

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Tubject interviewed 7/8/53 and again denied he ever was a member of the "ubject denied he was ever specifically asked to join the CP but stated at times was invited to attend social affairs which might have been supported by the CP. Subject stated he had no direct anowledge that these social affairs were being run by the CP and that he very rarely attended them. Subject denied being acquainted with anyone he knew to be a member of the CF. Subject would offer no explanation for discrepancy in his purchase of a Leica samera. Subject's U. S. Savings and War Londs Redemption record set out.

ALPPED ABRAHAM PURH was reinterviewed by 5A WILLIAM J. KICKHAM and the writer on July 8, 1953.

FUIL again advised he had never been a member of the Communist Party and consequently could furnish no information concerning members of the Communist Party. PUHN advised he had never been specifically saked to join the Communist Party but that he had been invited at times to attend various social affairs he beliaved might have been sponsored by the Communist Party but that he rarely attended any of these affairs. PINN again stated he went to a meeting

of what he believed to be the East Side Section of the Communist larty located on Last Proadway, New York City on one occasion to take pictures. FUHN stated he had no further information concarning the above meeting or of any people connected with it. IVHN also again stated he, on one occasion did a photography job for what he understood to be the Chelses Section of the Communist Farty whose headquarters were located on Lighth Avenue and West 17th Street in New York City but FUEN advised he had no information concerning this Chelses Section of the Communist Farty or of the people connected with it.

Fill advised his activities were in connection with the National Maritime Union for whom he was a photographer and almost all the rallies and meetings he attended were labor union activities at which he took pictures. Full stated that he had no direct knowledge that any of these social affairs were actually aponsored by the Communist Party. Full stated he had no first hand knowledge of any people who were members of the Communist Farty and declined to name any person he besidened might have been a Communist Party member.

FUEN advised, when questioned, that he was socially acquainted with CARTAR WINTER, HILDA ELRHHARDT, JOSEPH SOLOPON, and JULIAN SACH but could furnish no information that these people were members of the Communist Party or that they were Communist Party sympathizers. PUHE stated that he had academic discussions with the above people, sometimes on Communism, but to his knowledge none of them were Communist Party members.

PUHN advised he purchased his present Loica camera, model either F or G, serial number 231169 from the Olden Camera and Lens Company, 1265 Broadway, New York, New York.

PHEN stated that he did not know anything about the discrepancy in the purchase of a Leica camera, serial number 42270 on January 12, 1950 and the returning of a Leica camera, serial number 402330 on March 11, 1950 to Willoughby's Camera Store, New York, New York. PUHN advised he believed theremust have been an error made in the records of Willoughby's Camera Store. FUHH stated he was unable to offer any further explanation in the purchase and return of his Leica camera at

willoughby's Camora Store in New York, New York.

PURN advised he wished to cooperate with the FEI and stated he would be willing to furnish any information in his possession that the FBI might be interested in.

T-1, of known reliability, advised CARTER WINTER was a member of the 11 in 1944.

The records of the Eurosu of Special Services and Investigation. New York City Tolice Department reflect that HILLA E-PHHARIT, 40 Ponroe Street, New York, New York, solicited signatures for a Communist Party Nominating Petition dated August-September, 1919, for RENJAMIN DAVIE, Communist Party candidate for City Councilman in Manhattan.

T-2, of known reliability, who is acquainted with some Communist Carty activities in the New York City area advised that individuals who signed retitions as witnesses generally are the individuals who actually solicit the si-matures of the ordinars signers and that the job of securing signstures to the petitions is only assigned to Party members. The informent stated that in some cases, the petitions are circulated from door to door by Party workers who signed them as witnesses and in other cases petitions are circulated at some public gethering and are witnessed by some Communist Farty functionary. He added that in other instances, Communist Party workers would circulate petitions from door to door but would not sign them as witnesses because they did not desire to have their names appear on the petitions and they would turn them in to their club secretary or some other official who would . moitited to quore entire entitions.

