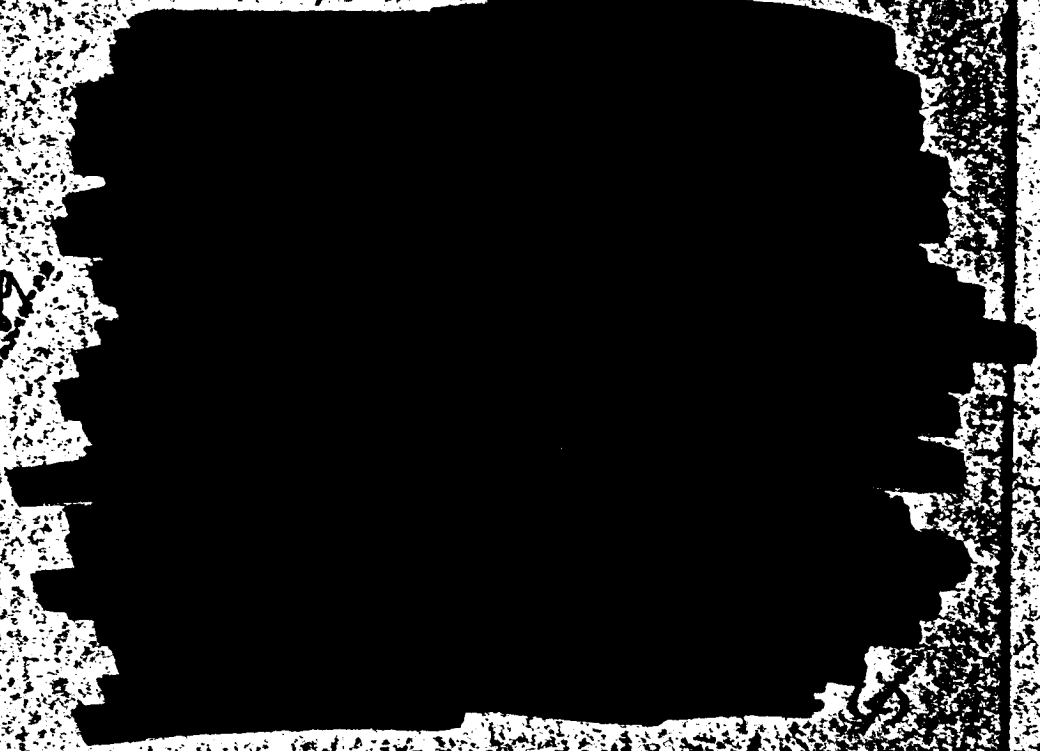

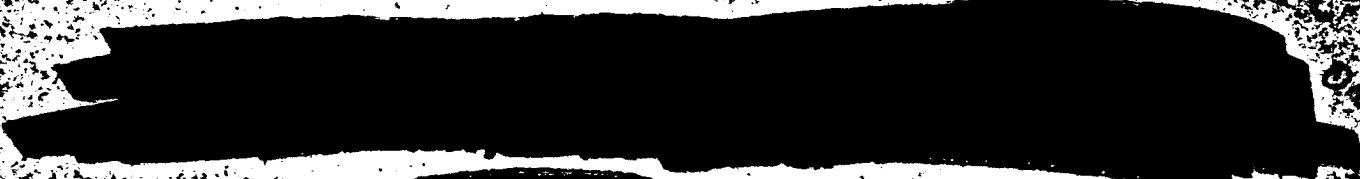

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was indicted on September 29, 1950 by a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York for obstruction of justice in furnishing false information as to his relationship with HARRY GOLD, a self-confessed Soviet espionage agent.

MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ, previously mentioned, was also indicted on September 29, 1950 by a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York for obstruction of justice in furnishing false information regarding the relationship of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and HARRY GOLD.

On November 30, 1945 ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY furnished information concerning one HARNEY SCHUSTER, who was connected with the financial division of the Communist Party, and whose party name was CHESTER. She stated that SCHUSTER was a social acquaintance of JACOB GOLOS, and with his wife had visited GOLOS in the latter's office. On one occasion SCHUSTER inquired how GREGORY SILVERMASTER was and indicated he was familiar with SILVERMASTER and others who were doing the same type of work as SILVERMASTER.

BENTLEY advised that while SCHUSTER was irritated over the manner in which some of the Communist Party members had been taken away from the party, and subsequently returned in an extremely nervous state, he agreed to cooperate with BENTLEY in furnishing people whom he thought would be sufficient in character to stand the type of work in which they were to engage.

Investigation of SCHUSTER reflects that he entered Mexico on November 25, 1944 and returned to the United States on December 20, 1944. Referenced Bureau letter requested that the New York Office furnish photographs of SCHUSTER and MAE MILLER to the Philadelphia Office to be displayed to HARRY GOLD. It was requested that the New York Office display these photographs to DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS, MAX ELITCHER, and others interviewed in connection with the JULIUS ROSENBERG case.

Philadelphia letter dated November 9, 1950 reflected that HARRY GOLD was then located in the New York Division and requested that the aforementioned photographs of SCHUSTER and MAE MILLER be displayed to GOLD at New York City.

