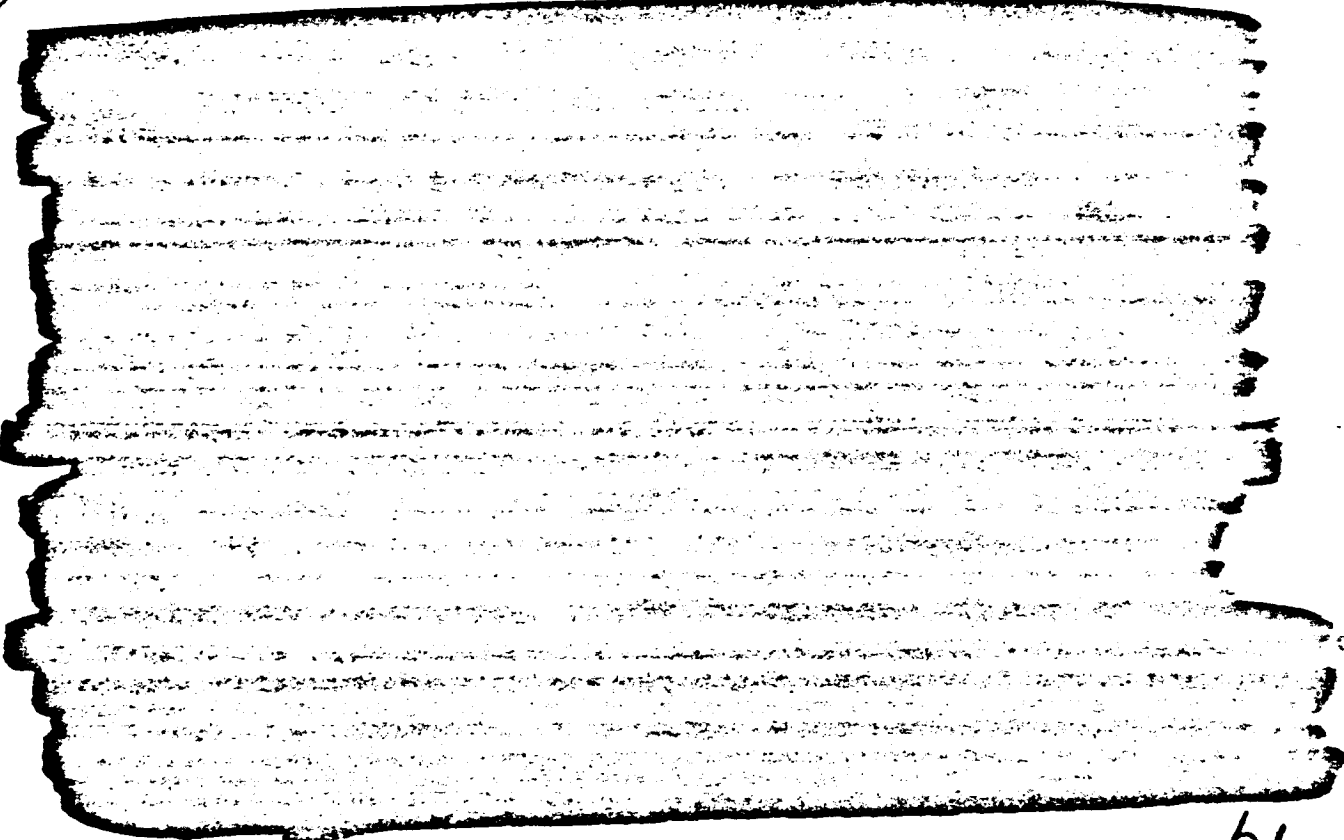



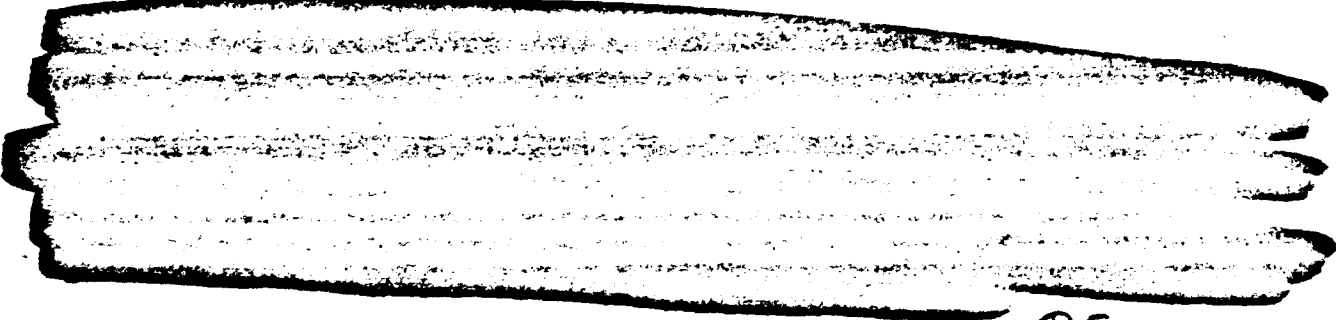

HARRY GOLD, self-confessed espionage agent, in July 1950 advised he had met ABRAHAM BROTHMAN on instructions of his Soviet superior, SEMEN SEMENOV in 1941. From then until sometime in 1944, GOLD stated BROTHMAN furnished him with technical information for transmission to the Soviet Union. GOLD stated MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ, a business associate of BROTHMAN, told him (GOLD) that it took a great deal of persuasion on the part of herself and NEEDLEMAN to convince BROTHMAN not to testify that he had furnished information to the Soviet Union.

IV.

On January 3, 1951, T-2, who is believed to be reliable, advised as follows:

While JULIUS ROSENBERG (convicted Soviet agent), and OSCAR VAGO, (awaiting trial on a perjury indictment) were in the Federal House of Detention, West Street, New York City, they had a discussion about HARRY GOLD (convicted Soviet agent) and ROSENBERG stated he believed "Gold is a counter-espionage agent and has been such since the beginning. Why else would he keep records of all transactions, maps, drawings, etc?" ROSENBERG continued in this vein for quite some time, explaining his theory and justifying it in full. Then he said, "I am going to get a message directly to the Chief about this and ask to have this entire matter investigated." Immediately after he made this statement VAGO asked, "Is _____ still sick?" ROSENBERG became furious and snapped, "Don't ask me questions like that." The informant stated the name VAGO used is pronounced like the name JIMMY except that in the place of the double "M" substitute one or two "b's". The informant does not know GIBBY NEEDLEMAN.

SA CLYDE E. MILLIGAN and SA JOSEPH F. DIFFLEY advised that Apartment 2C at 403 West 57th Street, New York City, has listed as occupants TYMON and S.W.N.

