THE MAY DEMONSTRATIONS. THE NCAVRR DID NOT AGREE TO THIS ARRANGEMENT. LAFFERTY AGREED TO RAISE THE NCAVRR REQUEST FOR CO-SPONSORSHIP WITH THE NPAC STEERING COMMITTEE, HOWEVER, NCAVRR LEADERS DO NOT THINK THE NPAC WILL AGREE TO CANCEL THE APRIL TWENTY FOUR DEMONSTRATIONS.

ACCORDING TO A SOURCE, WHO HAS FURNISHED RELIABLE INFORMATION IN THE PAST, RON YOUNG, WHO HAS BEEN ACTIVE IN THE ANTIWAR MOVEMENT, AND SIDNEY PECK WILL BE THE TWO KEY FIGURES OF THE NCAWRR. THERE ARE TO BE SEVEN CO-CHAIRMEN OF THE CONTINUATIONS COMMITTEE. THESE WILL INCLUDE BRADFORD LITTLE, OF THE COMMITTEE FOR NONVIOLENT ACTION; RENNIE DAVIS; RICHARD FERNANDEZ, THE LEADER OF CLERGY AND LAYMEN CONCERNED ABOUT VIETNAM; AN SCLC REPRESENTATIVE; AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE NATIONAL WELFARE RIGHTS ORGANIZATION.

IT WAS ALSO DECIDED TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE NCAWRR TO THE "PEOPLE'S COALITION FOR PEACE AND JUSTICE." THE NEXT MEETING OF THE CONTINUATIONS COMMITTEE WILL BE HELD AT WASHINGTON, D.C., FEBRUARY TWENTY SEVEN - TWENTY EIGHT NEXT.
