On August 29, 1950, [REDACTED] Bookkeeping Department of the Franklin Square National Bank advised that his records showed that THOMAS J. LONG had an account at the bank since 6/23/48. His business address was shown as 123 Schermerhorn St., Brooklyn, N.Y. The record showed that one JOHN P. DESMOND was also entitled to sign Long's checks.

[REDACTED] of Consulting Credit Department, of [REDACTED] stated that in October 1946, Thomas J. Long [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] his business in 1946 was called the LONG STWARD INC., 123 Schermerhorn St., Thos. J. Long Pres., Mrs. ELIZABETH P. LONG, Vice President and JOHN P. DESMOND, Sec. Treas.

LONG'S business according to the report is to blue print specifications of plastic items for sale to manufacturers.

Long's accountant in March 1948 was H.J. and M.H. BERMAN CO. 535 5th Ave., N.Y. 17, N.Y. [REDACTED]

MEMORANDUM

Reference memo of SA CLARY L. NEWTON, 8/8/50.

Lt. THOMAS ROSSI, in charge of Security at the Grumman Aviation Corp. plant, Bethpage, N.Y. was interviewed on 9/5/50. He stated about three weeks ago, JOSEPH ELTMAN of 68 DeMille Ave., Elmont, N.Y. who is employed at the plant in Plant #1, clock number 2030 had come into his office and told him that he had worked for Julius Rosenberg and David Greenglass. He told ROSSI that he did not know they were mixed up in any espionage activity and that the first he knew about it was when he read it in the paper. He pointed out that he was a Catholic and had no sympathy for that sort of activity. This information was furnished to SA KENNETH R. ROUNTON who in turn set this information out in a memorandum.

JOSEPH ELTMAN was interviewed by the writer at the Grumman plant. He stated that in 46 and 1947 he had operated a machine shop at 390 E Houston St., N.Y.C. known as the Dale Machine Co. He stated that he operated this plant for about one year. He stated that about $\frac{1}{2}$ block away on E 2nd St., Greenglass and Rosenberg operated a firm known as G & R Engineering Co. ELTMAN stated that he took a job with G & R Engineering Co as a foreman for several months in 1947. He then stated that Greenglass and Rosenberg took in a new partner in the business and changed their name to the Pitt Machine Prod Corp at which time they moved to the E Houston St., N.Y.C. address. He could not recall the name of the new partner but stated that this partner owned the building at E Houston St., where the Pitt Machine Co was located.

ELTMAN stated that he left this firm early in 1948 because business was bad and they were unable to pay him enough salary.

ELTMAN stated that he knew Mr. and Mrs. ROSENBERG and Mr. and Mrs. DAVID GREENGLASS AS WELL AS FERNAND GREENGLASS. He identified their photographs. He stated that he and his wife and Mr. and Mrs. Rosenberg and Mr. and Mrs. Greenglass had had dinner together on two occasions. One instance was after an employees wedding and they had had dinner at a chinese restaurant on Canal St., N.Y.C.

The other instance when he had dinner with them, the wives were not present. He stated that this occasion had been when Greenglass and Rosenberg had their business on 2nd St. They had had a terrific fight over the business, the details he did not recall. ELTMAN stated that he acted as mediator and brought the two men together again. He stated that the four men, himself, ROSENBERG, DAVID GREENGLASS and Bernhard GREENGLASS had had dinner on this occasion at a French Restuarant in N.Y.C. and afterwards had gone to the Roxie.

ELTMAN stated that he had known nothing of a derogatory nature as to ROSENBERG. He stated ROSENBERG impressed him as being a "regular guy". He pointed out that Rosenberg never seemed to have any great amounts of money as he would often toss Rosenberg for drinks. ROSENBERG never told him much about himself except that he had once worked for the Emerson Radio people and had traveled on the East Coast for them. Rosenberg had often told him how much he had liked this work and would like to get back with the Emerson people.

Photographs identified by ELTMAN were Mr. and Mrs. JULIUS ROSENBERG, Mr. DAVID GREENGLASS, Mrs. ETHEL GREENGLASS, JOEL BARR.

He stated that there were other people that he had known in and about the plant.

As to JOEL BARR, Eltman stated that he was in the shop quite often. The last time he had seen BARR he recalled that Barr was nearly bald. He stated that Barr would come into the shop every day for a week and then they would not see him for a while. He stated the last time he saw BARR was just before he went to Holland where he planned to attend some college or University. ELTMAN stated that BARR was an Electrical Engineer and he believed that he had been a classmate of Rosenberg. He stated that ROSENBERG and Barr were close friends.

ELTMAN further stated that only ^{RUTH} ETHEL GREENGLASS and DAVID GREENGLASS had been in his home when he lived in an apartment at 9354 Queens Blvd., Rego Park, N.Y. He stated that while he was employed by Rosenberg, he had had a appendicitis operation and been out sick for three weeks. He stated that the company paid him for this time and his wife decided to invite the Rosenbergs and the Greenglasses to dinner. He stated that only the Greenglasses could come. ELTMAN stated that he had known that GREENGLASS had worked at Los Alamos as when something was done in the plant he would often state how things were done at Los Alamos. He stated that Ethel Green glass would often come to the plant with her baby.

Another individual ELTMAN recalled at the plant was an elderly man named STETNER. This man was about 58 years of age, 6 feet tall, 210 lbs, heavy Jewish accent. He seemed to know ROSENBERG and Greenglass very well. He stated that this man was working on a sewing machine which he was trying to de elop that did not have a bobbin. STETNER had stated that he had a shop ina store on the East Side, N.Y. ELTMAN stated that he must have had a drill press and tools at this place. He further stated that STETNER was an electrical engineer and seemed like a capable man. He recalled that Stetner was a high officer in the Knights of Pythias. ELTMAN stated that STETNER must have been a close friend of Rosenberg and Greenglass otherwise they would not have allowed him to come in to the shop to work as he did.

Another individual that used to visit the shop quite often was a man 5'10", 180 lbs, 30 to 35 years of age, brown wavy hair, wore light plastic rimmed glasses. He could not recall this man's name. he stated that he had a shop in Woodside, N.Y. where he made magnetic novelties. This man used to work for the government. He knew that this man had purchased property in Tenafly, New Jersey and was building himself a house there. The individual was Jewish.

Another friend of Rosenberg was a Jewish individual about 30 years of age. He had a place at Willoughby St., Brooklyn, N.Y. The exact place he did not know but he thought it was in the same building with the Pilot radio. He recalled having seen a color television on the same floor that this man was located on. He further recalled that this man did coil winding of some kind.

Two other individuals known to Rosenberg were men named GORDON and SEINBERG in the sewing machine district in N.Y.C. He believed that these men were friends of GREENGLASSES uncle. He believed the firm was the GORDON SEWING MACHINE CO. on the West side, N.Y.C. This firm was trying to build up a huge supply of sewing machine parts so that they could compete with the supply houses. This firm used to give the Pitt Machine Co. huge orders for parts.

Another individual known to ELTMAN was a classmate of Rosenberg but Eltman could not recall the name. This man was a foreman in a plant that made luggage and traveling cases for salesmen. This man had a very odd name and his shop was located on 13th St., N.Y.C. He thought that this business was Universal Luggage or some similar name. He stated that this man was 35 years of age 5' 8", Jewish, stocky build, 180 to 190 lbs., bald spot, black hair.

ELTMAN stated that he has worked as a Tool and Die maker at Grumman since October 1948. He stated that he had known nothing about any of these individuals that would arouse his suspicion as to their espionage activities.

The following investigation was conducted on
6/29,31; 9/1,6/50.

Webber Beach Colony, Inc. has been operated
for the past two years by Benjamin Haskell and his wife Lillian.

Neither Haskell nor his wife could recall having
received any communication from Julius Rosenberg. Haskell pointed
out that the season opens on July 4th and that he had no guests
prior to that time.

Photographs of Rosenberg and his associates were
displayed to both Mr. and Mrs. Haskell. They advised that none
of these people had been guests at Webber Beach. They were also
unable to recognize the names of those whose photographs were dis-
played. Haskell checked his register and stated that none of these
appeared therein.

Haskell's daughter, Mrs. Rose Jackerson, who assists
her parents in operating the colony also reviewed the photographs
of Rosenberg and his associates. She was unable to identify any
as guests at Webber Beach but was of the opinion that she had seen
Ruth Greenglass and also Alfred Sarant. She could furnish no more
positive information and did not recognize the names of either
Greenglass or Sarant.



