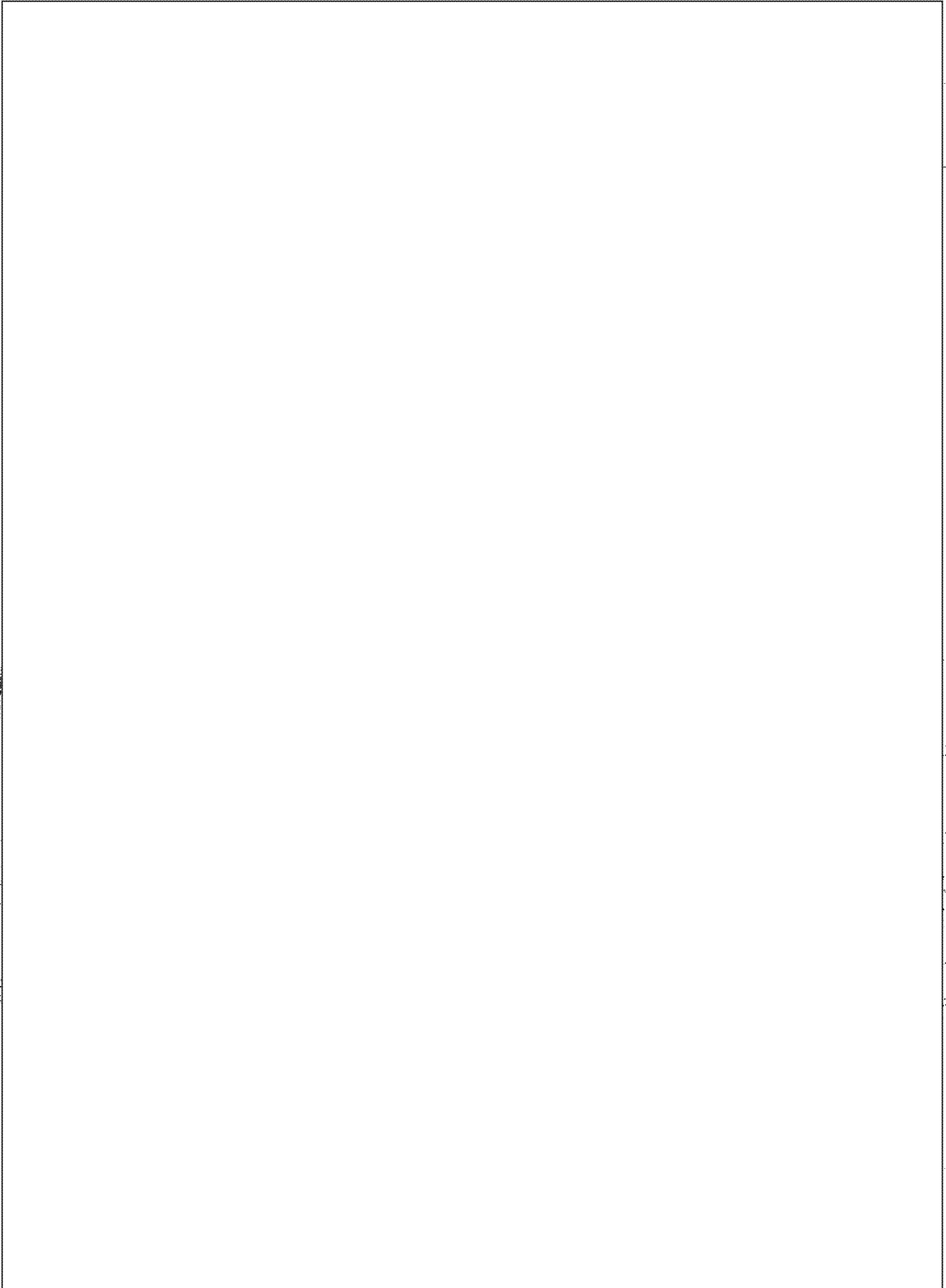

It was reported on 28 Aug 57, that Mexi Pres. and Minister of Interior studying case of Subject with view of denying Mexi citizenship and deporting Subject. Fernando AGUIRRE Hernandez said Subject's file had been picked for "jefe" and investigation of Subject underway. (MEXI-09), 30 Aug 57 in STERN CASE FILE

See HQA-7706, 21 Aug 57 in KICKER case file for details on MCKENIN-HALPERIN conversation on 3 Jan 57, concerning brief run down on Subject's life.

