In May 1946, a key German intelligence agent working for this detach-

From the time that contact had been made by the group with persons in the British Zone, Counter Intelligence Headquarters had maintained complete liaison with the British Intelligence Service in Germany. When it became evident that the group intended to approach someone in authority, a pseudonym number of the group was introduced by our German source to a British officer who pretended to be a British Fascist and a secret sympathizer with the Nazis. This officer agreed to call a meeting of leaders of the group with a "British Foreign Office expert" who would be sympathetic to their proposition and who would have influence in getting it accepted by the Foreign Office.

Such a meeting was held and the leaders of the group put forth their proposition. The "Foreign Office Specialist" appeared favorably impressed by the proposal but asked for more details on the caliber of personnel and so forth. By so doing, he uncovered the names and whereabouts of numerous other persons connected with this group, who were unknown to our sources.

Future meetings were scheduled and plans made for the transmission of the proposal to London and to Washington, D.C.

By now Counter Intelligence Corps had learned about as much about the group as could be expected. It was therefore decided to stage a "Group Operation". After careful planning and coordination with British authorities, lists of targets were drawn up and instructions issued to all agents throughout

the Zone. (See 3 inclosures). On the night of 22 February 1947, Counter Intelligence Corps made the attack. In the middle of a cold and rainy night, fifty members of the group were roused out of bed, given a quick preliminary interrogation for the location of their contacts, blindfolded and bundled off into safekeeping. Only one important member of the group escaped, and that one only because he had been called out of town on routine business that week-end. Prisoners were immediately subjected to complete interrogations and some twenty additional members of the group were uncovered. As soon as they had been milked for information, they were sent to internment camps to await judgment as prominent Nazis or were tried in Military Government courts for violation of existing ordinances.

This was the last large organized group of Nazis to be formed in the Western Zones of Germany. It was completely broken up, its activities were publicized, and its story now serves as a reminder to the German people of the futility of nationalistic action outside the scope of the existing democratic processes now in operation in Germany.

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OPERATION SELECTION BOARD

In May 1946, a key German underground agent working for this detachment reported the existence of an underground movement in Bavaria. This movement was supposed to be made up of former SS officers still fugitives from internment camps. These officers were joining together in order to form a group capable of resistance to the occupation forces. They remembered the success of the "Freikorps" groups which came into being in Germany after the first World War as irregular troops fighting to form a strong nationalistic Germany. It was from these Freikorps groups that the Nazi party had evolved and it was the idea of these Elite Guard officers that a new Freikorps should be built to bring back the ideology and power of the Nazis.

Since the source of our information was well connected with some of these leaders and since his connections with Counter Intelligence Corps were covert, he was instructed to become a member of the group and to report on its activities. To act as a check and to obtain more information, an American agent was placed in an undercover role and introduced into the organization. This agent, typical of the old war-time Counter Intelligence Corps Agents, was well qualified since he had spent several years in Switzerland as a student and spoke perfect Swiss German. He introduced himself as a Swiss of German ancestry who was a fervent believer in the cause of German nationalism who had come to Germany to aid in the building of a new Nazi Organization which would again put Germany to her rightful place in the world. Since he claimed to be Swiss, the group could not check on his background, and because of the skill he employed in playing his

part, accepted him as a member of their inner circle.

For six months the German and the American agent played with the group. In this time there were many difficulties for the movement. Unlike post-1919 days, illegal groups were not easy to organize. Top law enforcement agencies of the occupation powers were constantly on the alert for fugitives. There were no large numbers of Germans willing to be recruited for active resistance against the occupation forces. The occupation force had repeatedly shown that it would not tolerate trifling with its control of the American Zone. On the contrary, the occupation force had shown itself to be trying to help Germany to restore itself to a normal life.

The leaders of the group about this time began to contact fugitive SS officers in other areas - particularly in Hesse and in the British Zone. Their contacts turned out to be of higher caliber than themselves. In several cases they were persons of intellectual stature - in fact some of the better strains of the Nazi party.

Discussions were held among all these people and it became evident to them that resistance, terrorism or sabotage were out of the question as methods of gaining power. On January 31, 1947, CIC HQ sent its Region III office, which covered the Marburg area, a copy of its "Central Personalities Index Card," which identified Barbie as "Leiter, Abt[eilung] IV, SD Kds Lyon" (Leader, Section IV, Sicherheitsdienst Kommando Lyon) the head of the Gestapo in Lyon. Barbie was listed as "[l]ong a member of the SD * * * [a] dangerous conspirator" who was "last heard of in November and December 1944 in a hospital in Baden-Baden" Germany, near the French Border.

Based on reports from its undercover agent, CIC assembled a profile of the organization, its several dozen members and three or four leaders. One of the leaders was thought to be Barbie, whose group was believed responsible for "the procurement of supplies for the organization and the establishment of an intelligence network throughout the British and American Zones."

CIC, working closely with British military intelligence, decided early in February 1947 to stage a "swoop" to break up the organization, arrest its members, and interrogate them on their activities. Coining the name "Operation Selection Board," CIC HQ notified its regions on February 9, 1947 to execute the swoop at 2:00 a.m. on February 23. It provided a target list of some 57 members or suspected members of the SS organization, including Barbie, and their addresses.

1. This headquarters has been instructed to arrange, in cooperation with British authorities, a so-called sweep operation in order to arrest and detain all persons connected with SS subversive movements in this and the British zones.
2. It has been agreed that, within this zone, the action will include only those persons coming within the scope of Operations GOMER and ROSENROTTER, plus those persons connected with Operation BRANK who have definite SS connections. Should any Regional Commander have additional targets, such names should be forwarded immediately to this headquarters for consideration.
3. Attached is a preliminary target list. Targets have been classified as one star, two star or three star according to their importance. Each target has been assigned a number in order to make possible reference in telephonic and teletype messages.
4. 0200 hours, 23 February 1947, has been decided on as H-hour and D-day.
5. Each target should be reconnoitered discreetly in order to confirm his location. Reports of such location should reach this headquarters by 19 February 1947. It is realized that locations for many targets are extremely vague and it is anticipated that many will not be located.
6. A master target list will be forwarded to you as soon as practical which will include as much necessary information as possible and a concise brief of subject's connections.
7. In all cases, a search will be made of the place of arrest for documents, lists, weapons, etc. Documents will be given a rapid check by the arresting agency and all material believed relevant or needed for interrogation forwarded with the prisoner.

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9. The star targets will be interrogated on the spot or within their sanctuaries since this situation consists only of those persons whose names were furnished in protocols or whose names have been furnished in the course of the operation. No other persons are listed or other items are listed. Targets will be placed in transport and will not be interrogated in those areas where conditions are such as indicated, targets will be interrogated on the spot.

10. The star targets will be given a brief interrogation on the spot or as soon after arrival as practicable in order to determine any targets in the area.

