MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

FROM : Lawrence F. Barker

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 16 November 1963

1. A meeting was held with LITAMIL-9 from 2000 hours to 2230 hours, 16 November. The meeting took place at B's home -- pick-up was by car and B's wife sat in back with L-9 -- he was introduced to her as "Señor Aguilar."

2. L-9 reported that on the afternoon of 16 Nov he was called by ANLEO-3 who wanted to see him on a matter of importance. L-9 was quite surprised to receive this call but told A-3 to "come over here now if you want to." A-3 said he thought it would be better for the two to meet at the bar of the Del Prado Hotel at about 1800 on 18 Nov. L-9 asked B for instructions. B said that in view of the possibility that L-9's home phone might be tapped or that A-3 might let word leak out that he had contacted L-9, L-9 should inform Ambassador Hernandez Armas of the call -- it was agreed that B would consult further on this matter and that the final decision would be relayed to him on the evening of 17 November -- L-9 would call B's home and B, in a short conversation would use the word Acapulco if the incident should be reported -- Mazatlan if not. (L-9 called as scheduled and the word Acapulco was used). L-9 was advised to keep away from A-3 who was believed to be in town in connection with his efforts to get his relatives out of Cuba. He was told not to go to the Del Prado Monday night unless Armas insisted that he do so. He should make every effort to avoid any encounter with A-3 -- staying away from his home as much as possible.

3. L-9 has some lingering suspicions about A-3 -- said that back in Cuba A-3 used to drive a Mercedes Benz 190-SL sports car, bright red, which he sold to an officer in the Mexican Embassy -- L-9 found this strange since the Mexican, who had diplomatic status, could bring a new car into Cuba duty-free at much less than the going price for a used one on the local market. L-9 concluded from this that there might be some sort of hanky-panky between A-3 and the Mexican official.

4. L-9 reported further as follows:

a. He has seen a bit of Foracio FLORES Sanchez of the Bellas Artes Institute lately and has come to the conclusion that FLORES is 100% in favor of the Castro regime. He arranged a meeting between Amb. Hernandez Armas and Flores at the Hotel Maria Isabel on Thursday 14 Nov (we picked this up on LIENWAY). This had to do with an exhibit of Mexican art in Cuba -- scheduled for January 1964. L-9 had earlier made some arrangements to send Mexican paintings by air to Cuba (also picked up on LIENWAY).

b. On 14 Nov Mexican doctor ~~(name)~~ MARTINEZ ~~(name)~~ in Cuba, now in Mexi, reported that ~~(name)~~ had been helping the Cuban government and had, in the guise of hurricane relief, sold to Cuba 200,000 pesos worth of merchandise for only 30,000 pesos.

c. At the airport on 11 November L-9 saw the Cubana stewardess Marta ~~(name)~~ speaking with a "known gusano" (L-9 doesn't know him by name). This "gusano" is often at the airport, ~~(name)~~ has curly hair. (Couldn't be our man).

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d. A Mexican medical student who has been trying to get to Cuba for at least three months came back to the Embassy a few days ago to see about the status of his visa application. His name is Alejo Roa.

e. Teresa ROSA is suspicious of the American who has been ~~con-~~ ^{contacting} her about chances of going to Cuba. She said that he asked her how Fidel could be as foolish as to proclaim himself openly as a Marxist-Leninist and to state that President Kennedy is ~~illiterate~~. Teresa thinks this man is some sort of provocateur. (He is the same one mentioned in the last L-9 CR)

f. Dra. MACHADO has told Teresa not to have anything to do with Silvano REYES Fuentes without checking beforehand with her.

g. ^{Jose} PERNAUZEZ Roa (known as ROA) was working until the wee small hours of the morning on the night of 14-15 Nov. (Code work?)

h. PEREIRA's name is Raul,

i. Raul PEREIRA says he is going to get married in May in Cuba to a girl who works in MINREX. When asked if this would be by proxy, he said he would go to Cuba for the marriage but that his wife would not subsequently come to Mexico. (This is an interesting tidbit -- it will be recalled that PEREIRA has been coming up on LIENVOY as a possible homosexual.)

j. AZCUE will be leaving for Cuba on 18 Nov. L-9 believes there is no force in the world that can deter AZCUE from his determination to return. A's wife is desperate, hates the thought of going to Cuba but does want to see her children who are there. L-9 overheard A say in the office: "I've already started to fight, within a year I'll be a prisoner in the Cabaña Fortress." Said this on 15 Nov.

k. Rosario CASTELLANOS, female, Mexican writer, was at the recent Embassy party given ~~in honor of~~ in the honor of Alejo CARPENTER. She works at the UNAM where she has a responsible position. She said that she had asked the permission of the Rector CHAVEZ to go to Cuba. CHAVEZ turned her down at which point she said, "I quit." CHAVEZ then smoothed her ruffled feathers by explaining that if she were to quit she would be acting in an unpatriotic manner in a difficult situation since now that DIAZ Ordaz is lined up for the Presidency all future appointments will be of people from the political right and she would only create a vacancy for a rightist.

l. A Cuban in town looking for a visa to return home to Cuba entered the US six times illegally. His name is Jaime BUSO Molina.

m. Ambassador Hernandez Armas says that Foreign Office was "very helpful" to the Cuban Embassy in recent negotiations about the release of Cuban boats at Cozumel.

n. On Wednesday 13 Nov at 1000 hours L-9 overheard Nico MORA telling a man at the door of the Embassy that "there have been a lot of problems with the couriers lately, efforts have been made to steal the pouches."

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- o. At 1115 hours on Wednesday 6 Nov. [redacted] had an interview in his office with Manuel MARQUE [redacted]. He turned his radio on and kept the volume very high while the interview was in progress.
- p. A French woman named [redacted] staying at the Hotel Presidente room 705, attended the recent Embassy party in honor of CARPENTIER party.
- q. A Cuban (name?) who went to the US about a month ago in a small boat and who has in his possession an EMS Parole Form returned to Cuba from Mexico on 16 November. He had [redacted] it from the Embassy party.
- r. Many people at the CARPENTIER party were surprised to see LEONOLDO [redacted] there -- he had never been there before.
- s. Dolores de la Mora was shooting off at the mouth at the same party. She called the Argentine journalist PUIGROS over to her and said, "Isn't it true that MARQUE blasted DIAZ Ordaz purposely -- to insure that he would get the PRI nomination. PUIGROS agreed. (This refers to the issue of Politica which had a photo of DIAZ Ordaz on the cover along with the words -- He will not be president). Dolores said that DIAZ Ordaz is a good friend of her father and that her brother will probably become a diputado in the new legislature. She said that DIAZ' line would be the same as LOPEZ Mateos' -- no problem.
- t. Lately the Ambassador has been turning on loud music in his office. (To cover conversations - ?)
- u. L-9 went to the Soviet Embassy party celebrating the October Revolution - 7 Nov.
- v. L-9 took the pouch to the airport Friday (8 Nov-?). He was accompanied by Rogelio. He turned the pouch over to the "sobrecargo" (steward) on the Cubana plane. Had picked it up just inside the door of the Embassy. (Test mission-?)
- w. The planned exhibition of Cuban engravings at San Luis Potosi did not come off for reasons not fully clear -- some administrative SNAFU. L-9 is now planning to set up an exhibit at Guadalajara.

5. B informed L-9 that he would be on vacation from about 2 December until Christmastime -- said that he could put L-9 in touch with another officer during this period or could put the operation on ice with an emergency mail channel left open. L-9 said that he much preferred to put it on ice, does not want to be exposed to any more people. For the first time he showed some concern about finances -- said that he might go to Cuba for Christmas and would like to have some money available to do some shopping before [redacted] also needs to pay the next six-months advance rent for his apartment in December. He explained that when he goes to Cuba he hopes to take many gifts -- has all along been sending packages to his sister-in-law and feels that this is good insurance in several ways, especially since it suits her to have a source of supply in Mexico -- hence L-9 would probably be left alone and allowed to remain in Mexico. For his rent he will need six times 650 pesos or 3,900 pesos. It is planned to pay him his November and December salary plus a year-end bonus [redacted] pay (as per local custom) at the next meeting -- [redacted] which should enable him to pay his rent, do his shopping, [redacted] he will go to Cuba for Christmas. If he does he will spend about 3 weeks there.

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6. L-9 made it clear that if he does go to Cuba he (as last year) does not want to take any SW material or have any contact with KUBARK people inside. He will, of course, keep his eyes and ears open and make as many interesting contacts as possible. It is felt that we should be foolish to insist that he undertake any "mission" inside in view of his outright refusal last time to take any SW materials. A good briefing and debriefing should do the job. It would do him no harm to renew acquaintances inside Cuba and a true vacation would probably do him a lot of good.

7. Next meeting: Open.

Add: No heart-to-heart motivation-boosting session was required at this encounter -- other than being a bit shaken by the AMLEO-3 phone call, L-9 was in a good mood and not noticeably nervous. B's wife remarked on 18 Nov that "Aguilar" was quite nervous when he got into the car at the pick-up point.

SUBJECT : Addendum to GR covering meeting with LITANIL-9, 16 Nov 1963

LITANIL-9 reported the following additional information:

Ralph B. Stein, an American citizen holding passport B 661033, residing at 1510 E. 52nd Street, Chicago, Illinois, left Chicago Tuesday 12 November and came to Mexico via Canada where he obtained a Cuban visa at the Cuban Consulate in Toronto. He arrived in Mexico on the night of 15 November and stayed at the Hotel Agnes. He visited the Cuban Embassy on the morning of 16 November and was due to fly to Cuba the same day. The Cuban Embassy paid \$ 23.80 excess baggage charges for him (US Cy).

Stein is an engineering draughtsman and speaks Italian. He left a postcard with L-9 to be mailed to:

SUBJECT : Meetings with LITMIL-9, 23 and 27 November 1963

1. On the night of 23 November L-9 contacted Barker by phone and a meeting was held from 2130 to 2230 hours. L-9's reason for making the contact was to express his condolences for the recent assassination of President Kennedy. It was clear that L-9 was badly shaken up by this happening -- when he spoke of Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy his eyes clouded up with tears.
2. L-9 was asked if he had ever seen Oswald -- no. Had he ever heard that Oswald visited the Cuban Embassy in Mexico -- no. Did he know anyone in the Cuban Embassy that knew Oswald or knew anything about him -- no. *At this time Silvia Duran was in the hands of the Mexican police but L-9 was obviously unaware of her detention.* Asked what the reaction of those inside the Embassy was to the news of the President's death, L-9 said that he had heard very little talk about it, that the Saturday morning staff meeting was a short, perfunctory affair, but that just about everyone seemed to be truly shocked. He had heard no one expressing pleasure about the killing. He said that this reinforced his belief that once Fidel Castro falls, the Cuban people, even many of those who are now classified as *patricia o fuerte* types, will quickly show themselves to be essentially good people and essentially US-oriented.
3. L-9 was asked to report on the aftermath of his conversation with Ambassador Armas about the phone call L-9 had received from AMEX-3 and which, in the interests of security, it was decided, with HCS and JMWAVE assent, that L-9 should report to Armas. L-9 said that this went very smoothly -- that Armas apparently did not recognize AMEX-3 when he was mentioned -- L-9 merely stated that he had received a call from Captain (Surname), that the Captain wanted L-9 to come to see him at the Del Prado, that L-9 felt that this was somewhat suspicious and told the Captain that if he wanted to see L-9 he should come to L-9's home. Armas told L-9 that he had done the right thing -- that he should not go out making mysterious meetings with people in hotels. L-9 did not press the point but he believed that Armas thought that the captain mentioned was a Cubana airline pilot. Anyway, his skirts are clean should the question ever come up of his having been contacted by A-3 -- he reported the contact to his Ambassador. L-9 remarked afterwards that he really hated to brush off A-3 as the two families were very close in Cuba.
4. Another meeting was held from 2100 to 2200 on 27 November. By this time the arrest of Silvia Duran was public knowledge and L-9 made it his first topic for discussion. He said that Silvia was back in the Embassy on Monday the 25th and said that she had been held for 6 hours by the Federal Police. She seemed to be quite pleased with her performance -- said she kept reminding the police that Mexico is a free country and that the constitution guaranteed her freedom from such persecution. To this the police just laughed and said that the constitution wouldn't do her much good in jail, she had better cooperate if she wanted to get out. She freely admitted that she had seen Oswald in the Consulate, that he came to see her for a visa but that Cuba had answered the request (this seems like fact) to the effect that Oswald could not be issued a transit visa en route to the USSR unless and

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until he received a USSR visa. She said that the cops had threatened her with extradition to the US (seems unlikely) whereupon she said she would be glad to go to the US to face Oswald. She said that complaints would be made to President LOPEZ Mateos through Enrique PEREZ. (L-9 does not know who PEREZ is or what his access to IN is) Silvia said that she was quite surprised that word of her arrest was relayed to RAUL MARICIO Nogales so fast by (SANTANA) who flashed the word by 2300 hours 23 Nov. At this point Teresa PEREZ, one of the crowd listening to Silvia tell her tale, ordered her nephew to leave -- said, "we don't want you around here." All in all, Silvia thought she did a good job of standing up to the police. L-9 repeated, as he has done before, that she is a very intelligent, quick-witted girl. She did not appear to have been roughed up in any way or to have suffered from her "ordeal."

5. L-9 had nothing more to offer on the Kennedy assassination -- was again shown a photo of Oswald -- never saw the man. He said that there is not much talk around the Embassy about the killing -- perhaps because no one is expected to approve of such a thing yet at the same time no one wants to make too much fuss about it for fear of being suspected as pro-American.

6. L-9 reported on other matters as follows:

- a. The Counselor of the Soviet Embassy (no name given) came to the Cuban Embassy at about 1045 Monday 25 November. He spoke with Era. Margot MICHADO. The Ambassador was not present at the time.
- b. Inc. Jorge TIRADO was in the Embassy on Monday 25 November. He remarked that he had been to see DIAZ Ordaz some time ago about getting a permit to send his son to Cuba to see the heart specialist Dr. Enrique CARRERA. (T's son suffers from some heart ailment). DIAZ Ordaz questioned T closely about the projected trip (this was while DO was Minister of Government) and T took advantage of the occasion to complain to DO that people from the procuraduria had confiscated some medical slides from a Cuban heart specialist at the airport. (L-9 was the person who eventually recovered these slides). According to T, DO was somewhat upset, said that the procuraduria people had no business doing this, and saw to it that the slides were returned. T said that DO mentioned L-9 by name, telling T that he would see to it that an order was issued for the slides to be turned over to L-9. T passed word around the Cuban Embassy that everyone should be very careful to speak only the best of DO who might prove to be a useful friend.
- c. A meeting of Consular officers from all Cuban Consulates was held on Tuesday. L-9 does not know what went on at this meeting.

7. L-9 was paid 12,000 pesos -- 4,000 each for the months of Nov and Dec plus 4,000 year-end bonus. He was told that the C/O would be out of town during most of December and he reiterated his desire to have the operation put on ice during the interim -- he is not anxious to be "exposed" to any more people. Arrangements were made for an emergency commo channel to him in case it might become necessary for us to contact him during the C/O's absence. Details on next page.

8. L-9 asked B to buy him some oil paints in the US -- said that the Mexican product is inferior. Will do. L-9 is doing a lot more painting these days. He is now putting the finishing touches on an oil painting

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of Casilo CIENFUEGOS which he plans to give to the Embassy, possibly to be raffled off, proceeds to go to hurricane victims.

9. He was asked for additional detail on Luisa Calderon -- had little to offer except to report that Luisa had recently moved. He believed that she had been living with the MACENO's and Peregrina ALONSO but found that this was a bit confining and had moved "about ten days or two weeks ago" to live with a Mexican family. L-9 believes that her mother returned to Cuba some time ago. Her, Luisa's, new phone is 30 - 52 - 65. She "talks like a Communist," and speaks English -- L-9 thinks she has been in Miami, Florida -- does not know when. He says she is "muy rona" -- very pretty. She is about 24 years old.

10. The conno arrangements set up with L-9 were as follows:

Signal: Someone will phone L-9's apartment at 0800 hours and will use the word "alfombra" -- rug -- perhaps saying, we will be buy to pick up the rug you want cleaned -- something in this order that uses the word ALFOMBRA. L-9 will reply, "You must have the wrong number."