Leon MAWER stated that in Aug 57, he introduced him to the STERNs at Subject's residence in Mexico City. MAWER said that at this time, Subject worked for him as manager and representative of his factory, "Milades A.S.C.". (HQA-7613), 28 Aug 57 in STERN CASE FILE

Mexican newspaper "Ultimas Noticias", dated 2 Sept 57, states Mexican authorities expect to apprehend Subject any moment. States will expel Subject from Mexico because of his help in obtaining passage for STERNs to Prague. Believes Subject liaison for US Comies and Mexican elements. (MEXI-118, 8 Sept 57 in HALPERIN CASE FILE)

It is reported, on 13 Sept 57, that Subject was working as an Economist for Mexican Government. It was later reported, on that on 17 Sept 57, Subject was discharged by Financiera Nacional. Subject's wife dropped as teacher American school. (MEXI-121), 19 Sept 57 in STERN CASE FILE

Subject told Ralph SCOTT that musician friend Mrs NICARELLI had agreed to take duffle-bag to Illinois and then send by railway express to unspecified destination. Ralph is to pick up dufflebag and deliver to NICARELLI instead of to Subject. Subject stated to a Mrs Charles that NICARELLI agreed to take dufflebag to Peoria, Ill. Bag would come from this person to Charles. Charles then to send dufflebag via Railway Express to Rabbi HILLEL Omsoren, 8 Dehalb Place, Morristown, N.J. (MEXI-061, 28 Aug 57 in HALPERIN CASE FILE)

Subject and Frederick VANDERBILT (FIELD?) seem to have left Mexico where they not occupying their homes. (MEXI-290, 18 Oct 57 in STERN CASE FILE)

Subject still in Mexico as of 17 Oct 57. Subject spends weekends in STERN Cuernavaca home. (MEXI-403, 18 Oct 57 in HALPERIN CASE FILE)

Following phone call from Moscow by STERN to Ruth HIRSHFIELD on 7 Oct, STERN immediately called bank verifying signatures of Subject and NOVICE on checks. NOYOLA and HIRSHFIELD planned to meet Subject morning of 17 Oct saying he no longer signing checks. (MEXI-421, 15 Oct 57 in STERN CASE FILE)

Subject made appointment for typhoid vaccination on 21 Oct with Dr. David BRICILLOVSKY. (MEXI-483, 28 Oct 57 in HALPERIN CASE FILE)

Subject's son, David, was in Mexico City and at Cuernavaca with parents. Stated he planned to leave for Chicago on Saturday 2 Oct 57. (HQA-061), 23 Oct 57 in STERN CASE FILE

Subject borrowed \$3000 from STERN's firm, Negociadora de Comercio. Ruth HIRSHFIELD doesn't believe he will repay; Ruth said Subject wants to get rid of NOYOLA, so he can control of STERN's business. (Same ref above)

It is reported that Subject and wife have a son named Charles David HALPERIN (aka David HALPERIN) and a daughter named Judith, who is married and lives in the USA. Judith and her husband visited Subject in Mexico City in October 1956, and had returned to USA. (DWB-92038, 19 Sept 57 in # 201-128561)

FBI Leon case to AND BSB on 26 Nov 57 as intermediary for GARCETE (Luis F.) who wants to meet AFB, to provide info on Soviet agents in Mexico. Said info consisted only of names of Soviet agents and mentioned GOLDB, GJADA (phonetic), and HALPERIN (possibly referring to Subject). (ASAC-111, 26 Nov 57 in GARCETE CASE FILE)