Reference Cleveland teletype dated August 31, 1950, at 10:19 A.M.

Assistant United States Attorney MYLES J. LANE, Southern District of New York, confidentially advised that he questioned MICHAEL and ANNE SILOROVICH concerning the identity of the person who accompanied them at the time of their purchase of the PFLUGER automobile. He advised further that both MICHAEL and ANNE stated that they were alone on the date they approached Mr. PFLUGER concerning his automobile and specifically denied that WILLIAM PERL accompanied them. Both failed to identify a photograph of PERL and stated that they knew of no one by that name. Mr. LANE also stated that both SILOROVICHES said they went to the PFLUGER home by public transportation and specifically denied riding in an automobile driven by PERL on that date.

Mr. LANE further advised that PERL stated that he did not know JULIUS ROSENBERG and failed to identify a photograph of ROSENBERG. He later stated that he realized he went through City College at the same time ROSENBERG attended that institution, but could not recall any possible meetings with him. He stated that he definitely had not had any association whatsoever with ROSENBERG since leaving City College. PERL further denied that he had any acquaintance or association with ETHEL ROSENBERG.

The above source also advised that PERL denied recollection of attendance at any parties in Greenwich or Knickerbocker Village which was also attended by ROSENBERG and stated that he did not have any specific recollection of attendance at any such party in company with Mr. or Mrs. ELITCHER.

In compliance with Cleveland's request contained in referenced teletype, former members of PERL'S class at the College of the City of New York are being interviewed by this office concerning the degree of relationship between ROSENBERG and PERL.

JOSEPH PAUL BLUM, PERL'S brother-in-law, advised SAs (A) EDWARD J. CAHILL and HAROLD F. GOOD that he has never met JULIUS ROSENBERG and could not explain the fact that the business card of the Mechanical Heating Corporation with which BLUM was associated had been found in the possession of JULIUS ROSENBERG at the time of the latter's arrest.

BLUM stated that he was born on March 27, 1906 at Mannheim, Germany. He entered the United States in 1928 and was naturalized in the Southern District of New York on July 13, 1933. He attended public school in Mannheim for about one year during the years 1912 and 1913. For five years he attended high school in Nuremberg. At Essen, Germany, he attended a technical college for about two years, graduating in 1926 when he received a Mechanical Engineering Degree. In the United States, he attended a public school in New York City for a few months principally to acquire the knowledge of the English language. He attended Fordham evening high school which is located in the Theodore Roosevelt High School on Fordham Road in the Bronx during 1928 and 1929. For about three years, he attended evening sessions at College of the City of New York taking a post graduate engineering course, which he completed in the above period. He also attended the evening session of the New York University for about two years studying engineering. In 1933, he completed a one year course at the Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, Brooklyn, New York.

For approximately six weeks in 1928, BLUM was employed by the Cascade Laundry, Myrtle Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; for approximately 1 1/2 years during 1928 and 1929 BLUM was employed by S. L. Potter Machine and Tool Works located at 129th or 130th Street and Park Avenue, New York City; and from 1929 to 1933 or 1934 and for a few months in 1936 he was employed by Albert Fentzloff Incorporated, Consulting Engineers, which at that time was located at 11 West 42nd Street, but is now believed to be located at 111 Broadway, New York City.

For approximately two years, 1934 and 1935, he was employed by the NPA at the Brooklyn Navy Yard and at the Merchant Marine Academy, Fort Schuyler, Bronx, New York.

From 1937 to December, 1945, BLUM was employed by the Board of

Education, New York City, Bureau of Construction, 49 Flatbush Avenue Extension, Brooklyn, New York. He resigned from this employment to go with the Mechanical Heating Corporation. From 1945 to December, 1947, BLUM was employed by the above firm at 2514 Third Avenue, Bronx, New York. The principal stockholder of this corporation was a Mr. HARRY SINGER who transferred a small portion of the stock to BLUM thereby making him a principal in the corporation. BLUM was employed about six weeks during 1947 by the Soling Corporation at which time it was located at 43rd Street, New York City, but is now located in Long Island City. Since 1947 BLUM has been employed by the Kulan Plumbing Company, Incorporated, 25-09 42nd Road, Long Island City, New York, where he is a Chief Engineer and Estimator.

BLUM currently resides at 79-23 209th Street, Flushing, New York, Telephone HOllis 4-3333. He has resided at this address with his wife since 1940.

During the above interview, photographs of JOEL BARR, MORTON SOBELL, ABE SILVERSTEIN, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ALFRED SARANT, WILLIAM PERL, MAX and McLEAVE FLITCHER, DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS and MICHAEL SIDOROVICH were exhibited to BLUM. The only picture he recognized was that of Mrs. BLUM'S brother WILLIAM PERL. At this point, Mr. BLUM was asked whether or not he was a salesman at the time he was employed by the Mechanical Heating Corporation. He stated that he was an Engineer and Estimator and did a very limited amount of soliciting of new business. He was asked whether or not that would mean that his business cards would have been distributed in a limited manner. BLUM stated that there were very few occasions on which he had to give his business cards to anyone. He was then shown the photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG again and also the photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS. He again repeated that he could not recognize either of these two men. BLUM was then asked if he could explain how his business card could have been in the possession of JULIUS ROSENBERG at the time of ROSENBERG'S arrest. He indicated that he was completely taken by surprise and conjectured that he may have given his business cards to his father-in-law, to his brother-in-law WILLIAM PERL or maybe to some friends inasmuch as he was looking for business, but stated that he could not specifically recall ever giving cards out to these individuals or to anyone else for that purpose.

During the course of the remainder of the interview, this subject was brought up from time to time, and Mr. BLUM could not explain how his business card came into the possession of JULIUS ROSENBERG. He estimated that there were about 1000 business cards printed for him by the Mechanical

Attempts to reinterview HENRIETTA SWIDGE, PERL'S ex common-law wife concerning the location where she and PERL spent their vacation in June of 1944, have been negative to date. It is anticipated that this interview will be conducted in the immediate future.



Reference is made to the memorandum of SA REX L. SCHROEDER dated September 6, 1950 at New York.

The following investigation was conducted by SA's DANIEL O'CONNOR and WALTER P. GAVIN on September 8 and 9, 1950:

Mr. IRVING MAURICE AFFIAS, residence 3339 Hill Avenue, Bronx, 67, New York, who is a partner of the Neptune Electronics Company, 433 Broadway, New York, advised that he knew MORTON SOBELL since they attended Stuyvesant High School and the City College of New York (CCNY) together. Mr. AFFIAS stated that he had no association whatsoever with SOBELL outside of school.

Mr. AFFIAS stated that in 1938 the Young Communist League (YCL) was active at CCNY but that he was never approached directly. Mr. AFFIAS added that he might have been indirectly and subtly approached by "STANLEY RICH or somebody else" in regard to joining the YCL. Mr. AFFIAS stated that he recalls that he was "felt out" about joining the YCL at CCNY but stated he does not recall the circumstances. Mr. AFFIAS repeated that it possibly might have been STANLEY RICH who mentioned the YCL to him but that he actually does not remember.

Mr. AFFIAS advised that while he was at CCNY there was a group interested in high fidelity or chamber music which included EAT SUSSMAN, STANLEY RICH, and _____ KAPLAN, first name unknown. Mr. AFFIAS stated that he thought that this group possibly may have been officially connected with the YCL, but he didn't have any definite information along this line.

Mr. AFFIAS was not certain of the name KAPLAN but said he thought it was something like that. Mr. AFFIAS was asked if the name might be KLASKI or KLAYT W, but he said it definitely was not one of those names. Mr. AFFIAS added that he intended to check his CCNY Yearbook to refresh his memory regarding the name.

Mr. AFFIAS stated that HORTON SOBELL was an explosive and tactless individual in school. He was unable to furnish any information regarding SOBELL'S close associates or contacts.

Mr. AFFIAS stated that he, AFFIAS, wrote a joint article with SOBELL during his latter year at CCNY entitled, "Third Brush Generator". This article was a contribution for CCNY's technological journal, "Vector".