T-3, of known reliability, advised in October, 1944 that JOSEPH SOLOMON, 40 Monroe Street, New York, New York, was one of the parsons enrolled in the School transferred to New York City.

Secretary of War, Recrientation Branch, 131 Centre Street, New York, New York, advised that the subject's personnel file

reflects a Personal History Statement executed by the subject on which he lists a JULIAN BACM, 511 Fark Avenue, New York, New York, as a reference.

The files of T-4, another Government Agency that conducts security type investigations, reflect that a JUDIAN J. SACH, JR. of 911 Fark Avenue, was one of a group of students at the Summer Session of the First Foscov University (Anglowaterican Section) in 1935.



Re telephone call to Assistant Director A. H. Belmont from Supervisor Warren T. Marchessault, October 7, 1953.

On October 7, 1953, Mr. FRANK GORDON, Chief Attorney, Gricvance Committee, Association of the Bar in the City of New York, conferred with me in my office, at which time he stated that he was handling the attempted disbarment proceedings against EMANUEL HIRSCH BLOCH for the Bar Association. He stated that in view of Mr. BLOCH's attacks against officers of the U.S. Government, the Court, and his criticism of the administration of justice, he is most anxious to see Mr. BLOCH disbarred or at least have appropriate action taken against him.

Mr. GORDON stated that Mr. BLOCH testified before the Grievance Committee back in July and August, 1953, and they believe that he did not tell the truth to the Committee. One of the statements they are particularly interested in is that he testified he had no connection with, and did not like, the Committee to Defend the Rosenbergs. Mr. GORDON stated that any information or assistance the FBI can render him in connection with disproving statements made by BLOCH would be greatly appreciated and would be handled in the most confidential manner without the Bureau becoming involved in any way.

Mr. GORDON stated that he had been informed confidentially by Judge IRVING KAUFMAN, who presided at the trial of the ROSEN-BERGS, that there was a rumor to the effect that BLOCH had something to do with the opening of a bank account for the Committee to Defend the Rosenbergs. Mr. GORDON stated he would be very much interested in knowing the bank so that he could subpoen the bank records in order to prove BLOCH's connection with the Committee. He also stated that Mr. BLOCH may have turned money over to the Committee, although generally speaking it would be the other way around, since BLOCH was paid by someone. Nevertheless, he said there may be some evidence showing that money was given to the Committee by BLOCH, and he would be interested in getting a lead on the bank through which it was handled.

Mr. GORDON further stated that Judge KAUPMAN had told him while discussing this matter that in connection with statements made by the ROSENBERGS that were critical of the Court, it would appear that some kind of a table could be drawn up which would show (1) the dates of the various motions presented before the Court; (2) visits of Mr. BLOCH to Sing Sing Prison immediately after or before these motions; and (3) press releases issued immediately after BLOCH's visit to the prison. He stated that the Daily Worker did not cover the ROSENBERG case to any extent at the beginning of the trial. He requested that in connection with any criticism in the articles published by the National Guardian of the FBI, the Department of Justice, and the Courts, if it could be tied up with Mr. BLOCH this would be of great assistance to him. He added that any connection between Mr. BLOCH and the National Guardian itself would be helpful.

Mr. GORDON said that Mr. BLOCH has already had a hearing before the Grievance Committee of the Bar Association, and the next step is to bring the matter before the Executive Committee of the Bar Association in preparation of going to Court. He also stated that since he feels his case is not sufficiently prepared, he has requested a 30-day postponement before it is presented to the Executive Committee. This postponement has been granted. It is expected that it will be presented to the Executive Committee the first part of November, 1953.

Mr. GORDON pointed out during this conversation that he realized some of the information he has requested would be available by him through public sources, but due to the fact he does not have a staff employed by him, it is impossible for him to secure this information prior to the time the matter will be presented to the Executive Committee. He stated that, therefore, any assistance the FBI could render him in this matter would be greatly appreciated, and thought that the information requested would no doubt be contained in the files of this office.