T-9 advised TYMON is DOROTHY TYMON, an employee of the Board of Education, P. S. 618, New York City.

PHILIP SCHOTTLER, the superintendent of the above address, advised SAS MILLIGAN and DIFFLEY on January 13, 1954 that DOROTHY TYMON left on a trip about one week previous to this date, leaving the telephone number of a relative in Forest

Hills that he could contact in the event of an emergency. TOM SWAN was unknown to PHILIP SCHOTTIER. (DOROTHY TYMON is the subject of a security investigation.)

TOM SWAN, alias SIMON SVENCHANSKY, operates the Goswan Products, Incorporated at Room 1701, 505 Fifth Avenue, New York City. The door of this room also lists the "Economy Club of America".

SWAN is 55 years old, Russian born, and entered the United States in 1923. Records of the County Clerk's Office show Goswan Products was incorporated in 1948. The directors, in addition to TOM SWAN, were LEO J. LHEVINNE and LEO H. KRYZAK. (KRYZAK is the husband of IDA KRYZAK, who is the sister of Communist Party fugitive WILLIAM NORMAN.)

TOM SWAN has a brother, SHURA SWAN. HARRY GOLD, convicted Soviet espionage agent, testified in the trial of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN that BROTHMAN was introduced into Soviet espionage by SHURA SWAN. The information about TOM SWAN and SHURA SWAN is attributed to T-10 and T-11, respectively. T-12 has advised that SHURA SWAN is described as the "less important Communist Party member" in comparison to his brother TOM.

In 1945 SAM BROWN purchased the Tempus Import Company, New York City from MARTIN YOUNG. Tempus Import Company was founded in 1944 by JOSEPH KATZ, who sold it to his brother-in-law MARTIN YOUNG. According to ELIZABETH BENTLEY, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, JOSEPH KATZ was her principal in Soviet espionage from October 1944 to May 1945. In February 1949, BROWN became associated with the Midland Export Company, 347 Madison Avenue, New York City (see BLANKENSTEIN re MIKE BURD).