DAVID GREENGLASS, Inmate, U. S. Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pa., was interviewed and a photograph of subject was exhibited to him by SA WAYNE G. HUNT on 6/10/54, for the purpose of ascertaining whether subject is identical to ROSENBERG's friend, CHESTER, previously described by GREENGLASS. At this time, GREENGLASS advised that he was almost positive that subject is not identical to CHESTER but desired to view additional photographs of subject.

Additional photographs of subject were exhibited to GREENGLASS on 6/25/54, and he stated subject is definitely not identical to CHESTER. He stated the possibility exists that subject may be identical to another individual, known unknown to him, who also was a piano player and visited the apartment of his mother in New York City in the late thirties. He said this individual resembles the subject in some respect according to his memory, but stated since there has been such a lapse in time since he saw this unknown individual, he could not make a positive identification.

GREENGLASS advised that this unknown individual, who later worked with ROSENBERG in the Cone Engineering Company in 1938 or 1939, was introduced to him by ROSENBERG as a "good boy", which according to GREENGLASS probably meant that he was a Communist. GREENGLASS advised that this unknown individual came to the apartment located at 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, on several occasions with CHESTER, SUSMAN, JACK and others. He stated he saw him at the Cone Engineering Company later working on a gear box which ROSENBERG later advised was a gear to drive a wind tunnel machine for the purpose of testing a model airplane.

GREENGLASS stated ROSENBERG later advised him that this unidentified individual was from Canada and had served time for forgery in Canada and was a Trotskyite. According to GREENGLASS, the fact that ROSENBERG found out that this individual was a Trotskyite was the reason ROSENBERG broke relations with him.

GREENGLASS further advised that the subject answers the description of this unidentified individual as to age, height, shape of nose, hairline and features in the face.

"SAVE THE ROSENBERGS' LIVES

"The broad masses of the American public have been deeply moved by the decision of the Supreme Court refusing to consider the appeal of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG condemned to death on charges of betraying 'atom secrets' to the Soviet Union.

"The American public knows that in other countries - for example, in England and Canada where there were espionage trials too - there was no verdict of death brought against the defendants. Thus the prominent scientist FUCHS was sentenced in England to 14 years of imprisonment. The American public likewise knows that in the United States the Nazi spies sent by HITLER during the war were sentenced only to a comparatively short jail term.

"Nor was there ever an instance in the history of the United States when a death sentence in peacetime was given on charges of espionage. No one, moreover, can deny that the trial of the ROSENBERGS was conducted in an atmosphere of war hysteria.

"It is then no wonder that the above-mentioned decision of the Supreme Court has deeply stirred the broad strata of the American public. And this public decided to continue most energetically the fight to save the ROSENBERGS from the threatening death sentence.

"The Progressive Party candidate for United States president - VINCENT HALLINAN - characterized the Supreme Court decision as the 'verdict of the cold war.' HALLINAN requested President TRUMAN and Attorney General McGRANERY to have the ROSENBERG case reviewed by the Supreme Court. In this connection HALLINAN stated: 'The duty of the court to accept this case for review is emphasized by the fact that for the first time in our history a death sentence was pronounced for an alleged act of espionage in peacetime. What is more, the refusal of the court...' (Rest of sentence garbled.) This very same thing is emphasized in the statement of the Civil Rights Congress where it is shown that the fight to save the lives of the ROSENBERGS should be embraced by all the strata of the American public. The Civil Rights Congress suggests taking the following measures:

"Delegations should call on the national committees of the major parties. Delegations and telegrams should be directed to the President requesting pardon. Not a minute must be lost. The ROSENBERGS may be executed in the next 30 days. A determined campaign to save them is of extreme urgency."

"The public is aroused. Throughout the country, mass meetings of people are being organized accordingly, regardless of party affiliations, regardless of religious beliefs. At these meetings, people get acquainted with the ROSENBERG case, with the circumstances under which the case was tried, and with measures to be adopted for the saving of the ROSENBERGS, condemned to death.

"The broad masses of the American public are already responding in due manner to the call to fight for the saving of the lives of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. The fight to save them will be continued in the most energetic manner. This is dictated by considerations of humanity. This is required by the conscience of the American nation. This is required by the good name of America throughout the world."

"The meeting is arranged at the initiative of the 'Civil Rights Congress,' appealing to everyone to whom justice is dear to come to that meeting.

"Tomorrow, Wednesday, October 22nd, a large meeting to save the ROSENBERGS from death sentence will be held at the Premier Palace, 505 Sutter Ave., Brooklyn.

"Another meeting to save the ROSENBERGS, will be held on Thursday, October 23rd, in Huntspoint Palace in the Bronx. At the meeting the speaker will be the secretary of the National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS, DAVID ALTMAN."

Atom Board Head Envisions Need Of Easing Security on the Bomb

Says Time May Come When It May Be Wise to Reveal Size and Shape—Points to Mountainous Task of Secrecy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20—Klaus Fuchs, the British atomic scientist who turned over valuable information to the Soviet Union, advanced Russian atomic bomb research to two years, according to Gordon Dean, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission.

Mr. Dean's views were published today by the weekly news magazine U. S. News and World Report in the second and concluding section of an interview.

Fuchs has been convicted in Great Britain and is serving a fourteen-year prison term.

Mr. Dean declared that the security requirements in atomic energy plants were presenting a mountainous task and that the time might come when it would be wise to revise present security restrictions even to the point where the size and shape of the bomb could be disclosed publicly.