Meeting: The night of that same day and on subsequent days until contact is effected L-9 will go to a public phone booth at the corner of Reforma and Avenida Monte Altai (Lomas) at 2000 hours -- 8:00 p.m. He will be approached by an American who will have in his possession and clearly visible a copy of TIME magazine and a pack of PILTON cigarettes. No verbal signals were laid on. L-9 can be readily identified from photos on file.

Note: There is a bookstore -- the one with the huge red lighted sign LIBRERIA about a half a block up Reforma (up hill) from this phone booth -- L-9 as a confirmed bookworm can lounge around here, browsing until 2000 hours. L-9 is punctual -- always on time.

Person making call to L-9's apartment should speak excellent Spanish and should keep the conversation short. DO NOT ASK FOR L-9 by name -- he is going to say it is a wrong number. He lives alone and is always home at 0800 hours.

The contact point (phone booth) is on the right side going up Reforma -- beyond Petrolcos monument -- a short distance beyond the Malpas restaurant.

11. L-9 turned over some Havana newspapers which will be forwarded to JMWAVE.

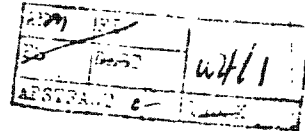
ACTION REQUIRED - REFERENCES

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITANIL-9, 15 October 1963

1. L-9 was picked up in Felanco at 2000 hours and driven to B's home where a meeting was held until 0020 hours (16 Oct) at which time L-9 was dropped off in Colonia Cuauhtemoc. He identified 90 photos from among several hundred taken from the LIERODE Base House; he was unable to identify any from the LEMBRACE coverage of the AMKNOB-reported Safe House at 157 Pachuca.

2. L-9 reported on the following:

a. On 8 October L-9 and Raul APARICIO Nogales had a few drinks and dinner with Raul MACIAS Franco, Cuban delegate to the Assembly of the International Union of Architects held in Mexico City the previous week.

MACIAS said that the Greek delegate to the recent Architect's Congress in Havana had been identified as a KLBARK agent. He did not give this man's name.

The Mexican ~~Ramon~~ ^X CORONA gave the Castro-Cubans a lot of trouble in Havana and it was hoped that some way might be found to take the Vice Presidency away from him, because of the proposals he made -- which were disruptive, but the Cubans and their allies decided it would be best not to risk a fight with CORONA.

The Englishman who presides as president of the UIA (International Union of Architects) was, on the other hand, very docile and easy to get along with -- the Cubans liked him. When he came back from Cuba the Mexican authorities at Merida "gave him the works," dumped the contents of his luggage out unceremoniously and searched it carefully, confiscating from him a number of packages which only contained materials relating to the congress. The Cuban delegates, such as MACIAS, himself, got the same treatment and lost a number of things they were bringing to Mexico.

During the Havana congress, a number of lapel identification buttons (allowing holders to enter the sessions) disappeared and it was hastily assured that an American present, an editor of the Magazine Architectural Record had, in conspiracy with an English newspaperman, stolen them. These two persons were, accordingly, held under arrest at the Riviera Hotel one morning from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. MACIAS had to intervene to secure their release. The American appeared "hurt" by the accusation and arrest and kept asking for someone to send him a drink. (L-9 said: If he was a KLBARK agent, he did a good job while under arrest, judging from MACIAS' account)

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- b. Dr. Filiberto RAMIREZ Corria, a physician who was here for some sort of medical conference (having returned to Havana on 14 October) said that rumors were rife in Havana that counter-revolutionary forces planned to bomb Havana from the air during one of the sessions of the architectural congress. Anti Aircraft units were ready and care was taken not to announce when and where Fidel CASTRO would address the group lest he be the target for bombing.

(Note: RAMIREZ Corria was here with another physician for several days -- L-9 saw quite a bit of RAMIREZ and had him take some medicine to L-9's father on his return. He assesses RAMIREZ as a "very valuable element, one you would do well to try to win over to our cause." L-9 did not know the name of the other medico but identified his picture in the LIERODE take.

- c. A short time ago, Vice Consul Ovilio SAMA of the Consulate in Veracruz told L-9 that he would like to close down the Mexican-Cuban Cultural Institute in that town -- it is not working out well, people are not attending meetings. SAMA feels that the 800 plus pesos per month that this operation costs can be spent in better ways.

- d. RUIZ of the Commercial Office told L-9 that someone had given him 30 dollars in Cuba to buy a pistol here in Mexico and that he had managed to find one for 300 pesos. (LIENVOY recently revealed that RUIZ was buying a Spanish Llana pistol).

- e. Cubana Captain SAMIDEY saw L-9, VEGA, and ROJAS of Cubana at the airport on 14 October -- L-9 and VEGA had gone out together to see RAMIREZ Corria off -- and SAMIDEY pointed to the IL-18 on the field, saying that for several reasons they had not yet been able to get permission to use this plane (which brought the Soviet cosmonauts to Mexico) to carry medicines and other relief supplies as cargo on its return to Cuba. ROJAS later showed up about 6 p.m. at the Soviet Embassy (where a reception was in progress) to speak to Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armas about this same matter -- L-9 witnessed the encounter. (LIENVOY covers this subject).

- f. At the Soviet reception mentioned above, which was for the purpose of introducing Soviet delegates to the International Aeronautical Conference then in session, L-9 spoke with (fnu) CICERO of the Foreign Office -- L-9 says that CICERO is pro-Soviet, anti-American. He overheard a young Mexican official of the Mexican Aero Club asking CICERO if it was true that the Israeli delegate to the Aeronautical Conference was going to be expelled from Mexico -- didn't hear the answer to this. The expulsion was reportedly in connection with a "problema migratorio."

- g. The two-door blue Buick sedan used by the Commercial Office is going to be sold -- according to Vega.

- h. When L-9 was seeing RAMIREZ Corria off a character she knows only as "Biru" showed up. This man lives with MIELE and has been

in Mexico several months. He is a Cuban and was closely connected with "Che" GUEVIRA in some official capacity. He does not plan to return to Cuba but is still in touch with "Che" -- received a letter from him 2 weeks ago. As RAMIREZ and his doctor companion prepared to leave, "Biru" said, "My brother is chief of all those medicos in Cuba." "Biru" is a light mulatto about 35 years old. Coto SOLORZANO is now trying to get him a job in Mexico City. He usually eats lunch with AZCUE. At the airport he said he couldn't understand why AZCUE was willing to be recalled to Cuba -- said that he doesn't know how AZCUE will manage to survive what with ration cards and other such inconveniences.

PRIORITY TASK: IDENTIFY THIS MAN "BIRU"

1. ~~Mooner KHAN~~^X, a senator from British Guiana, left for Havana on 14 October -- he is very friendly with L-9, spoke with him before making an earlier trip to the Island which had to do with procurement of petroleum products from Cuba. He told L-9 that the Mexican Consul at Trinidad had given him a 6-months multiple entry visa but that this was taken away from him at the Mexico City airport. He wondered whether AZCUE might help him get it back. AZCUE told him to relax, that he could get another from the Mexican officials in Havana.

KHAN left a postcard with L-9 to mail to his wife. L-9 showed it to Barker. Copy:

Hello Moon & Kids

Mexico even though
beautiful but for me
its very cold. I am
now leaving for Havana.
Care yourself & kids.

- j. L-9 says that ^{John}LLAGOSTERA and ^{Quoted}"LICH" are involved in a big love affair -- LLAGOSTERA is really love-struck and it is quite obvious to everyone in the Embassy that the two are involved -- they chat on the inter-phone quite often. (LIENVOY alerted us to this love affair recently) According to L-9 LLAGOSTERA is vulnerable because he has a wife and child in Cuba.

- k. Other insignificant items were reported on but not worthy of inclusion here.

3. A long conversation was held about clandestine operations in general, motivation, security, communications, etc. As has been discovered in the past, L-9 periodically requires an opportunity to explain why he is working for us and this must be followed up by renewed assurances on our part that we greatly appreciate his work and the high principles which motivate him. In this instance, comfortably ensconced in B's home with a glass of scotch in his hand,

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L-9 was in a talkative mood and no effort was made to shorten the session. After he had performed his catharsis he seemed to feel much better about things in general although on the way home he remarked that he hoped the Cuban problem could be solved within a couple of years so he could get out of this work. It is clear that he feels strong pressure and, not being a daring individual, he is looking forward to the day when he can stop living a double life. Nothing new came of this conversation which ranged far and wide -- from antique automobiles to classical music -- except that it apparently did L-9 some good and gave the C/O a chance to insert a host of tradecraft pointers designed to sharpen up the agent's security and convince him that (1) his security and well-being is our primary concern, and (2) if we practice good security in the operation he need have no fears of being compromised. (NB: A tour as an instructor at ISOLATION is the best basic training imaginable for this sort of situation -- really pays off).

4. A start was made on sketching the physical plant of the Embassy but L-9 was quite tired at this point and this work was left for the next meeting. L-9 looked over our file material on the Embassy building and explained that so many changes had been made in the last year that most of what we now have is completely out of date. The next meeting will take up the Embassy premises as the first order of business.

5. Next meeting: Open.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 26 October 1963

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 2000 to 2135 hours in B's car (parked in Tacuba) on 26 October.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. A few days earlier Coty^XSOLORZANO, sister-in-law of General Lazaro CARMENAS, told L-9 with a groan of disgust that it looks like DIAZ Ordaz has been chosen as the PRI presidential candidate.
- b. The Ambassador is still using the wall safe built into the chimney of his office (we have photos of this in our files). L-9 thinks that the Embassy payroll is kept there as the other day when he walked into the Ambassador's office he saw the Ambassador shut the safe door -- Dra. MACHADO was there, having just returned from the bank where she withdrew the payroll. Dra.^XMACHADO handles the payroll for the whole Embassy. MARGOT PADRON
- c. ^{EUSEBIO} XAZCUE^{LOPEZ} is leaving PCS for Havana on 4 November.
- d. ^{MADULL} XVEGA^{LOPEZ} is leaving quite soon. No replacement for him has arrived.
- e. ^{ALFREDO} XMIRABAL^{DIAZ} is looking more and more like a "security type." He is a key man ("lleva la batuta al") and appears to be a convinced Communist. In the old days, before CASTRO, MIRABAL worked for the Sherwin Williams paint factory (L-9 thinks S-W in the States must have a record on him) which was located a short distance from the plant owned by L-9's father.
- f. Dra.^XMACHADO recently told L-9 that ^{MADULL} XVEGA was discourteous to her when she first arrived here but that he has softened up a bit recently and now seems to "accept" her. She thinks this may be because she lost two sons in the Revolution (no details given). She complained that LLAGOSTERA still doesn't accept her but JORRIN seems to be coming around. (This may be the usual resentment caused by a female in a responsible executive position).
- g. Embassy staff meetings are held every Saturday morning from 0900 on -- usually lasting about two hours. They used to be held in the "theater" out back under the new construction but are now being held in the glassed-in terrace at the rear of the main building.
- h. Three Marxist study groups are being set up in the Embassy to include everyone on the staff. ^{JOSÉ MIGUEL} XVERNADEZ Roa, known as ROA to the staffers, is ramrodding this effort. These groups should be organized within a week. (L-9 dreads the thought of submitting to this indoctrination but realizes he must go along with it).

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- i. L-9 recently suggested that Embassy staff meetings be held at night so that afterwards everyone could get together for dinner. RUIZ of the commercial office took exception to this -- said that the result would be just like the Rotary Club. Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armas supported L-9's proposal but did not press for approval and the decision was made to continue holding the meetings on Saturday mornings. Later on the Amb. told L-9, "well, I supported you, anyway."
- j. ^{Joaquin HERNANDEZ Armas} The Ambassador said at a recent staff meeting that he was taken to task by a Mexican senator who asked him why Cuba refused to sign the atom test ban pact. ARMAS (he, like ROA, is known by his matronymic) tried to explain that Cuba could never sign the agreement as long as she is the subject of American aggression. ARMAS said that Embassy staff people should be prepared to answer such questions and mentioned that a request was being sent to Havana to allow the expenditure of sufficient funds to print up 10,000 copies of Fidel CASTRO's speech of 28 September to be distributed locally -- this speech apparently conveys the present "line" on the test ban issue.
- k. Foreign Minister ROA recently mentioned in a note to ARMAS that he is glad to hear that L-9 is painting again. L-9 was, in turn, pleased to hear that the Foreign Minister takes a personal interest in him. L-9 has recently done four paintings -- all female figure studies. (1) B asked him if he might not do something revolutionary from time to time -- such as a militia girl standing guard with a sub-machinegun. L-9 says he has thought of this but doesn't feel inspired.
- l. ^{Victor} TRAFOTE recently visited the Embassy and said that his daughter Irina, the ex-wife of Ramiro VALDEZ, will be coming to Mexico soon on a "special mission." He also said that his nephew, a Chilean, (no name mentioned) recently arrived here proceeding from the USA.
- m. L-9 got a nice thank-you letter from Mercedes LECHUGA -- sister of former Ambassador LECHUGA -- thanking L-9 for having sent her a bottle of perfume. L-9 was pleased to get this evidence of confidence since, as he says, if LECHUGA were the least bit suspicious of him Mercedes would not correspond with L-9.
have
- n. L-9 believes he heard the man with the thin mustache referred to as FEREYRA. This is the man who showed up at about the same time the unidentified "light skinned mulatto" (and possible code clerk) disappeared from the scene. L-9 identified his photo at the last meeting. (A Paul FEREYRA has been showing up increasingly on LIENVOY traffic -- we had considered this to be Raulito the messenger boy.) L-9 will try to find out more about FEREYRA and will look into the last name of Raulito.
- o. "Birru" -- see last CR -- L-9 had no more on this man except to report that he thinks Birru has found a job and that Coty SOLORZANO helped him to get it. L-9 says that Birru was sent to Mexico by "Che" GIEVARA.

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- p. Regarding Sara ^{HERNANDEZ} Cata, now in Caracas, L-9 recently learned that sometime in the past when Sara was on a Cubana plane at Mexico City, preparing to depart for Havana, she made a few anti-Revolutionary remarks. These were reported to Orfila, who reported them to Teresa PROENZA, who reported to Ramon SINGRAS (at the time Charge at the Embassy), who fired off a cable to MINTEX Havana. When Sara got to Havana she was accused of "intrigue." Teresa PROENZA recently told L-9 about this. (REPORT TO CARACAS STATION).
- q. A Cuban functionary on his way to Uruguay from Havana had some trouble with Mexican officials at the Central Airport -- a Cdte. VENTURA took some papers away from him when he arrived 24 October and as a result the Cuban was forced to cancel his onward reservations on Varig for the night of 25 October -- said he could not complete his mission without his papers. (Reported this to CASOT 28 Oct in case LIFIRES might be able to get hold of the papers in question).
- r. L-9 says that ^{MACHADO} Dra. MACHADO, her daughter ^{PERIN MACHADO} Enria, and Percegrina ALONSO all live together near the Embassy. (This may be in 157 Pachuca where the ANSNOB-1 safe site was located) L-9 will ask Dra. MACHADO to have dinner with him at his apartment -- making sure she is there well after nightfall so that he will be obliged to see her safely home and, in the process, find out where she lives.

