SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Mrs. GILDA C. EDWARDS did not know MORTON SOBELL. ROBERT EDWARDS stated he knew SOBELL when both employed with GE in Schnectady, N.Y. EDWARDS unable to furnish any pertinent information regarding SOBELL.

DETAILS: This report is predicated upon information furnished to the Newark Division by Newark Confidential informant T-1, of unknown reliability, who is acquainted with Mrs. EDWARDS, to the effect that remarks made by Mrs. GILDA C. EDWARDS to subject in 1952 possibly indicated that Mrs. EDWARDS had been acquainted with MORTON SOBELL, convicted espionage agent.

At Nutley, New Jersey

On March 10, 1955, Mrs. GILDA C. EDWARDS was interviewed by SAs ROBERT J. KIRWAN and BENSON R. MOORE, Federal Telecommunications Laboratory, River Road. Mrs. EDWARDS remembered talking to subject in 1952 about SOBELL inasmuch as both subject and SOBELL had attended the City College of New York. Mrs. EDWARDS said that she was quite familiar with SOBELL's name

because SOBELL had worked in the same department with her husband in the General Electric Plant, in Schenectady, N.Y., during the 1940's. Mrs. EDWARDS said that when SOBELL was convicted of espionage, he was the subject of considerable discussion by people in Schenectady in view of his having worked there.

On March 10, 1955, Mrs. EDWARDS' husband ROBERT advised Agents KIRWAN and MOORE that from 1943 through 1949 he had been employed as a Development Engineer for General Electric in Schenectady, N.Y. For a period of approximately one year, Mr. EDWARDS said that he had worked in the same section as SOBELL and shared an office with SOBELL and about 50 other employees.

Mr. EDWARDS said that he knew SOBELL on a casual office relationship basis, however, knew nothing about his background, associates or personal life. Mr. EDWARDS concluded by saying that he had never seen SOBELL outside the GE plant.

LEVITSKY indicated he had no service with a foreign government, not a member of any organization, had never been arrested and was fingerprinted in Brooklyn in 1940. Under caption of "additional remarks," subject stated he is experienced with U.H.F. Radio Equipment and associated test equipment. Also experienced with large variety of precision instruments, standard meters and receivers used by the War Department."

Further review of subject's Personal Security Questionnaire reflected that he is also known as JOSEPH LARKIN, he presently holds a position of project engineer and is responsible for the completion of various projects in connection with electronic development. Subject is married and his wife, ROSE, was born in Poland. PSQ dated August, 1950 reflected his father's name as MOSES instead of MORRIS as was on his original application form in 1943. He listed his brother's address in 1950 as University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Also contained in subject's personnel file was a letter from the National City Bank of New York, Flatbush Branch, advising that LEVITSKY had applied for a special checking account on 1/21/49.

A printed form captioned, U.S. Espionage Act, certificate dated 11/17/43 at New York City, indicated that persons whose signature appeared thereon had received, read and understood the Espionage Act, and would be responsible for conduct in accordance with promises thereon. It should be noted that the above form had been signed by LEVITSKY and had not been signed by a witness in accordance with instructions thereon. Mr. STONLDRIER furnished a picture of the subject which is being placed in the 1-A section of this file.

On 11/25/52, Mr. ROBERT CUNNINGHAM, Postmaster, River-Edge, N.J., advised that one JOSEPH LEVITSKY receives mail at 65 Rutgers Place. The names of the subject's relatives are not reflected in the Newark indices. Newark indices reflected numerous subversive references regarding JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe St., New York City.

On 12/12/52 SA TIMOTHY B. LAGRONE was telephonically contacted by SA EDWARD CAHILL of the New York Office regarding subject's relationship with JULIUS ROSENBERG and SOLOMON GREENBERG. As requested by SA CAHILL, one copy of this letter is being designated for GREENBERG's file.

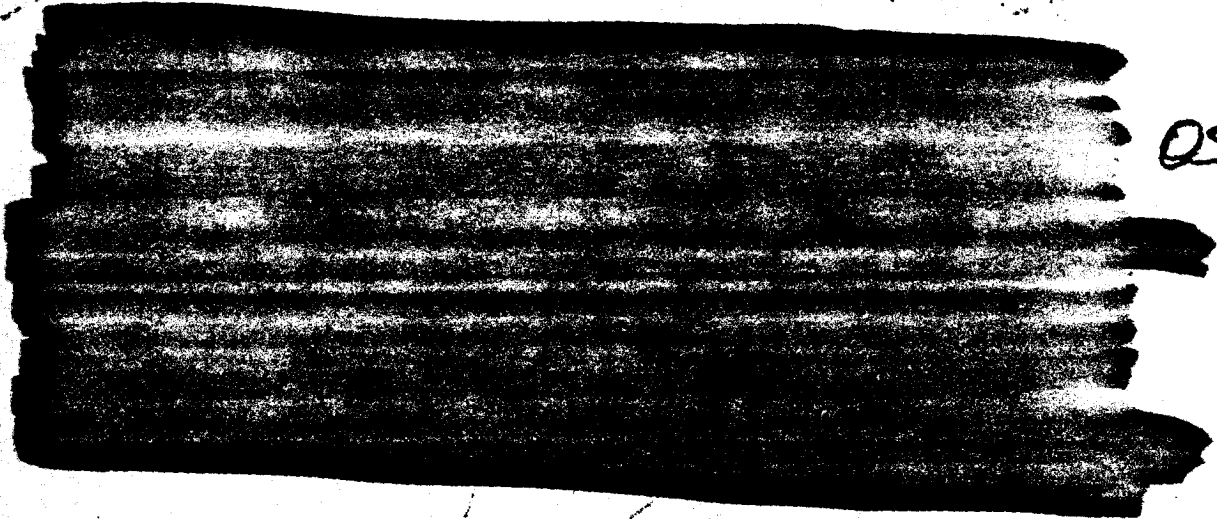

Mr. and Mrs. GEORGE HUSS of 4712 47th Avenue, Woodside, New York, advised that they were the owners, as well as resident managers of the property located at 646 St. Anns Avenue, for approximately 20 years prior to their sale of the property during the summer of 1952.