11. No interrogations will be made of three star targets.

12. All prisoners will be delivered to the British Base for detailed interrogation. GIBB, USMC (M/1/1/77), has been tentatively selected as the collecting point for prisoners. It is anticipated, however, that prisoners from Sub-Regions KASSEL, MARBURG and FRIEDL of Region III will not be brought to GIBB but will be collected by the transferring party along the way.

13. It will be appreciated that many of the details contained in this letter are tentative and incomplete, due to the sudden notification of this operation to this headquarters. More complete information will be passed on as soon as practicable.

14. Communication by teletype or telephone is authorized within the limits of security. With the exception of those matters requiring the personal attention of Col. Inskip or Col. Garvey, telephones 23303 (Capt. Frazier) or 22937 (Mr. Julia or Mr. Dreifuss) should be used. Teletype messages should be addressed for the attention of Capt. Frazier. Due to the distance between offices teletype conferences should be arranged in advance except in matters of urgency.

15. Receipt of this warning letter should be acknowledged by telephone or teletype.

INTERROGATION BRIEF

1. For the sake of convenience in interrogation, the partitions of the group have been divided into 5 groups, labeled A, B, C, D, and E. The members of each group are connected with one another. Groups A, B and C may be said to form one organization. Groups D and E are neither related to one another nor to groups A, B and C.

Group A & B - These two groups may be said to form the operational apparatus of the organization (see above.) Their principal efforts have been directed toward making propaganda, in which work they have repeatedly approached British and American authorities for the purpose of legalizing their activity.

a. The head of group A was SS Brigadeführer Erhardt MULLER who was arrested in November 45. SINCE THAT TIME THE GROUP HAS LACKED A LEADER AND HAS THEREFORE GROWN INCREASINGLY CLOSE TO GROUP B.

b. The leading figure in group B is SS Oberführer Kurt ELLERSIEK. Among the members of this group are quite a number of former members of the German Propaganda Ministry.

Group C - If groups A and B can be compared to the G-3 part of the organization, group C may be termed the G-2 and G-4. This group concerns itself with the procurement of supplies for the organization and the establishment of an intelligence network throughout the British and American Zones. The leader of this group is SS Hauptsturmführer Elias BARBIL.

Groups A, B and C have been in contact with each other at the top level and can be said to form one organization. On lower levels, however, the groups have been kept apart.

Group D - Group D is composed of Brandy personalities. Operation BRANDY concerns itself primarily with former members of the SS Brandenburg Division and the SKORZENY Jagdverbände. The Brandenburg Division trained personnel for high-grade intelligence work while the SKORZENY Jagdverbände were trained for action behind the enemy lines. The main activity of this organization consists at present in aiding some of its leading members to escape from American internment camps.

Group D is distinct and has no relation to groups A, B and C or to group E.

Group E - This group was essentially a British operation to investigate a suspected escape route from one of their CIA's. The operation revolves around the escape of SS Stubai SPRINGER and the contacts he made until recaptured as well as the activity of these contacts.

Group E is distinct from groups A, B and C and group D.

Members of Barbie's group were believed to be "people who have been connected in the past with one or more of the German Intelligence organizations, such as the Amts [Sections] III, VI and VII, RSHA." CIC believed that the "group led by SS Hauptsturmfuehrer [captain] Barbie has concentrated on the establishment of an intelligence network throughout the United States and British Zones, and possibly farther. [Barbie's] group takes care of the procurement of money, radio equipment, printing presses, etc. Centers of this group are in Marburg, Munich and Hamburg." Barbie himself was believed living at 35 Barfusserstrasse (or Barfuesslerstrasse) in Marburg, a city about 40 miles north of Frankfurt.

1. Reference is made to warning letter, this Headquarters, dated 9 February 1947, and to Supplementary Target List, this Headquarters, dated 13 February 1947, concerning Operation SELECTION ROAD.

2. Inclosed is a Master Target List for this operation. This list is still subject to change as new information is discovered or as new agreements are reached with British authorities, but such changes will be held to a minimum. It will also be noted that numerous changes have been arrested.

3. The following change has been made concerning the instructions set forth in the warning letter: Most personalities will be interrogated by MISC instead of being evacuated to the British Zone. All the most important personalities will be sent to MISC for preliminary screening. Instructions will be issued on later concerning transportation of prisoners. Prisoners will be segregated, or, if this is not practical, will not be permitted to communicate with one another.

4. This Headquarters should be notified immediately of any targets who have connections with Military Government, German Government or the Demagification system. Such targets will be considered for differential treatment. Amending of classification or other action as is not appropriate.

5. Counter Intelligence Branch, G-2 Division, has instructed this Headquarters that the appropriate Regional Command will acquaint the Military Government of the latter concerned with the outline of the operation within 24 to 30 hours before H-hour.

6. Emphasis should be placed on the discovery of new targets for preliminary interrogation. For one week after H-hour new targets should be transmitted by teletype unless considerable reason exists to transmit

authorities. Regions V, VI and IX will be briefed by this Headquarters.

Reports of persons arrested will be forwarded by teletype be-
fore 0000 and 1200 hours on 23 February 1947. Reports of preliminary
interrogations and interrogations of one star categories will be for-
warded as soon as practicable by courier.

8. The following paragraphs contain general information concerning
the personalities listed. For convenience in interrogation, they have
been divided into groups of persons more or less connected. Group "C" is
connected with Group "B" only by contact between their leaders. Groups
"A" and "E" are not connected with each other or with the other groups
as far as is known.

9. The personalities formerly dealt with in Operation GOEBER can
be divided into three groups centered around three personalities. These
groups have been in contact with each other at the top level, and may be
said to form one organization. However, on lower levels, the groups have
no all appearances; been kept deliberately apart.

10. SS Brigadefuehrer [redacted] is the supposed leader of
Group "A", which had headquarters in the ROSENFELD-PAO AIELING area, with
contacts to FRANKFURT, COLOGNE, MUNICH and HAMBURG.

11. Group "B" is guided by SS Oberfuehrer ELLERSICK, Kurt, who
maintains headquarters in DORTMUND and FULDA, with contacts to HAMBURG,
KASSEL, MARBURG and MUNICH. Among the members of this group are quite a
number of former members of the German Propaganda Ministry.

12. Groups "A" and "B" have become closely allied during the last
three months, mainly due to the efforts of the principal informant and
the arrest in November of SS Brigadefuehrer MUELLER, which left Group "A"
without a potential leader.

13. The dominant figure in Group "C" is SS Hauptsturmfuehrer BARBE,
Klaus. The members of this group are people who have been connected in
the past with one or more of the German Intelligence organizations, such
as the Amts. III VI and VII, RHSA.

14. A number of the targets listed are marked "Notebook". This
indicates a person whose name was found in the notebook of BARBE when
he was arrested briefly in HAMBURG in November. These persons should be
interrogated for information concerning BARBE, SCHAEFFER and TILCKERING
(see TX, this Headquarters No. 1274, dated 22 November 1946 and cable
SX-6577, dated 26 November 1946).