It is believed that to obtain the information requested by Mr. GORDON as above set forth would require a thorough and exhaustive search of the files of this office that would take up the time of two agents continuously for a period of eight or nine days. The interest of this office in the above-captioned case has been Re: EMANUEL HIRSCH BLOCH, WAS SECURITY MATTER - C

in connection with our investigation of Mr. BLOCH as a potential Security Index subject. He has now been placed on the Security Index.

Further, it is believed that assistance should be given to Mr. GORDON in sustaining and proving any charges against Mr. BLOCH for misconduct in office. It is believed that if the Bar Association would be successful in pressing charges against BLOCH it will be an example to the legal profession, and lawyers who espouse the Communist line will not in the future be able with impunity to make unfounded attacks against the Director, President EISENHOWER, Attorney General BROWNELL, and other responsible public officials, as well as the Courts of the United States.

The Bureau is requested to advise of its decision in the matter.

It is authorized to issue one hundred shares of common stock without par value and its office is maintained at 401 Broadway, In Care of, Emanuel H. Bloch. It has a minimum of three and a maximum of seven directors. The directors were listed as Morton Friedman, 42-12 216th Street, Queens, Ora Leak, 336 East 107th Street, Manhattan, Yo Fujii, 59 East 3rd Street, Manhattan. Each of the foregoing subscribed to one share of stock. The Certificate of Incorporation was filed by Emanuel H. Bloch, 401 Broadway. Morton Friedman is an attorney and is associated with Mr. Bloch at 401 Broadway. Yo Fujii is a female Chinese, employed as a secretary by Emanuel Bloch. It is likely that the name Jero Publishing Company, Inc. was taken from the first letters of the first names of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, namely, J-E-R- and the letter O was added to spell out a full name.




Informant advised that from 75 to 100 delegates from New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Washington, D. C., Massachusetts, California, Ohio, and Wisconsin attended the Conference and about 300 people attended the ROSENBERG Dedication Meeting (Public Session) at 8:00 pm, 10/10/53. Informant based the attendance at the Dedication Meeting on DAVID ALMAN's remark that he collected about \$1,200 or \$4.00 per capita.

DAVID ALMAN, according to informant, was the speaker at the 10/10/53 afternoon bession which began at 2:00 pm. ALMAN told how MORTON SOBELL was arrested in Mexico City where he had gone to vacation with his family. ALMAN stated that instead of taking SOBELL to the police station, they took him to the border and delivered him to FBI Agents. ALMAN pointed out that in the quick trial which followed SOBELL's arrest, SOBELL was convicted on the testimony of MAX ELITCHER, an admitted perjurer. ALMAN the trial, ELITCHER received a high salaried position in private industry which ALMAN feels was obtained with the aid of the FBI. United States vs. MORTON SOBELL and commented on it, but informant ddid not recall what ALMAN's comments were.

Informant advised that after ALMAN's speech, the delegates discussed a pre-conference paper and the sentence, "It (Committee) will work for a reduction of the tortuous 30 year sentence as alien to American concepts of justice and equality under law." This sentence was heatedly discussed and was deleted after the Sunday (10/11/53) report of the Policy Committee and a pledge was added to the pre-conference paper pledging support for the well-being of the ROSENBERG children and accepting full legal responsibility for MORTON SOBELL.

The discussion continued on the theme of how to get



SOBELL free. The delegates felt that the best way to do this was to get the support of labor and community leaders.


Informant said there were quite a few delegates from unions and a lady named HUGGINS (ph), a rank and file member of a Detroit union, told how she approached some of her co-workers during the heat of the campaign. The co-workers asked if she were a Communist. She replied no, but thought it a shame for the ROSENBERGs to die so young. She pointed out that regardless to ROSENBERGS remained in jail or were electrocuted, said she finally won the workers and the Detroit ROSENBERG Committee became one of the strongest.

GEORGE BROWN, Philadelphia, according to informant, suggested that there should be a youth branch as well as a senior branch of the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Committee. IRV SCHREIBMAN, Philadelphia, agreed that youth could play a tremendous part in theiring SOBELL. SARAH LITTENBERG, New York or New Jersey, stated that a youth group was in the organizational stage in New York and that every city should organize youth councils. The affection session adjourned about 5:30 pm.