Mr. AFFIAS advised that he met HORTON SOBELL about one year ago at Reeves Instrument Company, New York City. Mr. AFFIAS explained that the Neptune Electronics Company is a manufacturing and jobbing house and as such furnished the Reeves Instrument Company with parts. Mr. AFFIAS advised that he was never approached by SOBELL for any information.

Photographs of all the individuals involved in the Rosenberg Espionage Ring were exhibited to Mr. Affias. Mr. AFFIAS recognized photographs of the following:

RAY BROWN (Classmate)
JOEL BARR (Classmate)
SILVIA LAMBERT (Classmate)

It is noted that Mr. AFFIAS recognized the photograph of MAX ELITCHER, but he did not recall where he had seen ELITCHER before.

Mr. AFFIAS stated that the photograph of MIKE SIDOROVICH looks familiar and that he possibly met him somewhere.

Mr. AFFIAS advised that he was never approached or contacted by any of the aforementioned individuals for any information. He was unable to furnish any further information concerning them.

Mr. AFFIAS was employed as a civilian employee of the United States Navy during World War II.

Mr. LOUIS ANTELL, residence Apartment B-2, 1936 77th Street, Jackson Heights, has been employed as Engineer-Inspector, Inspection Division, Department of the Army, Signal Corps, Procurement Agency, 2800 South 20th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, since 1940.

Mr. ANTELL advised that he does not know SOBELL and does not know anything about him except what he recently read in the newspapers. Mr. ANTELL explained that he, ANTELL, attended the evening session at CCNY and apparently SOBELL was not in the same classes.

Mr. ANTELL advised that he did not know JULES ROSENBERG at CCNY but met him sometime between 1941 and 1945 on occasions when ANTELL was with the Signal Corps and attended official Signal Corps conferences at Brooklyn, New York. Mr. ANTELL stated that these conferences were generally held on Saturdays. Mr. ANTELL stated that he did not have any private conversations with JULES ROSENBERG on the occasions of these conferences. Mr. ANTELL advised that he did have a private talk with ROSENBERG about the beginning of 1950 at Hubble & Miller Company, 81 Willoughby Street, Brooklyn, New York.

At this time ROSENBERG was making aluminum brackets on a "sub sub-contract" for Coil Binders Co., Brooklyn. On this occasion ROSENBERG had a minor discussion with the company engineer and ANTELL. Mr. ANTELL did not recall the name of ROSENBERG'S company until he noticed in the newspaper that it was the Pitt Machine Company. Mr. ANTELL stated that nothing irregular occurred at this meeting.

Mr. ANTELL could not account for the fact that WILLIAM WINTERPARK'S photograph looked familiar to him.

Mr. DANIEL S. BARKIN, residence 9 Dawson Drive, Valley Stream, Long Island, has been employed as a television instructor at American Radio Institute, 101 West 63rd Street, New York City, for the past two years and a half.

Mr. BARKIN is a former musician. From 1942 to 1945 he was a civilian employee, Signal Corps Inspector, United States War Department, Newark Signal Corps Inspection, and worked in the Bridgeport, Connecticut area.

Mr. BARKIN was drafted in the United States Army in 1945. He was a Corporal in the Special Engineers Detachment at Oak Ridge, Tennessee for about one and a half years, where his work consisted generally of repairing equipment. Mr. BARKIN added that he also did WP work.

Mr. BARKIN stated that he does not know HERBERT S. SPILL. He advised that the photograph of SPILL looks familiar, but he does not recall him from COMI. Mr. BARKIN said that he has had no association with him. Mr. BARKIN added that he, BARKIN, started at COMI in the day division but finished up in the evening division.

Mr. BARKIN advised that he does not know JULIUS ROSENBERG at all, although the photograph of ROSENBERG looked a little familiar to him.

Mr. BARKIN advised that the photograph of JOEL BARR looked familiar to him and he remembered the name BARR. Mr. BARKIN stated that he recalls a fellow named BARR in his Signal Corps group at Bridgeport, but does not remember the first name of this ~~JOEL~~ BARR. Mr. BARKIN stated that he associates the BARR which he recalls as formerly living at Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn, and who had several brothers. Mr. BARKIN added that the name of BARR that he recalls might possibly be ARTHUR BARR, but he is not certain of this. Mr. BARKIN stated that he has never seen this ~~JOEL~~ BARR since he left Bridgeport, Connecticut.

WILLIAM WITTENBERG, aka: PARI.

Mr. BARKIN said that the name and photograph of WITTENBERG is familiar, possibly from school. Mr. BARKIN advised that he was never approached by any of the aforementioned individuals for any information and was unable to furnish any further information concerning them.

As requested in referenced letter photographs of various individuals in the ROSENBERG apparatus were exhibited to LAY YERGAN, former Chairman of the National Negro Congress and the Council of African Affairs, on 9/7/50, by SA ARTHUR R. WARE. YERGAN advised that he is unable to identify any of the individuals from these photographs although he did recognize GREENGLASS and ROSENBERG due to recent newspaper publicity.

With regard to ROSENBERG, YERGAN advised that when he first read about him in the newspaper he was under the impression that he may have met him at the home of LOUISE BRANSTEN on the West Coast, at the time of the initial meeting to form the United Nations. His reasons for this impression was that he recalled asking BRANSTEN, whose maiden name was ROSENBERG, if she was related to this other person, by the name of ROSENBERG. YERGAN, however, does not recall any other details and is not certain that the other ROSENBERG was the subject.

JENSEN is a graduate of the College of the City of New York, class of 1930, in electrical engineering and was a classmate of MORTON SOBELL and others. JENSEN advised that his employment since 1928 was the following:

Instructor at CCNY, October, 1939 to December, 1939.

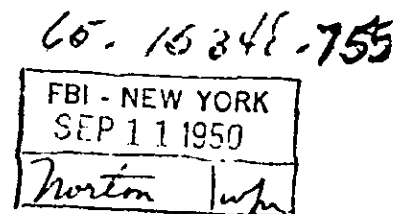
PUSEY & JONES, Shipbuilders, Wilmington, Delaware, January, 1940 - February, 1942.

JENSEN also advised that SAM LEVINE had attempted to interest JENSEN as a leftist and tried to get him to read the "Daily Worker." LEVINE, according to JENSEN, was also active in the FANCT. JENSEN described FLITCHER as a brilliant student and that MORTON ROSELL was a better than average student. He also stated that ROSENBURG was a very poor student and although active in left-wing societies, the names of which JENSEN did not remember, was a retiring person. JENSEN believed ROSENBURG was active in the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. JENSEN also stated that STANLEY RICH was very active in leftist affairs during his student days at CCNY.

JENSEN was shown a list of the graduates of his class from CCNY, in 1938, and some of the names he did not recall and others he has not seen since graduation. However, he gave information on the following classmates:

IRVING MAURICE AFFAIS, whom he believed worked for the Inspector of Navy Materiel, 30 Church Street in 1945.

ALFRED ENGEL, who he believes is presently employed by the Department of Public Works, New York City.

RAYMOND E. FULFELMAN, who he knows to be presently employed by the AUSTIN COMPANY, 19 Rector Street, New York City.

HENRY I. HELLMAN, who was at one time employed by the LUXUS COMPANY, Graybar Building, New York City.

BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN. JENSEN remembered that ZUCKERMAN was with the United States Signal Corps during the war, possibly as a commissioned officer.

JENSEN advised that a short time ago he had a conversation with ALBERT GRUFNER, who graduated from CCNY in September, 1938, and who is believed to be working for the BUSHNELL CORPORATION, Brooklyn, New York, as a radio engineer. During this conversation they discussed the arrest of ROSENBURG and the names of JOEL ROSE and M. BAYLEN were brought up and GRUFNER stated that those two had been connected with leftist activities while students at CCNY. JENSEN stated that M. BAYLEN had worked for GEORGE SWARTZ while JENSEN was employed there but that BAYLEN had terminated his employment some time previous to 1948 and his present employment is unknown to JENSEN.

Another person considered as a leftist, who attended CCNY, was HENRY or HARRY SHOLIFT. JINZEN does not know his present whereabouts but believed that he pursued graduate studies at Pennsylvania State in mechanical engineering after graduating from CCNY and that during the war he was employed on the West Coast as a vibration specialist.

JINZEN advised that he did not know JOEL BARR very well but he only remembered the name of WILLIAM PANZIGER. He remembered MAX FLITCHER as one of the younger members of the class and that FLITCHER was very friendly with SOBELL.

