She stated that the name YAKOVLEV was familiar but that she did not believe she had ever met him and stated that she was of the opinion that someone had probably pointed him out to her at some meeting.



American-Russian Instituto

The American-Russian Institute is an organization designated by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Russian Mar Relief

By memorandum dated February 28, 1942 BENJAMIN MANDEL, Director of Research, Committee on Un-American Activities, Room 226, Old House Office Building, Washington, D. C., advised that the Russian Var Relief is a Communist controlled front organization. This memorandum stated also that the Russian War Relief was started at a rally held July 2, 1941 in New York City. This rally was sponsored by the American Council on Soviet Relations. This latter organization became the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, which was declared subversive by the Attorney General.







In a signed statement dated November 30, 1945 ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, a self-admitted Soviet espionage agent, stated as follows concerning KAZAKEVICH:

"..... Sometine in 1942, I recall one VLADIMIR hazakevich, a former professor at Cornell University, was a somewhat frequent visitor to GCLOS' (JACOB GOLOS, SENTLEY'S Soviet espionage superior) office. This individual, who was not to my knowledge a member of the Communist Party but had Communist leanings, was at that time barely making a living teaching the Aussian language and giving lectures and writing exempts for Communist publications. VLADIMIR was not to my knowledge connected with any Government agency, nor did he have any source for obtaining information and as far as I know was merely a friend of long standing of GCLOS. I do recall, however, that at some previous time he had some information concerning Trotskyites which he furnished GCLOS...."

YAKOVLEV

EUFROSINA advised she recalled the above name and believed that someone pointed out an individual by this name to her on some occasion, most likely at a Russian War Relief Meeting.

A photograph of AHATOLF ARTOHOVICH YAKOVLEV was exhibited to her but she was unable to recall him or to identify him as the individual who sho may have met.

Confidential Informant T-8 advised that AM.TOLI YAKOVLEV, a clerk at the Russian Consulate frequently attended meetings at Russian har Relief Headquarters in 1944 and 1945.


HARRY GOLD, self-confessed former Soviet Espionage agent, identified ANATOLI YAKOVLEV as his Soviet Espionage superior to whom he furnished Atomic Energy information, which he received from KLAUS FUCHS.
















During 1944, BELOCK resigned his position with the United States Signal Corps and became Executive Vice President and General Manager of Reeves Instrument Corporation of New York City. This company is engaged in designing fire control systems for the Army and Navy Bureau of Ordnance and Aeronautics.



According to Confidential Informant T-19, BELOCK hired a number of employees at the Reeves Instrument Company of New York City suspected of being Communists, among whom were MCRTON SOBELL and MAX ELITCHER.

MORTON SOBELL was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on a



charge of conspiracy to commit espionage.


On April 5,1951, SOBELL was sentenced to a thirty-year term imprisonment by Federal Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN, Southern District of New York.

MAX ELITCHER, self-admitted former Communist, when interviewed admitted being a member of the Communist Party in Washington, D.C. in the latter part of 1939 until the Summer of 1948.

According to ELITCHER'S statement, he and MORTON SOBELL were members of a Navy Department Communist Party cell in Washington, D.C. from 1939 until approximately 1943.




On June 13, 1951, HARRY BELOCK was interviewed by SAS LEO H. FRUTKIN and REX I. SHRODER. He was interviewed in the office of the Belock Instrument Corporation, 111-01 14th Avenue, College Point, Queens, New York.











BELOCK advised that he never hired anyone at Reeves whose Communist affiliations were known to him at the time of hiring.

With regard to MORTON SOBELL and MAX ELITCHER, BELOCK stated that he learned from the Navy that they were suspected of being Communists, but that he had never had any indication from oither, that they were even "radically inclined".

BELOCK stated that if he had learned that any of his employees were Communists or suspected Communists, he immediately took steps to release them.

