SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

On April 19, 1953, Polish Ambassador ROZER WINIENICZ delivered an address before a reported gathering of four hundred persons at Manhattan Center, New York City, for a rally sponsored by United Committee to commemorate the Tenth Anniversary of the Warsaw Uprising.

On April 22, 1953, actual press release stating Poland was ready to grant asylum to JULIUS and EUGENIE SCHUBERT, convicted espionage agents. Polish Embassy National Liberation Day Celebration of July 22, 1953, was reportedly attended by approximately four hundred and fifty persons.

In connection with other press releases issued by the Polish Embassy, Washington T-9 made available a press release dated June 16, 1953, entitled "POLAND IS READY TO GRANT ASYLUM TO THE ROSENBERGS." This press release stated as follows:

"The Executive Board of the Polish Red Cross has directed an appeal to the Government of the Polish People's Republic requesting that, in accordance with article 75 of the

"Constitution of the Polish People's Republic, it grant asylum to Julius and Ethel Rosenberg under sentence of death in the United States.

"The Government of the Polish People's Republic, guided by humanitarian considerations, decided to meet the request of the Polish Red Cross and to grant the right of residence in Poland to the Rosenbergs in the event the Government of the United States would permit them to leave the territory of the United States.

"The Polish Foreign Minister, Dr. Stanislaw Skrzyszewski, on June 15 presented a note to this effect to Mr. Joseph Flack, the United States Ambassador in Warsaw."

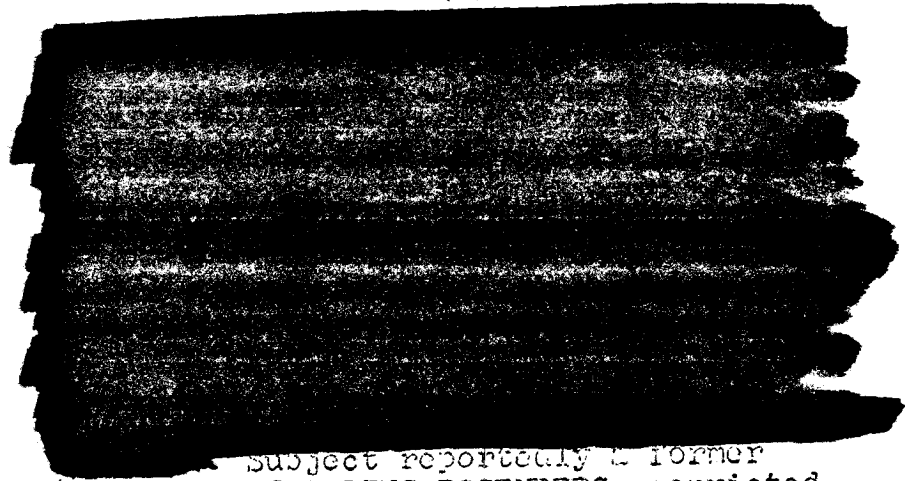

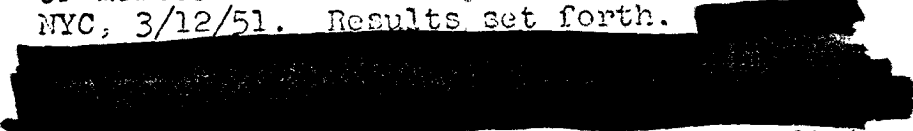

DETAILS:

This case is predicated on information furnished by one MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, 6706 Carnegie Avenue; Cleveland, Ohio, an admitted former member of the Young Communist League, and an admitted member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

MICHAEL SIDOROVICH advised that he worked with JULIUS ROSENBERG, ARTHUR SPRIGMAN and MARK PAGE at Williams Aero Research Company, New York City, 1939. He further stated that he considered both PAGE and SPRIGMAN as being followers of the Communist Party line. SIDOROVICH also stated that he and ARTHUR SPRIGMAN attended a course given by the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, and that JULIUS ROSENBERG was the Director of the course. SIDOROVICH also stated that he was acquainted with SPRIGMAN when he, SIDOROVICH, was formerly living in New York City. Both MICHAEL SIDOROVICH and his wife ANNE, have admitted being friends of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. DAVID GREENGLASS, self-admitted Soviet espionage agent, and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG told them that ANNE SIDOROVICH would act as a courier in obtaining information from DAVID GREENGLASS concerning the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico.