Re memo of SA ROBERT C. GALLAGHER, 8/15/50 to determine ROSENBERG'S connection with the Beekman Realty Co, Amenia, N.Y. as a result of a telephone call made by ROSENBERG to this company on June 27, 1949.

WALTER BEEKMAN, owner of the Beekman Realty Co. advised that he did not know of the subject JULIUS ROSENBERG. Photos of ROSENBERG and ROSENBERG'S associates were exhibited to BEEKMAN and his wife IRVINE with negative results.

BEEKMAN through the Beekman Realty Co. owns Lake Amenia and a few cottages which are rented every summer. BEEKMAN advertised these cottages in the New York Post in 1949 listing his Amenia telephone number. It is quite possible that ROSENBERG called to inquire about a summer rental.

Since the summer residents sometimes use BEEKMAN'S phone it was determined that on June 27, 1949 there was only one cottage occupied. This cottage was rented to a JOSEPH WINIG of 82 E. 47th St., NYC, associated with the Capital Jewelers Exchange.

On August 22, 31 and September 1, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed at the Tombs Prison, New York City, by the writer.

At the request of SA WILLIAM F. NORTON, Jr., DAVID GREENGLASS was shown a gold Driva Geneve lady's wrist watch with a gold wrist band, alleged to be the property of ETHEL ROSENBERG. DAVID GREENGLASS stated that he did not recognize this watch at all, and had no recollection of ever having seen it in the possession of ETHEL ROSENBERG. DAVID GREENGLASS advised at first that he had no recollection of JULIUS ROSENBERG telling him that ETHEL had received a wrist watch as a gift from the Russians or anyone else. However, on second thought, DAVID GREENGLASS recalled that while he was working at Pitt Machine Products Company JULIUS ROSENBERG mentioned to him that ETHEL had gotten a watch as a gift, but JULIUS ROSENBERG did not say specifically what the source of the gift was, except to indicate vaguely that it came from some friends. DAVID GREENGLASS was of the opinion that this meant it came from the Russians. GREENGLASS admitted he had no proof to substantiate that opinion. DAVID GREENGLASS repeated that he did not recall seeing the watch in question in possession of ETHEL ROSENBERG, nor did he have any recollection of having asked ETHEL about the gift.

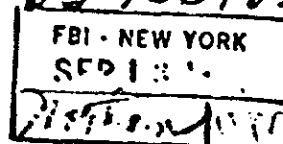
In accordance with the lead set out in Washington Field Office teletype dated August 17, 1950, at 7:44 p.m., entitled "JULIUS ROSENBERG; ESPIONAGE - R", DAVID GREENGLASS was asked whether or not he knew one ABRAHAM FOOKSON. DAVID replied that he had no knowledge whatsoever of such an individual.

SILVERTHORN dated August 24, 1950 in the cases entitled "STANLEY ROBERT RICH; ESPIONAGE - R" and "WILLIAM DANZIGER; ESPIONAGE - R", photographs of STANLEY ROBERT RICH and WILLIAM DANZIGER were displayed to DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS did not recognize the photograph of either individual and stated also that he did not recognize their names.

In accordance with the request contained in the memorandum of SA JAMES P. LEE dated August 10, 1950, in the captioned matter, DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed to ascertain whether or not he was identical with one DAVID GREENE, who was a member of the Communist Party, Branch P-4 of the East Side in 1943. DAVID GREENGLASS categorically denied ever joining the Communist Party under any name whatsoever.

In accordance with the lead contained in Washington Field teletype dated August 9, 1950 at 9:34 p.m. in the case entitled "JULIUS ROSENBERG; ESPIONAGE - R", DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed concerning LEO SHUBERT. DAVID GREENGLASS advised that he did not know this individual.

DAVID GREENGLASS was also interviewed as to the identity of EVELYNE MARAHE, whose name appeared scratched on the face of a typewriter found in JULIUS ROSENBERG'S apartment. DAVID GREENGLASS stated that he never saw the name scratched on the typewriter and did not know anyone by that name.

In accordance with the request contained in Albany teletype dated July 29, 1950, 2:02 p.m., regarding "ALFRED SARANT; ESPIONAGE - R", photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT were displayed to DAVID GREENGLASS, who stated that he did not recognize them.

In accordance with Washington Field teletype dated August 4, 1950 at 8:24 p.m. regarding "JULIUS ROSENBERG; ESPIONAGE - R", DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed relative to STANLEY MAGNES. DAVID GREENGLASS advised that this individual was unknown to him.

DAVID GREENGLASS was also interviewed as to the name he was instructed to use in the event he fled to Mexico City. DAVID GREENGLASS was unable to recall with any exactness what the name was, but had the vague recollection that it was "ROBINSON". He stated that he was certain that his instructions were that on arrival at Mexico City he was to write to the "Secretary to the Ambassador of the Soviet Union". DAVID GREENGLASS was unable to remember the exact message he was to convey in that letter.

DAVID GREENGLASS also stated that in his only contact with HARRY GOLD in June, 1945, in Albuquerque, New Mexico, he did not give HARRY GOLD any phone number in New York City where HARRY GOLD could later reach him. DAVID GREENGLASS stated he does not recall making any arrangements for GOLD to contact him in New York City.

DAVID GREENGLASS also stated that he informed the Grand Jury of the Southern District of New York that 30% of the personnel at Los Alamos, New Mexico (while GREENGLASS was employed there) were leftists. It may be noted that it has been previously reported that DAVID GREENGLASS furnished the names of the following persons who, in his opinion, were leftists at Los Alamos: BENJAMIN BEDERSON, Dr. BOHR and HENRY LINSHITZ.

With regard to Dr. BOHR, DAVID GREENGLASS previously confirmed the information of his that he learned that this individual was an alleged sympathizer only through the general talk at Los Alamos. DAVID GREENGLASS had no actual basis to substantiate the foregoing opinion of Dr. BOHR and HENRY LINSHITZ.

DAVID GREENGLASS was specifically interrogated as to the identity of those individuals at Los Alamos who made up the 30% he had referred to before the Grand Jury. DAVID GREENGLASS stated he was unable to recall the names of these individuals, but believed that if he had a personnel list of all those who had been employed at Los Alamos, he might be able to name some of those who he had heard were leftists.

Reference is made to the memo of SA JAMES P. LEE dated July 21, 1950, which stated that among the possessions of the subject at the time of his arrest was a business card which read as follows:

Rivercrest-On-The-Hudson
Ft. Montgomery, New York
Highland Falls 933

At Ft. Montgomery, New York, it was ascertained that Rivercrest-On-The-Hudson was an inn which burned down on October 14, 1946. It had been owned by FRANK and ALIDA FORZANI, who are presently operating the Highland Manor at Highland Mills, New York.

It should be noted that in April, 1950, Mrs. ALIDA FORZANI was interviewed in connection with her knowledge of the whereabouts of PIERRE BONVIN in connection with the case entitled, "ARMAUD LAUIS PELLISSAN," New York file 65-235. Subsequent investigation at the time of BONVIN'S location revealed that Mrs. FORZANI had been very uncooperative.

Both FRANK and ALIDA FORZANI denied any knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG nor did they recognize any of the photographs of his associates. When the card found in ROSENBERG'S wallet was shown to FRANK FORZANI, he stated that this card must have been one of those used by the previous owner of the Rivercrest-On-The-Hudson. He stated that this prior owner was a Mr. EVAN MAGINN, an attorney.

Mr. MAGINN, who resides at Ft. Montgomery, New York, has not been available for interview. His New York Office, is at 505 Fifth Avenue, telephone MU 2-6914, with a branch at 271 West 125th Street, telephone AC 2-3059.

It is requested that Mr. MAGINN be interviewed to determine if he has any knowledge of the subject.

Re Newark teletype 8/10/50, setting forth a lead to interview MEYER SUSSMAN; New York teletype to Bureau, 8/24/50, setting forth SUSSMAN'S Communist background; and Butel 8/25/50, authorizing interview of MEYER SUSSMAN.

MEYER SUSSMAN, Apartment 59, 50 Amsterdam Avenue, New York City, was interviewed on September 8, 1950 by SA DANIEL F. O'CONNOR and the writer, at which time he advised as follows:

He attended CCNY Night School in 1937-1938 and took courses in general philosophy and psychology. These courses were given at the Monroe High School in Brooklyn. SUSSMAN therefore was not in contact with any of the CCNY engineering students and did not meet JULIUS ROSENBERG.