"I think we are at a place where

owes his allegiance to nothing that ordinary humans owe theirs to. He is going to make his own decisions regardless of any rules he purports to operate under.

150 Can Make Bomb

"What do you do in a man like that? Usually he is a very intelligent man. He is an independent man. He is an idealist of some kind. He might be a Communist-idealist, but he is a man of ideals of some kind. You don't usually spot this type in a check."

Mr. Dean was questioned on the number of persons who had access to vital atomic secrets. He said that the number of persons who would know how to make an atomic bomb if they had all the materials was not more than 150.

He asserted that "the time may come when as many as 300,000 or 400,000 people must know things at the operational level to have real readiness."

DETAILS:

I. ESPIONAGE

- A. HARRY GOLD, with aliases: Henry Gold, Henrich Gold, Henrich Goldnitzki, Henrich Golodnitsky, Frank Keppler, Frank Kessler, "Raymond".

HARRY GOLD was arrested in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on May 23, 1950, for violation of the espionage statutes. He has admitted receiving information concerning atomic energy and fissionable material from Dr. EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS in 1944 and 1945 at Cambridge and Boston, Massachusetts, New York City, and Santa Fe, New Mexico. GOLD has identified ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV, former Assistant Consul General of the Russian Consulate in New York, as his Soviet superior to whom he turned over information received by him from FUCHS. Prosecution of GOLD is pending.

- B. DAVID GREENGLASS, with aliases: Dave Greenglass, David Green, David Greene.

GREENGLASS was arrested at New York City on June 16, 1950, for violation of the espionage statute. He has admitted turning over to HARRY GOLD in June 1945 information pertaining to the operation of the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratories at Los Alamos, New Mexico. The prosecution of GREENGLASS is pending.

II. COMMUNIST INFILTRATION

Investigation of applicants and employees of atomic energy installations has failed to reveal any pattern or plan indicating a coordinated attempt to infiltrate atomic energy installations with Communists. It has been ascertained, however, that in some cases such applicants and employees have been in some manner connected with the Communist Party, Communist front organizations, or Communist sympathizers.

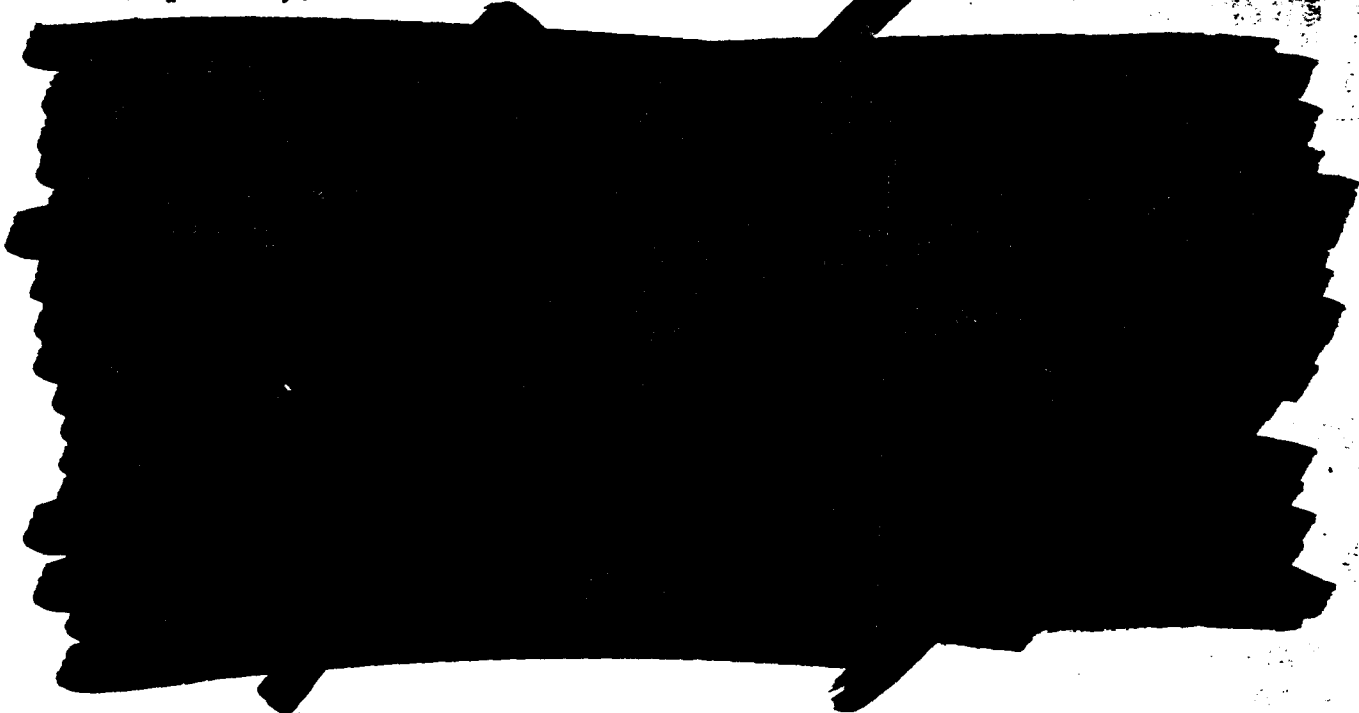

In November of the same year, Katherina's father (a Communist) and her mother were living in England in 1940.