On December 16, 1951, ELIZABETH BENTLEY advised SA LESTER O. GALLAGHER that she met BENJAMIN SEGAL in 1935 and he was a member of the Medical Advisory Board of the "Daily Worker". On January 24, 1954, T-8 advised Dr. BENJAMIN SEGAL contacted NEEDLEMAN to advise him of the birth of HANEN's baby. At this time NEEDLEMAN indicated he would pay any medical costs connected with this baby. On January 31, 1954, T-8 advised that a JACK (LNU) asked NEEDLEMAN for Mrs. HANEN's phone number and indicated that he and SID were going to pick her up at the hospital. At this time NEEDLEMAN gave JACK SAM BROWN's telephone number. The informant does not know the identities of these people.

ROSE ARENAL is the sister of Mrs. RITA SLEWICK, Mrs. SLEWICK'S wife.

On November 30, 1945, ELIZABETH BENTLEY in a statement advised the following:

Subsequent to March of 1939, BENTLEY was introduced by JACOB GOLOS to LEOPOLDO ARENAL. LEOPOLDO'S brother, LUIS ARENAL, was married to ROSE ARENAL. GOLOS told BENTLEY that LEOPOLDO in Mexico would send communications to ROSE ARENAL in Brooklyn, and BENTLEY was to pick these up and deliver them to GOLOS. From that time until November, 1939, BENTLEY contacted ROSE ARENAL about once a week to see if she had communications. BENTLEY states she believes she brought about 10 letters on separate occasions from ROSE ARENAL to GOLOS. These contacts stopped around the time LEON THOMAS'S chauffeur was murdered. ROSE'S husband, LUIS, was in Mexico at that time.

VII. REMARKS OF NATHAN WEYL, ELIZABETH BENTLEY
AND WHITTAKER CHAMBERS ABOUT THE ESTABLISHMENT
OF THE WASHINGTON, D.C. APPARATUS

NATHAN WEYL on October 17 and 19, 1950, advised SA'S MAURICE A. TAYLOR and LAMBERT G. ZANDER of the Washington Field Office that he was working in Washington, D.C. for the Government in June, 1933. WEYL was a Communist Party member from New York City and he advised the Party of his employment status. Shortly after June, 1933, he was contacted by HAROLD WARE and advised that an underground group of Communist Party members was being formed in Washington, D.C. WEYL stated that WARE was a capable Party member who was interested in agriculture and responsible for the agricultural policy of the Communist Party, USA.

WARE had previously been in charge of the largest cooperative farm in Russia. At the time of WARE'S contact of WEYL, WARE was operating an organization known as "Farm Research Bureau" and had offices in Washington, D.C. WARE was assisted in the Farm Research Bureau by ROBERT COE, LEIF DAHL and ROBERT HALL. LEM HARRIS was also connected with this organization.

WHITTAKER CHAMBERS who was attached to the Communist Party from 1934 to 1938 has stated that during the late 1930's J. PETERS conceived the idea of organizing underground groups which would furnish information to the Soviet intelligence services in exchange for money contributions. Accordingly, underground groups were planned at a conference between PETERS, CHAMBERS and HAROLD WARE. CHAMBERS acted as a courier between J. PETERS and WARE'S group in Washington, D.C.

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY in a signed statement, dated November 30, 1945, stated that around June or July, 1941, JAKE GOLOS began using her as an espionage courier for the collection of information from various individuals in Washington, D.C. and New York City, the majority of whom were employees of the United States Government or had sources therein. Her activities continued through 1944. She was placed in contact with two groups of individuals, each group functioning as a distinct Soviet espionage parallel, although investigations has since determined that certain individuals in the two parallels were socially acquainted with one another. These two espionage groups were known as the SILVERMASTER group and the PERLO group.

Each group or parallel consisted of about ten to fourteen persons. BENTLEY served as courier to some 15 individual not specifically connected with either espionage parallel but who individually furnished BENTLEY with information. Material BENTLEY collected was turned over to JAKE GOLOS until his death on November 27, 1943. Her principal after GOLOS' death was "JACK" and "BILL". ("JACK" being JOSEPH KATZ, previously described).

KAPLAN worked in Washington, D.C. holding a variety of Federal positions.

ELIZABETH BENTLEY in a signed statement, dated December 5, 1945, advised that in August, 1941, JAKE GOLOS advised her of several contacts with an underground group for Soviet espionage in Washington, D.C. and because of GOLOS' failing health, he asked her to come to Washington, D.C. and meet Mrs. HELEN WITTE SILVERMASTER.

In her statement and in an interview with SA LESTER O. GALLAGHER on March 21, 1952, BENTLEY advised that she became acquainted with the SILVERMASTERS in the latter part of 1941. She related that some time before early 1942, she learned that IRVING KAPLAN of the War Production Board was furnishing information to the SILVERMASTER group through ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN.

