MAX HORWITZ, Chairman of the Board, PHILIP CALIENDO, President, and JOHN NUKOTO, Executive Vice President are officers of captioned businesses. Directors are MAX HORWITZ, PHILIP CALIENDO and ALEXANDER EHAJNE. Efforts to locate [REDACTED] unsuccessful. [REDACTED] meat inspector, United States Department of Agriculture, advised KEN ETO controls Taco-Si and its successors.

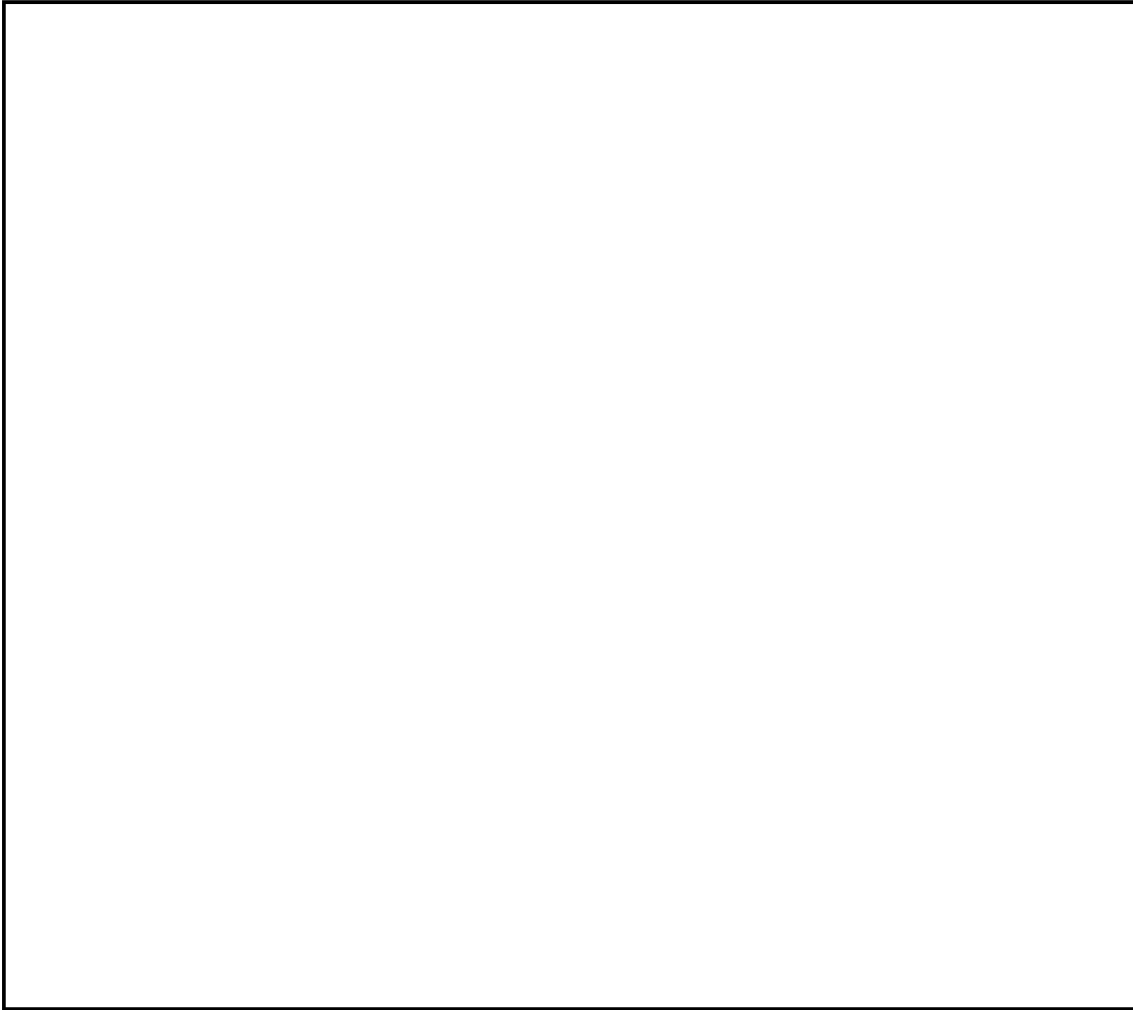

[redacted] dealt with [redacted] He stated while in Chicago once he met ETO, whose name he thought was JOE, and he had dinner with him. With ETO was a dark haired young woman, whose name he does not know. He stated he had never heard of the name [redacted] He stated that ETO had some connection with [redacted] and [redacted] but he did not know in what capacity. He stated he does not believe ETO was on the board of directors of Taco-Si, Incorporated. He stated he does not know anything about ETO's activities any more than that he appeared to be fairly close to the officers of Taco-Si, Incorporated. He stated [redacted] (phonetic) is reportedly running the Taco-Si plant at Oliver, Wisconsin, near Superior, but he has had no contact with them for some time. He stated ETO was in Wisconsin for a fishing trip once or twice when they were negotiating regarding the sale of the business, but he did not deal with him as such.

It should be noted that the plant seemed to lack raw materials for the products. Of the three large refrigerators in the plant, one appeared to be one tenth full of frozen food, which ETO characterized as entrees.