The Young Communist League and the Abraham Lincoln Brigade have been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, along with one MORTON SOBELL, were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage on March 29, 1951, United States District Court, Southern District of New York.

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 78th Congress, 2nd Session on H. Res. 282, listed the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians as a Communist front.

ARTHUR SPRIGMAN was interviewed at the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on the evening of March 12, 1951, by Special Agents RICHARD A. MINIHAN and ROBERT F. ROYAL. At the outset of the interview, it was explained to SPRIGMAN that his appearance was voluntary and that he did not have to furnish a statement; that he had the right to consult legal counsel, and that anything he might say could be used against him in a court of law. Mr. SPRIGMAN stated that he would be happy to furnish any information, and that he felt it was a duty on his part in view of the opportunities this country had given him and that he was in the process of acquiring United States citizenship. ARTHUR SPRIGMAN furnished the following information concerning his associations with JULIUS ROSENBERG:

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His first recollection of ROSENBERG was meeting him in approximately 1938 in the offices of the FAECT on 16th Street near Third Avenue, New York City, at which time they were both members and scheduled to attend some aeronautical courses to be taught by a Mr. WILLIAMS. He recalled that he attended a few of these classes taught by Mr. WILLIAMS, but lost his interest as he considered Mr. WILLIAMS "a fraud". Mr. SPRIGMAN could not recall the first name of Mr. WILLIAMS, but stated that he had been an aviator in the Spanish Civil War. ✓

According to SPRIGMAN, in approximately 1938, JULIUS ROSENBERG contacted him about joining Williams Aero or Aviation Research Company, which according to SPRIGMAN, was a corporation formed to do aeronautical research work. SPRIGMAN stated he was designated as Chief Engineer and was to be compensated for his work. However, he never received any compensation and the corporation lasted only a short period of time, possibly three or four weeks. SPRIGMAN said that he worked spare time for WILLIAMS in this venture. SPRIGMAN stated that the only other member of the group was an individual named MARK. The last name he could not recall. The name MARK PAGE was suggested to ARTHUR SPRIGMAN, and he stated that it was the name of the individual associated with him at Williams Aero Research Company. SPRIGMAN subsequently selected a photograph of MARK PAGE, was., Marcus Pogarsky, from a group of photos and stated that this was the individual known to him as MARK PAGE.

ARTHUR SPRIGMAN recalled that he had met JULIUS ROSENBERG's wife, ETHEL GREENGLASS ROSENBERG, at ETHEL's home prior to their marriage and that he recalls that DAVID GREENGLASS was present. He stated he recalled playing the piano on this occasion and that ETHEL ROSENBERG was singing. In 1939, SPRIGMAN stated he was

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invited to the ROSENBERG wedding, but did not attend. He said that the next time he met ROSENBERG was at the Jefferson Travis Corporation, where he, SPRIGMAN, was employed and JULIUS ROSENBERG was a Government Inspector. SPRIGMAN added that he has not seen ROSENBERG since he left the Jefferson Travis Corporation.

Concerning ROSENBERG, SPRIGMAN stated that he never knew him to be a member of the Communist Party but from conversations with him, would state that ROSENBERG propounded Communist philosophies. He added that ROSENBERG was confused about Communist philosophy and on some occasions would be propounding reactionary theories, thinking he was talking Communism. SPRIGMAN said that he was able to recognize this fact, as he had done some considerable reading in Canada about Communism.

