of the late playwright Brendan Behan, told the gathering:

"We are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution...we're not going to stand idly while genocide might begin in Ireland." Behan said the IRA with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in to defend people, but now we are going further." STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

Irish Fight Back British 'Atrocities'

Dominic Bohan, poet and Irish revolutionary, was to speak yesterday at 2:30 p.m. in Rittenberg Hall, but as of 3:40 had not appeared. In his place Gerald Regime, a soldier from the Irish Republic Army, addressed some 200 students and asked them for financial support and to boycott all British goods.

Regime spoke of the "atrocities" that the British government has been inflicting against citizens of southern Ireland, and asked for financial aid from American citizens so the Irish Republic Army could afford to buy weapons to fight British who are its country.

NOT PATRIOTS

The soldier said that he was very disappointed in the attitude of most Irish-Americans toward their homeland and he called the majority of Irish-Americans hypocrites. Regime added, "Although they may show concern for what is going on in Ireland, when it comes down to taking action they shrug the responsibility and prove themselves to be not patriots at all."

IMPORTED TRAITORS

Regime called the majority of the citizens of Northern Ireland "traitors who were imported to live there by the British." The Irish Republic Army is pledged to remove all foreign inhabitants from Northern Ireland and unite the country.

The soldier described the fighting force he belongs to as an underground army dedicated to protecting the citizens from the "brutality" inflicted upon them by the police of Ireland. He described the police as "tools" of the British government who indiscriminately attack citizens of the country.

SDS Begins 3-Day Meeting In Temple Hall

Students for a Democratic Society opened a three-day regional conference Friday in Temple University's Beury Hall, with about 200 students meeting before a draped Vietcong flag.

Those attending the session, with pictures of Mao Tse-tung, Ho Chi Minh and Lenin on prominent display, were told that the scheduled principal speaker, former SDS national president Carl Oglesby, would not attend because of illness.

Dominic Behan, spokesman for the Irish Republican Army, author, poet and brother of the late playwright Brendan Behan, told the gathering: "We are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution . . . we're not going to stand by idly while genocide might begin in Ireland."

He said the IRA, with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland, "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in to defend people, but now we are going further."

A second speaker, Philadelphia native Noel Ignatin, former national SDS officer, said the movement to the left is "approximately at the same stage that Lenin was in 1894 . . . Russian history tells us that in 1894 to 1899 the Russian revolution made a transition from a movement that was 75 percent students to 50 percent proletariat."

Ignatin said the main task of the U.S. revolutionary is to study U.S. history and its tradition of militancy.

National Association For Irish Justice To Hold Three-Day Conference At City Center

The National Association for Irish Justice, an organization which came into existence this year and which is chiefly known for its work in coordinating the August tour of Bernadette Devlin to America, will sponsor an "international conference" on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 7, 8 and 9, at the City Center, 135 West 55th St., in Manhattan. Brian Heron is the national coordinator of the N.A.I.J.

Among those invited to the conference by the N.A.I.J. are Miss Devlin, an independent M.P. in the British Parliament, Eamon McCann of the Derry Labor Party, Cathal Goulding of the Irish Republican Army, and Kevin Boyle and Michael Farrell of the People's Democracy. There has been no official word as to who will attend the conference although one unofficial report says Mr. McCann and Mr. Boyle plan to be there.

According to an N.A.I.J. statement:

"Delegates from Australia, England, Canada and Ireland as well as representatives from throughout the U.S. will be arriving here next week for the conference."

In the statement the N.A.I.J. says:

"The people of Northern Ireland have been oppressed for over 800 years and something to help them must be done now, we cannot wait until 400 more homes are burnt down, in Belfast and in Derry, nor can we wait until more Irish people must die."

"The N.A.I.J. also stresses that everyone is invited, whether Irish or not, whether black or white. If you are interested in seeing all peoples of the world get the civil rights they deserve, then this conference is for you."

The conference working sessions will begin at 9 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

Local and national affiliate groups of the N.A.I.J. are expected to attend the conference and will vote on matters discussed. However, though everyone is invited to attend, only affiliate delegates will be able to vote.

Entertainment

Entertainment will be featured on Friday and Saturday evenings beginning at 10 p.m. Dominic Behan, playwright and author, who has been in the U.S. on a speaking tour, will make an appearance on Friday, Nov. 7, with folk singer Pete Seeger. Saturday night, Nov. 8, after deliberations have taken place, Mr. Behan will return again with many other entertainers such as the Clancy Brothers, Stanley Abramson from the Village Gate, the Mary Basco Dancers, Mike Joyce (Rovin'

Galwaymen), Ann Byrne, Flaherty and McCrory Folk Singers, Deena Fishman and many others. Admission for the entertainment is \$3.00.

Several of the major Irish American organizations are not supporting the N.A.I.J. conference. Some would not take part in the conference because they were not brought in on the planning of the three-day event, other organizations oppose the political and ideological views of the organizers. Among those not participating are the United Irish Counties Association, the Gaelic Athletic Association, the American Irish Action Committee and the American Congress for Irish Freedom.

Byrne Statement

Eugene J. Byrne, New Jersey state president of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, last week warned Irish-Americans "concerned with the violence in Northern Ireland to be careful with whom they associate in efforts to aid the suffering in Ulster or they will find that they have been duped by persons using the conflict there to further their own ulterior motives."

Mr. Byrne stated that the persons he referred to included Bernadette Devlin, 22-year-old Member of Parliament from Northern Ireland, and Brian Heron, national coordinator of the National Association For Irish Justice. In a statement prepared for the press Mr. Byrne said:

"The N.A.I.J. has called an 'International Conference' for November 7, 8 and 9, in New York City, ostensibly to 'deliberate on the problems of Northern Ireland' and among those invited to the Conference are the leaders of the People's Democracy from Northern Ireland, such as Miss Devlin, Eamonn McCann, Michael Farrell and Kevin Boyle."

"The P.D., as evidenced by their publication, 'Explosion in Ulster', is a radical revolutionary socialist group which is seeking to 'radicalize' the Catholic and Protestant workers in Northern Ireland and link the struggle there to the 'concept of the international proletarian revolution' so that, according to one of its leaders, they can create a socialist workers' republic, 'something along the lines of Cuba'."

Comment From Tyrone

In a letter to the Irish Echo, Mrs. Patricia McCluskey, writing from Dungannon, Co. Tyrone, for the Campaign for Social Justice, had this to say:

"I am writing to you to set the record straight. I have been notified about the first annual conference sponsored by the Association for Irish Justice to

be held soon in New York. According to my information Miss G. Devlin, M.P., Frank Gogarty (chairman of N.I.C.R.A.), E. McCann, K. Boyle and M. Farrell are scheduled to attend. This is a considerable shock to me, as it is to my husband, since it is the first we have heard of it, except for Mr. Gogarty speaking vaguely to a group going to the States a couple of months ago.

"Both of us are founder members of the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association and my husband has always been on the Executive and has not missed any meetings recently. Our own organization, the Campaign for Social Justice in N. I., has no connection with N.I.C.R.A., although some of our members are members of it."

"Of these invited guests to the New York symposium all the five members except Miss Devlin and E. McCann, are executive members of N.I.C.R.A. The five are, or were, members of the very left wing People's Democracy, which was castigated by the Cameron Commission, and some have close connections with the International Socialists. They are not a true cross-section of the civil rights movement, although they displayed real heroism on the Burntollet march..."

"With regard to the claim (6/6/69) that Brian Heron and his National Association for Irish Justice are the sole agents for N.I.C.R.A. in the U.S.A., my husband has no recollection of any meeting which passed this, nor has a minute to support it been produced at his request."

"We in the civil rights movement are under great stress from sections who try from time to time to exploit it, to their own advantage, and we in the middle are trying all the time to prevent one or other militant group from taking over."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxist-Leninism. MICHAEL HICKSON, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country. (u)

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention. (u)

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions. (u)

BLACK PANTHER PARTY

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer. (u)

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed. (u)

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following: (u)

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power.. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere." (u)

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "... we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it." (u)

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun." (u)

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States. (u)

The Annual Fall Dance of Sean Oglaigh is being held on Sat. Nov. 15th at the Irish Institute, 326 W. 48 St. The entire proceeds of this affair will be donated to a fund to help the two L.R.A. prisoners who were sentenced to 7 year in jail.

This is a very worthy cause. I hope to meet all my Irish Republican friends there.

Annual Conf. For Irish Justice in Irish City Center Conference

The first annual conference of the National Association for Irish Justice will be held at the City Center, 125 West 12th St., on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 1, 2 and 3. Purpose of the conference according to the NAIIJ statement is to deliberate on the problems in Northern Ireland and to discuss the present status of the Irish National Delegates from around the world have been invited to attend. Among them are Frank J. Ryan, leader of the Civil Rights Association in Northern Ireland, Bernadette Devlin, M.P., the only Ulster, other civil rights leaders and representatives from Great Britain and the Irish Republican Army.

Local and national affiliate groups of the NAIIJ are expected to attend the conference and will vote on matters discussed. However, though everyone is invited to attend, only affiliate delegates will be able to vote.

According to its statement the NAIIJ "works in conjunction with the Civil Rights Association in Northern Ireland in helping the people in the North. It has collected many hundreds of dollars from people throughout the United States as a result of Miss Devlin's tour, and it helped to coordinate the tour as well."

Brian Heron, national coordinator of the NAIIJ, and other spokesmen of the group, are actively seeking participation in the conference by Irish organizations, as well as political, civic and student groups. Some Irish groups have signified their intention not to support the convention.

Among these groups is the American Irish Action Committee. In a statement issued last week the Action Committee said:

"At a special meeting held at the Irish Institute on Oct. 25, 1969, of the American Irish Action Committee -- a delegated body representing prominent Irish and Irish American associations -- voted to drop the civil rights movement in Ireland -- it was decided not to affiliate with the National Association for Irish Justice and to take no part in, or responsibility for, the forthcoming conference of that group."

The statement was signed by Michael Shanahan, president and Matthew P. Higgins, acting secretary.

This view was disputed by Tom Noonan, vice president of the Action Committee. In a letter to the press, he wrote:

"As vice president of the American Irish Action Committee, I was surprised to learn that a meeting of the committee was held last Wednesday or night without notifying a majority of the membership or myself, as an officer of the committee. At the time of the previous meeting the secretary of the committee was notified of a meeting. Only 11 of the 23 member groups were notified that such a meeting was to take place. The usual practice of the committee is to notify all members by mail at least four days ahead of the meeting. The secretary usually follows up with a phone call in the case of an emergency meeting. To disregard the fact that 12 groups were not notified of a meeting is an obvious denial of democratic practice."

