

MEMORANDUM:

At 10:40 AM I received a call from United States Attorney MYLES J. LANE, who stated he had made a speech at the annual communion breakfast of the 165th Infantry Regiment of the New York National Guard on June 1; that the newspaper on June 2 had garbled the speech a little. Mr. LANE stated in his talk, he advised the 165th Regiment to be careful of the Reds who were trying to infiltrate. He quoted from the Rosenberg trial from Page 723, that Greenglass had been told by Rosenberg that Rosenberg had received certain information on Atomic Energy equations. The paper indicated they had stolen the secret of it but that was not what was said.

Mr. LANE desired that I be apprised of this in the event any inquiries are received.

MEMO

Reference is made to memorandum of Edward Scheidt, SAC, dated 6/2/52 which reflects telephone call from U.S. Attorney Hyles J. Lane concerning his talk at the Communion Breakfast held on 6/1/52.

The trial record in the JULIUS ROSENBERG case has been forwarded to the Supreme Court of Washington, D.C., and accordingly Page 723 is not available for inspection. However, New York teletype to the Bureau in the ROSENBERG case dated 3/12/52 which contains the summary of the testimony reflects on page 6 the following:

"LATE IN FORTYSEVEN, ROSENBERG IN THE PRESENCE OF
BERNARD GREENGLASS TOLDDAVID ABOUT A SKY PLATFORM
PROJECT AND ROSENBERG SAID THAT HE HAD GOTTEN THIS
INFORMATION FROM ONE OF THE BOYS ROSENBERG
DESCRIBED THE SKY PLATFORM AS A LARGE VESSEL WHICH
COULD BE SUSPENDED AT A POINT IN SPACE WHERE THE
GRAVITY WAS LOW AND THAT THE VESSEL WOULD TRAVEL AROUND
THE EARTH LIKE A SATELLITE."

This is the extent of DAVID GREENGLASS* testimony concerning the sky platform.

The report of SA James P. Lee, dated 3/11/51 on page 59 reflects investigation conducted to that date concerning the sky platform. On 8/1/50 the Albany Office advised that it had been informed by the U.S. Air Force that the Rand Corporation, a subsidiary of Douglas Aircraft, Santa Monica, California, three years prior to that date had been engaged in a research project to determine the cost and feasibility of building a platform. The cost estimates were so huge that the project was terminated. The Air Force advised that the project was classified Secret.

Dr. Porter, Director of Project Hermes, G.F. Corporation, advised he was on the Research & Development Board of the Guided Missiles Committee under the Secretary of Defense in 1947 to 1949. He advised that a report was made in 1948 on the sky platform project known as Project Rand. It was concluded that the project was feasible but its cost was not commensurate with the results.

Mr. G.S. Trimble, Chief Engineer, and Mr. Pete Medina of the Glenn L. Hartin Co., Baltimore, advised that this company for several years had commenced work on a project referred to as Orbit. They both advised that the work on Project Orbit was done under a Navy contract dated June 6, 1946. The plan involved consists of a rocket capable of travelling an indefinite period of time at a speed sufficient to maintain in flight its relative position with the earth in the earth's rotation on its axis and its revolutions about the sun. They advised that the moving rocket's relative position to the earth would in effect remain stationary above a particular point of the earth's surface.

Lt. Col. Keith B. McCutcheon, Quantico, advised on December 2, 1950 that in 1946 the Bureau of Aeronautics of the Navy Department commenced a project known as the "Earth Satellite Vehicle" or "High Altitude Test Vehicle". This project was discontinued in 1949. Col. McCutcheon advised that the U.S. Air Force had a parallel project to that of the Navy.

WFO teletype dated March 15, 1951 advises that Fred Darwin, Director of Guided Missiles Committee of the Research and Development Board, stated that he was familiar with the Rand Project and that the reports incorporate the research on guided missiles and are classified Secret. The work was divided among numerous contracts such as Aero Jet Corporation, North American Aviation, Glenn L. Martin Company and Jet Propulsion of the University of California. The contracts were let by different branches of the Armed Services. All reports of this project are classified secret and were not available to be released in Court. He advised that Secretary of Defense Forrestal's daily report in 1948 made slight reference to this "World Satellite Orbit Project" which caused numerous newspaper articles about these projects.