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The organization as a whole is best compared to an illegal right-wing party. In connection with that, they have approached or tried to approach American and British officials in suitable positions and have, when given the chance, outlined their political program to them in an effort to "sell" it. They have also issued a manifesto in various propaganda pamphlets which they have cleverly placed in the hands of American and British officials. If Groups "A" and "B" can be compared to the G-3 part of the organization, Group "C" can best be portrayed as the G-2 and G-4. The group led by SS Hauptsturmfuehrer BARBE has concentrated on the establishment of an intelligence network throughout the United States and British Zones, and possibly farther. This latter group takes care of the procurement of money, radio equipment, printing presses, etc. Centers of this group are in MARBURG, MUNICH and HAMBURG.

16. Group "D" is composed of BRANDI personalities. It is believed the Region concerned is already sufficiently briefed on the background of these persons. Target 18, Manfred HAAS and target 10, Edwin D'INGLER have been eliminated since they are not believed to be of sufficient counter intelligence importance.

17. Group "E" constitutes the wind-up of Operation GLOBETROTTER. Operation GLOBETROTTER was a British Operation, originally set up with a suspected escape route of prisoners from British Civilian Internment Camp No. 6 (NEUENGAMME). Actually, the operation concerned only the escape of SS Sturmbaefuehrer Heinrich SPRINGER, former Adjutant of HIMMLER, the subsequent contacts of SPRINGER until recapture and the activities of these contacts. It has never been proved definitely that a well organized route existed; however, numerous persons have been located who gave aid and comfort to at least one escapee. SPRINGER's contacts include one HJ Gefolgshaftsfuehrer Werner STENDER, who was active in supply false D-2 forms apparently to all comers. STENDER is reported to be at large in the MUNICH area, although thorough search has failed to trace him. SPRINGER, after a thorough interrogation by British authorities, revealed a fairly large number of contacts who aided him.

BARBIE was apprehended by this Sub-Region in August and escaped. He was later apprehended by the British authorities in Hamburg and once again managed to escape.

2. BARBIE, Klaus is known to bea dominant figure in a group of people (for purposes of this operation known as Group "C") who have in the past been connected with one or more of the German Intelligence organizations such as the Aets III, VI, and VII, RHSA.

3. Group "C" under BARBIE, Klaus is known to have connections with other groups, inthe American as well as the British Zones.

4. This Sub-Region has at present eight (8) targets which are divided in two star (++) and one star (+) categories. Four of our targets are of the two star (++) category and four of the one (+) category.

a. The two star (++) targets are personalities which are to be apprehended at the appointed hour, briefly interrogated as hereinafter described and held for evacuation to MISC, CBERURSEL for detailed questioning.

b. The one star (+) targets are to be interrogated as hereinafter described and held under town arrest until

She has been threatened by BARBIE. She should be interrogated about her recent trip to ESSEN in the British Zone.

TARGET No. 40. RIEDESEL, Anneliese, listed as Castle near ALSFELD, Kreis ALSFELD. Interrogation should be directed towards her affiliations with Bishop OLDENBURG.

TARGET No. 42. ROTH, Max presently living at Bruckenstresse 423 KIRCHAIN kreis MARBURG is one of the persons that BARBIE planned to "eliminate".

TARGET No. 45. SCHILLING, Wilhelm is presently living at 13 Deutschhaus str. MARBURG, Kreis MARBURG. Subject was also on BARBIE's list to be eliminated. He should be courteously interrogated on Sunday 23 February 1947 at a reasonable hour.

However, it is considered possible that some of the targets may suddenly move into your areas or that preliminary interrogation may reveal the location of new targets in your areas.
3. Targets have been classified as one star, two star or three star according to their importance. Each target has been assigned a number in order to make possible reference in telephonic and teletype messages.
4. 0200 hours, 23 February 1947, has been decided on as H-hour and D-day.
5. One star targets will be interrogated on the spot to determine their connections since this classification consists only of those persons whose names were contained in notebooks or whose exact status is unknown. Unless a connection can be made, or suspicious documents, list or other items are found, targets will be placed in town arrest and will not be evacuated. In those cases where suspicious activity is indicated, targets will be upgraded to two star.

Barbie himself was not listed as a target in the memo in Tab 5. This omission may simply reflect Region III's inability to confirm that he was in Marburg. On the other hand, it is conceivable that Region III was ordered not to arrest Barbie. Such support as may exist for this theory is found in two cryptic documents in the Selection Board file. One is an undated teletyped conversation apparently between HQ and Region III, wherein an agent at HQ (Dreifuss) stated "We are still not allowed to do anything overtly about target nr [number] three," who was Barbie. The other is a scrawled, unsigned note in the file that states, "The person to be left off is our No. 3 on [the target] list."

There is no indication as to why Barbie would not be arrested, or who might have made such a decision. Indeed, as indicated in the text, CIC HQ was ordering Region III to arrest Barbie even though his apparent residence would not be raided to protect a source. And the "final report" from Region III on the swoop listed Target 3 simply as "not located." The significance of a decision not to arrest Barbie if that is what indeed it was is limited, however, for by April 16 Barbie was ordered arrested, as discussed in the text that follows.

Robert Frazier, the case officer in charge of Operation Selection Board, noted that "Barbie (not yet arrested) still has a large number of contacts at large who are believed to be active in procurement of false papers, in sheltering of fugitives and in giving aid to politically active persons * * *."

SUBJECT: Brief on Operation ~~SELECTION BOARD~~

1. Reference is made to the enclosed statistical analysis of Operation ~~SELECTION BOARD~~.
2. It should be explained that the large number of persons not yet broken is to be expected at this time. Until now interrogators have been busy obtaining material for Preliminary Interrogation Reports, fixing up prisoners and deciding on methods of interrogation.
3. Interrogation to date has obtained leads on one old target not arrested and on seven new targets. In addition, certain details of connections between several of the present prisoners have been discovered. This should lead to the breaking of some of these prisoners not now giving information.
4. While it is yet too early to give a forecast of the results of the operation, it is believed that the personalities will fall into four groups.
 - a. Those originally connected with ~~SLIM~~ and ~~WILLIE~~ in the ~~ROCKAWAY~~ area. Little of intelligence interest is expected, but prisoners may be of value in breaking others.
 - b. Those connected with ~~WILLIE~~ and his political group. Again, little intelligence interest is expected from the political personalities themselves, but their contacts with more active personalities will be of considerable interest.
 - c. Those followers of ~~MARIE~~. ~~MARIE~~ (not yet arrested) still has a large number of contacts at large who are believed to be active in procurement of false papers, in sheltering of fugitives and in giving aid to politically active persons who have ideas similar to ~~WILLIE~~. This group should provide the most information of value. British authorities are known to have considerable information available on this group. This information has been requested and should aid materially in the interrogation.

4. HAVLY. Interrogations of these personalities, connected with Bacteriological Warfare, has been limited to brief preliminary ones since little material is available to brief interrogators. Early transfer of these prisoners to British authorities is contemplated.