Subject read three letters: One, postmarked Dec 57 forwarding a final notice of a premium due from Associates Life Insurance Co., Indianapolis, Indiana; two, dated 12 Dec 57 from David, Subject's son in Chicago, Ill.; three, from Abe HELLER, 56 7th Ave., NYC, dated 6 Dec 57, which states that he and his wife Jane will be down to Mexico for a visit in February 58. 3.2 In. Mexican MO for David. Make appointment for this Thursday at 2 for dinner. House at 216, doesn't give street. MO relates that he made a request of the Embassy, and they sent him a form to fill out and a request for a personal interview. MO doesn't want to fill it out until he speaks to David, since there are things in it that he doesn't want to fill out. They will go over it this Thursday.

4.5 Out - number not recorded. Mrs. H. out to Celia. Mrs. H. is better. (line noise) Chatter. Borah left for California this morning. A good friend of Halperin's passed away - died of cirrhosis of the liver. (no name given)

6.5 to 11.0 Nothing recorded.

11.0 In. American WO for Mrs. H. (It's Molly) Exchange of greetings. Talk about weather, health, plans, going downtown, Molly will call later.

12.5 In. MH calling, says he will be home a little late - about 3. They will wait. Mrs. H. asks if everything okay, but MH had already hung up.

12.7 In. Marvin Bank for MH, but talks to David. Bank asks David about vacation, school, medical school, David's free time, when MH is home. Bank wants MH to call him when he arrives - 2037-52.

13.0 In. Mrs. Morrison for Mrs. H. Mrs. M owes Mrs. H. some money. She will send it. Mrs. H. will call in October about whether or not she will continue tutoring.

13.2 In. American WO for Mrs. H. (It's Celia) Mrs. H. says that she doesn't feel very well, things are very bad. Celia asks if she has heard. Mrs. H. says yes. Celia wants to know if they should come to see her, but Mrs. H. says that she will be alright - but they can come if they want. (Celia might have asked if Mrs. H. hurt, but it sounds like heard).

6.2 In. Rosero in for David, and wants David to call him immediately upon returning. Lupe says she will give him the message.

Wednesday, 18 Sept., 1957

6.3 In. Jorge for Lupe. He is down in front. Lupe will leave to see him on Durango right now.

6.8 In. American MG, asks Lupe to tell MH to call him at 20-3338-83, Sr. Nevick. Lupe will leave the message.

7.0 Out to 20-338-83. MH out to Sam. MH wants to know what Sam wants, and he says that he would like to know if everything went through on schedule. MH says it went through 100%, and now "we're" waiting to see what is going to happen. Sam asks if it was done as he suggested, and MH says it was, exactly, and everything is under control. Sam comments that MH should know in a couple of days, but MH says "auten sibe". Sam then says that it really doesn't matter if it does take a couple of days, but MH says that it does, he still has to be on his toes, and that he is still running around. But, MH says, they have something to do, and something in the works. Sam asks what "she" tells him. MH says he will get in touch with her tomorrow night, that she had to make out a whole new set of papers, and she sent them in this afternoon, and might have word tomorrow. Sam comments that it is an emergency and it has to be done fast - MH agrees. Sam thinks that even though it doesn't go through fast, that he can still get time now. MH says yes, that this thing had to be done, and what ever else has to be done will take its natural course. SUBJECT : Deportation of Maurice Halperin

1. Attached is a copy of [redacted] in which [redacted] asked for guidance on their effort to deport Halperin. We discussed this on the morning of 12 September. During the afternoon of 12 September I received HMM-A-7904 which outlines the stations' efforts to bring about Halperin's deportation.

2. You will note from (para 2 of HMM-A-7904) that [redacted] began its effort on 21 August when LUKAYAK-2 was asked by a Mexican official for information on Halperin. It appears that [redacted] then went forward in an attempt to have Halperin deported without advising Headquarters or the Legal Attache.