"This illegal meeting was used by this minority to undermine the decisions made at previous meetings of the Action Committee. At a public meeting on Sept. 21, 1969 the committee decided to continue its affiliation to the National Association for Irish Justice. This decision was reaffirmed at a later Board of Directors' meeting. The board recommended that all its groups affiliate with the NAIIJ and support the upcoming conference."

A special meeting was called on Wed. evening at the Irish bar, by the American Irish Association, to discuss the five contributions to a letter sent out by the Nat. Association for Irish Justice. The basis of this letter was to try to bring under its jurisdiction all Irish American organizations in the U.S. Its greeting carried the lovely words - Dear Affiliate Members - and was sent out on the stationery of the American Irish Action Committee, whose chairman is Richard Flannery and who will not authorize the sending of this letter or its make-up. The contents of opinion is that a convention will be called by the National Association for Irish Justice in N.Y. for the 7th Sun Day of Nov. and this was used as a publicity stunt to impress the heads of these organizations and their members, plus Irish Americans, that they and they alone are the only organization that can help in this battle for social justice in Northern Ireland. The letter asks for \$50. from each organization to offset the expenses of the convention. They also ask for unity and solidarity in an effort to aid our countrymen in Northern Ireland.

In calling the meeting to order and after reading the letter which brought them there, Mr. Flannery gave a clear synopsis of this National Assoc. for Irish Justice from the very beginning. After bringing the heads of the many organizations to the front over to the floor for debate. We appeal to all organizations to be on the alert and watch out for those who would destroy and tear down a reputation that has been maintained down through the centuries. Support your organization and make sure that it is always in good shape, in case of emergency. Those people living behind barricades in Northern Ireland plead for our help and we must not fail them in their hour of need. Support the affairs that are sending help in their own names and you will be doing an act of charity of which you can be rightly proud.

instructed to learn that a meeting
of the committee was held last
night without notifying a ma-
jority of the membership or any-

It is becoming more and more evident every day that conspirators against the civil rights of Northern Ireland are beginning to take forces in an attempt to sabotage the upcoming International Irish Conference, sponsored by the National Association which is planned for November 7th, 8th and 9th in the City Center, 135 West 55th St., N. Y.C. The conspirators have attempted to silence the majority of Irish and Irish American opinion on the Irish question by an attack both in print and by the ending of secret meetings.

One columnist made a grave error by forgetting his Irish history and attacked on personal levels. His bending of a Donahoe issue concerning money collected by Bernadette Devlin was finally put to rest by Verbitsky when she stated on October 27th that all money collected by her with the help of the National Association for Irish Justice had been received by her. In fact the charge was truly answered more than one month ago when a financial statement was issued by the 210 East 23rd St. office of the N.A.I.J. showing money totals collected and pledged and noting areas where difficulties had arisen in the transfer of money to Belfast.

We then have the co-conspirators led by Michael Flannery, the one-third of the 'American Irish Action Committee' who chose to disaffiliate from the N.A.I.J., an action contrary to the unanimous vote taken by the entire Action Committee. They are now holding to step behind the recognized strength of the N.A.I.J. the only representative of the Civil Rights Association in Northern Ireland.

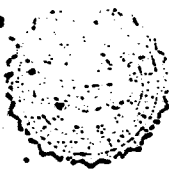

Gogarty reportedly concluded his remarks with the statement, "If any society is not prepared to continue its support in the understanding we shall work out through this conference, then I say, just leave us alone and allow us to get on unhindered with the task in our own way."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 203, 1603 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

The National Association for Irish Justice held its first conference last weekend in the City Center Ballroom. It was neither as controversial as some of its detractors had expected nor as momentous as some of its advocates had hoped.

The conference or convention as it was often called really operated on two levels. There was the tedious business of launching the young organization. This was accomplished by long working sessions on Saturday and Sunday which elected officers, passed resolutions and drew up a constitution. This was of paramount interest to Brian Henon, key figure at the conference, and the other members of the N.A.I.J. inner circle.

The second side of the conference embraced the visitors from overseas and could be described as mainly informational with public relations overtones. A variety of views were articulated by the visitors. Dr. Frank Gogarty, a Belfast dentist, chairman of the Civil Rights Association, reiterated his organization's endorsement of the N.A.I.J. In a surprising statement at the end of his formal speech, Dr. Gogarty said:

"If any society is not prepared to contribute its support in the understanding we shall work out through this conference, then I say, just leave us alone and allow us to get on unhindered with the task in our own way."

Virtually all the major Irish American organizations were not represented at the conference.

Workers Republic

Two of the visitors from Belfast, Kevin Boyle and Eilise McDermott, represented the left wing People's Democracy. Mr. Boyle, 26, a vigorous advocate, is also on the executive board of the Civil Rights Association. He is a lecturer in law in Queen's University, Belfast.

Miss McDermott, 19, is a law student in Queen's University. In an address to the conference she struck the People's Democracy theme. She said:

"People's Democracy, as you will know, has been active in the struggle for civil rights for more jobs and houses and against Toryism North and South. It believes that its objectives can only be obtained by the ousting of both Tory Governments and the setting up of an Irish Workers Republic. We arrived at this decision after considering three basic factors, all of which occurred post-August this year. The first factor which we considered was the Protestant backlash and the threat of Orange fascism. The second one considered by us was the use of eight and a half thousand British troops in Northern Ireland. The third factor was the necessity for support for our cause from the South."

Another View

Another guest speaker, Mrs. Maire Martin, co-treasurer of the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association of London, took quite a different tack.

Mrs. Martin, who is originally from Belfast, had this to say:

"We preach no political ideology, right, left or center. Our demands are those of the civil rights movement. Our objects are: 1) to publicize the aims and purposes of the Civil Rights Association and to give them complete support. 2) to give the public in London an opportunity to voice their condemnation of the happenings in Northern Ireland and to bring pressure to bear on the government at Westminster towards the enjoyment of civil rights by all the people of Northern Ireland."

From Dublin came Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the Irish Republican Army. He said:

"The I.R.A. supports the civil rights movement but our ultimate objective is a free Ireland and a 32 County Republic. Ireland belongs to the Irish people. We must maintain Irish people in their own country. We believe the resources of Ireland belong to the Irish people. The I.R.A. is ever alert. We have never sat back and waited. Our policy in the I.R.A. is to free Ireland and have peace and justice for all."

Other speakers during the conference included former New York City Councilman Paul O'Dwyer, Deputy Mayor Timothy Costello, who opened the conference and Dominick Lohan.

Conference Work

The visiting speakers aside, the main work of the conference was hammering out agreement over the various resolutions.

On Saturday several controversial resolutions were put forward. One, for instance, called for condemnation of U.S. policy in Vietnam. Many amendments were put forward by the 133 delegates from 21 organizations participating. There seemed to

be, at least generally, a left-right confrontation with delegates from student groups supporting proposals for N.A.I.J. involvement in U.S. and international affairs, while delegates from Irish American organizations in Brooklyn and Queens supporting an "Irish issue" only policy.

After caucuses on Saturday night and Sunday morning the following statement was issued by the Steering Committee concerning the list of amendments:

"It is evident that a discussion of each individual resolution and amendments related to the position of the N.A.I.J. on problems not directly affecting the Irish people would be time consuming and divisive. Therefore the Steering Committee has drawn up a general statement

of policy."

The statement read:

"The purpose of the N.A.I.J. is to establish broad public support for the United States for the demands of the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association and self-determination for the people of Ireland. The N.A.I.J. is an association of diverse groups united in their support for the Irish people. Consequently, the N.A.I.J. should not take specific stands on issues not directly related to the Irish situation. However, this in no way limits the prerogative of local autonomous groups or affiliates to take specific stands.

"The National Association For Irish Justice supports the struggle to achieve equal rights for all people. It also supports the right of every man to a standard of living which allows him

to live with dignity. Finally, the N.A.I.J. supports the right of every nation to self-determination, and reiterates its opposition to any form of economic, political, or military imperialism."

Other resolutions called for the freeing of political prisoners in Northern Ireland; supported armed self-defense when necessary; urged the boycott of British goods; supported the teaching of Irish history in American colleges and high schools; urged action at the U.N. on the Irish question; and called for the U.S. Government to discontinue financial aid to Britain.

In a matter related to the conference it was learned by the Irish Echo that several of the visitors from across the Atlantic

met with spokesmen of some of the major Irish organizations not participating in the conference. After a vigorous discussion of the issues surrounding the "split" here no progress was made in reconciling the various groups.

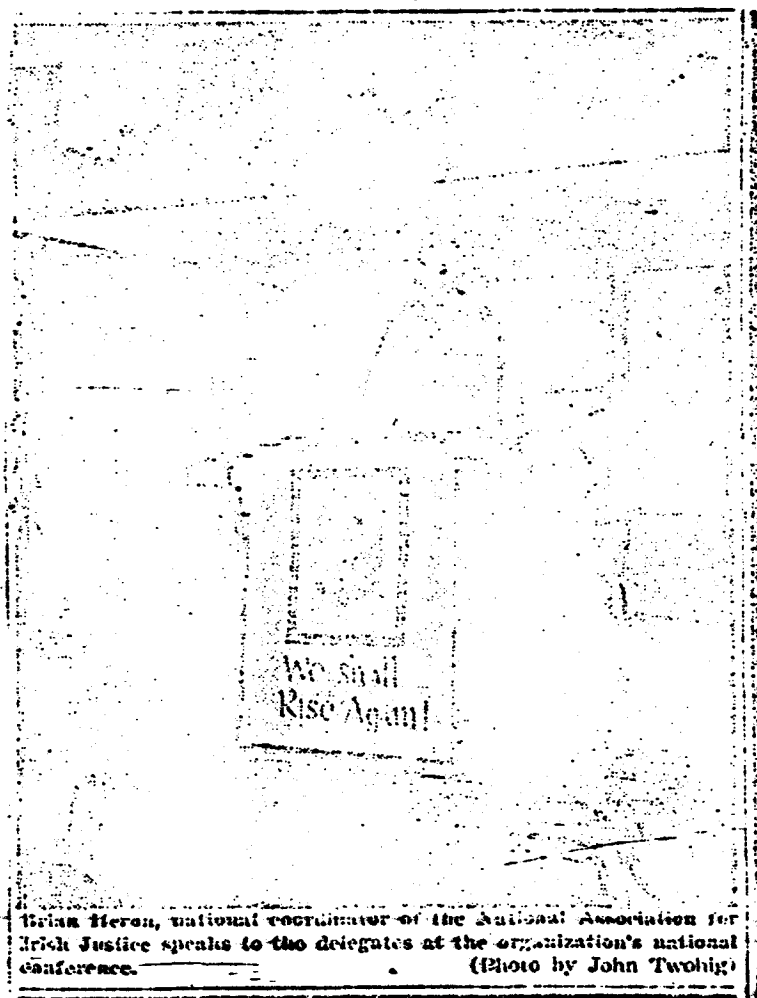

Speech By Dr. Frank Gogarty

CONFIDENTIAL

"This is an historic occasion. Never since the great days of Sinn Féin have so many Irish-American scholars been brought together at any one time for the single cause of justice for Northern Ireland.