Both Mr. and Mrs. HUSS advised that the name RICHARDSON was not familiar to them, and they were unable to identify a 1938 photograph of the subject and his wife.

Mr. HUSS explained that the property at 646 St. Anns Avenue has but 12 apartments and he felt that he could pretty well recall the names of people who resided there during the period of his management upon hearing them mentioned. When questioned about any tenant residing here during this period who may possibly have radio equipment in his apartment, Mr. HUSS advised that MORTON SOBELL had installed wires or an antenna on the roof and constantly complained of the automatic furnace stoker causing interference on his radio. HUSS did not see this equipment and could furnish no further information concerning it.

HUSS advised that he believed three of the current residents at this address were there during 1938. He identified these three as the BROHAMMER family in Apartment 4-A; FRANK KUPKA, and Mrs. THOMAS MULLVEY.

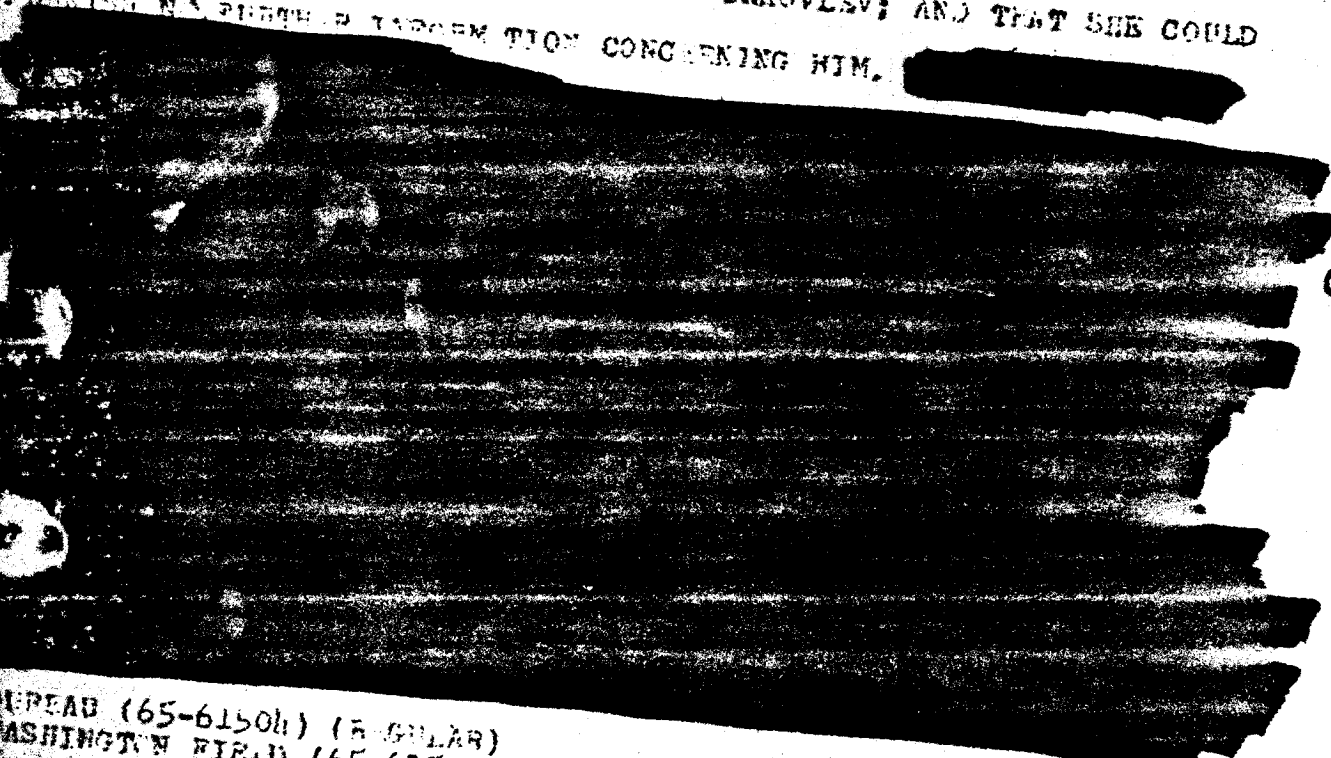

On June 9, 1953, EUFROSINA was again interviewed concerning her association with Soviet officials, personnel of the Russian Consulate and other Russian acquaintances. She denied that she had ever been closely acquainted or even casually acquainted with AN TOLI YAKOVLEV, stating that she was still of the opinion that he had only been pointed out to her or that she might possibly have been introduced to him at one occasion or some function such as a meeting or gathering of the Russian War Relief.

She said that she had no recollection of ever having talked with him; that she only recalled the name YAKOVLEV; and that she could furnish no information concerning him.

Concerning WILLIAM REMINGTON it is noted that he was convicted on February 4, 1953 on two counts of perjury. The first of these counts charged that REMINGTON lied when he said he (a) never gave to ELIZABETH BENTLEY or anyone secret classified information to which they were not entitled; (b) never gave such information to anyone for the purpose of having it sent to Russia; (c) never gave such information to anyone for any such purpose.

The second of these counts charged that REMINGTON lied when he said he had no knowledge of the existence of the Young Communist League at Dartmouth College.