3. As usual L-9 needed a bit of bolstering. He said that he feels intense pressure at staff gatherings when everyone looks at everyone else present and wonders "who is the Judas in this group." L-9 stated that he would much rather do some other kind of work and would rather sell tomatoes on the street than do what he is doing now. The thing that really keeps him going, aside from his expressed regard for KUBARK and his oft-repeated affinity for the Anglo-Saxon, is his sincere disgust with the CASTRO regime. He again told the story (B has heard it a half-dozen times and Shryock probably heard it often before that) of his father's having built up a big business by unstinting hard work -- of having brought his family up from nothing to a position of honest respectability -- only to be classified as a "bandido" and "explotador" by a bunch of revolutionary bums with beards. It is the case officer's belief that if L-9 did not have a release through painting he would break off from the Embassy and, naturally, from KUBARK. It is furthermore believed that if we were to ask L-9 to submit to an ECFLUTER examination as Headquarters has recently suggested, L-9 would immediately break contact with us as no matter how diplomatically the build-up might be phrased he would take it as a slur on his honor and we would be without a penetration into the Embassy.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 4 Nov 1963

1. A meeting was held with L-9 in B's car from 2200 hours to 2345 hours, 4 Nov. The car was parked in the Tlaxpana area.
2. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. Manuel VEGA left on PCS orders for Havana on the 3 Nov Cubana flight. Cotv SOLORZANO bid him goodbye at the airport along with members of the Embassy staff. It is not clear who is or will be replacing VEGA.
 - b. ^{Foot} FERNANDEZ ROA worked very late the night of Friday 1 Nov. L-9 still thinks he may be doing comso work.
 - c. ^(Approved) "Nico" GARCIA is going to move into the row of offices where L-9 is now located and is being "caged in" -- is installing door, blinds, etc., as did ROA recently.
 - d. ^{Ex Bio} AZCUE will be around for a short while before returning to Cuba -- he is planning to take a trip to Campeche with someone named LIZALDE to study building materials in preparation for AZCUE's assignment to JUCEPLAN as an architect when he returns. L-9 went on at some length about AZCUE -- said he was certain that AZCUE is not a Communist, not a CP member (note that AMKNOB-1 has AZCUE admitting he has been a Communist for many years - ?) L-9 repeated that AZCUE is an implacable foe of "the Pentagon, and the ruling circles in the US" but has a high regard for the American people. AZCUE's wife is still very upset at the prospect of going to live in Cuba. L-9 thinks AZCUE is a loyal Fidelista who would never knowingly cooperate with the Americans. At lunch with L-9 on 4 Nov AZCUE lashed out against the Cuban CP -- said that Lazaro PENA should be shot -- he has served his usefulness -- after the shooting a monument could be raised to him, but Cuba would be much better off with him out of the way.
 - e. ^{Approved} MIRAMEN, AZCUE's replacement, is not popular and nowhere near as effective as AZCUE. Sylvia MIRAMEN doesn't like him but will probably go on working as his secretary for the time being.
 - f. L-9 saw AZCUE kidding with Sylvia recently in the office -- chiding her for being a Communist. Sylvia replied, "It's not true. I am not a Stalinist and I have never been interested in Party membership. I don't accept the Party line and by talking this way you are insulting me!" L-9 thinks Sylvia is a very intelligent girl. He thinks we might be able to gain her cooperation by getting a desirable male next to her -- she is, according to L-9, "a little putita."
 - g. AZCUE told L-9: "If they don't give me a good job in Cuba, I'm not

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going to be upset -- I can always get a job here in Mexico."

h. L-9 exhibited a book by Alcijo CARPENTIER (who is in town). This book, entitled Los Pasos Perdidos, published in Mexico, had inside the cover two handwritten dedications to L-9 -- signed by CARPENTIER. The first was written when the two first met -- the second was written after L-9 had CARPENTIER over to his studio and C got a look at his paintings -- this dedication lauds L-9's ability as an artist.

i. L-9 showed B his address book -- in it he has a bookmark which consists of two ribbons - red and black -- with a small photo of Fidel CASTRO attached. L-9 likes to "casually" display this little item when consulting his book in the presence of Embassy officials. He says it has a nice effect on them.

j. L-9 overheard Teresa FROENZA on the phone (we have the same conversation on LIENVOY) saying that Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armas' wife is coming to Mexico on Friday 8 Nov and that she would not be staying at the Embassy, but would put up somewhere outside, probably with Dra. MACHADO. Teresa indicated that all is not well with the ARMAS family and that this was a somewhat scandalous situation. (We might be able to make some capital with Mrs. Hdz. Armas by tipping her off about the Amb's dalliances)

k. A tall, blond American student has been in to see about traveling to Cuba. He is studying at a University in Mexico City. (This sounds like the one who came in to see Joe Montllor recently). He is suspected of being an American agent -- "Licha" says that he is an agent for sure. He was there on Thursday, 31 Oct.

l. ^{Haleco} ROA told L-9 that he soon intends to marry a Mexican.

m. ^{Jose} FERNANDEZ is not happy about being a mere Press Attache. L-9 thinks this is a cover position and that ROA is probably CIS.

n. Teresa FROENZA spent the weekend at CARDENAS' place in Michoacan. She came back highly incensed that Gustavo DIAZ Ordaz had been uncovered as the Presidential candidate of the PRI. She said that LOPEZ Mateos made the choice himself. L-9 thinks this intelligence came directly from Lazaro CARDENAS. Teresa and the Ambassador were closeted for most of Sunday 2 Nov -- presumably T was filling him in on the political picture as a result of her visit with CARDENAS.

o. Someone named (fnu) IBARGUENOITIA, Reforma 7, Coyoacan, D.F. has recently received correspondence from the Casa de las Americas in Havana.

p. A Chilean artist (painter) named Hugo MARIN has been hanging around for a visa and the authorization finally came from Hava. This man formerly lived in Cuba, is wealthy. He is considered as a probable agent of the imperialists but the embassy feels he can be watched closely once he is in Cuba.

3. L-9 was in a pretty good mood, said that his sessions with the C/O give him "animo" and are a good antidote for the feelings he has in between meetings when he is sitting in his office, or beside the Ambassador, and wonder-

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ing how long he can go on without being discovered and what the others in the shop think of him. This was a good opportunity to inquire into the latter point, and B asked him to explain just what his posture is vis a vis his associates and outsiders who know him only as a CASTRO official. He talked for about 30 minutes on this point, explaining that he tries to project the image of a man who is "more artist than politician," who is not a revolutionary type but who believes that "there is a job to be done here, I have been chosen to do it, and I intend to do it -- wanna make anything of it?" He says this works very well -- he emerges as a dedicated, more-or-less apolitical worker, who is not going to take any foolishness from anyone who gets in his way, and who, like many artists, may be just a bit wacky. He cleverly manages to lose his temper from time to time with good effect since no-one wants to ruffle him too much lest his well-known "pull" with Fidel might be employed.

4. He was paid 4,000 pesos for October 1963. *

5. L-9 is planning to do a painting of Camilo CIEINFUEGOS which will be raffled off so that the proceeds can be sent to Cuba to aid victims of the hurricane.

6. He furnished B with a copy of the 3 Nov issue of HOY which carried the AMGLOSSY confessions. This was airmailed to the PIEPER address at WAVE on 5 Nov.

7. Next meeting - Open.

8. Problem: It will be more difficult to get L-9 into B's home in the future owing to the recent installation of mercury vapor lamps in Lucas which light the area up almost to a daylight degree. In view of the necessity to sit down with L-9 from time to time to pour over papers and photographs -- as well as the desirability to have him relax with a drink in hand -- a safehouse would seem to be more-than-ever in order, but L-9 is extremely nervous about the prospect of meetings in a safehouse. It is believed that a carefully-timed arrangement, whereby B's wife could swing open the gates of the B home may do the trick and enable us to continue to use the B residence for meetings from time to time.

SUBJECT : Meeting with UJTANL-9, 23 September 1963

1. A meeting with L-9 was held at the agent's initiative from 2030 hours until 2500 on 23 September. The pick-up was made on Chiers and L-9 was dropped off several blocks from his home after the meeting. The meeting took place in the C/S's car, parked on a dark street in Polanco.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

Architectural Congress in Havana: Practically all of the students from Laredo have already gone in by air. Of the 60-odd professional architects who were expected to go as delegates it appears that only 5 would be attending -- the others had been scared off by adverse publicity and the thought that they might appear on some sort of American blacklist if they were to go -- and by fears that they might have trouble getting back from Cuba once there. By some queer quirk of fate, Architecto Juanmario UTE, the man who did most to set up the congress from the Mexican standpoint, did not receive an invitation. Embajador Manuel M. Quintana, Cultural Counsellor, sparking for the operation in the Cuban Embassy, was surprised and shocked that UTE was not invited.

An American named PLANN (Dun), editor of or adviser for the publication Architectural Record has been at the embassy trying to get a visa for Havana.

ARMANDO was in contact with a person staying at room 216 of the Hotel Cardinal regarding the congress, telephone 14-32-32. He asked L-9 to call the hotel at that number, ask for room 216, and tell the man who answered that ARMANDO wished to talk to him. L-9 was not given the man's name and he told not to ask who was staying at the room -- just get the name on the line.

ARMANDO, who says he is ARMANDO in the Foreign Office told L-9 and ARMANDO that the Cuban would be able to give all available assistance to the Embassy in Havana, including approval of visas to the congress. The of Embassy files in Havana on these flights was authorized (the request for ARMANDO directly be authorized was ignored by ARMANDO) and the type of any notices having commercial relations with Mexico via Cuba, L-9 said that Mexican Consuls abroad had each advised to facilitate travel of individuals by issuing 30-day Mexican transit visas. ARMANDO was much more pleasant than ROSEMBERG had been at the previous encounter (see last contact report).

3. Russian-Chinese Split: During the recent Philosopher's Congress a function was held at the Russian cultural institute at which the Soviet philosophers were the guests of honor. L-9 was invited and

DETAILS

APRILIO was not. This was a scientific conference but L-9 took him along on Mowatt's invitation. His place was packed with people. L-9 and APRILIO were sitting near the front when suddenly a woman slipped these copies of Chinese propaganda to his feet behind -- he had forgotten the shoe was. These were the 7 Aug, 14 Aug, and 21 Aug issues of REVISTA INTERNACIONAL and all concerned the Chinese agreement in the field with the USSR. L-9 and APRILIO were surprised that the Chinese would take advantage of a Soviet function to try to win over the Cubans to their point of view.

3. The recent issue of SENESE (p. 135) contained a strong editorial against the US and USSR admissions to the Paleontologist's Congress. This editorial was considered a scandal by the Cuban Embassy which deplores the widening Soviet-Chinese rift. By branding the Soviet delegates as not interested in any countries other than the US, SENESE would soon (in the eyes of the Cuban Embassy) to have moved solidly into the Chinese Communist camp.

4. French travel to Cuba: Sofia, Bulgarians (Luis) of the French Embassy phoned L-9 about a French girl who want to visit Cuba but who want assurances that they will be able to get out of Cuba right away after interviewing the Communist part Nicolas G. These two are Rayniera de FERRIER and Rayniera P. Lillo. FERRIER has to move on to Sofia, Bulgaria without delay. Both came to the Embassy on visa matters. FERRIER speaks quite good English and Spanish and has been in Moscow.

This is for your information regarding the meeting

5. An American lawyer named (Dora) SMITH was in the Embassy a few days ago to get a Cuban visa. L-9 SMITH is represents an Oregon legal firm.

6. L-9 is going to set up his exhibit of Cuban engravings at San Luis Petrosi in collaboration with the Mexican National Institute of Fine Arts which will be the sponsor and will furnish the exhibition hall.

7. A Mexican named Hernandez (Luis), who has a daughter in Cuba, has recently been in close touch with Ambassador Joaquin HERNANDEZ Armas.

8. L-9 is passing along frequently with the Ambassador. When former Ambassador FERRER was on the airport preparing to leave he was most polite in his remarks and L-9 thought HERNANDEZ said to L-9, "I wish you could be in the office as you are to FERRER -- wish you had the same system for me."

9. Telephones: L-9 was asked to try to check out all phones in the Embassy -- every desk had a desk set, the modern, upright cream-colored phone. The desk set at the bottom is in the same office -- used to be used by the former SECRETARY but this office is now used by APRILIO -- is in the rear of the Embassy above the little theater. It has been out of order for about two weeks and APRILIO is trying to get it fixed -- asked L-9 if he had any "pull" with the phone company because he could get in and fix it. (NOTE: This is our hot-wire phone which recently failed to operate when we tried to reactivate it).

1. A meeting was held with L-9 in Barker's car in Polanco from 2230 to 2355 hours 25 September.
2. L-9 gave the following list of Mexican delegates to the Architect's Congress in Havana:

3. L-9 said that a telephone company representative had been in the Embassy that morning looking at APARICIO's out-of-order telephone (this is the one WILFORD doctored up for us) and would be back, perhaps 27 September, to fix it up.

4. Srta. Udo, Maria del Rosario ^X GONZALEZ, Institute Potosino de Bellas Artes, Venustiano Carranza, 100, Tel. 28-12, San Luis Potosi, S.L.P., has been designated by Bellas Artes to help L-9 set up his exhibit of Cuban engravings in that city.

5. A Colombian girl named (Mrs) SOUZA has recently arrived from New York City, from whence she fled when summoned by immigration authorities for an interview, and is now in touch with the Cuban Embassy here. She is on her way to Cuba to marry her Cuban boyfriend who works for the GOC. She made it quite clear that she is no Communist but said that she may have been branded as one by U.S. authorities for having a Cuban fiance.

6. Asked if he knew of anyone from the Embassy living at 157 Pachuca, corner of Vicente Suarez (this is the one also supplied by AMENOS-1), L-9 replied that "Gonzalez, Srta. Udo" lived in an apartment there, he did not know the apartment number. (The one AMENOS-1 told WINS about was 113).

7. E expressed his interest in the tailor, W, who is in frequent contact with the Embassy -- patronized by L-9 along with a lot of others. (Bidding operation happening in E's mind) L-9 did not know SOUZA's first name and did not know the name of the tailor shop where he works although he described it as on "Migra, beyond Sanborn's (House of Tiles) -- on the same side of the street -- before Bolivar -- next door to or almost next to an optical supply shop, SOUZA is usually at the corner there although he has a workshop on Calle Bolivar where he does most of the cutting, etc. L-9 said that SOUZA was a colonel of Assault Guards in the Spanish Republican army, was

apparently a regular army officer. He is well to the left but probably not a Communist. He is a Cuban Franco-phobe, he very much like Eusebio LOPEZ in political conviction. SOUZA is in frequent contact with Humberto GARCIA, alias "El Guero," who is a Cuban foreign service employee who is here in Mexico supposedly on a year's leave of absence. GARCIA stays away from the Embassy -- avoids it like the plague -- and is supposed to be disgusted with the Cuban revolution. (GARCIA gets more interesting all the time) SOUZA is about 55 years old, "very Spanish," short, medium build, thinning hair. He was helpful to anti-Revista people (including Fidel CASTRO) here in Mexico, helped them get arms. (NOTE: He is often in LINCOLN traffic and it would appear that his relationship with the Embassy goes beyond simple tailoring) SOUZA did not like Ramon SARDINAS -- doesn't care for the fresh young kids the Cuban revolution is turning out.

S. L-9 was asked to report on all the people in the Embassy -- tell us who is there now (this done primarily in an effort to find who replaced SARDINAS so we can get after him): Names as L-9 gave them.

Cultural: Raul APARICIO Morales

Luis SERRANU Ferrer (now seems to be APARICIO's favorite)

Teresa MONTANA Alvarez (she recently remarked that she may be sent to Cuba, was seen by L-9 cleaning out her desk, said she would keep her bags packed. APARICIO doesn't much care for her)

Daughter of Dr. MACHADO - Puerto Rico

Chancery: Josephine MONTANA Ferrer - Ambassador. Usually called AMEL S. Name used to be FERNANDEZ de Armas but he has apparently dropped the de as aristocratic, hence un-revolutionary.

Jose MONTANA Ferrer - secretary -- used to be in charge of passport division of MININT, Habana.

SUBJECT : Meeting with L-9, 5 October 1963

1. A meeting was held with L-9 in B-9 car track 2310 to 2143 hours on 5 October

2. L-9 reported on several subjects as follows:

a. Marta BOH, Chilean wife of Arturo BOH, came in recently from Cuba on her way to Santiago, Chile. She carries a Chilean official passport and when she went to the Mexican Embassy in Havana to get a visa she was treated in a rude manner by an employee there named Don Maria who said she could not understand why Marta BOH was carrying an official passport from Chile.

Marta told people in the Cuban Embassy here that the wife of Ambassador BOSQUES (Mexican Ambassador to Cuba) is always going around with a big smile on her face but that she is a hypocrite.

