By letter dated May 20, 1948, Mr. Peyton Ford, the Assistant to the Attorney General, furnished Assistant Secretary of State John E. Pearifoy.

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information in the files of this Bureau concerning [REDACTED] Mr. Peurifoy was requested to advise whether he desired a loyalty investigation regarding [REDACTED] By letter dated June 5, 1948, Assistant Secretary of State John E. Peurifoy advised Mr. Peyton Ford that virtually all of the information in his letter was in the possession of the Department of State at the time of [REDACTED] appointment and that a review of his full record convinced the Department of State of his loyalty to the United States. On April 8, 1949, the Loyalty Form submitted by the State Department on [REDACTED] was returned to the Civil Service Commission with the following notation on the reverse side thereof:

"Information concerning [REDACTED] contained in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation was furnished to the Department of State by the Department of Justice by letter dated May 20, 1948.

No additional information concerning employee appears in the files of this Bureau and in the absence of a specific request from the employing agency, no investigation will be conducted pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 9835."

The Honorable Seth W. Richardson and Mr. James E. Hatcher of the Civil Service Commission were notified by letter dated May 5, 1950, that a full field loyalty investigation had been instituted concerning [REDACTED] pursuant to a request of the Department of Justice after consultation with the Department of State. The results of this investigation will be furnished to the Civil Service Commission promptly upon its completion.

On July 18, 1947, a letter was addressed to the Honorable John E. Peurifoy, Assistant Secretary of State, in response to a request from the State Department for an investigation of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

A full field investigation was conducted under the provisions of Executive Order 9835 concerning [REDACTED] as an applicant for the War Department. Reports reflecting the results of this investigation were furnished to Mr. James E. Hatcher, Chief, Investigations Division, United States Civil Service Commission by letter dated April 19, 1948, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit #2. By letter dated May 4, 1950, the Honorable Seth W. Richardson, Loyalty Review Board, United States Civil Service Commission was advised that a supplemental investigation was being conducted

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under the provisions of Executive Order 9835. [REDACTED]

No independent investigation of [REDACTED] has been conducted by the FBI, nor is there any indication that copies of reports or memoranda on this individual have been furnished to the Department of State.

According to information provided by the State Department, this individual resigned from the State Department on March 5, 1948. A recent check of the records of the United States Civil Service Commission fails to indicate that she has been subsequently employed in the Executive Branch of the Federal Government. (Employment Chart of 81 individuals named by Senator McCarthy received from State Department March 24, 1950; Tel from WFO, 3/30/50, "Department of State-Allegations By Senator Joseph McCarthy, LGE.")

A full field investigation under the provisions of Executive Order 9835 was initiated May 28, 1948, concerning [REDACTED] as an employe of the Department of State. By letter dated June 11, 1948, the Civil Service Commission was advised that information had been received indicating that [REDACTED] had resigned from the State Department as of the close of business April 16, 1948 and that in view of this information no further investigation of [REDACTED] was being conducted by this Bureau. A photostatic copy of the letter of June 11, 1948, is attached as Exhibit #3. According to information recently received by the FBI from the Department of State, [REDACTED] is not presently employed by that agency, and a recent check of the records of the Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., failed to indicate that [REDACTED] is employed in the Executive Branch of the government.

By letter dated April 21, 1950, the Honorable Seth W. Richardson was furnished with information relative to [REDACTED]

In addition to the above, information relative to [REDACTED] was furnished to a representative of the State Department on January 4, 1950.

By letters dated August 25, 1947 and February 21, 1948, Mr. Jack B. Neal, Chief, Division of Foreign Activity Correlation, State Department, Washington, D. C., was furnished with information relative to [REDACTED]. On December 20, 1945, a memorandum captioned [REDACTED] was furnished to the State Department.

Additional information concerning this individual was furnished to the Honorable Seth W. On February 18, 1948, a letter was addressed to the Honorable John E. Psurifoy, Assistant Secretary of State for Administration concerning the availability of the State Department file regarding [REDACTED] for review by FBI agents in connection with the Loyalty investigation being conducted concerning her. The Attorney General's instructions concerning the jurisdiction of the FBI in Loyalty investigations was brought to the attention of the State Department in this letter. On February 24, 1948, a letter was addressed to Mr. Hamilton Robinson, Director, Office of Controls, Department of State, concerning the availability of the State Department's file regarding [REDACTED] and the procedures under Executive Order 9835 for notifying the State Department when an investigation under the Loyalty Order is instituted by the FBI.

