

It was ascertained that the business located at this address is a small hand laundry doing a neighborhood business. The proprietor, Mrs. Gertznas, advised that she has no recollection or record of any business transaction with the Pitt Machine Products Inc. or Julius Rosenberg or David Greenglass.

On 3/6/51 inquiry was made concerning purchases from 4/13/49 to 12/20/49 from the Pitt Machine Products Inc. by Continental Electric Co. 131 Boerum St. Brooklyn, N.Y. and for information concerning the activities of Julius Rosenberg and David Greenglass.

Mr. Irving Goodman, owner, Phenix Sales Housewares Corp. 131 Boerum St. Brooklyn, N.Y. advised that this firm formerly had a subsidiary corporation known as the Continental Electric Co., when the Phenix firm was located at 206 Middleton St. Brooklyn but that Continental Electric Co. was dissolved before 1949. Goodman recollected that the dissolution was in 1948. He stated that the Phenix Sales Houseware Corp. moved to 131 Boerum St. Brooklyn in about January 1950, the former building located at this address having been destroyed by fire in 1949. He had no recollection on record of any business transactions with the Pitt Machine Products, Inc. and did not know Julius Rosenberg or David Greenglass.

On 3/5/51 Miss Penny Del Regno, Clerk in office of W.J. Roberts Co. 59 John St. N.Y.C. was contacted by the writer.

She advised after checking her office records that no insurance policy had been issued for the Pitt Machine Products, Inc. under policy #722128 of the Standard Marine Insurance Co. Ltd. 108 John St. N.Y.C. Similarly she advised that W.J. Roberts Company had no relationship to her knowledge with a Page Agency.

Miss Del Regno did locate a fire and extended insurance policy which had been issued in the name of Pitt Machine Products Inc. 370 East Houston St. N.Y.C. under policy #263552. This policy became effective May 10, 1949 and normally would have remained effective until May 10, 1950. However the records reflected that this policy was cancelled on June 15, 1949; on 7 12/49, the premium for the effective period of the policy was paid by the Pitt Machine Company.

Miss Del Regno said that the order for the policy came to W.J. Roberts Co. from Charles Kaiser Associates now doing business as Spencer Marshall & Co. Inc. 1841 Broadway, N.Y.C.

On 3/5/51 Mr. L.M. Peine 30 Church St. N.Y.C. was contacted by the writer. Mr. Peine advised that he is a collection Agent for numerous insurance Companies in the metropolitan area and is concerned with collections of unpaid premiums on insurance policies from companies which have received insurance coverage but have not paid premiums for the period of coverage.

He advised that the Pitt Machine Company of 370 E. Houston St. N.Y. sounded familiar to him, but was unable to state whether he had ever contacted this firm for collection purposes.

A review of his correspondence files for the year 1949 to the present time disclosed no correspondence with the Pitt Machine Company. Mr. Peine only maintains records for a period of one year and then destroys them. He had no correspondence dating back prior to 1949.

He advised that he did not know Julius Rosenberg or David Greenglass. He was unable to furnish any additional information.

MRS. JENNIE MORRISON, insurance broker with offices located at 75 Maiden Lane was interviewed by the writer on 3/5/1951.


MRS. MORRISON resides at 14 Monroe St., Knickerbocker Village, and has lived there for the mast several years. She recalled that in 1946 or 1947 her daughter spoke to a MR. ISADORE GOLDSTEIN, an employee or officer of the Pitt Machine Company, who was anxious to secure compensation insurance for coverage of Pitt's employees. MRS. MORRISON subsequently contacted MR. GOLDSTEIN, obtained particulars about his firm, and had a policy issued through the Great American Indemnity Company, 89 John Street.

MRS. MORRISON said her records were not accessible at the present time. She said complete information about this compensation policy could be obtained at the above mentioned company. She said that after about one year of the policy's existence, she went to the Pitt Machine Company, and spoke to the bookkeeper, name unknown, about renewing the policy. She was advised that the Company no longer had need of such a policy, and accordingly it was discontinued.

MRS. MORRISON said she did not know JULIUS ROSENBERG or DAVID GREENGLASS and had no recollection of having spoken to either of them about this policy.

MR. MILTON F. LINK, Vice-President of Great American Indemnity Company, 89 John Street, was then contacted regarding Policy #C 264464. This noticy was issued in the names of JULIUS ROSENBYRG, DAVID GRWENGLASS, BERNAYD AND ISANORE GOLDSTEIN as G.&R. Engineering Company, 302 E. 2 St., New York. The policy was dated 3/6/1947 and expired on 3/6/1948. Policy was issued through insurance agent J. MORRISON. It was set forth that the post office address for this company was 370 E. Houston St., which change in address occurred about February 1948.





Judge Irving Kaufman called me at 9:35 AM today to advise that he had received a letter in reference to the Greenglass case which contains a vague threat to the effect that "if you continue to allow Greenglass to testify you will be a very sorry man". He advised that the letter was signed MAX SCHWARTZ and the envelope bore a return address which of course might be false. I pointed out that the threat was rather vague but I would arrange to have the letter picked up from the Judge's secretary and then check the indices, and appropriate action would then be taken. The Judge indicated he didn't have a possible violation of the extortion a statute in mind but just felt if the man could be found at the address given an Agent might check to see what he meant by telling the Judge he would be sorry; that probably the writer is slightly affected mentally. He requested that the letter be returned to him after it has been perused here.