In a signed statement dated November 30, 1945
ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, a self-admitted Soviet espionage agent,
stated as follows concerning KAZAKWICH:

"..... Sometime in 1942, I recall one VLADIMIR
KAZAKWICH, a former professor at Cornell University, was a somewhat
frequent visitor to GOLOS' (JACOB GOLOS, BENTLEY'S Soviet espionage
superior) office. This individual, who was not to my knowledge
a member of the Communist Party but had Communist leanings, was
at that time barely making a living teaching the Russian language
and giving lectures and writing excerpts for Communist publications.
VLADIMIR was not to my knowledge connected with any Government
agency, nor did he have any source for obtaining information
and as far as I know was merely a friend of long standing of GOLOS.
I do recall, however, that at some previous time he had some
information concerning Trotskyites which he furnished GOLOS...."

EUFROSINA advised she recalled the above name and believed that someone pointed out an individual by this name to her on some occasion, most likely at a Russian War Relief Meeting.

A photograph of ANATOLI ANTONOVICH YAKOVLEV was exhibited to her but she was unable to recall him or to identify him as the individual who she may have met.

Confidential Informant T-8 advised that ANATOLI YAKOVLEV, a clerk at the Russian Consulate frequently attended meetings at Russian War Relief Headquarters in 1944 and 1945.

HARRY GOLD, self-confessed former Soviet Espionage agent, identified ANATOLI YAKOVLEV as his Soviet Espionage superior to whom he furnished Atomic Energy information, which he received from KLAUS FUCHS.

SEMONTAL-ESP R. ROY COHN, COUNSEL TO MC CARTHY COMMITTEE WAS CONTACTED PURSUANT TO BUREAU INSTRUCTIONS AT EIGHT PM OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE. CONTACT MADE AT COHN-S RESIDENCE ONE ONE SIX FIVE PARK AVE, APT FIFTEEN C, BY SAS ROBERT F. ROYAL AND E. J. CAHILL. COHN FURNISHED ORALLY SUCH PERTINENT PORTIONS OF TESTIMONY OF CARL GREENBLUM AND JOSEPH LEVITSKY AS HE COULD RECALL. COHN STATED THAT GREENBLUM TOOK STAND IN MORNING OF OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE. GREENBLUM GAVE STOCK ANSWERS AND WOULD NOT ADMIT ANY KNOWLEDGE OF OR MEMBERSHIP IN CP OR ESPIONAGE ACTIVITIES. GREENBLUM BECAME ILL AND WAS REMOVED TO CARE OF PHYSICIANS. JOSEPH LEVITSKY TOOK STAND AND WHILE BEING INTERROGATED WORD CAME TO COMMITTEE THAT GREENBLUM DESIRED TO TESTIFY AND TELL HIS STORY. GREENBLUM BROUGHT BACK AND TESTIFIED AS FOLLOWS. GREENBLUM STATED HE FIRST MET JULIUS ROSENBERG WHILE BOTH WERE STUDENTS AT CCNY. GREENBLUM DESCRIBED HIMSELF AS A SOCIALIST AT THAT TIME. HE STATED JULIUS ROSENBERG WAS A COMMUNIST DURING SAME PERIOD. BOTH GREENBLUM AND ROSENBERG ENDEAVORED TO CONVERT ONE MORRIS SAVITSKY /PH/ A CCNY CLASSMATE TO THEIR

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RESPECTIVE POLITICAL PHILOSOPHIES. ROSENBERG WAS SUCCESSFUL IN THIS ENDEAVOR. AS A RESULT ROSENBERG AND GREENBLUM WERE NOT TOO FRIENDLY AT THIS TIME. GREENBLUM AND ROSENBERG WERE NEXT ASSOCIATED WHEN THEY ATTENDED SIGNAL CORPS SCHOOL IN FORT MONMOUTH IN FALL OF NINETEEN FORTY. IN NINETEEN FORTYONE GREENBLUM AND ROSENBERG WERE EMPLOYED BY THE SIGNAL CORPS IN PHILADELPHIA IN NINETEEN FORTY ONE. BOTH ROOMED AT THE SAME RESIDENCE IN PHILA, EXACT DATES AND ADDRESS NOT RECALLED. OTHERS IN GROUP IN PHILA SIGNAL CORPS WERE JOSEPH LEVITSKY, MARCUS /MAX/ EPSTEIN, ALFRED C. /WALKER. IT WAS IN PHILA THAT GREENBLUM BEGAN TO KNOW JOSEPH LEVITSKY. DURING THE MIDDLE NINETEEN FORTIES GREENBLUM VISITED LEVITSKY-S HOME IN BROOKLYN, NY ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS. AT TIMES THERE WERE PRESENT PEOPLE WHO LEVITSKY DESCRIBED AS CP MEMBERS. THESE INDIVIDUALS ARE - LEO LNU, FRED LNU, CECILE LNU AND SYLVIA LNU. GREENBLUM STATES HE CAN FURNISH DESCRIPTIONS AND IDENTIFY PHOTOS OF THESE PEOPLE. HE HAS ADDRESS BOOKS AT HOME AND WILL FURNISH INFO FROM THESE BOOKS. NY BELIEVES THAT THE LEO ABOVE MAY POSSIBLY BE IDENTICAL WITH LEO STACHOVER, FORMERLY OF