Marta said that, according to Ada ROA, Martha BOH, of the Mexican Embassy, Havana, was observed making photocopies in forbidden places during the October 1962 crisis in Havana.

b. Mexican Ambassador Gilberto ROCHA told Manuel HERRERA, sister-in-law of Lawrence P. Barker, recently that the Mexican government is pleased with Lawrence P. Barker -- the Mexicans like his manner.

c. A Cuban named Marlene (Jim), who sat beside John Wickham on a recent flight to Cuba, said that "now that Frankie WINE is leaving Mexico, it is a good thing that L-9 will remain there."

d. Marta BOH reported that Richard GARDNER had sent Paul WINE and President Kennedy to the car track to wait a couple of days last -- was not being all right one. WINE was having trouble with his spinal column. WINE took a few days at Verdere about the last time.

e. BOH had a little supper for Wine, L-8, and other friends at his place a few days ago and the supper was cooked by an Embassy employee in Wine. WINE has been in Cuba once before, a few days after WINE took power for the last time. This man "WINE" has a small mustache. (L-9 says he can identify him from WINE photos)

2. L-9 has been involved in the exporting to Cuba of some Cappy plants in the name of Josea Pineda (WINE confirms this). These plants were furnished by Dieta WINE WINE of Colombia.

3. L-9 was asked if he had been able to identify the "light-skinned mulatto" whom we had tentatively picked out as the code clerk. No. Furthermore, this man hasn't been seen around the Embassy since then. But there is another man in the Embassy -- like "Bob" was a small mulatto -- and is sometimes on duty at the gate (this is significant since "BOB" also worked the gates). He doesn't know this man's name but could identify him from a photo. (It was agreed that at the next meeting B would bring along the latest LERODE photos for identification by L-9.)

4. B turned the conversation to the physical plant of the Embassy, asking L-9 to describe the Ambassador's office. L-9 said that this office has been completely renovated, painted, new furniture moved in, etc. The small cocktail table is still there (this is the same one we earlier fixed up with a transmitter). B asked L-9 to do a thorough casing job of the Ambassador's office as well as that of his secretary, Peregrina LERODE. When asked where the wooden Don Quijote carving, which used to be in the Ambassador's office, then in Teresa BRUNDA's, is now located, he said he thought it was on Peregrina's desk. He was asked to observe this item carefully and to see whether the identical carving is still being sold there (that one was bought -- somewhere on Juarez. Will do. He was asked to make special note of small, portable items in these offices such as pen holders, statues, books (these used to be several, of Marti and others, in the Ambassador's office) -- especially items which can be duplicated and easily introduced. (If we could fix up a couple of Quijotes with concealed transmitters we could probably bring in a lot of sensitive information not available through LERODE.)

5. L-9 was told that at the next meeting he would be expected to furnish a complete sketch of the offices in which we are interested.

6. L-9 said that the telephones in the Embassy are all fouled up and that there is a standing request with the phone company for so many to come in and fix them up, arrange new extensions, etc. (L-9 confirms this). L-9 feels that we are missing a good job if we don't have some of our people do this work.

7. L-9's inability to get up with a new and more workable radio is encouraging but reflects a pattern observable from the time of the very first meetings with this agent. He is very nervous, is afraid to "take action" even to the extent of asking one of the men at the gate, "Hey, five forgotten, what is your name, anyway?" He fears that any question asked will result in immediate suspicion and since he's now taking this way for such a long time he may well be right since he is regarded as a quiet fellow who does his work and never asks any questions. To be sure, however, that we can -- we must -- get more mileage from him.

8. L-9 was paid \$,000 plus for September. Next meeting -- open.

9. Conclusions: He was not a very good source up until the end of meeting time on the phone will be as follows: B will actually take place one hour before the time mentioned. If an agreement is made to meet at 2100, the meeting will take place at 2000.

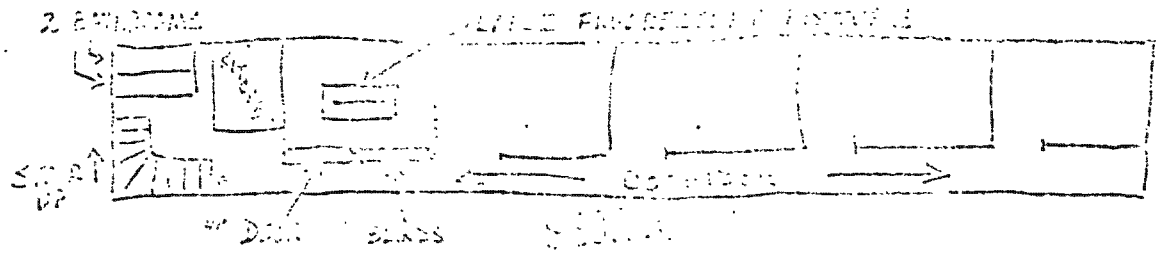
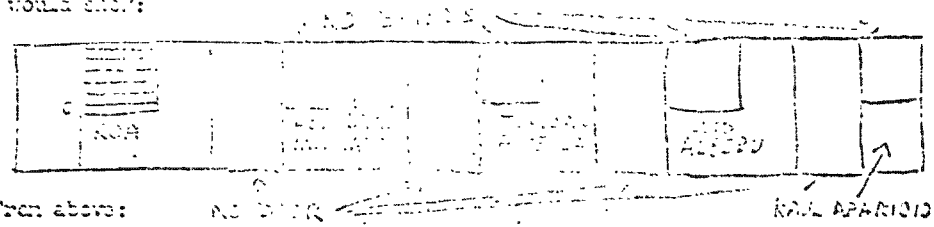

SUBJECT : Meeting with L-9, 7-8 Oct 1963

1. A meeting was held with L-9 in his car from 2350 hours 7 Oct to 0015 hours 8 Oct.
2. L-9, responding to a message received at the previous meeting to do everything possible to ascertain the identity of the code clerk, advised that he thinks that Jose Manuel MARTINEZ Roca may be the man, RMA, as he is known around the Embassy, who just recently performed a few suspicious alterations to his office:
 - (a) put up a locking door -- where none of his neighbors have one
 - (b) installed a venetian blind -- ditto
 - (c) installed a high-power fluorescent light fixture in the ceiling -- the others have older, weaker fixtures.
3. RMA is often out of sight during the day. MARTINEZ recently made a comment that it was strange that RMA is so often unavailable during the working hours.
4. L-9 was asked whether RMA has a safe or lock-fitted file cabinet in his office. No. (It would thus seem unlikely that he keeps any code materials in this area). The new alterations would make it appear that he does do (or plans to do) some sort of work out of sight.
5. L-9 says that RMA claims no relationship to the Cuban Foreign Minister, Raul RMA. He is married to the sister of a well-known Cuban painter named Mariano -- perhaps Mariano MARTINEZ -- L-9 not sure, will check. His wife is now in Cuba showing a picture.
6. RMA's office is in the "new construction" occupied by RMA, Teresa BUCHEZ, Luis MARTINEZ, and Raul MARTINEZ. A horizontal view facing the row of offices would show:

7. L-9 said that two large dogs, kept in a kennel during the day, are turned loose in the garden during the night. Another one, just a pup, has been seen lately.

8. L-9 said that the wood carving of Pon Quijote (see last CR) is no longer in evidence.

9. L-9 was advised to get up every available scrap of information on RDA and to keep in mind our intense interest in the physical layout of the offices of the Ambassador and his secretary.

10. Next meeting - open.

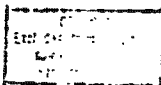

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITWELL-9, 13 September

1. LITWELL-9 phoned Barker at 3335 hours 12 September and arrangements were made to meet at midnight. The meeting was held in B's car and lasted until 0100 hours. L-9 reported as follows:

A. On 9 August L-9 and his boss, FRANCISCO Aparicio, visited ROSENZWEIG, Mexican diplomat stationed here at the Foreign Ministry, regarding the upcoming Architect's Congress in Habana. APARICIO asked ROSENZWEIG to get authorization for the Cubans to send a ship to Veracruz to pick up delegates and to land IL-18's here in Mexi for the same purpose. The request was on paper in the usual diplomat's form. L-9 was surprised to note that ROSENZWEIG was very cold and even unfriendly -- he told APARICIO that no decision could be made on the spot and that the Embassy would be notified by 11 Sept. As of the night of 11 Sept. no reply had been received and APARICIO was getting worried. A phone call was made to (Mrs) LAMB, an assistant of ROSENZWEIG, but this yielded no further information.

B. FRANCISCO, Manager of Cuban Airlines in Mexi, told APARICIO the other day that he had "fixed everything up with AIRBORNE" to solve the Architect's congress transportation problem.

Note: L-9's reason for calling this midnight meeting was to pass on the above in case we might be able to exert influence on the Mexican Government or Aerocuba to insure that the transportation problem remains a problem. L-9 said that his only real concern these days is the Congress and that anything we might do to frustrate their efforts would be most worthwhile.

C. APARICIO was pissed when he failed to get invitations to a Mexican government function connected with the Philosophers' Conference now being held in Mexi -- somewhere he didn't get invited to the Independence Day celebrations by the Mexican Gov. L-9 was invited to honor Rumbler and succeeded in arranging an invitation to the Independence Day celebrations for APARICIO who was very appreciative.

D. When former ambassador Beltrame for Cuba the other day he remarked in L-9's presence at the airport that he expects a new crisis to materialize in about a month. He did not elaborate.

E. FRANCISCO of the UN delegation, who has recently been in Cuba, is on his way back to New York. He was warned when he returned to Cuba a month or so ago that he was in the dockhouse with his child, OSCAR Indurategui, and would have to spend at least a year in Cuba for reorientation. The other day L-9 visited him at the Del Prado Hotel, where he was staying (avoiding the Embassy completely), and FRANCISCO exhibited a letter from (Mrs) NINA Otero (might be NINA OTERO) which stated plainly that FRANCISCO has the complete confidence of OSCAR ("goca de la cabal confianza..."). L-9 thus believes that FRANCISCO

is returning to the UN with a new order for GARCIA Inchaustegui. L-9 says that FRANZINI is not a Communist. When FRANZINI arrived in Havana, exactly he spotted Fidel CASTRO at some reception but CASTRO paid him no attention. He interpreted this as a snub but in a later reception at a foreign Embassy in Havana Fidel looked him up, apologized for not having spoken to him earlier, and was most effusive in his praise for FRANZINI.

F. Former Ambassador FRANZINI and wife, here for the philosophers' meeting, are buying up car tires in order to get P's car back on the road in Cuba. L-9 has been helping them -- said he would take payment when he goes back to Cuba since the P's were running short of cash here.

G. Dolores EE LAMON is still making a play for Ambassador FRANZINI and she now seems to be interested in having a play with her. Gety FRANZINI doesn't like Dolores and is trying to discourage the Ambassador from getting involved -- Gety believes that Dolores may be a Mexican Government spy. L-9 finds her excessive praise of Fidel CASTRO a bit phony and told Barker that if Dolores is "one of our agents" -- and, mind you, I'm not asking whether she is -- but, if she is... that we should tell her not to be so obvious. He said that Dolores recently bragged that Fidel CASTRO had "had" her on a mattress laid on the floor in Cuba and that while they were rapping around, nice wavy scurrying all about the room.

2. L-9 was asked to try again to ascertain who the new code clerk is. He was told that this person would have arrived shortly before FRANZINI's departure, would be close-mouthed, would work a lot of nights, probably in the basement, and would appear to be quite stupid in the mornings on new occasions. At this a light came to go on inside L-9's head and he said, "I know who it is, now -- but I don't know his name." Asked if this person lives inside the UN, L-9 replied yes. The man he has in mind is about 35 years old, a light-skinned mulatto, "very mysterious and reserved," and is an old-Communist. L-9 said he could identify the man from photos. He was asked to make every attempt consistent with good security to ascertain this man's identity.

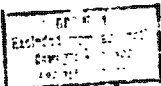

SUBJECT : Meeting with LEMME - 23 August 1963.

1. L-9 was picked up on Tlaxera by 1900 hours and driven out to a dark spot along Galileo where a kidnapping hold on Barker's car -- L was dropped off about two blocks in, at about 2710 hours.
2. L said that he has noticed that the new ^{Paul} ^{Nogales} ~~order~~ ^{order} ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~APARICIO~~ ^{APARICIO}, the new Cultural Counselor, are taking a hard line and "isolating" him. APARICIO seems to be doing the same thing in the office where he took over for himself, relegating him to the space formerly occupied by "Mico" GARCEL who was, in turn, so close to him, he supposed that he wrote a blast to Havana complaining that he was being walked around by APARICIO.
3. L says that the Ambassador, who he thinks to be an old-line Communist, is a "real smooth customer" who does not put his chosen and most trusted people in positions of responsibility and who is smilingly leading them on. He does not have complete confidence in him -- L thinks that he is in this latter category because he is not a Communist and this fact is well known. 13. I and APANELO recently visited Manuel GOMEZ, President of the Institute (Instituto Mexicano-Cubano de Estudios Culturales Jose Martí) -- GOMEZ said he wanted to leave the Institute -- is too busy -- feels that a good choice would be Manuel GOMEZ (to replace him). GOMEZ would be especially good because he is a councillor to the President of Mexico.

14. Regarding the Institute -- I think that there has been a family living in the building since the Cuban Revolution. They, alleging an agreement with the owner, have not been properly checked with the owner and found out that no such agreement had been made. I was assigned the job of checking that -- a policeman, including the child. Some thought was given to making some propaganda about "family eviction" but I asked that we not play it up since he has been doing a dirty job and he would be blasted in the press if it were to be made public.

15. I mentioned that he was not to be given being given for Armando (Museum Institute) and that the Embassy on 14 August -- another sign of his being there.

16. I produced a list of names of Cuban officials, through the Institute, that they would like to appear in the mailing list for the Embassy bulletin. (Attached)

17. I was advised to keep watch on the situation. It would not be possible for APANELO to say that he was not to be contacted that the Embassy can get along without him. I was reminded that if he pulls his strings with Fidel O'STROY he will have a good job. He mentioned that there might be a possibility that he would go to Cuba toward the end of the year for vacations. He was encouraged to do so.

SUBJECT: Meeting with LITVINOV, 5 September 1963

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 8:30 to 9:30 hours 5 September. L-9 reported as follows:

- A. L-9 now seems to be "in" somewhat with the Ambassador -- in contrast to the isolation he reported some time ago. The Amb visited L-9's apartment on 24 August. Incidentally, L-9 has prominently displayed a portrait of Fidel CASTRO and has been very friendly to L-9. L-9 also noted that L-9 had a spot on his coat, from some ink on the wall by his desk, and took out a handkerchief and dabbed it off. L-9's boss, APARTICO, has apparently taken L-9's hint and has likewise been much more friendly. L-9 said he had been in the Embassy for a few days ago when, for the third time, an effort was made to find the location of his library in the Embassy -- this calculation by the government had a very salutary effect on his fellows who were opposed to both his rankied teachers.
- B. Eusebio AZQUE, the Consul, is in Mexico City -- probably in about two weeks. He is on his way back to work. He does not seem happy with the transfer -- would much prefer to remain in Mexico. (Note: Will get cable off to HQS soon, complete before he takes off)
- C. The new Consul -- L-9 did not recall his name -- AZQUE's replacement, used to work for the Sherman Williams Paint Factory at Reparto Batista, Habana, in the pro-Castro camp.
- D. AZQUE recently remarked that the Cuban doctor (fnu) MEDINA who visits the Embassy often "must be a CIA agent." He is not trusted by Embassy people.
- E. A man named Humberto BARRERA was employed by the Embassy here and who later returned to Cuba to work in the Foreign Ministry, is back in town but is not in the Embassy and never visits the Embassy. L-9 ran into him in the office of SOUZA who does most of the mailing work for the Embassy (and who appears often on LITVINOV's list). BARRERA is a protégé of a protégé of Fidel CASTRO's secretary Silvia S. and is supposedly on one year's leave from MEXICO. L-9 says BARRERA is up to some "funny business" since he avoids the Embassy like the plague.
- F. The Mexican government is insisting that the Cubans to ship beans out of Mexico on Submarine. (Note: We must get through our Embassy commercial section).
- G. Raul APARTICO Negales was in contact with L-9 and the Ambassador -- reminiscing about the time both APARTICO and BARRERA were both secretaries of a Brazilian politician named Pio CORREA -- said that he had made some strong anti-Castro statements

including the statement that S would be in Paris but he would subject CASER's efforts to a "political" operation if then being imposed on people from the Soviet Union. SPANCO heard of this and promptly contacted S with influence on the newspaper journal to demand the publication of articles in the paper which succeeded in damaging S. SPANCO was quite proud of this operation.

