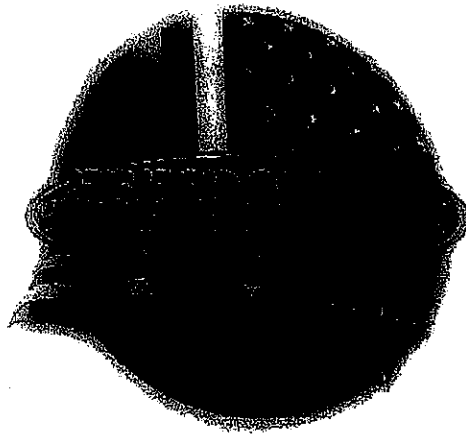

Confirming telephone conversation with Assistant to the Director D. M. LADD, 6/19/53, Commissioner GEORGE MONAGHAN, NYC PD, telephoned me, 6/19/53, and stated that in reading the stories in the newspapers concerning the ROSENBERG case, he had been concerned about the safety of Judge IRVING KAUFMAN and the members of his family. He commented that in the event anything happened to Judge KAUFMAN or any member of his family he was wondering whether or not it would be sufficient for him merely to say that the FBI was handling the protection of Judge KAUFMAN and the members of his family. He stated that of course if anything happened to Judge KAUFMAN in the City of New York, he, as Commissioner of Police, was responsible for the safety of the people in the City of New York, even though Judge KAUFMAN was a Federal Judge. He continued that for that reason he was anxious to know whether or not Judge KAUFMAN and the members of his family were in the city.

I informed Commissioner MONAGHAN that the members of Judge KAUFMAN'S family were out of the city at the present time but that Judge KAUFMAN was in the city. I then pointed out to Commissioner MONAGHAN that Judge KAUFMAN and the members of his family were under guard by the FBI continuously on a twenty-four hour basis. I reminded Commissioner MONAGHAN that I had told him at the inception in the event any unusual incident arises wherein I felt it should be brought to the attention of the New York City Police Department that I would immediately contact Commissioner MONAGHAN or one of his officials. I indicated to Commissioner MONAGHAN that was the reason why I had notified the New York City Police Department the moment we received an anonymous telephone call in this office to the effect that the apartment building at 1185 Park Avenue was going to be blown up. (The Bureau previously has been advised of the details of this telephone call.)

I told Commissioner MONAGHAN I would continue to keep him advised of any unusual situations. Commissioner MONAGHAN then commented that inasmuch as the FBI does have the members of the family and Judge KAUFMAN himself under twenty-four hour guard, he doesn't feel it would be necessary for him to take any further action inasmuch as he would not want to be "under foot". I told Commissioner MONAGHAN

that should he change his mind in any manner or should he be desirous of discussing any problems with me, to immediately contact me so I could have the benefit of his views. He stated he would do so and that as a consequence of his conversation with me, he did not contemplate any further action in the matter.

Commissioner Monaghan also indicated that of course as soon as the Police Department had received word of the possible bombing of the apartment building in which Judge Kaufman was located, they had immediately sent an appropriate number of the police department out to make the appropriate check.