In 1941, SUSSMAN secured employment in a civilian capacity with the U. S. Signal Corps at Governors Island and as his first assignment was sent to Mc Cord Field, near Tacoma, Washington. The climate on the West Coast did not agree with him and he therefore returned to New York City in about 1943. In April, 1943, he was assigned as a civilian inspector by the Signal Corps to the Jefferson Travis Radio Corporation on 2nd Avenue, New York City. The Signal Corps Inspector - Engineer in charge at that plant was JULIUS ROSENBERG. ROSENBERG was a friendly person and SUSSMAN and the other Signal Corps employees liked him. However, the relationship was a business one and SUSSMAN and ROSENBERG did not have any contact after business hours. SUSSMAN and the other employees probably went to lunch with ROSENBERG on several occasions and SUSSMAN recalled having seen ETHEL ROSENBERG at the plant on one occasion.

SUSSMAN left the Jefferson Travis Radio Corporation in September, 1943 and entered the U. S. Army, where he was assigned to the Air Force. During the time that SUSSMAN was at the Jefferson Travis Radio Corporation, there were two Signal Corps jobs. The first was a transmitter and receiver in one unit which was very poorly designed. To SUSSMAN'S knowledge, none of these

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units were ever shipped while he was at the plant. The second job was a three tube walkie-talkie.

SUSSMAN served in the U. S. Army until February 28, 1946. He received his basic training in Florida and thereafter served at Kearns, Utah; Colorado Springs, Colorado; Galveston, Texas; Pyote, Texas and McCook, Nebraska.

SUSSMAN does not recall that he was in contact during the period of his (SUSSMAN'S) Army service with ROSENBERG; however, he stated that it was possible that he may have sent a postcard to ROSENBERG as well as to other employees at the Jefferson Travis Radio Corporation. After his discharge from the Army, SUSSMAN returned to New York City and after a short rest, secured employment at the Newark Airport, where he was engaged in preparing Army planes for storage. Subsequently he and several other fellows organized AIR FREIGHT, INC. at the Newark Airport, but after six or seven months, this corporation went out of business.

DAVID ALTRUCH, the Vice-President of AIR FREIGHT, INC., SUSSMAN, DAVID FLANAGAN and RICHARD BURKE then formed the SUSS-HALL IMPORTING & EXPORTING COMPANY. FLANAGAN and BURKE were supposed to travel around the country looking for customers who wanted scarce materials. ALTRUCH and SUSSMAN were then supposed to find the materials. The company was only in existence for several months, no deals were ever consummated and the company did not obtain an export license. However, ALTRUCH and SUSSMAN did spend considerable effort to locate scarce materials, such as radio parts, hardware and so forth.

In so doing, they contacted every person they knew who might help them. SUSSMAN telephoned ROSENBERG'S home and was referred by Mrs. ROSENBERG to the office of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY. Finally after repeated efforts, SUSSMAN was able to contact ROSENBERG telephonically at his place of business. ROSENBERG said that he could not obtain radio parts, but that he could be of assistance if SUSSMAN wanted machinery. SUSSMAN pointed out that it just happened that an exporter (name not recalled), located in the Broadway-Wall Street area of New York City, had asked the SUSS-HALL COMPANY to obtain a list of machinery that they could get. SUSSMAN therefore went to the offices of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY and spoke to ROSENBERG, who indicated that he could get machinery from the surplus warehouses. SUSSMAN recalled that someone had also asked the SUSS-HALL COMPANY to obtain some twill cloth and that ROSENBERG had indicated that he might be able to obtain some of that material for the SUSS-HALL COMPANY. SUSSMAN only visited ROSENBERG on this one occasion and nothing came of the negotiations for the machinery or the twill cloth, although SUSSMAN believes ROSENBERG did submit

a list of machinery which he could obtain. SUSSMAN has had no further contact in any way with ROSENBERG.

A photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG was exhibited to SUSSMAN and he readily identified it. A photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS was exhibited to SUSSMAN, but he stated that he cannot recall ever having met GREENGLASS, although it is possible that he may have met him casually in ROSENBERG'S office.

SUSSMAN stated that ROSENBERG never approached him to engage in any espionage or obtain any information for him. SUSSMAN stated that he had no knowledge of ROSENBERG'S employment from 1943 to 1946 and did not know that ROSENBERG had been employed by the U. S. Signal Corps at the EMERSON RADIO COMPANY. He vaguely recalled that ROSENBERG had indicated that he had at one time engaged in aircraft work.

Photographs of JOEL BAFF and ALFRED SARANT were exhibited to SUSSMAN but he was unable to identify either of these individuals.

It is also noted that SUSSMAN stated that he does not have any relative by the name of NATHAN SUSSMAN.

Additional background information given by SUSSMAN reflected that after the SUSS-HALL COMPANY went out of existence, he worked for about a year with the SOUND SCRIBER CORPORATION in New York City and then started attending classes at Columbia University. He has obtained his B.S. degree and is now taking graduate courses in psychology at Columbia University. SUSSMAN indicated that he is not presently employed as a taxi cab driver.

It is noted that while in SUSSMAN'S apartment, the agents saw a television set and a radio receiving set, but no transmitter. SUSSMAN stated that he does not have a transmitter's license.

SA O'CONNOR also noticed an album of records in SUSSMAN'S apartment entitled "SOVIET SONGS FROM SOVIET FILMS".

He formerly worked at the Philadelphia Navy Yard, and was also formerly employed by the New York City Board of Transportation. He was born December 7, 1915 at Philadelphia. LEVINE stated that he only vaguely recalls SOBELL as one of his classmates and has had no contact with him since graduation. He could furnish no specific information concerning SOBELL.

LOHSE said that he recalled SOBELL had leftist tendencies in that he was opposed to Hitler, Franco and Fascism at the time, but that he does not recall whether SOBELL was connected with Communist activities or groups or showed any definite pro-Communist sentiment. LOHSE stated that he had no contact with SOBELL since graduation. He said that about two years ago, SOBELL applied for a job with the Control Instrument Company, and that he, LOHSE, saw the application. LOHSE said that SOBELL did not contact him in connection with his application, that SOBELL might not have known that LOHSE was employed at this company. LOHSE could furnish no information as to ALITOWER'S activities and said he has had no contact with him since graduation.

RESSA was born on August 12, 1913 at Long Island City. He stated that he recalled SOBELL as a classmate, but can recall nothing of his other activities or associations since that time. He said that the only time he has seen SOBELL since graduation was four or five months ago when he saw him in the building where the Reeves Instrument Company is located. RESSA also saw MAX ALITOWER at this time and said that ALITOWER was working at this company on a confidential Navy project. At the time he saw SOBELL, SOBELL told him that he was teaching a course in feedback amplifiers at some school in Brooklyn, which RESSA believes to be either the Pratt Institute or Brooklyn Polytech. RESSA said that he could furnish no other information concerning SOBELL.

GERMAN was interviewed on September 14, 1950, at which time he advised that the three dollar check in question was given him by JULIUS ROSENBERG to cover the medical fee for a minor medical service rendered by Doctor GERMAN to an employee of the Pitt Machine Products, Inc. Doctor GERMAN said that he told ROSENBERG that it would be foolish to submit a report of the injury so as to claim compensation for the injury, since it was so slight, and the tendency of many such small claims would tend to increase the rates.

Doctor GERMAN stated that he has been the family physician of both the GREENGLASS and the ROSENBERG family for several years, but that he has known nothing about the personal activities of either family, and the first inkling he had of either GREENGLASS' or ROSENBERG'S activities in atomic espionage, was when he saw this information in the New York City papers.

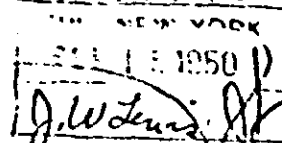

On September 11, 1950, Special Agents FREDERICK C. MAUCKHAM and JOHN W. LEWIS interviewed Mrs. EMMANUEL MELVIN GREENBAUM, nee RUTH MARKOWITZ, 73 Willet Street, New York City, Telephone AL 2-5318.