With regard to MAX ELITCHER, BELOCK stated that he first met him while on business for Reeves at the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D.C. ELITCHER impressed BELOCK as being intelligent and industrious and BELOCK told him that he could have a job at Reeves whenever he wanted it. BELOCK recalled that while ELITCHER

was working in New York on behalf of the Navy, he visited BELOCK at Reeves and asked him for a job. BELOCK said that he accepted him and that later, during 1948, he met ELITCHER at a pier in New York City. BELOCK explained that he had just returned from Europe and that ELITCHER was engaged on a job aboard the USS Mississippi which was docked at an adjoining pier.

ELITCHER knew that BELOCK was due to return on the Queen Mary. When the Queen Mary docked, ELITCHER visited the pier and found BELOCK aboard. At this time, ELITCHER told BELOCK that he was leaving the Bureau of Ordnance and a definite time was set to begin his employment at Reeves.

BELOCK added that he never had any idea that ELITCHER was affiliated with the Communists until sometime during 1949 or 1950, when the Navy refused him clearance. BELOCK added that he was surprised to learn this, as he considered ELITCHER one of the most industrious employees at Reeves. BLLOCK stated that he met MCRTON SOBELL during a visit to the General Electric Company and that he was highly impressed with SOBELL'S skill. When starting at Reeves, BELOCK personally requested SOBELL to work for him.

BELOCK added that SOBELL'S wife, HELEN, was also an employee of Reeves and that he had no idea either were Communists. He said that to him both appeared to be loyal citizens.





DETAILS:

I. BASIS OF INVESTIGATION

1. Activities of JULIUS ROSENBERG Espionage Ring

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have stated that they were recruited into a Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is presently serving a fifteen year sentence at the Lewisberg Penitentiary for transmitting certain classified data relating to the Atomic Bomb Project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty year sentence for espionage.

On April 6, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, received the death penalty in the Federal Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionege against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversations with JULIUS ROSENBERG, during the period of 1946 to 1950, that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage. In connection with this activity, ROSENBERG was using an apartment in the Greenwich Village Section of New York, and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and avenue B, New York City, for the purpose of microfilming of documents and espionage contacts.

MAX ELITCHER, admitted former member of the Communist Party, Washington, D. C., from 1939 to the summer of 1948, has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG approached him in June, 1944 for the purpose of recruiting ELITCHER into Soviet espionage. ROSENBERG wented ELITCHER to furnish information obtained through his position at the United States Navy Dept., Washington, D.C. ELITCHER has stated that he declined to furnish any information to ROSENBERG.

Investigation indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment mentioned above was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City, and was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October, 1943 to January, 1951. On several occasions, MAX ELITCHER visited this apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, with JULIUS ROSENBERG and ALFRED SARANT.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, has advised that on March 23, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street, where he, JOEL BARR, and 'Bill' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans". ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but, from other conversations which the informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by Confidential Informant T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

Confidential Informant T-1, on July 10, 1951, advised that ROSENBERG said he had on various occasions typed for many hours in the Morton Street apartment and, to reduce the sound of his typing, he had placed rubber pads under the legs of the typewriter table and would also let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised Confidential Informant T-1 that he had paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARART, when interviewed, advised
Bureau Agents that he had been a member of the Greenwich
Village Branch of the Communist Party in the years 19431944, and believes he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a
mutual friend, JOEL BARR. SARANT denied that ROSENBERG
was ever in his opertment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX
ELITCHER has stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR,
WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL),
and ELITCHER and his wife HELENE were together in SARANT'S
apartment, namely Apartment 61, 65 Morton Street, New York
City, in 1943-1944.

On July 6, 1945, ALFRED SARANT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and they moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken over by SARANT'S friend, JOEL BARR.

ALFRED S.RANT, following interviews by Bureau Agents in July and August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name, and his present whereabouts is unknown.

ROSENBERG identified WILLIAM PERL as a Soviet Agent to Confidential Informent T-1. PERL is presently under indictment for perjury, committed before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York.

ROSENBERG identified JOEL BARR as a Soviet Agent to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948.