BENTLEY states she has never met KAPLAN but alleged he was a dues paying Communist Party member and at one time was associated with the PERLO group. BENTLEY stated that about this time (1941-1942) she was told about the so called PERLO group, stating that this was actually the underground Communist group organized in Washington, D.C. in the early 1930's which by the time of her association with the SILVERMASTER group, had fallen under the leadership of VICTOR PERLO.

BENTLEY stated that before SILVERMASTER came from the West Coast to Washington, D.C. in 1935 to work for the Government, he had been told by EARL BROWDER to "lay low". BROWDER allegedly stated SILVERMASTER was too valuable to become associated with any group. SILVERMASTER followed these instructions but being a natural organizer surrounded himself with people who were not attached to other Communist groups, such as HARRY DEXTER WHITE. Meantime, the PERLO group knew SILVERMASTER was a Communist and that the group he was collecting were Communists and they became jealous of SILVERMASTER'S group which they referred to as the California Group.

Refusal of the California Group to work with the PERLO group annoyed and puzzled PERLO group who could not understand why SILVERMASTER was forming this group. After June 21, 1941, when Germany attacked Russia, SILVERMASTER turned to EARL BROWDER who sent him to JAKE GOLOS. GOLOS told SILVERMASTER that this was the time to go to work. SILVERMASTER did.

BENTLEY stated someone in SILVERMASTER'S group knew IRVING KAPLAN personally. KAPLAN until this time was functioning as a member of the PERLO group. KAPLAN was contacted by the SILVERMASTER group and BENTLEY stated she was told that KAPLAN decided to give information to the SILVERMASTER group but that he continued to pay his Communist Party dues to the PERLO group. VICTOR PERLO told her after GOLOS' death (BENTLEY did not make contact with them before this) that IRVING KAPLAN was paying dues to the PERLO group but was not producing for this group. PERLO complained of the activities of the California group and BENTLEY stated she was pretty sure KAPLAN was working with this group.

Mrs. HELEN WITTE SILVERMASTER, wife of NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, on April 15, 1947, advised SA'S J. W. PARRISH and EDWARD L. GRANTT in Washington, D.C. that she knew IRVING KAPLAN on the West Coast prior to moving to Washington, D.C. in 1935.

Between December, 1944 and December, 1948, T-87 advised that the KAPLANS in Washington, D.C. and the NEEDLEMANS in New York City were in continuous and frequent contact in both cities as well as in Hampton Bay, Long Island, New York.

EDWARD J. FITZGERALD

FITZGERALD was born in 1911 in New York City and resides 335 West 11th Street, New York City. His wife REBECCA from whom he is separated resides at 74 Irving Place, New York City, with their daughter KAREN. FITZGERALD formerly was an employee of the United States Treasury and War Production Board.

FITZGERALD works as a free lance writer and reviews a considerable number of books for the "Saturday Review of Literature" and the "New York Herald Tribune" and the "New York Times", according to newspaper columnist, GEORGE SOLKOLSKY, as outlined in his column of May 18, 1953, in the "New York Journal American".

In November of 1945 ELIZABETH BENTLEY advised SAS THOMAS SPENSER and J. M. KELLY that approximately one or two months prior to JAKE GOLOS' death (November 27, 1943) she learned that GOLOS had recently made contact with an underground Communist Espionage group in Washington, D.C., which he considered very valuable. Through GOLOS, BENTLEY learned that he had been placed in contact with this group by EARL BROWDER, then National Chairman of the Communist Party, USA.

Early in 1944 BROWDER informed BENTLEY that he had made arrangements for her to meet the group that GOLOS had spoken of prior to his death. BENTLEY stated that in early 1944 on a specified date, she was then sent to the apartment of JOHN ABT on Central Park West near 90th Street, New York City. Here she met four men none of whom she had ever seen before. These men were VICTOR PERLO, ED FITZGERALD, HAROLD KRAMER and HARRY MAGDOFF. BENTLEY gathered from their general conversation that they were engaged in some sort of espionage for EARL BROWDER and that all were Communists.

After this initial contact BENTLEY met ED FITZGERALD on other occasions along with VICTOR PERLO. BENTLEY advised that FITZGERALD supplied information to her on four or five occasions which she, in turn, passed on to her principal. FITZGERALD at that time obtained his information from the War Production Board.