Mrs. GREENBAUM is the sister of MARK PAGE's wife STELLA. Mrs. GREENBAUM furnished the following information:

She said that she, herself, had joined the Stuyvesant Branch of the Young Communist League, New York City, in 1936 and remained in that Branch for about eighteen months, when she transferred her membership to the Club Malreaux on Clinton Street, New York City. She said she continued her membership there until the Hitler-Stalin Pact in 1938, at which time she lost all faith in the Communist movement and discontinued her affiliation.

She said that when her sister STELLA married MARK PAGE the PAGES had lived with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG in an apartment in Brooklyn and through that relationship she had become acquainted with the ROSENBERGS as well as DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS.

She said that both MARK and STELLA PAGE had been active in Communist Party circles during the late 1930s, but had broken off with all of their friends on the Lower East Side of New York City when they moved to New Jersey about ten years ago. Mrs. GREENBAUM said that she was fairly certain that neither MARK nor STELLA had been active in the Communist Party in New Jersey.

Mrs. GREENBAUM advised that recently RUTH GREENGLASS had come to her and told her that if MARK PAGE were involved in espionage it would be to his advantage to make a complete disclosure to the FBI. Mrs. GREENBAUM subsequently spoke to her mother, Mrs. MAX MARKOWITZ, who also resides at 73 Willet Street, New York City, who had come to New Jersey to visit MARK and STELLA PAGE and she told them what RUTH GREENGLASS said. At that time MARK told Mrs. MARKOWITZ that he was not involved in espionage and MARK subsequently came to New York City to see Mrs. GREENBAUM and told her that he was not entirely in the clear in this matter. He said, however, that Mrs. GREENBAUM had

no business meddling in PAGE's business and that the less she knew about PAGE's business the better off she would be. MARK PAGE told Mrs. GREENBAUM that she should keep her mouth shut because she is also involved. Mrs. GREENBAUM then told MARK PAGE that her former membership in the Young Communist League does not make her a spy, to which MARK PAGE replied, "That's what you think." MARK PAGE told Mrs. GREENBAUM that the only way he could have been involved with JULIUS ROSENBERG was because he was supposed to have obtained some equipment for ROSENBERG at one time several years ago and that there had been a fight over this matter and that PAGE had discontinued his friendship with ROSENBERG.

Mrs. GREENBAUM said that MARK PAGE told her he could never be a traitor to the United States. Mrs. GREENBAUM stated that although she has no regard for MARK PAGE and no respect for his ideals, she believes that he is not a spy.

Mrs. GREENBAUM advised that during the Spanish Civil War MARK PAGE had recruited numerous persons to fight for Loyalist Spain, but when she asked him why he didn't go to fight for Loyalist Spain MARK replied that he was much too important an individual and should remain in the United States to further his career.

Mrs. GREENBAUM advised that her sister, LEONA REIMAN and the latter's husband, MORRIS REIMAN, had been at odds for several years. She also said that her sister, SYLVIA MARKOWITZ has never been friendly with MARK PAGE.

MILTON EPSTEIN, Secretary-Treasurer of Coil Winders Incorporated, 61 Bergen Street, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed by the writer on Sept. 19, 1950.

EPSTEIN stated that he originally met ROSENBERG through business about three or four years ago. He stated that ROSENBERG did work for his firm, Coil Winders, Inc. He stated that he had been to the Pitt Machine Products Corp. where he was introduced by ROSENBERG to two men whom ROSENBERG stated were his brothers-in-law, one he called "DAVE", but he could not recall the name of the other.

EPSTEIN stated that his only connection with ROSENBERG was through business and that he had never been in ROSENBERG'S company socially. He stated that he had been to lunch with ROSENBERG on a few occasions. EPSTEIN claimed that he knew nothing of any other associates of ROSENBERG and as far as ROSENBERG'S views were concerned he stated that ROSENBERG was, in his opinion, a typical small business-man who was confronted with the problems of having to pay large wages and difficulty meeting expenses.

EPSTEIN stated that he had served in the Air Force during the past war and was a flight engineer. While he was in the service he attended Syracuse University for courses in engineering. He stated that he does not recall ever meeting a man by the name of SARANT.

EPSTEIN stated that he had attended CCNY in about 1941 or 1942, before entering the service. He stated that he had never known ROSENBERG at that time but reiterated that his only acquaintance with ROSENBERG was through the business of Coil Winders Inc.

DAVID stated that as far as he knew, nothing ever came of this plan and no import-export business was ever engaged in by the G & R Engineering Company.

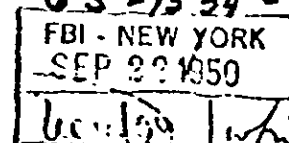

DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed to determine whether he had any other information concerning the contacts of JULIUS ROSENBERG Upstate New York. He stated that on one occasion, JULIUS ROSENBERG mentioned that an individual he knew was either working in a jet laboratory or attending a college in Upstate New York.

DAVID stated that JULIUS never gave him any other information concerning this individual and DAVID was unable to say what school this individual was attending or in what laboratory he was employed.

He stated that when HARRY GOLD was arrested, ROSENBERG told him that he had to go Upstate to warn his "boys" and that after that he was also going to Cleveland, Ohio.

DAVID said that later on JULIUS told him that he had been Upstate New York but that he had not gone to Cleveland and was not going to Cleveland. DAVID was unable to state where JULIUS went Upstate, however, he advised that he believed that JULIUS always traveled by train and on most occasions would travel at night and take a sleeper. He stated he had no idea of the town or location in the State of New York where JULIUS may have traveled.

DAVID recalled that in 1947 or 1948 JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that he had been in Cleveland and described the plant of the Warner and Swasey Company, manufacturers of turret lathes. DAVID said that JULIUS described the plant as one of the largest he had ever seen.

DAVID recalled that in early 1948, he asked JULIUS ROSENBERG for some money and JULIUS told him that he could not let him have any money at that time because he had to give quite a sum of money to one of his

On September 8, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed for any additional information he had concerning MIKE and ANNE SIDOROVICH. DAVID was specifically asked if he recalled asking JULIUS ROSENBERG why FARRY GOLD came to Albuquerque to pick up the information and material from DAVID and why ANNE SIDOROVICH did not come to pick up such information when it had been previously agreed that she would be the one to do so.

DAVID said that he vaguely recalls that when he came back on furlough in September, 1945, he asked JULIUS ROSENBERG why ANNE SIDOROVICH did not come out. He stated that as far as he could recall, JULIUS replied, "She couldn't make it."

He stated that he does recall that JULIUS at no time told him that ANNE did not come out because she refused to go.

DAVID also stated that he never heard of MIKE SIDOROVICH being a member of the ALB and that he never saw MIKE at a meeting of the YCG or ever heard that he was a member of the YCG.

On September 8, 1950, the writer interviewed RUTH GREENGLASS and asked her if she had ever asked JULIUS ROSENBERG why ANNE SIDOROVICH did not make the contact as arranged in Albuquerque. RUTH stated that she recalls mentioning it to JULIUS but could not remember his answer. She stated that about 1948 she spoke to ETHEL ROSENBERG and asked her where ANNE SIDOROVICH was and whether she had any children. She stated that ETHEL replied that ANNE was living in Cleveland and had a baby.

On September 8, 1950, the writer exhibited to RUTH GREENGLASS^d a gold watch and band which was taken from ETHEL ROSENBERG at the time of her arrest. This watch bears the name "DRIVA" on its face.

RUTH stated that this watch looked like the watch she saw ETHEL ROSENBERG wearing and that to her knowledge, she never saw ETHEL wear any other wrist watch. She stated she saw this watch when she visited JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG at their apartment, 10 Monroe Street, and believed that it was after she returned from visiting her husband, DAVID, at Albuquerque in November, 1944.

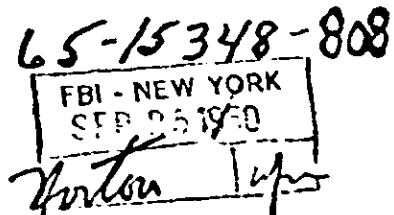
She stated that on this occasion she recalls that DAVID was not with her and that sometime during the night, she noticed that ETHEL was wearing a new gold wrist watch. RUTH stated that the only other watch she ever saw ETHEL wearing was a lady's sport wrist watch with a large face which she believed was given to ETHEL by her mother.

