



HARRINGTON that she now recalls that during the first week in May, 1945 she received a letter from ETHEL ROSENBERG instructing her to be available for an espionage contact at the prearranged place on the last two Saturdays in May, 1945.

A review of the correspondence obtained from the home of DAVID GREENGLASS failed to locate the above mentioned letter from ETHEL ROSENBERG, which was probably destroyed soon after it was received. The New York Office is in possession of a letter from RUTH GREENGLASS at Albuquerque, New Mexico, to DAVID GREENGLASS at Santa Fe, New Mexico, dated May 8, 1945, in which RUTH states she received a letter from ETHEL yesterday. No mention is made of the contents of ETHEL'S letter.

Reference report of SA (A) GERALD J. VAN DORN, dated December 2, 1950 at New York, page 9, which reflects that the Common Stock held by BERNARD GREENGLASS in the Pitt Machine Products Co., INC. was endorsed by BERNARD GREENGLASS January 4, 1950, but was not transferred to JULIUS ROSENBERG on the books of the company until May 1, 1950.

In this regard BERNARD GREENGLASS, 65 Cannon Street, NYC, was interviewed 2/17/51 at which time he furnished the following information:

About September, 1949 BERNARD GREENGLASS quit working at Pitt Machine Products Co., Inc. About November or December, 1949 at the home of Mrs. TESSIE GREENGLASS, 64 Sheriff Street, NYC, JULIUS ROSENBERG told BERNARD GREENGLASS and DAVID GREENGLASS that he thought he could get DAVID SHEIN out of the company and make a success of the business if JULIUS ROSENBERG had control of all of the common stock owned by DAVID and BERNARD GREENGLASS.

JULIUS ROSENBERG told both DAVID and BERNARD GREENGLASS at that time that if they would turn over their common stock to him he would later give them either \$1,000 or \$1,500 each for this stock if he was able to make a success of the business.

No decision in that regard was made at that time, but about January, 1950 JULIUS ROSENBERG came to BERNARD GREENGLASS'S home and asked him if he would be willing to turn over his stock to ROSENBERG. BERNARD advised JULIUS that he would be willing to turn over his stock if DAVID GREENGLASS would also agree to turn over DAVID'S stock.

DAVID GREENGLASS made out a note for <sup>future</sup> payment for the stock by JULIUS ROSENBERG, but JULIUS declined to sign it because he said he would not be able to deal with SHEIN if there was a note outstanding.

BERNARD GREENGLASS'S stock was kept together with that of DAVID GREENGLASS'S stock by RUTH GREENGLASS in a safety deposit box inasmuch as BERNARD had no safe place to maintain the stock.

When DAVID GREENGLASS decided to give his stock to JULIUS ROSENBERG without payment, BERNARD also signed over to JULIUS ROSENBERG BERNARD'S 25 shares of common stock in the Pitt Machine Products Co., Inc.

BERNARD GREENGLASS said that he believes that either DAVID GREENGLASS or RUTH GREENGLASS actually handed both blocks of stock to JULIUS at a later date.

BERNARD GREENGLASS was unable to recall whether he had had his signature notarized in regard to the transfer of the stock to JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The referenced report on page 15A reflects that Pitt Machine Products Co., Inc., accountant, ISAACS, prepared a balance sheet dated December 31, 1949, for ROSENBERG in connection with some bank loan or bid on a Government contract. BERNARD GREENGLASS advised that inasmuch as he was not working for the Pitt Co. as of December 31, 1949, he is unable to furnish accurate information concerning the accuracy of the balance sheet prepared for the firm at that time, and said that the balance sheet may have been prepared either for a bank loan or to obtain a Government contract.

BERNARD GREENGLASS did advise that the inventory of the company at that time may have been worth more than the book value would show inasmuch as the company had purchased a considerable amount of tool steel from junk dealers which was worth more than the amount actually paid for the steel.

Referenced report on page 34 reflects that no salaries were received by the officers of the Pitt Machine Products Co., Inc., during the period from October, 1948 to July 28, 1950.

BERNARD GREENGLASS advised that during the period between October, 1948 and July 28, 1950, the Pitt Machine Products Co., Inc., had no money available to pay the officers. He said that he had been able to pay his personal expenses during that period by depleting his bank account, cashing all of his savings bonds, spending about \$250.00 of the baby's money and by receiving financial assistance from his father-in-law. He advised that he also received \$45.00 per month pension from the United States Government because of a partial disability sustained while he was in the Army during World War II. He advised that DAVID GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG also depleted their savings during that period.