The assumption to be drawn from these seven points, plus the consideration of the published materials of the House Committee on Un-American Activities and the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, is that the United States has never had any atomic secrets not known to the Soviet Government, even the major facts passed to the latter by Fuchs and possibly duplicated through other unknown channels needed to be supplemented by the reports of many specialists in different areas. In such a highly complex enterprise as the development and production of the atomic bomb, it is obvious that not even one with the knowledge of Dr. Oppenheimer or Fuchs would have or could ever remember all of the intricate production details directed by scores of subordinates.

I do not mean to imply that even half of the fifty Communists working on the atomic projects were involved in espionage for the Soviet Union. The smallest possible numbers are most directly responsible for actual theft of confidential information. But the whole party organization played a role in it, and not one "politically developed" Communist could have been ignorant of the real objectives. In most cases, it would be a matter of trying to get other Communists into the projects, promote themselves when in preference to others, and always praise and seek to advance their superiors who were party members. And we must not forget that at that time the United States and the Soviet Union were allies in the war against Germany. Therefore the Communists in the atomic projects would be hard workers -- doing everything they could to help perfect the bomb in the shortest possible time. Usually these Communists had two objectives.

First, to perfect the bomb for use against Germany. Second, to see that all available vital data on that project be passed to the Soviet Government so that it would have every possible advantage in the future war between the United States and the Soviet Union, which they saw as inevitable.

Perhaps it was correct to use Communists on the atomic project. Certainly the Oppenheimer brothers, Dr. Weinberg, Dr. Szilard, Dr. Hawkins, Fuchs, and the other Communists made notable contributions to its development. The real mistake came after World War II -- the mistake of permitting the American people and even the Congress of the United States to think that the atom bomb was an American secret and that therefore it was safe to disarm in the face of the Soviet's overwhelming superiority in other fields. Those responsible for this terrible blunder have on their shoulders the responsibility for the death of every American boy killed in Korea. Without the mistaken belief that our nation had sole possession of atomic bomb secrets the people of the United States never would have permitted our reduction of other armaments to such a dangerously low level that the Communist invasion of Korea became possible.

Recently some of the Communists who worked on the bomb have come forward and admitted "former" membership in the party, in the face of overwhelming evidence and fear of prosecution for perjury. But they refuse to name the officers and other members of the cells to which they belonged or to give any real co-operation to the Government in uncovering the whole party apparatus in Alameda County and Marcel Scheyer's cell with its tentacles reaching into every scientific field in this country.

I am speaking now of the role of the FBI because I am reporting to the Congress of the United States, to which that Bureau also is responsible, and because of the vital importance of all facts relating to the Communist Party affiliations of Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer. I want to point out, and ask your committee to keep in mind, the fact that Dr. Oppenheimer is one of the major consultants of Secretary of State Dean Acheson, and that on April 20 of this year President Truman appointed Dr. Oppenheimer to the science advisory committee of the Office of Defense Mobilization. Dr. Oppenheimer has the latest information on our hydrogen bomb studies and all other up-to-the-minute atomic data.

In view of this, I think it important to note that it was FBI Investigators X-1 and X-2 (their names are being given to your chairman) who first told me that the house which I identified as the meeting place of a top level Communist Party special section gathering I had attended in July, 1941, was at that time the home of Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer and his wife, Katherine. In company with an official whom I will call "Inspector Y" (real name given to your chairman), a man who was connected with atomic bomb security during the war and still is, and Richard E. Conbo, counsel and chief investigator for the California State Un-American Activities Committee, I had identified at sight a house at 10 Kenilworth Court, Berkeley, as the place where the meeting was held in July, 1941. At the time of that identification, I thought that it was the home of Eric Loran, an art professor at the University of Cal-

ed off to the right on a gravel road or driveway for possibly a hundred yards. We parked in the yard on the North side of the house, but instead of going in through a front doorway we had climbed steps and followed a path around the house, entering on the East side.

The meeting was held in a very large living room on the South-west corner of the house, with large corner windows. There was a balcony on the West side of the house, onto which we had gone before the meeting to enjoy a beautiful view of the Bay. North of the meeting room (and overlooking the yard and parking place) was some sort of studio, separated from the meeting room only by some open space removable partitions. Part of the audience had stood in the studio room while I spoke, and I stood at the extreme South-west corner of the room near some kind of built-in seat oravenport. There was a large fireplace in the North-east corner of the living room.

I remembered ^{J. R. ...} J. R. ... who asked numerous questions after I spoke, and following adjournment of the meeting had walked over to where I was standing and carried on a discussion with me for some time. As he walked away, Kenneth Day, standing at my side, remarked: "He is a very famous scientist." It was a joint meeting of the Merriam Hall of the special section, composed of university professors and instructors, and the special section's cell of employees of the radiation laboratory (I believe it was called the Hallam unit.) The purpose of the gathering was to have these present hear my political report on the changed character of the war; the date was a few days after a meeting of the party's State committee which had been held in San Francisco on July 13.

Detailed drawings of the exterior and interior of the Frank

plans and the dates on which these drawings were made by me.
Prior to our fleeing that house in 1940, we did this with the
California State Committee and the FBI.