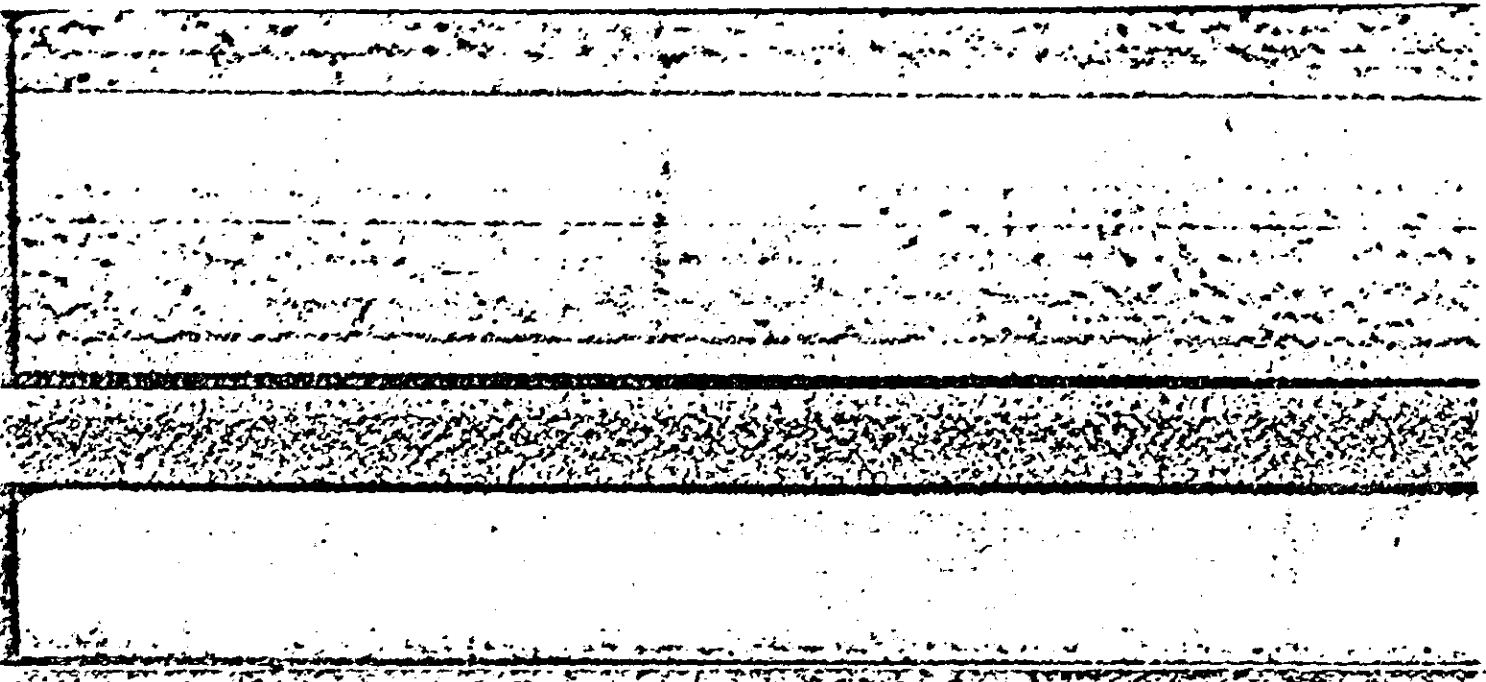

At 3:05 P. M., Judge Irving R. Kaufman called to inquire as to whether or not the time of execution had been set yet and to advise that telegrams were beginning to arrive at his office to the effect that he should be ashamed of himself that he is letting them go through with the execution on the Sabbath. The Judge said he did not intend to intervene, but wanted us to know about this. He suggested that a Rabbi be contacted to get the exact hour of sundown, which would be the beginning of the Sabbath. I told the Judge that this matter had been brought up by the Rabbi at Sing Sing and that I felt sure the matter of the Sabbath would be taken into consideration.

The Judge also advised that the lawyers were at that time outside in his chambers raising the same point as had been raised previously, and demanding a hearing.

AUSA LLOYD MAC MAHON telephoned at approximately 3:45 P.M. 6/19/53 and requested that we assist the U. S. Attorney's Office in getting the Supreme Court decision in the ROSENBERG matter the Circuit Judges in New Haven, Connecticut. He stated that Deputy Attorney General ROGERS was most anxious that they have the Supreme Court decision so in the event defense counsel gets in touch with any of the Circuit Court Judges, they will have the benefit of the Supreme Court decision in their possession.

I telephonically contacted Assistant to the Director D. M. LADD, informed him of the above, and indicated I was going to telephone the information to the New Haven Office and have them make personal delivery to CCA in the event they are available; that if they are not available no problem is involved.

Mr. LADD approved and SAC CASPER at the New Haven Office was furnished telephonically the content of the decision and instructed as above indicated.

Per Curiam:

"We convened a special term of the court to consider an application by the Attorney General (1) to review the stay of execution of JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG, granted by Mr. Justice DOUGLAS on June 17, 1953, or (2) for reconsideration and reexamination of this court's order in (1) Miscellaneous, JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG, petitioners, against WILFORD L. DENNO, Warden of Sing Sing Prison, June, 1953 special term, denying a stay.

"The Acting Solicitor General agrees, and we do not doubt that Mr. Justice DOUGLAS had power to issue the stay in these proceedings. There is no dispute that a stay should issue only if there is a substantial question to be preferred for further proceedings in the court.

"The question which has been and now is urged as being substantial is whether the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act of 1946, 42 USC, Section 1810, (B) (2) (3), rendered the District Court powerless to impose the death sentence under the Espionage Act of 1917, 50 USC, Section 32 (A), 34, under which Statute the indictment was laid.

"Although this question was raised and presented for the first time to Mr. Justice DOUGLAS by counsel who have never been employed by the ROSENBERGS and who heretofore have not participated in this case, the full court has considered it on its merits.

"We think the question is not substantial. We think further proceedings to litigate are unwarranted. A conspiracy was charged and proved to violate the Espionage Act in wartime. The Atomic Energy Act did not repeal or limit provisions of the Espionage Act. Accordingly, we vacate the stay entered by Mr. Justice DOUGLAS on June 17. We are entering this order in advance of the preparation of full opinions, which will be filed with the Clerk."

EDDIE RANZELL, reporter for the "New York Times," came to see me the morning of 6/22/53, and suggested that to counteract the terrific barrage of propaganda on the part of the Communists in the Rosenberg Case, he felt it would be desirable for the FBI to furnish to the "New York Times" the additional data contained in our files clearly reflecting the guilt of the ROSENBERGS. The "New York Times," after perusing the material, would thereafter prepare a story, or a series of stories, which would clearly point up the guilt of the ROSENBERGS, and counteract the barrage of propaganda. I spent several minutes pointing out to Mr. RANZELL how this would be impossible and completely impractical. I first pointed out to RANZELL that he would find the legal staff of the "New York Times" completely opposed to the idea; second, ~~which~~ was completely impossible, for the FBI to provide such material. As a matter of fact, a jury and a competent United States Court had already found the ROSENBERGS guilty, and there had been an execution of the sentence imposed, and that any additional information would be completely superfluous. RANZELL eventually agreed that this was entirely correct, and said that he did not propose to pursue the matter further.

I apprised Inspector J. J. McGUIRE, and Mr. McGUIRE concurred.

At 5:10 P. M., 6/23/53, I telephonically advised Assistant Director A. H. Belmont that SA John A. Harrington and the writer had visited Judge Irving R. Kaufman's Chambers and, in accordance with the Director's instructions, had furnished him certain information. We told the Judge in general terms that JULIUS ROSENBERG was an important Espionage Agent; that we had information in our possession not disclosed at the trial which indicated that he was a high ranking official in the Soviet Espionage apparatus in this area. The Judge expressed his appreciate to the Bureau and particularly to the Director in that the Director had thought so much of him as to make this information available to him at this time.

