The following information should be noted in connection with the employment of the applicant's brother, George Albert Rothman, by the United Service for New Americans:

The New York Office, by report dated January 30, 1950, closed a case file entitled, "COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF UNITED SERVICE FOR NEW AMERICANS", inasmuch as there was no indication of Communist infiltration.

On October 10, 1950 a "Caution" memorandum was placed in the above file inasmuch as this organization seemed very uncooperative when contacted in connection with another case.

The memorandum further stated that Vivian Glassman is employed by the United Service for New Americans. Vivian Glassman is a known contact and associate of Julius Rosenberg, a key espionage agent who directed Harry Gold. Glassman is known to have been used by Rosenberg on courier work and in instructing William Perl, who is also involved in the Rosenberg espionage network, to leave the United States.

Entered the U.S. Navy 6/28/43. He was honorably discharged as a Quartermaster, Third Class, on 3/10/46. Record clear.

Applicant's father, Abraham Eli Rothman, was born in Roumania. He was naturalized by virtue of his father's, Simon Rothman's, naturalization in New York City, on February 15, 1905. Verified.

Applicant's father-in-law, Philip Sherman, was born in Russia, naturalized in New York City, on April 13, 1926. Verified.

Applicant's mother-in-law, Dorothy Sherman, was born in Russia, and received her citizenship by virtue of her father, Israel Schwartz' naturalization, on January 3, 1929. Verified.

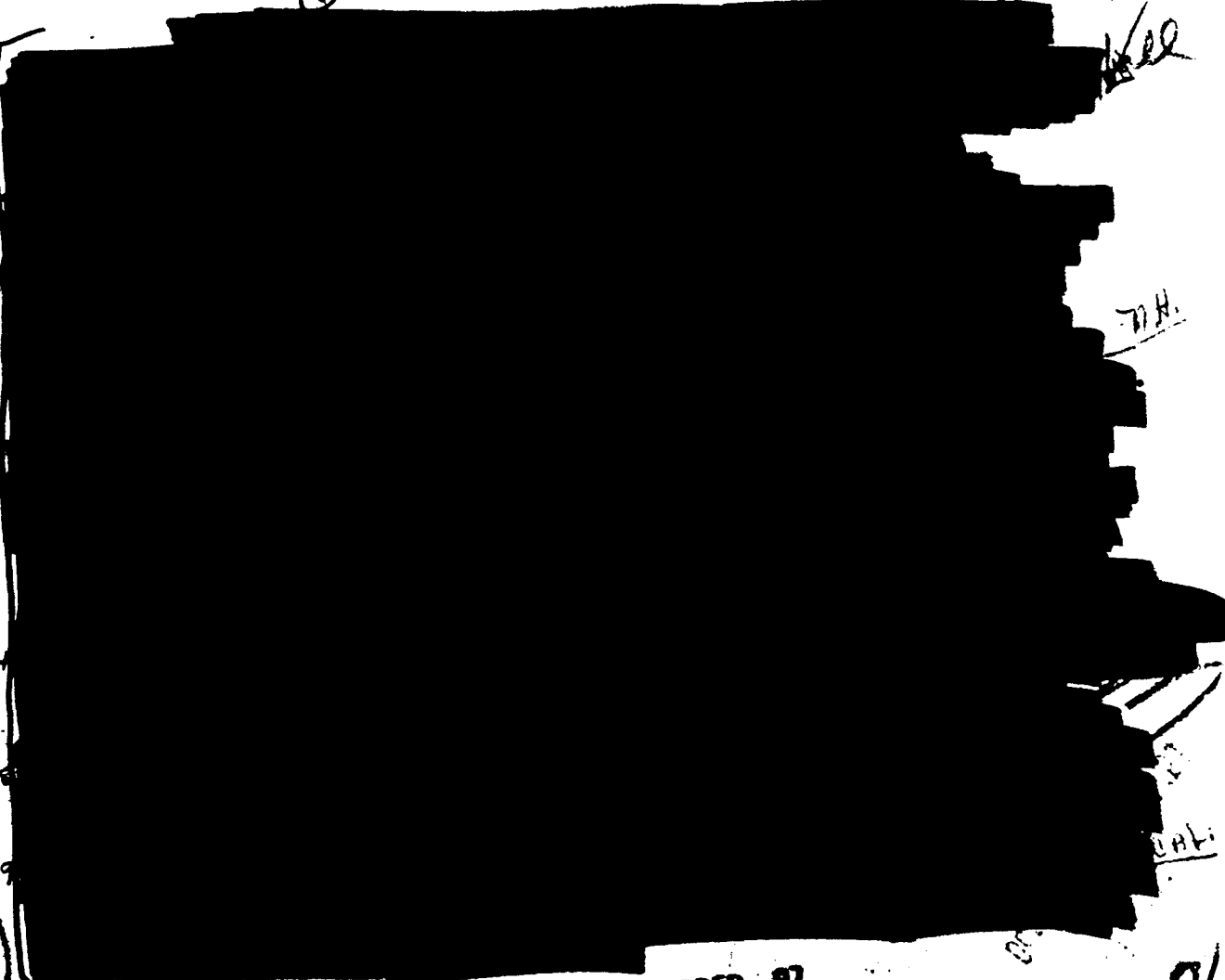

Investigation in this case is predicated on information received from DAVID GREENGLASS, admitted espionage agent, who gave a signed statement to SAS JOHN W. LEWIS and LEO H. FRUTKIN of the New York office, July 17, 1950, a pertinent part of which is being set forth:

"Through conversations with JULIUS ROSENBERG, I got the impression that the man who previously rented the apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, now occupied by ROSENBERG, was an engineer also engaged in Soviet espionage, and it was through this medium that ROSENBERG was able to get the apartment. This man left New York City ostensibly to go to the West coast to live, but instead went to China."

THE SPY STORY: The testimony at the atom bomb spy trials revealed that Julius Rosenberg gave \$5,000 to his brother-in-law, David Greenglass, and urged him to use it to escape to Mexico, then to Prague and on to Russia. When Greenglass was on the witness stand he wasn't asked what he did with this money . . . He spent most of it to retain O. John Rogge as his lawyer. Rogge's fee was \$3,900. And, as his counsel, Rogge persuaded him to tell the full story to U. S. Atty. Saypol. Rogge, as counsel to Max Elitcher—a classmate of defendants Rosenberg and Sobell—also convinced Elitcher to tell all.

The tragic figure in the case, the mother of Greenglass and the doomed Mrs. Rosenberg, had made a vain plea to Judge Irving Kaufman to spare her daughter's life. And when she realized that the matter of life or death now was the sole responsibility of her daughter—who can save her life by telling the full story—she asked to see her daughter, to persuade her to reveal all. Mrs. Rosenberg replied that this was inconsistent with her stand of innocence. Besides, was Mrs. Rosenberg's message, she didn't want to see her mother, "because she believes my brother, David, and doesn't believe me."

PERCENTAGE ON INVESTMENT: Don Hartman, the new executive producer at Paramount, for many years was a successful Hollywood screen writer before he became producer. One of the Paramount directors who congratulated him on his new high office said that Hartman now needs only some business experience—that movie-making is a major industry, involving millions of dollars, and that attention first must be paid to the stockholders and dividends. "You've been a writer, Don," he said. "What we businessmen want is quality, of course, but also movies which will return a profit."

"Spend \$2 million on a picture, but get back \$4 million for it," said Hartman. "Is that right?" . . . "Right," he was told . . . "I know that, but don't discount the writer's sense of profit," said Hartman. "100% profit on a \$2 million investment is remarkable. But now take the writer: He buys four pencils and some paper—total cost, maybe 85c—and from this comes something which often brings him a return of over a million per cent."

For the information of all offices receiving copies of this report, the information contained therein was furnished by MAX and HELENE ELITCHER of 164-18 72d Avenue, Flushing, New York.

MAX ELITCHER in 1944 was approached by JULIUS ROSENBERG purpose of recruiting him into Soviet espionage. ROSENBERG wife ETHEL and MORTON SOBELL were convicted and sentenced in 5 in the Southern District of New York of conspiracy to commit pionage. ELITCHER testified as a Government witness against them at the trial.

MAX ELITCHER has admitted membership in the Communist Party in Washington, D. C. from 1939 until approximately the summer of 1948. HELENE ELITCHER, his wife, has admitted membership in the party in Washington, D. C. from the Fall of 1943 until April 1946 or March 1947 within the Navy Department group and within the Housewives Group of the party during 1947 and 1948. Both have stated that they severed their connections with the Communist Party upon moving to New York in September 1948. The New York Office has no information to the contrary.

