


It was ascertained in 1948 by the Birmingham office that while STEINGART resided in Birmingham, during 1948, that his address book contained the name of "J. ROSFUBURG, 10 Monroe Street, Apartment GE 11." His address book also contained the rames of numerous prominent CP members in Fan Francisco.

It will be roomlied that STHEGART was born January 1, 1900 in craia, Russia; that he was naturalized in EDNY on August 20, 1925; and that he was employed by the Browster Aeronautical Corporation, Long Island City, during 1941 wile he resided at 362 E. 10th Street, New York City. He was discharged from the Browster Aeronautical Corporation because of his participation in a strike which almost deused a complete shut down. STEINGART claimed to have been employed from September 1940 to July 1942 by the Bousing Authority in the City of Alexandria, Virginia when he applied for employment with the Vallejo Housing Authority in 1944.

Re memo of SA WILLIAM D. WRIGHT dated 8/31/50.

On October 28, 1950, SAS JOHN W. LEWIS and LESTER O. GALLAHER interviewed Mrs. PEARL GOLD KUSHNER, apartment 6C, 795 Hicks Street, Brooklyn, New York, concerning her knowledge of ETHEL ROSENBERG'S Communist Party activities. Mrs. KUSHNER admitted that she had formerly resided at 2 Attorney Street, New York City, but declined to confirm or deny that she had been active in the Communist Party and stated that she was unable to recall having known ETHEL ROSENBERG, ETHEL GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, DAVID GREENGLASS, or RUTH GREENGLASS. She said that in connection with any information she might be able to furnish in this regard, she would want to first discuss the matter with her husband.

She was again interviewed on November 24, 1950 : by SAS JOHN W. LEWIS and JAMES P. LEE. She again stated that she aid not know ETHEL ROSENBERG and aid not recognize her photograph. Mrs. KUSHNER also said that she would not want to testify because she feels that she should stay at home with her two year old daughter.

On November 15, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that RUTH GREENGLASS had advised him that about the time the GREENGLASS family was purchasing a lot for the grave of BARNET GREENGLASS in the Spring of 1949, JULIUS ROSENBERG gave DAVID GREENGLASS \$40.00 and BERNARD GREENGLASS \$140.00. These amounts were in addition to the money JULIUS had given them to apply toward the purchase of the grave.

BERNARD GREENGLASS at that time told his wife, GLADYS, that JULIUS had borrowed two or three thousand dollars from a friend who makes plenty of money.

Re San Francisco letter dated 10/28/50.

On November 13, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that the information given to him by JULIUS ROSENBERG concerning the illness of the wife of one of his contacts probably took place in either the late Spring of 1948 or September or October of 1948.

In this connection, DAVID GREENGLASS recalls at the time he had asked JULIUS for money and JULIUS had said that he had none because just one week previous it was necessary for him to furnish money to one of his contacts whose wife was sick. GREENGLASS had the impression that ROSENBERG was referring to one of his espionage contacts probably in upstate New York. GREENGLASS placed the time of this conversation because of the following circumstances:

About April, 1948, ROSENBERG was ill for about five weeks and after that there were no workers at the Pitt Machine Products Company because there was no business to be done at that time and no money coming in. GREENGLASS recalled that it was because there was no money coming in that he had been forced to ask ROSENBERG for money. He also recalls that at the time he asked ROSENBERG that the latter was dressed in work clothes and helping GREENGLASS at the small milling machine in the shop. Because of this, GREENGLASS feels certain that there were no other persons being employed at the plant or ROSENBERG would not be assisting him in the shop. He said it is possible that this may have occurred in September or October, 1948 because there was another slack season at 63-15348-971 that time and the employees were laid-off.

BERNARD WEINSTEIN was -re-interviewed at the N.Y. Office 11/29/50 by the writer and 3A STUART J. CAMERON. WEINSTEIN said he might have seen ROSEMBERG in Washington, D.C. on one or two occasions between 1936 and 1942. However, he could not recall any specific occasions for meetings with ROSEMBERG.

School, Washington, D.C. from 1936 to 1939 when he received his law degree. He said he received his Masters Degree from Southeastern Law School, Washington, D.C. in 1940. He advised further that Conais B. FLEISSIG went into a law partnership with him at the Southern Building, Washington, D.C., 15th Street and H, Washington, D.C. in the latter part of 1940. He said they dissolved the partnership at the end of 6 months because they were not making any money.

