Dear Leo:

I was glad to have the opportunity to hear about the continuing very worthwhile activities of the International Rescue Committee.

I note that in your letter to the White House you have followed through on pressing for further Congressional attention to the President's proposals for changes in the basic immigration laws. In our restricted area of influence we are also seeking to encourage the adaptation of immigration legislation to reflect the President's proposals.

As we discussed in our meeting, the matter of fund raising is properly one which should be pursued with private foundations and sources. While recognizing the many additional projects which your group might initiate, perhaps, as you suggest, the present endeavors of the new members of your Board could best be devoted to solicitation of private financial support for the projects already underway. For the Government's part, financial support of private groups such as the I.R.C. is contained in the Department of State's U.S. Escapes Program and the special activities of ICA and USIA with which you are familiar.

In relation to the plight of the Yugoslav refugees, U.S. Government participation is, as you know, placed in the Department of State, principally in the U.S. Escapes Program, and I believe that these would be the best people to give you the guidance you need. You can rest assured that the U.S. Government is taking interest as appropriate in the Yugoslav refugees and their welfare.

R.I. Document 100-122-6 reflects a copy of a telegram to Secretary of State Dean ACHESON from the Executive Secretary, Americans for Intellectual Freedom dated 20 March 1949 requesting that an emergency visa be granted and trip to the U.S. expedited for Pabel LYSZKO, outstanding Russian scientist who has fled from the Soviet Government. The AIF desires that LYSZKO address their freedom rally as their guest on 26 March 1949. Among the signers of the telegram is one Leo CHENE.

A memorandum in the same R.I. Document dated 1 April 1949 discloses that GFC began coordinating with the State Department in an attempt to effect LYSZKO's admittance to this country.

R.I. Document 43-120-5 is a memorandum to record dated 25 January 1952 reflecting that GFC and CC Contacts effected the use of Subject's services, through his position with the Research Institute of America, to backstop the cover story of a proposed agent in training.