Both have cooperated with this office since their initial contact by Bureau agents in July 1950. There is every reason to believe that both ELITCHERS will be called by the Government as witnesses at some future date, in the perjury trial of WILLIAM PERL who is presently under indictment for allegedly making false statements under oath regarding his association with ROSENBERG and other individuals in ROSENBERG's espionage apparatus.

Inrerep, information furnished by the ELITCHERS is set forth relating to the existence, structure and activities of Communist Party cell groups within the Government, as known to them. In addition, the names of all individuals whom the ELITCHERS identified as Communist Party members in these cell groups are listed.

Specific information furnished concerning these former Government workers who were party members will be set forth in individual letters bearing the caption of the individual's name. These letters will be forwarded soon to the field offices covering the present residence address of each party member named. Two copies of each letter will be sent to each interested office, one for the individual case file and the other for the COGOG file. Two copies of each letter will be furnished to the Washington Field Office.

In a letter of March 2, 1951 to New York, the Bureau advised that it was disseminating to other intelligence agencies in Washington, D. C. information secured from ELITCHER concerning his involvement with ROSENBERG and SOBELL in espionage as well as his admissions of past Communist Party membership. The Bureau advised that further dissemination of information would be made at the Bureau as warranted and advised that no information should be disseminated locally at New York.

In view of this, all offices receiving copies of rerep are instructed not to disseminate any of the information contained therein unless specific authorization to do so is received from the Bureau. All offices are similarly requested, in utilizing this information in the course of investigation or interview of subjects mentioned in the report, not to disclose the identities of the ELITCHERS but to cover them through use of temporary informant symbols.

It is felt that the information furnished by the ELITCHERS will prove to be good source material for a thorough interview.

Reference is made to the report of SA Vincent J. Cahill dated March 31, 1952, at New York, entitled "Cogog."

A review of referenced report shows that the information contained therein was furnished to the Bureau by Max Elitcher and his wife, Helene, who have admitted membership in the Communist Party from approximately 1939 to 1948 in Washington, D. C.

It appears that the individuals referred to in referenced report were all members of the Navy cell of the Communist Party during the period 1939 to 1948. The Bureau has very little information regarding the various Government cells of the Communist Party and it is requested that the Washington Field Office expend every possible effort to develop additional information relative to the Government underground from the information contained in referenced report.

Each individual referred to in the referenced report should be checked through your indices to determine whether or not you have an active security investigation at the present time. Confidential informants and reliable sources should be checked for additional derogatory information. All of the information in your possession should be carefully evaluated to determine if subjects should be included in the Security Index or interviewed for any information that might be available regarding subversive matters and particularly the Government groups.

SAAG JOHN C. WALSH states that he has reference to possible criminal cases in which the defendants were American Communists and were convicted of disloyalty to the United States Government, or betrayal of our country. He has in mind such cases as those involving the ROSENBERGS, SOBELL, COPLIN, HISS, KLAUS FUCHS, DAVID GREENGLASS, WILLIAM REMINGTON, etc., in which the defendants or accomplices may have been identified as American Communist Party members either during the trial or probably at some other time.

It is realized that some of these cases cited above will not qualify for Mr. WALSH's purposes as the defendants were merely tried for perjury and not the substantive disloyal offense. Of course, if the trial of one of these or similar cases should have developed that the defendant was an American Communist and had been engaged in espionage or some similar act against our Government, the case would be of interest to him.

Mr. WALSH intends to use the cases, if there are some available, in connection with the cross-examination of witnesses which the defense may call. In this manner, he hopes to be able to disprove the statement by CHARLES E. FUCHIATO that there has never been any evidence of disloyalty on the part of any member or official of the Communist Party.

Mr. WALSH does not expect the Bureau to supply informants to prove the matter of disloyalty or the matter of Communist Party membership.

Reurlet of October 3, 1952, concerning the request of SAAG John C. Walsh for pertinent facts showing examples of disloyalty to our Government on the part of American Communists. Reference is also made to your letter of clarification dated October 16, 1952, in which it was stated that Mr. Walsh had referred to possible criminal cases in which the defendants were American Communists and were convicted of disloyalty to the United States Government or betrayal of the United States.

In the referenced communications you noted that Mr. Walsh intends to use the requested material in connection with the cross-examination of witnesses at the scheduled "Smith Act" trial at Honolulu. In this manner Mr. Walsh intends to disprove the press release made by Charles K. Fujimoto, Chairman of the Communist Party of Hawaii, which claimed that as a "matter of public record--there has not been a single evidence of disloyalty on the part of any member or official of the Communist Party."

Conversely, it would appear that attempts to disprove this statement of Fujimoto should also be made from the "public record." It would appear that the examples to be cited by Mr. Walsh should include three factors: (1) the example being a matter of record; (2) membership in the Communist Party, USA, and (3) acts of disloyalty to the United States. The strongest examples coming within these categories are set forth in the four blind memoranda attached, captioned: "Louis Francis Budenz; "Elizabeth Bentley"; "Jay David Whittaker Chambers and Alger Hiss"; and "Morton Sobell; Julius and Ethel Rosenberg." The original and one copy of each memorandum should be furnished SAAG Walsh, and one copy should be retained by your office.

The public source material used in the preparation of these memoranda has been checked against information determined by Bureau investigations for accuracy. It is noted that examples suggested by your letter of October 16, 1952, have been reviewed and do not come within the desired category with the exception of the enclosed material. It is noted that the case of William Remington did come within the desired category; however, upon appeal a new trial was ordered and it does not appear desirable to utilize the Remington matter at this time. the attached blind memoranda available to Mr. Walsh, you are instructed to bring to the attention of Mr. Walsh the fact that the conviction of the Rosenbergs is at the time of writing on appeal to the United States Supreme Court. The next session of the United States Supreme Court is scheduled to open on November 10, 1952. Therefore, Mr. Walsh should be alert to any reversal of conviction or sentence in the Rosenberg case.

In addition to the attached blind memoranda, you may wish to bring to the attention of Mr. Walsh, as a prime example within the desired category, the conviction of the eleven National Committee members of the Communist Party on October 14, 1949, in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. Inasmuch as this example represents a "Smith Act" conviction, he may not feel that it is a desirable example to use in connection with similar prosecutive action.

Summary
Summary

On March 29, 1951, a jury verdict of guilty was returned against Morton Sobell, Julius Rosenberg, and Ethel Rosenberg in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York. These individuals were charged with being part of a conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were sentenced to death, and Morton Sobell was sentenced to thirty years in prison. The principal evidence against Julius and Ethel Rosenberg was supplied by two co-conspirators, David Greenglass and Harry Gold. David Greenglass made a plea of guilty to his participation in the conspiracy to commit espionage and, in general, supplied the following testimony regarding the Rosenbergs. Greenglass stated that he had participated in discussions with his sister, Ethel Rosenberg, and his brother-in-law, Julius Rosenberg, during the period 1935 to 1945 or 1946. These discussions concerned the relative merits of the governments of the United States and the Soviet Union. According to David Greenglass, Julius and Ethel Rosenberg indicated a preference for "Russian Socialism."

David Greenglass stated that the original approach relative to his involvement in espionage activity was initiated by Julius and Ethel Rosenberg through Ruth Greenglass, the wife of David Greenglass. David Greenglass testified as to the conversation engaged in by the Rosenbergs and Ruth Greenglass as related to him by his wife, Ruth Greenglass. This conversation took place just prior to November, 1944, on the occasion of a visit by Ruth Greenglass to the residence of the Rosenbergs. During the course of the conversation on this occasion, Ethel Rosenberg indicated that she was no longer involved in Communist Party activity; that she did not attend club meetings; and that she did not buy the Daily Worker. Ethel Rosenberg claimed to Ruth Greenglass that these circumstances were occasioned by the activity of Julius Rosenberg, in connection with his supplying information to the Soviet Union. Also on this occasion, according to David Greenglass, Julius Rosenberg advised Ruth Greenglass that David Greenglass was working on the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, a fact heretofore unknown to Ruth and David Greenglass. Rosenberg further indicated that he wanted David Greenglass to supply information in connection with this project to the Russians.

On the occasion of a visit made by Ruth Greenglass with David Greenglass in November, 1944, at Albuquerque, New Mexico, Ruth Greenglass relayed the request of the Rosenbergs. David Greenglass

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agreed to submit to this request and, in addition, supplied information available to him at that time to Ruth Greenglass, which she was to transmit to Julius Rosenberg upon her return to New York City. David Greenglass also stated that in January, 1945, he visited Julius Rosenberg in New York City and supplied him with atomic data in his possession as well as names of possible recruits for Soviet espionage activities. According to Greenglass, Julius Rosenberg had indicated that he wanted a list of people who seemed sympathetic to Communism and would help furnish information to the Russians. During the course of this visit in New York City, Julius Rosenberg arranged with Greenglass tentative plans for future contacts with Greenglass after his return to New Mexico. The arrangements made at this time were subsequently consummated when Harry Gold, a professed Soviet espionage agent, contacted Greenglass in New Mexico for atomic data.

