I bave zeat ani uncersturd tie propisicns of the espionege lawe of our governnent ard I an aware that unauthorized disclosure of clessified informatir relating to the national defense may subject ne to prosecution for violation of such lass, shether such disclosure be made anile I am essociated with the Crganizatios or at any tire tnereaiter.
3. In adsition, nowerer, as I an undertakirg a position of trust, I have a reapensibility to the irganizaiion not to disclose an classified information relating to the Organization without uroner authorization. I uniertake, therefore, sot to disciss with or disclose to any person not authorized to hear it frca information relating to the Oramization, its activities, or to intelligenca raterial under the control of the Crganization. I further understand that this indertaking is a condition of me association with the Organization, tnat its siolation raj subject ra to irmediate lifsissal for cause or to otner apmopriate disciplinary action, anI that this undertaking athall be equally binding upon me after my association with the Organization as during it.
4. I understa:d that the burder is upon me to ascertain whether or not information is classiried and if so, who is autiorized to receive it, and, therefore, I illl oitain the decision of autiorized oi"icials of the Organizazi. \(y_{4}\) on these points prior to disclosing information relating to the Organizetion, and failure to obtain such a decision will be crounds for my dismissal.

One of the most violent reactions came from the heartland of capitalism, from the small American faction wisc: produce the monthly Hammer \& Steel Newsletter in Boston. Tine October issue of the mimeographed bulletin vengefully give a list of eight reasons why Khrushchev loll - mach one a yindictive crow of triumph, and many attacking not only Thrushcher but basic Soviet policies such as "the distortion of peaceful coexistence. Points 2, 3 and 8 mill serve as illustratione:
2. "His German policy -- Khrushchev sought to ingratiate himself with West Germany. He was obviously ready to sell out the German Democratic Republic...
3. The declining influence of the CPSU among the Socialiss countries and the Communist Parties. The proposed Moscow gathering was shaping up as a conference of only those Party leaders ready to openly serve U.S. imperialist aggression against the national liboration struggles. For example, Asian supporters of Khrushchev could have gathered in a telephone booth.
8. The nuclear success of People's China. Khrushchev had maintained that nuclear power was the exclusive
responsibility of revisionists andimperialiots
of white nations. Khrushchev is great power chauvin-
ism was blown sky high in Sinkiang Province.

Although there is no evidence that the politically insigmilicant Hammer \& Steel group enjoys any direct support from the Chinese (as the Russians alleged in their "Open Letter"
of July 14, 1963), it has always offered its allegiance to Peking in the most extreme form. This is expressed again i: the claim that "Khrushchev's failure to recognize the contradiction between the oppressed peoples and imperialism as the focal contradiction of our time resulted in blindness concernlng the leading role of the Chine ge Party. "8 Fins \(2 \mathrm{~s}^{8}\) a calm that the Chinese themselves would not want to ware, oxpecialy at this juncture.