2. Data Obtained From ALFRED SARANT'S Address Book

During the course of an interview with ALFRED SARANT, on July 19, 1950, by Bureau agents, he executed a waiver, authorizing Bureau agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York. Among the items located during the search was a small address book containing a number of names, addresses and telephone numbers. On Page 2 of this address book the following listing appeared:

"SOL GREENBERG Fod. BO. GR. 9-3800 X 609"

Mrs. ALFRED SARANT was questioned by Bureau Agents concerning the identity of persons whose names appear in this address book, and in some instances she did furnish information. However, concerning SOL GREENBERG, Mrs. SARANT failed to furnish any identifying data.

3. "GREENBERG" - Contact of JULIUS ROSENBERG

Confidential Informant T-2, of unknown reliability, has advised that he had occasion to question JULIUS HOSENBERG concerning the names of his contacts, and ROSENBERG said, "You know a man by the name of GREENBERG, who is a big Electrical Engineer at General Electric in Newark". ROSENBERG also advised Confidential Informant T-2 that GREENBERG was a friend of a man who is now deceased and whose name was BOLOS or POLOS. The informant was unable to recall his first name and tried to recollect the last name accurately for sometime. After sufficient reflection, Confidential Informant T-2 was unable to recall the name and was asked if the name GOLOS was familiar. Confidential Informant T-2 said that it sounded very much like the name that ROSENBERG mentioned.

4. Identity of BO. GR. 9-3800 and SOL GREENBERG

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, has advised that Bowling Green 9-3800 is the tolephone number for the International Telephone and Telegraph Company (IT&T), 67 Broad Street, New York City. IT&T is the parent company of many subsidiaries, some of which occupy space in the same building at 67 Broad Street, New York City. One of the subsidiaries is the Federal Telecommunication Laboratories (FTL). FTL occupied quarters on the Third Floor at 67 Broad Street, New York City, during the years 1941 to 1947, when FTL moved to its present quarters at 500 Washington Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey.

Confidential Informant T-3 advised that, while occupying space in the ITAT building, 67 Broad Street, New York City, FTL used the same telephone number as the parent company, ITAT.

Confidential Informant T-3 caused a search to be made of the ITAT records (which includes the parent company and all subsidiaries) and advised that the only record of SOL GREENBERG which could be located was that of SOLOMON GREENBERG, who is prosently employed by the Foderal Telecommunication Laboratories, Nutley, New Jersey. According to Confidential Informant T-3, SOLOMON GREENBERG was employed by FTL in June, 1943, as a Junior Engineer. His place of work was at 67 Broad Street, New York City, from the beginning of his employment, until December, 1947, when he was transferred to FTL, Nutley, New Jersey.

The only other GREENBERGS shown on the records of IT&T are:

HAROLD GREENBERG, omployed since October, 1951, in one of IT&T'S cable companies.

MELVIN GREENBERG, employed for a short period of time in 1946 by IT&T as an Office Boy.

MURRAY GREENBERG, employed by ITMT as a Nessonger for a short period of time during 1951.

Concerning the telephone extension available to SOL GREENBERG while he was at 67 Broad Street, New York City, it has been determined that GREENBERG'S name was not listed in the ITAT telephone directories. I. BASIS OF INVESTIGATION


1. Activities of JULIUS ROSENBERG Espionage Ring

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have stated that they were recruited into a Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is presently serving a fifteen year sentence at the Lewisberg Penitentiary for transmitting certain classified data relating to the Atomic Bomb Project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty year sentence for espionage.

On April 6, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, received the death penalty in the Federal Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversations with JULIUS ROSENBERG, during the period of 1946 to 1950, that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage. In connection with this activity, ROSENBERG was using an apartment in the Greenwich Village Section of New York, and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B, New York City, for the purpose of microfilming of documents and espionage contacts.

MAX ELITCHER, admitted former member of the Communist Party, Washington, D. C., from 1939 to the summer of 1948, has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG approached him in June, 1944 for the purpose of recruiting ELITCHER into Soviet espionage. ROSENBERG wanted ELITCHER to furnish information obtained through his position at the United States Navy Dept., Washington, D.C. ELITCHER has stated that he declined to furnish any information to ROSENBERG.