FEDERAL TELECOMMUNICATION LAB NUTLEY NJ AND NOW OF KOLLSMAN INSTRUMENT CO., QUEENS, NY. BUREAU HAS BEEN FURNISHED WITH INFO ON STACHOVER IN PAST. IN NINETEEN FORTYSEVEN LEVITSKY BEGAN SHOWING INCREASED INTEREST IN GREENBLUMS WORK AND FRIENDS AT FT. MONMOUTH AND WHAT THEY WERE DOING. GREENBLUM SUSPECTS THAT AT THIS TIME LEVITSKY WAS TRYING TO DEVELOP HIM AS AN ESPIONAGE CONTACT. HE WAS AT THIS TIME INVITED TO A DINNER PARTY AT A FRENCH RESTAURANT ON THIRTYFOURTH ST., NYC. THREE COUPLES WERE PRESENT IN ADDITION TO LEVITSKY. THE MEN WERE IDENTIFIED AS WILLIAM PERL AND JOEL BARR. THE THIRD MAN'S NAME WAS NOT RECALLED BUT GREENBLUM COULD IDENTIFY A PHOTO IF ONE IS SHOWN TO HIM AND CAN FURNISH DESCRIPTION. GREENBLUM DOES NOT RECALL THE WOMEN BUT CAN DESCRIBE THEM. HE IDENTIFIED BARR AS KNOWN TO HIM TO BE A MEMBER OF THE CP. THIS LATTER POINT WAS NOT DEVELOPED BY THE COMMITTEE. GREENBLUM BELIEVES THIS DINNER PARTY WAS HELD FOR THE EXPRESS PURPOSE OF LOOKING GREENBLUM OVER AS AN ESPIONAGE PROSPECT. HE MENTIONED OTHER DINNER MEETINGS BUT DID NOT GIVE DETAILS. LATER LEVITSKY EXPRESSED TO GREENBLUM AN INTEREST IN LOUIS ANTELL. GREENBLUM BELIEVES THAT LEVITSKY WAS CONSIDERING AN APPROACH TO ANTELL FOR DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES. GREENBLUM SAYS THAT ANTELL PROBABLY ALERTED GREENBLUM TO WHAT LEVITSKY WAS TRYING

TO DO AND REMARKED THAT THIS WAS SERIOUS BUSINESS AND THAT GREENBLUM AND ANTELL SHOULD TERMINATE THEIR CONTACTS WITH LEVITSKY. FOR INFO OF BUREAU, ANTELL IS EMPLOYED BY US SIGNAL CORPS AT SEVENTY EAST TENTH ST., NYC, AS AN INSPECTOR. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY THE NYO ON OCT TWELVE, FIFTYTHREE. INTERVIEW CONDUCTED IN LEVITSKY CASE ON BASIS THAT LEVITSKY HAD USED ANTELL AS A REFERENCE ON PSQ IN NINETEEN FORTYSEVEN. ANTELL ADVISED HE ATTENDED SIGNAL CORPS CLASSES AT FT. MONMOUTH IN FALL OF NINETEEN FORTY. WHILE THERE HE FIRST SAW LEVITSKY AND BELIEVES HE SAW ROSENBERG THERE. SUBSEQUENTLY DEVELOPED FRIENDSHIP WITH GREENBLUM. NINETEEN FORTY THREE TO FORTY SIX MET LEVITSKY ON SOCIAL OCCASIONS, NEVER ENGAGED IN ESPIONAGE OR CP ACTIVITY. HE DENIED EVER HAVING BEEN APPROACHED TO COMMIT ESPIONAGE. COHN SAYS GREENBLUM WAS IN HIGHLY EMOTIONAL STATE AT END OF SESSION BEFORE COMMITTEE, THAT DOCTORS HAD GIVEN HIM SEDATIVES AND THAT HE LEFT FOR HIS HOME ON EVENING OF OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE. NY AGENTS WILL INTERVIEW GREENBLUM AT HIS RESIDENCE AND WILL BE ALERT TO SECURITY PRECAUTIONS DURING INTERVIEW. INTERVIEW WILL NOT TAKE PLACE IN PRESENCE OF ANYONE OTHER THAN GREENBLUM AND AGENTS. MARCUS EPSTEIN WAS BEFORE COMMITTEE OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE. HE DENIED KNOWING THAT ROSENBERG AND LEVITSKY WERE CP SYMPATHIZERS AND DID NOT FURNISH ANY PERTINENT INFORMATION. COHN STATES EPSTEIN IS PROBABLY LYING AND BUREAU SHOULD GO AFTER HIM. EPSTEIN HAS BEEN INTERVIEWED PREVIOUSLY BY BUREAU AGENTS AND GAVE MORE INFO THAN OUTLINED ABOVE. LEON MILLER ALSO TESTIFIED OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE AND DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF ESPIONAGE OR CP ACTIVITY ON PART OF ROSENBERG. MILLER IN NINETEEN FORTYFIVE WAS ROSENBERGS FOREMAN AT EMERSON RADIC CO., VIVIAN GLASSMAN CLAIMED PRIVILEGE UNDER FIFTH AMENDMENT. LEVITSKY TESTIFIED AND CLAIMED PRIVILEGE ON HIS OWN CP ACTIVITIES, DENIED ANY ESPIONAGE ACTIVITY BUT ADMITTED CLOSE RELATIONSHIP WITH ROSENBERG. EACH TIME COMMITTEE ASKED LEVITSKY ABOUT DOCUMENTS HE CL