RUTH GREENGLASS stated that she asked ETHEL ROSENBERG about the gold wrist watch and that ETHEL said that it was a gift from JULIUS' "friend" and that if any of her family asked her from whom she received it, that she would say that JULIUS gave it to her. On September 8, 1950, the writer exhibited the above mentioned "DRIVA" watch to DAVID GREENGLASS and he stated that he thought that it was his sister, ETHEL'S, watch but that he did not know anything else about it. He did not know from where she had obtained it.

He also recalled that when he returned from Albuquerque in 1946 that he and RUTH had stayed at the apartment of JULIUS and ETHEL for about ten days. He stated that he did not know where JULIUS and ETHEL had been at that time.

On September 8, 1950, the writer interviewed RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS. RUTH GREENGLASS gave the following account of her acquaintance with VIVIAN GLASS'AN.

She stated that during ^{the} September 1945 furlough of her husband, DAVID, she had visited ETHEL ROSENBERG'S apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, and that VIVIAN GLASS'AN was present. She did not recall too much about the circumstances of the visit, but did recall that her husband DAVID drove VIVIAN GLASS'AN home in RUTH'S father's car. She also stated that on one occasion JULIUS ROSENBERG told RUTH that he was going to see VIVIAN in connection with a change in the then political situation. RUTH believed that this was also in 1945.

She stated that she again met VIVIAN GLASS'AN in ETHEL ROSENBERG'S apartment in the fall of 1946 or the early part of 1947. She stated that she believed that VIVIAN was giving ETHEL ROSENBERG advice about how to raise MICHAEL. She stated that ETHEL told her that VIVIAN was a social worker and had worked for the YU or some other organization. She explained that ETHEL ROSENBERG was in the habit of writing down at the end of each day her experiences during the day with her son MICHAEL. She did this in an attempt to determine whether she had made a mistake at any point in the day which would reflect upon the proper upbringing of MICHAEL.

She also stated that one night during the Christmas holidays of 1947, she was in ETHEL'S apartment and that VIVIAN GLASS'AN and JOEL BARR were also there. She recalled that VIVIAN brought clothes, including ski pants, sweaters and other heavy clothing, for ETHEL, who was going on a vacation with her husband JIMMIE. RUTH stated that she knew nothing else about this proposed vacation.

She stated that at most she saw VIVIAN on four or five occasions but that ETHEL ROSENBERG spoke about her quite often, indicating that she was going out with VIVIAN.

She stated that no one ever said that VIVIAN was a Communist and that she (RUTH) did not know whether she was or not. She stated, however,

She recalled on one occasion she asked ETHEL why VIVIAN and JOEL did not marry but she did not recall what ETHEL replied. She also stated that about two years ago when she and DAVID had little funds and apparently JULIUS and ETHEL had but little funds, JOEL BARR and VIVIAN came to ETHEL'S house and BARR brought the whole dinner for everybody. She said that ETHEL told her this. She stated that on another occasion about two and one-half years ago she was in ETHEL'S house with DAVID and BERNARD GREENGLASS' wife, GLADYS. On this occasion JOEL BARR and VIVIAN came to the house and brought ETHEL a pressure cooker. She stated that she did not think that JOEL BARR was working for JULIUS because he seemed to have money and to be on the level with JULIUS.

On September 8, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS identified a photograph of VIVIAN GLASSMAN. He stated that he first met her when he came back from the Army in March 1946 and met her at the apartment of JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street. He said that on that occasion there were present in the apartment VIVIAN GLASSMAN, JOEL BARR, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, WILTON WAPES and DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS. He stated that in all he saw VIVIAN about four times and knew that she was the girl friend of JOEL BARR. DAVID also stated that his brother BERNARD GREENGLASS told him that he saw VIVIAN GLASSMAN at the shop of the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS and at that time she was with JOEL BARR. DAVID stated he could not recall exactly how long ago that was.

The photographs of AL and LOUISE SARANT, MAX FEINSTONE, MAX ELITCHER, WILLIAM PERE, MORTON SOBELL, WILLIAM DWIGTER and STANLEY RICH, were exhibited to DAVID but he did not identify any of them and did not recognize any of their names. He also stated that he did not know anybody by the name of FOKSON or SHUEFRT.

On August 31, 1950, the writer interviewed DAVID GREENGLASS and asked him if he recalled the name that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him to use when he was corresponding with the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City and if he recalled the message that he was to send.

DAVID stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him to use the name T. JACKSON. He stated that JULIUS told him to send a letter addressed to the Soviet Embassy, Mexico City, and that the salutation or address on the letter was to read, "To the Secretary to the Ambassador of the Soviet Union."

He stated that he was to send a message in his own words but that either three or four points were to be contained in the message. He stated that the letter was to read something as follows:

- Point 1: I am writing this letter in answer to the one you wrote me in which you asked the question about the Soviet position on the U.N.
- Point 2: DAVID explained that Point 2 in this letter was to be a mention of the United Nations (U.N.).
- Point 3: DAVID was to say that the position that the Soviets took on the U.N. question was good and met with his approval.

At the time of this interview, the notebook of RUTH GREENGLASS which had been found in DAVID'S house on June 15, 1950, and was taken pursuant to a waiver of search, was exhibited to him. DAVID GREENGLASS examined this book and stated that none of the names in there were his friends or were people who are Communists or engaged in Soviet espionage. He stated that none of these names in this book were names of persons that he had given to RUTH to transmit to JULIUS ROSENBERG as persons who could be contacted for recruitment purposes at Los Alamos. He also stated that none of these names was given to JULIUS ROSENBERG by himself during any of his contacts.

During this interview the notebook of DAVID GREENGLASS, which was obtained during the course of the search as above stated, was also exhibited

to him and he identified the names of the individuals listed therein. He stated that the only names he recalls giving to RUTH GREENGLASS to deliver to JULIUS ROSENBERG as being persons who were working at Los Alamos were UREY and OPPENHEIMER. He also stated that he gave the same names and a list of technicians including BOHR (BAKER) to JULIUS ROSENBERG when he saw him on his furlough in January of 1945. He does not recall any other names except UREY, OPPENHEIMER and BOHR. During the examination of his notebook, DAVID stated that he believes that he had given the following names to GOLD as possible recruits at Los Alamos:

- HY ADLER
- BEN BEIDERSON (BEDERSON)
- M. DALY (DAVID indicated that he believed that DALY was "leftist"; that he never saw him again after Los Alamos)
- J. DI GIACOMO (DAVID described this man as a "leftist" who was employed at Los Alamos but never saw him again and knows nothing about him)
- THOMAS A. FEINBERG (DAVID described him as radical and one who had so informed the Army)
- DR. HENRY LINSCHUTZ (LINSCHITZ) (DAVID described him as a civilian scientist who was also a friend of WILTON VANNES)
- WILLIAM SPINDELL (DAVID described him as a chemist and soldier)
- EMANUEL SCHWARTZ (DAVID described him as a civilian mathematician employed at Los Alamos)

He also stated that he believed that he gave to GOLD a list of employees who were in the technical area at Los Alamos.

On September 14, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS was again interviewed concerning the identity of any of the friends of JULIUS who were working upstate New York. DAVID said that he could only recall that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that he had a "friend" working upstate New York in jet research. DAVID said to the best of his knowledge this was either in the latter part of 1947 or the early part of 1948 when JULIUS told him this. DAVID stated that he did not know any person employed either in Republic Aviation or Vultee Aircraft.

DAVID stated that in about September 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that he had been to a friend's house and had met an old school-mate, STEVE JAVNA, a Hungarian. JULIUS told DAVID that JAVNA was working for the Wright Aviation Company on design and development of a solenoid pump which was to be used to feather propeller blades hydraulically for the airplane, the XP 36. JULIUS told DAVID that JAVNA informed him that he had quit his job with Wright and had opened his own company, called MAGNETIC DEVICES COMPANY, in Long Island City, and had later moved his business and residence to New Jersey. JAVNA told JULIUS that he had obtained a contract for the manufacture of the above-described solenoid pump.

JULIUS gleefully told DAVID that he had been able to persuade JAVNA to let the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY (which was the company owned by JULIUS and DAVID) have a subcontract for the manufacture of certain parts of the pump.

