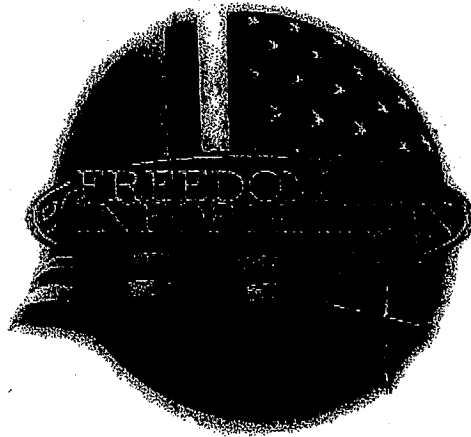

Alfred Rand, who is the President of the RAINERALOPPE, 115 Cedar Street, New Rochelle, N.Y. and who resides at 9 Abbyville Lane, Orchard Hill, N.Y., advised his Corporation was formerly known as the RAND Corporation having its offices at 141 Wooster St., N.Y.C. Upon checking his records, he advised that on 1-10-49, 2-17-49 and 2-11-49 he had work done for him by the Pitt Machine Co., 370 Houston St., N.Y.C. totalling altogether approximately \$100. He stated that his company is in the Metal Business and that is interested in perfecting any gadget which might assist in polishing metal. In January 1949 he invented a gadget which he thought could aid his business and, therefore, he looked through the classified Red Book in order to see if there was any machine shop near his office on Wooster St., which might make a polishing jig and a gadget to support the polishing jig. He noticed there was a machine shop nearby called the Pitt Machine Co. and, therefore, he phoned the latter company and spoke to a Mr. Rosenberg at Gramercy 3-8330. Mr. Rosenberg agreed to do the work specified. RAND does not know what Rosenberg's first name is or what his connection was with the Pitt Machine Co. He never saw Rosenberg and merely

knows he spoke on the telephone to a man named Rosenberg because he had made a notation to that effect in the order form to the Pitt Machine Co.

RAND stated he does not know JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG and does not know DAVIS or RUTH GREENGLASS. He did not know they were connected with the Pitt Machine Co. He remembered, however, that he had recently read

in the newspaper. He added that no other official had any contact with Pitt Machine Co.

On March 14, 1951, Dr. William Spindel, East Greenbush, N.Y., advised our Albany Field Office that he had read the testimony of David Greenglass in the "New York Times" in which Greenglass stated that Spindel advised him that Nick Baker was Nils Bohr.

Spindel stated that this information was common knowledge at Los Alamos and that he is prepared to deny flatly that he ever furnished this information to Greenglass. Spindel stated that his purpose in contacting the office was to "be put on record". Spindel gave no indication that he had been asked to serve as a defense witness.

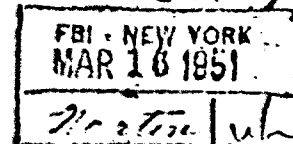
Mr. Hennrich called at 11:30 A.M. and advised that the U.S. Attorney's Office had identified the representative of the airline in Mexico City, who was to come to the U.S. to testify, as GLEN DAVIS. He said the Legal Attache has identified him as GLEN DENNIS and to desired to know what name had been set forth on the subpoena forwarded by the U.S. Attorney's Office to the Department of Justice.

I called Mr. Hennrich back and stated that the name the U.S. Attorney's Office had and which they obtained personally on their trip to Mexico City, was GLEN DAVIS. I told Mr. Hennrich we had advised the U.S. Attorney's Office that possibly his name was GLEN DENNIS and it was suggested the U.S. Attorney's Office here contact the Department of Justice and request them to authorize the State Department to properly correct the subpoena. I told Mr. Hennrich the U.S. Attorney's Office said they would do this and in the meantime asked that we advise the Legal Attache so the latter could inform DAVIS' employers that a subpoena had been issued.

Mr. Hennrich said this would be done.

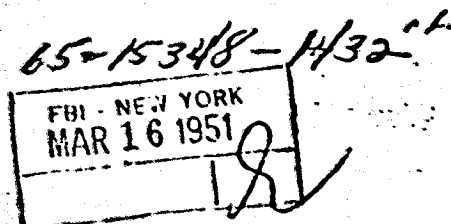

COLONEL HOLZMAN AGREES WITH STATEMENT OF DARWIN IN REF WFOTEL THAT ALL REPORTS RE PROJECT HAVE BEEN FROM INCEPTION, AND STILL ARE, SECRET. NY AUTHORIZED TO FURNISH CONTENTS OF WFOTEL DATED FIFTEENTH TO USA AND ASCERTAIN FROM HIM IF TESTIMONY OF HOLZMAN AS OUTLINED ABOVE WILL BE SUFFICIENT FOR PURPOSES INSTANT TRIAL.
