Most of this page is devoted to correspondence of readers who express their political views or other slanted opinions.

The first letter is signed by J. G. from New York. It is entitled "Three Notorious Racists." It opens in these words "According to radio reports President EISENHOWER decided to name Senator WALTER GEORGE of Georgia as Ambassador of the United States to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, this politico-militaristic freak, the chief purpose of which is to rebuild HITLER's war machine for American taxpayers money."

In criticizing Senator GEORGE the correspondent writes that he was a "thorn in the side of President ROOSEVELT," and although he is officially a Democrat he has always worked with Republicans, and was always on the side of Germans, and that it was he who fought to save the life of the Nazi criminal Captain KURT DOERFLER. Senator GEORGE did this despite the protests on the part of the American citizens who remembered Malmedy, and the massacre of American soldiers taken prisoners by the Nazi troops led by Captain DOERFLER and General SEPP DIETRICH. The letter concludes with a comment that no American should envy Senator GEORGE, for as an Ambassador to NATO he will have to/the hands of many German criminals whose hands were dipped in the blood of American soldiers and unfortunate prisoners. Clever Republicans would rather give this job to a Democrat from Dixieland.

In this correspondence J. G. writes about Senator EASTLAND/who recently violently attacked the United States Supreme Court, particularly Chief Justice WARREN for the decision in the question of desegregation in the public schools, which meant equal rights for Negroes and white citizens of this country. This shameful attack of the Supreme Court and its Chief Justice by the racist Senator EASTLAND who depends upon his Ku Klux Klan electorate for his seniority position in the Senate to which he was elected regularly for a score of years," hardly needs a comment, writes J. G.

Senator EASTLAND was supported in this attack by the notorious Senator JOE McCARTHY who only a few years ago was the most popular demagogue, witch hunter, and to some extent television artist. This trio wants to be remembered by the American public even after a parade of their worst behavior before the world.

Another letter, unsigned, from New York, entitled "Mother in Defense of Her Son," tells about HORTON SOBELL's mother, - ROSE SOBELL traveling all over Europe to win support for an appeal to release her son who has been sentenced for 30 years in prison in Alcatraz. It tells about her visits in England, France, Italy and how she has been treated by leaders of those countries, etc.

The third correspondence on this page signed by L. P. from Detroit, Mich., is entitled "Bankrupts from Under the Emblem of 'Free Europe,' Disappointed." It tells about General ANTHONY C. McAULIFFE, commander of American troops in Europe, announcing liquidation of liberation EE force which was trained at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. These troops were supposed to be composed of Poles, Yugoslavs and other Slavs and were to be used to fight behind enemy's lines in Europe. Referring to Polish emigre political leaders as "bankrupts" the correspondent adds that their disappointment may be great, but General McAULIFFE's action is sound and good.

Short story from New York tells about "Fight For Justice For SOBELL." Professor STEPHEN LOVE, noted Polish-American Attorney and Professor of Law at Northwestern University, also Lord BERTRAND RUSSELL, famous British Philosopher and Mathematician, have expressed their convictions about the innocence of MORTON SOBELL who was sentenced to thirty years in prison at the trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

Mr. LOVE spoke at a public gathering on May 15, in Carnegie Hall in New York, a meeting which was arranged by the committee to obtain justice for MORTON SOBELL, - stated that the greatest tragedy in the case of SOBELL is that the United States refuses to review the trial. Professor LOVE was sure that if the case was reviewed by the Supreme Court flagrant violations of court procedures and insufficient evidence would have been uncovered.

Lord BERTRAND RUSSELL sent a message from England to the meeting expressing his conviction that the verdict was unjust and that the sentence is monstrously revengeful. He believes that the United States, in keeping with its good name, and that for the good of humanity in general, this injustice will be corrected and that an innocent person will be released soon.

A few weeks ago Attorney for SOBELL filed a petition in Federal Court for a new trial on the basis that the attorneys for the government knowingly have used fabricated documents and false testimony against SOBELL. Other speakers at the meeting was MORTON SOBELL's mother and JOHN AEXLEY who discussed in detail the testimony used against SOBELL and who stated that the attorneys for the government used perjurers as witnesses and that they have deceived the court and concealed the true evidence.

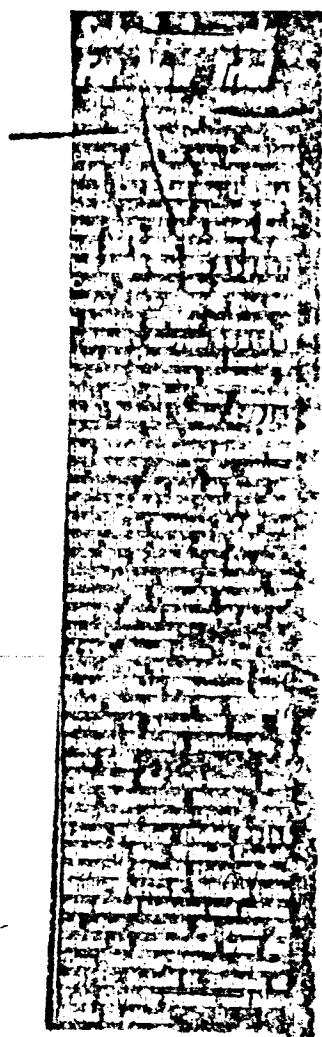

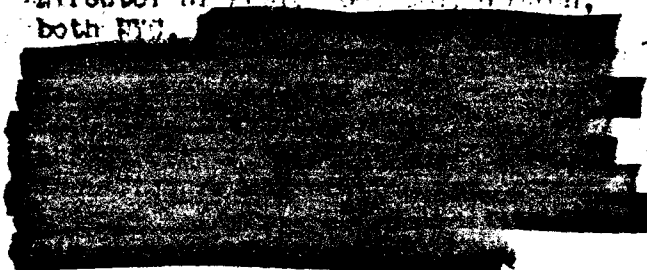