3. Thus, when it appeared from LIMEW's statements (see [redacted] that ODENVY did not want American Communists deported, [redacted] realized that it was working at cross purposes with the Bureau since the station's efforts had been in progress for almost three weeks.

4. That the Mexican government is probably confused at this moment is indicated by the fact that Gustavo Deas Ordaz (see para 8 of dispatch) who is in touch with Santillan, probably knows that Santillan is receiving information from LUKAYAK-2, who is known to be in touch with the Americans. 5. We cannot say, on the basis of available information, whether or not the Legal Attache knows of our effort to deport Halperin. However, if he does know, and if we go to him now to say (as we decided yesterday) that we are planning an operation to deport Halperin, he could well take the position that he should have been consulted several weeks ago since, if Halperin is deported he will land squarely in ODENVY's lap.

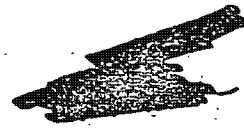

1. Submitted herewith is a detailed account of [REDACTED] efforts directed towards inducing the Mexican Government to take action in the case of Maurice Hyman HALPERIN, American Communist residing in Mexico and close associate of Alfred Kaulman STERN, Soviet agent.
2. On 21 August 1957, Fernando ROMERO Hernandez, employee of the Mexican Ministry of Interior and associate of LIKAYAK-2, asked LIKAYAK-2 to contact his "correspondent" in the US [REDACTED] stating that the top officials of the Ministry of Interior needed information on HALPERIN urgently. It was recalled at this time that HALPERIN's name had appeared in the Mexican press in connection with the Alfred K. STERN case.
3. On 21 August LIKAYAK-2 relayed this request [REDACTED] stating his belief that the request had been originated by Fernando ROMAN Lugo, Undersecretary of Interior, who has dealt with this station through LIKAYAK-2 on various matters in the past.
4. On 22 August Fernando ROMERO Hernandez asked LIKAYAK-2 if he had already sent a cable to his "correspondent" asking for details on HALPERIN. ROMERO added that the request came from very high up in the Mexican Government. LIKAYAK-2 replied that he had sent the cable and expected an answer the following day.
5. On 23 August 1957 [REDACTED] met with LIKAYAK-2 and, with the approval of [REDACTED] gave the following information to him, dictating it in Spanish:

HALPERIN is an active American Communist and is a known Soviet agent.  
HALPERIN is employed by the Mexican Government and has his office at the building of La Nacional Financiera, Room 414.  
HALPERIN's wife, Edith, is a Communist and teacher at the American School in Mexico City.  
HALPERIN's son, David, is a student in Chicago, Illinois.  
HALPERIN has the power of attorney for Alfred K. STERN.

6. At this meeting [REDACTED] also made the following suggestions:
  - a. The office of STERN, as well as his home, should be raided without warning as they were believed to contain papers of interest pertaining both to HALPERIN and STERN.