While at the Jefferson Travis Corporation, SPRIGMAN said that he had gone to JULIUS ROSENBERG and asked him to help him induce other employees to form a union and associate themselves with the FAECT. He stated that he had also complained to ROSENBERG that some of the employees were pro-Nazi and not interested in helping our Russian allies. According to SPRIGMAN, ROSENBERG told him that neither of these items was any of his, ROSENBERG's, business. SPRIGMAN said that he thought ROSENBERG had gone "sour". SPRIGMAN stated that ROSENBERG never at any time requested him to participate in Communist or espionage activities and that during the time both were employed at the Jefferson Travis Corporation, JULIUS ROSENBERG had access to anything he wanted and it would not have been necessary for him to ask anyone.

Concerning MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, ARTHUR SPRIGMAN stated that he recalled him as a roomer in the same apartment on East 19th Street, New York City, where he roomed in the late 1930's. SPRIGMAN recalled that he was working on the WPA at the Police Department at that

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time and thought MICHAEL SIDOROVICH was attending Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute. He recalled that MICHAEL SIDOROVICH had left the United States to fight in the Spanish Civil War, but knew of nothing else concerning him. He stated that he did not know that SIDOROVICH and ROSENBERG were acquainted with each other, but recalled that he had borrowed a New York Public Library Card from MICHAEL SIDOROVICH in 1938 or 1939, and that in 1941 or 1942, while at the Jefferson Travis Company, JULIUS ROSENBERG asked him in behalf of MICHAEL SIDOROVICH to return it. It was SPRIGMAN's recollection that he returned it at that time. SPRIGMAN stated that he has no recollection of seeing MICHAEL SIDOROVICH since 1939, and that he did not recall MICHAEL SIDOROVICH attending the PAECT course with JULIUS ROSENBERG and himself. He said he did not know whether MICHAEL SIDOROVICH knew PAUL WILLIAMS, and that he did not recall MICHAEL SIDOROVICH being a member of the Communist Party or the Young Communist League. He said he did, however, recall him making broad general statements favoring Communism. SPRIGMAN stated that he did not know ANNE SIDOROVICH.

Concerning JOSEPH E. CICIERSKA, 231 East 13th Street, New York City, ARTHUR SPRIGMAN stated he recalled him also as a roomer at East 19th Street rooming house at the time he and MICHAEL SIDOROVICH roomed there. He said he recalled giving JOE CICIERSKA access to his room as it was heated and CICIERSKA's room was unheated. Furthermore, he, SPRIGMAN, got CICIERSKA a job at the Jefferson Travis Corporation. He stated he never knew CICIERSKA very well, but recently met him by chance at the Emerson Radio Corporation, Eighth Avenue, New York City, where CICIERSKA is presently employed. He said that he had not seen CICIERSKA since he left the Travis Corporation in approximately 1942. SPRIGMAN stated that he never knew or heard of any Communist affiliations on the part of JOSEPH CICIERSKA.

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Concerning MARK PAGE, SPRIGMAN stated that he last saw him in 1938 or 1939, and outside of the course they talked at the FAECT with JULIUS ROSENBERG and their association at Williams Aero Research Company, he has no other information. He recalled meeting PAGE's wife, STELLA, on one occasion somewhere and heard that the ROSENBERGS were living with the PAGES on some later date, but outside of this, knew nothing else concerning PAGE.

ARTHUR SPRIGMAN stated that he never was prominent in the FAECT and never detected any official Communist activities there. He stated he was only active in the FAECT for about five months in 1938. SPRIGMAN said he was never asked by anyone to engage in espionage or any subversive activities at any time.