In connection with the trial of the Rosenbergs, Harry Gold testified that he had collected atomic data from Greenglass in accordance with instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, Anatoli Antonovich Yakovlev. Documents were offered at this trial identifying Yakovlev as an official or employee of the Soviet Union.

Max Elitcher, a former employee of the United States Navy Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C., from November, 1938, to October, 1948, testified in this conspiracy trial. He stated that both Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell tried to persuade him to supply them with secrets concerning projects at the United States Navy Bureau of Ordnance. Elitcher also stated that Morton Sobell had taken him to a meeting which concerned the formation of a Communist Party branch, resulting in Elitcher's becoming a member of this branch. Elitcher stated that both he and Sobell attended subsequent meetings of this Communist Party branch, at which the Daily Worker was read and Marxist and Leninist theories were discussed. Elitcher admitted that he had continued as a member of the Communist Party until 1948.

REDS SAVED ROSENBERGS (THEY SAY)

Paris, March 9—This may come as a profound shock, so brace yourselves. The Kremlin and its Communist parties around the world have saved the Rosenbergs. Snatched them away from the electric chair at the eleventh hour, to use their quaint figure of speech. American juridical process according to Communist exultations—bowed before the cumulative "moral" indignation of the Soviet world and provided Ethel and Julius Rosenberg with a stay of execution, pending further review by the U. S. Supreme Court.

So how, demanded a rotund figure with a toothbrush mustache the other day can the U. S. and nations allied with her persist in charges that Russia is committing deliberate acts of anti-Semitism? Isn't it proof, he challenged his listeners, that by persuading the U. S. to hold off on the Rosenbergs that Communists are not anti-Semitic?

These moralistic acrobatics were spun by Jacques Duclos, acting chief of the French Communist Party, the second largest outside the Soviet Union. But, while Duclos was snatching at the Rosenbergs, his party apparatus and Communist organizations throughout Western Europe were singing other tunes.

Right in France, on the party cell level, Communist orientation courses are today filled with anti-Jewish doctrine as vicious as anything that ever appeared in Julius Streicher's "Der Sturmer," when Hitler's favorite Jew-baiter was riding high. Lectures are preceded with the explanation that Communists are not anti-Semitic, or anti any racial minority. But Communists, like the Soviet Union itself, must be vigilant against the encroachment of Jewish banking interests, international Jewish finance capital and its product, the State of Israel.

To help the average party member retain the indoctrination, Communist newspapers feature lengthy series of articles on the "capitalist-imperialist" designs of the Jews, whose objective, they claim, is to help the U. S. overthrow Soviet-sponsored republics throughout the world. Cartoons of conspiring Jews, reminiscent of all the Nazi caricatures, are sprinkled liberally throughout the articles to provide additional emphasis.

Simultaneously, the Western European Communist parties, particularly the French, have come up with a program for closer comradeship ties with Germany's Reds in the West and East zones. Tightened bonds, party leaders contend, will lead to unified action and remove the threat of war.

Unity already exists in the common cause the Communist parties have made of an anti-Semitic campaign. It didn't, for example, take the French Communists very long to follow the lead of their German comrades—about five days. First the crackdown on East German Jews was ignored and then the action was applauded as a protective measure. Protection from what? The answer came soon. Jews in East Germany—all 2,800 of them—were usurping the economic structure of the state. They would do the same, and are so engaged at present, in France, Italy, Britain and the rest of Western Europe.

That's the basic indoctrination thesis the Communists employ today. Then they go on to show how international Jewry, a once-familiar propaganda term, is exploiting underprivileged peoples. The theme veers immediately to the Middle East. American-provided Point IV assistance, Communist agitprops (agitator-propagandists) declaim, are schemes designed and financed by Jews to give them and the U.S. a stranglehold on the Arab world.



Which leads the doctrinaire Communist to the next point: Zionism and Israel. A month before the Soviet break with Israel, the Communist line was taken to show how the U. S. was using refugees from Eastern Europe and organizations assisting them in mass espionage and sabotage.

And once a refugee reaches Israel, the indoctrination insists, he is trained to believe that one day he will return to the land of his birth within an "imperialist" army. That line has been brought up to date by citing Jewish refugees from Soviet Europe as part of the "Fascist" legions. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles has been recruiting, or so Communists tell local memberships.

The firms of Kuhn, Loeb and Co., Lehman Brothers, and most recently Dillon, Read, have been introduced darkly by the Communists as the investors behind Israel in general and Prime Minister Ben-Gurion, in particular. In France, the party has singled out C. Douglas Dillon, the new U. S. Ambassador, as a "Jewish banker" commissioned by the Eisenhower administration to entrench his purported co-religionists' financial interests.

In retracing the history of this "Jewish conspiracy," France's local Communist leaders are informing their faithful that the Marshall Plan was part and parcel of the organization of the American Joint Distribution Committee, AJDC, is a world-wide Jewish espionage network, according to the Communist indoctrination lectures.

Therefore, the lecturers' summations say, international Jewish banking interests are behind all the American espionage activities, are solely responsible for the creation of Israel and are seeking to retain an iron grip around the collective economic throat of Western Europe and the gasping Middle East.

Supreme Court Justice Meier Steinbrink, national chairman of the Anti-Defamation League, today warned against Communist Party propaganda that seeks to create the false illusion that Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, convicted atom spies, were victims of an anti-Semitic frameup and the principals in an "American Dreyfus" case.

"The invention of anti-Semitism where it does not exist," Judge Steinbrink declared, "has long been a Communist Party tactic. Well-meaning citizens with a genuine desire to combat religious bigotry may be misled. But the patent falsity of the Communist propaganda claims should put all Americans on guard against falling into this trap."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case, Judge Steinbrink said, has promoted public meetings in New York and Chicago and has made a special effort to hold these meetings in Jewish communal buildings in order to provide a setting for their propaganda line that a Jewish issue is involved. One of the Chicago meetings was scheduled to be held in a temple. This was cancelled after officials of the congregation discussed the problem with ADL and other Jewish agencies. A similar meeting was held in New York City and it is anticipated that there will be further efforts by Communist groups to agitate the Jewish community with other meetings.

"The pages of the Daily Worker, the National Guardian and other Communist publications are increasingly playing the Party line of attempting to identify the Rosenberg conviction with a plot against Jews. By faking the evidence of anti-Semitism for their own partisan purposes, in a situation where it does not exist, the Communist Party is actually creating anti-Semitism," Judge Steinbrink said.

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A review of the County Clerk's records of New York County by SA WILLIAM R. YATES disclosed that a Certificate of Business dated March 24, 1945 in the name of the Processed Chemicals Company indicated that this business was to be conducted at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, by ROSE GOLDBLUM, 783 Troy Avenue, Brooklyn, and BEATRICE KIRSHEN, 556 Albany Avenue, Brooklyn. A notation on the certificate indicated that it had been filed by a SERGE JARVIS, 10 East 40th Street, New York City, as attorney.

It is to be noted that MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ, partner and secretary to ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, during an interview in May, 1950, by SAs RALPH F. MILLER and THOMAS H. ZOELLER advised that A. BROTHMAN and Associates in 1945 decided to build a laboratory and rented space at 85-03 57th Avenue, Elmhurst, Queens. She said the money to set up this laboratory was borrowed in the firm's name from BERNARD PIDTO who was a salesman for the Malone Bronze Powder Works, Inc. of New York City, and who had a business in Brooklyn called the Processed Chemicals Company. PIDTO, according to MOSKOWITZ, first put up \$16,000.00 but later put up additional amounts until he had furnished a total of \$25,000.00.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that on January 23, 1950 Ulster Chemicals, Inc., a corporation controlled by ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, entered into an

agreement with the Processed Chemical and Coatings Corporation, Inc., 33 North First Street, Brooklyn, New York, of which MORRIS KUSHEN was secretary, and under which Processed Chemical and Coatings Corporation, Inc. became exclusive sales agent for a certain chemical product known as thioglycolic acid manufactured by Ulster.

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN has been identified as being a Soviet espionage agent in the early nineteen forties by HARRY GOLD and ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, both admitted former Soviet espionage agents.

BROTHMAN and MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ were convicted of Obstruction of Justice in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, in 1950.

The name of this concern was changed by a certificate dated April 17, 1950 to Saxony Screen Printers. This certificate was signed by BERNARD JUSZMAN, SAM BROOKS and HARRY E. ELLIS who indicated they were the holders of all outstanding stock.

It is to be noted that investigation in connection with another matter has disclosed that in the Summer of 1950 GEORGE NEUMAN, President of the Printex Corporation, was ill and PHILIP MARSTON SALOFF was operating Printex.