- b. Ruth HIRSHFIELD and Ralph SCOTT, secretary and chauffeur to STERN, should be picked up and interrogated. [redacted] would want copies of the documents taken as well as of the results of the interrogations. CARVAJAL was supplied with the home addresses of SCOTT and HIRSHFIELD. (NOTE: These also had appeared in the newspapers.)
  - c. (fnu) WATTY, of Credito Bursatil, should be questioned about the whereabouts and other details of the STERN finances and those of HALPERIN. It was explained to LIKAYAK-2 that WATTY had handled the transfer of large sums of STERN's money into Mexico prior to STERN's flight to Czechoslovakia. (It was indicated that this information was obtained in the U.S.A.)
  - d. It was suggested that HALPERIN's petition for Mexican citizenship be denied.
  - e. It was suggested that the STERN funds be frozen in Mexico. (NOTE: This was the crux of the problem, for it was felt that by giving the Mexican Government officials some chance to take part or all of the funds their cooperation [redacted] was guaranteed.)
  - f. It was suggested that HALPERIN be deported either to the US or to a place where he could be picked up by US authorities. Panama was suggested as possibly suitable in this connection.
7. On the evening of 23 August, LIKAYAK-2 gave a written report on the above to Fernando ROMERO Hernandez in a sealed envelope. A copy of this report exists on as yet undeveloped film [redacted] LIKAYAK-2 allowed ROMERO Hernandez to read another copy, which was not enclosed in the sealed envelope.
  8. ROMERO Hernandez stated that the envelope should not be given to Fernando ROMAN Lugo, Undersecretary of Interior, but to Jose T. SANTILLAN, Chief of Inspection of the Immigration Service, which is a division of the Ministry of Interior. ROMERO Hernandez added that this was because of the President of Mexico was the originator of the request for information on HALPERIN. He added that the President had requested the Minister of Interior, Angel CARVAJAL, for this information. CARVAJAL relayed the request to Gustavo DIAZ Ordaz, Official Mayor of Interior, who in turn, in a formal-signed note seen by LIKAYAK-2, passed the request to Jose T. SANTILLAN. SANTILLAN relayed it to LIKAYAK-2, as noted above.
  9. ROMERO Hernandez took the sealed envelope from LIKAYAK-2 and passed it to Jose T. SANTILLAN. LIKAYAK-2 was able to confirm this in a conversation with SANTILLAN the next day.
  10. SANTILLAN gave the original sealed envelope to Fernando ROMAN Lugo to whom, according to LIKAYAK-2, SANTILLAN is personally very loyal. ROMAN Lugo was reportedly very pleased with the contents but deleted a greeting directed to him by LIKAYAK-2 on the grounds that since the request originated within the Ministry from CARVAJAL no salutation to ROMAN Lugo should be included. ROMAN Lugo then made another copy, minus the salutation, and sent it to CARVAJAL, Minister of Interior.

11. LIKAYAK-2 heard on 24 August, following a conversation with SANTILLAN, that CARVAJAL was impressed with the report and believed it excellent. There seems little doubt that SANTILLAN, ROMERO Hernandez, ROMAN Lugo, and CARVAJAL were all attracted by the dazzling possibility of acquiring at least a portion of the STERN "millions".
12. On either 24 or 25 August ROMERO Hernandez made a cryptic remark to LIKAYAK-2 to the effect that a high official of the US Embassy in Mexico had seen the report on HALPERIN and thought it excellent. In reply to LIKAYAK-2's questioning, ROMERO Hernandez would not state how that official had come to see the report and would only state that the official might have been the Secretary to the Military Attache. On 28 August, while [redacted] listened in, LIKAYAK-2 made a call to ROMERO Hernandez and informed him it had been someone in the ODENVY office who had seen the HALPERIN report. This was considered logical since it is known from ODENVY that Romero Hernandez has contact with ODENVY though that office claims to regard him unfavorably.
13. On 28 August rumors quoted to LIKAYAK-2 by ROMERO Hernandez and SANTILLAN indicated that HALPERIN would be deported, that the President was studying the case and that a lot of action could be expected. Rafael HUERTA Nava, a police informant on Communist matters, hinted to LIKAYAK-2 that several raids were to be made in the near future, one of which was to be in Cuernavaca. This led LIKAYAK-2 to believe that the STERN-HALPERIN group was to be raided, as suggested [redacted]
14. Likewise on 28 August LIKAYAK-2 reported that he had been sent over the previous weekend to Cuernavaca to locate the Alfred K. STERN home there. He stated it is an imposing home, nearing completion. LIKAYAK-2 added that he has received a report that Ralph SCOTT, the Stern colored American chauffeur, is the lover of a negro woman named "La Martinique", who does semi-nude dances in Acapulco, and that for that reason her residence may also be searched.
15. At the close of the 28 August meeting with LIKAYAK-2, [redacted] admonished him to advise [redacted] at once of any developments in the HALPERIN case, especially if deportation appeared imminent.
16. Meanwhile a technical surveillance was re-established on the home of HALPERIN at 1115 hours on 24 August. This coverage, plus LCHAYFOWL coverage, was held in the belief that it could shed considerable light on developments in the case.