Investigation indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment mentioned above was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City, and was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October, 1943 to January, 1951. On several occasions, MAX ELITCHER visited this apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, with JULIUS ROSENBERG and ALFRED SARANT.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, has advised that on March 23, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street, where he, JOEL BARR, and 'Bill' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans". ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but, from other conversations which the informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by Confidential Informant T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

Confidential Informant T-1, on July 10, 1951, advised that ROSENBERG said he had on various occasions typed for many hours in the Morton Street apartment and, to reduce the sound of his typing, he had placed rubber pads under the legs of the typewriter table and would also let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised Confidential Informant T-1 that he had paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, when interviewed, advised Bureau Agents that he had been a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in the years 1943-1944, and believes be met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend, JOEL BARR. SARANT denied that ROSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife HELENE were together in SARANT'S apartment, namely Apartment 61, 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.



On July 6, 1945, ALFRED SARANT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and they moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken over by SARANT'S friend, JOEL BARR.

ALFRED STRANT, following interviews by Bureau Agents in July and August, 1950, fled the United States into Moxico, entering under an assumed name, and his present whereabouts is unknown.

ROSENBERG identified WILLIAM PERL as a Soviet Agent to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is presently under indictment for perjury, committed before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York.


ROSENBERG identified JOEL BARR as a Soviet Agent to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948.

2. Data Obtained From ALFRED SARANT'S Address Book

During the course of an interview with ALFRED SARANT, on July 19, 1950, by Bureau Agents, he executed a waiver, authorizing Bureau Agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York. Among the items located during the search was a small address book containing a number of names, addresses and telephone numbers. On Page 2 of this address book the following listing appeared:

"SOL GREENBERG Fed. BO. GR. 9-3800 X 609"

Mrs. ALFHED SARANT was questioned by Bureau Agents concerning the identity of persons whose names appear in this address book, and in some instances she did furnish information. However, concerning SOL GREENBERG, Mrs. SARANT failed to furnish any identifying data.




3. "GREENBERG" - Contact of JULIUS ROSENBERG

Confidential Informant T-2, of unknown reliability, has advised that he had occasion to question JULIUS HOSENBERG concerning the names of his contacts, and ROSENBERG said, "You know a man by the name of GREENBERG, who is a big Electrical Engineer at General Electric in Newark". ROSENBERG also advised Confidential Informant T-2 that GREENBERG was a friend of a man who is now deceased and whose name was BOLOS or POLOS. The informant was unable to recall his first name and tried to recollect the last name accurately for sometime. After sufficient reflection, Confidential Informant T-2 was unable to recall the name and was asked if the name GOLOS was familiar. Confidential Informant T-2 said that it sounded very much like the name that ROSENBERG mentioned.

4. Identity of BO. GR. 9-3800 and SOL GREENBERG

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, has advised that Bowling Green 9-3800 is the tolephone number for the International Telephone and Telegraph Company (IT&T), 67 Broad Street, New York City. IT&T is the parent company of many subsidiaries, some of which occupy space in the same building at 67 Broad Street, New York City. One of the subsidiaries is the Federal Telecommunication Laboratories (FTL). FTL occupied quarters on the Third Floor at 67 Broad Street, New York City, during the years 1941 to 1947, when FTL moved to its present quarters at 500 Washington Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey.

Confidential Informant T-3 advised that, while occupying space in the IT&T building, 67 Broad Street, New York City, FTL used the same telephone number as the parent company, IT&T.



Confidential Informant T-3 caused a search to be made of the ITAT records (which includes the parent company and all subsidiaries) and advised that the only record of SOL GREENBERG which could be located was that of SOLOMON GREENBERG, who is prosently employed by the Federal Telecommunication Laboratories, Nutley, New Jersey. According to Confidential Informant T-3, SOLOMON GREENBERG was employed by FTL in June, 1943, as a Junior Engineer. His place of work was at 67 Broad Street, New York City, from the beginning of his employment, until December, 1947, when he was transferred to FTL, Nutley, New Jersey.






