
ReBu R/S 11/14/66, and Legat, London letter 11/2/66, copies of which are being furnished to New York.

On Saturday, October 15, 1969, during a Moratorium for Vietnam demonstration in Central Philadelphia, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation picked up pamphlets advertising a rally for Irish freedom on Monday, October 20, 1969, at 6:30 p.m., at the 30th Street Railroad Station, Philadelphia, sponsored by Friends of the Northern Irish Civil Rights Movement, and the Clan Na Gael, a copy of this pamphlet being attached hereto, lettered A.

On Saturday, October 18, 1969, from 2:33 p.m. until 5:15 p.m. a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Impatigation observed five pickets representing the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association (NICRA) outside the Strawbridge and Cicthier Department Store, Eighth and Market Streets. Two of these








On October 20, 1969, this bus was observed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at 30th Street Station at 6 p.m.

On Monday, October 20, 1969, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed approximately 25 demonstrators representing the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association picketing in front of the west entrance of the Penn Central Railroad Station. Among those participating in the picket line was one James Quinn.

The "Temple News," official newspaper of Temple !
University, Philadelphia, in its edition of October 22, 1969,
contained an article indicating that Dominic Behan, post,
revolutionary, and former employee of the British Broadcasting
Corporation, was scheduled to speak on the Irish struggle for
freedom on that day. A copy of the announcement is attached
herato, lettered E.

The "Temple News" in its edition of October 23, 1969, contains an article captioned "Irish Fighter Blasts British Atrocities." A copy of this article is attached hereto, lettered F.

The Philadelphia Inquirer, a daily newspaper published in Philadelphia, in its edition for October 25, 1969, contains an article on Page 6 captioned "SDS Begins Three-Day Meeting in Temple Hall." The article reflected that Dominic Behan, spokeshan for the Irish Republican Army, author, post, and brother of the late playeright Brendan Behan, told the gathering:

"We are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution...we're not going to stand idly while genocide might begin in Ireland." Behan said the IRA with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in todefend people, but now we are going further." A copy of this article is attached hereto, lettered G.

A characterization of the Students for a Democratic Society is attached hereto.

#### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SD3), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Fort Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left kotes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect egates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

### TRAITORTED TRAITORS

Regime called the majority of the citizens of Northern Ireland "traitors who were imported to live there by the British." The Irish Reublic Army is pledged to remove all foreign inhabitants from Northern Ireland and unite the country.

The soldier described the fighting force he belongs to as an underground army dedicated to protecting the citizens from the "brutality" inflicted upon them by the police of ireland. He described the police as "tools" of the British povernment who incloriminately attack citizens of the country.

## SDS Bogins 3-Day Mesing In Temple Hall

Students for a Democratic Society opened a three-day ragional conference Friday in Temple University's Beury Hall, with about 200 students meeting before a draped Vietcong flag.

Those attending the session, with pictures of Mao Tse-tung. Ho Chi Minh and Lenin on prominent display, were told that the scheduled principal speaker, former SDS national president Carl Oglesby, would not attend because of illness.

Dominic Behan, spokesman for the Irish Republican Army, author, poet and brother of the late playwright Brendan Behan, told the gathering: "We are over here tooking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution... we're not going to stand by idly while genocide might begin in Ireland."

He said the IRA, with its 200 armed men in Northern Ireland, "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in to defend people, but now we are going further."

A second speaker. Philadelphia native Nocl Ignatin, former national SDS officer, said the movement to the left is "approximately at the same stage that Lenin was in 1694.... Russian history tells us that in 1694 to 1899 the Russian revolution made a transition from a movement that was 73 percent students to 80 percent proletariat."

### PLACK PANTHER PARTY

CONFINERAL

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BDP) was started during December, 1956, in Cakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY GEORGE SDALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Cakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed (u)

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:(4)

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere. "(4)

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "... we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."(u)

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and Scature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun. (4)





Attached heroto are reproductions of three items relating to the captioned Conference, which appeared in the November 15, 1989, issue of the "Irish Echo", a weekly newspaper published in New York City, which appears on the newsstands cancrally on the Wednesday prior to the actual date appearing a each issue.