DAVID stated that JAVNA gave them the contract and that the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY made about 1300 pairs of parts for the pump. He stated that he met JAVNA in the shop very often and that on one occasion he went out with JAVNA to buy a certain machine part (a comparison block to check micro-inch finish). He stated that during the time that he was out with JAVNA, JAVNA spoke politically and indicated that he was a Marxist. DAVID said that he had no other information concerning JAVNA except that JULIUS stated that he knew him from college.

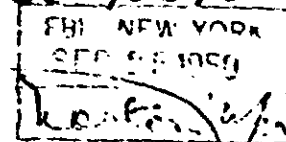

Mr. IVAN MAGINN, Attorney, 505 5th Avenue, New York City, was interviewed by the writer on September 25, 1950 and advised that he did not know JULIUS ROSENBERG after the latter's picture was displayed to him. Mr. MAGINN was advised by the writer that among the possessions of the subject at the time of his arrest was a business card which read as follows:

Rivercrest-on-the-Hudson
Ft. Montgomery, New York
Highland Falls 933.

In respect to this, Mr. MAGINN stated that such business cards were available to many people, especially those who had the occasion to spend their weekends at the Rivercrest-on-the-Hudson. Mr. MAGINN stated that due to the fact that the hotel records reflecting names of guests at the Rivercrest-on-the-Hudson were destroyed during the fire of the hotel in 1946, he could in no way determine what guests spent any time at the hotel.

In addition to displaying ROSENBERG'S picture to Mr. MAGINN, the following pictures were also shown to him with negative results:

HELEN TURNER, 115 West 57th Street, New York City, advised that she was employed by the Jewish Community Home Maker Service and she had an appointment to meet Mrs. ROSENBERG on August 11, 1950 which was not kept by MRS. ROSENBERG. This appointment was made to obtain assistance for MRS. ROSENBERG'S children and home while her husband was under arrest. MRS. TURNER was not of any value to this case as far as espionage was concerned.

DAVID GREENGLASS, admitted Espionage agent, advised that it was his belief that the person who had occupied apartment GS-11, 10 Monroe Street, NYC, prior to JULIUS ROSENBERG was also an espionage agent. Confidential informant advised DAVID KAPTEL had occupied apartment GS-11, 10 Monroe Street, NYC, from 10/1/41 to 4/11/42, at which time he moved to Montrose, New York. Background information on KAPTEL set forth.

DETAILS:

Investigation in this case is predicated on information received from DAVID GREENGLASS, admitted espionage agent, who gave a signed statement to SAC JOHN W. LEWIS and LEO H. FRUTKIN of the New York office, July 17, 1950, a pertinent part of which is being set forth:

"Through conversations with JULIUS ROSENBERG, I got the impression that the man who previously rented the apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, now occupied by ROSENBERG, was an engineer also engaged in Soviet espionage, and it was through this medium that ROSENBERG was able to get the apartment. This man left New York City ostensibly to go to the West coast to live, but instead went to China."

In a subsequent interview with DAVID GREENGLASS, GREENGLASS advised that he had never seen the person who resided at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, prior to 1947, and he would not be able to identify a picture of the person.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that DAVID KAPPEL had occupied apartment 6C-11, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, from October 1, 1941 until April 14, 1947, at which time he moved to Montrose, New York. This informant further advised that DAVID KAPPEL was married and that his wife's name was Mrs. BARBARA E. KAPPEL.

The following investigation was conducted by SA NORMAN W. MILLER:

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised the subject's mother, one EILEEN KAPPEL, a widow, presently resides at Montrose, New York. The KAPPEL family has resided in Montrose, New York, for about 20 years. The subject's father, FRANCIS KAPPEL, deceased, was formerly Dean of Columbia University, New York City, and was also the President of the Carnegie Foundation.

Confidential Informant T-2, further advised that DAVID KAPPEL'S brother, PAUL, is presently employed by the European Recovery Program in Greece. The informant said the family has an excellent reputation and is believed to be entirely loyal to the United States. The informant knows of no derogatory information regarding DAVID KAPPEL or any member of the family. DAVID is married to BARBARA KAPPEL and they have four children. He is presently employed at Tunis, Tunisia, by the Gulf Oil Corporation.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that DAVID KAPPEL was employed by the Gulf Oil Corporation, Foreign Production Division, 17 Battery Place, New York City, on October 15, 1945, as a geologist, at which time he was sent to the Colombian Gulf Oil Company, Bogota, Colombia. He remained there until December 30, 1949, at which time he was sent to Tunis, Tunisia, where he is presently assigned.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that KAPPEL was born August 5, 1911, in Quogue, Long Island, New York. This informant advised the subject was 6' tall and weighed 175 pounds. KAPPEL registered for Selective Service at Local Board 34, East Hampton, Middlesex County, Connecticut. His Social Security number

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was given as 245-24-4699. The Informant further advised that KEPEL had the previous employments:

- 1933 - 1934 - Field Assistant, TVA, North Carolina
- 1934 - 1935 - Assistant Recorder, the Texas Company, Fort Worth, Texas
- 1937 - 1941 - Professor, Wesleyan University, Middletown, Connecticut
- 1938 - 1941 (inters) - Geologist, Connecticut Geological and Natural History Organization
- 1941 - 1942 - Technical Aid, Office of Scientific Research and Development, New York City (Confidential war research)
- 1942 - Geologist, Colonial Sica Corporation, 141 Broadway, New York City

Confidential Informant F-3 made available a full face and profile photograph of DAVID KEPEL, which is being maintained in the New York file.

In June 1942, DAVID KEPEL applied for a position at the Office for Emergency Management, and the results of the investigation as conducted by SA R. J. LANEY at New York City are being set forth as follows:

[redacted] Registrar, Columbia University, Broadway and 115th Street, New York City, advised that DAVID KEPEL entered Columbia University in September, 1929 and that in June, 1932 he received his B.A. degree. From September, 1932 to June, 1933, KEPEL also attended Columbia University; at the completion of his course, he received an M.A. degree. From September, 1935 to June 1937, KEPEL also attended courses at Columbia University, working on a Ph.D. degree, and on June 4, 1940, he received his degree of Doctor of Philosophy. KEPEL stated that KEPEL had taken a liberal arts course and that he had majored in Geology. [redacted] further stated that KEPEL had made good grades while in Columbia University and that his conduct and attendance were rated as good. He also stated that KEPEL had been a member of Iota Psi social fraternity, a member of the crew squad for three years, and a member of the cross country squad, one year, earning a varsity letter in 1933.

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P. W. [REDACTED]'s investigation further reflected that [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] and his wife, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], had maintained an apartment in Knickerbocker Village, 10 [REDACTED] Street, and that they were considered excellent tenants. This [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had always paid his rent on time, and that they had never caused any trouble nor did the neighbors complain concerning their activities.

[REDACTED] stated that she felt quite positive that [REDACTED] was perfectly loyal to this country and that she knew of no reason why he should not hold a position of trust with the United States Government.

Investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1942 failed to reveal any derogatory information on the subject's loyalty to the United States Government.

The records of the Consolidated Edison Company of New York reflected that service was first furnished to JULIUS ROSENBERG at apartment 6E-11, 10 [REDACTED] Street, on April 8, 1942, at which time he stated he was employed by the United States Signal Corps at Philadelphia, and that his former address was New York City, no street being furnished.

The records further reflect that ROSENBERG'S apartment previously had been occupied from October 1, 1941 to March 1942 by DAVID KAPPEL, and that prior to the latter's tenancy of the apartment, one ABRAHAM BERNI had occupied the apartment from September 1935 to September 1941. BERNI subsequently moved to 200 Clinton Street, Brooklyn, New York, residing there from September 1941 to July 1945, at which time he moved to 1770 Pine Street, San Francisco, California.

Confidential Informant [REDACTED] of known reliability, advised that Mrs. HELEN AS [REDACTED], mother of DAVID KAPPEL, advised that David is presently employed as a Geologist for the Gulf Oil Corporation in Tunisia. Mrs. KAPPEL said that his address was Boite postale B, P. O. Box, Tunisia, Africa. Mrs. KAPPEL said that DAVID had been employed by the Gulf Oil Corporation since the end of the war and that he recently spent two years in South America. Mrs. KAPPEL advised

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Confidential Informant K-5 that DAVID KAPPEL left for his present job in January, 1950, and that he plans to be gone for the next two years. Pres. KAP. 50 further advised the Informant that DAVID has never been to the West Coast nor has he ever worked in China or in any part of Asia.