Bureau authorized delivery of copy of report of SA James P. Lee on March 20th to U.S. Attorney Saypol and same was delivered on that date.

A review of the articles in the New York "Times" of June 2nd and of the New York "Herald Tribune" of June 2nd and of the New York "Daily News" of June 2nd reflects that the statements attributed to U.S. Attorney Myles J. Lane far exceed the testimony of DAVID GREENGLASS.

MEMORANDUM:

At 1:10 PM today I called Mr. Hennrich at the Bureau, in the absence of Mr. Belmont, and advised him that US District Judge Irving Raufman, SDNY, had called on me this morning; that he is the Judge who sentenced the Rosenbergs to execution and is a good friend of the Bureau, being personally acquainted with the Director; that Judge Kaufman had advised me that he is scheduled to preside at a conference on International Judicial Cooperation, which is to take place at a meeting of the International Bar association being held this Summer at Madrid, Spain; that he is scheduled to leave New York on July 3rd via the UNITED STATES, arriving LeHavre July 8th, taking a train to Paris and will be there until July 14th, then to Madrid; that he will leave from Naples, Italy on the INDEPENDENCE, arriving at New York on August 13th.

The Judge advised me that he has been noticing recent publicity regarding the Communist demonstrations in Paris and he wondered whether there is any reason why he possibly should not go to Paris, or whether he would be in danger as a result of these Communist activities in view of his connection with the Rosenberg case. He requested my advice in this matter, and I told him I would be in touch with him later, after giving the matter some thought. Mr. Hennrich advised that he would prepare a memo on this matter and advise me in the event the Bureau had any suggestions; that he felt there was always a possibility of some danger, either in Europe or elsewhere, but the matter of whether the Judge should follow the plans outlined was a matter for his own decision. I told him I had suggested to the Judge that he keep his plans quiet, however the reservations have already been made in his name and there is a possibility they might become known. I suggested that the Legal Attache at Paris might have some information as to the seriousness of the situation there. Mr. Hennrich said he thought it was more or less under control now; that there was of course a heavy concentration of Communists in France and the French Government was probably heavily infiltrated.

At 10:10 AM today Mr. Hennrich of the Bureau called me with further reference to call I received from USA Lane yesterday regarding his being misquoted by the press. Mr. Hennrich said he had prepared a memo on the basis of our previous conversation indicating that Lane had told me that what he had actually said on this occasion was limited to information which had been furnished during the trial in the Rosenberg case. He said this memo had now come back to him with the inquiry as to just wherein Lane was misquoted.

I advised Mr. Hennrich that my conversation with USA Lane onthe morning of June 2nd was very brief; that I did not have the news article before me and was not in a position to question him closely; that I took the information he gave and recorded it since I did not know specifically what the issue was or what the misquotation was; that he did not refer specifically to any news article such as the Herald Tribune; that the only example of misquotation he gave in this conversation was the information in the papers indicating that the reds had stolen the secret relating to the sky platform; Lane told me that what he said was strictly confined to testimony at the Rosenberg trial wherein Greenglass furnished information he had received from Rosenberg about the sky platform; that he had also warned those present at the communion breakfast to be careful of reds who are trying to infiltrate; that the papers however had carried a story that the reds had stolen the secret of it. meaning the sky platform; that he wanted me to know this in the event inquiries were made; that I had made no comment on his call. Mr. Hennrich said this information would suffice.



At 2:45 PM I received a call from Mr. HENNRICH at the Bureau, in which he stated he had recommended that Judge KAUFMAN be advised that due to troubled conditions in Europe, particularly in France, at this time, the Bureau is not in a position to say there would be no danger involved in his visit to Paris. Mr. HENNRICH stated this recommendation had been approved. Mr. HENNRICH also said he had further recommended that inquiries be made through our source in Paris but this was turned down.