It is to be noted that in the attached article captioned, "N.A.I.J. Holds First Conference", Miss Eilish McDarmo I, a representative of the left-wing People's Damocracy, a law student at Queens University in Belfast, who was present at the Conference, said, in part:

"People's Democracy, as you will know,...believes its objectives can only be obtained by ousting both Tory Governments and the setting up of an Irish Workers Republic..."

The article also mentins that Kewin Boyle, 28 year old representative of People's Democracy, a lecturer in law at









Gogarty is quoted as saying, "...but at the rick of losing your much valued support, rather than risk the splitting and destruction of our movement, we are prepared to forego all further aid from all or any American groups, so as to preserve our unity and integrity".

Gogarty reportedly concluded his remarks with the statement, "If any society is not prepared to continue its support in the understanding we shall work out through this conference, then I say, just leave us alone and allow us to get on unhindered with the task in our own way."



### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has adviced that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Muron, Michigan, in June, 1992. From an initial idealogical posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marniem-Leminiam. MICHAEL MLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leminist movement. program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnan war position and finally to its procent advocacy of an anti-imperialist line. linking up the cuprensed peoples of Asia. Africa and Latin America with the black liberation nevenent in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwice struggles against United States imperialism. On the other and, SBS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1603 West Mad son Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the Hational Council and Kational Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to Mational Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

"The Advocate", a weekly newspaper published at New York, New York, in its issue of November 15, 1969, published a column by Jee O'Connor, a reproduction of which is attached hereto.

According to O'Connor, the total attendance for the three day session of the NAIJ-sponsored "international & conference" was as follows:

> Friday (November 7, 1969) 588 Saturday (November 8, 1909) 1,103 Sunday (November 9, 1969) 378

In his column, O'Connor lists by name a number of groups affiliated in Ireland with the N.I.C.R.A. (Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association), naming members of the General Committee, the list including a member of the Communist Party (CP) among others representing divergent groups. Mr. O'Connor states that divergent groups, in joint solidarity, "compromised their geometric differences toward one aim, a civil rights program. In this they have solicited our cooperation. The minority refuses to do this except on their dictated terms. They have been totally rejected by the C.R.A. according to the members of the Executive Committee attending the conference.

Mr. O'Connor's article includes a list of affiliated American groups that endorsed the C.R.A. resolution read by Mr. (Frank) Gogarty.





BLACK PANTHER PARTY Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self-Defease

SECKET

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and MUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. Chairman, and MUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1996, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASCH MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

included in the introduction to an article appearing is the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Slack Panther" is the estatement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. "We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."



## STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Muron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national MICHAEL leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cubs are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other head, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1808 West Medison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year suring a summer National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

Present at the Conference, according to Shields, were Cathal Goulding, Chief of Staff of the Irish Republican Army (IRA); Frank Gogarty, Chairman of the Morthern Ireland Civil Rights Association (MICRA), and Mrs. Martin, a visitor from London (who is a spokesman for civil rights in London).

Mr. Shields commented, in part, that Frank Gogarty had definitely stated at the Conference that his organization endorsed Heron's NAIJ as a collection agency in the United States, a statement which Mr. Shields regarded as surprising.

Joe O'Connor in his column mentioned above, includes some of the statements reportedly made by Mr. Gogarty at the Conference.