According to Confidential Informant T-3, all the above parties were assigned to the Legal Department of IT&T.


GREENBERG was not listed in any of the above records.

According to STANLEY LUKE, Director of Industrial Helations, IT&T, since GREENBERG was normally employed on the Third Floor at 67 Broad Street, New York City, the possibility exists that GREENBERG may have participated with other union representatives in negotiations on the 27th and 29th Floors concerning labor contracts. These negotiations generally occured on a yearly basis between members of IT&T'S Legal Staff and members of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians, which Union represented the workers.



Generally, during those negotiations, while the Union members were on the 27th Floor and 29th Floor, IT&T would make available to them telephone facilities, desk space, etc.





It should be noted that ALFRED SARANT attended the Polytechnic Institute of Technology in 1943 and 1944. The following record on SARANT is reflected in the school's files:



Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, has advised that from 1941 to 1945 FTL was the laboratory section of the Federal Telephone and Radio Company (FTR), which firm is a subsidiary of the International Telephone and Telegraph Company (IT&T). In the year 1945, FTL became an individual corporation in the IT&T system. In December, 1947, FTL and FTR moved to Nutley and Clifton, New Jersey, respectively.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that on occasion in the past he believes that FTR has been referred to see Federal Electric. Further, since both the New Jersey plants of FTL and FTR are adjacent to one another, a person might refer to them as one firm.

It is to be further noted in connection with ROSENBERG'S statement concerning an informant in Newark that Nutley and Clifton, New Jersey, are suburbs of Newark and are located approximately three to four miles from the latter city.

DAVID GREENGLASS is presently serving a 15-year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy.

GREMICLASS learned through conversations with JULIUS ROSEMBERG that. during the period 1946-1950, ROSEMBERG was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage and, in connection with this activity, ROSEMBERG was using an apartment in the Greenwich Village Section of New York City for espionage purposes.

Investigation shows that the Greenwich Village spartment mentioned above was located at 65 Morton Street and was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October, 1943, to January, 1950.

During the course of an interview of:
ALFRED SARANT on July 19, 1950, he authorized Bureau
Agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga
Heights Road, Ithaca, New York. Among the items
located was a small address book. On page two of this
address book, the following listing appeared:

"SOL GREENBERG, Fed., Bo. Gr. 9-3800 Extension 604."

Previous investigation has developed that this is the telephone number for the International Telephone and Telegraph Company, 67 Broad Street, New York City. During the period 1941-1947, a portion of the quarters at this address was utilized by FTL. In December, 1947, FTL moved from 67 Broad Street, New York City, to its present quarters at Nutley, New Jersey.

During the interview of GREENBERG on August 5 - 8, 1952, he definitely recalled using telephone number Bowling Green 9-3800, Extension 604, shortly after starting to work with FTL in June, 1943, and said his access to same continued during the entire period he was at 67 Broad Street. It was in December, 1947, that GREENBERG moved to Nutley, New Jersey, with the firm.

Invitigation has also disclosed that ALFRED SARANT and SOL GREENBERG in 1903-1944 attended the same classes at Polytochnic Institute of Brooklyn. GREENBERG, however, has denied any knowledge of ALFRED SARANT.

During a permissive search of the residence of SOLOMON GREENBERG at 2183 Ryer Avenue, Bronx, New York, a small address book was located.


GREENBERG advised that he started using this book during the year 1943-1944 for his personal use. The name "J. LEVITSKY" with telephone numbers Davenport 4-3856 and Ingersoll 2-3655 was among the many names listed in GREENBERG'S address book. GREENBERG described LEVITSKY as a fellow employee at FTL, Nutley, New Jersey.



Confidential Informant T-3 has advised
that examination of the employment application of
JOSEPH LEVITSKY, project engineer, FTL, has reflected
that LEVITSKY'S application for employment dated
November 6, 1943, reflected the name of JULIUS ROSENBERG,
radio engineer, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, as a (U)
reference.

It is to be noted that JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espicaege agent, resided at 10 Monroe Street, New York City. from April, 1942, until his arrest by Bureau Agents in July, 1950.