"I commend the National Association for Irish Justice for their achievement—an achievement, however, which could not have been possible but for all those people who behind the scenes have worked so hard over the past few months to make this occasion a success. It is people like these who are the backbone of our movement. On behalf of the executive of the Civil Rights Association, I would like to record our appreciation and gratitude for their tireless devotion to our cause.

"Of people like Pat Garland, Leonie O'Brien and Brian Heron who, out of nothing, have created this dynamic organization. I have only the highest praise. I recognize the great efforts required and the long hours they devoted to their mission. The National Association which they have labored to establish is a credit to them and we in Northern Ireland—especially the people of the barricades, have much to be grateful for as a result of these efforts. It was natural, therefore, that when Bernadette Devlin came to America to raise funds for relief that it was to this National Association she turned to organize her tour. I wish this conference every success.

"At this point it will be necessary to re-examine the relationship of the C.R.A. and the N.A.I.J. and before I do so I would like, first of all, to list the demands of our movement. Our aim—since Britain is morally responsible for all the injustices in Northern Ireland—has been to urge the Westminster Government to legislate directly to ensure basic civil rights for all the citizens of Northern Ireland. Such legislation under section 75 of the Ireland Act of 1926 would guarantee:

1. Universal adult suffrage at 18 in all elections;
2. All electoral boundary revisions by a Westminster commission;

3. Repeal of the Special Powers Act and the Public Order Act (together with the amending bill) to ensure that every individual is free from arbitrary interference by the state and all groups have the right to freedom of peaceful assembly and association;

4. The outlawing of discrimination and incitement of religious hatred;

5. The disbandment of the Ulster Special Constabulary and the creation of independent machinery to enquire into citizens' grievances against members of the police force.

"Over the past 12 months we in the civil rights movement have campaigned hard and always our tactics have been strictly non-violent. Despite this, however, innocent lives have been lost, hundreds have been maimed and thousands have had to flee their blazing homes in terror of the violent forces unleashed against them. For the past year the people of Northern Ireland have had to endure an agency of civil strife, and in spite of all this—after all the fear, the terror, and the physical suffering; after all the vast devastation of property, we are almost as far from winning those fundamental rights which we demand and which are the God-given heritage proper to the full dignity of mankind.

"Other speakers from Northern Ireland will assess just how much or how little we have won and I will only cover briefly the purpose of our visit and how we evaluate your involvement.

"Your societies over here are many and varied—some exile, some cultural, others political. All, however, are united by a common bond—a fellow feeling of sympathy for the people of Northern Ireland. Your difference from each other is the badge of your identity—a thing to be cherished and proud of.

"But the passion for freedom which characterizes the Irish is a common bond which unites us all. And it is this bond which must be emphasized and consolidated in a union of purpose.

"We in the civil rights movement have in the past been torn by internal dissensions -- by jealousies and uncharitable suspicions. We have, I hope, seen the last of these things. The danger, as I see it now, is that much of the internal conflict which threatened to shatter our movement in the early spring of this year has become transplanted unto the American scene. This danger is very real and must be resisted.

"That is why, I believe, it is so important for all of us here today to play an earnest and sincere part in this conference. There are occasions for voicing differences, but this is neither the time nor place. Here today we must unite under the banner of justice--the National Association for Irish Justice. The N.A.I.J. is your organization, and what you make of it depends entirely on you and you alone. Here I would like to endorse what Brian Heron said that the National Association is the only organization mandated by our executive to speak on our behalf of the N.A.I.J. and as such, its main function for us is to mobilize and coordinate the activities of all other sympathetic organizations. It is an umbrella association within which each society and group has its own personal contribution to make without any loss of autonomy or identity. We all hope that the committee which you elect at this conference will be broadly representative of Irish American societies in general. This, I believe, will be a measure of your strength and potential.

"Since our arrival here we have been made aware of the sharp divisions which preoccupy the time and energies of Irish American groups.

"What is it in we Irish that makes us each believe that he alone knows best how to undo Irish wrongs? Why is it that we must always attack--not the injustices, mark you, but our fellow Irishmen who believe just as passionately as we do in the cause of justice. Because we know best we dragged Pay-doll into the gutter. In our wis-

dom we persecuted O'Donnell, Rosa and without a conscience we murdered Michael Collins.

"There are many, I fear, only too anxious to do our enemies' job and degenerate one of the great Irish leaders of our times--Bernadette Devlin. I am not here to speak on her behalf--not that she stands in need of defending. But I am citing her as an example of this peculiar characteristic of self-destruction within us all.

"I make this point also to emphasize the threat of the divisive influences already at work and to remind you that we in Northern Ireland have overcome all our past disputes and that the civil rights movement in England has also passed through a similar phase.

"On the other hand, here in the United States not only do you have your splits but you have done something else, you have succeeded in imposing your disputes on the civil rights movement in Northern Ireland. When I say this I hasten to add that it has been brought about by a very few. Nevertheless, it has happened.

"I will make one final point and this I want to make quite positive. We in the civil rights movement have far enough problems on our hands as it is. We are not going to tolerate for one moment any attempt by any group here in America to divide our movement. Your societies have been generous. You have all individually worked hard on our behalf and your help has been magnificent, but at the risk of losing your much valued support rather than risk the splitting and destruction of our movement, we are prepared to forego all further aid from all or any American groups so as to preserve our unity and integrity.

"The people of Northern Ireland have had to suffer enough and their plight must not be exploited.

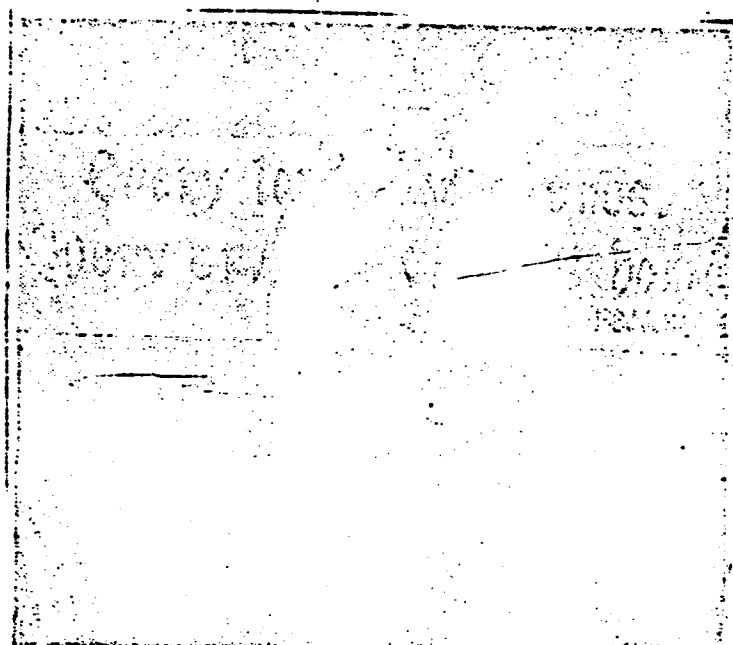

Speech Of Mrs. Maire Martin

"Fellow men, Irish women, friends of the civil rights movement. It is a great pleasure and privilege to be here addressing this first National Conference of the N.I.C.R.A. I bring greetings from the London Region of the N.I.C.R.A.

"It is indeed comforting to us and to the people of the Six Counties of Northeast Ireland to feel the compassion and friendship extended to us by our compatriots who have helped to make this nation great and to feel that they are showing solidarity with us in this final chapter of our unhappy history.

"The London Region of the N.I.C.R.A. came into being early this year when a group of people of diverse political thought got together to model themselves on the movement in Northern Ireland and to try to achieve the same unity of thought and purpose and to project the image of a broadly based movement which would appeal to all sections of the Irish community living in Britain.

"There was one very necessary requirement for membership and that was that each member should totally submerge his or her political identity and work under the guidance of the N.I.C.R.A. in Belfast and be completely subordinate to it. It has been said that the dividers in Irish life are accentuated in London and even more deeply accentuated in the U.S. In London, this certainly was an aspect that could have stunted our growth at the outset. Right-wing Republicans, Connolly Socialists, the G.A.A., Gaelic League sitting round the same table—impossible—and yet today, we can boast of an organization unrivaled among Irish federations in Britain.

"We preach no political ideology, right, left or center. Our demands are those of the civil rights movement. Our objects are: 1. to publicize the aims and purposes of the Civil Rights Association and to give them complete support, 2. to give the public in London an opportunity to voice their condemnation of the happenings in Northern Ireland and to bring pressure to bear on the government at Westminster towards the enjoyment of civil rights by all the people of Northern Ireland.

"Most of us exiles who join the civil rights movement do so because we see in the establishment of a just society in Northern Ireland a stepping stone to that ideal which so many of us long desire—the eventual reunification of our country. We are

aware, however, of the divisive elements at work anxious to frustrate the progress of the civil rights movement. We quickly became aware that the reverberation of the divisions outside Ireland were as great a threat to the movement as were our traditional enemies. Instead of engaging in squabbles with the left, we recognized the validity of their contribution and instead of going out and bringing disrepute to the movement by having it labeled with a Socialist or Republican or Tory tag, we ensured that the organization remained broad.

"My appeal to you all here today, and I want each of you to take this message back to your respective organizations, that the movement is greater than the individual. Let us sink our differences, let us work together, let us show our solidarity with our compatriots, let us say loudly and often that we seek only the reconciliation of the Irish Protestants and Irish Catholics in the six Northeast counties of Ireland and the establishment of a just society in that unhappy place called Northern Ireland."

"The Advocate", a weekly newspaper published at
New York, New York, in its issue of November 15, 1969,
published a column by Joe O'Connor, a reproduction of which
is attached hereto.