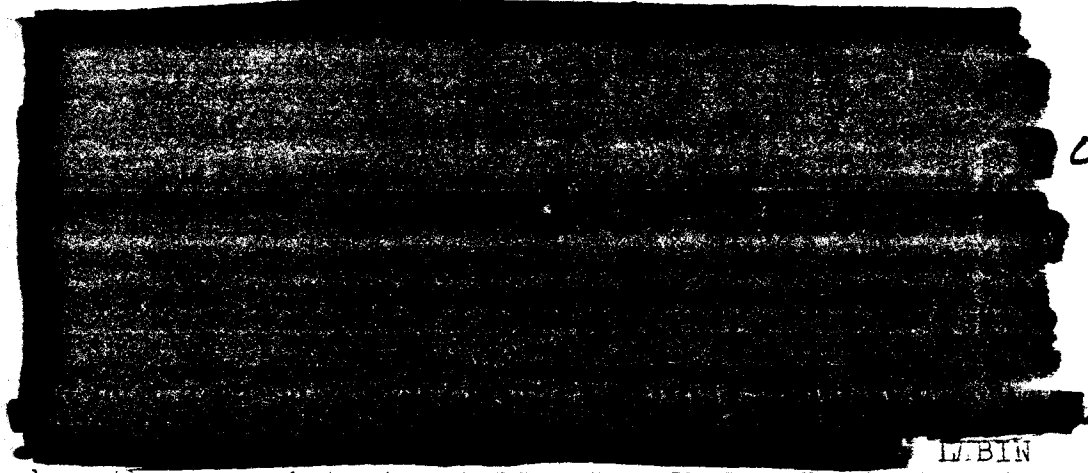

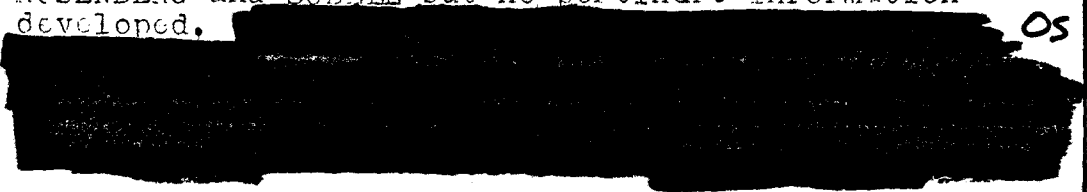

T-2 said that LABIN had three chief assistants whom he identified as follows: DONALD D. GRIEG, EVERT MANUEL OSTLUND and NORMAN HUGH YOUNG, Jr. T-2 said that these three persons appear to be close friends of LABIN not only at FTL but also socially. The informant was not able to provide information relating to the extent of the social relationship.

SA WILLIAM R. YATES checked the records of the College of the City of New York, where it was learned that DONALD D. GRIEG had been a classmate in 1939 of JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL, convicted Soviet agents. GRIEG was interviewed by Bureau Agents in connection with the above investigation but no information considered pertinent was developed from these interviews.

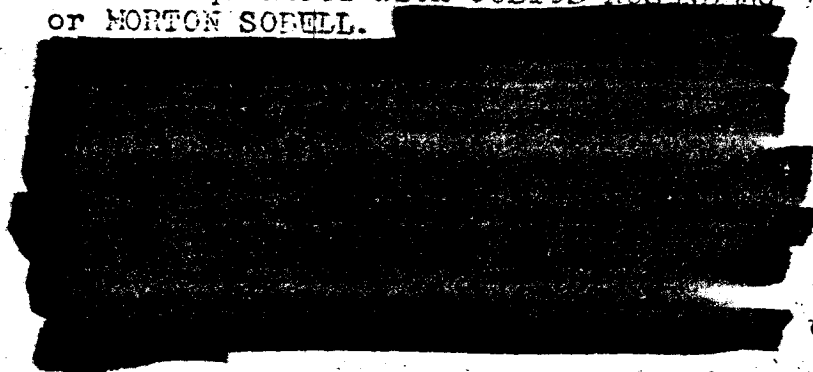

All of these individuals advised that the subject was unknown to them and that they had no information in their possession which would indicate that GRIEG was acquainted with ROSENBERG or SOBELL while at the College of the City of New York or any time prior to or thereafter.

RUTH GREENGLASS, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent who was interviewed by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON on February 4, 1952.