- H. Ambassador HERRANDEZ recently told L-9 that he had received some "insider" info regarding the activities of David Alfaro SIQUEIRAS. Someone had told ERNEST GARDER that it was a terrible thing that the LAFER Arceas editor, HERRANDEZ, had go out of office with this SIQUEIRAS blarney on the subject. GARDER replied that it was S's fault -- that his activities were a "political thing" of the case by presenting the Mexican government with a 10,000 page "bulletin" which was really an accusation against the GCM. On another occasion it appeared that S might be released soon and S remarked sarcastically that this might give S "the American Embassy points to," This made ERNEST break and all over again and he resolved that S would not be jail.
- I. The Cuban Embassy has run out of paper for its bulletin and has not been able to get any more. An appeal was made to the Soviet Embassy for reprint but the News turned them down!
- J. Twenty pre-paid tickets for Mexican delegates to the Architect's Conference have arrived -- L-9 was not able to learn the names of the Lucky twenty. The National Association of Architectural Students has chosen two delegates to attend the congress --
Francisco M. S. S. S.
Roberto S. S.
L-9 turned over a proposal for the Congress -- said there are "members" of this society who are waiting distribution. (Sample was given to SMOUL and S.)
- K. The "equator" building of the Cultural Institute has been moved out (and L-9 was not there) -- L-9 handled this and it went reasonably. A number of the GCM now remains there -- old man SMOUL is the head of the Institute -- his wife and daughter work at the Cultural Institute. (Note: The maid of ERNEST-22 and ERNEST-12 had previously become very friendly at the market with a 14-year-old girl who works as a maid at the Cuban Embassy -- this is a very interesting girl - ERNEST!)
- L. The cultural society of the GCM brought Joni Sierra & BEATRIZ, Antanas and several other members of the Supreme Administration, Federal of the GCM to the Embassy to see L-9 and to get his views on the situation. L-9 is on an around-the-world trip and a scholar's trip from the American Student Union in Mexico. He wanted letters of introduction to Soviet and Cuban officials and others. Ambassador HERRANDEZ was obliged and L-9 was pleased that the Frenchmen came to see L-9. HERRANDEZ was obliged to accompany the distinguished-guests back to the French Embassy.
- M. With NEGUE's coming Spanish, L-9 feels that he may have a chance to "get to" Silvia BURKE who has not have any ties of loyalty to the new Consul. On the other hand, she may not be retained.

- X. L-9 met Emma GUSTO at the airport on her return from Cuba. He asked her how Fidel was getting along. She replied that Fidel is very busy organizing troops with the guerrilla incursions.
- O. Engineer Victor LORELLI came to the Embassy the other day and was stopped by JORRIN, the porter, who told him he must use another entrance. L-9 intervened and escorted LORELLI through the gate. Later JORRIN apologized to L-9 -- said he did not recognize LORELLI.
- P. The Cuban cultural institute at Temple has a weekly radio program (Sat or Sun after hours) of Cuban music which is broadcast regularly by station WEDD Tropical. The cost is only 40 pesos per broadcast.
- Q. Former Ambassador PORTERON, an intellectual, recently sent L-9 an inscribed, autographed book. Ambassador HERNANDEZ and APARICIO were both impressed by him and a little jealous because they were left out.
- R. Manuel WARRIN, a Colson artist who lives at Liverpool 179, Mexico City, and who has visited here several times, is trying to get a visa to return to Cuba but the Cubans won't give him one. They suspect him of being on the other side politically. APARICIO thinks that he should be given a visa and then watched inside Cuba.
- S. Gilberto BLAN Parana, a Paranaese who maintains homes at Mexico and Mexico City, gave a talk on 23 August at the Escuela Superior de Medicina Rural regarding the public health situation in Cuba today. This man is close with GUSTO.
- T. "Micha" -- a girl who works at the Embassy -- daughter of a Communist who formerly served as a consultant for Ambassador PORTERON-CHICO, was attacked at 3:00 pm. She was last (31 Aug-?) on Reforma -- came straight to the Embassy and made her get into a car, she was dazed and could not get out in the rain, she had her gold checked. She was told that this was no ordinary robbery -- had paid 2000 pesos.
- U. An architect named CORREIA is trying to get a visa recently.

2. L-9 identified a number of HERNANDEZ's applications noted on photos.

3. L-9 was paid 1,000 pesos for help in getting the "Agallas."

4. He was a bit about Sanja HERNANDEZ, daughter of Enrique SPIRA, Pole; and Vladimir RIBSENER, Czech -- all Cubans. He has had no contact with these people but might be able to arrange to see HERNANDEZ is interested in his painting. L-9 will look into possibility of getting closer to some of these people -- he does not seem to think that HERNANDEZ is the Polish cultural attache (possibly SPIRA) admitted she was sent out of Paris.

5. A rather lengthy discussion of L-9's work was held -- at L-9's initiative. He said that he had apparently had contact with the Ambassador -- all signs showed that the Ambassador was interested in him and was depending on him. GARY SOLERANO recently told L-9 that he was very happy with L-9's work. Nevertheless, L-9 feels that maybe he has been around too long -- maybe he should try to wangle a transfer someplace where there would be no lingering suspicions. Asked where he would like to go, he quickly singled out London and admitted that his prime reason for wanting to go there is a desire to perfect his English (which is quite good already). Solerano told that we would be very interested in continuing his services if he ever thought of going but that, frankly, he was of more value to us here in Mexico City than anywhere else with the possible exception of Havana. The discussion turned all over the map and metamorphosed into quite an exchange of mutual philosophies. L-9 again explained his motivation -- as he sees it -- and expressed great satisfaction in being able to do something for Cuba by cooperating with us. He said that he has a strong desire to get back to painting and has asked the Ambassador if he might take time off in the after-noon to paint -- that he is building up to an exhibition if he cannot paint -- the Ambassador readily agreed and said that since L-9 has a phone at his apartment he could quickly be reached if needed at the Embassy.

6. L-9 is thinking of going to Cuba sometime in December -- was encouraged to do so. A vacation, even in Cuba, would probably do him a lot of good since he is obviously feeling the pressure of leading a double existence. He is still worried about his security (the Ambassador says that this has been a problem from the beginning) and fears that at any moment he might be discovered. At the same time he is impressed by our own cleverness and seems to be getting some enjoyment out of his activities on our behalf. A very nice degree of rapport between C/O and agent has been established and L-9 seems to be looking upon his C/O as a trusted friend.

7. NEXT MEETING: Left open -- contact will be by phone.

1. LITAMIL-9 was contacted by phone at his home at 0815 hours 29 July and a meeting set up for that night. The pick-up was made on Thiers at 2100 whereupon Barker drove L to his, B's, home for the meeting. Driveway lights were out and B's car was driven inside by the door to B's home where L alighted and scooted inside. The meeting lasted until midnight when L was dropped on Malehor Ocampo not far from his home. The decision to use B's home was made in view of the difficulty of transacting such business in an automobile and the good physical security afforded by the layout of B's home in Lomas. It was decided that the time had come to reveal B's identity to L since a social encounter in diplomatic-consular circles was inevitable sooner or later -- furthermore B is reasonably satisfied that L is sincerely devoted to the anti-Castro cause and not playing a double game. The relaxed atmosphere in B's home contributed materially to mutual rapport building between L and B. L was quite impressed with the many books in evidence and showed great interest in some of the paintings and furnishings in the house, saying "Es evidente que es Ud. un hombre muy fino."

3. L explained that he had just arrived back in Mexico City on the 28th -- after an extended trip to Tampico where he was very successful in staging an exhibit of Cuban engravings on 20 July and a big affair at Ciudad Madero on the 26th celebrating the anniversary of Fidel's Cuartel Moncada attack. He exhibited a number of newspaper clippings and photographs concerning these events and said he was more than ever "in" with the Ambassador for having sponsored these two events. He may go to Merida on the 31st to represent the Embassy at a meeting of the Jose Marti Cultural Group there. After that he plans to rest on his laurels and devote more time to painting. He seemed somewhat concerned lest the Mexican Government give him trouble in view of his recent activity for the Embassy -- explained that a boy distributing leaflets in Tampico had been picked up and arrested. B explained that it was highly unlikely that the Mexican Government would take any action against a diplomat who was simply (in their eyes and those of everyone else) doing his duty. It is to be noted that L is not the courageous type -- he is constantly expressing fears that he might get into trouble, this even when his actions are those which would normally be expected of a man in his overt position.

4. The greater part of the meeting was taken up in going over a large backlog of LIERODE photographs. L made the following identifications:

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

FROM : Lawrence F. Barker
SUBJECT : Meeting with LITVIN-9, 11 July 1963

1. At about noon 11 July L-9 phoned Barker's home, spoke in English with Mrs. B and said he would call again at 2000 hours. At 1945 he phoned again, B answered, and it was agreed that L-9 would meet at 2100. Accordingly, at 2100, B picked up L at the corner of Suberberg & Wilers (circle at Tolence), the same contact point Surrock, L's former case officer, used to employ. B-9 drove on out to Tomas and parked for a long talk. L was dropped off about 4 blocks from his home at 2245.

2. L explained that he had phoned Barker twice at Barker's old Monte lithos address after returning from Veracruz and before going on to Tampico -- no answer either time. It developed that L had been using a wrong number -- replacing 20 with 30. L was quite embarrassed about this fluke, saying, "It's the first time I've ever done anything like that."

3. The meeting was conducted entirely in Spanish. It was a classic of sorts -- almost as though a script had been prepared beforehand. What it amounted to was an understandable and quite obvious, although not direct, attempt by L to sound out his new C/O in various ways to decide whether he wished to have his life in the hands of B -- a hitherto unknown quantity to B.

4. L began by stressing the dangers inherent in his position and confronting him as posed by the recent arrival in the Cuban Embassy of a number of highly-qualified, hence dangerous, people -- the new ambassador and the new cultural counselor are two examples. L pointed out that these people are of varsity quality and representative of a new breed of Cuban diplomat, more culture, more intelligent, and in every way much better qualified than their predecessors. L felt that out of respect for the caliber of the operation we should take extreme security precautions in our future contacts and meetings. B readily agreed and pointed out that contact points should be varied and away from the main streets of Tolence which have recently been made more dangerous by being straddled with bright new street lights. L said he had the same idea in mind. B said he did not wish to follow the old pattern of parking in the war zone district since the car in a parked car in that area could be assumed to be up to no good, perhaps costing for a robbery, and, in any case, would be hard pressed to explain their presence to the satisfaction of an inquiring policeman or witcher -- furthermore, the mere presence of a car in the area would arouse suspicion and might lead to checking of its license plates or subsequent mobile surveillance. B asked L to case his neighborhood for better contact points, note those on a map, and be prepared to discuss priv & coord at a next meeting. B explained that our primary action must be directed at the protection of L. L soaked this up like a sponge and showed his appreciation.

5. B asked L what he would reply if he were to be approached in his office on the morning of 12 July by one of his co-workers and asked, "Who was that gringo type you were seen with last night?" This drew a rather lengthy and awkward silence -- B could come up with no answer. B then gave him a short course in cover, throwing in lots of examples from real operations (gleaned from 3 1/2 years of ISM/ITSM instruction experience) and a few

suggestions for action cover. It was generally agreed that MI might never need to use a cover story to explain their association in view of the resort to clandestine night-time meetings, but also agreed that such a story should be agreed upon in advance, just in case. I suggested that this cover might be related to L's activity as an artist and portrait painter. L was advised to give the subject a lot of thought -- MI will discuss at the next meeting. An interesting sidelight was that L (probably referring to L's use of numerous European examples to illustrate the use of cover) said, "You're a lot more European than Shryock -- I can tell that you've had considerable experience there." Barker acknowledged this although he has never set foot in Europe. Incidentally, I showed throughout the meeting a very high regard for Shryock.

6. L tried to explain his main operandi and, almost apologetically, explained how he had made arrangements while in Terrico for a big cultural exhibit by the Consulate there on 11 July. He hoped we would understand that he felt he had to do this, explaining that he could "live off" the prestige gained therefor for a couple of months. I explained that it was essential for L to do his overt job and do it well, that if he succeeded in winning over a few people to Fidel Castro's side we would not be upset -- that we want to be in a position of eyes and ears and a good brain inside the embassy -- if L does not do his overt job well sooner or later he will be on the outside and will all be the loser. I explained that in his experience in handling of penetration agents he had often come up with similar problems -- the agents found it difficult to believe that he really wanted them to act like Communists and go out at night to paint "Yankee Go Home" on the walls -- but, that if they failed to be good Communists, we would soon be minus good assets. I told L not to worry about the consequences of his ostensibly performing will on behalf of the Castro government -- yet at the same time L should not step out of character and become a rabid Fidelista. At this point L sighed, threw up his hands, and said, "Now I can see that we are going to get along wonderfully (a las mil maravillas)."

7. L explained that one factor always in his favor is the fact that he is known to be well connected with Fidel -- that persons in the embassy are never sure he is not more than what he appears to be on the surface and that no-one in the embassy really dares to "take him on" in any dispute lest he pull his strings with Fidel. I acknowledged the value of this "aura" and advised him to keep himself somewhat of a mystery to his associates insofar as the connection with Fidel. I remarked somewhat modestly that ASCE had recently told him that he was especially valuable to the embassy precisely because he does not rant and rave about the imperialists, does not make wild Fidelista propaganda, but convinces people because of his obvious culture and intelligence.

8. When I gave L his June salary of 5,000 pesos L asked for the receipt before it was in evidence, and signed it without hesitation. He then launched into an explanation of why he accepts money and why he was being what some might term a "traitor." I tried to cut him off but he would not be stopped -- wanted to set the record straight. It is clear that he is a sincere, convinced ideological opponent of the Castro government -- he was determined to make this clear, and did so eloquently.

9. I impresses B as an exceedingly valuable agent with great potential -- highly cultured, intelligent, operationally "savvy," ideologically motivated -- a person who must identify closely in a personal way with

his case officer. By the end of the meeting I was obviously impressed with B's ostensible professional competence (the meeting was heavily larded with tradecraft instruction and examples from experience) and a very friendly atmosphere reigned although it will probably be some time before I have the sort of personal esteem for B that he has for his former C/O.

10. Little of intelligence value came from the meeting -- L had just returned to Mexico City from extended trips to Veracruz and Tampico -- arriving the night of 10 July. He got back just in time to attend an embassy press reception at which he was buttonholed by MEMORANDUM of the Soviet Embassy who inquired about his views on the Guantanamo issue and nuclear disarmament. MEM was not giving out anything -- just asking, and he got the standard CIA dista replies for his efforts.

11. A meeting will be held before 20 July when L is due to depart for Tampico to set up the 25th of July exhibit. I said that the best time to contact him by phone at home is between 0700 and 0900, preferably at 0800. At the next meeting he will report at length on topics of intelligence interest and arrangements will be made for more secure contact in the future.

12. Barker advised him to always speak in English when he phones Barker just in case someone might be listening -- his voice in English would be much harder to identify.

On 27 May 63, I met LITANIL-9 at a convenient rendezvous point and we drove to outlying area, where meeting was held. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS.

LITANIL-9 reported as follows:

1. See NEXT re SINOBAS' request to meet Virginia Sanchez, Costa Rican Communist at airport on 25 May 63. L-9 said GRUTTER asked him if all the other Cubans could go to the airport and L-9 was obliged to tell her that SINOBAS told him that she should go but no mention was made of the others. L-9 said that the other Costa Ricans were scheduled to stay at the Hotel Astoria over night. He said that GRUTTER was very happy that they were allowed to leave the airport, although they had transit visas only.

2. L-9 said that on 27 May 63, Rogelio SINOBAS, Cuban Charge, gave him a list of names received from Habana re applications for employment in Cuba. L-9 was amazed that SINOBAS gave him this task as it appears to fall into Manuel VEGA's bailiwick, i.e. G-2. L-9 plans to take advantage of this task to find out about their friends etc. The names are as follows:

(L-7 reported previously that Tania ZELAYA replaced CALVO). L-9 said that CALVO's reason for resigning was because of her studies. This is same info provided by L-7.