WEINSTEIN said he lived at a boarding house with FLEISSIG for one year, possibly in 1937 or 1938 at 1916 17th St N.W., Washington, D.C. with a family named KOHRN. WEINSTEIN said KOHRN was a personal friend of FLEISSIG'S.

ROSENSERG. He said FLEISSIG and ROSENSERG were known to each other, but he did not know the degree of relationship. \*\*EINSTEIN said he did not have any reason to believe FLEISSIG was connected with any espionage or Communist activities.

MINISTEIN advised that he himself, had been a dues paying member of the Young Communist League in 1934. He said the meetings were held in the apartment of Rabbi LOUIS IMDIAND in the Lavanburg Homes, Lower East Side, NYC. MEINSTEIN stated he did not recall who recruited him, but it was his opinion that he merely heard about the meetings and that he went to the meetings on his own volition. He said he never saw JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENDERS or LORRIS FLEISING at any of the meetings he attended. WEINSTEIN said he attended meetings of the YCL

for about 3 or 4 months and that he probably paid dues at the rate of 10 cents a week. WEINSTEIN said he knew of no other members of the club and the only name he could recall was Rabbi LOUIS NEILAND.

NATHAN SUSSMAN was interviewed November 29, 1950 at his place of employment, Fairchild Aviation Corporation, Farmingdale, Long Island, New York, by SA REX I. SHRODER and the writer.

SUSSMAN advised that he recalls SOBELL as a former classmate but stated that he did not know him very well and also advised that he did not recall SOBELL as a member of his laboratory team. He stated that he has not seen SOBELL since his graduation from CCNY.

SUSSMAN stated that he knew JULIUS ROSENBERG, having met him and having been associated with him at CCNY. He advised that following their graduation from CCNY he had seen ROSENBERG four or five times up to the year 1944 and that he had not seen him since 1944 until approximately March 1947 at which time SUSSMAN had returned to New York City from his employment with Western Electric in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. He advised that at this time he and his wife visited in ROSENBERG's home. SUSSMAN stated that ROSENBERG had never asked him what work he was engaged in nor had they discussed anything about his work at this last meeting in 1947.

SUSSMAN stated that neither ROSENBERG nor SOBELL had ever attempted to recruit him into the YCL or the Communist Party while they were at City College. In this connection SUSSMAN stated that he believed ROSENBERG might have been a "leftist" but on this matter he would not elaborate further. To his knowledge, ROSENBERG was not a member of any club or organization while a student at City College.

SUSSMAN identified a picture of WILLIAM DAN ZIGER as an individual whose face was familiar, and upon being given

the name, he advised that the name was also familiar to him. He advised that he had no recollection of any association between SOBELL. ROSENBERG or DANZIGER.

He subsequently added that ALFRED SARANT was the only individual of the approximately twenty persons who were at this party that he recalled. He then stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was at this party. It is pointed out that the identification of GLASSMAN as an individual at this party was made from an examination of GLASSMAN's photograph.

SUSSMAN was shown a picture of WILLIAM PERL and he advised that this photograph was familier. However, he did not recall the name. He stated that he recognized the picture as a former classmate but that he had not seen him since he left City College.

individuals who have been associated with ROSENBERG, SUSSMAN advised that he recalls MAX ELITCHER as a former classmate. He advised that he did not know MIKE and ANN SIDOROVICH but stated that he may have seen MIKE.

He identified a picture of STANLEY RICH as an individual whom he recalled at City College but stated that he had not seen him since that time.

In connection with the names listed above, SUSSMAN stated that he could not recall ROSENBERG having mentioned any of their former classmates in any of their discussions or conversations.

SUSSMAN identified a picture of ALFRED SARANT and further identified him as a fellow employee in his, SUSSMAN's section at Western Electric. SUSSMAN stated that SARANT was a fellow employee.

friend of JOEL BARR. He stated that he might have gone to SARANT's epertment in 1943. During subsequent conversation SUSSMAN edvised that he recalled having been in the apartment which BARR and SARANT occupied and stated that he recalled that it was somewhere between 14th and 20th Streets, but that he could not recall the exact location. He stated that this visit occurred prior to the group going ice skating. He stated that there was one other couple in the epartment on that occasion but he did not recall their identity.