No independent investigation of [REDACTED] has been conducted by the FBI nor is there any indication that any reports or memoranda on this individual have been furnished to the State Department. According to information provided by the Department of State, this individual resigned from the State Department on February 11, 1948. A recent check of the records of the Civil Service Commission fails to indicate that [REDACTED] has been employed in the Executive Branch of the Federal Government since her resignation from the State Department. By letter dated June 3, 1948, Mr. James E. Hatcher, Chief, Investigations Division, U. S. Civil Service Commission, was advised that a loyalty investigation had been initiated concerning [REDACTED] as an employee of the Department of Commerce. By letter dated June 11, 1948, Mr. James E. Hatcher was advised that [REDACTED] had resigned her position with the Department of Commerce on March 12, 1948, and was no longer an employee of the Federal Government, and that in view of this information no further investigation was being conducted under the Loyalty Program. A photostatic copy of this letter of June 11, 1948, is attached as Exhibit # 9. By letter dated April 17, 1950, the Honorable Seth W. Richardson, Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, was furnished with a summary of information concerning this individual appearing in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. b7c

A letter was directed to Mr. James T. By letter dated April 15, 1948, addressed to Mr. Hamilton Robinson, Director, Office of Controls, Department of State, the State Department was requested to conduct the necessary loyalty investigation regarding [REDACTED]. By letter addressed to Mr. James E. Hatcher, Civil Service Commission, dated October 1, 1948, the Civil Service Commission was advised that the State Department had advised the FBI by letter of September 23, 1948, that [REDACTED] had terminated his position with the Foreign Service of the State Department and that, therefore, the State Department was discontinuing the requested investigation of [REDACTED]. Additional information concerning [REDACTED] was furnished to the Honorable Seth W. Richardson, Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, by letter dated April 20, 1950.

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Prior to the issuance of Executive Order 9835, the State Department on April 2, 1942, was furnished with a copy of the report of Special Agent [redacted] Chicago, Illinois, dated September 18, 1941, and a copy of the report of Special Agent [redacted] Chicago, Illinois, dated January 24, 1942, both captioned [redacted] Internal Security - C. It is noted that a copy of Special Agent [redacted] report, referred to above, also was furnished to the State Department on October 10, 1947. On May 21, 1942, Mr. Crane of the State Department was orally furnished with information provided to the Chicago Office of the FBI by [redacted]

A full field investigation concerning [redacted] was conducted by this Bureau under the provisions of Executive Order 9835 as an employee of the Department of the Air Force. Copies of the reports setting forth the results of this investigation were furnished to Mr. James E. Hatcher, Chief, Investigations Division, U. S. Civil Service Commission, by letter dated March 3, 1949, a photostatic copy of which is attached as Exhibit #11. By letter dated May 11, 1949, addressed to Mr. James E. Hatcher, information voluntarily given to this Bureau by [redacted] on April 27, 1949, was furnished to the Civil Service Commission. On May 13, 1949, the Civil Service Commission was furnished with a copy of a report setting forth the results of foreign investigation by the Department of the Air Force. On June 3, 1949, three additional copies of this report were sent to Mr. James E. Hatcher of the Civil Service Commission. According to information received by this Bureau from the State Department, [REDACTED] resigned from that agency on December 13, 1946, and a recent check of the records of the Civil Service Commission fails to reflect any employment of [REDACTED] in the Executive Branch of the Government subsequent to his termination with the Department of State. [REDACTED] was investigated by this Bureau in 1944 and 1945 under the provisions of the Hatch Act, and the following reports were furnished to the Department of State on the dates indicated, under the caption of "[REDACTED] - Hatch Act," reflecting the results of this investigations:

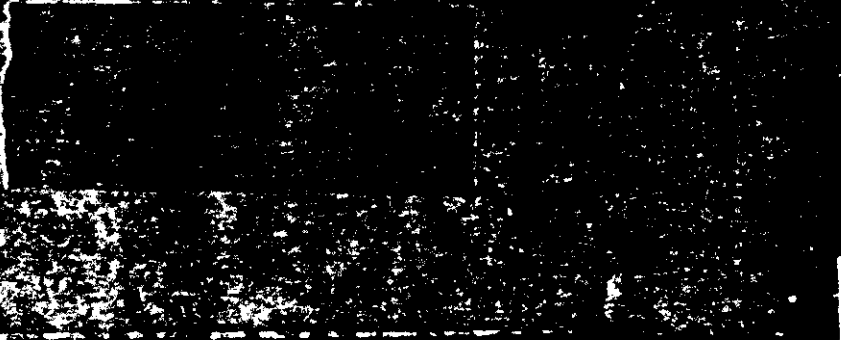