1. Following are additional items concerning Subject's conversations and activities which were recorded [Redacted] during Subject's stay at the hotel Sumer, Mexico City. As reported in reference A, [Redacted] was unable to render a complete transcription of the three reels because of street and radio noise on the tape. The following summary is a result of items which were remembered by [Redacted] present in the listening post and items which could be transcribed from the tapes.

- a. MUCENIK telephoned Maurice HALPERIN at 2055 hours on 3 June stating that he (MUCENIK) would be at HALPERIN's home in thirty (30) minutes. HALPERIN gave MUCENIK his address. HALPERIN stated that he was delighted to hear MUCENIK's voice and that he (HALPERIN) had tried to reach MUCENIK but had failed.
- b. At 2100 hours MUCENIK departed from his room returning at 2130.
- c. At 2140 hours, MUCENIK again telephoned Maurice HALPERIN and stated that he had visitors "including my relatives" and therefore could not go to HALPERIN's house. They arranged to meet at 1700 hours 4 June at the Hotel Sumer in MUCENIK's room. MUCENIK also received from HALPERIN the address of Leon FELIPE, Spanish Communist Poet. The address given by HALPERIN was Miguel Shultz 73, apartment 3. MUCENIK stated that he wished to get some recorded poetry from Felipe.
- d. At 2200 hours, MUCENIK phoned the hotel desk and requested that he be called at 0600 hours the next morning.
- e. At 0800 hours, 4 June MUCENIK was awakened.
- f. MUCENIK departed his room at 0830 hours 4 June.
- g. At 0910 hours MUCENIK had breakfast in the Hotel with Leon FELIPE Duhalt, Director of Public Relations for NOVARO EDITORES.

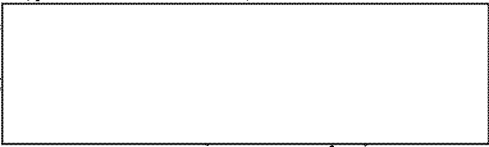

- h. At 1700 hours, Maurice HALPERIN arrived in Subject's room at the Hotel Bamer. MUCHNIK stated that he was in Mexico at the invitation of Luis MOCERO, publisher of comic books in Mexico. HALPERIN started off by giving a brief run down of his life. HALPERIN mentioned being in Harvard University and was involved with Harry Dexter WHITE. HALPERIN stated that J. Edgar HOOVER, Director Federal Bureau of Investigation, "wanted to get rid of someone...made someone testify." HALPERIN stated that after this he worked as a Consulting Economist and said, "I was never, strictly speaking, a Communist in my life...Red Bush Tail, yes." "Now I am a La La (phonetic) for a Government (Mexican) industrial development plan." HALPERIN stated that for this work he received a monthly retainer. "Edith (HALPERIN's wife) came to Mexico with me and adjusted well." MUCHNIK and HALPERIN discussed a dancer who was recently married and they didn't know where she now stands. MUCHNIK mentioned the fact that his daughter had studied in London and said that this was very expensive. MUCHNIK stated that he and his wife were very close and that the money which they had made while in Russia, they had rapidly spent and now do not know what to do. MUCHNIK said that he had dreamed a little of coming to Mexico; that his wife was now in New York and would wait there for his return. MUCHNIK said that in 1949 he left for Rome, Italy and that his children were still in Rome. MUCHNIK stated that while in the United States the FBI had asked him a lot of questions. MUCHNIK told the FBI that he was not a Communist but that the FBI tried to get him to work for them, cooperate with them. MUCHNIK stated that he introduced ELLISWORTH (fnu-phonetic) in the Soviet Union. MUCHNIK said that he had been with ELLISWORTH in Buenos Aires.
- i. At 2100 hours 4 June, MUCHNIK phoned Alfredo ROBLEDO (phonetic). MUCHNIK told ROBLEDO that he was from Buenos Aires and was the representative and translator for Alfred MILLER (phonetic). MUCHNIK stated that he was the sole person authorized to translate MILLER's books in Mexico and would send ROBLEDO a photostatic copy of his contract.
- j. At 2116 hours, MUCHNIK left his hotel room returning at 2210 hours, when he ordered dinner from room service.
- k. At 2245 MUCHNIK phoned the hotel desk and requested that he be called at 0800 hours the next morning.
- l. At 0845 hours, 5 June, MUCHNIK left his hotel room and had breakfast with Leon PAILLES Duhal.
- m. At 1000 hours MUCHNIK and PAILLES left the hotel in PAILLES' 1952 Cadillac, license plates DF 85028.
- n. MUCHNIK returned to his hotel room at 1615 hours departing at 1625 hours and returning again soon thereafter.