The following background information was obtained from SUSSMAN following the above interview:

Date of birth - May 5, 1918, New York City. Father - ABRAHAM Mother - JENNIE VIETCHNER Brother - DANIEL SUSSMAN Wife - GERTRUDE EDELSTEIN

He advised he attended CCNY from 1933 to 1938, obtaining a BS end ME in Electrical Engineering. He subsequently attended Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute during the years 1940 to 1942, doing work toward his doctor's degree, but he stated that he did not receive this degree. He also advised that intermittently during the years 1943 to 1947 he had attended the New School where he took courses in Economics.

Former residences: 405 Rockeway Parkway, from which he moved in 1936 to Allen Street, New York City. It should be noted that SUSSMAN was unable to recall the address on Allen Street but advised he believed that it was in the 80's and he specifically mentioned 86. It is known from election check that the SUSSMAN family resided in 1936 at 50 Allen Street. The family then moved to 275 Broome Street, also in 1936. In 1940 they moved to 103 Eldridge Street, New York City.

He advised that he was married in December 1943, at which time he resided at 43-09 47th Avenue, Sunnyside, Queens. Following this address, he advised that he resided in Winston-Salem, North Carolina where he was employed at

Western Electric. From May 1947 to October 1947, he advised that he and his wife resided with his wife's family at 1902 81st Street, Brooklyn. Subsequent to this he advised that he had purchased the house where he currently resides at 56-55 205th Street, Bayside, Queens.

advised that he was employed as a clerk in the Department of Welfare. From 1940 to April 1942 he was employed as an inspector of naval material with headquarters at both 30 Church Street and 90 Church Street, but that most of the time he spent at Western Electric in Kearny, New Jersey in connection with this naval inspector's work. He advised that prior to the time of leaving this employment, for a period of time which he was unable to recall he was permanently stationed in Kearny, New Jersey.

SUSSMAN advised that following this employment he went to Western Electric Company at Bayonne, New Jersey and was employed by this company in Bayonne, Jersey City, Kearny, New Jersey, and Winston-Salem, North Carolina. This employment, he advised, was terminated in November or December of 1947.

in January 1948. He stated he is employed on classified material, both Army and Navy contracts. This classification, he advised, is confidential. He stated that he is an electronics engineer doing design work on controls.

SUSSMAN stated that all of his contacts with the various individuals set out above were social. He advised that there were no hints or suggestions made to him to furnish any material to them. He advised that to his knowledge none of these individuals were members of the Young Communist League or the Communist Party. He stated that none of them ever attempted to recruit him. He reiterated that he had visited ROSENBERG and stated that the last visit occurred in the spring of 1947 and during this visit he advised that he was in ROSENBERG's shop, the Pitt Machine Works.

It is noted that SUSSMAN during the period of the interview appeared very nervous, gave cryptic ensuers to the

questions, and he volunteered no information beyond specific questions asked of him. In many instances he would not definitely commit himself by stating that he knew an individual but usually prefaced the remark with, "I might have".

In accordance with Bureau instructions, SUSSMAN.

In accordance with Bureau instructions, SUSSMAN was not questioned concerning his own activity or Communist affiliation. As is noted, the interview was confined to SOBELL and ROSENBERG and other members of the ROSENBERG ring, and the interview was conducted from the standpoint of SUSSMAN having been a classmate of these various individuals at CCNY.

On Wednesday, December 6, 1950, I was requested to sit with
Attorney Emanuel Block and his father while they examined the books of Pitt
Machine Tool in the office of AUSA Miles Lane, SDNY. During this examination
they inspected the Minute Book, the Stock Transfer Ledger, the Stock Certificate
book and two books containing check stubs for the years 1948 and 1949.

They expressed an interest in the checks drawn for payroll in which Rosenberg and David and Bernard Greenglass received mages. They noted checks paid to Rosenberg and the Greenglasses which were shown to be repayment of advances.

Emanuel Block made a special note of a check paid to faniel Reit, dated June 4, 1948 in the amount of \$150.00 for services rendered. He explained to his father that Rosenberg had told him that Reit was an attorney who had handled a case for him involving a judgment and that they, Rosenberg and Reit, had agreed to split the amount realized an the judgment.

Emanuel Block had remarked to his father that he had seen the statements pertaining to the bank account of Pitt Machine. This is being mentioned here because the statements and cancelled checks for this account have never been made available to this office.

LEADS - Check indices of the New York Office for references in the name of Daniel Reit.