We then discussed with the Judge the bodyguard assignment. Judge Kaufman explained that his three boys were leaving for camp Monday, 6/29/53; that he intended to remain with his wife at the Rosenstiehl estate for a couple of weeks and then take a vacation trip to Maine. About the end of July, the Judge contemplates taking an automobile trip to California. The Judge desired a recommendation from the Bureau as to when it would be desirable, from his standpoint, to remove the bodyguard detail. I told the Judge that I thought the bodyguard assignment should be continued until the boys go to camp; that I would present his plans to the Bureau and request a recommendation from the Bureau as to the continuance of this assignment. I told Mr. Belmont that I believed the assignment should be continued until the boys go to camp and that it could be gracefully discontinued at that point inasmuch as Judge Kaufman will be out of town probably until 8/31/53. I told Mr. Belmont I was sure the Judge would go along with any recommendation we made along these lines. In the absence of any additional incidents or threats to the Judge, I felt the bodyguard assignment should be discontinued on the night of Monday, 6/29/53. Mr. Belmont will advise this office of the Bureau's decision.

At 11:00 A. M., 6/24/53, I telephonically contacted Assistant Director A. H. Belmont, Bureau, and advised him that the Director's message of congratulations on the Judge's anniversary had been conveyed to Judge Kaufman. I told Mr. Belmont that the Judge desired the following message be conveyed to the Director:

"Mrs. Kaufman and I are deeply touched by Mr. Hoover's thoughtfulness in sending his good wishes on the occasions of our anniversary and my birthday. We are very grateful to the Director for this and many other favors."

We then talked about the bodyguard assignment on Judge Kaufman. Mr. Belmont said that my recommendations of 6/23/53 concerning the discontinuance of this assignment after the children of Judge Kaufman had gone to summer camp on Monday, 6/29/53, had been presented to the Director and that the Director had agreed that this would be satisfactory if it was agreeable to Judge Kaufman. The writer will in the immediate future communicate with Judge Kaufman concerning the termination of this assignment.

At twelve noon, 6/24/53, Mr. Belmont was requested by the writer to have appropriate authorities in the Department of Justice instruct the Marshal, SDNY, to release to this office for review the material formerly the possessions of the ROSENBERGS. I told Mr. Belmont the Marshal was willing to do this, but that he was absent from the city and his assistants, in view of the importance of this case, preferred to have specific instructions from the Department before releasing this material to this office for review. Mr. Belmont indicated he would endeavor to have these instructions issued to the Marshal's office.

At 10:30 A. M., 6/29/53, I telephonically contacted Judge Irving R. Kaufman in connection with the discontinuance of the bodyguard assignment on the Judge and his family. I ascertained that the Judge's children will be leaving for camp today. The Judge then raised this issue. He said numerous friends, including Lewis Rosenstiehl, Chairman of the Board, Schenley Products, Inc., had urged him not to discontinue the bodyguard assignment completely, but rather to taper it off. The Judge indicated that his wife was concerned for his welfare and expressed that the bodyguard assignment be continued for at least a little while longer, until the complete picture could be determined as to whether or not there is an actual threat against the Judge. The Judge asked that he be advised as to whether or not it is safe to discontinue the bodyguard assignment completely. I told him I could not give him any such advice. The Judge then suggested that the assignment might be tapered off and that bodyguards be assigned only to him during the working hours; that no agents be permitted to remain in his house during the evening hours and that his wife not be accompanied during the day by Agents. I told the Judge that the Bureau's feelings in the past had been that we do all or nothing, but that, at his request, I would present it to the Bureau for instructions. The Judge indicated that he was contemplating calling the Director on this problem. He also mentioned that Walter Winchell last night on his radio broadcast, discussed the fact that the Judge had a bodyguard of FBI Agents. The Judge then mentioned that he had changed his plans and was not returning today to Connecticut, but intended to remain in New York City until at least Thursday, 7/2/53.

I immediately contacted Inspector L. L. Laughlin, Bureau, and furnished him the above information. I indicated my feelings that we should discontinue it today or keep it on on both the Judge and Mrs. Kaufman with Agents in his house at night; that, despite the fact that this was a heavy burden on this office, I felt we should do all or nothing, and requested instructions by the afternoon of 6/29/53.