- c. At 1915 hours, FAILLES arrived at the Lauer Hotel and cashed a check for 3,000 pesos (approximately US\$240.00) before going up to MUCHNIK's room, FAILLES departed the hotel at 1930 hours.
- p. At 1935 hours, MUCHNIK departed the hotel.
- q. At 0645 hours 6 June, MUCHNIK left his hotel room and had breakfast with FAILLES in the hotel dining room.
- r. At 1000 hours MUCHNIK left the hotel for the airport accompanied by FAILLES.

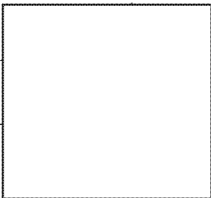

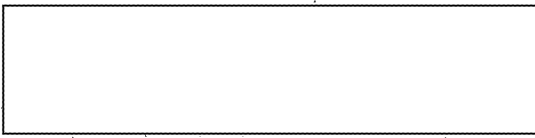

C.: "Yes I did and he said that the pre-med here is very bad - that was pre-med that David had, wasn't it?"

E.: "Yes, preparatory."

C.: "But the medical is better here. They have a group of 150 out of this 500 that started, this Harvard Experimental group." E. doesn't know anything about it. Well, there is a group of 150 and for this group they have gotten down from the States some trained teachers, and among these are two Rhodes Scholars. E. comments, "Is that a fact?" They have a very high type teacher for this group and the Rockefeller foundation judged this group among the 10 best medical groups in the world."

E.: "What are you talking about? Really?"

C.: "I'm talking about this group, this does not go for the whole school (bunch), and a couple of fellows that came out of this group had no trouble at all in passing their State Board (exam) in California."

E.: "Really?" "Is that a fact; and then does that go for this class only, or is it going to continue (a group like this every year.)"

C.: "It is continuous; as a matter of fact, on the basis of the success of this class they are considering revising the whole school - this does not include the pre-med; but the medical school only."

E.: "Yes, I understand that, but David now enters medical school, see?"

C.: "No, He does, but what happened to his pre-medical school?"

E.: "He... hesitating... He fin.. he finished."

C.: "He finished what, pre-med is three years."

E.: "But where?"

C.: "In the states."

E.: "But you can't have pre-med here, when you finish preparatory school here you just go on to medical school, I think."

C.: "Then I don't understand, in pre-med they have special subjects which prepare them for medical school; and D. didn't have that sort of training here."

E.: "Yes he did, I think."

C.: "He couldn't have. He couldn't have had intensive chemistry, intensive, what-you-may call it, all this stuff which prepares you for medical school."

E.: "Yes, he did. Cells, that was what was weak. That's what he had in preparatory which is equivalent to college pre-med."

C.: "Of the junior college."

E.: "No,

C.: "No, your wrong Edith, but I don't know where you're wrong."

E.: "The medical school here takes 6 and pre-med. C.: "Six." E.: "Or maybe it's 3 and 3."