1. Reason for investigation: Reference is made to previous reports on Subject. (see cross references listed).

2. Synopsis of Previous investigation: a. Penetration of various German underground groups widely scattered over the US and British Zones of Germany has been the object of the principal informant. Only one contact with the Russian Zone [redacted] has been made. A cross check on the informant was accidentally developed by Sub Region Goeppingen; use of this check has indicated that the principal informant has been cooperating rather well and has not been using his position to hood-wink CIC. s-1

b. The principal informant contacted [redacted] and AUGSBURG, Emil, approximately the middle of February 1947. A report on conditions within the Russian Zone was obtained from [redacted] and has since been forwarded to 970th CIC Detachment. [redacted] a new personality who seemed to have a dominating position among the others, was introduced.

[redacted] again refused to fuse their groups with the one supposedly represented by the principal informant; and [redacted] reiterated his claim of having made contact with British elements which would support him. As usual, he refused to elaborate or give evidence to support this statement. (See LCIC, subject as above, dtd 8 March 1947) REPHRASED CONFIDENTIAL BY AUTHORITY OF COL D C ERSKINE BY [redacted] 14 MAY 1950

3. Synopsis of Present Investigation: [redacted] was established by X-3-I Sp sqd with Target 73 of Operation SELECTION BOARD in connection with underground groups supposedly existing in HAMBURG (154/350) and KREUZBURG (151/674). Further meetings between X-3-I Sp sqd and Target 73 resulted in contact with two personalities named BECKER and KRAMER. s-1

b. NAUMANN now resides in MAREBURG (L51/674). There are hints that he was formerly chief of the SD in LEIPZIG (N52/S21). BECKER claimed contact with a group in KASSELL (L52/C20). 8-3

c. BECKER later visited X-3-I Sp Sqd and revealed his true identity as that of Target 3, Operation SELECTION BOARD. He claimed contact with other personalities carried on the SELECTION BOARD target list. (See Incl 1). 8-2

d. After the execution of Operation SELECTION BOARD Target 3 again contacted X-3-I Sp Sqd and indicated his desire to move to the area of SCHORNDORF (L49/S32). 8-2

e. At the same time, X-3-I Sp Sqd has learned of the possible existence of a Russian agent or courier center in [REDACTED]. This information is very difficult to evaluate as yet. No connection exists between it and the personalities mentioned above, but it is reported at this time because of points which will be covered in the following sections of this report. 8-4

4. Undeveloped Leads:

a. Little is known of NAUMANN and his connections with the GOETTINGER University. (See par 3 a, b, and Incl 1 above).

b. Baron von MERTIN II has been reported on by Sub-Region BARLACH (see Incl 4) and mentioned by BARRIE but little other than background is known at present.

c. The supposed Russian net in existence in [REDACTED] has only recently come to the attention of the undersigned and has not been investigated as yet. This phase of the Operation deserves quite a bit of attention in the future.

5. Agent's Comments and Conclusions:

a. As a result of SELECTION BOARD Target 73 has become dependent on X-3-I Sp Sqd for funds and a new cover address in BAVARIA.

b. His (Target 73) contacts, some of which were on the target list for Operation SELECTION BOARD, indicate that he is an active organizer. He has also indicated that he had contact with a former Sturmbannfuhrer of the SS Hauptamt who was liaison officer to the Ukrainian Groups (up, at one time at least, had contact with BENDER. A detailed report on these points is impossible at the moment, but during the course of the coming week (24-29 March 1947) it is expected that more information will become available.

c. BARBIE (Target 3 of SB) may well be a good source of information on personalities connected with SELECTION BOARD who have not yet been apprehended. The same pertains to Baron von MENZINGEN. In addition, due to his background and experience with the GIS, it is very possible that BARBIE might be useful in penetrating the supposed Russian center in ██████████ mentioned in paragraphs 3-e and 4-c above. He has indicated to T-3-I Sp Sqd that he (BARBIE) would not be unwilling to collaborate with T-3-I Sp Sqd in such a venture. BARBIE has also mentioned that von MENZINGEN would be willing to connect himself with a movement of anti-Russian nature.

6. Recommendations:

a. It is recommended that 970th CIC Detachment, Headquarters, check its file for any available information on HALLMANN (see par 4-a above) and that same be forwarded to CIC Region I. A check with CIC Region III might also be of value. It is further suggested that an attempt be made to determine the state of penetration of GOETTINGER University by HALLMANN's group.

b. It is recommended that any background information on von MENZINGEN available to 970th CIC Detachment, Headquarters, be forwarded to this office and that further surveillance be maintained on Subject, both through Sub-Region KASLSAUNE and sources available to T-3-I Sp Sqd.

c. It is recommended that BARBIE not be interned as yet, but that he be used in an attempt to penetrate the supposed Russian-inspired group at ██████████. It is at present believed that a tight enough control over him can be maintained so that his arrest could easily be effected should such action become desirable. Using him for the purpose outlined here would be an excuse to keep him under surveillance.

d. It is recommended that no action be taken against WENZEL (Target 73) as yet until 970th CIC Detachment, Headquarters, has had an opportunity to study the forthcoming report which outlines the use made of him in an attempt made to locate BADERA.

RE : Progress Report

1. REASON FOR AND OUTLINE OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY:

Reference is made to TOP SECRET Summary of Information 20 February 1947, paragraph 3-c, and attached inclosure 1 of attached SRL.

2. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY:

a. The snoop Operation SELECTION BOARD was completed on 23 February 1947. BECKER, Fridolin was listed as having been apprehended in KASSEL (L52/C20). Since BARBIE used the alias BECKER, Fridolin, it was assumed that he had been apprehended. I-3-I SP SQD who was surprised by the snoop operation, was informed to be on the lookout for a possible return of BARBIE. (B-2)

b. BARBIE had promised I-3-I SP SQD to pay a return visit on 4 March 1947. BARBIE kept this appointment and arrived on 4 March 1947. He stated that he had been in KASSEL (L52/C20), Augusta Victoria Strasse 7 when the raid took place but was able to slip into the bathroom and later into a waste dump escaping detection. After the raid he reentered his room and slept the rest of the night. The man arrested was also named BECKER, SA Sturmbannfuhrer, who had some contact with the ELLERSICK group, but he is not the real BARBIE. BARBIE had used the name of BECKER so that he could at times use the room of the real BECKER. (B-2)

c. He commented on the snoop operation as being of no great consequence; that actually no real underground existed but that the action undertaken to apprehend known personalities was dictated by British politics and not because of threatened action by a ~~Government~~ ~~Authority~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~ ~~United~~ ~~Kingdom~~.

d. It is of special interest to note that BARBIE and WENZEL, Peter, were contacted by I-3-I SP SQD after the snoop operation. WENZEL, who was not at his MUNICH residence but in vicinity of BAD WOEHRISHOFEN, BAVARIA (M19/Y13), exact address is unknown, was notified via telegram by his mother in MUNICH that a raid had taken place and that he was not to return. He is at present in this small Bavarian settlement and can be contacted whenever deemed necessary. (B-2)