The ROSENBERG Dedication Meeting began at 8:30 pm, 10/16/53, according to informant, with Dr. MALCOLM SHARP of the University of Chicago Law School giving some of the high-lights and legal points of the ROSENBERG case. Then EDITH SEGEL read three of her poems on the ROSENBERGs which will appear in a booklet soon. Two of them were entitled "I Hear the Rosenbergs" and "I Call Across the Continent." Mrs. SOBELL read a letter from her husband in which he said he welcomed the Committee and the work they were doing for him. Mrs. SOBELL said that her husband has renewed his energy since "those two gallant heros were cruelly put to death." Informant said that Mrs. SOBELL's remarks stirred the delegates emotionally.

DAVID ALMAN said there was still a chance for SOBELL's release from prison, but to get the finest legal staff available, they would need money.

Informant advised that the San Francisco chapter was



the first to contribute \$100. The Philadelphia Committee advised they had already left a check for \$100 at the Chicago Committee's office. Informant stated that a donation of \$100 was the largest requested and then a \$50.00 donation, \$30.00 donation, "a dollar for each year of SOBELL's sentence" and smaller amounts were requested.

Informant reported that on 10/11/53 at 9:30 am, the Eastern Region of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case held a caucus in Chicago.


The last session of the Conference began in Room 602, Fine Arts Building, 410 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, at 12:00 Noon on 10/11/53, according to informant, who further advised that REID ROBINSON, Los Angeles labor leader, was chosen Chairman of this session. ROBINSON called for the report of the committees. Dr. TUSHNET reported the following program and policy.

- 1. The Committee should circulate an Amicus Brief appealing for a new trial for SOBELL.
- 2. Obtain a detailed report from the U.S. Attorney Ceneral s Office. (Informant was not clear what this meant and stated he would discuss it with delegates for clarification.)
- 3. Acquire the names of the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee and have constituents write letters to members' homes and offices.

DON ROTHENBERG, Cleveland, gave a detailed report about Washington, D. C. during the ROSENBERG appeals. He stated that no Congressmen had the nerve to make a public statement on the ROSENBERG Case. He said he called on an unidentified Senator who said he would do what he could. Later, the Senator told ROTHENBERG that there was nothing to worry about since he had contacted the Justice Department, and they said a representative from their Department would call on the ROSENBERGS. ROTHENBERG







said he then read in a newspaper where the representative of the Justice Department had called on the ROSENBERGs and told them "either you talk or you die." ROTHENBERG said he showed the newspaper to the Senator who became furious after reading it. ROTHENBERG urged the contacting of members of the U. S. Senate and House of Representatives by their constituents on behalf of SOBELL.

DAN MARSHALL, Los Angeles attorney, was elected to lead the Committee, and the following were elected to assist him:

JOE BRAININ, Eastern Region Co-Director, and EMILY ALMAN, Secretary. LEONARD TUSHNET was nominated Treasurer, but not elected because TUSHNET felt the position of Treasurer required more discussion.

The following were elected to the Executive Committee:


JEAN FRANTJIS, Philadelphia; HERBERT TAMPSKY (PH), Boston; SYLVIA BERNSTEIN, Washington, D. C.; and W. E. B. DuBOIS, DAVID ALMAN, YURI SEWELL (PH), and NORMA AARONSON, New York. Baltimore, New Jersey, Western Pennsylvania, the midwest and west coast were expected to submit their nominations for the Executive Committee in two weeks or as soon as possible. A \$60,000 budget for a six month period was approved by unanimous vote.

The ROSENBERG Trust Fund was then discussed by YURI SEWELL, who said that the trustees, Professor MALCOLM SHARP, Chairman; EMANUEL BLOCH, Secretary; W.E.B. DuBOIS, and himself are striving for a \$75,000 fund which would be soundly invested.

The last point was a detailed report by SARAH LITTENBERG on the sale of the book entitled "ROSENBERG Death House Letters."