FIVE, SCLOMON GREENBERG WAS APPROACHED BY AGENTS OF MYO AT MY PORT OF AUTHORITY BUS TERMINAL WHERE GREENBERG HAD LEFT A BUS WHICH HAD CARRIED HIM FROM NEW JERSEY. MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION CONCERNING

The above-captioned individual personally called at the NYO and stated he desired to "bring his file up to date" and to get some advice on a matter in which he was involved.

He advised that he was formerly employed by the Electro Math Corporation, White Plains, NY. The president of this company is MARTIN DAVIS of 70 Westmorland Street, White Plains, NY. BIRKEN stated his name had been connected with the case of DAVID GRELNGLASS, Espionage - R, which resulted in DAVIS stating that BIRKEN was a Communist. He stated that as a result of this DAVIS had been instrumental in having the Army investigate him.

BIRKEN stated he had developed a process for making bomb sights while employed by the Electro liath Corp. When PAVIS made his accusation about BIRKEN being a Communist, it caused friction between the two which resulted in BIRKEN's leaving the Electro Math Corp. in Harch 1950. He stated that after he left the Electro Math Corp. could not get the process for the bomb sights to work properly. As a result on one occasion DAVIS made the accusation that BIRKEN had sabotaged the process.

BIRKEN stated that because of DAVIS accusation and because DAVIS further stated in front of several other employees that he, BIRKEN, could purchase any amount of equipment he needed, and because DAVIS further would call him at home on the telephone and tell him that he dare not spend another penny or he would "split BIRKEN's head open," he, BIRKEN, installed a recording device on his home telephone.

BIRKEN, could not spend any more money he asked DAVIS for a suggestion as to how he could get around the problem, at which time DAVIS told him not to worry about it...that matter he could "bribe" and referred to Admiral (fnu) SCHOFTEL, head of Ordnance in Washington, and also several Senators whose names BIRKEN could not recall. He stated DAVIS operated on the theory that money could do anything.

Letter to Director NY 62-0

BIRKEN stated DAVIS employed a man named PRINKIE (phonetic) whom he knew to be a Socialist and who formerly had worked at the Bureau of Standards. He stated that PRINKIE led a strike at a defense plant during the last war which resulted in the plant's loss of a contract. He could furnish no further details or identification of PRINKIE.

BIRKEN wanted to know if the FBI could tell him how to stop DAVIS from spreading the rumor that he is a saboteur and Communist. He was properly advised that this office would make no suggestions or recommendations whatsoever. BIRKEN further advised that he had intentions of suing DAVIS for defamation of character, at which time he may have to use the information on the tape recording and invited agents of this office to come to his home to listen to the recordings and determine whether or not they were of importance.

A roview of the indices of the NYO reflect that BIRKEN had been employed as a shop foreman by the Ardun Mechanical Corporation, 503 liest 56th Street, NYC. This company operated from 1945 until Hay 1950 and was owned by YURA ARKUS-DUNTOV and his brother ZDRA. DUNTOV recalled that in 1946 JULIUS ROSENBERG, confessed Russian espionage agent; had contacted him and his brother for some grinding work on a selector valve. BIRIEN was interviewed and advised he met JULIUS ROSENBERG and the latter came to have some work done on the valve. He stated he also met DAVID GREENGLASS on a number of occasions when DAVID brought work to the shop and later picked it up. Ho also advised that ROS WIRG wanted him to enter into a partnership in the manufacture of model airplane engines, and that on one occasion he visited the G & R Engineering Company to look over the facilities. He stated that he never sau either JULIUS RUSSIEFIRG or DAVID GREENGLASS after the work on the valve was completed in 1946.

The foregoing is probably the reason why BIRKEN has stated his name was mentioned in the case of DAVID GREENGLASS.

This office will not interview BIRMEN or listen to his tape recordings. The foregoing is award thed for the information of the Bureau, in view of the non-specific mention of a "bribe" and in view of the possible publicity