On April 15, 1947, FITZGERALD, during an interview, advised SAs DUDLEY DAYNE and CORTLAND J. JONES, both of Washington, D.C., that he was close to HARRY MAGDOFF; that he met him while working in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, with the National Research Project. He likewise advised that IRVING KAPLAN worked with them in the National Research Project. (FITZGERALD listed IRVING KAPLAN as his reference in the War Production Board.)

T-92 has advised that FITZGERALD was well acquainted with ALFRED VAN TASSEL, HARRY MAGDOFF and IRVING KAPLAN in Washington, D.C.

T-93 on November 9, 1953, advised that ED FITZGERALD is a very close friend of CAPPY (IRVING) KAPLAN.

(In connection with the National Research Project in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, it is noted that PHIL and OLGA FIELD likewise were employed at the NRP.)

VIRGINIUS FRANK COE

FRANK COE, as he is known, is an economist who now resides at Apartment 4C at 30 Charlton Street, New York City.

Beginning June, 1934, COE held various positions as an employee of the Federal Government and eventually succeeded HARRY DEXTER WHITE as the Director of the Division of Monetary Research, United States Treasury Department. FRANK COE was on a leave of absence from the Federal Government from September, 1934, to May, 1936, when he lectured at the University of Toronto in Canada and again from October of 1936 to May of 1939 when he worked for the Bankers Educational Association of Toronto.

On November 20, 1952, ELIZABETH BENTLEY advised SAs SIMON TULLAI and JOHN J. KEARNEY that she never met FRANK COE, but knew of him in early 1942 when COE supplied data to the SILVERMASTER group.

BENTLEY stated that sometime in the spring of 1943 she received information from JAKE GOLOS that SILVERMASTER or ULLMAN had met a Canadian who was a Communist and he wanted to know if he should attempt to get information

from the Canadian and bring it to the attention of GOLOS. BENTLEY could not recall the primary source of this information nor could she provide the name of the Canadian referred to except she thought it sounded like the name of a person involved in the Canadian spy trials.

WHITTAKER CHAMBERS advised that HAROLD WARE introduced him to ROBERT COE, who was close to HARRY DEXTER WHITE. FRANK COE, ROBERT'S brother, was, according to CHAMBERS, at McGill University in Canada and CHAMBERS heard of plans to bring FRANK COE from Canada back to Washington, D.O.

COE, who has received considerable newspaper publicity, was the subject of a publicized search in May, 1953, when the Special Senate Committee Inquiry, headed by Senator CARL E. MUNDT, sought to locate COE in May of 1953 to take testimony from him.

A United Press dispatch appearing in the New York "Daily News", May 30, 1953, stated that Mrs. COE told Senate Investigators her husband left their home in Arlington, Virginia, two months ago and that "nobody in the world knows where he is". (COE was missing in April and May, 1953.)

On June 3, 1953, COE gave himself up and agreed to appear before the above-mentioned Senate Committee. At the time of his appearance he stated he traveled to Canada entering at Niagara Falls, New York; that he visited Nassau, Cuba, and Mexico, and that he re-entered the United States at Laredo, Texas.