2. On the morning of 7 May 63, Baron SINCAS Casado, Cuban Charge, called L-9 to his office and told him to get in touch with DE GORTARI, Mexican Communist, and make an appointment for SINCAS to see him. L-9 called a number where DE GORTARI previously lived and was told that DE GORTARI had just moved to Rosas Moreno 70. L-9 went to this address and DE GORTARI was not in but he talked with his wife. 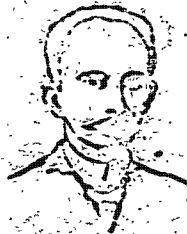

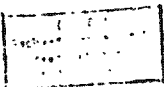

On 10 June 63, I met LITAMIL-9 at the usual rendezvous point and we drove to airport, i.e. L-9 got out of car prior to arriving at the airport. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED.
Time: 2245-2315.

LITAMIL-9 reported as follows:

1. L-9 said that he talked with Vicente ^{FIO P} ~~CAMARA~~ ^{CIT MEXICO}, Mexican who is ^{RE} ~~handling~~ ^{occ} real estate in Mexico and CAMARA gave him a list of several apartments which might be of interest re ILCRC new site. CAMARA gave L-9 his telephone number, which is as follows:

2. Benigno CASTELLAR Sanchez ~~XXXXXX~~ introduced Miguel ^{CIT CUBA} ~~REYES~~, a Cuban diplomat to L-9. L-9 said that he ~~believes~~ ^{is} REYES has been ~~assigned~~ ^{is} to the Cuban Embassy but is not sure.

Subject: LITAMIL-9

On 18 June 63, I met LITAMIL-9 at the usual rendezvous point and we drove to an outlying district of the city, where we held meeting. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED. Time: 2300-2400.

LITAMIL-9 reported as follows:

1. As previously reported, AMB HERNANDEZ de Armas is scheduled to arrive on 21 June 63.
2. ^{CIT CUBA} Jose PAZ Leon, Carlos BALOSARRI Abreu, Jose MARTINEZ Socarras Duban delegated to the FAO Seminar arrived in Mexico on 17 June 63. L-9 said that PAZ told him that he had been in Mexico in 1957 and had met a Costa Rica who later died in an automobile crash. According to PAZ, the Costa Rican was a red hot CASTRISTA.
3. L-9, after all others in the Cuban Embassy had refused to help ^{RECAF} Emma CASTRO de ^{CIT CUBA} LOMELI ^{RE SUOTACTS} get several boxes of medicine on the plane, was able to convince the steward on the plane to take the boxes. AZCUE, Jorge ROJAS, "Nico" GARCIA among others were involved and did nothing, stating that it was strictly against orders to put any more cargo on board the plane. GARCIA who was supposed to have helped Emma CASTRO disappeared and could not be found. L-9 ^{XX} said that Emma CASTRO was with her husband, "F6fo" GUTIERREZ, Orquidea PINO and Odilia PINO de CHAUMONT.
4. The steward on the plane on 17 June 63 told L-9 that the Britannia which came in to Mexico was completely overhauled in Cambridge England to the tune of \$2,000,000 U.S.
5. On 18 June 63, L-9 took a letter to the secretary of ^{CIT CUBA} Jose GOROSTIZA ^{RE LETTER} in the Foreign Office for GOROSTIZA. The letter was given to L-9 by Buenaventura REYES Acosta who told him "Tenga cuidado con esta carta, es para GOROSTIZA". The letter came in on the 17 June flight and L-9 believes that it probably has to ^{DEHANG} do with the new Cuban Amb, Joaquin HERNANDEZ de Armas.

6. Ramon SINOBAS was looking for Eli de GORTARI's address again re a Philosophical Congress to be held in Habana.

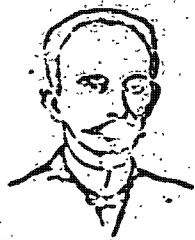
L-9 said that he is giving the case to Jose FERNANDEZ Roa to handle. L-9 believes that GORTARI will be the "recruiter" i.e. it will be he who will choose the delegates from Mexico.

7. On 18 June 63, L-9 went to find the Mexican chess champion re an invitation to Cuba from Raul ROA. L-9 went to the following address: Panama 1009-13, where Jose ARAIZA Vazquez, reportedly lived. L-9 did not find ARAIZA Vazquez but his son Jose ARAIZA Munoz or Muriz, who told L-9 that his father, a Colonel, was presently living in Torreon at the following address: Paquaduria Militar, Palacio Federal, Torreon, Coah. The young ARAIZA said he would write his father soonest but he made no statement as to whether or not his father would accept the invitation. The young ARAIZA is also a chess player. Young ARAIZA hangs out at the Club de Ajedrez on Insurgentes XXXX Sur 219.

8. L-9 reported that Eusabbio AZCUE's wife brought in many boxes from Habana for Dr. DOVAL, father of Cuban girl in Mexico and anti-CASTRISTA. DOVAL, who is expected to come to Mexico soon is reportedly returning to Cuba but L-9 does not believe he will return. DOVAL's wife is in Mexico. L-9 is amazed that AZCUE is helping the DOVALs who are definitely against the regime. (COMMENT: See previous memo re DOVAL's daughter who visited the Embassy a few months ago re her father's case.)

9. L-9 reported that Vicente CAMARA is still looking feverishly for a new site for the INCEC. He said on 14 June he was with CAMARA and they were looking at a place on Reforma. Upon entering L-9 recognized the owner as a friend and whispered to him in an aside not to rent the place to him.

10. L-9 provided the attached IMCRC programs.

On 20 June 63, LITAMIL-9 called to report that he wanted to see me urgently. He said as early as possible. A meeting was scheduled for 2030. I met L-9 at the usual rendezvous point and we drove to darkened area of the city. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED. Time: 2030-2045.

LITAMIL-9 reported as follows:

CIT MEXICO RE SUBJECTS

1. L-9 reported that the letter he delivered to Jose GARCOSTIZA's secretary per previous memo was written by Pres BORTICOS and addressed to Pres LOPEZ Mateos. L-9 said that Buenaventura REYES asked him whether he had delivered it and added it was ~~XXXXXX~~ "de Presidente a Presidente".
2. L-9 reported that the woman whom we have not been identify and who works in the Consulate showed up at the Consulate at 0945.
3. L-9 said that "Panny" a ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ fine bred dog owned by Humberto GARCIA Morera and ~~left at the Embassy when GARCIA~~ *CIT CUBA SUBJECT'S DOG* went to Cuba is lost. JORRIN said that he got out of the gate and ran after a cat. L-9 believes that GARCIA should be told that his dog was allowed to get out of the yard and ran away. He said that GARCIA was very fond of the dog and will be upset when he hears they lost it.
4. L-9 said that the old homestead of Jose MARTI which was being considered as a possible site for the IMCRC is occupied and is "out" as far as the IMCRC is concerned.
5. L-9 said he received his checks from the Cuban Govt, that they had been delayed in Canada etc.
6. L-9 said that Cubana arrived about 2200 on 19 June and did not leave Mexico until the evening of 20 June. He said a Cuban dip arrived on this plane en route to Toronto.

On this date, L-9 reported that Raul ROA sent a cable to Mexico asking that someone oversee the arrival and departure of murals and sculptures to and from Mexico. ^{VE} RAMON SINOBAS ^{EXIT CUBA!} chose L-9 as the man to do the job. L-9 reported that the Cuban vessel ^{HE SUBS} Las Villas was scheduled to arrive the night of 20 June 53. The vessel was not to tie up by rather lie off the port and await the arrival of either a Panamanian cafetero or a Scandinavian ~~XXXX~~ ship. This ship will take on the murals and other items at sea, then proceed to Tampico where the items will be unloaded again. They will then be put aboard a Brazilian ship and taken to Rio De Janeiro, where they will be exhibited at the BIENAL. SINOBAS told L-9 that he should stay in the area i.e. Veracruz and Tampico until the ship leave with the items on board. They ~~XXXX~~ murals will leave Tampico either the 1st of the 4th of July 53. L-9 was asked to leave for Veracruz as soon as possible.

In view of the above, it was necessary to introduce Bob Shaw to L-9 later on in the evening. A meeting was scheduled for 2400, at which time was introduced to L-9 and contact instructions were arranged. L-9 then reviewed in general terms his position re the Cuban Embass personnel, his opinions on the Cuban situation in general and on personalities in the Cuban Embassy in particular. The meeting ended at 0130.

On 16 June 63, I met LICAMIL-9 at the usual rendezvous point and we drove to outlying district of the city where mtg was held. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS. Time: 2330-2430.

LICAMIL-9 reported as follows:

1. L-9 reported that he saw LICAMIL-3 at the funeral of CAMPOS Ortiz and shook hands with ~~XXX~~ him. L-3 reported this previously.
2. A cable from Raul ROA, Cuban Foreign Minister, requested that the Cuban Embassy in Mexico, invited the champion Mexican chess player to participate in the chess championship which will take place in Habana in July. Ramon SINOPAS gave L-9 the assignment to get in touch with the Mexican and invite him. L-9 will do and will provide further details on the case as they are available.
3. On 14 June 63, L-9 told Ramon SINOPAS that Elorenza DE LA ROSA had called him and she wanted to discuss the Architectural Congress with him. SINOPAS told L-9 not to pay any attention to her because she is "muy enredadora", i.e. she fouls up the detail, gets things involved more than necessary etc. This is an interesting comment on the part of SINOPAS, who has taken a liking to L-9. L-9 believes that this is SINOPAS sincere opinion of DE LA ROSA and indicates that she is not quite as important as what she thinks she is. SINOPAS added that CELIS, ^X fnu is handling the Congress invites in Mexico and already has about 20 architects, who are going to go to Habana for the Congress. L-9 said he did not know CELIS' first name but he is very well known among Mexican architects.
4. L-9 reported that the two Cuban delegates to the FAO Seminar on Agriculture have received their visas and will arrive on 17 June. LICAMIL-9 will meet them at the airport.
5. On 14 June 63, one of the subordinates on board the Habana flight (there were three) told L-9 that the crew was leaving for Cambridge,

England on 17 June with a Britannia plane for overland. The crew was then going to the Soviet Union to pick up an Iluyshin 18. 6. L-9 said that three or four paintings have arrived from Cuba for Amb. Carlos LECHUGA Nevia but that Carga Aerea has not picked them up at the Embassy. L-9 went to Carga Aerea offices and he was told that the Procuraduria has been inspecting all material re Cuba and although they have been shipping they will not go to the Embassy to pick up material. The Cuban Embassy, therefore will make arrangements to send the paintings to the Carga Aerea offices.

The agent wanted to know how FUJOL got into Mexico as there reports indicated he had entered the country illegally etc. L-9 then showed me two summons from the Procuraduria, one for him (L-9) and one for his brother. If L-9 ever finds out his brother is being called a Communist he will probably want to get out of the Embassy as soon as possible. XX Win - let's discuss)

8. L-9 provided copies of May and Revolution dated 14 June 63.

On 11 June 1963, I met LITAMIL-9 at the usual rendezvous point and we drove to outlying area of the city, where mtg was held. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED. Time: 2200-2245.

LITAMIL-9 reported as follows:

1. On 11 June 1963, ^X TELLEZ, fnu (possibly Spaniard) of the FAO called L-9 re the Seminario de Extension Agricola and told him that the Seminario had started but there were no signs of the Cuban delegates. TELLEZ said that he had received a communication from the Cuban Foreign Office asking the FAO to request visas for the Cuban delegates because they were not able to get them. TELLEZ said that the FAO had formally requested the visas for the Cuban delegates.

2. On 11 June '63, ^X ~~Inacio~~ ^{YE} LOPEZ, aka "Lacho", ^{CIT MEXICO} Mexican ^{CCC:} photographer, was at ^{USA} the Embassy with a friend, ~~XXXXXXXX~~ who wants to go to Cuba re moving picture industry. Teresa PROENZA told LOPEZ's friend to write to Jose Antonio PORTUENCO, former Amb in Mexico and he would activate the request in Cuba. L-9 said that LOPEZ, in 59-60, went to Cuba to make a picture for ASCORRAGA but that ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ ASCORRAGA was very unhappy with it because it was purely propaganda. L-9 said that Amb LASSIP at that time told him (L-9) to pick up the picture at the aduana but not to turn it over to LOPEZ. L-9 got the picture and brought it back to the Embassy. After a good deal of hickering LOPEZ was finally able to obtain the picture from the Cuban Embassy. L-9 does not recall the name of the ~~XXXXXXXX~~ picture but is quite certain that LOPEZ was unhappy about the whole thing.

4. ~~Francisco~~ ^{CIT MEXICO RE SUBJ ACTS} told L-9 that Mirta AGUIRRE, Cuban intellectual, became disgusted with the Consejo Nacional de Cultura and left to teach at the Universidad de Habana. PROENZA said this during a conversation with L-9 re advisability of working in Cuba. PROENZA and L-9 both agreed that they would not want to work in Cuba. PROENZA gave L-9 the idea that she might be going to Paris. L-9 believes that Coty SOLERZANO might have brought this word back to PROENZA from Habana.

5. On 11 June 63, Horacio FLORES ^{CIT MEXICO SAID} ~~Sanchez~~ told L-9 that he had arranged to send a Mexican Art exhibit to Cuba. L-9 said that PROENZA had previously reported this. L-9 described FLORES as "un demonio" and has always referred to him as a dangerous anti-U.S. type. ^{REPORTER}

6. PROENZA told L-9 that Ramon SINOAS ^{CIT MEXICO RE SUBJ ACTS} told Coty SOLERZANO that L-9 was doing a terrific job etc. SINOAS has been extremely nice to L-9 since his return from Habana.

7. L-9 said he has noted an obvious coldness on the part of Manuel VERA ^{2-1-33453 CIT CUBA} ~~Sanchez~~, Chief Cuba G-2 in Mexico. ^{RE SUBJ ACTS} He said he hardly says hello. L-9 believes it possible that "Canchita" FERNANDEZ said something to him in Habana re his remark several months ago re L-9's plane ride with ALMO 3's pilot. L-9 said he told FERNANDEZ about this remark when he was in Habana the last time. L-9 plans to approach VERA and if he reacts coldly he will ask him what is bothering him.

On June 63, I met L-9 at the usual rendezvous point in the deserted section of the city where we held meeting. NO PROBLEMS NOTED.

L-9 reported as follows:
CARD ALL RE SUBT ACTS

1. On 5 June 63, L-9 met with Jose Antonio GARCIA ^{X F CIT MEXICO} to purchase art materials for architects in Cuba. L-9 took GARCIA to the Centro ^{X F CIT MEXICO} where they made some purchases. They then went to ^{X F CIT MEXICO} where L-9 met Enrique DOXA ^{X F CIT MEXICO}. CARDOZA gave L-9 a plaza but no intel of interest obtained.
2. L-9 said that AMARA, now a Mexican real estate agent, was at the Embassy on 5 June re a new site for the INCRG. CAMARA, according to L-9, is about 32 years old, well dressed, good looking. As yet L-9 does not know CAMARA's full name. He believes that CAMARA is a friend of Teresa PRONZA P. Thus far L-9, who has been with CAMARA on two occasions, has not heard him discuss AMARA. This is probably Vicente CAMARA ^{X F CIT MEXICO} involved with CAMARA. CAMARA is also trying to get apartments for Antonio GARCIA ^{X F CIT MEXICO} and Jose FERNANDEZ ^{X F CIT MEXICO} Roa. L-9 said he expects to do a good deal of CAMARA because as yet the Cubans have not decided on a new site for the INCRG.
3. L-9 said that Grupo de Estudios scheduled for 0930 on 5 June 63 was cancelled because XXXXXXXX ^{X F CIT MEXICO} XXXXXXXX ^{X F CIT MEXICO} the Commercial XXXXXXXX and instructor did not show up. The group is discussing the book, Geografia Politica (?) by XXXXXXXX, FXU, Soviet writer. SINORAS on 5 June 63 asked that all members of the XXXXXXXX attend a special mtg to be held at the Embassy on XXXXXXXX 1720. L-9 does not know what XXXXXXXX the subject XXXXXXXX will be.
4. L-9 said that XXXXXXXX ^{X F CIT MEXICO} XXXXXXXX ^{X F CIT MEXICO} who returned to Mexico on 4 June XXXXXXXX on 5 June and was profuse in his greetings and XXXXXXXX. L-9 believes that while Hobara, CASILLAR "got the word" XXXXXXXX with Fidel CASTRO etc.
6. L-9 said that XXXXXXXX has been heard re the arrival of the new Inte Joaquin XXXXXXXX Armas.