It is noteworthy that DAVID GREENGLASS, convicted Soviet espionage agent, has identified PHILIP SALOFF as a contact in 1949 of JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent.

During an interview by SAs JOHN A. HARRINGTON and NORMAN E. BLISS on February 15, 1952, SALOFF admitted knowing ROSENBERG since about 1936 when SALOFF was organizer for the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians. SALOFF further stated that he met JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG during World War II at a party while he (SALOFF) was working for the Audio Manufacturing Company, Glenbrook, Connecticut.

Later in about 1948 SALOFF said JULIUS ROSENBERG contacted him in an effort to get some business for the Pitt Machine Products Company which was operated by ROSENBERG and GREENGLASS. SALOFF said that he decided Pitt was not set up to do the high caliber work required by Audio and so no business came from this contact.

During this interview SALOFF admitted having been a member of the International Workers Order for its insurance coverage since about 1940 but denied any other activities with the International Workers Order. SALOFF further denied ever having been a member of the Communist Party or having any knowledge that the Communist Party exercised any control over the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians, and SALOFF specifically denied any knowledge of espionage activities on the part of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

It is to be noted that the International Workers Order has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Concerning the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, the following is noted:

On page 151 of the book "A Story of the CIO" by BENJAMIN STOLBERG, the following appears:

"Only four CIO unions are under complete control of STALINIST officials. They are the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians....."

Referenced letter suggested that further consideration be given to interview of DAVID LEEDS, who is believed to have been associated with SCHUSTER. In this connection, NY was requested to interview confidential source [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] NYO will arrange to interview [REDACTED] at NY if he is available, however, the Pittsburgh Office will be furnished with sufficient information to explore fully the informant's knowledge of the association of SCHUSTER and LEEDS.

In this connection, the Bureau's attention is invited to page 30 of the report of SA DANIEL F. O'CONNOR dated 3/16/51, at NY, in the captioned matter. [REDACTED]

Agents assigned to the TOPLEV program will review the LEEDS case and give consideration to the desirability of an interview of DAVID LEEDS at this time. The views of the NYO as to this matter will be furnished to the Bureau by separate letter. Referenced letter further noted that LEEDS was employed by the Advance Printing Company, and that SCHUSTER was connected with Advance Scientific Publishers, Inc. It was suggested that NY ascertain if there was any connection between these two concerns.

Referenced letter also comments on recently reported quarrels between the subject and his wife, as contrasted with the appearance of devotion reflected during surveillances of the subject.

On 10/30/52 the subject, while under surveillance, after work had dinner with his wife at the El Faro Restaurant, where they have frequently eaten in the past, and then returned home.

On 11/13/52 the subject, while under surveillance, returned from work; met his wife in front of their residence; they greeted one another with kisses, and spent the evening together, having dinner at Schwartz Restaurant, 30 St. Mark's Place, and attending a neighborhood motion picture theater. During the entire period, they were under surveillance. SCHUSTER gave the appearance of a devoted husband, and the couple walked arm-in-arm engaging in apparently pleasant conversation.

From the above, it would appear that the quarrels of the SCHUSTERS may have arisen over dissatisfaction on the part of Mrs. SCHUSTER, over their previous quarters.

In contrast, the subject currently resides in a furnished apartment in a large, relatively modern building.

Referenced letter invited ~~committees~~ ^{COMMENTS} on the sufficiency of investigation to date, and the desirability of interviewing SCHUSTER. This office feels that upon the completion of interviews of established sources and informants, as set out in my letter of 6/23/52, the next logical step would be an approach to the subject.

SCHUSTER's long association with undercover and espionage operations would make him extremely valuable, if he could be persuaded to cooperate. He is known to have associated with JULIUS ROSENBERG, ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and JOSEPH KATZ; he could probably identify many of the unknown subjects known to [redacted] he could be logically expected to have some knowledge of the CP [redacted] s b/

underground, and could be in possession of valuable information which might lead to the apprehension of the CP fugitives.

In view of SCHUSTER's known habits and behavior, it is felt that the most appropriate method of initial contact would be to approach SCHUSTER on the street after he leaves work in Brooklyn, and before he enters the subway on his regular route. The interviewing agents could indicate a desire to speak to him, and suggest that he could be driven to his home or any other place that he desired. He could be advised that the Bureau's interest in him derived from possible information he could furnish concerning the CP fugitives. This approach might have a tendency to make him more cooperative in the initial stage.

If he expressed a willingness to discuss this matter, it could be explored to an extent to determine the degree of his cooperation. Other matters of interest could be temporarily deferred in such event.

If he failed to denote any desire to cooperate, it could be suggested that the Bureau is aware of his past activities and that he was being afforded an opportunity to cooperate.

The Bureau's suggestions and advice on this proposed interview of SCHUSTER are requested. In addition, the Bureau is requested to advise as to what other investigative steps, including possible prosecution, in the event SCHUSTER proved totally uncooperative.

As the Bureau has been advised, a summary report covering all of the investigation to date is being prepared, and will be submitted as soon as possible. This report will be accompanied by a cover letter which will request authorization to interview SCHUSTER.

In accordance with Bureau instructions, BERNARD SCHUSTER was interviewed on 3/23/53 by SA ALBERT J. KLEIN and SA ARNOLD E. BRANDT.

At 4:15 p.m. the subject was approached on North Seventh Street between Berry Street and Bedford Avenue, Brooklyn, NY, at which time the above-mentioned agents identified themselves and expressed a desire to speak to the subject. The subject appeared to be taken completely by surprise but indicated a willingness to converse with the agents for a few moments. He was advised that a car was available if he wished to be taken anywhere. However, SCHUSTER indicated a fear that it might contain a "dictaphone" and was also reluctant to enter any bars or restaurants in the area. He indicated a willingness to conduct the conversation while walking along the street. However, he stated that if the matters to be discussed involved him he would probably not say anything.

SCHUSTER was immediately asked to explain his relationship with JULIUS ROSENBERG. At this point the subject manifested complete surprise and alleged that his only knowledge of ROSENBERG was what he had read in the newspaper. He was then asked if he knew ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, at which he denied that he had ever heard of him.

The subject volunteered the information that he had given up any CP activity three or four years previously for "personal" reasons, which, at this point, he refused to elaborate on. He stated he assumed that the purpose of the contact was to enlist his cooperation but he wished to point out that he had no present knowledge of any activities he felt would be of interest to the Bureau and that in any case he would not speak of any of his prior associates or acquaintances since it was against his principles.

The interviewing agents pointed out that they knew that SCHUSTER was not being truthful about his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG and ABRAHAM BROTHMAN inasmuch as the Bureau was in possession of information that SCHUSTER actually and definitely had had association with ROSENBERG and BROTHMAN. In spite of these statements, the subject remained impassive and refused to make any comments.

The Bureau interposes no objection to a re-interview of the subject. You should be guided by the instructions furnished you by the Bureau in conducting the initial interview.

The possibility of offering the subject some financial reward to influence his cooperation has been considered by the Bureau. It is not felt, however, that any set sum should be offered Schuster in order to induce him to cooperate. As you know, the opinion of the Department has been requested as to possible prosecution of the subject under the Internal Security Act of 1950, or other Federal statutes. In the event a specific sum were offered to Schuster and he rejected same, this episode could prove embarrassing to the Bureau during any possible future prosecution. It is believed that the sincerity and willingness of the Bureau to be absolutely fair to Schuster in the event of his cooperation should be stressed in the next interview.

The possibility of inducing the cooperation of Schuster through his wife should also be considered. It was noted that Schuster, in the interview of March 23, 1953, expressed a desire to keep his wife out of the conversation and did not deny her attitude may have been a factor in his withdrawal from CP activities. Your observations and recommendations as to a possible contact with the subject's wife are solicited.

Wingdale Lodge was a haven for the Party faithful. Almost all the key personnel were identified as active Communist Party members.

Morris Lipschitz, director of the camp for children connected with Wingdale Lodge, was, under the alias of Moe Morris, secretary of the Communist Party fraction assigned to children's work. He was also dismissed from the New York City school system as a result of Communist affiliation.

Claire Rodney, in charge of the Wingdale Lodge book shop, was a Communist Party member and a former official of the Young Communist League. She is the wife of Lester Rodney, a *Daily Worker* sports columnist.

Irwin Silber, athletic director at Wingdale Lodge, had many-faceted Communist activities: as a publisher of Communist books, of song books used in children's camps, and also as director of plays and pageants.

Elliot Sullivan, with an extensive Communist background, was in charge of staging plays, pageants, and other entertainment at Wingdale Lodge.

