

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<u>d.</u> All personal documents taken by Customs from military personnel or civilian personnel employed by the Nar Department or by contractors for the War Department will be referred by Customs to the nearest District Postal Censorship Station or Traveler Consorship Station for examination and recommendation as to disposition, or will be acted upon by Customs.

4. All commanders will at the time of issuing orders directing travel to or from the continental United States, inform personnel affected by the travel orders of the provisions of this letter.