Contact Daniel Reit and obtain details of the case in which he represented Rosenberg and the outcome thereof. Ascertain how Rosenberg happened to select him as attorney and obtain all information known to Reit regarding the activities.

Hills, Queens, NYC, was interviewed by SA VINCENT J. BURKE 11/29/50. Mr. LUSTIG described himself as age 36, born 10/2/14 in NYC, a resident at 807 Riverside Drive, Manhattan, for many years prior to moving a few months ago to his present address. He is an investigator for the NY State Department of Labor, 80 Centre Street, Manhattan, and is occupied mainly in checking payrolls of business firms.

He has known BLOCK for about twenty years as a neighbor and well-known CP speaker in Upper Manhattan during the 1930's. He described BLOCK as about 5'9", 175 pounds, having wiry, gray-black hair when he last saw him to speak to, briefly on the street, about five months ago.

LUSTIG recalled BLOCK as openly indicating he was a Communist in his speeches and by his close association with known Communists such as CLAUDIA JONES and a WILLIAM MILLER who headed a CP group, name not recalled by LUSTIG, which held meetings at 3785 Broadway, NYC.

He described this WILLIAM MILLER as having been, like LUSTIG, a resident at 807 Riverside Drive, and an attorney for a time with the United Electrical Workers.

The NY Division files reflect that a WILLIAM HENRY MILLER, born 9/8/12 in Philadelphia, was an Organizer for the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America and later became a Captain in the US Army, having permanent address at 807 Riverside Drive, NYC. The files reflected no information as to any CP activities on the part of LUSIIG.

As for any information concerning BLOCK'S activities in recent years other than those reported in the

newspapers, LUSTIG said he had none, but would be glad to advise the FBI in case he learned anything.

It should be noted that the case on BLOCK is being maintained in a pending inactive status until the trial of his client, JULIUS ROSENBERG, is completed. The date for this trial has not yet been set, but it is expected to commence in January, 1951.

(MERVIN ISAACS, CPA, 1220 Broadway, New York City, accountant for Pitt Machine Products, Company, was interviewed at the New York Office Monday, December 11, 1950. He examined the balance sheet he prepared for Pitt Machine dated December 31, 1949 and the work papers attached thereto.


ISAACS stated that the inventory reflected on the work papers, namely, work in process \$1,000.00 and inventory \$8,000.00 was furnished to him by ROJENBERG when he, ISAACS, was preparing the balance sheet of December 31, 1949. He also stated that the inventory actually reflected in the balance sheet as of December 31, 1949, namely, inventory—in process (EST) \$1,050.00, raw materials \$10,500.00, total \$11,550.00, was furnished to him by JULIUS ROSENBERG. These facts he can testify to.

The circumstances surrounding the reason for the change, ISAACS stated, he could only guess because he does not recall them. His guess is that the original estimate furnished by ROSENBERG of \$9,000.00 in inventory was probably based upon the involtory in the balance sheet for September 30, 1949, which was shown as \$8,845.00. ISAACS stated that he believed that it was around the end of 1949 that DAVID SCHEIN was intending to withdraw his financial support from Pitt Machine and it may have been for the purpose of obtaining new. financial aid that this balance sheet as of December 31, 1949 was prepared.

The fact that the inventory of \$9,000.00 reflected a loss in the operations, ISAACS believes that this may be the reason for ROSENBERG increasing the amount of the inventory to \$11,550.00 which would reflect a profit in the operations of the company.




#### Re: United States v. Rosenberg, et al.

I spoke with Mr. Harry Gold today in this building with reference to four points. The first three related to Mr. Gold's attitude in general since imposition of sentence on him in Philadelphia last week. The fourth point concerned a pipe which the Dohertys purchased for Mr. Gold as a Christmas present two years ago.

Mr. Gold advised that this pipe was made by John Middleton, that it is a curved pipe with a large brown bowl. I gathered from Mr. Gold that this pipe had unusual characteristics. Mr. Gold advised that he was smoking this pipe — that he had it in his mouth — when Rosenberg saw him; that he thought Rosenberg would remember the pipe because of its peculiar shape. Mr. Gold advised that this pipe is now at his home in Philadelphia and suggested that we procure it for the forthcoming trial of the Rosenbergs. Mr. Gold further advised that either his brother or father would be able to locate the pipe in order to turn it over.