Fred Briehl, owner of Briehl's Farm at Walkill, Ulster County, New York, was the Communist Party candidate for the office of Attorney General of the State of New York in 1934 and 1936 and later the Party's candidate for Comptroller of New York State. His picture, as one of the "state leaders" of the Communist Party of New York State, appears in the publication "1919-1939—Two Decades of the Communist Party, United States of America."

The testimony of Norman Studer, director of Camp Woodland, denied that he purposely hired Communists as his assistants at the camp, but his records show that the staff was studded with Communist specialists in training children.

Another member of the management staff at Camp Kinderland was Edith Segal, who acted as the children's "dancing teacher." According to sworn testimony before the Committee, which she declined to deny, she was a long-time active Communist Party member; a teacher at the Jefferson School of Social Science (cited by the Attorney General of the United States as a Communist organization), and the author of a number of books and articles including a book of poems glorifying Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, the convicted Communist espionage agents. It is typical of the material given the children that this book was recommended reading at the camp.

The following in her testimony is illuminating.

When Miss Segal was shown a Camp Kinderland illustrated brochure, she was asked:

The Chicago Committee for Justice for ROSENBERGS (its address is 179 West Washington Street, Room 1006, Chicago) announced that 89 citizens of the south side of Chicago sent an open letter to President TRUMAN requesting clemency for the ROSENBERGS.

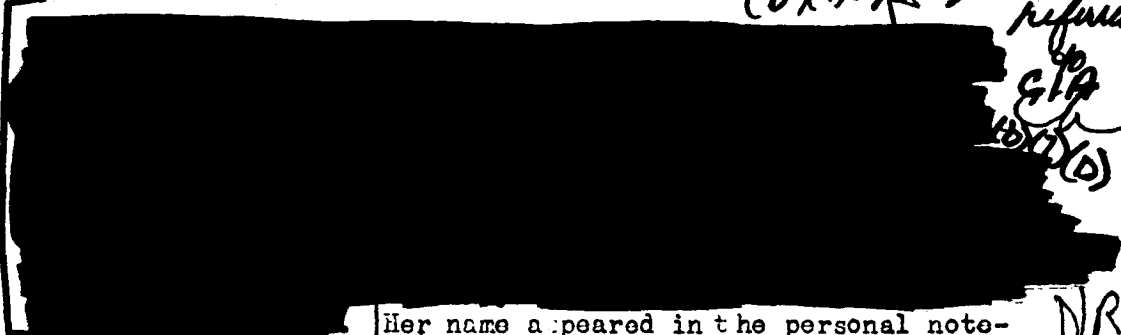

The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951. On February 25, 1952, this conviction and sentence were affirmed by a United States Court of Appeals. ALLEGED SOVIET ESPIONAGE

On March 27, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS, an admitted former Soviet espionage agent, advised that in 1945 or 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent, told him that the friends on the west coast to whom he had shipped furniture were engaged in Soviet espionage and were going to China. On March 22, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified, during the course of his trial in New York City, that HARRY and SYLVIA STEINGART had loaned him two tables when they moved to California.


JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, along with MORTON SOBELL, were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union on March 29, 1951. On April 5, 1951, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, at the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, were sentenced to death, and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to thirty years in prison. On June 19, 1953, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, and MORTON SOBELL is

currently serving his prison sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

On March 24, 1951, HARRY STEINGART was interviewed by Special Agents FRANCIS D. COOLEY (A) and THOMAS E. BRYANT, of the Los Angeles Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, in the presence of STEINGART's attorneys. STEINGART stated that he had met JULIUS ROSENBERG in New York City in 1939 or 1940, probably at a meeting of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians Union. Thereafter, STEINGART stated he saw ROSENBERG at union meetings and, in addition, made social calls on ROSENBERG and his wife. STEINGART stated that in 1945, he wrote ROSENBERG, requesting that the latter forward to him certain furniture which he, STEINGART, had stored in New York City at the time of his departure. In return for the forwarding of this furniture, STEINGART stated he permitted ROSENBERG to retain certain pieces of furniture. STEINGART, at this stage, declined to answer further questions regarding his association with JULIUS ROSENBERG, on the advice of his attorneys.

On March 27, 1951, Special Agent THOMAS E. BRYANT, Los Angeles Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, was advised by HARRY STEINGART's attorney, JACK TENNER, that neither HARRY STEINGART nor SYLVIA STEINGART would answer any additional questions unless they were served with a subpoena. o/s

 She continued that both ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG grew in stature in their faithfulness to the Party in their last years, and that if they had talked before they died, every Communist in the United States would be in jail. Because they did not talk, SYLVIA indicated, it was possible for this group to be together in San Francisco. SYLVIA said that she and HARRY lived next door to the ROSENBERGS in the east, and all they, the ROSENBERGS, thought of was the tremendous importance of the Party and the role being played in the world by the progressive people. She stated, "We owe our future to them and must carry on the work that they gave their lives for. In a few years we will have won our battle and pay them back for the lives they so generously gave in our behalf."

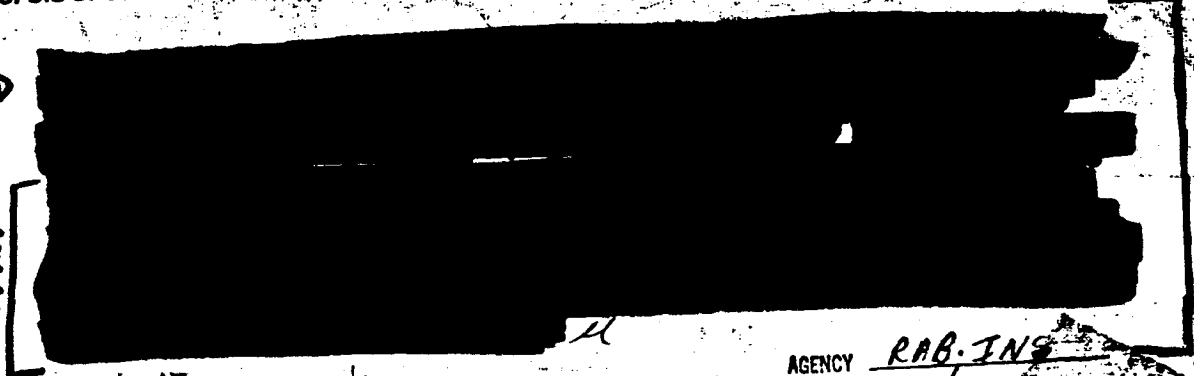

On pages 264 and 265 of the book "The Story of the CIO" by BENJAMIN STOLBERG, published in October 1938, he wrote that the FAECT was organized in 1934, mainly from among the technical staff in the WPA, and said that from the very beginning the Federation was under Stalinist leadership and its rank and file had been chiefly Communist Party followers. *u*

On November 15, 1944 T-1, another government agency which conducts security investigations, advised that a publication of the FAECT, described as "Bulletin of the FAECT", issue of March 1936, contained the information that HARRY A. STEINGART was Treasurer and MARCEL SCHERER General Organizer of the New York Chapter of FAECT. *u*

According to the records of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, MARCEL SCHERER joined the Communist Labor Party in 1919 and later joined the Communist Party. *u*

On March 8, 1946 T-1 advised that BENJAMIN MALTZ who was inducted into the United States Army on January 18, 1944 was discharged from the Army January 15, 1946 in accordance with demobilization procedures and gave his future residence at 1010 President Street, Brooklyn, New York. T-1 further advised that while in the Army MALTZ had corresponded with OSCAR J. VAGO, 6607 99th Street, Forest Hills, New York. *u*

u In reference to OSCAR J. VAGO it is noted that on June 20, 1952 he was found guilty by Federal Judge SYLVESTER J. RYAN, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, of having committed perjury in his testimony before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on September 21, 1950, which was conducting an inquiry of possible violations of the espionage laws of the United States. He was sentenced to three years suspended sentence and placed on probation for three years. *u*

T-13, of known reliability, has advised that VAGO was a member of the Communist Party on October 28, 1943. *u*

On October 4, 1946 T-14, of known reliability, advised that VAGO was still carried as a member of the Rego Park (Queens), New York Section of the Communist Party. *u*

It is further noted that HARRY GOLD confessed and convicted Soviet Espionage Agent in a signed statement dated October 2, 1950 advised SA's ROBERT G. JENSEN and RALPH J. T. CARTER, JR. that he first heard of OSCAR VAGO in 1943 from ABRAHAM BROTHMAN who was at that time furnishing GOLD with technical information for transmittal to the Soviet Union. He stated that VAGO had been described to him by BROTHMAN as a sincere and convinced Communist. GOLD further stated that he first met VAGO in May of 1946; that VAGO had discussed matters that had happened in his Communist Party Club and told of VAGO having mentioned his fear of an investigation concerning the irregularities of movements in and out of the United States in the late twenties or early thirties. *u*

