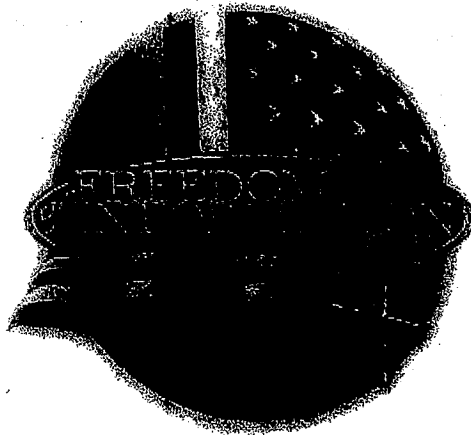

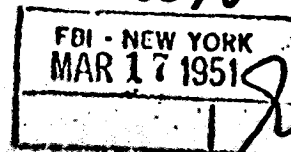

I called Mr. Hennrich of the Bureau 5:30 P.M. 3/9/51 and advised him William Sheehy, who was connected with the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy as an investigator, and who was formerly a Bureau agent, had advised me he was leaving for Washington the night of 3/9/51 and intended to stop in and see Mr. Ladd of the Bureau and would also see Senator McMahon and point out to them that he felt dissatisfied with the presentation of the evidence in instant case, primarily because of lack of preparation on the part of the U.S. Attorney's Office. He said there was absolutely no criticism of the Bureau and he intended to make that clear to anyone he talked to in Washington but that he felt that in the examination of DAVID GREENGLASS in particular he should not have been questioned in as much detail concerning the atomic bomb prior to the appearance on the stand of Dr. Koski as this would place Dr. Koski in an embarrassing position should the defense decide to cross examine him about the atomic bomb.

I told Mr. Hennrich I had explained to Sheehy that the Bureau was not presenting this case at the trial, as he knew, and that we were making no comment whatsoever concerning the presentation of the evidence in the trial.

I also explained to Mr. Hennrich that Mr. Dennison and Mr. Rollander, representatives of the Atomic Energy Commission, were going to Washington on the night of 3/9/51 with a transcript of the trial and they intended to arrange with Commissioner Dean for a conference with the Attorney General re this matter.

Dear Mr. Harrington:

You will find enclosed (1) a copy of the receipt which we gave Mr. Louis Abel, and (2) three blank checks bearing the signature of Julius Rosenberg. Although the receipt states the amount of \$4,000, this was filled in before the money was counted. When the money was counted it was discovered that there was \$3,900 rather than \$4,000.

Morris Schreier was interviewed by Special Agents Bert S. Taylor and Robert L. Stevenson, Jr., March 22, 1951 at his office, 134 Broadway, New York City. Mr. Schreier advised that Dr. George Bernhardt, 40 Monroe Street, New York City, is his personal physician and that from a period of March to August, 1950, he visited Dr. Bernhardt at 40 Monroe Street about twenty times in order to take injections for hay fever.

Mr. Schreier advised that during his visits to Dr. Bernhardt he saw Julius Rosenberg at the office about three to six times. He stated further that Rosenberg impressed him as being a very "tight lipped person."

Mr. Schreier said that the only remarks he ever heard Rosenberg make were to a nine year old son of Dr. Bernhardt. He said Dr. Bernhardt's son was a Yankee baseball fan and that on the few occasions he saw Rosenberg, Rosenberg discussed baseball with the Doctor's son. Mr. Schreier said that he never heard Rosenberg or Dr. Bernhardt discuss any vacation trips, or any other matter.