At 3:45 P. M., Mr. L. L. Laughlin, Bureau, telephonically advised the writer that this assignment could be tapered off as requested by Judge Kaufman. 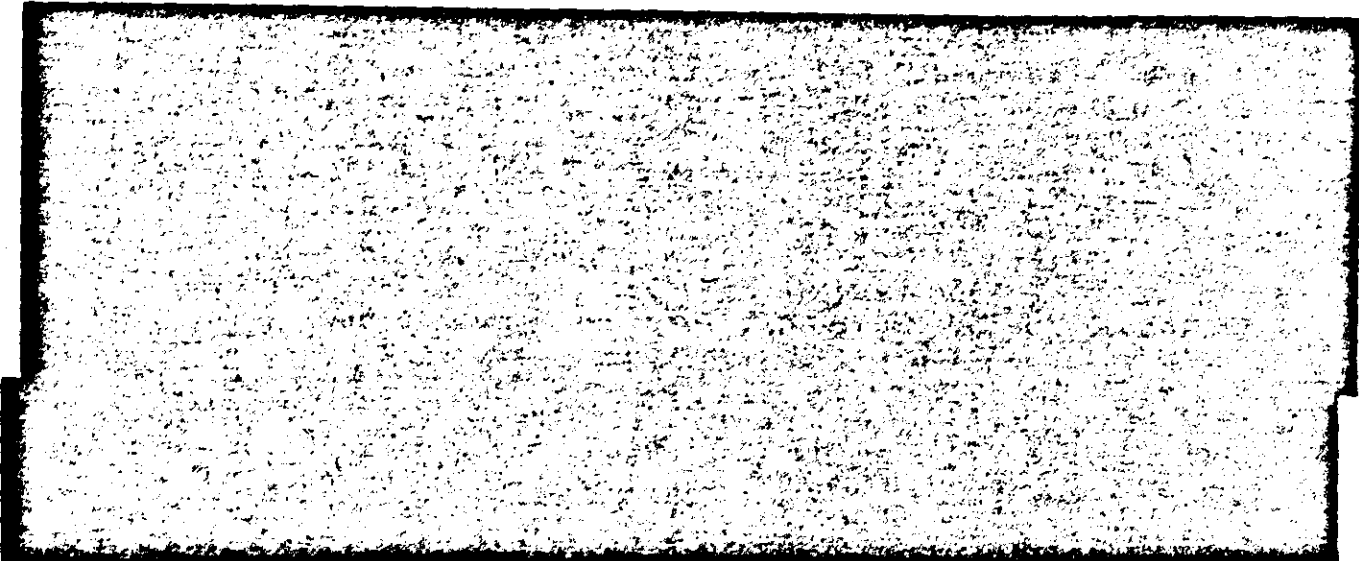

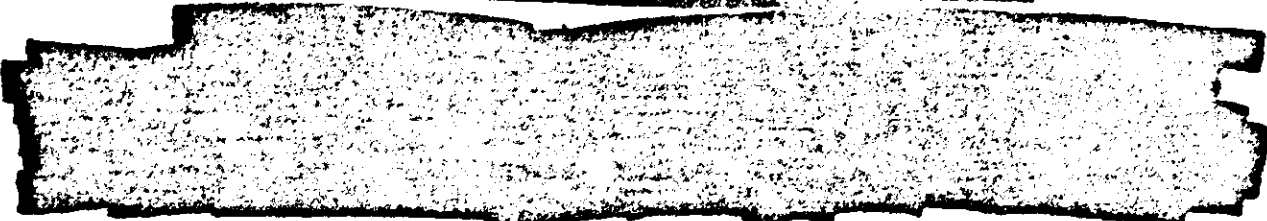

M. BUNYACK [REDACTED] the Policyholders Committee of the International Workers Order issued a call to all members of the IWO "not to get scared" by the latest attempt to destroy the IWO. "This time undertaken by the US Attorney General BROWNELL declaring the IWO a Communist front organization and putting the IWO on the subversive list. The IWO membership is being called to pay their dues regularly and to continue their fight for the right to belong to an organization of their choice.

A. JENOFKY [REDACTED] read recently a report from Tel Aviv, Israel, that the Youth organizations of the Hagan Party Ashomer atzair, Hachnes Halem and other left-wing groups decided to join the Israeli division of the World Federation of Democratic Youth. The Young Communist League of Israel is playing the leading part in organizing the left-wing Youth organizations as part of the WFDY.

WILLIAM PATTERSON [REDACTED] ANGUS CAMERON and ALBERT KAHN established in New York a publishing Co. under the name of "Cameron & Kahn Inc.". This outfit will specialize in publishing important books of progressive authors at the price of 50¢ per book.

EDITH ROSENBERG [REDACTED] while she visited the National office of the National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS she was told of a National conference which took place in Belgium on May 12, 1953. The conference issued a call demanding a new trial for the ROSENBERGS on account of the "newly discovered documents which show that the witness against the ROSENBERGS lied in court". Copies of these documents are now being circulated all over Europe. [REDACTED] about the UC to SJ for the ROSENBERGS is preparing to publication in a book form to sell for \$1.00 the "Death House Letter of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG". The Committee is aiming to sell at least 500,000 copies of this book. The profits from the sale of this book will go into a fund for the ROSENBERG children.

POSE WEINSTOCK [REDACTED] ARNER GREEN, Executive secretary of the American Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born is leaving for a tour of middle-western States which will begin on June 18, 1953.

The aim of this tour is to develop a campaign against the Walter-McCarran law and to mobilize public opinion against the demand of the Justice Department that the American Comm. for the Protection of Foreign Born should register as a Communist front organization.

MAC GORDON [REDACTED] HARRY SCHILLER resigned as manager of the Morning Freiheit; the work is too strenuous and his health doesn't allow him to continue this work.

The new manager of the Morning Freiheit is CHAIM SULLER. Up till recently SULLER was the National secretary of the "Jewish Music Verband".

MAC GORDON [REDACTED] the Morning Freiheit is still short over \$10,000 from its goal of the \$175,000 fund drive. Special efforts are now being made to finish the fund drive by June 18th. A special call was issued by leaders of different progressive organizations to all N. Y. committees, especially to those outside of NY to quickly fulfill their quotas.

A. GOODELMAN [REDACTED] Rev. CHARLES HILL from Detroit is specially coming to New York to address to June 7th convention of the NY State IWO.