The chairman thanked the delegates for attending the Conference and read messages from Miami, Tampa, and "Other cities." The Conference adjourned about 3:00 pm, 10/11/53.



Information has been recently received that at a dinner of the New Jersey Committee for Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case, a check in the sum of \$5,000.00 was presented to EMANUEL H. BLOCH as New Jersey's contribution to the Trust Fund established for the Rosenberg children. As you have been previously advised, the stated goal of this Trust Fund is \$75,000.00. Information has also been received that Emanuel Bloch plans to travel to Canada and the West Coast in an effort to raise the necessary funds for the Trust.

Reference is made to my letter of December 2, 1953, by which there were forwarded to you certain copies of Trust papers which make reference to the "Rosenberg's Children's Trust Fund."

You are further advised that the Kational Rosenberg-Sobell Committee is circulating a form letter on a letterhead entitled, "Southern California Trust Fund Committee For Rosenberg Children." This letter solicits contributions for the fund as well as monthly or yearly sustainers enabling the contributor to "Become an Honorary Foster Perent."

You are further advised that on December 4, 1953 a rally was held at the Embassy Auditorium at Los Angeles, California. This rally, which featured Emanuel Bloch, was attended by approximately fifteen hundred persons. Bloch gave a speech mainly concerning the lives of the Rosenberg children since the arrest of their parents. The main purpose of the speech was to collect funds. Approximately \$2500.00 Another \$2500.00, which had been was collected.

It was announced at the rally that the local trust fund for the Rosenberg children was dissolved and all money collected in the future should be sent to New York.

In his speech, Bloch stated that he was looking for foster parents for the Rosenberg children and had in mind two ex-school teachers who were not further identified.

You are further advised that during past interviews by agents of this office with Mrs. TESSIE OREENGLASS, mother of Ethel Rosenberg, it was determined that neither she nor any members of her family had the financial means to raise the Rosenberg children. It is believed that if an application was made by Mrs. Greenglass at this time for letters of guardianship of the Rosenberg children, that the current efforts to raise a fund of \$75,000.00 for the support and education of the Rosenberg children would abruptly cease. However, when the present drive to collect the sum of \$75,000.00 has reached its goal, or nearly so, it would then be practical for Mrs. Greenglass to apply in the Surrogate's Court for letters of administration on the estate of her daughter Ethel, and at the same time, for appointment as guardian of the Rosenberg children.

It is noted the law of the State of New York vests the right to the appointment of a guardian in the blood relations of the children. Thus, if Mrs. Greenglass were to be appointed administratrix of the estate of Ethel Rosenberg and guardian of the children, Emanuel H. Bloch, the Rosenberg committies, and all others could be required to account in the Surrogate's Court for all funds in their possession rightly belonging to the estate of Ethel Rosenberg or the Rosenberg children.

Harry F. Goldberg was interviewed by SA Arnold C. Larson and the writer on the evening of 1/8/54 in Bureau car.

Subject appeared to be cooperative as to his activities in a general manner but could not recall anything specific as to the name of his in branch that he belonged to wo nor the names of any of the Ci leaders in the branch or the names of any of the members.

Subject recalled that the members did not use their true names but used aliases and were generally referred to by their first names.

Subject advised that he never knew Julius Rosenberg and that the only knowledge he had of Rosenberg was what he had mead in the newspapers.