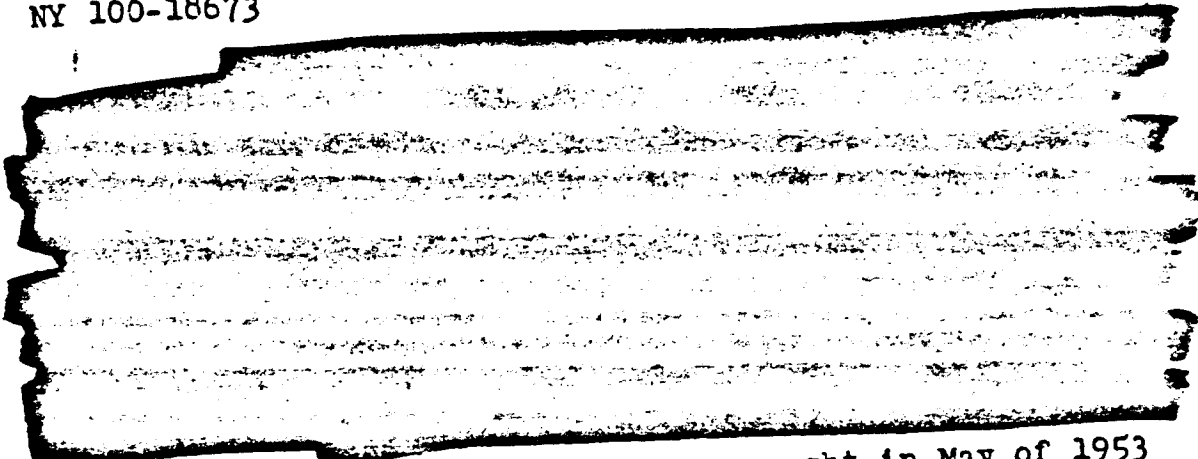

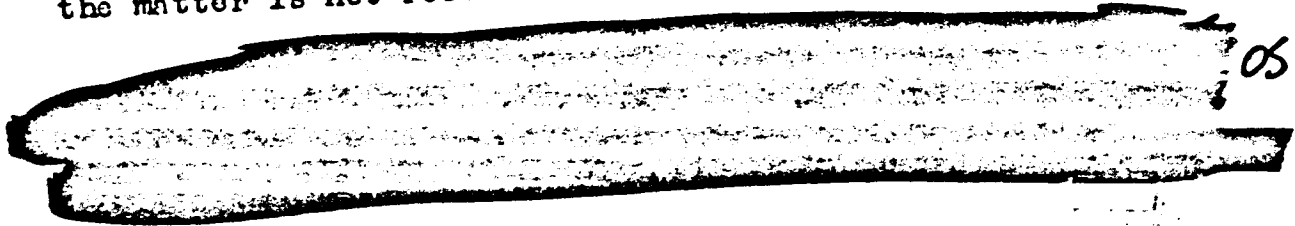
The reason COE was being sought in May of 1953 by the Special Senate Inquiry headed by Senator MUNDT was, according to the "New York Times" of October 21, 1953, as follows:

The Senate Committee was seeking the facts as to who caused the United States to turn over to the USSR engraving plates which allowed the Soviets to throw an estimated \$255,000,000 worth of supposed United States Military Marks into the economy of Germany, making them appear to be backed by the United States Treasury.

The "New York Times" under date of October 20, 1953, stated that FRANK COE, in his public testimony, testified that he went to the Treasury Department after the decision about these plates had already been made, but that he was in Government service at the time of the delivery of the plates.

In regard to BENTLEY's contention that FRANK COE became active in the Washington, D.C., apparatus through a Canadian, the following fact may be pertinent:

Considerable investigation has been conducted to attempt to ascertain COE'S Canadian apparatus contacts; yet the matter is not resolved.

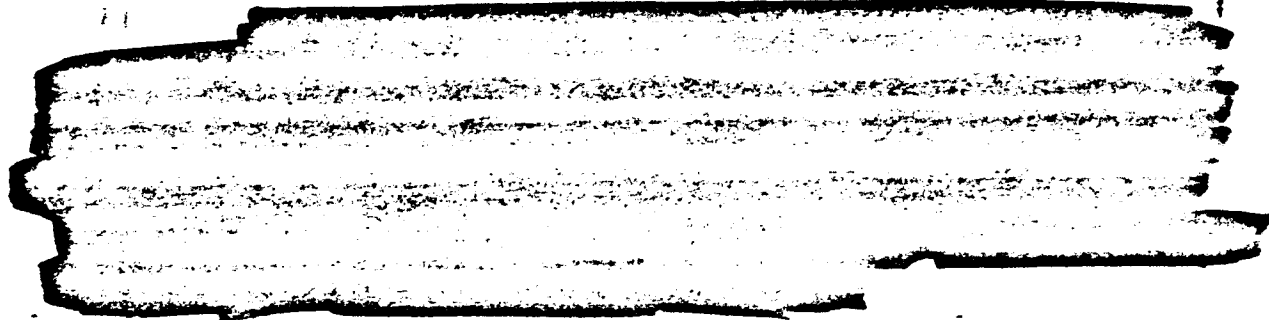

BENTLEY'S recollection that COE entered the Washington, D.C., apparatus through a Canadian and COE'S disappearance in April and May of 1953, COE'S stay at NEEDLEMAN'S apartment during the summer of 1953 and his travel to Toronto, Canada, and his purchase of an airline ticket at Nassau in the Bahamas on April 24, 1953, could mean that COE was in contact with SUKLOFF during his absences.

COE'S speech at the "Trial of Senator JOE MC CARTHY" in January, 1954, stresses that J. EDGAR HOOVER had not received any information about COE from Canadian authorities, and the only information concerning COE that was in the possession of the Canadian Government was that which had been submitted to Canada by HOOVER.