In company with the FBI officials whom I call "Investigators
I-1 and I-2", after days of searching, I also recognized the house
in Oakland where I had attended Young Communist League meetings at
which Dr. Weisberg was present. This house, too, I identified as
right -- a house at 145 Duran Avenue. FBI investigations revealed
that the interior corresponded with my description, and the present
occupants gave permission for me to go in with the FBI officials
for identification purposes. Investigations showed that in the
summer of 1941 that dwelling had been rented by YCL members, and
that another YCL member -- a veteran of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade
-- had his car registered at that address in the same year.

The search for the other house, however, proved far more diffi-
cult. All I knew about the location was that it was in the hills
near Berkeley, with a good view of San Francisco Bay. That involves
a lot of territory. With FBI "Investigators I-1 and I-2" I spent
many hours, day after day, driving through the hills looking for
a residence that I knew I would recognize. Other trips also were
made with "Inspector Y" and Mr. Conde of the State Committee.

Finally, we decided to check the possibility that the special
section meeting might have been held in the home of a subscriber to
the Communist daily, People's World. Through another intelligence
agency the 1941 subscription list of that paper was obtained and
we began checking addresses located in the hills overlooking the

My. We went to a dozen or more without luck, and then we came to 10 Kenilworth Court, the address of People's World subscriber Prof. Eric Loran. I recognized the house there instantly, although there was nothing about the exterior to indicate that the interior would correspond with my previously dated drawings in FBI and State committee files. But FBI investigations soon disclosed that the interior was precisely like my drawings.

We had noted with no more than a little interest that Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer also received the Communist newspaper, People's World, at the same address as Prof. Eric Loran during 1941, but assumed that for some unknown reason he didn't want Communist literature to come to his own home -- which the State committee, FBI officials, and I all believed to have been at 2 Eagle Hill during that period. (It is only a few blocks from 2 Eagle Hill to 10 Kenilworth Court.)

Then, in looking for positive evidence that Prof. Eric Loran was occupying the Kenilworth Court house in July, 1941, the FBI officials made the electrifying discovery that he was in New York at that time and had subleased his home from December, 1940, until mid-August, 1941, to Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer.

Following that discovery the California State Un-American Activities Committee extended a public invitation to Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer and his wife, Katherine, to come to California, face me and my wife, and testify under oath about the meeting at their home and give their own story of their relations with the Communist Party. Dr. Oppenheimer and his wife neither accepted that invitation nor was any reply from them received. And the California committee had no power of subpoena outside of the State.

I understand that at a closed House committee hearing, the details of which were never made public, Mr. J. Robert Oppenheimer testified under oath that he had never belonged to the Communist Party. Documents and reports of investigators in the files of several intelligence agencies, especially of military intelligence (S-2), if they were all subjected and analyzed by your committee, could prove that Mr. Oppenheimer was a member of the Executive Committee of the Communist Party in America, and that he gave large sums of money as Communist Party dues to your State. They would discuss other facts also, even more alarming in my opinion, that would make your whole committee realize that Mr. Oppenheimer's associations with the Communist movement should be given a thorough complete and public examination. In my opinion, too, all military and other intelligence investigators who took part in the investigation of Mr. Oppenheimer's Communist activities should be heard in executive session and the material facts they state should be made public knowledge.

Perhaps I may seem to have focused too much attention here to one individual. Yet in view of all the circumstances and the gravity of the international situation, I think not. But before I leave this point I wish to make clear that I am not basing my personal knowledge of certain activities on Mr. J. Robert Oppenheimer's part alone, but on all matters.

My attitude is toward the Soviet Union and the Communist Party, which I believe to be a great danger to the United States and to the world. I believe that the activities of the Communist Party in this country are a serious threat to the national security and to the peace of the world. the Communist movement -- and his wife's connections. And he should publicly denounce the actions of his brother, Frank, who has refused to give information of vital importance to this country regarding his former associates in the party.

The Communist Party is not and never has been merely a pink tea party of discussion groups and idealists. It is and always has been a well-pledged hard disciplined organization of revolutionists dedicated to the overthrow of the Government of the United States by brute force. It has always been and is still devoted to the aim of aiding the Soviet Union to win a war over the United States -- "the last citadel of world capitalism." The Communist Party has never permitted anyone to remain a party member who did not believe in the armed overthrow of the United States Government. ~~Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, who has been a subscriber to Communist daily papers since 1938 (and probably earlier), his brother Frank, also a subscriber to the Communist press for years, and the others in that special section of the party in Alameda County all know these facts only too well. Espionage against one's own Government should not be surprising in a party openly dedicated to the object of bringing about the defeat of "one's own Government" and the armed victory of the Soviet Union over the United States. That is only a detail in the process.~~

In conclusion:

The Communist Party, as an organization, is as guilty of atomic espionage as those sentenced to the electric chair; the espionage activities of individuals are only the result of the teachings of the Communist Party for years.





III. CONNECTION WITH JOEL BARR

The records of the Sperry-Gyroscope Company, Lake Success, New York, reflected that JOEL BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York City, listed VICTOR ROSS of Ithaca, New York, as a character reference on May 3, 1947.

DAVID GREENGLASS states that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him in February, 1950, that JOEL BARR had left the United States to do espionage work for the Russians in Europe and that BARR had been one of ROSENBERG'S espionage contacts.