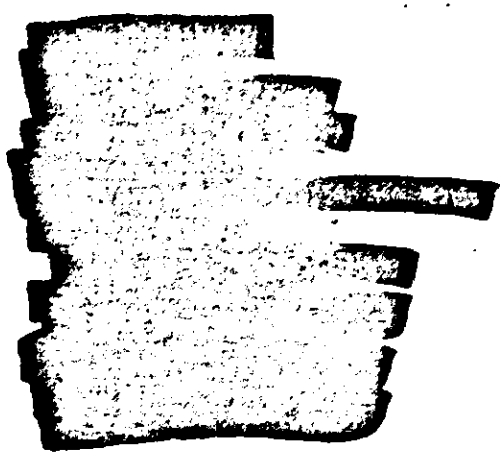
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

Italian Elections and stated it was a big victory for the CP because G. SPERI didn't draw as many votes as he expected.

GORDON told those present that the comrades must do everything in their power to see if the ROSENBERGS do not die. GORDON stated that if the ROSENBERGS talk they will implicate others. It would also mean the CP as a whole in this country would be identified as an agency for espionage. All the comrades have a big stake in keeping the ROSENBERGS alive. GORDON, according to the informant, intimated that the comrades present are as guilty as the ROSENBERGS and must keep them alive.

These remarks, according to [REDACTED] were made to spur the comrades present on to greater activity on behalf of the ROSENBERGS.

MORTON FRIEDMAN, attorney, was described by [REDACTED] as follows:

About 40-43 years old, 5'10", white, 165-170 lbs., glasses, brown hair, which stood up on right side.

[REDACTED] reported FRIEDMAN stated in part "You comrades don't know how hard we attorneys have been working" (on behalf of the ROSENBERGS). He referred to Judge KAUFMAN as "Butcher KAUFMAN".

Chairman EDDIE NELSON also told the comrades to devote as much time as possible for activity for the ROSENBERGS.

The above information was furnished to Assistant Director J. H. BELMONT subsequently telephonically advised Supervisor T. SPENCER that where Security Index cards did not exist on individuals mentioned previously as being present at the meeting, the case should be actively investigated.

Dear Sir:

Please excuse the liberty I am taking in addressing this letter to you, and I ask your forbearance with its lengthy contents. I am confident that it also reflects the sentiments of every loyal American, and is motivated only by pure thoughts in that direction. If I say, --- I am a totally-disabled veteran of World War I, my two sons are overseas veterans of World War 2, and my wife is an indirect casualty of the latter conflict, for which she still suffers the tortures of hell. First, I want to thank God that this great land of ours, in these troubled times, has courageous men like you to stand up and cry out against such infamous action as that taken by Justice Douglas June 17.

The Cornies waited for just that moment, when the Supreme Court was in recess. They fired away at Douglas, a perfect target, because they knew he wouldn't have the courage to say "no." By his official conduct and activities in behalf of infamous traitors to their native land, by his deliberate and unwarranted interference with the majority rule of our highest court, by his calculated yielding and subservience to the vociferous Cornie pressure groups, and in staying the executions solely on pleas from defense lawyers, Douglas acted with malice aforethought in pulling his "quickie" and thereby degraded his high office. If his intentions had been otherwise, he would not have reached a decision without the presence of Government counsel. His action was not only a publicity-and act to obstruct justice, but was motivated by some ulterior design, which will catch up with him in due time. The Reds are very proud of him. This unprecedented and unilateral action has dispelled any lingering doubts in the minds of the American people as to his doubtful allegiance. By being obedient to his oath of office, he was thereby disloyal to his country. He should, therefore, be tried for treasonous activities for his subservience to enemy pressure groups. I'll be ashamed to tell my grandchildren that a Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court betrayed the trust of his fellow-Americans.

In staying the executions, Douglas was "concerned" that "we allow human lives to be snuffed out." But he could not have been concerned that the lives of 30,000 of our boys were snuffed out by the Reds in Korea. These boys are turning over in their hallowed graves, terrified that their loved ones on earth might some day be subjected to the whims and fancies of such ignominious individuals. And his conscience could not have bothered him knowing that another 120,000 American boys were shot to pieces by the Cornies, the homegrown counterpart of whom guided and influenced Douglas' thinking and decision on that June 17 day. These lads are now wondering why they had to be so killed, and why such individuals hold sway in our land. And the thousands of our boys who are guests of Mao Tse Tung will remember Mr. Douglas to their dying day, which won't be so far away for many of these poor devils. Tomorrow, the Korean "Police Action" will be three years old. It has already cost us 150,000 battle casualties alone. And for what? Monetary values are out of place here. It's the only time in our otherwise glorious history that some of our leaders didn't want to win a war. Why? June 25 1950 will go down as a black day in our history.

I am enclosing a photo which appeared in a local daily last week. It speaks for itself. Who else but such degenerates would degrade the sanctity of the dead, particularly an American soldier. Did you ever see anything more horrifying? And isn't our national security jeopardized when Cornie-loving individuals like Einstein are entrusted with formulating our national defense? In his letter to a New York school teacher, who was later fired for being a Red, Einstein summed up the typical Cornie philocopy when he said: "Every intellectual who is called before one of these committees ought to refuse to testify. He must be prepared for jail and economic ruin; in short, for the sacrifice of his personal welfare in the interest of the cultural welfare of his country." He didn't say the interest of the U.S. simply because he meant Cornie Russia. That's precisely why the U.S.-born Rosenbergs died; --- they sacrificed their personal welfare (and their lives) in the interest of their true alleg.