Sean Maxwell, in his column, referred to above, reported that Brian Heron conducted most of the proceedings at captioned Conference. He reported the speakers from Ireland included the following:

Also attached is a reproduction of an item clipped from page one of the Movember 22, 1969 issue of the "Irish Echo," namely, an article entitled "Analysis: the "Irish Echo," namely, an article entitled "Analysis: Splits Hurt Rights Drive" by John Kelly, which was carried so as a "Special to the Irish Echo." Mr. Kelly's column alludes to what he refers to as hysteria over the question indicated to be now in the minds of some people as to "are we going to be now in the minds of some people as to "are we going the civil rights movement, both in Ireland and in "the supporting stateside organizations." Kelly's column contains commentary on the controversy regarding the reported appointment of NAIJ as the only association to act on behalf of the NICRA in the United States, and on the conflicting statements issued by Frank Gogarty and by Dr. Con McCluskey of the CRA Executive on the matter.

Kelly's article reports that McCluskey said that the NAIJ was banned by the eighteen organization Irish Action Committee in America because it was associated with the Black Panthers and the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).



DOMINICK BEHAN and other members of the Irish Republican Army (IRA), alluded to in the first paragraph of the letter, are required to register pursuant to the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended.

The opening paragraph of Mr. YEAGLEY's letter, containing pertinent information concerning reported activities of BEHAN, is set forth verbatum immediately below:

"According to a news story by Leonard Downie, Ir., published on page Bl4 of the <u>Washington Post</u> of October 27, 1969, Dominick Behan and other members of the Irish Republican Army have been touring "Eastern U.S. cities, asking anyone who will listen to send money to Northern Ireland Catholics for guns. They have been driving up and down the coast in a wildly decorated microbus." Downie also reports that Dominick Behan "came to Washington yesterday to raise money for guns for Northern Ireland's Catholic minority" and that he addressed local members and sympathizers of the National Association for Irish Justice gathered at a Cleveland Park home."

#### At Philadelphia

The Philadelphia Inquirer, a daily newspaper published in Philadelphia, in its edition for October 25, 1969, contains an article on page six captioned "SDS Begins Three-Day Meeting in Temple Hall." The article reflected that Dominic Behan, spokesman for the Irish Republican Army, author, poet, and brother of the late playwright BRENDAN BENAN, told the gathering: "we are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution...we're not going to stand idly will genocide might begin in Ireland." Behan said the IRA with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were stracked. We stepped in to defend people, but now we are going further."

A characterization of the Students for a Democratic Society is attached hereto.



The "Temple News", official newspaper of Temple University, Philadelphia, in its edition of October 22, 1969, published an article captioned "Dominic Behan: Irish poet to speak today". The article stated that Dominic Behan, poet, revolutionary and former employee of British Broadcesting Corporation, would "speak today at 2:30 in Ritter Hall auditorium. The following comments appeared in the article:

"Behan, the brother of the late great Irish poet Brendan Behan, will speak on the Irish struggle for freedom. He will also read some of his poetry."

"Behan is a member of the Irish Revolutionary Army. His speech is being sponsored by the English department."

#### B. Activities related to Tour of Minibus

The "Daily World" in its issue of Saturday, October 11, 1969, page 10, carried an article entitled "Irish bus to weylay. British train in US", a reproduction of which is attached hereto, lettered A.

The "Daily World" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

The article reported that according to sources close to the IRA, the IRA was conducting a tour in a bus called "Johnston's Motor Car", in which IRA units would follow the British train, the "Flying Scotsman", on the latter's tour of US cities to promote British-made goods. The IRA tour was reportedly being conducted as IRA's contribution to the nation-wide boycott of British products being conducted in the US by the NAIJ.

According to the article, the bus reportedly would appear at churches, universities, factory gates, and union halls, "and funds will be raised for the IRA Political Prisoners Defense Committee".


DOMINICK BEHAN, according to the article, would go along with the bus (and train) and would speak on the Irish struggle.

It indicated that DOMINIC BEHAN would be part of the entertainment programs scheduled for Friday and Saturday evenings, November 7 and 8, 1969.