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ASKED LEVITSKY ABOUT DOCUMENTS, HE CLAIMED PRIVILEGE UNDER FIFTH AMENDMENT. MARCEL ULLMAN CLAIMED PRIVILEGE WHEN QUESTIONED ON ESPIONAGE. ON OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE ALFRED WALKER, MENTIONED ABOVE AND LOUIS ANTELL WILL APPEAR BEFORE COMMITTEE, LEVITSKY WILL ALSO APPEAR. ROY COHN AND FRANK CARR WILL LEAVE BY NOON OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE BY AIR FOR LEWISBURG, PA TO INTERVIEW DAVID GREENGLASS. SENATOR MC CARTHY WILL HANDLE WITNESSES. JAMES JULIANA REPORTEDLY FLEW TO GERMANY OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE ON COMMITTEE BUSINESS. COHN SAYS THIS TRIP BY JULIANA IS HIGHLY SECRET AND NOT TO BE DEVULGED. COHN WILL ENDEAVOR TO FURNISH NYO ALL TRANSCRIPTS OF TESTIMONY BY SIX PM OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE INCLUDING TESTIMONY GIVEN ON OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE. ROY COHN OFFERED TO PERMIT AGENTS TO BE PRESENT AT HEARINGS ON OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE BUT NO COMMITMENTS MADE BY AGENTS IN THIS REGARD. NYO ON OCT SIXTEEN FIFTYTHREE RECOMMENDED TO BUREAU THAT NO AGENT BE PRESENT AT THESE HEARINGS. ASST. DIR. BELMONT CONCURRED IN THIS RECOMMENDATION AND NO AGENT WILL BE PRESENT. BUREAU TO BE ADVISED OF ALL DEVELOPMENTS. INTERVIEW OF LEVITSKY NECESSARILY DEFERRED BY HIS SCHEDULED APPEARANCE BEFORE COMMITTEE ON OCT SEVENTEEN FIFTYTHREE. PRESENT AT THE GREENBLUM RESIDENCE WERE CARL GREENBLUM, HIS WIFE ^{MR. MARY ANN SACH} A BROTHER IN LAW ABRAHAM HERSHKOWITZ AND HIS NEPHEW JACK SOHLERFMAN BOTH OF WHOM RESIDE AT ONE ONE SEVEN DASH ZERO ONE PARK LANE SOUTH, QUEENS, NY. UPON ARRIVAL AT THE RESIDENCE AGENTS WERE INFORMED THAT CARL GREENBLUM WAS ILL AND IN BED, HAD BEEN UNDER PHYSICIAN'S CARE AND HAD BEEN GIVEN SEDATIVES THAT MORNING ^{BY DR. ALEX. MIRON.} THE PHYSICIAN, HOWEVER, HAD STATED IT WAS PERMISSIBLE FOR GREENBLUM TO BE INTERVIEWED, HIS WIFE WHO WAS IN A NOTICEABLY NERVOUS CONDITION ALSO INDICATED A WILLINGNESS FOR HIM TO BE INTERVIEWED AND THE TWO ABOVE MENTIONED RELATIVES INTERPOSED NO OBJECTION. GREENBLAUM WAS INTERVIEWED ALONE IN HIS BEDROOM AND IT WAS APPARENT FROM THE OUTSET THAT HE WAS IN A HIGHLY NERVOUS AND

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EMOTIONAL CONDITION. GREENBLUM POINTED OUT THAT IN JEWISH FAMILIES A ONE WEEK MOURNING PERIOD IS OBSERVED BY ALL MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY FOLLOWING A DEATH. GREENBLUM STATED THAT THE SERVICE OF THE SUBPEONA, HIS APPEARANCE BEFORE THE COMMITTEE ON OCTOBER TWELVE, LAST, AND HIS MOTHER'S DEATH HAD UP SET HIM CONSIDERABLY. DURING THE WEEK OF MOURNING HE RECEIVED PHONE CALLS FROM THE MC CARTHY COMMITTEE REGARDING A RE APPEARANCE. FORMER SA JAMES JULIANA TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED GREENBLUM ON OCTOBER FOURTEEN, LAST, AND REQUESTED GREENBLUM TO APPEAR BEFORE A COMMITTEE IN NY ON OCTOBER SIXTEEN. GREENBLUM INTERPOSED NO SERIOUS OBJECTION BUT DID POINT OUT THAT WHILE HE WAS WILLING TO TESTIFY IT DID INTERFERE WITH THE MOURNING PERIOD AND THAT HE WAS CONSIDERABLY UPSET BY HIS MOTHER'S DEATH. GREENBLUM

THEN ADVISED THAT FOLLOWING HIS APPEARANCE ON THE STAND, HE HAD AN EMOTIONAL BREAKDOWN. THIS BREAKDOWN WAS NOT CAUSED BY THE FACT THAT HE HAD BEEN LYING IN HIS APPEARANCES BUT RATHER BECAUSE OF THE ROUGH TREATMENT TO WHICH HE WAS SUBJECTED IN QUESTIONS BY THE COMMITTEE. AS A RESULT, HE WAS IN A STATE OF SHOCK AND BEFORE HE TERMINATED HIS TESTIMONY, HE WAS SAYING ANYTHING BECAUSE THE COMMITTEE WAS PUTTING WORDS IN HIS MOUTH. GREENBLUM STATED THAT HE WAS REACHING CONCLUSIONS BASED ON CONJECTURE WITHOUT REFLECTION. THESE CONCLUSIONS WERE OFFERED BECAUSE GREENBLUM WAS ENDEAVORING TO COOPERATE WITH THE COMMITTEE AS A CITIZEN. CONCERNING HIS TESTIMONY ON OCTOBER SIXTEENTH LAST, GREENBLUM STATED THAT HE TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT HE KNEW JULIUS ROSENBERG AND NATHAN SOSSMAN AT CCNY TO BE LEADERS IN WHAT HE BELIEVED TO BE THE YOUNG COMMUNIST LEAGUE AT THAT INSTITUTION. WITH REFERENCE TO THE ALLEGATION THAT ROSENBERG AND GREENBLUM CONTENDED FOR THE POLITICAL LOYALTY OF MORRIS SAVITSKY, GREENBLUM STATED HE HAD ATTEMPTED TO INTEREST SAVITSKY IN HIS IDEAS CONCERNING SOCIALISM. HOWEVER, HE COULD RECALL VERY LITTLE CONCERNING ROSENBERG'S ACTIVITIES AT CCNY. HOWEVER, HE WAS AWARE OF THE FACT THAT ROSENBERG'S FRIEND, SOSSMAN, HAD DISCUSSED POLITICAL MATTERS WITH SAVITSKY WHICH HE, GREENBLUM, BELIEVED WERE COMMUNIST. HIS CONTACT WITH ROSENBERG WAS VERY LIMITED. GREENBLUM DENIED THAT HE HAD EVER BEEN A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY AND DENIED THAT HE HAD EVER BEEN ACTIVE IN ESPIONAGE IN ANY CAPACITY.