Incidents and political diatribes during their funeral at New York home to all of us the real danger to our internal security, --- homegrown and foreign Reds run loose in our land. During the ceremony about 40 men, dressed in a sort of sports uniform, arrived in several took complete charge, without identifying themselves. They were definitely not members of any official local police force. They locked arms and shoved the crowd back. When demonstrators tried to get thru, the crowd trampled them amid shouts of "kill them," and the leader of the "Elite Guard" warned them: "If you value your lives or your equipment, get out of here." I know we are infested with elements of the Communist Secret Police, but I didn't think they operated in such open, brazen and defiant displays. I am calling this matter to the attention of the U.S. Supreme Court and the U.S. Department of Justice.

The political diatribe dispensed during the funeral service, when the spies were treated as American heroes with prominent display of American flags, was typical of that handed out by Moscow. I knew that their chief counsel was hand-picked by Moscow, and he certainly played the part. But in the trash he peddled so vehemently at the funeral, and not in a role as lawyer, he exposed himself unmistakably as a pure Red. Some of his outbursts were: "I place the murder of the Rosenbergs at the door of Eisenhower, Brownell and John Edgar Hoover. These two sweet, tender, sensitive, cultured people were victims of cold, deliberate murder. This was the face of Nazism that killed the Rosenbergs. They were tortured but they didn't yield. They fought tyranny. To live today under the heels of a military dictatorship garbed in civilian clothes, the men who run the country have no heart. They have stones in their breasts. They have souls of murderers."

Should such dangerous fomenters against our Government be entrusted with all the privileges given to members of the bar? Inasmuch as he's "asked to be an American," why not ship him to Russia? He'll then get a taste of some of their slave labor because, as they don't hold trials, they don't need lawyers. And should our American flag be desecrated in such degrading manner, --- right in our own midst? Why must we look at such things to make one's blood boil? Don't you think it's about time we put a stop to these degrading outbursts and other nefarious activities, and that we outlaw everything that smells or looks like Red? By letting these brazen and straggling Tories run rampant and unopposed throughout our land scuffling off for Malenkov and dragging our flag in the mud, and by our unwillingness to recognize this threat to our internal security and our refusal to do something about it now, we are ourselves creating the greatest danger to our Country in its entire history. Some day, after the horse is stolen, we will rush to close the barn door.

There is no room in this great land of ours for half-Americans. Some of my fellow-Americans are concerned about preserving the liberties of such ideological misfits. It's frightening, --- when you hear so many of the bleeding hearts screaming to high heaven that their right to scream has been curtailed. And they get very with it. There can be no doubt as to the true allegiance of these Godless individuals. One does not have to hide his or her true loyalty to the United States of America. In the book of rules of any decent and loyal American, these spineless rats have already had too much liberty, much too much for the good of our Country. And that's all I'm interested in, --- the good of our Country. Other things will take care of themselves, --- without a single decent and loyal American getting hurt. We must protect our young generation in the schools and colleges against this Red poison, which is full of the malignant venom. They have even infiltrated into the sanctity of our houses of worship. And who will deny that? I am not afraid of a decision against our Armed Forces on the battlefield. But the Red menace here at home is something to be taken more seriously. If the recent executions will set a precedent for the future and instill fear into the warped minds of some of these homegrown, yellow-bellied slunks, then thank God for that.

I can conceive of no higher moral duty on the part of any loyal American than to do everything within his power to expose the Godless forces of Communism, which seeks to subvert human dignity and individual liberty wherever it exists. And I can conceive of no higher duty or no higher response to ethics than to expose this evil force with every means at our command.

If I were able to leave my wife alone, I would consider it a privilege and an honor to go to Washington and shake hands with some real Americans. In the meantime, with my kindest personal regards and best wishes, please believe me,

("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers' Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Prior to September, 1951, the National, State and N.Y. County offices of the Communist Party also occupied these premises.

MR. PRESIDENT: IT IS INCONCEIVABLE THAT OUR GREAT COUNTRY SHOULD CARRY THE GUILT FOR THE MURDER OF ETHEL AND JULIUS ROSENBERG. EVEN WITHOUT THE NEW EVIDENCE THAT HAS COME TO LIGHT, GRAVE SUSPICION EXISTS AS TO THE PURPOSE OF THE TESTIMONY OF SUCH A CHARACTER AS GREENGLASS. THE FACTS IN THE CASE DEFINITELY WARRANT THE WELL-FOUNDED BELIEF THAT GREENGLASS OFFERED HIS PERJURED TESTIMONY TO THE GOVERNMENT TO SAVE HIS OWN LIFE AT THE EXPENSE OF THE LIVES OF HIS SISTER AND BROTHER-IN-LAW. THE NEW EVIDENCE WHICH HAS RECENTLY BEEN UNCOVERED STRENGTHENS THE CONVICTION THAT THE MURDER OF THE ROSENBERGS WOULD CONSTITUTE A CRIME WHICH THE CONSCIENCE OF AMERICA CANNOT TOLERATE. 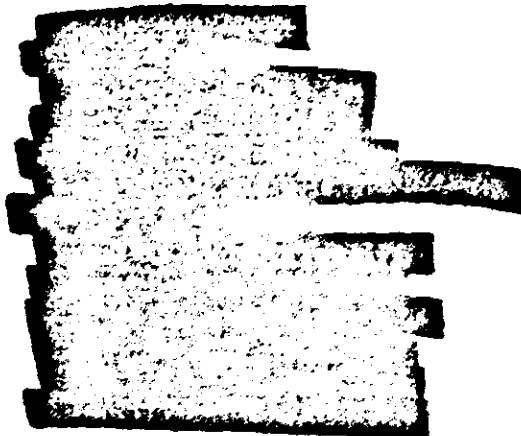

This is to advise that on June 23, 1953 a woman who desired her identity to remain anonymous, telephonically communicated with this office to furnish information as to correspondence received at her address with respect to the Rosenberg case. She stated that a letter had been received at her address, 515 Reynolds Blvd., El Paso which letter was directed to a Mr. LEONARD SIEGEL, whom she learned to have been a former tenant in that house. The address on the envelope was given as 1012 N. Richmond Ave., Albuquerque, and was forwarded on to her address.