Coldberg stated that he became active in the CP in about 1935 as a result of the degression. He stated that he did not know what Communism stood for at the time, but that it did have some good features for the poor and the unemployed. He stated that the CP program was very attrative to him as an unemployed person. Subject stated that he used to listen to corner speakers and subsequently joined the CP at its headquarters office on Utica Ave and Bergen in Brooklyn. He stated that he was not recruited but joined by himself. Subject stated that sometime after becoming a member he was made branch organizer of the club whose name he did not remember. His duties were to sell the Daily Worker and to make corner speeches. He stated that he did sell many DWs and that he made numerous speeches. However, he stated that he never recruited any members into the CP. He did state that he was instrumental in influencing his wife to join his brachch. He stated that he was also a member of the INO and the ALP and that his wife did subscribe to the "Jewish Life". However, he stated in 1939, he no longer felt that the CP was what it was pictured to be. He could no longer see "eye to eye with its policies and theories and started to become inactive in the CF and INO. In 1942, he stated, he made the definite break from the larty. However, he still felt by doing so he was he jeopardizing the safty of himself and his family. In 1946, Goldberg stated that he moved his family to Hempstead, where he presently resides . He stated that after moving to Hemistead, he also dropped from the ALP also realizing that it was dominated by the CP. He stated that shortly after he moved to Hempstead, he was contacted by an unknown woman who tried to persuade him to reactivate himself again in the liberal movement. But subject stated he rejected her completely and he hasnot been approached since then.

Subject stated that he has been out of the CP movement since 1942 and was inactive in it since 1939. He stated that he dropped out of the



It has been ascertained from a confidential source that the Rosenberg children were taken away from Ben Bach and his wife by Emanuel. Bloch and were being placed with a childless couple on Riverside Drive in New York City. The objective was for this couple to adopt the children and change their names but such action is not contemplated at present. Bloch was fearful that the Jewish charities or Jewish welfare committees might attempt to obtain custody of the children. Bloch has applied to a Quaker educational institute to assume the education of the children but was turned down, probably on some technicality.

amounted to \$50,000 and it was Bloch's plan to discontinue solicitations when the same of 375,000 has been collected. He believes that this amount is sufficient to educate and support the children. Bloch was very pleased with his trip to Los Angeles because he received more money there than in any other city. As of January 11, 1954, the trust fund amounted to \$65,000 which sum did not include royalties from the European sale of the book "Death House Letters."

The Rosenberg children are now attending a public school in New York City under an assumed last name.

Clerk SOLOMON SKOLNICK, who identified himself as a Post Office Clerk who lives at 80-36 - 265th St., Floral Fark, L.I., telephone Fieldstone 7-3570, stated that he is employed at the Church St. Outgoing Station and wished to make verbal charges against Field Supervisor Jack Walker. He stated that Jack Walker is a Supervisor at the Church St. Gutgeing Station and has a night tour and is a member of the Prothman-Rosenberg spy ring. He stated that Mr. Walker has attended open air Communist Party meetings with Leon Nelsen. Sam Novik and others whose identity he has previously brought to the attention of the FBI. He stated that Walker has been associated with former Police Lt. Miller who was expelled from the NYC PD squad. He stated that there are at least three other -men who have been associated with this spy ring and Walker presently employed in the Church St. P. O. Station. He described one as last name TANNENBERG, another as a tall thin fellow who works on the East Conne dicut table, a third fellow whose first name is Dave and works on the Pennsylvania mail table. He stated that he would be very happy to orally furnish additional data. Skolnick sounced emotionally upset at the time of the call and spoke in disjointed manner. He indicated then that there were certain Democrats and Post Office Inspectors in the Post Office who were trying to cooperate with Walker and who also had been trying to frame Skolnick. He thinks that Inspector Montague is one who has been in on the "framing". Skelnick appeared to be calling from a pay station, his time ran out, the operator was asking for another nickel, he stated that he would be glad to talk it over with a representative. I told him that I would see to it that he was contacted.

It is desired that arrangements be made to contact Skolnick for further details for the purpose of determining whether or inot he has any information of value.

At 2:00 P.N., 1/20/54, I was telephonically contacted by former Special. Arent Joseph Wohl concerning the picture to be made by Republic Pictures on the life and activities of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

Mr. Wohl advised that Republic Pictures, for whom he is now employed, had purchased the articles written by Bob Considine on the execution of the ROSENEERGS and intend to make a picture based on these articles. Mr. Wohl requested that, if possible, certain factual information concerning the birth, education and the like of the PCSENBERGS would be helpful to Republic Pictures. One Frank Nugent is writing the scenario for the picture and would appreciate talking to a Bureau official concerning this type information. He does not desire to obtain Bureau approval for the picture nor does he desire any confidential information.