GREENBLUM STATED THAT HE BEGAN HIS EMPLOYMENT WITH THE US SIGNAL CORPS PROCUREMENT DIVISION, IN NY IN NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY. IT WAS ABOUT THIS TIME THAT HE FIRST MET JOSEPH LEVITSKY. HE SUBSEQUENTLY SAW LEVITSKY AT FORT MONMOUTH IN THE FALL OF NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY, WHILE BOTH WERE ATTENDING A CLASS FOR SIGNAL CORPS INSPECTORS HELD DURING SEPTEMBER OF THAT YEAR AT FORT MONMOUTH. DURING THE WINTER OF NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY GREENBLUM WAS SENT TO THE RCA PLANT IN CAMDEN, N.J., AND THERE RESIDED WITH ALFRED C. WALKER AND MARCUS OR MAX EPSTEIN. THESE INDIVIDUALS WERE ALSO AT THE RCA PLANT, CAMDEN, N.J., AND THE THREE OCCUPIED AN APARTMENT ON THE TOP FLOOR OF A BUILDING NEAR SPRUCE AND TWENTY-FIRST STREET, PHILADELPHIA. AT THAT TIME JOSEPH LEVITSKY ALSO WAS EMPLOYED AT RCA AND RESIDED IN AN APARTMENT NEARBY. GREENBLUM AFTER A FEW MONTHS WAS ASSIGNED TO ST. CHARLES, ILL. AND HE SUBSEQUENTLY HEARD THAT JULIUS ROSENBERG HAD MOVED INTO THE APARTMENT WITH WALKER AND EPSTEIN. ~~SHORTLY~~ ^{AFTER} ~~THE~~, THE ST. CHARLES ASSIGNMENT GREENBLUM WORKED AGAIN IN PHILADELPHIA AND NY AREA. IN NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE HE WAS ASSIGNED AS AN INSPECTOR AT THE FTL FACTORY IN NEWARK, N.J. ABOUT THIS TIME JOSEPH LEVITSKY EXPERIENCED SOME DIFFICULTY IN HIS POSITION WITH THE SIGNAL CORPS AT THE BENDIX PLANT IN

TOWSON, ~~MD.~~ ^{MD.} AN UNIDENTIFIED ARMY CAPTAIN HAD CAUSED HIM DIFFICULTY BY MAKING ANTI-SEMITIC REMARKS. LEVITSKY WAS HIRED AS ~~AN~~ ^{A CIVILIAN} EMPLOYEE BY FTL AT SIX SEVEN BROAD STREET, NYC. SHORTLY THEREAFTER LEVITSKY WAS MARRIED AND RESIDED IN BROOKLYN, NY. DURING THIS PERIOD GREENBLUM SAW LEVITSKY FREQUENTLY AND ATTENDED SOCIAL FUNCTIONS AT LEVITSKY'S HOME. IN CONNECTION WITH THE STATEMENT ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN MADE BY GREENBLUM BEFORE THE COMMITTEE ON OCTOBER SIXTEEN LAST CONCERNING MEETING PEOPLE DESCRIBED AS LEO, FRED, CECILE AND SYLVIA AT THE LEVITSKY HOME, AND WHO WERE REPORTEDLY DESCRIBED BY GREENBLUM AS CP MEMBERS THE FOLLOWING WAS OFFERED BY GREENBLUM: THESE PEOPLE WERE NOT TO HIS KNOWLEDGE CP MEMBERS NOR AT THE TIME DID HE SUSPECT THEM TO BE CP MEMBERS, ON THE CONTRARY HE EXPRESSED THE OPINION THAT THEY WERE HIGHLY RESPECTABLE PEOPLE. AS A RESULT OF LEVITSKY'S MARRIAGE HE SAW LESS AND LESS OF LEVITSKY AND DEVELOPED A CLOSE FRIENDSHIP WITH LOUIS ANTELL. GREENBLUM STATED THAT HE AND ANTELL WERE CLOSER TO EACH OTHER THAN EITHER WAS TO LEVITSKY. ^{With} REFERENCE TO THE ~~ALLEGATION~~ ^{STATEMENT} ALLEGEDLY MADE IN HIS APPEARANCE BEFORE THE COMMITTEE, THAT LEVITSKY SHOWED AN UNUSUAL INTEREST IN ANTELL'S WORK WITH A POSSIBLE VIEW TOWARD DEVELOPING ANTELL AS AN ESPIONAGE CONTACT, GREENBLUM STATED THAT HE DID NOT

BELIEVE THE INTEREST DISPLAYED BY ~~LEVITSKY~~ IN ANTELL WAS UNUSUAL IN ANY RESPECT. IN NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN GREENBLUM WAS TOLD BY LEVITSKY THAT LEVITSKY INTENDED TO JOIN THE PARTY. BY THIS ~~LEVITSKY~~ GREENBLUM UNDERSTOOD LEVITSKY TO MEAN THE CP, ALTHOUGH HE DID NOT SPECIFICALLY QUESTION HIM ON THAT POINT. FROM NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT TO THE PRESENT GREENBLUM HAS SEEN LEVITSKY ON ONLY APPROXIMATELY FIVE OCCASIONS. IN ABOUT NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT GREENBLUM OBSERVED THAT LEVITSKY WAS ADOPTING THE RUSSIAN VIEWPOINT ON CURRENT EVENTS IN SOCIAL CONVERSATION. AT ABOUT THIS TIME ANTELL SUGGESTED TO GREENBLUM THAT PERHAPS IT WOULD BE BETTER FOR BOTH OF THEM IF THEY SAW LESS OF LEVITSKY. THIS SUGGESTION WAS NOT MADE BECAUSE ANTELL OR GREENBLUM BELIEVED THEY WERE BEING DEVELOPED AS ESPIONAGE CONTACTS, BUT RATHER BECAUSE LEVITSKY WAS TENDING TOWARDS MORE RADICAL POLITICAL VIEWS. AT FIVE THIRTY-NINE P.M. OCTOBER SEVENTEEN NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE, AND AGAIN AT SIX TWO P.M. ON THE SAME DATE GREENBLUM TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED SA ROBERT ROYAL AT THE NYO TO FURNISH THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL INFO: AT ABOUT THE TIME OF THE DINNER PARTY, MENTIONED BELOW, IDENTIFIED AS NINETEEN FORTY-SEVEN LEVITSKY CONTACTED GREENBLUM AND SOLICITED FROM HIM A SUBSCRIPTION OF