According to O'Connor, the total attendance for
the three day session of the NAIJ-sponsored "international
conference" was as follows:

Friday (November 7, 1969) 588
Saturday (November 8, 1969) 1,103
Sunday (November 9, 1969) 378

In his column, O'Connor lists by name a number of
groups affiliated in Ireland with the N.I.C.R.A. (Northern
Ireland Civil Rights Association), naming members of the
General Committee, the list including a member of the Communist
Party (CP) among others representing divergent groups. Mr.
O'Connor states that divergent groups, in joint solidarity,
"compromised their geometric differences toward one aim, a
civil rights program. In this they have solicited our
cooperation. The minority refuses to do this except on
their dictated terms. They have been totally rejected by
the C.R.A. according to the members of the Executive Committee
attending the conference."

Mr. O'Connor's article includes a list of affiliated
American groups that endorsed the C.R.A. resolution read by
Mr. (Frank) Gogarty.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us". At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1606 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Refracted Statehood, as a favorably suggested idea of Jack Lynch, has made a big hit with William Craig, the recently de-throned hatchet-man of Her Majesty's fascist order in the occupied zone of Ireland. This internal idea for a diabolical plan, to bring both ends of Ireland together, as a double yoked egg in the Westminster hatchery, could mean common grounds upon which both gentlemen might wish to sit down and mull the matter over.

In such a plan, there is just one barrier, an insurmountable one, over which neither Craig, Mr. O'Donnell O'Connell nor Mr. Lynch shall ever succeed in crossing. That great barrier is the woe of Irishmen of wrath and fury that would rise like a tidal wave. The vast majority of our people over both areas of Ireland would also like the voice of thunder in denouncement of the present ties, not to mention the recreation of a second Act of Union with our British Imperialist masters. Good bye to the idea, Mr. Craig and to you, also, Mr. Lynch.

Mr. Humphrey has just expounded his meeting with the finance experts on the matter of a year-end budget. He further took up the problem with F.F. team captain, Jack Lynch. At this writing, it is only a matter now to be decided, as to when to blow the whistle, and for how much. How the taxpayer knuckles under, is not a matter that the party is deeply concerned about. They gave them the mandate and apparently they felt that they can also afford it.

What prompted Mr. Humphrey to go into a new tax battle with his advisors, was the replacement economic trade figures which put the Republic deeper into the hole by another 243 million in imports over exports and, when you buy the goods and sell the goods, the difference is, in the end, the same. But, the more the goods to be sold, the more the people

reimburse - more taxes. The makings of such a deficit was, of course, quite obvious in April, when the original budget came up.

The National Association for Irish Justice has gone into its third day of an international conference and, unless a calamity overtakes it in the final hours, it goes down as a great Irish event. It was a victory of the rising generation and it made me just a little bit sad to realize that much of it was truly over my head.

There was, of course, a grand piece of the more ancient folk, whose vibrant culture gave a hopeful and encouraging glow to the future. Twenty-year-old Ailish McDermott, a Belfast law student from Queens University, gave an hour-long spirited delivery for the socialist movement of the People's Democracy. Whatever the nature of a man's politics might be, or the shade of his thinking, the quality of her logic and the wisdom of her years, was most inspiring. Brains and feminine beauty may be a mixture that most men would rather not challenge, but we doubt if this was the combination that drew such a flow of admiration from all those delighted listeners. From the same school as Bernadette, she was equally gifted in a fitting assortment of words for any circumstance. Cathal Cauldwell's address was most important to all those fostering doubt about the awesome thoughts of open conflict. He met this crisis and explained the I.R.A. stand as one that was not solely for him and his followers to settle in a secret back room. "When the people of Ireland are provoked, and continued to be provoked, and the Irish people are provoked, they are prepared to lead them in the final struggle, even if that struggle demands the use of arms, the I.R.A. shall not be deterred."

Kevin Boyle, a law practice solicitor and a Peoples Democracy Executive Committee man, gave an outline on the structural workings of the Civil Rights Association of Northern Ireland and its present potential in setting up a new additional system of defense within its framework, for self-defensive emergency measures only. He elaborated on its constant policy of non-violence and non-political involvements, but recent developments are forcing upon N.I.C.R.A. certain changes to protect its own existence.

Frank Gogarty had the final word on this phase of development and went so far as to state that they were prepared to cut off all associations with the founding elements in America that have threatened to crush their ranks on Irish soil.

N.I.C.R.A. covers the entire spectrum of all affiliated groups in Northern Ireland and is made up of the following groups. Executive members are in accordance with the number and size of each group. This is the general committee of all the groups in the Civil Rights Assn. in Ireland... Frank Gogarty, chairman (non-affiliated); Vince McDowell, Irish Labor, Vice Chairman; Ann Hope, Socialist Labor, Treas.; Rebecca McGlade, Republican; Edwin Stewart, Communist Party; Frank Republican; Peter Morris, Soc. Rep.; Kevin Boyle, Peoples' Democracy; Eridine Holmes, Nat. Labor Party; Kevin Agnew, Repub.; Liam McMahon, Repub.; James Quinn, Republican; Dalton Kelly, Repub.; Bridgid Rogers, Fianna Fail Club; John Donaghy, Fianna Fail Club; Con McCloskey (no political aff.); Thomas O'Connor (formerly Sinn Fein - resigned); Joe Skerrie, associated with Jerry Flinn party and Michael Farrell, Peoples Dem.

Irish soil, openly supported the rights of individuals to equal treatment under the law. In bringing this about, they differed in their methods and their approach. In joint solidarity they compromised their geometric differences toward one aim, a Civil Rights program. In this they have solicited our cooperation. A minority refuses to do this except on their dictated terms. They have been totally rejected by the C.R.A. according to the members of the executive committee attending the conference.

Justice in Ireland, Nassau County; Chicago Students for Irish Justice; Queens Village IAAA; Northeast Branch of NICRA of India; American Com. in Support of Civil Rights in No. Ireland, Phila.; Com. for Justice in Northern Ireland, Bronx; Wash. Heights Action Com.; Westchester Irish Action Com.; Irish Rep. Aid Com., Boston; Com. for Irish Justice, San Francisco; Students for Irish Justice, Pace College, NY; Irish-American Action Assoc., San Francisco; Students for Irish Justice, Bklyn. College; Inwood IAAA; Jersey Branch NICRA.



The "Irish Echo," a weekly newspaper published in NYC, in its issue of November 22, 1969, on page 10, published an article by Sean Maxwell, Author of the column "Forever Green," giving an account of the proceedings at the recent NAJJ-sponsored conference in NYC, which he had attended as a member of the press. A reproduction of the article is attached hereto.

Columnist Maxwell had this to say in the column, in part:

"Mr. Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the IRL, directed most of his remarks to the progress of the N. I. C. R. A. and of the support to which they were entitled to carry on their fight. Mr. Goulding's speech was mild, moderate, and carried with it no inflammatory remarks. It was not one in the nature of an oratorical outburst nor of National Republicanism in the light of those we have heard in the past. It too, was a new approach by the Republican movement abounding with the social ideals of the N. I. C. R. A., and in accord with the methods used by the N. I. C. R. A. While he did not leave the national question in the background, he dealt more so with social regeneration."

"The Advocate," another weekly newspaper published in NYC, on page 15 of the November 15, 1969 issue, published a column "As I Was Saying," by Joe O'Connor, a reproduction of which is attached hereto. The latter part of the last paragraph, second column of the first page of the attachment, carries O'Connor's report on what Goulding had to say in his address before the recent NAIJ-sponsored conference.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY
Also Known As
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE HANON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1808 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

ANALYZING THE SITUATION

For countless years we have been listening to Irish leaders at home and abroad projecting the cause of Ireland and that of national freedom. Patriotism and nationalism have always been the keynotes of oratorical outbursts whether at conventions, meetings, banquets, commemorative ceremonies or even at house parties. We have listened to diverse groups — conservative, democratic, moderate and liberal — with the same theme, the same cause, the same patriotic ideal, all speaking on behalf of the Motherland but speaking and working apart. Disunity, dissension and ideologies and claim to Irish Republicanism have kept those groups and organizations apart.

Moreover, Irish Nationalism and Republicanism have been used and abused by individuals and groups as a stepping stone to prominence and popularity. Only a small minority of the Irish people have dedicated themselves to Irish Republicanism over the last few decades, while the majority wish to be remembered as having been associated with this great national movement. It is strange but true.

What happened to the Irish people and the ideal over the years is the most pathetic chapter in Irish history. Oh yes, we can, and may, and do blame England for everything. Each and every one of us may shout in our more enthusiastic and emotional moments, "Up the Republic!" and feel we have achieved much but ours, not England's, was the responsibility for our abandonment of the Irish Republic.

Disunity did not remain in, or exist in, the old land alone, it followed our exiled children and they carried it with them to distant lands and there over the years it has remained with us. We have not as yet established the Republic, but all of us, whether at home or abroad, think we alone are its inheritors and to our individual grouping it alone belongs. The fact is it belongs to none of us individually, to none of our parties or organizations. It belongs to all of us.

THE NEW APPROACH

Because of the indifference of our leaders to the ultimate goal, there is the situation in Northeast Ireland today. The nationhood of Ireland lies in a perilous state. A section of our people were allowed to be discriminated against and persecuted, and no challenge or complaint was made to the Northern Government or the Westminster Government by the people of the Irish Nation. While they were sending "peace forces" to other lands they remained indifferent to the terrible situation in their own backyard.

There were sporadic efforts made by the I.R.A. down through the years to bring about the ultimate objective but their efforts were impeded by the co-operation of the powers that be in North and South. Perhaps force was no remedy, perhaps it is not the remedy to bring about the ultimate goal, but only time will tell whether it is the final method. But no other remedy appeared on the horizon either, no other was put forward or has been put forward since the outlawing of force.

And so the Civil Rights Association was born, given birth by the persecuted people in Northeast Ireland. It is a non-violent organization. The C.R.A. made demands through agitation and demonstration on the Stormont government — social reforms — six in all. They took to the streets to focus attention on the state of Northeast Ireland and made clear to the world that they wished to become equal and demanded that their status be raised to that of the citizens of the Unionist class or their fellow subjects in Great Britain. This was a new approach and it found a rallying center in the C.R.A. and has been the most effective step taken over the last 50 years. It was an ideal approach and similar to that taken in other lands by minority groups. While their demands

have not come as yet after more than a year of turmoil, riots and suffering, it has gained its objective in gaining world coverage for their struggle. Within the Civil Rights Association there are many groups coordinating their efforts in endeavoring to achieve the demands which they have put forward.