### D. BEHAN at Forum at Pace College, October 23, 1969

on November 5, 1969, advised that en organization known as en Ad Hoc Committee for Irish Justice had been formed at Pace College in downtown Manhattan (New York City), at the conclusion of a Pace Press Forum held October 23, 1969.

of October 29, 1969, a school publication, the first page of which contains an article captioned "Dominic Behan Speaks on Irish Civil Rights". The article gives an account of talks given to students at Pace by JAMES GAFFEY, a member of the Clan na Gael, and by DOMINIC BEHAN. BEHAN, described in the article as a member of the IRA, reportedly stated that his speaking tour here was being sponsored by the NAIJ.

The erticle mentions that the Ad Hoc Committee formed at Pace is a part of the MAIJ.

A reproduction of the erticle, containing additional comments attributed to BEMAN, is attached hereto, lettered D.

### E. Subject Speaker at Hamden, Connecticut

# Erish bus to wayley British train in U.S.

NEW YORK. October 10 — Reliable sources close to the outlawed Irish Republican Army (IRA) in New York have revealed that the IRA plans to ambush a British train in the U.S. to focus attention on what an IRA spokesman terms "British imperialism's denials of basic civil rights" to the people of Northern Ireland.

The train, the "Flying Scotsman," is traveling on U.S. tracks across the country to promote British-made goods. Pulling a 10-car train, the "Flying Scotsman" will go from Boston to Houston October 8-November 15.

The IRA in New York insisted that its planned ambush of the train will be non-violent. "The campaign in America is purely educational," it statement reads.

"The IRA is conducting the tour as its contribution to the nat on-wide boycott of Eritish products being conducted in the U.S. by the National Association

for Irish Justice," the New York-based organization which sponsored Bernadette Devlin's recent trip to the U.S.

The IRA sources say that IRA units "will follow the 'Flying Scotsman' with a bus called 'Johnston's Motor Car.' The original 'Johnston's Motor Car' became famous during the Irish War of Independence and inspired the song popularized by the Clancy Brothers and Tomray Makem."

"'Johnston's Motor Car' will also appear at churches, universities, fretery potential aulien

## Dominic Behan Speaks On Irish Civil Rights

As the civil rights struggle rages in Northern Ireland, the Pace Press invited Dominic Behan to speak, to give the students some insight as to what is happening, what has happened and what is being planned with regard to the "Irisa question."

The Pace Press Forum was held Thursday, October 23 at 4 o'clock in Schaeberle Hall. Mr. Dehan was delayed in arriving, so Mary Wingaie, a Pace English major who acted as maderator, introduced

James Gaffney as the first speaker who gave background information, Mr. Gaffney is a member of the Clant na Gael, . U.S. organization supporting the Irish Republican Army, Just back from Ireland, he explained that the U.S. papers were very vague; the situation has been presented as Catholics lighting Protestants as though it were a religious fight. differences between the Irish Republican Army and the National Association for Irish Justice, the organization in this country that is speasoring his speaking tour here. The NAIJ, is for civil rights in Northern Ireland, "one man-one vote." The I.R.A. supports the civil rights and the N.A.1.J., hoping that they will support the LR A, and their fight to end British compation and oppression of people, hit. That is not saying that Chichester-Clark is any better.

When asked about the I.R.A. and Bernadette Devlin, he answered, "We are like St. Paul. We'll take help from anyone. She did raise a lot of money. I only wish that I was as good-looking."

Concerning the clergy, Mr. Behan said that their position is the same as it was in 1916. The remains priest remains the supporter as he was in 1916. After the Easter Rising many priests were executed because of their association with the Sinn Feln. But the Church is still the same too. The Church, during the years of the troubles exiled priests because of their parts in the movement. "Father Dominic. who was extled to Alberia. Canala, is my namesake. Please don't think that I'm named after that bloody saint, that womanhater!"

BLACK PANTHER PARTY Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOEBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1966 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Cakland police officer.

The official newspaper. "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are the serves against the police who are should be killed. referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by EPP Manister of Education, GHONGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere: Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite: Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrol of a gun."

MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the China, Vietnam black liberation movement in the United States. and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

Its official paper "New Left Notes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). 





"We are over here looking for money to buy guns to spread the revolution...we're not going to stand idle while genocide might begin in Ireland."

Behan said the IRA with its 300 armed men in Northern Ireland "didn't throw petrol bombs until our people were attacked. We stepped in to defend people,





Dominic Balan, post and frush sevolutionary, was to quark yesterday at 2:30 p.m. in Ritter Hall, but as of 3:40 had not appeared. In his place Gorald Regime, a seldior from the frush Republic Army, addressed tonse 200 students and naked them for linancial support and to boycott all British goods.

Regime spoke of the "atrocities" that the British government has been inflicting against citizens of southern triand, and asked for financial aid from American citizens so the frish Republic Army could afford to buy weapons to fight British who are its assumbly.

#### NOT PATRICTS

The soldier said that he was very disappointed in the stitute of most fish-Americans toward their homeland and he called the majority of fish-Americans hypocrites. Regime edded, "Although they may show concern for what is going on in frelend, when it comes down to teking action they shrugg the empounibility and prove themselves to be mot patriots at eli."

#### IMPORTED TRAITORS

Regime called the emjority of the citizens of Northern Iseland "traitors who were imported to live there by the British." The Irish Roublic Army is pledged to remove all-foreign inhabitants from Northern Iseland and units the country.

The soldier described the fighting force he belongs to as an underground army dedicated to protecting the citizens from the "brutality" inflicted upon them by the police of feeland. He described the police as "tacks" of the British government who indiscriminately attack sitisens of the country.


#### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SD3), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Rotes" shows the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven numbers are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

## 'Rioting 13 Good for You

LONDON — (AP) — Rioting is good for some people a British psychiatrist reported after an exhaustive study in Northern Ireland. He concluded that a man who can act out his aggressive feelings, by throwing a brick or a punch, &s less likely to keep his frustrations bottled up inside.

Dr. H. A. Lyons, a consultant psychiatrist at Belfast's Purdysburn Hospital, reported in the British Medical Journal that the number of suicides in Belfast fell 50 percent as street riots there intensified a couple of years ago.

For several years Lyons studied figures showing the number of suicides in Belfast and the number of people with depressive illness, a serious mental disorder.

He compared the average for relatively quiet years, 1964-68, with figures for the worst year of riots then available, 1969-70.

As the riots increased, he reported, "there was a significant decrease in depressive illness in Belfast in both sexes and all age groups." On average, the decrease worked out to about 13 percent, but in the worst riot areas depressive iliness was down as much as 67 percent.

For purposes of contrast, Lyons also studied figures for the same years in a relatively calm area, County Dovin. There he found both suicides and depressive illness on the increase in 1969-70.

Lyons concluded that suicide and depressive illness declined in the capital, for both men and women, because "in large areas of Belfast there was relative freedom to be aggressive.'

His investigation covered only suicides and depressive illness. Other studies have charted an increase in Belfast in less serious mental conditions, such as acute anxiety and emotional stress, due to the escalating violence.

"The Advocate," a weekly newspaper published in New York City in its edition of November 6, 1971, contains an article, "Philadelphia I.R.A. Club". The article advised that the James Larkin Irish Republican Club was being formed and that FRANK HOULIHAN of Philadelphia was the chairman.

The October 4th Organization is named after an important incident in Kensington history—the Rebellion of October 4th, 1779. During the First American Revolution, the merchants and businessmen of Kensington and Philadel—phia began to hoard food and clothing in order to inflate the prices. On October 4th hundreds of Kensington people led by THOMAS PAINE stormed the homes of these merchants, seized their supplies and distributed the goods free to the people who needed them.

The October 4th Organization believes that working class people of Kensington and other neighborhoods are still oppressed by the big businessmen, rich merchants and politicians who serve them—the criminal ruling class, the behind-the-scenes dictators of America, the people who run the system that keeps us down and out.