Relative to the association between BENJAMIN MALTZ and OSCAR J. VAGO it was further noted that "Tech Talk", a publication issued by Chapter Number 31, FAECT, on November 26, 1941 listed nominees for election in FAECT and among those listed were individuals named MALTZ and VAGO, who were described *u*

It is further noted that on July 18, 1950 DAVID GREENGLASS, brother-in-law of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who admitted his participation in Soviet espionage activities with ROSENBERG and was convicted of this crime, advised that RUSSELL MC NUTT was an associate of JULIUS ROSENBERG and was possibly involved in Soviet espionage. u

On June 16, 23, 1951 MC NUTT was interviewed by SA's PAUL J. GLASCO and JOHN A. HARRINGTON. During this interview he stated that he had been employed on the WPA in New York City during 1935 or 1936 to 1939. Among other employments he gave, was his employment with the Kellogg Corporation

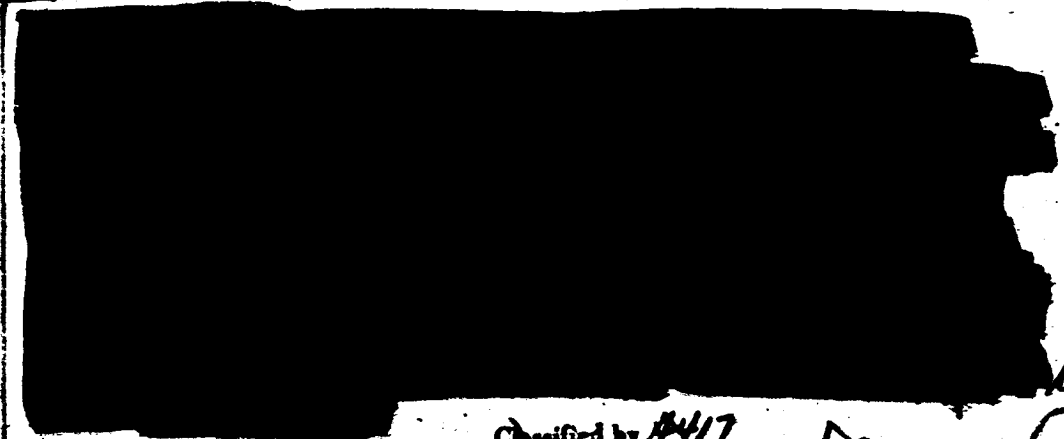

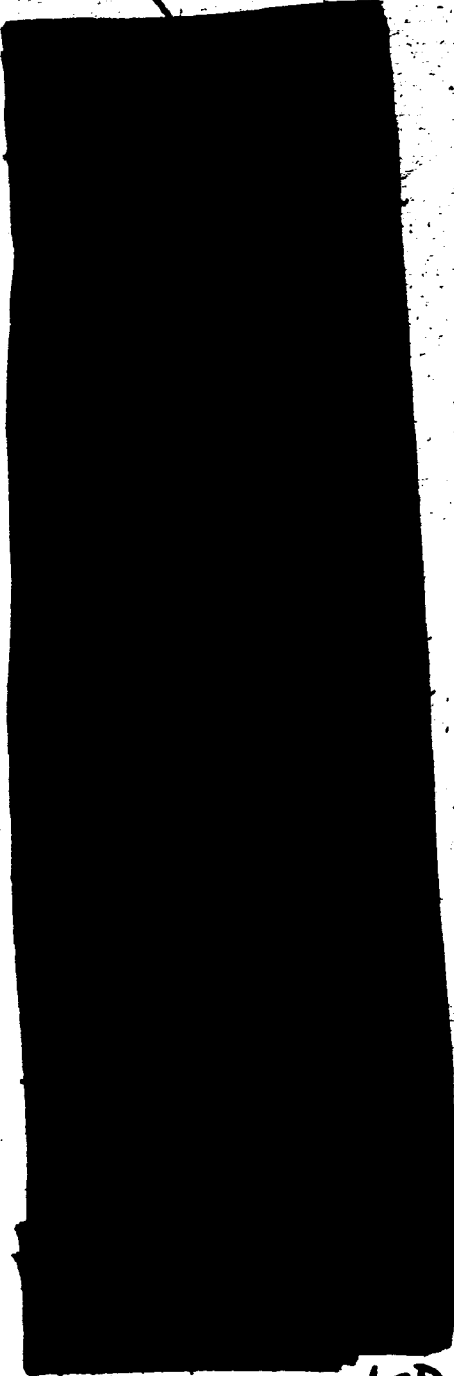

When later questioned, GREENGLASS said that either in 1945 or 1946 JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that the people (STEINGARTS) from whom ROSENBERG had borrowed the furniture were going to China. (u)

The article further stated that STEINGART had recently returned from the Hawaiian Islands where he had made an extensive survey and study for the government of housing needs for plantation workers. On March 22, 1951 JULIUS ROSENBERG, who was subsequently convicted as a Soviet Espionage agent, testified during the course of his trial in New York City that HARRY and SYLVIA STEINGART had loaned him two tables when they moved to California. He stated that one of these was a maple leaf table and the other was a gate leg table. He testified that later the ROSENBERGS sent the maple leaf table to the STEINGARTs in California and the gate leg table was finally sold by the ROSENBERGS for \$5.00. ROSENBERG testified that the STEINGARTs had given him this furniture when they moved to California in 1942.

Subject said he left New York City around 1941 and went to Washington, D.C., Alabama, and finally to San Francisco, California. He advised he visited his wife in New York City around 1943 at which time she was attending Hunter College. There he believed he saw JULIUS ROSENBERG on this occasion which was the last time he saw ROSENBERG, to the best of his knowledge.

Subject advised that about 1945 he wrote ROSENBERG and stated that he desired ROSENBERG to forward to him certain furniture which subject had stored in New York City at the time of his departure. In return for forwarding this furniture, subject stated he permitted ROSENBERG to retain certain pieces. Subject recalls specifically requesting ROSENBERG to forward a bed, chest of drawers and probably a maple table. Subject stated that he had also received an iron grate with this shipment. Subject said that the maple table and the other furniture had been purchased by him probably around 1938 and definitely before the time he knew ROSENBERG. Subject could not recall where he had stored his furniture in New York City at the time of his departure.

Subject denied knowing MORTON SOBELL who was convicted as a Soviet Espionage agent with the ROSENBERGS.

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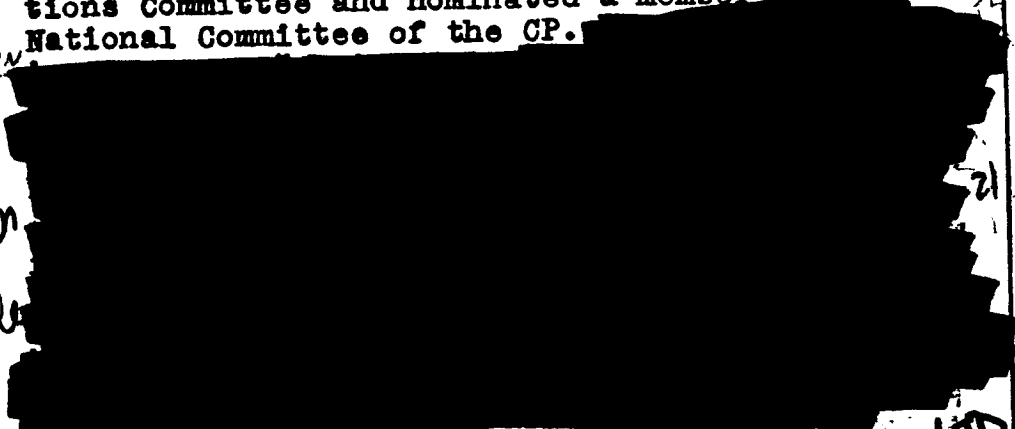

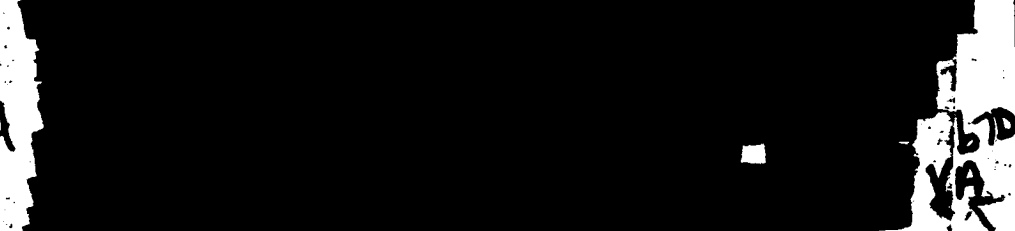

During the fall of 1950, New Haven Confidential Informant T-6, of unknown reliability, claimed to have recognized newspaper photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG as one who had been a guest at regular dinner meetings held by EDMOND J. BARACH.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were tried in the Southern District of New York on March 6 through March 29, 1951 for conspiracy to commit Russian Espionage and were found guilty on March 29, 1951. Both were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951.