. - Mr. Wohl asked that, if possible, an appointment be arranged with Mr. Nichols at the Pureau for Mr. Nugent.

I telephonically contacted Supervisor Frank Crosby at the Bureau at 12:12 P.K. and related the above to him. He told me that in all probability Mr. Nichols would see Mr. Nugent. SA Crosby would check and advise the writer on Thursday, January 21st or Friday, January 22nd whether Mr. Nichols could see Mr. Nugent. Dali, allegedly the leading figure in the group of hames she listed, was an officer in the MARTIGANER HAT CORP., MYC, which had bought out 'Ii lan rang with and soud of upton, hiss., in order to dominate the lives of the persons employed at this plant and who reside in Upton. She also maintained, no definite reason furnished, that there was a connection between the MA MIGAHER HAT CORP. and DAVID DUTINGRY of the Garment Workers Union. Sty like ise maintained that GUESH was associated with the FARESN Group in Germany. Regarding MATHAN SUSSMAN, she stated he is connected with the Company acres English acre, inc, and is an associate of The Done Company. No more specific information re this matter could be obtained from complainant.

Reference is made to memo of SAC BOARDMAN dated 1/18/54 in captioned matter which relates a telephone conversation had with one SOLOMON SKGLNICK, a post office clerk. Mr. SKOLNICK — was interviewed by SAS RICHARD A. MINIHAN and JOHN A. HARRINGTON on 1/20/54 in the NYO. Mr. SKOLNICK advised that he attended city College from Jan., 1936 until June, 1938 and took an engineering course. He quit school because he could see no future in chemical engineering.

He has been employed in the post office for the past 8 years and has been assigned to the Church Street Station for about the past year and half in the outgoing mail department on the 5:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. shift. He stated his boss was Mr. WAGNER, an Assistant Superintendent.

He stated that after he left City College in 1938, he joined the Young Communist League (YCL) and attended meetings in various locations in the Coney Island Section of Brooklyn. He advised that he saw JULIUS ROSCINEERS and JUEL BARR at City College. He advised that HARRY GOLD, convicted espionage agent, attended meetings of the CP in Brooklyn. He also stated that MARTIN BRAVERMAN was a member of this group.

He stated he saw BRAVERMAN on the subway one day surrounded by "8 Russians" and that if he (SKOLNICK) had sttempted to touch BRAVERMAN, he would "have been shot by the Russians."

SKOLNICK also mentioned that various fellow employees of the post office were members of this espionage group and also stated that he knew HAROLD GLASSER, recently in the news as 2D, espionage agent. He described MARTIN BRAVERMAN as a Large and it is noted that the papers on occasion have linked BRAVERMAN romantically with Miss MARGARET TRUMAN. It is noted that Mr. SKOLNICK had with him newspaper clippings and magazine articles which carried accounts of the JULIUS ROSENPERG trial and had pictures of these individuals. He described JOEL BARR as being "short and stocky" whereas this is just the opposite of the physical description of JOEL BARR.

You are advised that on 2/2/54, Philip Sokol, Counsel of the Department of Welfare, City of New York, telephonically contacted this office and advised of the following:-

Attorney for the ROSENRERGS, 1/30/54, BLOCH had teen called to the Department of Welfare to discuss placing the children of the ROSENBERGS in a foster home. Mr. Sokol stated that, to all efforts in this direction by the Department of Welfare, BLOCH was uncooperative and stalled in final determination. The Department of Welfare now intends to proceed with plans to establish a legal guardian over the persons and property of the children. This, of course, will entail action in the Surrogate's Court. Final plans as to how the Department of Welfare intends to proceed have not been formulated as yet. It is the intention of that Department, however, to place the children in the custody of a Jevish Philanthropic organization, as yet unidentified, which organization will obtain a suitable foster home for the children. As additional information in this regard is obtained, it will be transmitted at once to you.

You are further advised that the balance in the ROSENBERG Children's fund as of 2/1/54 is \$42,469.31.