During interview with SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer on December 30, 1952, JOSEPH LEVITSKY, 65 Rutgers Place, River Edge, New Jersey, furnished the following information:



DAVID CARRICLASS, mentioned above, has advised that he learned from JULIUS ROSENBERG that JOEL BARR was an active Soviet espionage agent in the United States. BARR in July, 1948, left the United States for Europe ostensibly to study music. In June, 1950, BARR left his Peris residence and has not been seen since.

During 1940, JOHL BARR was a laboratory technician employed by the United States Signal Corps at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

LEVITSKY, when questioned for information concerning JOEL BARR, stated that the name sounded familiar to him and possibly he had met him at the time of his, LEVITSKY'S, initial employment by the Signal Corps Laboratory in the fall of 1940.

When questioned for details concerning BAPR, LEVITSKY stated that he was not in his training class at Fort Monmouth. However, he believes that they must have met at the bowling alleys in Long Branch, New Jersey. LEVITSKY said occasionally he and other civilian employees would go bowling in the evening and he felt that some person had introduced BARR as another engineer working at Fort Monmouth. He stated that he was unsole to furnish any other information concerning BARR and that he had last seen BARR in the fall of 1940.

Corps inspector was at the Radio Corporation of America, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. However, he was a tually assigned to work at the Company's Camden, New Jersey, plant. He estimated that there were approximately 30 other Signal Corps inspectors in the Camden plant. While he could not recall the name of the inspector-in-charge, he said that among the other inspectors were IDISORE HODES, SID METZGER, MARKUS EPSTEIN, CARL GREENBLUM, KERMIT BRYNES and MEM MOGNARD.

It was noted by the interviewing agents that LEVITSKY did not mention JULIUS ROSENBERG as being another inspector at /Redio Corporation of America (RCA).

When questioned concerning this omission, LEVITSKY advised that at the time of the ROSENBERG trial in 1950 he recognized ROSENBERG from the newspaper accounts as a person he had met while working at the Signal Corps in Philadelphia. Both were at the Camden plant of RCA. LEVITSKY went on to say that he was amazed to read about him in the newspaper. LEVITSKY said his contacts had been on an extremely limited basis. He further remembered seeing JULIUS wife, ETHEL, sitting in a car waiting for JULIUS to leave the RCA plant upon the conclusion of work. It was his recollection that JULIUS ROSENBERG was riding in another car pocl. However, LEVITSKY was not to identify the other numbers of the can be went on to say that he was unable to furnish any additional information concerning ROSENBERG.

However, during the interview, LEVITSKY admitted to the interviewing agents that the above version was inaccurate since he wished to minimize his relationship with JULIUS ROSENBERG. This desire was motivated because of the notoriety connected with the ROSE BERG trial. Thereupon, LEVITSKY said the

following information is an accurate and truthful version of his contacts with JULIUS ROSENBERG:

He first met JULIUS ROSENBERG shortly after his employment by the Signal Corps in August, 1940. A about October, 1940, both were sent to the Civilian Training School, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. LEVITSKY stayed at a hotel in Long Branch, New Jersey, with other trainees while JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG stayed at an apartment located off the main street of Long Branch, New Jersey. He was unable to furnish any further identifying data concerning ROSE BERG'S apartment.

During the period of approximately three months they were stationed at Fort Monmouth, ROSENBERG invited LEVITSKY and several other members of the training class to his apartment for dinners. He believes these dinners occurred on several occasions and were attended by AEM MOGVARO, ISIDORE HODES and himself. He could not recall the names of any other persons who attended.

LEVITSKY at first said that JOEL BARR had not visited at this apartment. However, after reflection, he stated that he was not sure if BARR was or was not present during any of his visits.

Sometime toward the end of December, 1940, the training class was completed and the members were handed various assignements. ISIDORE HODES, SID METZGER, MARKUS EPSTRIN, CARL GREENBLUM, KEM MOGVARO and JULIUS ROSFNBERG were sent to the Philadelphia Office of the Signal Corps. In turn, they were assigned to work at the RCA Camden plant.