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Hq, CIC Region I, 970th CIC Det, APO 154, MCIT dtd 29 March 1947, Subject: Operation FLORENCE, Re: Progress Report

e. BARRIE is now leery of returning to KASSEL (L52/C20) and is spending his time between BRECHSAL (L50/B65) and SCHROEDER (L49/832). Since he has no real residence he has requested X-3-I SP SQD to arrange for his being properly registered by the German police so that he can draw ration cards. This agent will accomplish the proper registering of BARRIE so as to be able to keep tab on his whereabouts. He is using the name of SPIER, Claus. (B-3)

f. It is the intention to use BARRIE in penetrating what appears to be a Russian agent or courier center in [redacted] (A) (For information on this Center see MOIC, Inclosure 3, attached) BARRIE has expressed his willingness to undertake this task. It is felt that the use of BARRIE would serve a two-fold purpose; keep him under surveillance and utilize a man of some experience to penetrate this center. He has become relatively dependent upon X-3-I SP SQD for funds and ration cards. It is believed that a tight control over him can be maintained. (B-3)

g. WENZEL appears to have a contact that leads to BANDERA. He has indicated that he had contact with a former SS Sturmabfuhrer of the SS HAUPTAMT, who was a liaison man to the Ukrainian groups. It is felt that he should be exploited in this direction and also to bring within the scope of this Operation his contacts with subversive groups in Bavaria. (B-3)

3. AGENT'S NOTES, COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. It is recommended that BARRIE not be apprehended but that this Headquarters be allowed to exploit him with the aim of getting more complete information on that portion of the organization driven underground by Operation SELECTION BOARD. To utilize him for the penetrating of a possible Russian inspired courier center in [redacted]

b. It is recommended that WENZEL not be apprehended. His contacts, some of which were on the target list of SELECTION BOARD indicate that he is an active organizer. He has become dependent upon X-3-I SP SQD for funds and a new hide-out in Bavaria making it relatively certain that he is under the control of this Operation. It is intended that his acquaintance with a former SS Sturmabfuhrer who appears to be in contact with BANDERA be fully exploited.

RE : Investigation of Supposed Russian Courier Center

1. REASON FOR AND OUTLINE OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY:

This investigation was undertaken to clarify vague reports that a SED or Russian courier center existed in [REDACTED] (B-3)

2. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY:

a. X-3-I SP SQD has brought to the attention of this agent what appears to be a meeting spot for personalities connected with subversive activities. The center of activity is in [REDACTED]. It has been observed that a Herr PETERSON of that town has been transporting unknown personalities in and out of his residence in the early morning hours. He is a known Communist and active in communistic affairs. (B-3)

b. It has been observed that the personalities in contact with PETERSON do not appear to be Germans and that his activities in the early morning hours is suspect. It is believed that every four weeks a courier arrives from BERLIN with large sums of allied marks and printed matter; that upon the arrival of this individual a noticeable increase in the activities of Herr PETERSON is apparent. (B-3)

3. AGENT'S NOTES, COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. The information on what may be a meeting point for Russian inspired couriers is very sketchy. This agent does not have sufficient basis for making a positive statement. However, the principal informant feels strongly that PETERSON is the focal point of a Russian courier center and should be investigated.

1. REASON FOR AND OUTLINE OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY: Reference is made to TOP SECRET Summary of Information this Headquarters dated 20 February 1947, Paragraph 3-f.

2. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY: Informant WALTER, hereinafter designated as I-3-I Sp Sqd, in his efforts to penetrate an underground organization in HAMBURG (LSL/555) was placed in contact with a group with its center in HAMBURG (LSL/074). The first information that such a group existed came from ██████████ of HAMBURG. (Listed in report 20 December 1946 - ██████████ died in February 1947 of a heart attack in a cafe in HAMBURG) I-3-I Sp Sqd was informed that a WENZEL, Peter, former SS Obersturmfuehrer, residing at Boettengerstrasse 7, near Dachaustrasse, MUNICH (M49/185) was a contact man with this group. 6-1

b. WENZEL was first contacted by I-3-I Sp Sqd on 3 January 1947. It was not possible to establish his identity beyond information received from ██████████. He was reticent to mention the names of personalities in the HAMBURG group but agreed to pay a visit to I-3-I Sp Sqd in SCHORNDORF (L49/532). Upon his visit to SCHORNDORF it was agreed that I-3-I Sp Sqd be brought into contact with the leading members of this group in MUNICH during the second week of February. 6-2

c. This meeting took place on the 13 February 1947 in the home of WENZEL. I-3-I Sp Sqd accompanied by ADGBURG, Dr. Emil were introduced to a BECKER and a MAUMANN. BECKER claimed to be in contact with a group in KASSEL (LS2/C20) and MAUMANN with a group in HAMBURG (LSL/074). The real identity of these two personalities was not revealed; however, it was hinted that MAUMANN was the former SD chief of LEIPZIG (NS2/EZ1) and that both of the groups mentioned were part of a larger organization in the British Zone. Further organizational plans or information regarding personalities were not divulged. 6-2

d. On 20 February 1947, BECKER visited I-3-I Sp Sqd in SCHORNDORF. He appeared to be impressed with the ability of I-3-I Sp Sqd and willing to reveal more information about himself and his contacts. He stated that his real name was BARBIE, alias BECKER, Fridolin and SPIER, Claus; that he was in the SS BEWER in LYON, France, and is at present wanted by the British. He claimed that he had recently

been arrested in MARBURG but jumped out of the CIC jeep and escaped. He can be reached in KASSEL at August Victoriastrasse No. 7 under the name of BECKER, Fridolin; in BRUCHSAL (L50/R65) with Baron MENZINGEN, Telephone No. 15. (Note: Real name BARBIE used in remainder of this report.) He claimed to be in loose contact with a man named BOHAFFER, purportedly former adjutant to DOERKLE, WILKENING, and one ELLERSICK, all located in the British Zone. X-3-I Sp Sgd was unable to get more complete information as to the size, location, and intentions of this group. 8-2

e. He further stated that the MARBURG group was being led by NAUMANN, fnu, former SD Chief of LEIPZIG; that he (BARBIE) was in close contact with NAUMANN but could not give his first name or actual address in MARBURG. NAUMANN and his group were supposed to be fairly active in having placed most of its members in the GOETTINGER University where they had taken up contact with some extremely nationalistic professors. 8-3

f. BARBIE agreed to return to SCHORNDORF for another visit with X-3-I Sp Sgd on 4 March 1947. He was in need of a notice of employment (Arbeitsanweisung) which was promised to him upon his return. 8-2

g. The above information was received by this agent too late to have any effect in the execution of Operation SELECTION BOARD.

3. AGENT'S NOTES, COMMENTS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. It is recommended that, since BARBIE is a high priority on the target list of SELECTION BOARD, his possible return to visit X-3-I Sp Sgd be closely watched. If he should not be on the list of personalities listed as apprehended then X-3-I Sp Sgd will be instructed to gain some control over BARBIE so that he will be available for arrest if deemed necessary.

b. It is also recommended that Target 73 SELECTION BOARD be brought under the control of X-3-I Sp Sgd in case he is not apprehended. It appears that this Operation has now come into contact with several personalities of SELECTION BOARD. In the event that the two personalities listed in this report are not apprehended, it may be advisable to further penetrate the remnants of the SELECTION BOARD group by tying them in with this Operation.