It must be said that the C.R.A. gained popularity and favor that the Republican movement in the past failed to achieve. It is claimed by their enemies — the Unionists and Orange Order — that the C.R.A. is the Republican movement in another guise. We fail to establish that fact.

THE BIG QUESTION DEBATED

After more than a year of demonstrations, riots, bombings, burnings, 15 or more persons killed, countless injured and countless homeless, the Civil Rights Association continues its struggle. After more than a year of political chaos in the Stormont Government, the resignation of Captain O'Neill, the coming to power of Chas. Clarke, the demands of the British Unionist forces to join the already Army of Occupation, the so-called disbanding of the B Specials, the militant action of the U.D.F. and the Paisley Unionists, the situation has not improved; and despite the Cameron and Hunt Reports advocating civil rights, the demands have not been fulfilled. Nothing but promises.

The Civil Rights Association has no doubt found favor with Ireland's children and those of Irish heritage in England, the U.S.A., Canada, and various other lands where children of the Gael are resident. It has also found favor amongst other nationalities and groups, but its mainstay is naturally her exiled children. It has naturally found sympathy with the Irish in the South and received much charitable help from all. But if it is to be successful it must receive more than charity and sympathy from Southern Ireland.

Where is the fault, the Civil Rights Movement, in failing to achieve its objectives? The demands

rainbow. However, the N.A.A. seemed to gain favor from the majority of the delegates on many and most of the resolutions put forward. But it may be said that the greatest outcome of the long session was the policy statement. It seemed that the most interested delegations were those from out of town, Boston and elsewhere.

As to where the C.R.A. is going, well, Mr. Gogarty stated clearly that they were confining themselves specifically to the present demands put forward to the Stormont Government and had no intention of going further. Mr. Boyle, a very eloquent gentleman, and with a deep knowledge of the entire situation, gave, as did all speakers, the impression that they favored a Socialist Republic, but confined their Socialist State to that of Northeast Ireland. Of course Mr. Boyle and Miss MacDermott were projecting the ideals of the People's Democracy, coordinated with those of the N.I.C.R.A. Mrs. Maire Martin of London was warmly received because of her straightforward policy in which she avoided the imbedding of any "isms" or ideologies and discarded all views to the left or the right. She seemed to portray and create a more favorable image than any of the other speakers.

Mr. Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the I.R.A., directed most of his remarks to the progress of the N.I.C.R.A. and of the support to which they were entitled to carry on their fight. Mr. Goulding's speech was mild, moderate, and carried with it no inflammatory remarks. It was not one in the nature of an oratorical outburst, nor of National Republicanism in the light of those we have heard in the past. It too, was a new approach by the Republican movement abounding with social ideals of the N.I.C.R.A. and in accord with the methods used by the N.I.C.R.A. While he did not leave the national question in the background he dealt more so with social regeneration.

In a final analysis, we might suggest to our readers that there is a great and dire need for unity of purpose within our Irish organizations in this country. We feel it is not for us to dictate policy or advise the acceptance or rejection of various opinions. We feel that what we can do, and confine ourselves to doing, is supporting the N.I.C.R.A. and the Republican Movement in their struggle. Financially we can help and that is the extent of our endeavors. There is dissension within the civil rights groups in New York City and that dissension has not come about because of finance or other. The discord and dissension has come about because of ideas, opinions, isms, personalities and leadership. Whatever our opinions may be, it is the N.I.C.R.A. and the Republican Movement that will or should dictate policy, and their policy will be accepted or rejected by the people of Ireland or those within the troubled area. As this writer has said before on countless occasions, he is not afraid of those with views of extreme right or extreme left, he is more fearful of compromise on the entire national ideal.

If we are to succeed, and if the N.I.C.R.A. is to go forward through our support, our various organizations must unite together. And what is very important to our supporters and hopeful supporters in this country is that we return to, and create a National Image. We must get back into, and appeal to, the mainstream of Irish life and Irish-American life in this country. There lies our support. There are other groups which may come forward with support, but it is Ireland's children at home and abroad who must finish this job. It is Ireland's people who will determine what systems of government will be employed. In this light, we appeal for—Unity.

Federated Scabbard, as a favorably suggested idea of Jack Lynch, has made a big hit with William Craig, the recently de-throned hatcher-man of Her Majesty's factist order in the occupied zone of Ireland. This infernal idea for a diabolical plan, to bring both ends of Ireland together, as a double yoked egg in the Westminster hatchery, could mean common grounds upon which both gentlemen might wish to sit down and mull the matter over.

In such a plan, there is just one barrier, an insurmountable one, over which neither Craig, Mr. Chichester Clark nor Mr. Lynch shall ever succeed in crossing. That great barrier is the wide chasm of wrath and fury that would rise like a tidal wave. The vast majority of our people over both areas of Ireland would see like the voice of thunder in denouncement of the present ties, not to mention the recreation of a second Act of Union with our British imperialist masters. Good bye to the idea, Mr. Craig and to you, also, Mr. Lynch.

Mr. Hanphrey has just announced his meeting with the finance experts on the matter of a year-end budget. He further took up the problem with F.F. team captain, Jack Lynch. At this writing, it is only a matter now to be decided, as to when to blow the whistle, and for how much. How the taxpayer knuckles under, is not a matter that the party is deeply concerned about. They gave them the mandate and apparently they felt that they can also afford it. What prompted Mr. Hanphrey to go into a new tax huddle with his advisers, was the unpleasant economic trade figures which put the Republic deeper into the hole by another \$43 million in imports over exports and, when you buy too much and sell too little the difference is, in simple language, debt. Having no available funds to pay debts, there is always a

remedy - more taxes. The making of such a deficit was, of course, quite obvious in April, when the original budget came up.

The National Association for Irish Justice has gone into its third day of an international conference and, unless a calamity overtakes it in the final hours, it goes down as a great Irish event. It was a victory of the rising generation and it made me just a little bit sad to realize that much of it was truly over my head.

There was, of course, a grand hient of the more ancient folk, whose vibrant outlook gave a hopeful and encouraging glow to the future. Twenty-year-old Ailish McDermott, a Belfast law student from Queens University, gave an hour-long spirited delivery for the socialist movement of the People's Democracy. Whatever the nature of a man's politics might be, or the shade of his thinking, the quality of her logic and the wisdom of her years, was most inspiring. Brains and feminine beauty may be a mixture that most men would rather not challenge, but we doubt if this was the combination that drew such a flow of admiration from all those delighted listeners. From the same school as Bernadette, she was equally gifted in a fitting assortment of words for any circumstance. Cathal Caulding's address was most important to all those fostering doubts about the awesome thoughts of open conflict. He met this crisis and explained the Irish stand as one that was not solely for him and his followers to settle in a secret back room. When the people of Ireland are prepared, united and conditioned to the principles of national freedom, we, in the forefront, are prepared to lead them to the final objective and, even if the use of force shall not be found wanting.

Kevin Bolger, a law practice solicitor and member of the Executive Committee of the C.R.A., gave an outline on the structural workings of the Civil Rights Association of Northern Ireland and its present potential in setting up a new, additional system of defense within its framework, for self-defense as emergency measures only. He elaborated on its constant policy of non-violence and non-political involvement. Our recent developments are focusing upon N.I.C.R.A. as a means of protecting its own members.

Frank Gogarty had the final word on this phase of development and went so far as to state that they were prepared to cut off all associations with the leading elements in America who have threatened to crack down on the Irish soil.

N.I.C.R.A. covered the entire spectrum of all affiliated groups in Northern Ireland and in made up of the following groups: Executive Committee of the C.R.A.; the Irish Civil Rights Association; the Irish Civil Rights Association in Ireland; Frank Gogarty, chairman (non-affiliated); James McGuire, Irish Labor, Vice Chairman; Ann Hope, Socialist Labor; Theresa Rebecca McGlade, Irish Labor; Siewart, Communist Party; Frank Republican Party; Kevin Bolger, People's Democracy; Erskine Holmes, New Labor Party; Kevin Agnew, P.O.; Liam McMacoin, Republic; James Quinn, Republican Party; Paddy; Bridgid Rogers, People's Club; John Donaghy, Irish Civil Club; Con McCloskey (no political club); Thomas O'Connor, formerly Sinn Fein, resigned; Joe Sweeney, associated with Gerry's group; and Michael Farrell, People's Dec.

Heights Action Com.; Westchester Irish Action Com.; Irish Rep. Aid Com., Boston; Com. for Irish Justice, San Francisco; Students for Irish Justice, Pace College, NY; Irish-American Action Assoc., San Francisco; Students for Irish Justice, Bklyn. College; Inwood IAAA; Jersey Branch NICRA.

Columnist Pat Shields, in his article, mentions that the captioned Convention "was presided over by Brian Heron who is alleged to be a long time organizer for the Students for a Democratic Society." Present at the Conference, according to Shields, were Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the Irish Republican Army (IRA); Frank Gogarty, Chairman of the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association (NICRA), and Mrs. Martin, a visitor from London (who is a spokesman for civil rights in London).

Mr. Shields commented, in part, that Frank Gogarty had definitely stated at the Conference that his organization endorsed Heron's NAIJ as a collection agency in the United States, a statement which Mr. Shields regarded as surprising.

Joe O'Connor in his column mentioned above, includes some of the statements reportedly made by Mr. Gogarty at the Conference.

Sean Maxwell, in his column, referred to above, reported that Brian Heron conducted most of the proceedings at captioned Conference. He reported the speakers from Ireland included the following:

Mr. Frank Gogarty
Miss Ailish Mac Dermott
Mr. Kevin Boyle, representative of the
People's Democracy, described as a
grouping within the Civil Rights
Association.
Mrs. Maire Martin, representing the
Irish Civil Rights Movement of London.

Mr. Maxwell includes in his column, comments attributed to Cathal Goulding as remarks reportedly made at the Conference.

Also attached is a reproduction of an item clipped from page one of the November 22, 1969 issue of the "Irish Echo," namely, an article entitled "Analysis: Splits Hurt Rights Drive" by John Kelly, which was carried as a "Special to the Irish Echo." Mr. Kelly's column alludes to what he refers to as hysteria over the question indicated to be now in the minds of some people as to "are we going red"? He indicates that such "hysteria" has infiltrated the civil rights movement, both in Ireland and in "the supporting stateside organizations." Kelly's column contains commentary on the controversy regarding the reported appointment of NAIJ as the only association to act on behalf of the NICRA in the United States, and on the conflicting statements issued by Frank Gogarty and by Dr. Con McCluskey of the CRA Executive on the matter.