The referenced report on page 39 reflects a schedule of the Capital Investment and Withdrawals of Capital of the partners in the G & R Engineering Company.

BERNARD GREENGLASS examined the schedule of Capital Investments and Withdrawals of Capital listed in the books of the G & R Engineering Co. and advised that he is of the opinion that this schedule is correct. He stated that the capital investments made by him on April 20, 1946, in the amount of \$205.00 and \$943.50 were amounts taken from his own savings. BERNARD GREENGLASS said that the \$3,870.00 investment by him in G & R Engineering Company on July 3, 1946, represented loans made from relatives. These loans were obtained from ISIDORE FEIT (uncle), REGINA FEIT (sunt), JEAN KELSCH (sister-in-law) and TUSSIE GREENGLASS (mother).

In this regard he furnished the following signed statement:

"February 17, 1951

"I, BERNARD GREENGLASS, make the following voluntary statement to JOHN W. LEWIS whom I know to be a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I understand that it may be used in a court of law.

"I was a partner of my brother DAVID GREENGLASS and my brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG in the G & R Engineering Company in which I invested about \$1100 of my own money and about \$3800 borrowed from relatives, in 1946. In 1947 the G & R Engineering Company was succeeded by the Pitt Machine Products Company Incorporated in which I received 25 shares of Common Stock for my investment. In the early part of 1950 I turned over my 25 shares of stock to JULIUS ROSENBERG on his promise that he would pay me \$1000 or \$1500 at a later time if he were able to make a financial success of Pitt Machine Products Inc. To date I have received no payment for the stock. I think that about \$1100 of the \$3800 I borrowed from relatives, has been repaid, so that I now have about \$1100 of my own and about \$2700 of my relatives invested in Pitt Machine Products Inc., which JULIUS ROSENBERG recently sold for about \$10,000. After the corporation was sold, I asked JULIUS ROSENBERG'S attorney, Mr. BLOCK if I was going to receive any of the proceeds of the sale, to pay off the loans made from relatives. He gave me no answer to this question.

On 1/16/51, Mrs. GERTRUDE SUSSMAN advised the writer by phone that she desired to submit for information the term paper on the CP which she had composed in connection with a sociology course she took at Columbia in 1944.

On 1/18/51, SA REX I. SHRODER and the writer contacted Mrs. SUSSMAN at her residence. She turned over a 44 page typewritten manuscript entitled "The Participant-Observer", the title apparently referring to the role of the author. The manuscript gives thumbnail sketches of various types encountered by the author, and discusses certain problems current in the Communist Political Association, such as recruitment, helping recruits interested, the role of the American Labor Party, etc. Persons are identified only by first names as nicknames. The original of this manuscript has since been returned to Mrs. SUSSMAN file.

On the occasion of turning over the manuscript, Mrs. SUSSMAN mentioned the the "VIVIAN" who figures therein is a Mrs. I. HEISLER, who as of 6/7/46 was residing at 48-20 44th St., L.I. She was evasive when asking concerning the identities of other persons, stating that she would have to make inquiries on her own to ascertain this, inquiring as to whether it had something to do with the ROSENBERG ring, etc., so the matter was not pressed.

Mrs. SUSSMAN stated that she had been recruited into the CPA by her husband shortly after their marriage in December, 1943, and that early in 1944 they had been transferred by the CPA to the Sunnyside Section, CPA. She stated that it was her belief that ROSENBERG was a member of the group to which her husband belonged when she was recruited. However, she could not say ROSENBERG attended meetings because she herself was never certain whether she was attending group discussions, neighborhood social affairs, ALP caucuses or CPA meetings.

She stated she found it impossible to tell which was which, since collection of dues and organized political discussions seemed to be carried on at all such affairs. Meetings of this nature took place at her home as well as the ROSENBERG residence. She had no hesitation in characterizing ROSENBERG as a Communist, basing this on his opinions as repeatedly expressed. She never saw him pay dues.

Mrs. SUSSMAN stated that early in 1944, when she and her husband had already made an "emotional break" with the Party, and wished to dissociate himself unobtrusively. However, since she had embarked on a term paper on the CPA in connection with her sociology course, and was still interested in Communism, she influenced him to accompany her to regular meetings of the CPA, Sunnyside Section. By the end of 1944 she had finished her term paper, felt that she also had made an "emotional break", and could view the Party objectively. Since the beginning of 1945, according to Mrs. SUSSMAN, neither she nor her husband have taken any active part of CPA or CP, and have dropped their membership. In the light of recent events, they see Communism as "a menace".