Upon examination of the contents, she advised that the envelope contained a letter addressed to "Dear Friend." The letter itself made reference to the death of the martyred ROSENBERGS, and then pointed out that additional funds and contributions were necessary to take care of the ROSENBERG children, MORTON SOBELL, who was serving 30 years, and to carry on their fight for the vindication of the ROSENBERGS. The letter inferred that the person to whom same was addressed had made a previous contribution to the fund for the ROSENBERGS. The signature on the letter was that of DAVID ALMAN. An envelope enclosed with the letter was addressed as follows:



Subject was reinterviewed on 7/8/53 by Special Agents THOMAS F. MC QUEENEY and WILLIAM J. KICKHAM.

Subject again advised that he had never been a member of the Communist Party and consequently could furnish no information concerning members of the CP. Subject advised that he had never been specifically asked to join the CP, but that he had been invited at times to attend various social affairs, he believed might have been sponsored by the CP, but that he very rarely attended any of these affairs.

Subject advised that he had no direct knowledge that any of these social affairs were actually sponsored by the Communist Party.

Subject advised his activities were in connection with the National Maritime Union, for whom he was a photographer and almost all the rallies and meetings he attended were labor union activities at which he took pictures. Subject stated that he had no first hand knowledge of people who were members of the Communist Party and declined to name any person he believed might have been a Communist Party member.

Subject advised, when questioned, that he was socially acquainted with: CARTER WINTER, HILDA BERNHARDT, JOSEPH SOLOMON, ALAN SILLS and JULIAN RACH, (All previously mentioned in the report of SA THOMAS F. MC QUEENEY, JR. at New York, dated 4/28/53), but could furnish no information that these people were members of the Communist Party or that they were CP sympathizers.

Subject stated that he had academic discussions with the above people at different times, but to his knowledge, none of them were CP members.

Subject advised he purchased his present Leica camera, model either F or G, serial number 231169 from the Olden Camera and Lens Company, 1265 Broadway, New York City.

On June 23, 1953, [REDACTED] dictated information to SA ROONEY STEWART which was transcribed and signed by informant on June 27, 1953 [REDACTED] as follows:

"On the night of Wednesday, June 17, 1953, 1600 people attended a meeting concerning the Rosenbergs at the First Unitarian Church on 8th Street near Vermont Avenue in Los Angeles, overflowing to the outer courtyard so that it became necessary to hold a second meeting later in the evening. The sum of \$1800 was collected at this meeting to finance a delegation of four people for a flight to Washington, D. C. to plead for clemency for the Rosenbergs. The four delegates elected were BEN MARGOLIS, IGNACIO LOPEZ, DAVID GRUTMAN, a businessman at the present time and former president of the Southland Jewish Organizations, and DAVID BROWN, head of the Los Angeles Rosenberg Committee.

"At this meeting, IRWIN EDELMAN was present distributing flyers attacking the Rosenberg Committee for mistakes made by defense attorney EMANUEL BLOCH, and giving full credit for Justice Douglas' stay or execution to himself and FYKE FARMER of Nashville, Tennessee. "The meeting, upon adjournment, then proceeded to the Federal Building in Los Angeles, at which a vigil was set up comprising 638 people, which wound its way through downtown Los Angeles, past Republican Party headquarters and other points of congested traffic in order to attract the attention of the people. They were carrying placards which had slogans on them in substance as follows:

"Pope Pius XII urges clemency. ALBERT EINSTEIN, Dr. HAROLD C. UREY, Rabbi CHOI-BACH and dozens of others, each stating that the individual named was for clemency.

"After about an hour of picketing, the vigil settled down to about 20 which stayed through the night in front of the Federal Building and reformed on a mass scale so that by 9:00 AM, June 18, the ranks had swelled to several hundred persons and throughout the day the line kept increasing. This vigil was maintained until the hour of the execution which was 4:00 PM PDT, June 19.

SID told those present he saw BURTON GARRETT and LENNY LEVENSON at the funeral home where the ROSENBERGS were located.

SID also stated the CP should have begun its campaign on behalf of the ROSENBERGS sooner. However, the CRC would not let the CP come out in the open for the ROSENBERGS because by doing so it would have become directly linked with the ROSENBERG case. The Party wanted to pretend it was not interested.

It was further reported the "Daily Worker" and "The Worker" is delivered to R. CAMP 66-30 64th Street, Ridgewood, Long Island. According to the informant this is BOB ROSEV'S address. However, because the comrades do not want to receive the papers in their own name, the fictitious name of R. CAMP is being used on a mail box in the apartment house for the comrades to receive their papers. According to the informant this practice is in effect in all the boroughs.

The informant also reported FRANK DUFFY made two trips to Washington, D.C. to participate in the vigil outside of the White House on behalf of the ROSENBERGS.

On Monday night June 22, the Bronx Freedom of the Press held a Peace meeting at the Hungarian restaurant on 2141 So. Blvd. Bx. The main speaker was CLAUDIA JONES.

The Chairman of the meeting was MOISHE—and the other important speaker was MAX GORDON.

There were about thirty people present among these were

The meeting started after 9 o'clock and was over by eleven fifteen.