3. It is agreed that BARRIE, Klaus, SS Hstuf, be arrested as quickly as feasible, bearing in mind the security of Region I informants.

4. It is further agreed that the Baron von MENZINGEN not be apprehended at this time pending investigation by Region I.

5. The hunt for OTTO, Wolfgang, alias WENZEL, has been called off and Region IV has been informed.

6. The following information on NAUMANN, fmu, is available at this Headquarters. This information was secured during Operation GOPHER. There is no previous record at this Headquarters.

a. NAUMANN, Christoph or Max, alias Cornelius, formerly lived at TREYSI, near MAREBURG. He is presently residing at OEDLSEEDL near BOESFELDE/WEBER. (Region III has been keeping his home under surveillance but NAUMANN has not been home lately.) According to BARKHAUSEN, Kurt, (Target No. 2, Master Target List, Operation SELECTION BOARD) NAUMANN is a former H.S. Fuehrungs-officer of Army Group S.W., with a rank of Captain i. G. The following can be quoted as some of NAUMANN's past contacts:

While Regions I and III pressed the search for Barbie in Stuttgart and Marburg, CIC agent Robert S. Taylor, stationed in the Memmingen office of CIC's Region IV, had located Barbie through a far different procedure. Since April 1946, one of agent Taylor's carded informants (paid sources) in Memmingen had been Kurt Merk, a former Abwehr (military intelligence) specialist who had served in Dijon, France during the war; "one of the best Counter Intelligence men in France during the German occupation," according to Taylor.

RE: WILSON, Walter

1. For request Region VIII, 1946, VIII-6145, dtd 20 Jan 47, and MOLO, Reg VIII, dtd 19 Mar 47; MOLO, Reg I, I-1-3416, dtd 4 Mar 47; MOLO ltr, D 125551, dtd 3 Apr 47; and 1st Ind. Reg IV, IV-879, dtd 3 Apr 47; all re Subject, this Agent forwards the following report to clarify the status of Walter WILSON and his relation to OIG, Region IV, Sub Region Memmingen (formerly Memmingen).

2. For clarity's sake it is felt necessary by this Agent to state the entire story of relations between WILSON and this Agent.

a. WILSON, Walter, is a cover name for informant S-4-IV-K. His real name is WILK, Kurt Josef. For simplicity he will be referred to as WILSON in this report.

b. WILSON was arrested by this Agent in February 1946 as an automatic arrest - abwehr - and also for suspected subversive actions. Subsequent investigation by this Agent and by HQ-Memmingen Sub Region, Region I, cleared WILSON of the subversive charges. WILSON, through the action of this Agent, was released from a POW en route to a CIA because the G.I. no longer fell under the automatic arrest category.

(Comment: Reference is made to Summary of Information, Reg I, dtd 19 Jan 46, Re WILK, Kurt, and to MOLO's, Memmingen Sub Region, dtd 6 Mar 46 and 23 Mar 46, Re MOLO.)

c. Realizing WILSON's possible value as an informant due to his background and training, this Agent placed him on a probationary status for several months as a minor informant. It should be mentioned here that he was considered one of the best Counter Intelligence men in France during the German occupation.

1. Reason for investigation: Investigation was instigated in compliance with instructions contained in subject operation dated 13 February 1947, and 1st Indorsement Headquarters Region III dated 15 February 1947, III-3796. On original date set for operation, this office was advised not to contact Barfusserstrasse No. 35 bei Schmidt which was reported as a meeting place for BARBIE, Claus. Verbal instructions received from Commanding Officer, Region III, 970th CIC detachment, gave clearance for a raid on subject address on 12 April 1947. On 17 April 1947, subject raid on 35 Barfusserstrasse was completed and report of subject raid is hereby submitted.

2. Synopsis of previous investigation: See pertinent reports this Sub-Region "Operation Selection Board."

3. Synopsis of present investigation:

a. At approximately 2000, on 17 April 1947, this office conducted a raid of a building located on Barfusserstrasse 35, MARBURG (L51/G62), Kreis MARBURG, Sub-Region MARBURG. A thorough search was made of the 3rd floor of the building for possible leads and additional information on Operation Selection Board. All persons found at Barfusserstrasse 35 during the raid, were subsequently interrogated. They are as follows:

1. SCHMIDT, Dora
2. SCHMIDT, Else
3. SCHMIDT, Margarete
4. LUDWIG, Martha
5. SCHMUELLING, Heinz

b. During a cross interrogation of SCHMIDT, Dora and SCHMIDT, Margarete, the following information was obtained concerning BECKER, Claus, alias BARBIE, alias BEHRENS:

1. Sometime in the Winter 1945, one Frau *Kathe* GROSS, residing at Liebigstrasse 32, MARBURG, Kreis MARBURG,

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introduced BECKER, Klaus to the SCHMIDT family and asked the SCHMIDTS to give lodging to BECKER, who had come from KASSEL to study at the University of MARBURG. Furthermore Frau GROSS stated that BECKER, had just been released from a Prisoner of War Camp. SCHMIDT, Robert took a liking to BECKER and accepted him into his home, where BECKER stayed until August 1946. Prior to his departure, BECKER told SCHMIDT, Dora that he was going to KASSEL (L52/Q20) first and that after a short stay there, he would leave for DUSSELDORF (L52/P39), where his mother BECKER, Maria was living. The exact address in DUSSELDORF is unknown, however SCHMIDT Dora remembers BECKER mentioning that his mother was staying in a small room on Reihallee or Reitallee. Since his departure from MARBURG in August 1946, BECKER was visited the SCHMIDT family once in October 1946, once in December, 1946, twice in February 1947 and his last visit to the SCHMIDT house was on 16 April 1947. During every visit to the SCHMIDT family BECKER stayed overnight and would leave the next morning. BECKER mentioned to SCHMIDT, Dora that he was either coming from KASSEL and going to DUSSELDORF or vice-versa. SCHMIDT, Dora also stated that during BECKER's stays at their house, she had seen lebensmittelkarten and other identification papers that had been made out to the name BECKER, Klaus and that they had been issued to BECKER in KASSEL. Furthermore, she believed that his mother is registered in DUSSELDORF with the name of BECKER, Maria, born in BRRESLAU.

2. During the time BECKER stayed at Barfusserstrasse 33 MARBURG, numerous visitors would come to see him, some of whom would also spend a night or two there. Among his acquaintances are the following persons:

a. PRIEHS, Fritz Dr. alias PRUESS, met BECKER during the first months of 1946; Saw BECKER quite often, the last time being at the beginning of February 1947. Dr. PRIEHS was arrested during Operation Selection Board.

b. OTTO, Wolfgang, alias WENZEL, came to see BECKER, twice in MARBURG during the summer of 1946. He stayed over night at the SCHMIDT house, and then left without reappearing again.

c. SCHMUELLING, Heinz, residing at Barfusserstrasse 32, MARBURG, Kreis MARBURG, Marburg University Student, met BECKER at the SCHMIDT home in the summer of 1946. He saw BECKER the last time on 16 April 1947, but did not admit this fact.