Kelly's article reports that McCluskey said that the NAIJ was banned by the eighteen organization Irish Action Committee in America because it was associated with the Black Panthers and the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).

Characterizations of the Black Panther Party and the SDS are attached hereto.

The recent convention of the National Assn. for Irish Justice, held in City Center on Nov. 7th, 8th and 9th did not live up to the expected standard. For months prior we were told of the many celebrities from North and South Ireland who would attend. To the great disappointment of those concerned, just a few from the Belfast Peoples Democracy and from Dublin came. Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the Irish Repub. Army, Frank Gogarty who at the present time is chairman of N. Ireland Civil Rights Assn. and another visitor from London, Mrs. Martin, who is a spokesman for Civil Rights in London. This conglomeration of minds came here to tell the Irish and Irish Americans how they could help N. Ireland's C.R.A. by giving all aid through this N.A.I.J., while many of the Irish American organizations oppose this newly formed group.

When I reached the Convention on Sunday afternoon I was challenged as to my identity and my purpose for being there. I was told by a young man with extremely long hair, that without a press pass I could not enter. However, my good friend Jim Folan arrived on the scene. Big Jim as we call him was known to the Black and Tans as the Connemara Fox - a dedicated Irishman. Members of the committee were summoned to the door. Some I knew very well. All this time, I wanted to know why I was refused admission. After a whispered conference I was told that my writings were not favorable to the N.A.I.J. After a while I was given a pass to enter the hall and was directed to a press box where my compatriots and representatives from other newspapers showed signs of being disappointed at what they saw

The three day convention was presided over by Brian Heron who is alleged to be a long time organizer for the Students for a Democratic Society. The question asked most frequently was "Who is this Brian Heron and his relationship to James Connolly who was executed for his part in the Rising of 1916?" Mr. Heron is a grandson of James Connolly. In searching through the records we can't find any similarity in the in the philosophy of the James Connolly who, in 1916, walked to his death with a prayer on his lips and gave his life so that a just cause would live.

Frank Gogarty who attended the Conference as the chairman of N. Ireland Civil Rights Assn. definitely stated that his organization's endorsement of Heron's N.A.I.J. as a collection agency in the U.S. was surprising. Said Gogarty- "If any are not pre-

pared to continue its support with the understanding we work out through this convention, then I say leave us alone and allow us to go unhindered with the task." He reiterated this statement when visited by the heads of the many Irish organizations who went to his hotel and begged him to separate himself from this group.

Demand in your letters that Civil Rights in N. Ireland be returned to the people who can do the best for the people. Don't hesitate to have your voice heard on this most serious question.

Reading an article, credited to Thomas Hughes, a staff writer on the Tampa Florida press, provokes some interesting comments. An item carries a three column headline in half inch size case letters, "ROTARIANS GIVEN REPORT ON TROUBLES IN IRELAND." Seems that this well meaning group was interested enough to seek some facts of history and general conditions concerning recent civil rights upheavals in Belfast and Derry and enlisted the knowledgeable aid of a locally based Irishman in the field of religion and education at Lakeland, Florida. This is part of a "Cock and Bull" story he gave them in his lecture. Quote - "Father Caverly explained to Rotary Club members that today troubles in Ireland are affected by an original political settlement in 1922 when England gave dominion status to an Irish Free State, but one million unionists did not want this type of settlement but instead, wanted a United Ireland. To this, England agreed, with the separation of Northern Ireland, which had two thirds Protestants wanting union with England and the other one third, composed mostly of Catholics." He further stated in his lecture that "the Church of Rome is not directly responsible for conditions there nor is it particularly in sympathy with those conditions. It is a battle between two nations, and not a traditionally religious difference, but rather more like a historic feud."

The Irish gentleman, sending this clipping to THE ADVOCATE office requested my comment,-- here it is. "Next time out, the Rotarians should contact Bob Jones of Bob Jones University, South Carolina, where Rev. Ian Paisley got his mail order degree as Doctor of Divinity. At least you will get the reverse point of view in a factual lire and himstone version, then the Rotarians will surely be convinced that there is much more than traditional historic feud as related to by Rev. Patrick J. Caverly. Please forward an address so I can forward the Rotarians some factual information at this time.

Many of the most important items of the Nat. Assn. for Irish Jurid. Conference were deleted from the Irish American press. In fact, the journal decided not to even mention the conference at all. Another journal covered it in a neutral manner and credit should be given for such a courageous stance at this time. Paul O'Dwyer was the only Irishman with a long and reputable record in Irish social affairs to make an appearance and to congratulate the new and rising generation in their efforts to set new standards and higher objectives for Irish nationhood in the future.

Most noteworthy were the closing chapters of Dr. Frank Gogarty's address in opening the conference on Saturday -

"There are many, I fear, only too anxious to do our enemies job and to speak damagingly of one of the great Irish leaders of our time - Bernadette Devlin. I am not here to speak on her behalf, nor that she stands in need of defending. But I am citing her as an example of this peculiar characteristic of self-destruction within us."

"I make this point also to emphasize the threat of the divisive influences already at work and to remind you that we in N. Ireland have overcome all our past disputes and that the civil rights movement in England has also passed through a similar phase.

"On the other hand, here in the United States not only do you have your splits, but you have done something else; you have succeeded in imposing your disputes on the civil rights movement in N. Ireland. When I say this I hasten to add that it has been brought

about by a very few.

"We are not going to tolerate for one moment any attempt by any group here in America to divide our movement. Your societies have been generous. You have all individually worked hard on our behalf, and your help has been magnificent, but at the risk of losing your much valued support rather than risk the splitting and destruction of our movement, we are prepared to forego all further aid from all or any American groups so as to preserve our unity and integrity.

"The people of N. Ireland have had to suffer enough and their plight must not be exploited.

"If any society is not prepared to continue its support in the understanding we shall work out through this conference, then I say, just leave us alone and allow us to get on unhindered with the task in our own way."

Frank Cogarty, chairman, N. Ireland Civil Rights Assn., speaking at the opening of the International conference of the NAII, City Center, New York.

The following letter arrived from Sean Fitzpatrick, National Secretary, National Graves Assn., 74 Dame Street, Dublin.

Dear Joe:

I am sorry I did not give you more information in my letter. The Wolfe Tone grave, and the two memorials on it were blown up in the early hours of Oct. 31st. The Ulster Volunteer Force, stated that their units had carried out the explosion on the grave of "Traitor Wolfe Tone." I was immediately on the job, and on TV, and the newspapers. I accepted responsibility on behalf of National Graves Assn. for its complete reconstruction.

The old family stone was shattered to pieces, while the other stone was uprooted from its foundations, there is now a big gaping hole in the middle of the grave. We have an opportunity to erect a much worthier memorial; the response to our newspaper appeal has been very good. The first subscription received was from a Presbyterian clergyman in Dublin. We have since received additional subscriptions from other non-Catholic clergymen. The general response from the six counties and England has been good.

I just had word that Galt Moylan is ill in Spiddle, Co. Galway, and may not be able to attend the meeting in Mullingar next Sunday, of the Barnes Mc Cormack committee. At this meeting there was to hand over all funds she had left, to National Graves Assn. We can not move with the memorial stone till all funds are released to our committee. I hope this information on the Wolfe Tone grave desecration will enable you to make a success of your efforts on our behalf of the new memorial through your New York Council of National Graves Assn.

I am pleased to note that you and Eileen are well as we are here. Trusting a fruitful meeting of the Association on your arrival here in a couple of weeks time.

For countless years we have been listening to Irish leaders at home and abroad projecting the cause of Ireland and that of national freedom. Patriotism and nationalism have always been the keynotes of rhetorical outbursts whether at conventions, meetings, banquets, commemorative ceremonies or even at house parties. We have listened to diverse groups — conservative, democratic, moderate and liberal — with the same theme, the same cause, the same patriotic ideal, all speaking on behalf of the Motherland but speaking and working apart. Disunity, dissension and ideologies and claim to Irish Republicanism have kept these groups and organizations apart.

Moreover, Irish Nationalism and Republicanism have been used and abused by individuals and groups as a stepping stone to prominence and popularity. Only a small minority of the Irish people have dedicated themselves to Irish Republicanism over the last few decades, while the majority wish to be remembered as having been associated with this great national movement. It is strange but true.

What happened to the Irish people and the ideal over the years is the most pathetic chapter in Irish history. Oh yes, we can, and may, and do blame England for everything. Each and every one of us may shout in our more enthusiastic and emotional moments, "Up the Republic!" and feel we have achieved much but ours, not England's, was the responsibility for our abandonment of the Irish Republic.

Disunity did not remain in, or exist in, the old land alone, it followed our exiled children and they carried it with them to distant lands and there over the years it has remained with us. We have not as yet established the Republic, but all of us, whether at home or abroad, think we alone are its inheritors and to our individual grouping it alone belongs. The fact is it belongs to none of us individually, to none of our parties or organizations. It belongs —
"all of us."

THE NEW APPROACH

Because of the indifference of our leaders to the ultimate goal, there is the situation in Northeast Ireland today. The nationhood of Ireland lies in a perilous state. A section of our people were allowed to be discriminated against and persecuted, and no challenge or complaint was made to the Northern Government or the Westminster Government by the people of the Irish Nation. While they were sending "peace forces" to other lands they remained indifferent to the terrible situation in their own backyard.

There were sporadic efforts made by the I.R.A. down through the years to bring about the ultimate objective but their efforts were impeded by the co-operation of the powers that be in North and South. Perhaps force was no remedy, perhaps it is not the remedy to bring about the ultimate goal, but only time will tell whether it is the final method. But no other remedy appeared on the horizon either, no other was put forward or has been put forward since the outlawing of force.

And so the Civil Rights Association was born, given birth by the persecuted people in Northeast Ireland. It is a non-violent organization. The C.R.A. made demands through agitation and demonstration on the Stormont government — social reforms — six in all. They took to the streets to focus attention on the state of Northeast Ireland and made clear to the world that they wished to become equal and demanded that their status be raised to that of the citizens of the Unionist class or their fellow subjects in Great Britain. This was a new approach and it found a rallying center in the C.R.A. and has been the most effective step taken over the last 50 years. It was an ideal approach and similar to that taken in other lands by minority groups. While their demands

have not come as yet after more than a year of turmoil, riots and suffering, it has gained its objective in gaining world coverage for their struggle. Within the Civil Rights Association there are many groups coordinating their efforts in endeavoring to achieve the demands which they have put forward.