On Oct. 26, 1950, ^{Mr.} EDMOND J. BARACH, Windy Hill, Ridgefield Conn., was interviewed by SA HUGO P. BLANDORI and the writer concerning his alleged acquaintanceship with JULIUS ROSENBERG and other individuals identified with ROSENBERG. During the interview BARACH furnished information concerning his personal background and mentioned that he was the founder of a company now known as Oxygen Equipment Manufacturing Corp., which concern is now located on Fitch Ave. in East Norwalk, Conn. BARACH further indicated that he was married to MITZI KOLISCH on Oct. 9, 1925 in New York and that they have one child, a daughter, MARGARET, age 20 in 1950. Mr. BARACH stated that about 1945 his wife MITZI was doing volunteer work for the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship and as a result of his wife's association with the Council, he contributed, on various occasions, approximately \$1,000.00. *Marga Barach*

It is to be noted that the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship has been cited by the U.S. Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835.

Mr. BARACH, at the time, identified PHILIP JAFFE of Stamford, Conn. as one of his closest friends. He stated that PHILIP JAFFE was a member of his brother's class at City College of New York and that he usually sees him on the average of once a week. Mr. BARACH also remarked that he is personally acquainted with PHILIP JAFFE's brother, SAM JAFFE.

ROSENBERG stated that when he was dismissed in 1944-45 from the United States Army Signal Corps, it was charged that he belonged to the FAECT, a Communist Union and being a member of this Union, he, ROSENBERG, was a Communist.

On May 28, 1951, MILTON MANES, who is employed as a chemist at the U.S. Bureau of Mines, Bruceton, Pa., and who resides at 356 Rockhill Road, Bridgeville, Pa. (both suburbs of Pittsburgh, Pa.), was interviewed at the Pittsburgh Office by Special Agent RICHARD D. COTTER concerning his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG. It is noted that MANES was formerly closely acquainted with ROSENBERG during the period 1934-40.

During the course of this interview, MANES stated that he had formerly been a member of a Young Communist League Chapter at the City College of New York, New York City, during the period 1936-37. MANES stated that the Young Communist League Chapter at CCNY, during this period, consisted of about 100 members, ten or twelve of whom, including himself, were assigned to a separate sub-group known as the "engineering group," which consisted of engineering and chemistry students at CCNY.

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o/s [He said that he attended three or four meetings of this engineering group during the first six months of 1937, all of which were held at a hall located near Union Square, at Fourteenth Street, New York City, and he recalled, further, attending one or two meetings of the general Young Communist League Chapter at CCNY.

MANES identified the following individuals as members of the "engineering group" of the Young Communist League Chapter at CCNY during this period: JULIUS ROSENBERG, MARK PAGE, NAT SUSSMAN, NATHAN SHOIKET, IRVING WEINGARTEN, IRVING GUSS, SAVITSKY (phonetic), PETSOK (phonetic) and HERMAN.

In addition to the foregoing, ^{Louis BERNHAM} MANES recalled that the following individuals were active in the general Young Communist League Chapter at the College during this period: LOUIS BERNHAM (phonetic), MICHAEL WOFSE, LAWRENCE KNOBEL, SIMON SLAVIN, ARNOLD SROOG, and MASARSKY (phonetic).

With respect to BERNHAM, MANES stated that this individual was a negro, who later became active in the National Negro Congress and who was an excellent public speaker.

o/s MANES was unable to furnish any other specific information concerning BERNHAM and he could furnish no further details regarding Young Communist League activities at CCNY at this time.

On January 3, 1952, MANES was reinterviewed at the Pittsburgh Office by Special Agent RICHARD D. COTTER, at which time a photograph of the subject, LOUIS EVERETT BURNHAM, was shown to him. At this time MANES advised that the subject bore a strong resemblance to the individual previously referred to him as LOUIS BERNHAM; however, he could not make a positive identification.

It is noted that the Young Communist League has been cited by the Attorney General, under Executive Order 9835, as a Communist organization.

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He states that "the revolutionary theater is on the threshold of its vital growth" and asserts that "creative work draws its whole inspiration and meaning from the vital forces of its period; in our day, the vital forces at work are the growing strength of the revolution, the upsurge of a new class..." Mr. Lawson concludes at another point that "there is only one direction in which the drama can move forward: it must join the march of the advancing working class; it must keep pace with the quickening momentum of the revolution."

The Communist Party line was also advanced in the screen play which Mr. Lawson wrote for the movie, *Blockade*, according to the California Committee on Un-American Activities in its 1945 report, page 118.

This ends the official citation of Lawson's Communist record from the 1947 hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

John Howard Lawson did not cease his Communist activities in 1947. We shall briefly describe some of the most important and recent of them.

The most recent issue of Mainstream (for March 1960) lists John Howard Lawson as a contributing editor. Mainstream grew out of a magazine called Masses & Mainstream which in turn was an outgrowth of the old weekly publication, New Masses. All have been Communist publications, and John Howard Lawson has been a contributing editor of each.

On November 6, 1959, John Howard Lawson made a speech in Los Angeles on behalf of the Powell-Schuman Defense Committee, according to the National Guardian for November 2, 1959,

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page 11. Mr. and Mrs. Powell and ~~Julian Schuman~~ were indicted in 1956 by a federal grand jury on charges of sedition. In recent years, Lawson has spoken on behalf of such other Communists as Ethel and Julius ~~Rosenberg~~, Alexander ~~Trachtenberg~~, and Hugo Gellert. *deceased*

Joseph ~~North~~ for many years has been a writer for Communist publications, including the Daily Worker. A letter dated November 21, 1958, which was released by the Joseph North Testimonial Committee, included the name of John Howard Lawson as a signer.

On November 12, 1955, it had been John Howard Lawson's turn to receive the plaudits of his fellow Communists. The Salute to John Howard Lawson was staged in Los Angeles, California, in the form of a testimonial dinner to the Communist screen writer. Hundreds of known Communist Party members joined in the salute to Lawson. Leading Communists from foreign countries, including Poland, Hungary, East Germany, Mexico, England, Australia, Japan, Colombia, China, Bulgaria, Italy, and the USSR, sent expressions of admiration for Lawson, to be included in a handsome booklet.

In 1955 Lawson signed a brief amici curiae which was presented to the Supreme Court on behalf of the Communist Party. What irony!

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DETAILS:

I. RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE FIELD OF ATOMIC ENERGY

A. THE HYDROGEN BOMB

Pursuant to the announcement by President TRUMAN that this country would attempt to develop a hydrogen bomb, the Atomic Energy Commission announced that the du Pont de Nemours Company had been awarded a contract for the construction of facilities required for the development and manufacture of the bomb.

B. ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION REACTOR PROJECT, ARCO, IDAHO

o/s
The construction of this project is in its initial stages. The objectives of the AEC's Reactor Development Program include development of a nuclear reactor for the production of fissionable material, the generation of electric power, and the propulsion of ships and aircraft. The nuclear design of the Experimental Breeder Reactor has been completed by the Argonne National Laboratory at Chicago, Illinois, and detailed architect-engineering design work is almost completed. The Bechtel Corporation of San Francisco will build the steel, brick, and concrete reactor structure, as well as the control, ventilation, cooling, and auxiliary equipment. The reactor core, the heart of the nuclear machine, will be furnished by the Argonne National Laboratory, where it is being designed and built.

The Experimental Breeder Reactor is designed to test the practical feasibility of breeding with fast neutrons and to investigate the application of liquid metals to the removal of fission-produced heat from reactors at high temperatures.

The primary purpose of the Materials Testing Reactor to be constructed at the Arco site will be to test under conditions of severe neutron bombardment the materials which may be used in the future reactor construction. The materials to be tested will be contained in test pockets. The neutron bombardment to which they will be subjected will be of an intensity very much greater than any ever experienced before.

There is also to be erected a Ship Propulsion Reactor at Arco. Construction of this reactor is scheduled to get under way in 1952.

II. ESPIONAGE

A. DAVID GREENGLASS
JULIUS ROSENBERG

GREENGLASS has advised that in November 1944, while he was stationed with the U. S. Army at Los Alamos, New Mexico, his wife, RUTH, he was

arrived in New Mexico and told him that JULIUS ROSENBERG, his brother-in-law, had asked if he, GREENGLASS, would give information on the atom bomb. GREENGLASS agreed to give whatever information came to him in the course of his employment at Los Alamos.