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d. GROSS, Katha, residing at Liebigstrasse 32, MARBURG, Kreis MARBURG, originally introduced BECKER TO THE SCHMIDT family sometime in the Winter of 1945.

e. LUDWIG, ^{mother} ~~Kath~~, residing at Rotengraben, MARBURG, Kreis MARBURG, presently employed as a nurse at the Deutschhausstrasse hospital, met BECKER at the SCHMIDT house, however refuses to admit it.

f. SCHNEIDER, Kurt, approximately 20-24 years of age, visited BECKER in various occasions, stayed overnight at the SCHMIDT house in Summer of 1946.

g. BECKER, Klaus usually visits a farmer at HIMMELBERG (LS1/085), from whom he obtains food, which is rationed. BECKER, usually takes this food to DUSSELDORF to his mother. The farmer is supposedly some friend which BECKER met during World War II.

d. During the last visit which BECKER made to the SCHMIDT house on 16 April 1947, he stated that he was on his way to KASSEL, where he is to meet some friends. No identity was revealed. Further-more BECKER mentioned that he would come back to MARBURG in 6 or 8 weeks on his return to DUSSELDORF. BECKER left MARBURG on 17 April 1947 at approximately 1230.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE

SUBJECT: HOFFMANN, Emil

1. Per request coded T W X, ltd 22 May 1947, Hqs, 970th CIC Det., EUCOM, signed INSKEEP, requesting clarification of pars. 56 and 57 of Top Secret Tri Weekly Reprt VI, Hqs., Region IV, Re Subject, the following report is submitted.

2. Source of this information was listed in report as Informant X-4-IV-K. Real source of this information was Klaus BARBIE (Reference Operation SELECTION BOARD and Orientation and Guidance Report No. 2, par. 5 (1) (a)). It is to be noted that the information was evaluated "B-3". Klaus BARBIE is now listed and registered as Informant X-22-IV-K.

a. It is felt necessary at this point to make some clarification of BARBIE's relations to this Agent. On approximately 10 April 1947, Informant X-4-IV-K reported to this Agent that he had met, quite by accident, an old friend of his from France (X-4-IV-K was an Abwehr Officer in France) named Klaus BARBIE, who had excellent connections to sources of CIC Information. The name was immediately recognized by this Agent as being that of one of the chief personalities of Operation SELECTION BOARD. Informant X-4-IV-K mentioned at that time that BARBIE knew something of British attempts to recruit unapprehended Selection Board personalities for intelligence work.

b. After conversation with Colonel Garvey, Commanding Officer, Region IV, on 14-15 April 1947, it was decided to use BARBIE as an informant. His use, however, would be subject to two conditions: REGRADED CONFIDENTIAL BY AUTHORITY OF COL D. G. ERSKINE BY *[Signature]*

(1). That he check with HQ 66th CIC Det. on any information concerning British use of Selection Board personalities.

(2). That he break off any connections he may have with illegal SS elements and Selection Board personalities.

c. On approximately 18 April 1947, this Agent met BARBIE personally in MEMMINGEN (148/X83). BARBIE agreed to write a report concerning the first point above, in clarification of British interest in Selection Board figures (See inclosures 1 and 2 attached to this report). The second

point above was also agreed to by BARBIE because, as he pointed out, his connection with SS elements was necessary only to retain his own personal freedom.

d. BARBIE impressed this Agent as an honest man, both intellectually and personally, absolutely without nerves or fear. He is strongly anti-Communist and a Nazi idealist who believes that he and his beliefs were betrayed by the Nazis in power.

e. Since BARBIE started to work for this Agent he has provided extensive connections to French Intelligence Agencies working in the US Zone, to Banat German circles, to high ranking Rumanian circles, and to high Russian circles in the US Zone. The following reports are directly or indirectly due to BARBIE's use as Informant:

(1). IV-K-1208.03 Re French Intelligence Activities from Lindau into the American Zone.

(2). WRENCH-K Report 13 K, Re Resettlement of Banat Germans (Rumanian Volksdeutsche) in France and in the Saargebiet.

(3). IV-K-1277, Re Russian Anti Soviet Underground Youth Movement.

3. AGENT'S NOTES:

a. In reference to Orientation and Guidance Report No. 2, par. 5 (1) (a), it is stated that BARBIE should be arrested. It is requested that BARBIE be allowed to retain his freedom as long as he works for this Agent. It is felt that his value as an informant infinitely outweighs any use he may have in prison. Control over BARBIE's activities is obvious. It is felt that BARBIE will answer more fully and freely any questions concerning SS groups or Selection Board groups desired by higher headquarters, if he be allowed to retain his freedom. This opinion is based on this Agent's personal contact with BARBIE and the trust that BARBIE has placed in this Agent.

b. It is to be noted in Inclosure 2, Re Dr. Kurt ELLERSIEK, that BARBIE himself does not know ELLERSIEK personally, but knew of him through the SS grapevine and from reputation.

PURPOSE:

1. (1) Reorganize secret police, (2) resist occupation and new German authorities, (3) establish escape systems from GIE's, (4) establish contacts with Allied personnel through female agents. (S: LOOS)
2. The forming of Kio-Kimian based on SS principles without political aspirations (Date Jan 47, S: HOFFMAN)
3. Combining these elements "persecuted" by the Allies into a nationalistic organization. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)

DEVELOPMENT:

1. Apparently BARRIE's group was an independent group or a subsection of ELLERSIEK's "Organization fuer den deutschen Sozialismus."
2. Phase of development was in a preliminary build-up stage when it evidently disintegrated through the arrest of key persons during Operation Selection Board, or through the scare caused by the operation. (S: varied)

FINANCE:

1. HAMBURG black market activities; mostly dealings in soap. One sale was made in HAMBURG of a DEFFELIE's carpet (?). (S: HOFFMAN)
2. Counterfeiting in HAMBURG. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)
3. HAMBURG black market deals in jewels obtained from the Soviet Zone through one HEINZEL, fma. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)

ARMS:

1. Arms were buried in an airraid shelter near HAMBURG. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)
2. During the 12 November 46 meeting of MOUSE and BARRIE, BARRIE's bodyguards were armed - one showed a .635 pistol to MOUSE stating that the other bodyguard was armed also.

ACTIONS:

1. Obtained false D-2 forms (Date Aug 46, S: HAAS)
2. Sgt AHRENS obtained 100 D-2 forms complete in MUNICH. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)
3. A German Wehrmacht "F-CORANT" radio was employed by BARRIE's group. (Date Oct 46, S: MOUSE)

1. Reference is made to letter Headquarters, CIC Region IV, dated 17 October 1947, subject as above, and 1st Indorsement thereon from Headquarters, 870th CIC Detachment, EUCOM, dated 29 October 1947, subject as above, file D-153204. The attached MIC concerning the status and activities of Klaus HARBIE is forwarded per verbal request of Captain GLASS (EUCOM) in telephone conversation with Mr. BRUEHL (Region IV), on 17 November 1947.