ONE DOLLAR FOR THE "DAILY WORKER". TO ACCOMODATE LEVITSKY HE DID PAY LEVITSKY ONE DOLLAR. GREENBLUM NEVER RECEIVED THE "DAILY WORKER" AND MADE NO EFFORT TO OBTAIN IT FROM LEVITSKY, INASMUCH AS HE WAS NOT INTERESTED IN RECEIVING THE PAPER. GREENBLUM OFFERED THE OPINION THAT AS A RESULT OF THIS INCIDENT HE BELIEVED THAT LEVITSKY WAS EITHER A CP MEMBER OR SYMPATHIZER. CONCERNING THE MEETING WITH LEVITSKY FOLLOWING THE ROSENBERG ARREST GREENBLUM STATED THAT THE MEETING OCCURRED IN EARLY NINETEEN FIFTY-TWO, AND WAS "ACCIDENTAL" MEETING AT THE IRE SHOW, WHICH WAS HELD IN NYC. THIS "MAY HAVE BEEN ON PURPOSE". GREENBLUM WAS QUESTIONED AS TO WHY HE MADE THIS DEDUCTION, AND HE COULD GIVE NO REASON FOR IT. IT IS NOTED THAT THE IRE SHOW IS THE ANNUAL MEETING HELD BY THE INSTITUTE OF RADIO AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS. LEVITSKY AND GREENBLUM WENT TO A NEARBY RESTAURANT, WHERE THEY ENGAGED IN CONVERSATION, AND DURING THE COURSE OF THE CONVERSATION DISCUSSIONS WERE HAD CONCERNING THE PUBLICITY DEALING WITH JULIUS ROSENBERG. GREENBLUM QUESTIONED LEVITSKY AS TO WHETHER HE WAS INVOLVED IN THIS MATTER, AND THE REPLY OF LEVITSKY WAS, "THERE BUT FOR THE GRACE OF GOD GO I". HE WAS QUESTIONED FOR ADDITIONAL DETAILS AS TO WHY HE ASKED LEVITSKY THIS QUESTION AND GREENBLUM

STATED IT WAS MERELY A CASUAL QUESTION UPON HIS PART.

He did not obtain any explanation from Levitsky
~~AND FURTHER THAT BY THIS TIME HE HAD FORGOTTEN BECAUSE~~
as to what Levitsky meant by the quotation
~~OF LEVITSKY'S BACKGROUND "COMMUNIST BACKGROUND" IF HE~~

~~HE HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN NOCTURNAL ACTIVITIES. GREENBLUM~~

~~COULD NOT SPECIFICALLY EXPLAIN WHAT HE MEANT BY NOCTURNAL.~~

WITH REFERENCE TO HIS TESTIMONY CONCERNING THE DINNER PARTY IN THE FRENCH RESTAURANT, GREENBLUM STATED THAT LEVITSKY INVITED GREENBLUM TO DINNER IN NY. HE RECALLS THAT THE DINNER WAS HELD IN A FRENCH RESTAURANT NEAR PENN STATION, NYC, AND THAT PRESENT WERE LEVITSKY AND HIS WIFE, GREENBLUM AND A DATE, NAME NOT NOW RECALLED, AND HE WAS SURPRISED TO SEE THAT OTHERS WERE PRESENT. IN ALL EIGHT TO TEN PEOPLE WERE THERE, SEATED AT A TABLE FOR TWELVE. AMONG THE OTHERS PRESENT WERE WILLIAM PEARL AND A WOMAN WHO MIGHT POSSIBLY BE HIS WIFE. ONE OR TWO OTHER COUPLES WERE PRESENT, BUT HE HAS NO INFO WHICH COULD BE USED TO IDENTIFY THESE PEOPLE. GREENBLUM STATED THAT IN HIS TESTIMONY BEFORE THE COMMITTEE HE CONFUSED JOES BARR'S PRESENCE AT THE DINNER PARTY WITH A CHANCE MEETING HE HAD WITH BARR, AND BARR'S DATE, AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME AS THE DINNER MEETING TOOK PLACE. HE DESCRIBED JOEL BARR'S DATE ON THIS OCCASION AS BEING A WOMAN TENTATIVELY IDENTIFIED FROM PHOTOGRAPHS AS VIVIAN GLASSMAN. THE OCCASION OF THE CHANGE

AND NOT AT THE
DINNER PARTY.