MOISHE introduced MAX GORDON who gave a brief picture of the sub drive, we must continue it to July 4, because we have not reached our quota as yet, spoke as he did once before on the need and use of the paper in our every_day struggles etc. etc.

He expressed regret that there were so few people here tonight, but that must be because of the strain and hard work of the past few weeks on the ROSENBERG Case.

On the ROSENBERG Case he branded it as a case of murder by the US. The futile fight we waged, the many appeals, the last minute staying of the execution by Justice Douglas, of his heroic effort and unwavering stand against such odds and his courageous interpretation of the law was very heartening, but alas all to no avail when he was overruled by the Supreme Court, and the ROSENBERGS were murdered.

This will live long in the minds of peoples all over the world.

The marvelous turnout at the funeral yesterday, both at the funeral parlor and at the Cemetary, even though the FBI and other forces of law and order tried to provoke trouble and disorder.

The forces of reactionary have taken the lives of two innocent people who died and will live as Martyrs in the eyes of the world for time immemorial, we will never rest until the ROSENBERGS are vindicated.

MOISHE introduced CLAUDIA JONES as our guest speaker, one who is undergoing heroic suffering and also out on bail, one of the "13", and also one who is fighting deportation as an alien; she is going to talk on Peace and the war in Korea and what is to happen after we sign a Peace treaty with the reactionary forces.

CLAUDIA JONES spoke from a prepared statement and often went off it to stress certain points.

She also spoke on the ROSENBERG Case and repeated almost word for word what M-X GORDON said placing the blame on the Mass hysteria and organized labor for their death. If organized labor had placed their support behind this case, the ROSENBERGS would not have died, their children would not be orphaned, and the real guilty ones, GREENGLAS who gave perjured testimony would be in a position clear them if his testimony was examined more closely.

CLAUDIA JONES spoke on the forth coming Peace talks and here she castigated the So. Korean President, RHEE as the arch-Conspiritor of this Peace plan. RHEE was blamed for starting this war of aggression and now when a genuine Peace Plan is in the offing he is turning against it, he is defying the UN and all other forces who want peace. He is fermenting hatred and discontent among his own people while our boys are dying on the battlefields of Korea.

We must pressure our representatives and the UN to sign this peace offering and let RHEE govern his own people without our help in money guns and forces.

CLAUDIA said let the Korean people settle their own problems, remove our forces immediately from the hills and mountains of Korea sign a peace treaty with the peoples representatives and let them decide how to handle their own problems.

During her speech a little kitten strayed into the hall and after going back and forth she jumped on the table directly in front of where CLAUDIA JONES was talking and she let out a scream causing her to momentarily lose her composure.

CLAUDIA continued to speak on Korea and the brave Chinese (Korean) people who are fighting a battle for their very existence, and denounces the various world aggressors and Capitalist elements and industrialist who seek to rule and ruin the world in their expansion and domination of all peoples including the colonial peoples.

After her speech she was asked a few questions, which she answered. This was followed by a brief discussion on the floor and only a few people participated.

It was announced later that JOSEPH CLARK, our foreign correspondent, has just returned from the Soviet Union and anyone who wants to go to this, in fact everyone should go this coming Wednesday June 24, any other information is to be found in the D. W.

To make this meeting more interesting each one of us should bring a sub to inspire JOSEPH CLARK and to come to hear his wonderful report, which we are all waiting to hear.

MOISHE announced that the A. L. F. is sponsoring a festival this coming Sunday June 27, at Randal Island stadium at 3 p.m. and all are urged to be there and bring your friends and neighbors, tickets are available here tonight.

At 1:40 PM, August 20, 1953, an unknown woman who refused to identify herself, telephonically contacted the NYO and advised that she had information which she wanted to furnish to the FBI.

She first made reference to the "Rosenberg Letters", stating that one MILLEN BRAND, an editor employed by Crown Publishers, 419 4th Ave., NYC, edited these letters which are being published. She said that MILLEN BRAND knew both of the Rosenbergs personally and that he also knew Judith Coplon. Informant advised that BRAND was mentioned in "Red Channels" in connection with Coplon, and that he had also refused to testify before a Senate Committee concerning his own activities. Informant further stated that Crown Publishers is soon to bring out a book written by MILLEN BRAND.

Informant stated that BRAND has a brother, EARL BRAND, who used to be employed in the Merchant Marine as a radio operator, and that EARL had at one time in the past been employed by the Panama Line.

Informant also stated that BRAND has a mother, name unknown, who resides at 18 Fairfield Street, Montclair, New Jersey. Informant said that both EARL BRAND, and the mother, as well as MILLEN BRAND, were known to her to have been associated extensively in Communist Party activities.

The informant then stated that one Dr. JOHN HANCOCK ROSEN, who is located in the vicinity of 1000 Park Ave., NYC, is active in Communist Party affairs, and that ROSEN'S sister, name unknown, is a known Communist. Informant stated that DR. ROSEN sponsored a book written by MILLEN BRAND.

Informant stated that the above-mentioned people passed cigarettes with messages concealed in them, and that she knew this from her own personal knowledge.

She further advised that LESTER WATKINS and FAT WATKINS are employed by Crown Publishers, and are presumably anti-Communist, although she said she could not understand why they were still employed there if they are anti-Communist.

Informant was pressed as to her identity, but she refused to tell her name, indicating fear of reprisal for having furnished information. She said that she also had to protect her children, and said she was not employed by Crown. She telephoned during her lunch hour, and said that the above was all the information she had to furnish at this time.

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