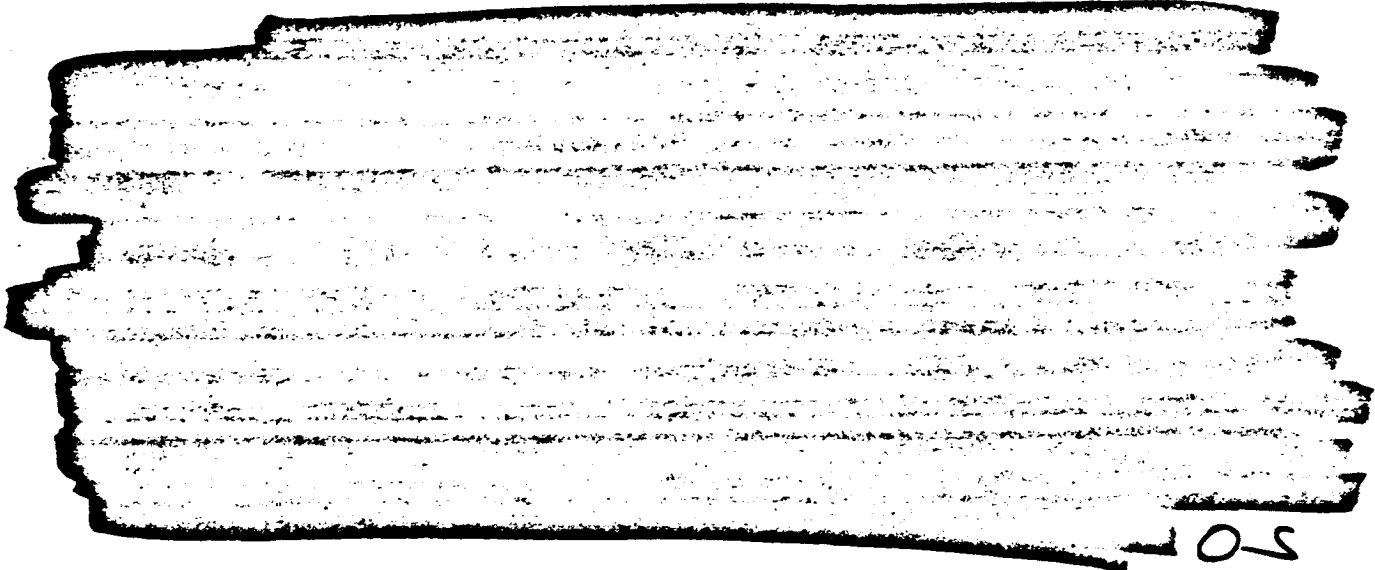
MAGDOFF, born in 1913 in New York City, resides at Apartment B at 68-62 136th Street, Flushing, Long Island, New York. He is married to BEATRICE GREIZER MAGDOFF and has two sons. MAGDOFF works as a marketing and counsel advisor and maintains an office at 340 East 13th Street, New York City. As set out in the information under EDWARD FITZGERALD, ELIZABETH BENTLEY first met MAGDOFF in early 1944 at the apartment of JOHN ABT. NATHAN WEYL, who has related the story of HAROLD WARE contacting him in Washington, D.C., to form an underground group of Communist Party members, has advised that he knew HARRY MAGDOFF when they both attended Columbia University in New York City prior to their going to work in Washington, D.C., for the Federal Government.

From September, 1932, to August, 1934, MAGDOFF was employed by the Premier Painting Company, 125 West 101st Street, New York City. It is noted that SAM BROWN was operating as the Premier Painting Company at 1133 Broadway, New York City, until October, 1952. The details as to both companies being one and the same are not available since T-30 advised on May 24, 1954, that documentary information about the Premier Painting Company is either lost or destroyed. This informant has advised, however, that as of August 5, 1943, the Premier Painting Company was located at 72 West 93rd Street, New York City.

In 1945 BROWN purchased the Tempest Import Company from MARTIN YOUNG. MARTIN YOUNG was the brother-in-law of JOSEPH KATZ who founded the Tempest Import Company in 1944. JOSEPH KATZ was ELIZABETH BENTLEY'S

principal from October, 1944, to May of 1945 as he replaced JAKE GOLOS after GOLOS' death. It is noted that BENTLEY has stated that information she received from the PERLO group, of which MAGDOFF was a member, was passed to KATZ after GOLOS' death.