The records of the Board of Health, Brooklyn, New York, reflect that JOEL BARR was born on January 1, 1916 at Brooklyn, New York.

The records of the College of the City of New York indicate that BARR attended there from February 1934 to June 1938 receiving a Bachelor of Engineering Degree.

JOEL BARR'S present location is unknown and investigation has reflected that he last resided at Villa Regine in Paris, 16 Rue de la Retouse, Seine, France, in June 1950 where he has been alleged to be studying music.

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited to work in the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. JULIUS ROSENBERG was arrested by Agents of the New York Office on July 17, 1950. ROSENBERG was indicted on August 17, 1950 by the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage. He was arraigned on August 24, 1950 before District Judge, Southern District of New York, and pleaded innocent and was continued on \$100,000 bond.

It is of particular significance that ALFRED SARANT, the son-in-law of Mrs. MINA B. ROSS, and CAROL DAYTON, wife of WELDON BRUCE DAYTON, SARANT'S next-door neighbor at Ithaca, New York, should leave Baldwin, Long Island, on the evening of August 4, 1950 and enter Mexico on August 9, 1950 and were alleged to have continued to Mexico City where they would make contact possibly with SARANT'S mother-in-law; that Mrs. ROSS should also start for Mexico City prior to August 5, 1950, and plan to be in Mexico City by August 12, 1950. It would appear that SARANT and his mother-in-law had possibly pre-arranged a contact point at Mexico City.

September 15, 1950, that he observed Mrs. ALFRED SARANT (identification made from photograph), a woman believed to be her mother, and an unknown man arriving at the hotel via a 1950 black Austin bearing New York License Plate at approximately 5 p.m. on September 15, 1950. He described the unknown man as male, white, 5' 7", 135 pounds, dark complexion, dark, curly hair, and having a heavy beard. A photograph of ALFRED SARANT was exhibited to LANDERS and he advised the unknown man's facial characteristics appear similar to those of ALFRED SARANT.

Mr. LANDERS stated that the mother entered the hotel and Mrs. SARANT and the man remained a few minutes in the automobile. He stated that a few minutes later he observed that the automobile, which was parked across the street in front of the hotel, had been driven away. However, he did not know who was driving the car.

On September 15, 1950, at 6:55 p.m. the writer observed Mrs. SARANT, her mother, and an unknown woman carrying what appeared to be a violin case covered with brown leather, leaving the Hotel Fifth Avenue together at the 9th Street entrance. The unknown woman may be described as white, approximately 5' 2", 125 pounds, medium complexion, brown eyes, and brown hair, approximately twenty-five years of age.

Mrs. SARANT, her mother, and the unknown woman stood outside the 9th Street entrance of the Hotel Fifth Avenue talking for several moments and then separated. The unknown woman was observed walking toward Sixth Avenue. Mrs. SARANT and her mother were observed crossing 9th Street and entering an apartment building located at 20 Fifth Avenue at approximately 7 p.m.

It is noted that DANIEL A. SHIRK, previously mentioned in this report, resides at 20 Fifth Avenue. According to ALFRED SARANT, SHIRK is a prominent attorney in New York City who is a personal friend of MINA ROSS who is known as Mrs. VICTOR ROSS.

At 10:30 a.m. Mrs. SARANT entered the lobby of this hotel from the elevator and was joined by a man described as male, white, in his late twenties, 5' 7" or 8", 150 pounds, brown eyes, black hair streaked with gray, straight and unruly, medium complexion, large features, two dimples in cheeks and one dimple in chin. He was wearing a gray-green tweed sport coat, green sport shirt, dark blue tie, light blue trousers, and was hatless.

It is noted that this individual was believed to be identical with the man who was previously described by LANDERS on September 15, 1950 as the individual who was with LOUISE SARANT and her mother when they arrived at the Hotel Fifth Avenue.

From the description furnished immediately above and the description of HOWARD ERNEST GRUBER, who was a graduate student at Cornell University, Ithaca, and whose home is in Brooklyn, New York, it may well be that the unknown man and GRUBER are identical.

It is to be noted further that SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN, who had interviewed ALFRED SARANT, the husband of LOUISE SARANT, at the New York Office on July 28, 1950, states that this unknown man, whom he had personally observed as a surveilling agent on September 17, 1950, is not identical with SARANT although from a distance they are similar in appearance.

At 10:30 a.m. LOUISE SARANT and this unidentified individual, believed possibly to be HOWARD GRUBER, left the Hotel Fifth Avenue and met Mrs. ROSS at the Ninth Street entrance at that hotel. Mrs. ROSS was observed driving a black Austin bearing New York License Plate #7X762. After the three had entered the automobile, Mrs. ROSS drove to the Westside Highway and thereon proceeded to New Jersey via the George Washington Bridge.

