- I will provide the year, the neighborhood, the street, and with whom he first joined the Young Communist League. The emphasis is added because this person has since, unobtrusively, become a "very solid person" in Marxist circles.
- I will list - beginning with 1935 - approximately a dozen political activities in which he engaged from which it can be proven - significantly - that the sum and consistency of his actions were representative and premeditated; seaman's strikes, union formational activities, youth and student "groups", etc.
- I will also provide the names and approximate dates of various political activities in which his wife participated, the political significance of their meeting, the manner in which she aided him to contribute even a greater share of his time and effort than before.
- I will - within a week - produce documentary evidence that he has been arrested - under aliases - at least once and possibly twice for participation in riotous demonstrations, political meetings, etc.
- I will contribute what information I have been able to garner concerning the location of the money - not less than \$50,000.00 I am sure - paid him by the Soviet Government for his work. I have nothing definite on this, but we have - he reluctantly - discussed the money (and his need for it at this time) on several occasions, and I feel that one of two persons whom he has named is presently responsible for the guardianship of the cash.
- Perhaps my greatest contribution to the government's case would be in the role as liason between his law firm and the U. S. Attorney's office. Our friendship, his knowledge of my need to provide for my family, and their need of men to "investigate and disprove" certain allegations made by his brother-in-law (whose memory, from what I am able to establish, is dangerously weak and should not be completely trusted) has prompted him to extend, seriously, an offer of employment with his legal representatives in the "event of an early parole release." I realize that no "great secrets" will be imparted to me, but in such a capacity I will be able to prevent useless information being used by the government, as well as be able to enable the government to keep abreast of the situation as well as I am able to observe.

Two things have become obvious during the past week or so. First, there is hardly any question that a flight - specifically to Mexico City - was being planned. Only intervention by the authorities prevented the consummation of this plan. Apparently, there is some organized radical element operating in Mexico City which provides the materials of exodus for fleeing Americans, radicals, criminals, etc. The fact that Sobell was in Mexico City is by no means a coincidence.