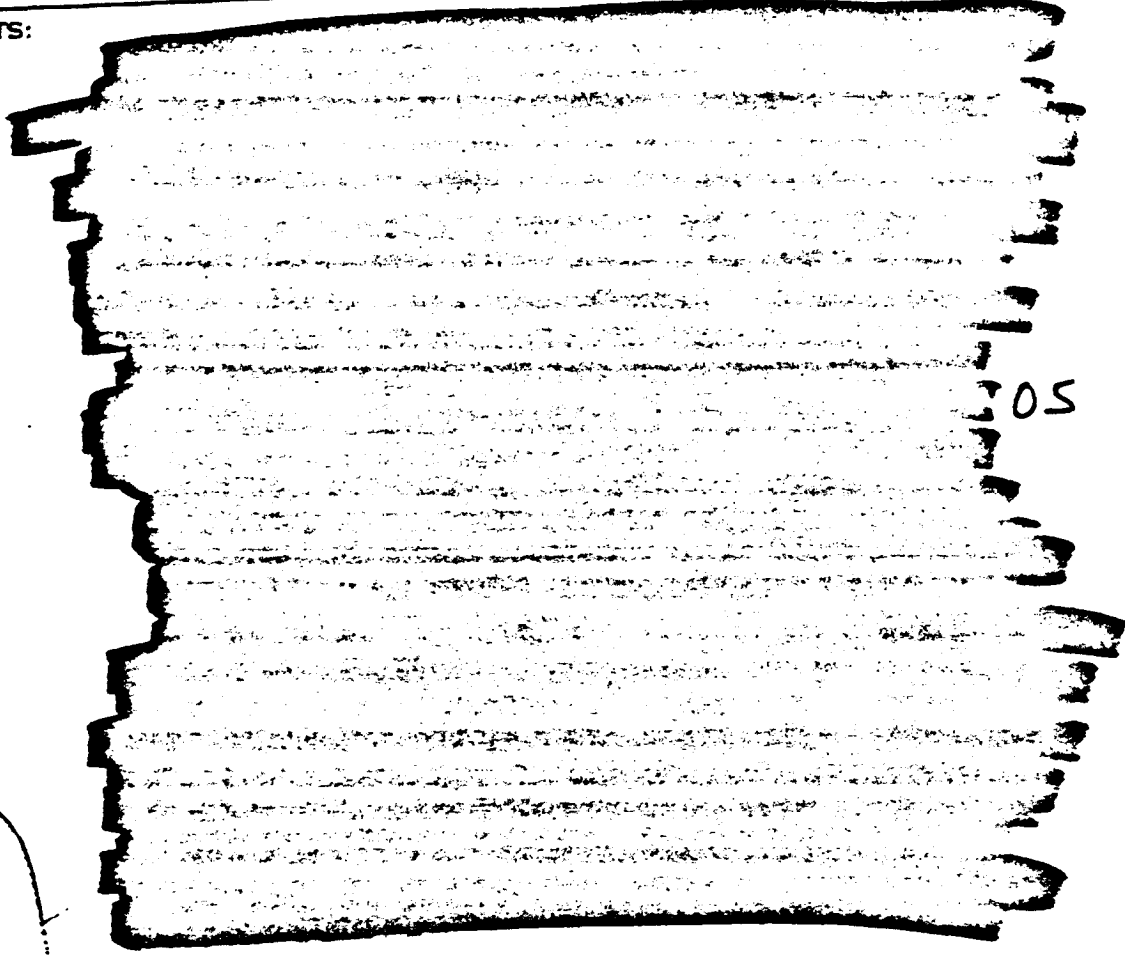

On 11/26/52, SAs HARRY C. O'CONNELL and CHARLES L. SMITH interviewed Mr. J. MURRAY, renting agent at Knickerbocker Village, 10 Monroe St., NY, NY. Present during the interview was Mrs. LUCILLE MARBLE, Mr. MURRAY'S secretary.

Mrs. IRVING GOFF, wife of the subject and her two children reside at 10 Monroe St. in Knickerbocker Village and it was believed advisable to contact Mr. MURRAY for information concerning other tenants living on the same floor as Mrs. GOFF with a view towards developing a source of information there concerning her.

Mr. MURRAY furnished the following information concerning tenants of that floor:

His wife was formerly employed at the United Service for New Americans as of 1951 which organization is located at 15 Park Row, NY, NY, and prior to that she was employed for three years up until 1947 by the China Aid Council, 1790 Broadway, NY, NY. Mr. DARIEN has advised Knickerbocker Village that he was formerly known as JOSEPH SCHUL which name he had changed in 1943. He was reported to have been employed at one time by Leather Exchange at 193 Williams St., NY, NY.

With regard to HELEN DARIEN, Confidential Informant NY-426-S advised on 10/7/47 that HELEN DARIEN of 10 Monroe St., NY, NY was then treasurer of a Communist Party Club in NYC.