With reference to the apartment on Morton St. where she visited with her husband, it was her belief that this was SARANT'S residence, not BARR'S. She recalled that there were two girls living in an apartment across the hall who were on friendly terms with SARANT. She was informed that they were homosexuals.

Mrs. SUSSMAN mentioned that after her manuscript had been type up, some time early in 1945, she brought it with her when she and her husband visited the ROSENBERG'S. JOEL BARR was present at this visit, and she showed the manuscript to him. She states that after reading it he threw it across the room, stating it was "junk" or "stupid" or some such term. She believes this was because BARR was a devoted Communist and the manuscript contains critical comments about the CP.

Mrs. SUSSMAN also mentioned that during some period of their acquaintance with the ROSENBERG'S, the ROSENBERG residence was cluttered up with furniture and ROSENBERG said he was holding the furniture for a couple who were good friends of his. He mentioned that the woman was an organizer for a union, and was then in the South organizing agricultural workers. The nearest date Mrs. SUSSMAN can give on this is 1942-1944. She also stated that ROSENBERG mentioned good friends of his who had a country place where they raised poultry, either as a hobby or for a living, but she has no name for them, believes they maybe the same couple whose furniture ROSENBERG was keeping.

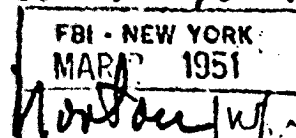

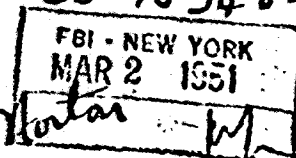

WILLIAM DANZIGER, ESPIONAGE (R). SUBJECT WAS QUESTIONED DURING A PRE-TRIAL INTERVIEW BY USA SAYPOL, AUSAS ROY COHN, NYLES J. LANE, JAMES KILSHEIMER, AND NY AGENTS IN THE PRESENCE OF SUBJECT'S ATTORNEY MORRIS EHRLICH. DANZIGER REPEATED IN SUBSTANCE THE STATEMENTS PREVIOUSLY GIVEN TO BUREAU AGENTS AND TO AUSA LANE AND IN HIS GRAND JURY TESTIMONY. I called Inspector Hennrich of the Bureau and made reference to our teletype of 2/26/51, in particular the last part relating to the utilization of atomic energy in airplanes.

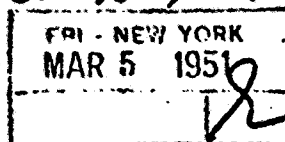

# Ousted 'Risk' Sues Army, Father Aided Rosenbergs

Special to the New York Post

Washington, Nov. 17 — A "security risk" whose father helped win an 11th hour stay of execution for atom spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg has filed suit to force the Army to give him an honorable discharge.

Charles H. Marshall, 23, of Los Angeles, was given an "undesirable" discharge early this year. He had invoked the Fifth Amendment in refusing to answer a loyalty questionnaire.

## Called Red Sympathizer

His use of the Fifth Amendment and the action of his father, Daniel G. Marshall, Los Angeles attorney, in behalf of the Rosenbergs were linked by the Army to a third charge—that Charles Marshall and his father were Red sympathizers and his mother attended Communist Party functions.

The case was similar to a number of others now pending before Army review boards and civilian courts throughout the country.

Young Marshall was inducted into the Army on Aug. 12, 1953. He received a confidential letter from the Army embodying the charges against him on June 15, 1954.

Early this year he charged he

had been forcibly thrown out of the Army without discharge papers. The "undesirable" discharge followed.

## Father Asked Rosenberg Stay

More than two years ago the elder Marshall joined with attorney Fyke Farmer of Nashville, Tenn., to petition for a stay of execution for the Rosenbergs on the grounds that the trial judge, Irving R. Kaufman, lacked the authority to condemn the Rosenbergs without a death recom-

mendation by the jury.

Neither lawyer had been associated with the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, the Communist-dominated organization that financed the defense. Kaufman castigated them as "intruders and interlopers."

Nevertheless, U. S. Supreme Court Justice Douglas granted a stay, which was set aside by the full court two days later. The Rosenbergs were electrocuted the same night.
