

This book is presented to you, the students of Kentucky State College. It is offered to you with the very real hope that through its pages the forward look of your school will be vividly shown to you.





THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In October 1963, I was presented with the symbol of the Office of President of Kentucky State College, a public institution. In taking this symbol, I accepted formally a challenge, a privilege and a responsibility to dedicate this administration to the (a) achievement of excellence of work offered by the college, (b) strengthening of the foundations necessary for survival and progress in our democratic society, (c) necessary increase in quantity without the loss of quality, and (d) voice of the people if this voice does not conflict with the proper functions of an educational institution. This symbol, although accepted by me not for myself alone, but for the faculty, students, alumni, government and the people, and the Board of Regents. For the teamwork of all these groups is essential to the full realization of the meaning of this symbol.

No educational institution, public or private, can move ahead or achieve academic quality without a prepared and constantly preparing faculty working together to inspire students to fulfill their maximum potentials. In teaching, research, guidance, the increase in the number of cooperative, creative and dedicated faculty is a primary consideration. Kentucky State College's faculty must concern itself with exploring and using every possible means of upgrading present curricula, as well as adding new ones. In some areas, we must attack the triple problem of catching up, keeping up and moving ahead—all at the same time. The tasks facing us are not easy to accomplish, but many problems have been identified, solutions proposed, and work begun.

Also, the students of an educational institution should sense and respond positively to the direction of the institution; discover and reassess their desires and Capabilities; move ahead on all fronts; and accept the rigors of scholarship; the elevation of the cultural and moral, as well as the benefits and boundaries of the social. The resultant atmosphere will be one in which both student and faculty can surmount many difficulties which obstruct, or even subvert, individual and group progress.

Along with the faculty and students, the alumni represent an invaluable asset to an institution. They are in a real sense Kentucky State College away from the campus, and therefore have the opportunity and responsibility to contribute to the stability, progress and prestige of their alma mater.

While the people and the government which represents the people do not, and should not exercise direct control in educational matters, the constructive and balancing voice of the people should be heard; progressive and realistic financial needs should be met by the government and supported by the people.

In addition, the Board of Regents, from whom the President receives his direct atuhority to implement major programs, has a great responsibility in the forward movement of Kentucky State College. The Board has accepted this responsibility with insight and sensitivity; with cooperation and dedication.

The symbol of the Office of President which I accepted then, can have the most satisfactory and creative meaning only as the faculty, students, alumni, the people and government, and the Board of Regents join hands, join minds, and join hearts to achieve a common goal: A Kentucky State College second to none in quality education. This is my assignment and I have every reason to believe from the support already given that this is the assignment of our faculty, students, alumni, the people and government as well as the Board of Regents.

So I am happy to congratulate you, the members of the senior class. You have reached an important goal in your career. You are on the alumni threshold, and are greatly involved in the symbol to which I have referred. It is my hope and belief therefore that you will continue to pursue excellence, and by your accomplishments and cooperation; by your social and economic awareness; by your spiriutal and moral values, give the highest meaning to our symbol.

Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority was founded on January 16, 1908. A group at Howard University caught the inspiration of a fellow student, Ethel Hedgeman Lyle, and initiated the movement of Greek-letter sororities among Negro women in America. Now interracial, Alpha Kappa Alpha has 188 graduate chapters and 161 undergraduate chapters. The sorority's projects include foreign fellowships and undergraduate scholarships, research, and local community programs. It is affiliated with the American Council on Human Rights.

The purpose of the sorority is to cultivate and encourage high scholastic and ethical standards, improve the social stature of the race, promote unity and friendship among college women, and keep alive within the alumnae an interest in college life.

Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, the first Negro College fraternity, was founded December 4, 1906, at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York.

Now interracial, with all undergraduate chapters, two intermediate chapters, and 141 graduate chapters in 36 states, the District of Columbia, and the British West Indies, more than 25,000 men have been initiated into Alpha Phi Alpha.

Its activities and projects include Citizenship Week, American Education Week, and Founders' Day. It is affiliated with the NAACP, the National Pan-Hellenic Council, the United Negro College Fund, and the National Housing Discrimination Committee.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was founded November 17, 1911, by Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper, Frank Coleman, and Ernest E. Just. These four men, in the early part of the twentieth century, seized upon the cultural heritage of the human race and at their Alma Mater, Howard University, Washington, D.C., established in the national Greek-letter fraternity, Omega Psi Phi.

The four cardinal principles upon which Omega Psi Phi is founded are Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance, and Uplift. Its goal is racial uplift through cultural achievement and inspiration.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority was founded at Howard University, January 13, 1913. Its founders envisioned an organization which would lift the race through the combatting of ignorance, prejudice, discrimination, and injustice and which would bring together college women of like ideals, scholarship, and potentialities. Delta Sigma Theta Sorority is recorded in Washington, D.C., as the first incorporated sorority.

Grand Chapter scholarship awards amount to \$5,000 annually and are not limited to Delta women. The major activities are Founders' Day, the Jabberwock, National May Week, and Job Opportunities.