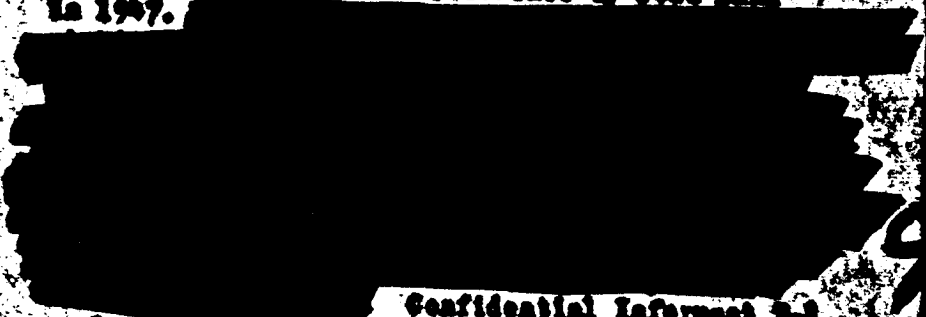

Informant further stated that he is acquainted with ALFRED SARANT and LOUISE SARANT and that subject had talked with him concerning the investigation of ALFRED SARANT by the F.B.I. Informant stated that he personally believed that subject has never been engaged in any espionage activity and that he definitely does not know of the present whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT. In recent conversations, subject has told him that he

does not like the way SARANT has handled his personal matters in leaving his business and his family and that he has counselled his step-daughter, LOUISE, to obtain a divorce. Informant advised that he has never seen any evidence of espionage activity or Communist activity among the personal possessions and papers of subject.

It will be noted that ALFRED SARANT departed from Ithaca, New York on July 26, 1950 for a vacation in New York City. While in New York City, he was joined by Mrs. CAROL BAYTON, his next-door neighbor in Ithaca, on August 4, 1950 SARANT and CAROL BAYTON departed from New York City. Investigation has reflected that SARANT and BAYTON arrived in Tucson, Arizona on August 7, 1950 and that on August 8, 1950, CAROL BAYTON obtained two visitors permits from the Mexican Consulate at Tucson under the names of CAROL B. BAYTON and BRUCE BAYTON. On August 9, 1950, SARANT and BAYTON journeyed from Tucson, Arizona to Hermosillo, Mexico. Their whereabouts since that time are not known. During the course of interviews conducted with ALFRED SARANT at Ithaca, New York between July 19 and July 25, 1950, he advised that MIRIAM BOSS, his mother-in-law, was going to make a trip to Mexico. Confidential Informant T-1 advised that Mrs. BOSS left Ithaca during the last week of July with a female companion named Mrs. FRIMA HERGIS, who resides at 50 West 9th Street, New York City, a close friend. This trip was made in a 1950 English Austin which is owned by Mrs. BOSS. Informant stated that Mrs. BOSS has come into some money from her mother, Mrs. ESTHER S. BRANDT, who resides in New York City and that the trip had been contemplated by her for a considerable time prior to the Bureau's investigation of ALFRED SARANT.

Confidential Informant B-1 stated that he talked with subject after his wife's return from Mexico and that subject told that his wife had not been contacted by ALFRED SARANT in Mexico City or at any time during this trip. Informant advised that he felt sure that no contact was made due to the fact that subject, by his remarks and actions, appears to have absolutely no knowledge of ALFRED SARANT's activities and whereabouts since leaving Ithaca, New York.

IV. INTERVIEW WITH SUBJECT

Subject was first interviewed by SA JOHN B. HANOHY and the writer on August 15, 1950. Subject absolutely denied any knowledge of Russian espionage activity carried on by ALFRED SARANT while he was residing in New York City prior to moving to Ithaca, New York. Subject stated that he was partly instrumental in causing SARANT to move to Ithaca due to the fact that he did not approve of the living conditions that LOUISE SARANT had to put up with in the New York City apartment at 65 Morton Street. Subject stated that he had visited ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT from time to time during their residence at 65 Morton Street and that during these visits and in conversations had with ALFRED SARANT, he never had any possible reason to suspect him of espionage activity. He added that he could not possibly see how ALFRED SARANT in his various employments in New York City would have come into possession of any information which would be of possible interest to a foreign government.

Subject denied that he himself had ever been connected with Russian espionage and also denied that he had ever been a member of the Communist Party.

Photographs of the following individuals were displayed to subject: JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, JULIS and BEHEL BOKEMERS, VIVIAN GLASSMAN, MAX and HELEN ELYCHER, MORTON and HELEN BOKELL, MICHAEL and ANNE SIDOROVICH, DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS, and HARRY GOLD.

The only photograph positively identified was that of JOEL BARR. However, subject stated that the photograph of WILLIAM PERL seemed to be familiar to him. Subject, however, denied knowing WILLIAM PERL when this photograph was identified for him.

VIVIAN GLASMAN

With reference to JOEL BARR, subject advised that he met him when he came to Ithaca with ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT and an unknown woman while these four individuals were on a canoe trip. Subject stated that at this time, his wife NINA was in a hospital at Sayre, Pennsylvania and that this party of four had stayed in his cottage on the West Shore of Lake Cayuga for a few days. He stated that he had never seen this unknown woman before or after this incident. It will be noted that Mrs. ALFRED SARANT (LOUISE SARANT) has advised that in 1945 she went on a canoe trip with JOEL BARR, VIVIAN GLASMAN and ALFRED SARANT and that on the conclusion of this canoe trip, the four of them visited for a few days in Ithaca, New York.

Subject further stated that he believes that he also met BARR on another occasion in Ithaca when BARR visited the SARANTS when they were residing with the ROCKES in their apartment at 422 Midy Street. Subject stated that he also believes that he again met BARR sometime in 1947 while he and his wife (NINA) were visiting in New York City. He stated that he recalled that while he and his wife met BARR and another individual while walking down Fifth Avenue in the vicinity of Ninth Street. He recalled that they stopped and talked a bit at that time. Subject stated that he believed that the individual with BARR resembled very closely the photograph of WILLIAM FIELL.

