## 1.

a. While still at Kyankpyn Major Charles J. TREES and Captain Carrol C. GARRETSON called HOUTS to their tent. ITREES was HOUTS' CUmmanding Officer and GARRETSON was Executive Oficer to TREES.) TREES stated that GARRETSON hac discovered iitiy-one .45 calibre automatic pistols at Chitagons which were "charged vut to no one." TREES and GARRETSON believed they could get a "sood amount" of money irom the sale of the weapons, but they wanted HOUTS' advice so they woulen't set caught. (HOUIS had been in the FBI). They offered HOUTS one third of the proift and, after several days, he agreed.
b. On the nitht of $3-4$ July $19+5$ HOUTS assisted in the clandestine delivery of the pistols to a Lt. Col. Tun Aung, a Burmese oiticer in the "Burma kinles" for burial, until a market could be isund.
c. On 15 July 1945 BOUTS was questioned by the OSS investigato: ard assisted him in the recovery of the pistols.
2. During tie first week that HOUTS was in Rangoon an informer, told him that 90 sworis had been burice jat the compound of A. Habeeb. At GARRETSON's Eirection and expense HOUTS had the swords cleaned. On 25 May 1945 HOUTS delivered them to TREES' quarters. On 13 July 1945 TREES quariers wore searched and 30 swords were iound and confiscated by OSS. (Several classidied documents were also iound in TREES dutile bag. 1
3. TREES. GARRETSON and persunme! unde - their command misappropriated seoperty (jewelryand old bouks) during the iirst two weeks of the occuzation o: Rangoon.
4. Six CSS pezsuncl were killé in a plane crash ciarly in June. Three parachute were eecurcred trom the crashed phate. GARRETSON and HOUTS rad ;dumas and other articles ot clothing tailored from the parachutes.
5. l: Sprin $19 . \operatorname{SR}^{5}$ TRES and GARRETSON were involued in the illegal sale ot ofition.


6. In carly July 1945 TREES and Houts were involved in an illegal money exchange.
7. Specific charges against HOUTS, as recommended by the investigating officer:
a. Misapplication of 50 . 45 calibre automatic pistols and one Model M-3 submachine gun, property of the U.S.
b. Conspiracy with TREES and GARRETSON to misapply the above firearms.
c. Larceny of 86 swords.
d. Conspiracy with TREES and GARRETSON to feloniously take, steal and carry away 86 swords.
e. Conspiracy with TREES and GARRETSON to procure and deal in abandoned property found in Rangoon.