Re: d GREENGLASS has further stated that while he was in New York City on furlough from Los Alamos about September 1945 he turned over to JULIUS ROSENBERG information he had been able to collect concerning the construction of the atom bomb, together with a couple of sketches of the components which make up the atom bomb.

ROSENBERG was arrested July 17, 1950, at New York for complicity in espionage activities. His prosecution is pending.

L. FOREIGN DEVELOPMENTS

The London Daily Telegraph newspaper for February 14, 1951 reported that Britain's atomic engineers can build an atomic engine to power a medium-sized aircraft carrier and may need about another nine months to work out details of design and cost.

The same newspaper for February 17, 1951 reported that the main impediment to British production of an "A" Bomb was the lack of explosive materials. By the time that such material is available in quantity from new piles at Sellafield, Cumberland, the rest of the bomb will probably be ready to receive it.

II. ESPIONAGE

Information appearing in this section has been summarized from accounts appearing in the public press.

Former Army Sergeant, ~~DAVID GREENGLASS~~ has testified in the espionage trial of his brother-in-law, ~~JULIUS ROSENBERG~~, his sister, Mrs. ~~ETHEL ROSENBERG~~, and ~~MORTON SOBELL~~, that in September, 1945 he turned over to his brother-in-law the description of an atom bomb of a later type than the Hiroshima model. Dr. ~~WALTER KOSKI~~, physical chemist at Johns Hopkins, who worked at Los Alamos as an engineer in 1944-1945, has testified that the sketches and information which ~~GREENGLASS~~ supplied were in sufficient detail to reveal what was going on at Los Alamos. The courtroom was cleared of spectators while ~~GREENGLASS~~ explained that he compiled a twelve-page report, including sketches of the bomb.

U.S. Attorney ~~IRVING H. SAYPOL~~ has stated that the prosecution in this case was in constant consultation with the AEC regarding the testimony and that the Commission authorized release of heretofore secret information on the atom bomb solely for the purpose of the trial.

On March 15, 1951 the Justice Department announced the arrest of ~~WILLIAM PERL~~, Columbia University physicist, on a charge of perjury. ~~PERL~~ was indicted on March 13, 1951 by a Federal Grand Jury for denying that he was acquainted with ~~JULIUS ROSENBERG~~, ~~MORTON SOBELL~~, and other figures in the atomic espionage trial.

In this same trial, ~~HARRY GOLD~~, confessed spy who has been sentenced to 30 years imprisonment for his espionage activities on behalf of the Soviets, testified that he told the Russians about the first atomic bomb.

GOLD described how he picked up atomic information from DAVID GREENGLASS and Dr. KLAUS FUCHS on a trip to Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945 and how he turned this information over to ANATOLIYAKOVLEV, former Russian Consulate official in New York.

On March 29, 1951 the three defendants in the current trial were all found guilty.

The above individual has been under contract as a consultant at the nuclear reactor project since January 1, 1949. He visits Brookhaven on an average of once a month and completes his scientific work in New York City, where he is affiliated with the Markite Company. He was granted access to restricted data on February 2, 1948.

In a handwritten form completed by COLER for the MED Project on May 18, 1943, he gave Dr. JOSEPH GREENSPAN as a reference.

On March 27, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS, an admitted former Soviet agent, advised that in 1945 or 1946 JULIUS ROSENBERG, who has been convicted as a Soviet espionage agent, told him that friends on the West Coast to whom he had shipped furniture were engaged in Soviet espionage.

On March 22, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified during the course of his trial in New York City that HARRY and SYLVIA STEINGART had loaned him two tables when they moved to California.

On March 24, 1951, HARRY STEINGART was interviewed by Special Agents in Los Angeles in the presence of STEINGART's attorneys. At this time STEINGART stated he had met JULIUS ROSENBERG in New York City in about 1939 or 1940 and that thereafter saw ROSENBERG at union meetings and made social calls on ROSENBERG and his wife. STEINGART said that in 1945 he wrote ROSENBERG requesting that the latter forward him, STEINGART, certain furniture which he had stored in New York City at the time of his departure from that city.

HARRY STEINGART declined to answer any further questions at this time on the advice of his attorneys.

**A radiance behind the
Death House bars**

LAST FRIDAY defense attorney Emanuel Bloch spent three hours with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in the Sing Sing death house. News of the nation-wide response to the GUARDIAN appeal for funds and support "thrilled them and moved them to tears," Bloch reported. Julius Rosenberg asked Bloch to transmit this message to GUARDIAN readers:

"I feel I am again living with the struggles of the people against tyranny. The bars no longer seal us, we are no longer isolated. I have enough faith in the people of America to believe they will vindicate us and the cause we represent when they know the facts. The charges against us were nebulous but the meaning of the death sentence is all too clear. Our crime was that we were plain, progressive-minded people who believed in democratic and constitutional rights, in decency, humanity and peace. That is why we were tried and condemned to die: so that others like us would be frightened and silenced.

"We miss the opportunity to create, to talk to our fellows, to work, to go home and enjoy comfort and peace with one's family, with one's wife and children. But the GUARDIAN's articles, and the wonderful response to them, give us hope and courage and strengthen our belief that the efforts of our oppressors are doomed to failure."

Here is what Ethel Rosenberg said, as attorney Bloch took down her words:

"All of a sudden my drab and wretched surroundings are touched with radiance and color. The expressions of support from my new-found brothers and sisters are unutterably touching. I am speechless with gratitude and admiration for all the precious human beings who have offered their love and assistance to our dear children and have at the same time tendered such a beautiful tribute to us, their parents. In all humility, I pledge myself anew to the unceasing war against man's inhumanity to man in whatever form it may rear its brutal head. I shall never sell short the faith and trust that the GUARDIAN readers have reposed in my husband and me. Else shall our lives have gone for naught."

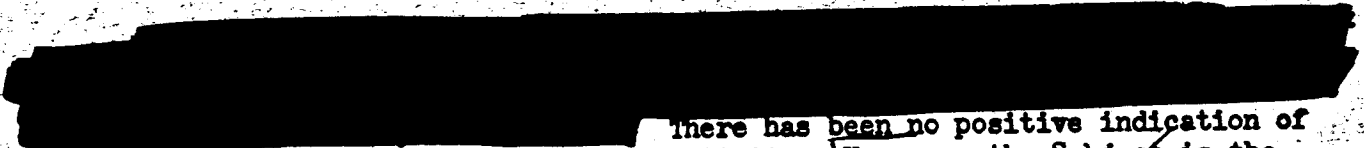

Further, the Subject's name was given as a character reference on May 3, 1947 by JOEL BARR, another member of the ROSENBERG Apparatus, in connection with employment of BARR at the Sperry Gyroscope Company, Lake Success, New York.

On May 28, 1951, MILTON MANES, who is employed as a chemist at the U.S. Bureau of Mines, Bruceton, Pa., and who resides at 356 Rockhill Road, Bridgeville, Pa. (both suburbs of Pittsburgh, Pa.), was interviewed at the Pittsburgh Office by Special Agent RICHARD D. COTTER concerning his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG. It is noted that MANES was a former close acquaintance of ROSENBERG during the period 1934-40. It is further noted that ROSENBERG, together with his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG, was tried in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, from March 6 through March 29, 1951, for conspiring to commit espionage, and on March 29, 1951, was convicted and sentenced to death.

During the course of this interview, ^{1111k To NY} MANES stated that he had formerly been a member of a Young Communist League Chapter of the City College of New York, New York City, during the period 1936 and 1937. MANES said that he had been recruited into this organization by JULIUS ROSENBERG, with whom he was closely acquainted since 1934, and with whom he was a fellow student at CCNY. According to MANES, ROSENBERG was a very active member of the Young Communist League at CCNY, beginning about 1936, and at one time during the period 1936-37 served as Executive Secretary of the Young Communist League Branch at the College. MANES related that ROSENBERG spent a great deal of time on Young Communist League activities and was especially interested in the cause of the Loyalist (Communist) forces in Spain and spent a considerable amount of time soliciting funds for Loyalist relief. In this connection, MANES advised that ROSENBERG had introduced him to several students at the City College of New York, who were veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

MANES stated that one of these individuals was ABE OSHEROFF, who had been wounded during the Spanish Civil War while fighting with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. MANES was not able to furnish any specific details, however, concerning OSHEROFF's background or activities.] g/s

On January 3, 1952, MANES was reinterviewed at the Pittsburgh Office by Special Agent RICHARD D. COTTER, at which time a photograph of the subject was shown to him. At this time, MANES advised that the subject was identical with the individual previously referred to by him as an acquaintance of JULIUS ROSENBERG at the City College of New York.

It is noted that the Young Communist League has been cited by the Attorney General, under Executive Order 9835, as a Communist organization.