MEETING WAS AT A PLAY IN GREENWICH VILLAGE, THE ONLY INFO GREENBLUM COULD FURNISH CONCERNING BARR WAS THAT HE KNEW BARR AT CCNY, AND THAT HE HAS NO POSITIVE INFO WHICH COULD IDENTIFY BARR AS A MEMBER OF THE CP OR AS AN ESPIONAGE AGENT. HE DID KNOW THAT BARR WHILE AT CCNY ASSOCIATED WITH NATHAN SUSSMAN, WHO WAS ACTIVE IN THE YCL AT THE INSTITUTION. CONCERNING THE DINNER PARTY HE HAD AT THAT TIME NO IMPRESSION ^{AT THE TIME OF THE PARTY.} THAT HE WAS BEING DEVELOPED AS AN ESPIONAGE CONTACT, BUT IN RETROSPECT POSSIBLY OFFERED TO THE COMMITTEE THE THEORY THAT HE MIGHT HAVE BEEN PRESENT AT THE DINNER PARTY TO BE CONSIDERED FOR RECRUITMENT INTO THE CP. HE BASED THIS STATEMENT ON THE FACT THAT IT WAS AN UNUSUAL DINNER GROUP, SINCE SO MANY WERE STRANGERS TO EACH OTHER AND THERE WAS NOT MUCH CONVERSATION INDULGED IN AT THE DINNER PARTY.

AT THREE FIFTY PM ON OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH NINETEEN FIFTYTHREE, ROY COHN TELEPHONICALLY ADVISED THAT HE DID NOT YET HAVE THE TRANSCRIPT OF TESTIMONY OF GREENBLUM. COHN STATED HOWEVER, THAT THE STENO WHO TOOK THE TESTIMONY LEFT FOR WASHINGTON, D.C., ON OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH FIFTYTHREE AT ABOUT NOON TIME. COHN ENDEAVORED TO PERSUADE THIS STENO TO TYPE THIS TRANSCRIPT AT NY BUT COULD NOT PREVAIL UPON HIM TO DO SO. COHN ARRANGED FOR THE STENO TO TYPE THIS MATERIAL IN WASHINGTON AND DELIVER IT TO THE OFFICE OF ASSISTANT TO THE DIRECTOR NICHOLS AT THE BUREAU ON OCTOBER EIGHTEENTH, COHN HAD IN HIS POSSESSION THE TRANSCRIPT OF THE TESTIMONY OF JOSEPH LEVITSKY COVERING LEVITSKY'S APPEARANCE BEFORE THE COMMITTEE ON OCTOBER ~~SIX~~ ^{THIRTEEN.} TEENTH. COHN VOLUNTEERED THAT ON OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH, LEVITSKY CLAIMED PRIVILEGE UNDER THE FIFTH AMENDMENT TO ALL QUESTIONS AND THE COMMITTEE WILL CITE LEVITSKY FOR CONTEMPT INASMUCH AS IN HIS PRIOR APPEARANCE, LEVITSKY HAD ~~SENSED~~ ANSWERED CERTAIN QUESTIONS, DECLINED ON OTHERS, AND THEREFORE, IN COHN'S OPINION, HIS TESTIMONY ON OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH MADE HIM LIABLE FOR CONTEMPT PROCEEDINGS. OTHER WITNESSES ON OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH WERE ALFRED C. WALKER AND LOUIS ANTELL.

CONCERNING THESE PEOPLE, COHN STATED THAT THEY MENTIONED CERTAIN NAMES AS COMMUNISTS BUT COHN DID NOT VOLUNTEER ANY SPECIFIC INFORMATION CONCERNING THEIR TESTIMONY. COHN DID STATE THAT ANTELL PROBABLY SHOULD BE INTERVIEWED. IT IS TO BE NOTED, AS SET FORTH IN NY TELETYPE TO THE BUREAU OF OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH, THAT ANTELL WAS INTERVIEWED ^{By NYO} WITHIN THE RECENT PAST. COHN PROVIDED A COPY OF THE TRANSCRIPT OF THE TESTIMONY OF LEVITSKY WHICH COVERS SOME THIRTYSIX PAGES OF TESTIMONY AND IS SUMMARIZED BELOW. PHOTOSTATIC COPIES OF THIS TESTIMONY WILL BE TRANSMITTED TO THE BUREAU ON THE NIGHT OF OCTOBER SEVENTEENTH, MARKED FOR THE ATTENTION OF ASSISTANT DIRECTOR BELMONT. IN ADDITION, COHN ADVISED THAT LEVITSKY WAS REPRESENTED BY "LEONARD BUDEN", ~~ALSO KNOWN AS~~ (BOUDIN), KNOWN TO THE BUREAU AS COUNSEL FOR SUCH SUBJECTS AS COPLON, VIVIAN GLASSMAN, ERNEST PATAKI, MAX FINESTONE, ETC. ~~IN VIEW OF THE ABOVE, NY WILL NOT AT THIS TIME ATTEMPT TO INTERVIEW LEVITSKY UACB. NY RECOMMENDS THAT ANY INTERVIEW OF LEVITSKY SHOULD BE HELD FOLLOWING A REVIEW OF THE TRANSCRIPT OF THE TESTIMONY OF LEVITSKY AND GREENBLUM, THE ANALYSIS OF THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE TO NY IN ITS FILES, AND BY THE INTERVIEW OF GREENBLUM, IN DEVELOPMENT.~~

GREENBLUM REQUESTED THAT HE BE NOT INTERVIEWED ON OCTOBER EIGHTEENTH UNLESS IT WAS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY, IN WHICH CASE HE WOULD WILLINGLY COOPERATE WITH THIS OFFICE. GREENBLUM PREFERRED TO BE INTERVIEWED AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE MOURNING PERIOD WHICH WILL BE ON THE MORNING OF OCTOBER NINETEENTH FIFTYTHREE. IN VIEW OF HIS CONDITION AND THE FACT THAT THE TRANSCRIPT OF HIS TESTIMONY OF OCTOBER SIXTEENTH IS NOT AVAILABLE, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT NO FURTHER INTERVIEW BE CONDUCTED WITH GREENBLUM UNTIL THIS TESTIMONY CAN BE RECEIVED AT THE NYO, ANALYZED, AND ANY DISCREPANCIES NOTED.