C.: "C, I don't know. But Max told me that if you want to practice in the States later, they require the 3 yrs of pre-med to be taken in the states and then the

States will recognize the medical school here (in the National University). Then it all depends on the State Boards; but C. doesn't think they permit you to take the Board exam if you've taken all your medical training here, in Mexico.

E.: "O, this is a special course. Tell me is there only Americans in this 150."

C.: "Yeah, they're all on the GI Bill."

E.: "Tell me, isn't there any Mexicans?"

C.: "O, yes, but for the Mexicans it is difficult for all the text books are in English. Most of the text book, anyway are in English." They are constantly revised."

C. says, yes but if they will pick their course and their professors - you know there's an awful lot of guys who want to have a good time, an easy time and long vacations, etc. But with this course of the 150 they get no vacations, no holidays; only Good Fridays, Christmas, etc. But they don't get the whole weeks (here and there). E. says they will talk to D. about it and all isn't lost here. If he comes back it will be living at home, seeing the same friends and getting his work at the same time. The Seborer boy is doing a very fine job at the Red Cross every day. He's doing a good job, he works hard, and he is having a lot more advantages here than if he were in the States. There is no question about it. Anyway the experience hasn't hurt David at all; and he is going to see the family which will be nice. They agree to talk together again later and if E. has time she will drop by tomorrow. Bye Bye.

(The phone is taken off the hook, no dialing; but H's (v) is heard saying: "Come on Edith, come on Edith.")

14.0 Out to 20-84-18. (H is heard saying while dialing, I thought you wanted me to call.). M. Halperin (v) asks WO (said probably) for the Sr. or the Sra. One moment. WO comes to phone and they greet each other. MH calls him Albert, so this

must be Albert Stern. (-Is this phone no. correct? Number is not listed in telephone book for 1956?) H. tells Albert that they had a perfectly lovely time and it was lovely today. ACTION REQUESTED: a. Transcription of attached reels;  
b. Return copies of transcriptions [redacted]

1. There are attached three (3) reels which resulted from installation of a probe microphone from Room #1105 in the Essex Hotel [redacted] rented late on Monday 3 June, aimed at Room #1104 occupied by Jacobo MUCHNIK, from about 1000 hours on 2 June until about 1000 hours on 6 June 1957.
2. Due to street noises, the location of the microphone, MUCHNIK's wariness (as evidenced by his turning up his radio at the time of the visit of Maurice HALPERIN) and MUCHNIK's peculiarities (he talked in his sleep, read or talked aloud when alone) [redacted] unable to make transcriptions.
3. At times [redacted] (the latter occupied Room #1105 from late 3 June until MUCHNIK departed) did live-monitoring. It was by this method that Maurice HALPERIN's talk (from 1700 hours until 1915 hours on 4 June) with MUCHNIK in Room #1104 was heard. During this live-monitoring SECHEM heard HALPERIN describe how he was at Harvard University, how he got mixed up with Harry Dexter WHITE; and, how, since (J. Edgar) HOOVER wished to "get someone" he (HALPERIN) became the "victim". It was during this discourse that HALPERIN stated "I was never, strictly speaking, a Communist in my life." He added, "A Red Bush-tail, yes."
4. In this same conversation SECHEM heard MUCHNIK then take over and relate his experiences with the FBI. He said the FBI talked to him, asked him a lot of questions, he told them he was not a Communist; and they tried to recruit him, to get him to work for, cooperate with them.
5. Carbon copies of the attempts to transcribe these three (3) reels are attached for whatever assistance they may be to Headquarters.
6. It is believed that NURIOT has a laboratory in which they can delete certain wave-lengths and leave the conversations. With this, and translators who are bilingual, it is hoped that Headquarters can get meaningful transcriptions of these reels.

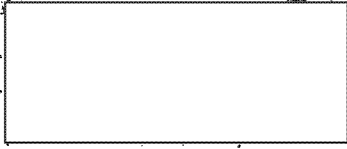
