On 12/27/57 RAMET COID, convicted espionage agent, Registry 19312 No. United States Penicentiery, Levieburg, Fe., advised SA THOMAS E. SAINDERS that he had never used the alies of MILI, and never knew of anyone who did, who was engaged in espionage activity. GOLD stated be often used the alias of RUBIN COHEN when signing receipts for money received to cover expenses.

COLD further advised the women whom he can recall who should have had inowledge of his espionage activities are: VERONICA MANE, JULIE SLACK, RUTH GREENGLASS, MARIAN MOSCOWITT (PH), and Mrs. KRISTEL HEINEMAIN, the sister of CLAUS FUCHS. He said that more of those women maned, to his knowledge, was ever referred to as MYRTLE. GOLD further pointed out that it is entirely possible that MIRTLE, HARRI and MILT are code names, if in fact those mentioned are or were engaged in espionage activity.

DAVID ORFFROLASS, completed estimage agent, Begistry \$1935205, United States Penitentiery, Levisturg, Pa., on 12/27/57 advised SATHURIS E. SAUNILIS that he cannot recall ever having met or known anyone by the name of MYRTLE or BARRY, other than BARRY COLD, As to MILT, CREEKGLASS advised he used to know Dr. MILT MARNUS, a physical chemist, employed by the U.S. Bureau of Mines at Pitteburgh, Fa., during the period 1946-47-48.

ORDENCLASS stated that MANNUS graduated from CCKT, MIC, around 1936-39, and subsequently received his Doctor's Degree from Duke University. He said that MANNUS was a very close friend of JULTUS ROSENHERG, and visited with ROSENBERO frequently during this period. GREENGLASS asserted that be once asked ROSENBERG if MANHUS was working for him, and ROSENBERG stated that be was not, that he was an "ivory tower scientist and won't give me any informition. GREENGLISS stated that JULIUS ROSENHERO had no reason to lie to him regarding his association with Dr. MILT MAKRUS; however, it is possible that he lied, as JULIUS had lied to him about some other things. OREEWILES then stated that it is conjecture on his part, but since reading about the conviction of Col RUDOLF IVAKOVICH AREL, he is convinced in his own mind that ABEL, who came to this country around 1947, is the one whom ROSENEIRO made contact with after having lost his Soviet contact for a period of time prior to this. GRZENGLASS stated that if such is the case, as ROSENEIRO never identified his new contact to GREENGLASS, it is entirely possible that some of ROSENEERO's contacts later became part of AREL's apparatus.

On 2/17/53, DAVID ORLEWILLSS, convicted espionage agent, U.S. Fonitontiary, Lexisburg, Pa., furnished the following to SA THULLS E. SAUNDERS:

the West Street Jail, New York City, in connection with a funeral trip permitted him at the time of the death of his mother, he observed Colonel RUDGLF IVAROVICH AREL in a coll at the West Street Jail, while dressing to attend the funeral. GREENILASS stated that in addition to previously having viewed photographs of AREL which were published in newspapers and magazines and now having seen AREL in person, he definitely can say that he has never knowingly observed AREL prior to his being convicted on explonage sharges.

Regarding statements previously made that it was conjecture on his part, but he felt that ABEL was JULIUS ROSENDERG'S contact subsequent to 1943, GREENLASS stated that his reasoning in this regard is as follows:

ROSERFERO lost contact with the soviet. He said that he knows this is true as he had requested money of ROSERFERO and ROSERFERO told him that he had lost contact and to obtain money he would have to borrow some from one of his friends, which he did not care to do. GREENLASS continued that later, sometime in 1948, U

ROSENEERG did make contact with the Soviet and was "flush" with money and did, in fact, give some to GREENGLASS. Furthermore, ROSENBERG told GREENGLASS that his new contact was a "sweet setup" in that he could meet him in theaters, cutlying sections, and other special places which were not mentioned to GREENGLASS. As stated before, GREENGLASS stated this new contact was never identified to him by ROSENBERG.

and the methods which were used by him to obtain information, which were similar to those described by ROSERBERG, he feels that it was possible that ABEL was ROSERBERG's new contact. He said it appeared to him that ABEL was interested in technical information and that was the kind of information that ROSERBERG furnished. Further, that ABEL used microfilm to relay this information which was another thing that ROSERBERG did. GREENHASS further pointed out the time coincidence, in that ROSERBERG re-established contact with the Boviet at about the same time that ABEL is reported to have entered the United States, that is, in 1948. In conclusion, GREENGLASS pointed out that ABEL is reported to have had access to a sizeable amount of money, and noted that it was in 1948 that JULIUS ROSERBERG suddenly became "flush" after making recontact with the Soviet.

GREENGLASS said that it is for the reasons stated above he thought it worthy to mention his thoughts in the matter. He further advised after viewing the photographs of AEKL, that he is identical with the person pointed out to him as AEKL at the West Street Jail and, as previously stated, is totally unfamiliar to him.




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

On July 10, 1959,

Syracuse, New York, furnished information which reflected that the Syracuse Sobell Committee was effiliated with the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, 940 Broadway, New York 10, New York, and that the Syracuse Sobell Committee had been formed for five years.

A confidential source advised on May 31, 1963, that the Syracuse Sobell Committee was still in existence and that LILLIAN REINER was the titular head of this organization with ELSIE COHN continuing to function as Treasurer, and JANE ANDERSON and KLIZABETH ALLEN being Co-Secretaries of the Syracuse Sobell Committee.

Another confidential source advised on January 15, 1962, that the Syracuse, New York, Chapter was one of the affiliates of the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Eastern Region of the United States.

On May 31, 1963, another confidential source advised that the purposes and aims of the Syracuse Sobell Committee were, insofar as this source was concerned, the same as those of the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, namely, to continue the fight for the parole of Morton Sobell and to raise funds on his behalf to carry out this fight successfully.

Another confidential source advised as follows:

LILLIAN REINER was not known as a Communist Party member; but as Chairman of the American Lebor Party at Syracuse, New York, she worked closely with Communist Party members.