At this time, LEVITSKY rented an apartment with MARKUS EPSTEIN and KEM MODVARO . which was located

on 15th Street near Spruce or Pine Street, Philadelphia. After staying there a short period of time, they moved to an apartment in West Philadelphia. However, he could not recall the address.

While in West Philadephia, EPSTEIN, who owned a car, would drive to the Camden, New Jersey, plant carrying other riders with him.

During this same period, JULIUS POSENBERG, who also was residing in the same read of West. Philadelphia, would on occasion join the car pool for the purpose of riding to the RCA plant. ROSENEERG was living in the same neighborhood in West Philadelphia.

LEVITSKY also advised that on several weekends during that year, 1941, EPSTEIN would drive miss car for to New York and in the car with EPSTEIN and LEVITSKY would be JULIUS ROSENBERG. Upon entering New York City, EPSTEIN, who was driving to Brooklyn, would discharge JULIUS ROSENBERG at a subwey stop near the Holland Tunnel and continue on his way. At no time could he recall that they had ever driven JULIUS ROSENBERG directly to any residence in New York City.

In the fall of 1941, LEVITSKY was assigned as an inspector at the Cardwell Company, New York City, and he lived with his parents at 79 Woodruff Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. He went on to say that he had no contact with RCSLEBERG after learning to in the transfer.

LEVITSKY, when questioned if he had ever used JULIUS ROS NBERG'S name as a reference, stated that he could not recall ever naving listed his name.

It was pointed out to him that, when he had filed an employment application with FTL in November, 1943, the name JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, had been used.

Thereupon, LEVITSKY advised that probably ROSENBERG had given him his name and address when they were working together at RCA in Philadelphia.

It was then pointed out to LEVITSKY that he had stated that his contact with ROSENBERG had ceased after the fall of 1941, and that ROSENBERG had moved to 10 Monroe Street in April, 1942.


In accounting for the 10 Monroe Street address of JULIUS ROSENBERG, LEVITSKY believes that sometime either in the spring or fall of 1942 he attended a musical concert at Washington Irving High School. During the intermission at this concert, he had a chance meeting with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. They chatted, and when the concert was resumed, they parted company. LEVITSKY believes it was at this concert that JULIUS and ETHEL invited him to visit their apartment, which accounts for his having the 10 Monroe Street address.

LEVITSKY advised that in 1943 (ERMIT ERYNES suggested /that FTL was a good place to work." BRYNES had formerly been employed by FTL and at that time was working with LEVITSKY.

It was pointed out to LEVITSKY that his employment application did not reflect the name of KERMIT BREGES as a reference and it appeared logical, since BRYNTS was a former FTL employee and believed that FTL was a good place to work, that his name would be a suitable reference.

LEVITSKY believes that in reviewing his address book he had come across the name of JULIUS ROSENBERG and had simply used his name because it had been recently placed in the book and "fresh in my mind."

LEVITS. Y stated that he had never seen JULIUS ROSENEERG since the above-mentioned meeting and was unable to furnish any other information concerning him.




It should be noted that previous information has been received from FTL that in 1940 and 1945 JULIUS RUSLINGERG attempted to obtain employment with that organization.








LEVITSKY stated that he had never been approached by anyone for espionage purposes and if he had been, he would have reported it to the proper authorities.

It should be noted that early in the interview, this question was asked and LEVITSKY advised the interviewing agents that he would recognize such an approach no matter how subtle it might be; however, when questioned concerning ROMENBERG, he stated that he was amazed when he heard of ROSENBERG'S arrest for espionage since he did not appear to be the type who would engage in espionage. He thereupon admitted that he did not believe he could detect any person engaged in espionage activities.


Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, from available information, believes that there were three classes conducted at the Civilian Training School; Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, all three of which started in 1940 and were composed of fr.m 20 to 40 students. As far as can be determined, all personnel attending this school came from the Brooklyn Army Base,





III. INTERVIEW OF MARKUS EPSTEIN

on January 8, 1953 MARKUS EPSTEIN, 1 thronics engineer and reference of JOSEPH LEVITSKY, was interviewed at his place of employment, The Empire Laboratories, 38-25 Bell Blvd., Bayside, Long Island, by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer.