Subject stated that on the basis of the above he never was intimately acquainted with JOEL BARR. He added that in these meetings with BARR and in his conversations with ALFRED SARANT concerning BARR, he never had any reason to suspect him of Russian espionage activities.

Subject advised also during this interview, that he was acquainted with BRUCE and CAROL MAYTON but only as next door neighbors to ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT.

At the conclusion of this interview, subject stated that he wished to cooperate with the F.B.I. in any way and that he would willingly furnish any information coming into his possession concerning ALFRED SARANT and his activities.

Since the time of the above interview, periodic contacts have been made with subject. He has advised that he has no late possession of no other information and that he has absolutely no idea of the present whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT.

ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORYMISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION FURNISHED BY CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT T-1

At the time that ALFRED SARANT left Ithaca, New York he was in partnership with FRANK LA ROCK in a paint store at 537 West State Street. The building at this address had been purchased jointly by LA ROCK and SARANT. The partnership papers had been drawn up. However, neither party had signed those papers. When LA ROCK learned that SARANT had left the city and that his whereabouts were unknown, he attempted, through an attorney, to dissolve the unwritten partnership and to take over the business at this address. However, subject has not been cooperative in this regard and presently is trying to purchase LA ROCK'S interest in this building. LA ROCK closed up the plant they approximately three weeks ago. Subject has also stated that he desires to sell ALFRED SARANT'S residence. In both of the above transactions, the question of a power of attorney by SARANT came up. ROSS indicated that he had such a power of attorney but such power was not recorded in the Tompkins County Clerk's Office and such power was never evidenced in his transactions to date with FRANK LA ROCK. However, on October 25, 1950, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that he had actually seen such power of attorney drawn up on the New York State recognized power of attorney form. This document is dated May 2, 1950, is notarized by subjectas of the same date and in it ALFRED SARANT gives full power of attorney to his wife, LOUISE S. SARANT.

With reference to Trees, Incorporated, ROSS'S business in Miami, Florida, Informant advised that subject has obtained this business on a day by day concession from the City of Miami Beach. CLYDE B. SMITH, a forester of Ithaca, New York, originally was in on this transaction with subject and went to Miami Beach to manage the operations. He, however, soon returned to Ithaca and dissolved his association with subject. The firm is presently being managed by WALTER B. FERRY, 1455 Michigan Avenue, Miami Beach, Florida. FERRY is a former Ithaca man. According to Informant, to date the operation of this company have not produced satisfactory profits. However, subject believes he can make a substantial livelihood in this business and has indicated that he desires to turn over his law practice in Ithaca to WALLY WIGGINS, sell his house, and take up permanent residence in Miami Beach. NINA ROSS recently made a trip to Miami, Florida

where she obtained an apartment for the winter at Coral Gables. Subject and his wife plan to leave Ithaca soon after the first of the year for a vacation, at least, in Florida. On 1/6/56 MAX ELITCHER was contacted by the writer. He was shown photographs of OSCAR, STUART, MAX and MIRIAM SEBORER, ANNA ZKITLEN and ISIDORE GIBBY NEEDLEMAN, but was unable to identify any one of these individuals.

ELITCHER stated that he was positive he had never known or had contact with anyone named SEBORER, and had no recollection of the name SEBORER in the course of his associations within the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., between 1939 and 1948.

Similarly he had no recollection of JULIUS ROSENBERG ever mentioning the name SEBORER in his presence, and did not know if ROSENBERG might have known any of the aforementioned individuals.

He said he had no recollection of STUART SEBORER at CCHY between 1934 and 1939, but pointed out, that unless STUART SEBORER had been an engineering student at City College during that time, the chances were practically nil that he would have met or heard of him since the students in specialized schools such as Engineering had practically no contacts with other students matriculating at the same time in other branches of the college.

ELITCHER advised on 1/9/56 that his wife, HELENE, knew no one named SEBORER and specifically had no information on OSCAR, STUART, MAX, MIRIAM SEBORER, ANNA ZKITLEN, or ISIDORE GIBBY NEEDLEMAN. Photos of these individuals have not been shown as yet to HELENE ELITCHER since she has not been available for interview, due to other personal and family commitments.

Mr. Robert Taylor, Registrar, Day Session, CCNY, 139 Street & Convent Avenue, NYC on 2/14/56 made available to the writer the following information.

A comparison of the four year course cards of Julius Rosenberg, Morton Sobell and William Mutterperl with the course card of Seborer showed that in only four courses - Hygiene 1 & 2 and Mathematics 7 & 8 - were any of the first three men taking the same courses as Seborer during their College career.

Further investigation reflected that Seborer was in the same M Mathematics 7 class (Section E), for the term September 1934 to February 1935, as Julius Rosenberg; he was in the same Mathematics 8 class (Section X) for the term February to June 1935 as William Mutterperl. Seborer had no classes with Morton Sobell.

Mr. Taylor stated that being in the same section these men were physically in the same classroom at the same hour and that the classes contained approximately thirty students each.

Efforts will be made to obtain the roll books for these classes to determine the names of each student in the classes.