MAX ELITCHER, an admitted former member of the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., from the latter part of 1938 to August, 1948. ELITCHER was contacted by JULIUS ROSENBERG with the intention of recruiting ELITCHER into Soviet espionage work. ELITCHER was also a classmate of ROSENBERG and SOBELL at the College of the City of New York. He was interviewed by SA VINCENT J. CAHILL on February 11, 1952.

NATHAN SUSSMAN, an admitted former member of the Young Communist League at the College of the City of New York and of the Communist Party in New York City. He was interviewed by SA RICHARD A. MINIHAN and SA ROBERT F. ROYAL on March 5, 1952.

A. THEODORE MANZAVINOS, who attended the College of the City of New York during the same period as the subject, ROSENBERG, and SOBELL. He currently operates the Telco Electronics Company, 37 East 18th Street, New York City, where SUSSMAN is currently employed. He was interviewed by the writer on March 6, 1952.

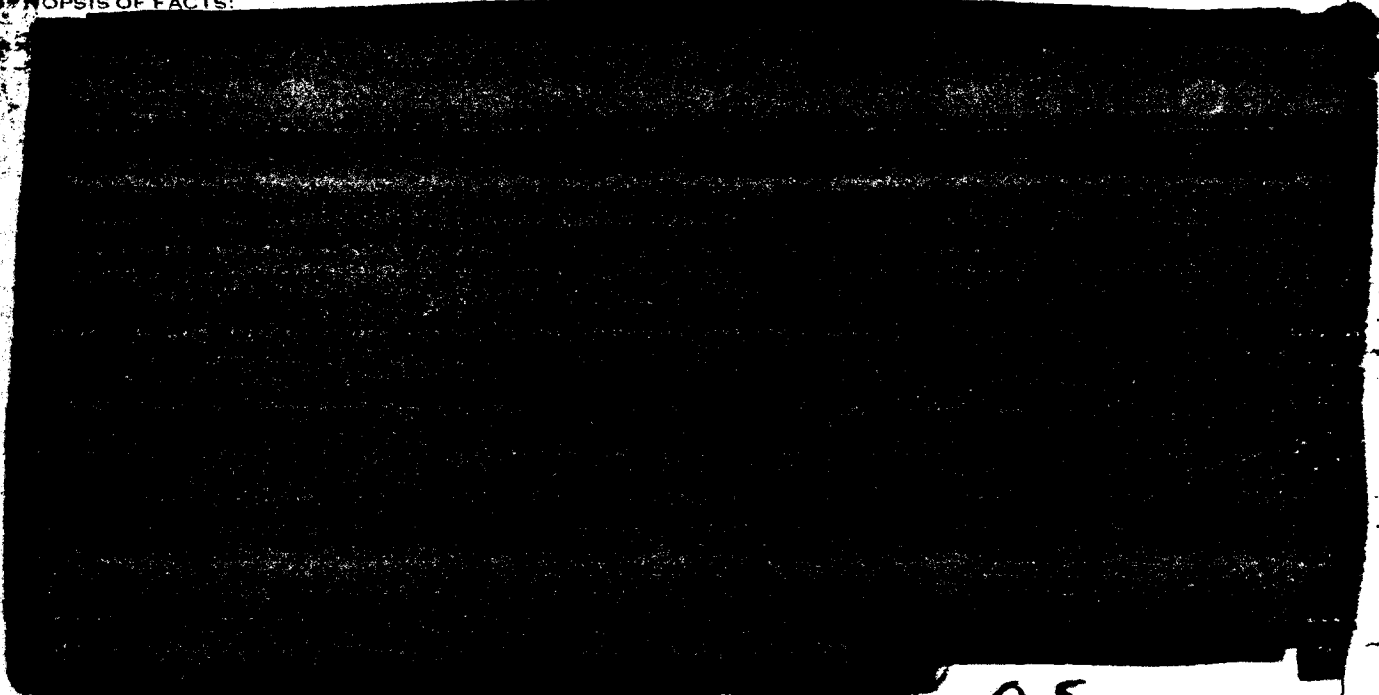