In connection with this employment, EPSTEIN furnished the following information:

A short time prior to July, 1940 he applied at the Brooklyn Army Base for a civil Service position as a civilian inspector for the Signal Corps. In July, 1940 he received his appointment. About October, 1940 he was sent with a group of approximately 25 other trainees to the Civilian Training School in Fert Hommouth, New Jersey, He recalled that the following persons more in his training class:

JULIUS_ROSENBERC

KARL GREENBLUM.

KEM MOGVARO

JOSEPH LEVITSKY

LOU GRANDIVISO (ph)

LEONARD DISESA

Also, ALFRED C. WALKER may have been in this same class.

while stationed at Fort Monmouth, EPSTEIN resided at a hotel in Long Branch, New Jersey. He believes the above-mentioned persons, with the exception of JULIUS ROSHIMERG, resided at the same hotel. It was his belief that JULIUS ROSENBERG had an apartment where he stayed with his wife.

Concerning JULIUS ROSENBERG, EPSTEIN stated he first met him at Fort Monmouth and had not known him previous to this time. He believes, however, that JULIUS ROSENBERG had attended the College of the City of New York.

DESTEIN thought that as paid a visit to JULIUS' apartment at Long Branch where he met ETHEL ROSENBERG; however, he could not furnish any details concerning this visit. He pointed out that he was single at the time and since JULIUS was married, they would have had separate social contacts.


Upon the completion of the training class about the end of December, 1940, approximately thirty inspectors were sent to Philadelphia for assignment. He recalls the inspectors in Philadelphia were headed by a Colonel FRINA.


Upon his arrival in Philadelphia, EPSTEIN obtained an apartment which he shared with KARL GREENBLUM, ISIDORE HODES and/or JOSEPH LEVITSKY. This apartment was located on 15th Street near Walnut or Spruce Street. He placed this period to be January through March, 1941.

Where JULIUS ROSENBERG was at this time EPSTEIN did not recall but he remembered that about March, 1941 one of the other persons in the apartment left and AIFRIED C. WALKER and JULIUS ROSENBERG moved in. The others, GREENBLUM, HODES and LEVITSKY were in a near-by apartment. LEONARD DISESA and his wife also shared an apartment near-by.

He believed that after the original arrangement was broken, various roommates changed. The entire group had moved to an area somewhere in West Philadelphia which he could not identify. To the best of his recollection, EPSTEIN believes ROSENBERG stayed in the Philadelphia apartment from March through July, 1941 when possibly NL WALKER and ROSENBERG lived in Camden, New Jersey and worked at RCA in the same town.

EPSTEIN advised that in 1941 he owned a 1940 grey Chevrolet sedan and he used it to drive back and forth from work. Also riding with him wore AL WALKER, KARL GREENBLUM, KEM MOGVARO, JOSEPH LEVITSKY, and LOU GRANDIVISO. At various times JULIUS I JAKKELEG joined the par pool.





EPSTEIN, while on official business for the Signal Corps in 1945, recalls meeting JULIUS ROSENBERG in the plant of the Emerson Radio Company in Jersey City. This was his last contact with ROSENBERG. He stated that he had never visited at ROSENBERG'S residence nor had ROSENBERG visited at his.

In this connection, he believes that while they were working together in Philadelphia he may have driven ROSENBERG to New York City but it was his belief that when they reached New York City, ROSENBERG would have left the car and taken the subway or bus to his own residence. He pointed out that he probably would have been rather tired after driving from Philadelphia and since he had to continue on to Brooklyn he would not have taken the time to drive ROSENBERG about New York City.

Concerning KARL GREENBLUM, EPSTEIN last met him about two years ago at Watson Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, when they had dinner together in Asbury Park and he has not seen him since. He recalled that GREENBLUM associated with ROSENBERG in Philadelphia. They attended tachool together.