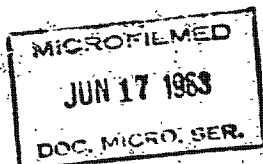

8. Victor TRAPOTE Mateos - This man's most interesting operational access is through his daughter, Irina TRAPOTE de VALDES, who is married to Ramiro VALDES. The prospective fruitfulness of this entree diminishes, however, as the facts are laid on the table. For one thing, though anti-Communist, TRAPOTE is still a friend of Fidel Castro. L-9 said that he sheltered Fidel in his home during Fidel's exile in Mexico. TRAPOTE, who was born in Spain, is about 58 and apparently more interested in his art (sculpturing) than in politics. TRAPOTE apparently has no intention of going to Cuba permanently. L-9 says TRAPOTE has made no comment concerning Ramiro VALDES, but he apparently has suggested that Irina is not getting along well with Ramiro. L-9 described TRAPOTE as of medium height, solidly built, and in good physical condition. His daughter is a tall attractive blonde of about 25, and has a rather retiring personality. L-9 could come up with no means of developing an operation against VALDES through these entrees.

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Attachment A

1. In compliance with DIR-40146, Edward D. Knapman was dispatched to Mexico City from JMWAVE to conduct a debriefing of LITAMIL-9. Knapman arrived here 29 May 1963 and conducted the debriefing at three sessions totaling eight hours on the nights of 29 May, 31 May and 1 June 1963.

2. Attachment B is largely positive intelligence while Attachment C is basically of operational interest. The intelligence debriefing was conducted on the basis of current and past intelligence requirements lists available at the Mexico Station. To the extent feasible we attempted to pinpoint ultimate sources, but headquarters will note that a sizable part of the information provided was based on personal observation and impressions. Headquarters should keep in mind that L-9's perimeter of access was the city of Habana and that he was exposed principally to bureaucrats who are identified with the regime. We caution headquarters on this rather obvious point, perhaps because we were exposed recently to AMKNOCK-1 who has been living deep "in the entrails of the monster" in Oriente and who had a different view of the temper of the people in that area from that given by LITAMIL-9 for Havana.

3. In attachment C are the answers to a series of questions of operational interest which were posed after a thorough review of the LITAMIL-9 operational file. In some cases fuller biographic information can be obtained from L-9 if and when required. L-9 was most cooperative and understood clearly what the debriefer was looking for. In most cases, however, it is not probable that L-9 will be of great help in making operational approaches and pitches because of his present position.

Intelligence

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1. Subject had nothing meaningful to add on disaffections or realignments as a result of the October crisis.
2. With regard to internal friction within the GOC, he said that there is considerable criticism of the "old" Communists by the "new" Communists and 26th of July. He cited the case of Felipe GUERRA Matos' criticism of Joaquin ORDOQUI and Nicolas GUILLEN (previously reported) as cases in point. By and large, the new Communists and Fidelistas are grabbing off most key position in the government bureaucracy. Fidel Castro is still the principal leader of the Revolution and both the PSP and the Soviets know that he is vitally important to them. Source was told by his sister-in-law (Conchita) that Fidel showed some annoyance with Blas Roca one night when he phoned and told Rene VALLEJO to tell that "son of a bitch" (*puta*) to stop bothering him. Conchita also says that Fidel is somewhat annoyed at his old crony Carlos Rafael ROERIGUEZ because the *zafra* is proving to be such a bust and that Fidel has complained that Carlos Rafael frequently doctors INRA statistics to his own advantage. Despite these minor problems with key Communist leaders, Fidel continues on friendly terms with the key members of the PSP, and Blas Roca should be included with Fidel, Raul and Che Guevara among the four most powerful men in Cuba. Source commented that we must understand the myth created by the Revolution and its propaganda in evaluating internal friction and cleavages. Non-communist officials have been either brainwashed by propaganda, are still blindly loyal to Fidel, or else have no place to go. Thus, in the final analysis, the cleavages are superficial and of no great moment.
3. Source had no detail on the formation of the Partido Unico. He commented that the PSP view PURS as an attempt by Fidel Castro to absorb it and that the PSP consequently has been cool to the idea.
4. Subject was questioned on mass organizations in Cuba, but could provide no information worth reporting.
5. Source was questioned on the positions of Lazaro Pena, Lizardo, Ramiro VALDES and Juan MARINELLO. He had little of importance though he commented that Fidel, according to Conchita, did not hold Lazaro PENA in high regard. Source had no information on MARINELLO's reported problems at the University of Habana.
6. We covered the gamut on counter-revolutionary activities and other types of resistance with disappointingly negative results.
7. In the military field (number of Soviet troops, training in both Cuba and the Soviet Union, missile arrivals, hiding of military materiel in caves etc.) source could add nothing to the bolas which can be picked up on Flagler Street in Miami.

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8. Source was questioned about Chicom military activities. He answered that he saw no Chinese, heard no comments about the Chinese and did not get the impression that the Chicoms are significantly active in any field in Cuba.

9. When asked about Cuban confidence in the Soviets, he said that most people he had talked to felt that the Soviets would come to Cuba's defense in case of an American invasion if it happened to suit Soviet interests at the time. He said that to his knowledge Soviet technicians were getting along well with Cubans, but he feels that the Cuban people view the Soviet with detachment socially and have very little to do with them.

10. Source was queried on any comments he had heard concerning a GOC desire for a rapprochement with the United States. He said that he had heard nothing specific, but that he personally felt this was a prospect frequently considered by Castro.

11. In view of Source's excellent sub-source in INRA (Conchita), it had been hoped that he would be able to provide some valuable information on this organization. Actually, he had little to add to Conchita's comments in regard to Fidel's attitude toward Carlos Rafael Rodriguez. We asked for Conchita's evaluation of Carlos Rafael, and received information which has many times been forwarded to headquarters and need not be repeated here. Conchita made no meaningful comments on the effectiveness of Soviet and Satellite technicians assigned to INRA. (See also paragraph 5 of attachment B concerning Fidel Castro which may be of PI interest.)

12. When asked about the principal reasons for industrial difficulties, Source said that he heard universal complaints about the need for spare parts. He could only pinpoint the transport industry. He had no specific information on how some U.S. manufactured spare parts were being received, but commented that Canada might be the source. He could give no specifics and said that all correspondence on these matters is closely held and encoded when cabled. He has had no access to such information.

13. Regarding the rationing system, he said that it is working more smoothly now than a year ago and that grumbling is less now than in the past. He said that things are better organized now and that he saw no desperation because of food or other shortages.

14. Source said that he had heard of no significant increase in diseases, though there was much comment about cases of gastroenteritis.

15. Source had no information whatever on the export of the Cuban Revolution and on the training of revolutionaries from other areas in Cuba.

16. Regarding diplomatic relations with other Latin American countries and Spain, his understanding is that the GOC wants no more breaks and is especially interested in maintaining the tie with Madrid since Spain is the mother country and an airline link to Europe.

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17. With regard to the Civil and Foreign Services, Source said that there is more stability and discipline in both than there was a year ago, with a consequent rise in morale. He said that there is much less free-wheeling on the part of subordinates, but now the chiefs are expected to face up to their responsibilities and the competent must carry the load for the majority who are incompetents. We commented that this was not a phenomenon absent in other public services and tried to flush Source out on the quality, loyalty, and efficiency of the services. He said that loyalty is increasing, quality is circumscribed seriously by insufficient academic preparation and job training and efficiency has increased in the past year because of better discipline and improved administrative practices.

18. Subject had nothing of consequence to add regarding the organization of the Ministry of Foreign Relation and the Foreign Service. This subject will be covered to some extent in the operational attachment to this dispatch. See paragraph 7 of attachment B concerning the rumor that Armando WART will replace Raul ROA at MINREX.

19. Source had little information on the Church. He said that the Catholic Church is not being molested and that relations between it and the GOC have improved. Pope John XXIII was viewed with favor by the GOC. (Note: Batistianos in Miami frequently take the opposite view.)

20. Source had nothing of value on the Ministry of Education, the University of Habana, the literacy program, the establishment of new technical and scientific institutes, the quality of education at secondary and primary levels.

21. Regarding the United States, he feels that there is still a fund of friendship among the Cuban people and admiration of American technology. He said that a few of his friends listen to U.S. broadcasts, but he had nothing to say concerning their comments and the extent to which these broadcasts are having an effect.

22. Regarding the temper of the Cuban people, source does not believe that the ingredients for a revolt exist. He feels that the regime may have more support now than it had a year ago, or, if such is not the case, that people are just more resigned to it.

✓ 1. ^{F/R} Alfredo *GUEVARA - It was noted in L-9's file that he at one time had been in touch with GUEVARA. L-9 described him as a man in his thirties, who had lived in Mexico. He struck L-9 as something of a bluffer, and L-9 understands that he is not well liked. In some respects (political) the writer knew something more about this Cuban Communist movie producer than L-9.

2. Source had nothing new to add on Ramon *CUEENCA, suspected G-2 agent, than is already a matter of record. *Re. CONTACT with Sub. of 201-329609. DTJ JUNE 63*

3. With the prospect of possibly developing source's brother, Alfredo (see 29 below), through their half-sister, source was queried on the latter, but we ceased this line of questioning when the ^{WALTER} latter learned that the child is only 10.

4. Source had met Jose "Pepin" *NARANJO when he came to Mexico with Blas Roca, but he had little of operational interest to add concerning him. He said that NARANJO struck him as wily, sharp, but intellectually quite superficial.

✓ 5. We questioned source concerning Conchita's impressions of Antonio *NUMEZ Jimenez, and Carlos Rafael *RODRIGUEZ, and nothing of value resulted (see attachment B for some comments on the position of the latter). Conchita did have an interesting comment concerning Fidel CASTRO's health. Apparently he has not fully recovered from a rather serious pulmonary illness and she said that he is much less robust than he used to be. (Attention is drawn to this paragraph in Attachment A).

✓ 6. Orlando *SANCHEZ - He is the brother of Celia SANCHEZ, and L-9 believes that he is disaffected with the regime and is anti-Communist. SANCHEZ is about 38, lived for a time in New York (ODURCE traces should therefore be available), and is now in charge of the "Seccion X" store on O'Reilly Street in Habana. His wife, whose name escaped L-9, is an American and probably of Puerto Rican extraction. They have at least one child. L-9 feels that there is very little chance that SANCHEZ is recruitable and he does not believe that he would use Celia for intelligence purposes in any case. As Headquarters knows, L-9 has extended an invitation to SANCHEZ to visit him in Mexico. We could, perhaps, push this, but the chances of successfully recruiting him in Mexico, according to L-9, would be small. L-9 said that a sister of Celia, whom L-9 described as being in her twenties and married to a formerly wealthy man from Oriente whose holdings had been confiscated, was against the regime and was about to leave Cuba for Miami with her husband. L-9 did not know the sister's name.

7. The writer asked L-9 whether he had any contact with Haydee SANTAMARIA or her spouse, Armando *HART Davalos, during his visit, and he said that he had not. He said that it was widely rumored around the Foreign Ministry that Hart might replace Raul ROA. He said that this would really not be a demotion for Roa since he would handle and attend international conferences while Hart administered MINREX.

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✓ 8. Victor *TRAPOTE Mateos - This man's most interesting operational access is through his daughter, Irina *TRAPOTE de VALDES, who is married to Ramiro *VALDES. The prospective fruitfulness of this entree diminishes, however, as the facts are laid on the table. For one thing, though anti-Communist, TRAPOTE is still a friend of Fidel Castro. L-9 said that he sheltered Fidel in his home during Fidel's exile in Mexico. TRAPOTE, who was born in Spain, is about 58 and apparently more interested in his art (sculpturing) than in politics. TRAPOTE apparently has no intention of going to Cuba permanently. L-9 says TRAPOTE has made no comment concerning Ramiro VALDES, but he apparently has suggested that Irina is not getting along well with Ramiro. L-9 described TRAPOTE as of medium height, solidly built, and in good physical condition. His daughter is a tall attractive blonde of about 25, and has a rather retiring personality. L-9 could come up with no means of developing an operation against VALDES through these entrees. RE CONTACT WITH Sub. of 201-329609. DUE JUNE 63

9. Source was asked about the current activities of Faure *CHOMON, and could add nothing to what is already known.

✓ 10. Abraham *MACIQUES - He is about 28, Jewish, has no military title, and was formerly married to an American who has divorced him and returned to the United States. He is now married to a Cuban who gave birth to a child in the Spring of 1963. His parents live in Cardenas, Matanzas, but L-9 could give no other information on them, the former-wife or the present wife. He said that AMLEO-3 would have much fuller basic information on MACIQUES. His sister, Nidia *MACIQUES de Roque, lives in Wooster, Ohio at 1653 Smithville Road. L-9 said that MACIQUES was relieved of his job in the Cienaga de Zapata because people under his direction were assisting anti-Castro elements which have since been liquidated. It is not clear whether MACIQUES knew of these activities, but, in any case, Fidel Castro sacked him. MACIQUES, at the very least, is indifferent to the present regime. He told L-9 that he would leave for the United States if he could get to see Fidel soon about another job. L-9 feels that MACIQUES may be recruitable, but he could propose no approach. It should be noted that MACIQUES' access is limited now (no job) and he may be in disgrace.

✓ 11. Guillermo *LEON Antich - L-9 said he is about 30, has the rank of SCOUT ambassador, and may be G-2, but he had little else to add to our present knowledge of LEON. RE CONTACT WITH Sub. of 201-329609. DUE JUNE 63

12. LIOOZE-1 - L-9 said L-1 is assigned to protocol in the Foreign Ministry and that he spends a good deal of his time at the airport at Rancho Boyeros. L-1 has criticized extremism in the regime, is pro-ROA, apparently strongly dislikes Carlos *OLIVARES and was glad to see him sent out to the field. L-9 gave no further information that is not already a matter of record.

✓ 13. Ramiro *DEL RIO - He is about 28, went about half way through medical school at the University of Habana, is rather short, well-proportioned, and stoops a bit when he walks. He is probably G-2 and is assigned to the Consejo Nacional de Cultura. He is a protegee of the Consejo's directress, Edith *CARCIA Buchaca (see 14 below). L-9 believes DEL RIO is a strong Fidelista and not a recruitment candidate.

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14. Edith GARCIA Buchaca and the Consejo Nacional de Cultura - GARCIA, an old-line Communist, is trying to place Communists and extremists in as many cultural slots as practicable in Cuban embassies. She is 45-47, a light mulatto, about 63-64 inches tall, fairly well proportioned, and an indefatigable worker. The Consejo is now located in the Ayuntamiento de Marianao and has a staff of about 25 at headquarters. L-9 does not know of any clandestine activities in which the Consejo may be engaged and considers it basically a cultural organization. In addition to GARCIA and DEL RIO, L-9 recalls the names of the following personnel: Marta ARAJONA (plastic arts), Maritza ALONSO (recites poetry). He said that the Consejo is interested primarily in fostering art exhibitions, many of which are displayed abroad. He mentioned Aracio VANEAS Arroyo, a Mexican employed by the Consejo, as a contact, but VANEAS appears to be a strong Castro. Vanegas is 30-34, about 65 inches, well-built, married to a Cuban and a good friend of Raul Castro. L-9 could come up with no realistic penetration prospects in the Consejo.

15. Guillermo GUERRA Matos - L-9 had nothing to add to what has already been reported. L-9 does not know GUERRA personally.

16. Petra BALLEGAS de PEDROSO - Her husband, Regino PEDROSO, is a poet of some stature and Cuban Charge in Peking. L-9 does not know whether Regino is a Communist, but he knows that he was at one time arrested for being one. Petra and Regino have no children. She is middleage and is separated from Regino to collect her benefits in Habana as a retired teacher. She is related to the Communist poet, Nicolas GUILLET. L-9 views Regino as a very slippery article and did not have any recommendations concerning an operational approach. In any case, there is no real reason to believe that either Petra or Regino would be susceptible to a pitch.

