VIN 6G25H155042, and Illinois license YNU 402. Eto pretended to be dead and after his two assailants fled, he was able to seek medical help. Eto has since been cooperating with Federal authorities and has advised that his two assailants were LCN figure Jasper J. Campise and hoodlum John A. Gattuso. At the time of the shooting, Eto was sitting in the driver's seat, Campise was in the front seat next to him, and Gattuso was in the back seat behind Campise. Gattuso did the shooting. One bullet lodged in the windshield.

Campise is described as a white male, date of birth 3/15/15, FBI Number 3686563, and Gattuso is described as a white male, date of birth 6/27/35.

Chicago Police Department Crime Lab Technicians did initial examination of the automobile and discovered only two bullet fragments. One fragment has been identified as a .22 caliber slug with 6 lands and grooves and a right twist. The other fragment was too small to classify.

On 2/24/83, Chicago Division took possession of the automobile and on 2/25/83, it was examined by Bureau Agents. Enclosed items are parts of the automobile. No other bullets were discovered.

Enclosed items 1 - 7 were taken from 1976 Ford Torino belonging to victim Ken Eto. Enclosed section of windshield (item 1) contains what appears to be a bullet hole.

Referenced airtel sets forth how victim Eto was shot by subject John Gattuso from behind while Eto, Gattuso, and subject Jasper Campise were sitting in Eto's automobile. Various parts from the inside of the automobile were sent as enclosures with referenced airtel to be examined by FBI Laboratory. During referenced telcall to John Kilty, he requested that the section of windshield containing the bullet hole and the top of the seat back cover from the front seat be sent to the Laboratory for powder residue, glass fracture, and other tests to corroborate that Eto was shot from inside his automobile.

Laboratory should note that referenced airtel stated that there was one bullet lodged in the windshield when Chicago Police Department technicians examined the automobile. This was apparently wrong since Chicago Police Department reports do not mention a bullet lodged in the windshield.

Laboratory should also note that when Chicago Police Department technicians examined the automobile, they dusted all surfaces, including the seat covers, for fingerprints.

Request of the Laboratory:

The Laboratory is requested to conduct powder residue, glass fracture, and other tests on the enclosed items in an attempt to corroborate that Eto was shot from inside his automobile. Enclosed seat back covers should be examined for gun powder residue, and enclosed windshield should be examined for minute lead fragments and also to determine if the bullet impact originated from inside or outside the automobile.