It must be said that the C.R.A. gained popularity and favor that the Republican movement in the past failed to achieve. It is claimed by their enemies — the Unionists and Orange Order — that the C.R.A. is the Republican movement in another guise. We fail to establish that fact.

THE BIG QUESTION DEBATED

After more than a year of demonstrations, riots, barricades, burnings, 15 or more persons killed, countless injured and countless homeless, the Civil Rights Association continues its struggle. After more than a year of political chaos in the Stormont Government, the resignation of Captain O'Neill, the coming to power of Chester-Clarke, the demands of Wilson and O'Donnell, the arrival of British armed forces, the already Army of Occupation, the so-called disbanding of the B Specials, the political action of the C.M.F. and the Paisleyite Unionists, the situation has not improved; and despite the Cameron and Hunt Reports advocating civil rights, the demands have not been fulfilled. Nothing but promises.

The Civil Rights Association has no doubt found favor with Ireland's children and those of Irish heritage in England, the U.S.A., Canada, and various other lands where children of the Gael are resident. It has also found favor amongst other nationalities and groups but its mainstay is naturally her exiled children. It has naturally found sympathy with the Irish in the South and received much charitable help from all. But if it is to be successful it must receive more than charity and sympathy from Southern Ireland.

Where is the Civil Rights Association going? Is the Civil Rights Movement confining its objectives to the six demands already on the books?

As a member of the press, we attended the three-day convention held in New York sponsored and directed by the National Association for Irish Justice and affiliated civil rights organizations. The Coordinating Chairman of the N.A.I.J., Mr. Brian Heron, conducted most of the proceedings and speakers from Ireland included Mr. Frank Gogarty, chairman of the C.R.A. in Northeast Ireland; Miss Ailish Mac Dermott and Mr. Kevin Boyle, representative of the People's Democracy, a grouping within the C.R.A.; Mrs. Maire Martin representing the Irish Civil Rights Movement of London and Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of I.R.A.

Irrespective of those who agree or disagree with the N.A.I.J. in New York, it must be said that their press room and their workers left no stone unturned to keep the delegates informed of the various matters on the agenda and the schedule of events. Copies of all matters to be discussed, resolutions and amendments were available to all so that at all times delegates were aware of presently discussed matters and those following them.

At this convention, like that of other conventions, the shades of opinion were like that of the

rainbow. However, the N.A.I. seemed to gain favor from the majority of the delegates on many and most of the resolutions put forward. But it may be said that the greatest outcome of the long session was the policy statement. It seemed that the most interested delegations were those from out of town, Boston and elsewhere.

As to where the U.R.A. is going, well, Mr. Goparty stated clearly that they were confining themselves specifically to the present demands put forward to the Stormont Government and had no intention of going further. Mr. Boyle, a very eloquent gentleman, and with a real knowledge of the entire situation, gave, as did all speakers, the impression that they favored a Socialist Republic, but confined their Socialist State to that of Northeast Ireland. Of course Mr. Boyle and Mr. McDermott were projecting the ideals of the People's Democracy, coordinated with those of the N.I.C.R.A. Mrs. Mahe of London was warmly received because of her straightforward policy in which she avoided the injecting of any "isms" or ideologies and discarded all views to the left of the right. She seemed to portray and create a more favorable image than any of the other speakers.

Mr. Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the I.R.A., directed most of his remarks to the progress of the N.I.C.R.A. and of the support to which they were entitled to carry on their fight. Mr. Goulding's speech was moderate, and carried with it no inflammatory remarks. It was not one in the nature of an oratorical outburst, nor of National Republicanism in the light of those we have heard in the past. It too, was a new approach by the Republican movement abounding with social ideals of the N.I.C.R.A. and in accord with the methods used by the N.I.C.R.A. While he did not leave the national question in the background he dealt more so with social regeneration.

In a final analysis, we might suggest to our readers that there is a great and dire need for unity of purpose within our Irish organizations in this country. We feel it is not for us to dictate policy or advise the acceptance or rejection of various opinions. We feel that what we can do, and confine ourselves to doing, is supporting the N.I.C.R.A. and the Republican Movement in their struggle. Financially we can help and that is the extent of our endeavors. There is dissension within the civil rights groups in New York City and that dissunity has not come about because of finance or other. The discord and dissunity has come about because of ideas, opinions, isms, personalities and leadership. Whatever our opinions may be, it is the N.I.C.R.A. and the Republican Movement that will or should dictate policy, and their policy will be accepted or rejected by the people of Ireland or those within the troubled area. As this writer has said before on countless occasions, he is not afraid of those with views of extreme right or extreme left, he is more fearful of compromise on the entire national ideal.

If we are to succeed, and if the N.I.C.R.A. is to go forward through our support, our various organizations must unite together. And what is very important to our supporters and hopeful supporters in this country is that we return to, and create a National image. We must get back into, and appeal to, the mainstream of Irish life and Irish-American life in this country. There lies our support. There are other groups which may come forward with support, but it is Ireland's children at home and abroad who must finish this job. It is Ireland's people who will determine what systems of government will be employed in this light. We appeal for—Unity.

Analysis: Splits Hurt Rights Drive

(Special to the Irish Echo)

Some time ago, I wrote about an American lady who was interviewed on Irish radio during a visit to this country. Unfortunately, I could not catch the lady's name, nor did I know what organization she represented, since I only heard a small part of the program.

But, apparently, she was worried about the way in which Bernadette Devlin was going to dispose of the cash she collected in the States during her tour.

And, apparently, the lady was also disturbed about the carte blanche of organizations working for the Civil Rights Association in the North. She felt that, perhaps, Bernadette Devlin could indeed be another "Castro in a mini-skirt" and that it would be therefore un-American to support her or the cause she stood for.

At the time, I wrote that I considered such fear to be nonsense and that any American who had even the remotest knowledge of the real Irish situation would not have the slightest hesitation in lending full support.

I still do believe that it's nonsense to think that because an organization has some leftist members, perhaps even some with fled leanings, that it's going to sell this country, hook, line and sinker to Communist Russia.

Holding such a view, I believe betrays a horrifying innocence of the real political facts in Northern Ireland and, for that matter, in the world at large.

HYSTERIA

This type of hysteria smacks of the McCarthy scare in the States but I also pointed out that the worst aspect of this trend of thought was that it played completely into Unionist hands.

In America, the people who played on these particular American chords were Baillic and Mills, sent over especially to discredit Bernadette Devlin and her fund-raising attempts. These two Unionist members were also sent over by their party to burnish the deservedly tarnished party image.

So, it would seem that anybody with any political sense would automatically disregard their statements as propaganda, pay no more attention and get on with the job of doing something for the people in the North.

But apparently, this has not

happened and this "Are we going Red?" hysteria has also infiltrated the civil rights movement here in Ireland as well as supporting Stateside organizations.

This emerged recently in a report in the Irish press of a confrontation between Dr. Con McCluskey of Dungannon, a member of the Campaign for Social Justice and of the C.R.A. Executive, and Frank Gogarty, chairman of the Civil Rights Association.

BANNED

Dr. McCluskey said that the National Association of Irish Justice was banned by the IS

organization Irish Action Committee in America because it was associated with the Black Panthers and the Friends for Democratic Society.

He added that the National Association claimed on July 6 that it had been named by the C.R.A. to be the only association to act on its behalf in the U.S.A. and that he had never seen an agenda of the meeting at which this appointment was supposed to be made.

But, said Mr. Gogarty, the appointment had indeed been made at a regular meeting of the executive and the Secretary, Mr. Peter Morris, had the min-

utes of this meeting.

And he added that it seemed the sort of inner argument that threatened to split the Civil Rights movement in early spring had now spread to America where a state of "neo-McCarthy hysteria" had set in.

He also said that he and several members of the Civil Rights Association had been given a standing ovation to go to speak in America by the National Association but would not go any further in fixing a time for the visit.

To Irish people reading this, especially those supporting the continuing struggle for civil rights in the North, any split in the American organizations is unfortunate and, in fact, plays right into the Unionist hands. Historically, it seems, the Irish have had a penchant for splits.

A LULL

The real, unfortunate point about this split is that at this juncture, as I have written often in the Irish Echo, is that all of the support the C.R.A. can get is needed. At present, Irish-American organizations may feel that there has been a welcome lull in events in the North.

But the past has proved that these "lulls" have literally what the term means, temporary halts in the fight for equality.

As recently as last weekend, Mr. Craig attended a meeting of disgruntled B Specials in Belfast. No reporters were allowed to the meeting which was held in complete secrecy but, later, reports came out which indicated that the temporary policemen were fully behind Mr. Craig's fight to retain the force as it now stands. Most, it seemed, did not want to hand in their guns.

And, at the same time, British Navy minesweepers and the British Army, along with the R.U.C. and B Specials were maintaining a tight security net around the Border and around the coasts to attempt to prevent gun-running into the Six Counties.

So it does seem that the present lull in the North may be slightly ominous. Then, it must be added, that it does seem as though the Unionist Party is attempting to give the impression that everything is now being solved in the North and that Civil Rights will be granted to all.

In this, they seem to be successful. If one is to judge by the fact that for the past four weeks there has been no major outbreaks in the North. This would indicate that both sides have decided that it is time to take a rest but this has happened so many times in the past that it would be impossible to bet on the future with any confidence—not yet, at any rate.

And it is because of this that the American split is unfortunate. It is essential to maintain the pressure on the Unionists to ensure that promised reforms will be carried out.

Of course, it must be added that it is unfortunate that Irish-American organizations, fighting for rights in the North, should be allied with any other organizations while their fight continues. This again, can only lend some credence to the accusations hurled by Paisley and his kindred demagogues.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY **Also Known As** **Black Panther Party for Self-Defense**

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

DETAILS:I. PREDICATION

This investigation is predicated upon a request contained in a letter to the Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), dated October 28, 1969, from J. "According to a news story by Leonard Downie, Jr., published on page B14 of the Washington Post of October 27, 1969, Dominick Behan and other members of the Irish Republican Army have been touring "Eastern U.S. cities, asking anyone who will listen to send money to Northern Ireland Catholics for guns. They have been driving up and down the coast in a wildly decorated microbus." At Philadelphia

The Philadelphia Inquirer, a daily newspaper published in Philadelphia, in its edition for October 25, 1969, contains an article on page six captioned "SDS Begins Three-Day Meeting in Temple Hall." The article reflected that Dominic Behan, spokesman for the Irish Republican Army, author, poet, and brother of the late playwright BRENDAN BEHAN, told the gathering: "we are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution...we're not going to stand idly while genocide might begin in Ireland." Behan said the IRA with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in to defend people, but now we are going further."