17. L-9 had nothing to add to what already has been reported concerning AMIEO-3 and his family.

18. He had nothing new on Orlando PANTOJA Tamayo, previously reported to be an inspector for Ramiro Valdes.

19. L-9 was questioned about the BAYO brothers (Armando and Alberto BAYO Coscaya), old man BAYO (Gen. Alberto BAYO Giroud) and General Enrique Lister. The only comments he had to make were that the BAYOs are all believed to be pro-regime and that the old man is of no significance in Cuban affairs. He knew nothing about Lister.

20. The subject of Conchita, which has already been mentioned elsewhere in this debriefing, was discussed at length with L-9. Nothing of operational interest that has not already been reported by the Mexico Station emerged from this discussion. Conchita is still loyal to Fidel and L-9 could suggest no workable operational approach to her.

21. Rene Depestre - Source had no information of use.

22. L-9 was questioned about rumors of Castro penetration of KUBARK that he had heard during his visit, but he could provide no specifics. He gave no information on Cuban intelligence activities that is not already a matter of record.

23. Agustin ^FYASSELLS - Nothing new to add except that L-9 considers this diplomatic courier as quite loyal to the regime.

24. Mercedes ^FLECHUGA - She is about 35, a teacher, single, anti-Communist and lives with her parents on Calle 25, No. 963, Vedado, Habana. She is the sister of Ambassador Lechuga and known personally to L-9, but he does not believe that a pitch would be practicable.

25. Ernesto ^FRODRIGUEZ Cue - He is about 30, married to a Mexican, and believed to be loyal to the regime. Although he is employed in a very worthy target area ("confidenciales" of MINREX), L-9 does not believe him to be recruitable.

26. Felipe ^FROJAS - This employee of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico plans to go to Cuba. L-9 understands that Rojas is going to emigrate to Cuba permanently and does not know what ROJAS plans to do there. L-9 gathers that ROJAS will be paying his own passage. While this at first appeared to be an operational lead, it would seem that it is simply a case of a pro-Castro young man who wants to settle in Cuba.

27. Joaquin ^FHERNANDEZ de Armas, 201-301753 Cit. Cuba cc. D. de INT Ambassador-designate to Mexico - L-9 ^F described him as a man in his forties, but who looks much younger. He is highly thought of in the Cuban Foreign Service, is very intelligent, and believed to be loyal to the regime. L-9 had no information of operational interest on Hernandez. RE CONTACT with Sub of 201-31469. DOL June 63

28. Dolores de la ^FMORA - Source said that she is highly intelligent and rich Mexican, who is now in Cuba, and is close to Fidel Castro and to Luis Alberto ^FCIERGE Fabra, a G-2 officer. L-9 got this information from Conchita second-hand and was not able to provide additional details.

29. Alfredo, L-9's brother - the writer can add nothing to what Station Mexico has already reported on this operational target, and feels that we are barking up the wrong tree if we expect L-9 to approach him. In so doing we would be trying to undermine values which probably transcend L-9's basic anti-Communism. On the other hand, Alfredo is anti-Communist and dissatisfied with the regime, and, while he rejected Growery's pitch, he did so graciously and told L-9 that Growery impressed him favorably. While the writer cannot suggest an approach to Alfredo, it is felt that at this time such attempts as may be made to develop him should be channeled through someone other than his brother.

On 16 May 63, I met LITAMIL-9 at rendezvous point and drove to outlying district of the city where we held meeting. NO SIGNIFICANT PROBLEMS NOTED. Time: 2200-2300.

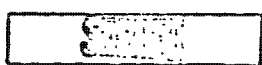

It was he who also told L-9 that he was in contact with Raul REA, i.e. "Baby on contact con REA". L-9 said that on 9 May at the Embassy, FERRER was sick, i.e. red nose, bad breath, etc. L-9 told L-9 to make contact with FERRER and MAZOTTE if possible and give them the info. L-9 said it would be difficult because he has no phone number.

c. BRUS 3617, 30 June 1960, reported that GUERRA was born on 1 May 1927, and was called "Captain";

d. LASB 1798, 6 August 1960, reported that GUERRA was a member of Raul CASTRO's party transiting the Azores enroute to Habana on 29 July 1960;

e. FBIS report, 25 November 1960, termed GUERRA director of the Cuban Sports Department;

f. TDCSDB 3/650,097, 2 May 1962, reported that GUERRA was one of a group of Army officers contacted by Fidel CASTRO about two weeks before the ousting of Anibal ESCALANTE on 25 March 1962; CASTRO asked them to back him up, as he intended to regain full control of the Socialist revolution, and they agreed; despite this the Army leaders had in mind a plan which was to involve the assassination of Fidel, Raul, and Che GUEVARA at a propitious moment and the Army officers were to then take over the government for themselves;

g. [redacted], 18 June 1962, reported that Gustavo ARCOS Bergnes, Cuban Ambassador to Belgium, was the leader of a meeting (which GUERRA attended) in Miramar to plan for the future when the CASTRO brothers were out of power; GUERRA was one of the disaffected members of CASTRO's military staff who had been meeting for eight or nine months in a house in Miramar, Habana;

h. UFG-2598, 26 March 1963, reported that GUERRA was teaching weapons handling daily at La Cabana Fortress in Habana.

3. Abraham MACIQUES

a. OO-E 3/216,515, 1 June 1962, reported that MACIQUES was a favored companion of Fidel CASTRO;

b. SE 80/53, 1 October 1961, reported that MACIQUES was loyal to CASTRO, responsible for tourist facilities in Cienaga de Zapata, 25 years old, not known whether a Communist, and married to a U. S. citizen (whereabouts unknown).

h. There was no pertinent information on Petrona BALLEGAS, wife of Regino PEDROSO Aldama, Cuban Cultural Counselor in Peiping.

On 22 Apr 63, at 2200, LITAMIL-9 called to report his arrival and set up a mtg for 2230 at the usual rendezvous point. The mtg was held from 2230-2400. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED.

L-7 reported the following:

- In his opinion there is no chance of the Cuban Govt falling because of political or economic reasons at the time. L-9 said that the Cuban people will be able to stand the conditions under which they are presently living indefinitely. He said the most pronounced scarcity is that of buses, which hardly present a serious problem in terms of disaster. He said that although food is not plentiful, the people are not starving and will be able to continue to get along. In the political field, L-9 said that there is definitely a rift between the Communist left and CASTRO's 26 July Movement, but again this is not of serious proportions and CASTRO appears to be handling it adeptly. L-9 said that CASTRO dislikes both Lazaro PENA and Blas ROCA intensely and might possibly rid the country of one of the two after the final tally is made on the sugar crop. That is, the rumor is around that CASTRO will take one of the these two as scapegoat for the poor sugar crop. On the other hand, much criticism was heard when CASTRO moved Joquin CERDQUE, Cuban CP leader, ^{added} up in the Government hierarchy. At any rate, L-9 said that through conversations that he had had with many people his conclusions were that "el gobierno de Cuba es salido". 6. L-9 reported that Ernesto RODRIGUEZ Cue, ^{CIT CUBA} formerly assigned in Cuban Emb in Mexico is now working in "confidential" section of the Foreign Office. - 10.01 APR 63

7. L-9 said that on 22 Apr 63, LIOOZE-1 told him that Humberto GARCIA Lara, had not shown up for work recently and was trying to get out of Cuba. LIOOZE-1 said that GARCIA was really "acting up". He told L-9 that GARCIA told him Mexican wife XXXX not to return to Mexico.

8. L-9 reported that Ramiro DEL RIO Perez, ^{CIT CUBA} employed in the Consejo Cultural told him that Teresa PROENZA might be recalled. He criticized her because according to reports she only acted hospitably to her Communist friend. L-9 said that DEL RIO is the mouth piece of Edith GARCIA Lara, who heads up the Consejo. - 10.01 APR 63

9. L-9 said that his brother in Cuba told him that he had been approached in Spain by an American "guy fino" and that he told him that he would be willing to talk with him at any time. L-9 did not push this question and it is understood that his brother meant that he would talk to an American "in the open" but not in terms of clandestine activity. L-9 said that his brother was very "honesto" and would not want to take part in any type of "engano". He said that his brother would be extremely angry if L-9 (L-9) was cooperating with the U.S. clandestinely.

L-9 said that he was pretty sure that AM-1's wife would leave Cuba. He said that Fidel CASTRO was very upset at the time and he felt that AM-1's wife would be "sacrificed" Lara

11. L-9 said he saw Eusebio AZCUE in Habana and AZCUE will probably return to Mexico in about two weeks. L-9 said that LIOOZE-1 was very critical of AZCUE because of some of things he has been doing in Mexico. LIOOZE-1 probably made ref to drinking heavily, independent air, etc. Mariano GARCIA Perez apparently reported to Habana that AZCUE left the Consulate in an awful mess.
12. L-9 said that Raquel, Inu, an Uruguayan who stayed at Eusebio AZCUE's house while waiting for her visa in Mexico was under suspicion after she arrived in Habana. According to Concha FERNANDEZ, Fidel CASTRO, himself, went to visit her to find out where she stood through an interview. FERNANDEZ said that CASTRO returned from his visit to the Uruguayan and assured everyone she was O.K.
13. MAFKAKAMX Conchita FERNANDEZ told L-9 that Fidel CASTRO wanted to know who the SP CPAS were, i.e. father and son who are located in the Cuban Embassy in France and Mexico respectively. CASTRO described them as 2 "extremistas".
14. L-9 reported that while he was in Cuba rumors were flying to the effect that Armando HART, present Minister of Education was in line to relieve Paul RCA as Minister of Foreign Affairs. The rumors also indicated that Eusebio XIMENES VALMERA was to replace Paul CASTRO as Chief of the Armed Forces. CUBA, APR 63
15. L-9 reported that Russians were frequently seen riding around the city in trucks, wearing plaid sport shirts.
16. L-9 said that about 3 weeks ago, Juanita CASTRO was the protagonist in a big scandal at Varadero Beach. According to the reports, Juanita CASTRO opened a package of American cigarettes at the beach and she was approached by the authorities to tell her that the smoking of AMERICAN cigs was prohibited. She blew her top and there was quite a scene.
17. L-9 reported that Benny MORE, the famous Cuban musician died about 3 weeks or so ago.

(AIRLINE Airlists show both may arrived in Cuba on 5 May 63, PEDROSA with Special ~~ARRUNDO~~ ^{ARRUNDO} (number 63/253.) Gilberto BOSQUES, Mexican Amb in Habana. ~~ARRUNDO~~ ^{ARRUNDO} SUAREZ left Mexico for Habana on 3 May 1963. She arrived in Mexico on the same flight as the LFCMUGAS and has been living at the Cuban Embassy.

4. I-9 queried Teresa PROENZA re the problems in Haiti and the Don Reg asking whether she thought the crisis would affect Cuba. PROENZA very confident, said that the crisis would not affect Cuba.

On 24 Apr 63, I picked up LITAMIL-9 at rendezvous point and took him to my house where we talked from 2230 until 2400. NO SECURITY PROBLEMS NOTED.

See LEXI cables dated 25 Apr re L-9 info on MACIQUES other ops leads, LI OZE-1, Spare parts shop etc.

In addition to the above, L-9 provided the following information:

1. Abraham MACIQUES, Cuban, is divorced from his American wife, who is now in the U.S. with their children. MACIQUES is married again and ~~YAK~~ his wife gave birth to a child recently.
2. LITAMIL-9 said that he had a long talk with Enrique DE LA OSA, editor of Bohemia and DE LA OSA is very pleased with the recent turn in events in the U.S. re Cuba. It was DE LA OSA who told L-9 that Fidel CASTRO was very please by Cartier Professor in RE INFO GIVEN BY SUBJ TO LITAMIL-9 - CUBA, APR 63 a few months ago. CUBA?
3. L-9 said that he heard several people mention that Fidel CASTRO had penetrations of KHE KUBARK. He was not able to give any details on these reports but cited the case of AK-3 as an example of this.
4. L-9 said that on several occasions he saw a Czech or Soviet "jeep-like" truck out in front, or rather near, AK-3's house. The vehicle had an aerial on the front and heavy canvas covering ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ the back part. L-9 said the vehicle would remain for several hours in the same place, be driven rapidly off and then return to take up station again. L-9 said that when the children in the area asked the purpose of the truck they were told that it was being used for studies of the San Antonio de los Baños Airforce base. (Do you have photos of Sov trucks sent down by HQ's re radio detection etc? I would like to know them to L-9 for possible iden.)
5. On 24 Apr 63, while at the INURO, Teresa PROJEVA told L-9 that he had a very important appointment on 25 Apr with the Amb and Pres DOPEL Mateos. L-9 believes this to be significant because his rank does not put him in this category, i.e. being with ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~
6. L-9 said that he met VENECAS, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ (probably Ambassador) in Habana and had him over to dinner one night with his father (L-9's) and himself.

7. L-9 said that in his opinion the presence of Soviets in Havana is not influencing the Cuban "ambiente". He said, in fact, the presence of Americans, in previous years, was more noticeable ~~XXXXXX~~ than the Soviets today. L-9 said: "No se ve afecto ni desafecto, una indiferencia" re the Soviets.

8. ²⁰¹⁻²²⁻¹¹⁴ L-9 reported that (Dr.) ~~XXXXXX~~ ^{YASFA} now in Cuba has criticized the Cuban regime calling it "muy mediocre" and is planning to leave for Puerto Rico in the near future. L-9 received this info from ~~XXXXXX~~ AZCUE. AZCUE also told L-9 that ~~XXXXXX~~ ^{YASFA} phone tapped by Cuban Govt.

9. L-9 said that while in Habana he "bumped into" Agustin YASSELES, Cuban courier, and asked him about the Bolivian plane crash in which two Cuban couriers were killed. YASSELES told L-9 that ~~XXXXXX~~ "sabstare"

10. L-9 went to the "wake" of Roberto MOLEN, Cuban courier, who was killed in the crash in Bolivia and was approached by MOLEN's brother, who oddly enough had attended the party that L-9 ~~XXXXXX~~ threw for Mercedes LECHUGA at his apartment. I recall L-9 showed me a photo of the group and cited the negro as a Cuban "in town" so he invited him to the ~~XXXX~~ party.

11. On 23 Apr 63, Teresa PROENZA told L-9 that she knew he would return to Mexico because when she was in Habana she heard that someone higher than ROA was very pleased with L-9's handling of Juanita CASTRO and her sister re scandal at the Embassy. It is L-9's opinion that Fidel CASTRO took this incident very seriously and he attributes the recall of Heberto JORPE, who according to L-9 will not return, the CONDES and others to this incident. It is L-9's opinion that no one involved in the scandal will remain in Mexico. L-9 said that Manuel VECA Perez is also scheduled to leave Mexico for good. L-9 said that Raul ROA asked him to give a first hand detailed account of what happened at the Embassy ~~XXXXXX~~ re Juanita CASTRO et al.

LITAMIL-9 reported as follows:

1. On 29 January 1963, ^(Dr) ~~Jaimo~~ ^{CIT MEXICO} ~~WOOLRICH~~ went to the Cuban Embassy to discuss travel to Havana re 10th Medical Congress. WOOLRICH, who will be using a Special Passport told L-9 that he had been to Tijuana recently and crossed the border, visiting San Diego. WOOLRICH gave his address as Condominio Insurgentes, Insurgentes Sur 300 -603, ^{L.A. 63} ~~NEW CITY~~ ^{MEXICO} LITAMIL-9 said that WOOLRICH was shrewd and "sneaky", he did not like his attitude. He appeared to be a person of "confidence", i.e. of the Cuban Embassy. WOOLRICH said he had a Cuban visa. WOOLRICH showed L-9 a letter which he received from Havana several months ago because according to WOOLRICH the meeting was scheduled for the end of last year. WOOLRICH pointed out that the paper was outdated and suggested that it be returned to Havana and a new one sent to WOOLRICH. The letter provided spaces to fill in by WOOLRICH of the doctors who would be going. WOOLRICH told L-9 that he had about five in mind, that some of those who were going have changed their minds. WOOLRICH said that Dr. Clemente ROBLES was now vacillating and he did not know whether he was going to go. L-9 told WOOLRICH he would send the letter soonest and get a new one for WOOLRICH to fill in. The Congress will take place between 17-24 February 1963. L-9 took WOOLRICH to see Maricarmen OLIBARRI re visas and left him there. WOOLRICH, however, will be back to see L-9 on 30 Jan 63. PROENZA turned this case over to L-9.