The following comments appeared in the article:

"Behan is a member of the Irish Revolutionary Army. His speech is being sponsored by the English department."

Irish bus to waylay British train in U.S.

NEW YORK, October 10 — Reliable sources close to the outlawed Irish Republican Army (IRA) in New York have revealed that the IRA plans to ambush a British train in the U.S. to focus attention on what an IRA spokesman terms "British imperialism's denials of basic civil rights" to the people of Northern Ireland.

The train, the "Flying Scotsman," is traveling on U.S. tracks across the country to promote British-made goods. Pulling a 10-car train, the "Flying Scotsman" will go from Boston to Houston October 8-November 15.

The IRA in New York insisted that its planned ambush of the train will be non-violent. "The campaign in America is purely educational," it statement reads.

"The IRA is conducting the tour as its contribution to the nation-wide boycott of British products being conducted in the U.S. by the National Association

for Irish Justice," the New York-based organization which sponsored Bernadette Devlin's recent trip to the U.S.

The IRA sources say that IRA units "will follow the 'Flying Scotsman' with a bus called 'Johnston's Motor Car.' The original 'Johnston's Motor Car' became famous during the Irish War of Independence and inspired the song popularized by the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem."

"'Johnston's Motor Car' will also appear at churches, universities, factory gates and union

halls," the IRA says. "The tour will explain IRA involvement in the struggle in Northern Ireland. Funds will be raised for the IRA Political Prisoners Defense Committee."

Dominic Behan, well-known author and playwright, will go along with the bus (and train) and will speak on the Irish struggle. Behan is the brother of the late Brendan Behan, IRA militant and author of the plays, "The Hostage" and "The Quare Fellow."

Demonstrations against British imperialism are also planned in New York: on Tuesday, October 12, at 1 p.m. at Penn Station (7th Ave. and 33rd St.), and on Thursday, Oct. 16, outside Gimbel's (Broadway at 33rd St.). Dominic Behan Speaks On Irish Civil Rights

by Mary Wingate

As the civil rights struggle rages in Northern Ireland, the Pace Press invited Dominic Behan to speak, to give the students some insight as to what is happening, what has happened and what is being planned with regard to the "Irish question."

The Pace Press Forum was held Thursday, October 23 at 4 o'clock in Schaeberle Hall. Mr. Behan was delayed in arriving, so Mary Wingate, a Pace English major who acted as moderator, introduced

James Gaffney as the first speaker who gave background information. Mr. Gaffney is a member of the Clann na Gael, a U.S. organization supporting the Irish Republican Army. Just back from Ireland, he explained that the U.S. papers were very vague; the situation has been presented as Catholics fighting Protestants as though it were a religious fight. The fight is, in actuality, an economic struggle. The British government has kept the majority of Protestants "just one step in front of the Catholics." But under the present government policy, blatant employment and housing discrimination is being practiced against Catholics. The Protestants suffer along with Catholics with the voting requirement. A landlord who has ten tenants has ten votes; the landowning class is made up of Protestants.

Mr. Gaffney went on to describe what he saw while he was in Northern Ireland. A group of militant Protestants crashed through a school in the Catholic area in Belfast. Some were armed with machine guns and fired at random into the area. B-specialists, a semi-military army, composed of young members of the Protestant Orange Order, came to the support of the Protestants. Leaders pointed out to the mob which houses and stores should be burned. A group of seventeen

men, with I.R.A. affiliations held off the attackers for two hours until the police arrived.

Dominic Behan arrived at 4:30. A renowned playwright, poet, folk-singer and song-writer, Mr. Behan, the brother of the late Brendan Behan, is a member of the I.R.A. His opening remark was, "Mad Protestants, as such, do not exist. Neither do the deft Catholics. There is only a majority and a minority to oppress the minority." As a member of the I.R.A. he wished to explain the

differences between the Irish Republican Army and the National Association for Irish Justice, the organization in this country that is sponsoring his speaking tour here. The N.A.I.J. is for civil rights in Northern Ireland, "one man-one vote." The I.R.A. supports the civil rights and the N.A.I.J., hoping that they will support the I.R.A. and their fight to end British occupation and oppression of people. Mr. Behan explained that the I.R.A. supports any people's legitimate struggle for freedom. He went on to say that the I.R.A. had no realistic tactics to gain the independence that it is seeking for Ireland. Being an illegal organization in Southern Ireland, they have 300 men as opposed to 30,000 of Northern Ireland's police force.

Mr. Behan then entertained questions from the audience. As to a question regarding the election of Mr. Chichester-Clark as Prime Minister in Northern Ireland, Mr. Behan replied that it was easier to elect Chichester-Clark, than to throw out Faulkner, whom he succeeded. That is not saying that Chichester-Clark is any better.

When asked about the I.R.A. and Bernadette Devlin, he answered, "We are like St. Paul. We'll take help from anyone. She did raise a lot of money. I only wish that I was as good-looking."

Concerning the clergy, Mr. Behan said that their position is the same as it was in 1916. The regular parish priest remains the supporter as he was in 1916. After the Easter Rising many priests were executed because of their association with the Sinn Fein. But the Church is still the same too. The Church, during the years of the troubles exiled priests because of their parts in the movement. "Father Dominic, who was exiled to Alberta, Canada, is my namesake. Please don't think that I'm named after that bloody saint, that woman-hater!"

At the end of the Forum, Bruce Davis announced the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee for Irish Justice at Pace. This committee is a part of the National Association for Irish Justice. Anyone wishing to join should contact either Mary Wingate or Bruce Davis.

Also Known As
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

Irish fighter blasts British 'atrocities'

Dominic Bagan, poet and Irish revolutionary, was to speak yesterday at 2:30 p.m. in Rittenberg Hall, but as of 3:45 had not appeared. In his place Gerald Regime, a soldier from the Irish Republic Army, addressed some 200 students and asked them for financial support and to boycott all British goods.

Regime spoke of the "atrocities" that the British government has been inflicting against citizens of southern Ireland, and asked for financial aid from American citizens so the Irish Republic Army could afford to buy weapons to fight British who are its enemy.

NOT PATRIOTS

The soldier said that he was very disappointed in the attitude of most Irish-Americans toward their homeland and he called the majority of Irish-Americans hypocrites. Regime added, "Although they may show concern for what is going on in Ireland, when it comes down to taking action they shirk the responsibility and prove themselves to be not patriots at all."

IMPORTED TRAITORS

Regime called the majority of the citizens of Northern Ireland "traitors who were imported to live there by the British." The Irish Republic Army is pledged to remove all foreign inhabitants from Northern Ireland and unite the country.

The soldier described the fighting force he belongs to as an underground army dedicated to protecting the citizens from the "brutality" inflicted upon them by the police of Ireland. He described the police as "tools" of the British government who indiscriminately attack citizens of the country.

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1408 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

On September 22, 1971, Mr. Pat Rice, Security Office, Department of State, 450 Golden Gate Avenue, advised information received by his office shows Princess Alexandra and her husband plan to fly from San Francisco to Los Angeles on October 6, 1971, via PSA Flight Number 710. Rice stated, however, a possibility exists that a private plane might be provided for this flight. The Princess is to be accompanied by Lady Waterhouse and Inspector Keith during the flight to Los Angeles. From Los Angeles the Princess, her husband, and party, are scheduled to fly to Denver on October 8, 1971, aboard Continental Airline Flight Number 10. The plane is to depart Los Angeles at 1:35 PM and arrive in Denver at 4:32 PM. From Denver, the party plans to fly to Sheridan, Wyoming, same day, aboard a private plane, where they are to be guests to Lady Portchester.

Rice further advised that the Princess' trip to Sheridan, Wyoming, was strictly a private matter and to be given no publicity. The British Government is holding details closely, and local consulate unable to provide any additional information.

On September 28, 1971, H. W. Ramsey, Special Agent, Department of State, San Francisco, California, advised that there had been no changes to date in above itinerary regarding the travel of the Princess, et al.

'Rioting Is Good for You'

LONDON — (AP) — Rioting is good for some people, a British psychiatrist reported after an exhaustive study in Northern Ireland. He concluded that a man who can act out his aggressive feelings, by throwing a brick or a punch, is less likely to keep his frustrations bottled up inside.

Dr. H. A. Lyons, a consultant psychiatrist at Belfast's Purdysburn Hospital, reported in the British Medical Journal that the number of suicides in Belfast fell 50 percent as street riots there intensified a couple of years ago.

For several years Lyons studied figures showing the number of suicides in Belfast and the number of people with depressive illness, a serious mental disorder.

He compared the average for relatively quiet years, 1964-68, with figures for the worst year of riots then available, 1969-70.

As the riots increased, he reported, "there was a significant decrease in depressive illness in Belfast in both sexes and all age groups." On average, the decrease worked out to about 13 percent, but in the worst riot areas depressive illness was down as much as 67 percent.

For purposes of contrast, Lyons also studied figures for the same years in a relatively calm area, County Down. There he found both suicides and depressive illness on the increase in 1969-70.

Lyons concluded that suicide and depressive illness declined in the capital, for both men and women, because "in large areas of Belfast there was relative freedom to be aggressive."

His investigation covered only suicides and depressive illness. Other studies have charted an increase in Belfast in less serious mental conditions, such as acute anxiety and emotional stress, due to the escalating violence.

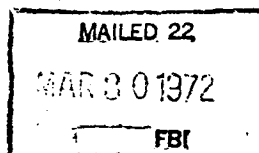

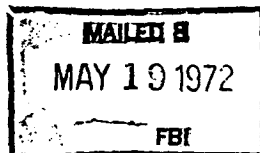

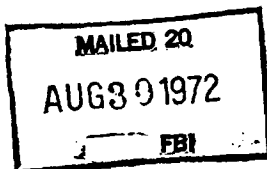

The October 4th Organization is named after an important incident in Kensington history-- the Rebellion of October 4th, 1779. During the First American Revolution, the merchants and businessmen of Kensington and Philadelphia began to hoard food and clothing in order to inflate the prices. On October 4th hundreds of Kensington people led by THOMAS PAINE stormed the homes of these merchants, seized their supplies and distributed the goods free to the people who needed them.

The October 4th Organization believes that working class people of Kensington and other neighborhoods are still oppressed by the big businessmen, rich merchants and politicians who serve them-- the criminal ruling class, the behind-the-scenes dictators of America, the people who run the system that keeps us down and out.