2. This headquarters strongly concurs with Special Agent SANDU's comments relative to the probable loss of trust on the part of informants of the lot of X-5067-IV-2 if Subject is arrested. However, if some assurance can be given to HARBIE that he will be permitted to return to his work in this region, as well as given some type of preferential treatment during the period of his interrogation at EUCOM, it is the opinion of this headquarters that there would be no loss of prestige or trust by this organization in its relation with these informants. It is believed that any treatment other than that outlined above would result in material damage to the informant net. HARBIE has been in the important position of establishing a long range penetration of French intelligence installations in the French zone, which is beginning to consistently show excellent results.

3. It is requested that this headquarters be advised of the disposition of this case desired by Headquarters, 870th CIC Detachment, EUCOM.

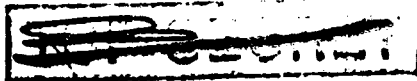

1. Reference operation SELECTION BOARD. Following information is herewith submitted regarding subject, as directed by S-3, Headquarters Region IV, CIC.

2. a. Subject was originally contacted by Special Agent ROBERT S TAYLOR, on 18 May 1947 through informant X-3067-IV-K, who was running a network of informants for Special Agent Taylor. After an interview with Special Agent Taylor, subject was integrated into the network of X-3067-IV-K

b. Subject, who has extensive connections with high level former German intelligence circles, immediately began exploiting these contacts and furnished this organization with extremely good material.

c. In July 1947, subject was designated by X-3067-IV-K as his assistant and as such took over that portion of the net which specializes on French intelligence activities in the French and US zones of Germany. In this capacity subject has so far demonstrated exceedingly successful results.

d. Since taking over Special Agent Taylor's net, this agent has had several conversations with subject and has scrutinized subject's work very carefully, and it is believed that subject has devoted all his efforts to his work.

e. Although it is fully realized that as a member of operation SELECTION BOARD, subject's interrogation would reveal information of value, it is also felt that his arrest and possibly his delivery to British authorities would damage considerably the trust and faith which informants place in this organization.

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3. AGENT'S COMMENTS:

a. It is strongly recommended that subject not be arrested.

b. It is further recommended that, inasmuch as subject has in the past shown his willingness to answer any questions, subject's interrogation be conducted on a voluntary basis.

c. In accordance with above recommendations, it is requested that subject's interrogation be conducted by Headquarters Region IV, or that arrangements be made to avoid that subject be incarcerated or in any way treated as a prisoner while being interrogated.

d. It is believed that if above recommendations are taken into consideration, subject will voluntarily submit to any interrogation and that subject's services to this organization will not be lost. Furthermore the prestige which this organization enjoys with its informants will remain undamaged.

1. Reference is made to letter, Hq CIC Region IV, subject as above, dated 25 November 1947, and to paragraph 3, 1st indorsement, Hq 970th CIC Detachment dated 1 December 1947.

2. In compliance with instructions contained in above referenced indorsement, preparations are being made by this headquarters to have Klaus BARBIE transferred for interrogation to ECIC by 12 December 1947.

3. This headquarters is fully aware of the provisions of directives cited in above referenced 1st indorsement regarding scope and limitations of coverage of CIC targets. It is emphasized that it is not the desire of this headquarters to violate in any manner whatsoever the spirit or intent of these directives. It is felt that the wording of the basic letter (CIC Region IV) with reference to BARBIE's French penetration was somewhat vague, and the following information is submitted in order to clarify any misunderstanding.

e. Kurt WERK (X-3067-IV-E) has been employed as an informant for this Region since March 1946. His work has been mainly directed toward uncovering Soviet influences in German as well as displaced persons groups. His endeavours have been considered very satisfactory by this headquarters. WERK's success has been due chiefly to his excellent connections to former German intelligence personnel, as well as to the general high caliber of the men he has been using as sub-informants. His main sub-informants are as follows:

- (1) Dr. Emil AUGSBURG, residing in KEMPTEN, former chief of the BERLIN-WANZSEE Institute

These men have worked their way into intelligence positions in the French Zone, where they have access to classified information of counter intelligence interest (including leads on suspected Soviet and French agents who are crossing into the US Zone at border crossing points believed to be in the CIC Region IV area). These acquaintances visit MERK and BARBIE periodically at their homes in KEMPTEN (CIC Region IV) and pass on this information to them. They, in turn, occasionally receive minor favors in the form of cigarettes or food from MERK and BARBIE. In view of the proximity of MERK's residence in KEMPTEN to the French-US border, and the fact that the leads obtained are of counter intelligence interest, this headquarters has always encouraged him to accept information of this nature. It is emphasized that these sub-informants were never given any relevant EEI's of any importance other than to question closely the information which they submitted. Their information is merely accepted. This headquarters has no knowledge of any provision in current counter intelligence directives which prohibits the accepting of information of counter intelligence interest (particularly information which affects US interests in the US Zone of Germany) which is submitted voluntarily by persons who reside within the US Zone.

c. Since it would be very difficult to recite all reports which have been compiled of information submitted by MERK and his sub-sources in the past twenty (20) months, the following reports which have been forwarded by CIC Region IV to Hq 970th CIC Detachment, EUCCOM, are listed for the months September 1947 through November 1947:

The original CROWCASS list of July 1945, which had listed Barbie as wanted by the French for murder of civilians and torture of military personnel had been superseded by a new CROWCASS list in March 1947, just prior to Barbie's recruitment. This new list contained the name of "Klaus Barbie" as wanted by France for "murder." The new list, which directed that "all previous CROWCASS wanted lists should be destroyed," eliminated any reference to torture and did not specify "civilians" as the victims. Furthermore, the CROWCASS list noted, "The information given in this list about each person is all that is contained in the Wanted Reports filed with CROWCASS. The descriptions given are not summaries." (Emphasis in original.)

CROWCASS authorities felt it necessary to publish a directive in December 1946 entitled "What is CROWCASS?" and to admit that "[i]t is apparent both from the personal experience of the members of the Staff of this Organization, and the official documents and inquiries transmitted to this Office, that a complete answer to that question is required by all interested authorities of the Allied Nations."

1. This List is the first part of the Consolidation of the names of all persons in CROWCASS Records who are wanted in connection with War Crimes and includes all Wanted Reports received up to 31 Jan. 1947 plus a few additional names not published in previous lists.
2. This list contains the names of all persons stated to be of German nationality who according to the information passed to CROWCASS are still wanted by the Allied Nations in connection with War Crimes. Persons who are stated to be of nationality other than German will be listed in the second part of this Consolidated List, which is in course of preparation and will be distributed shortly. All persons of UNKNOWN name will also be included in the second part.
3. This list also includes the names of all persons stated to be of German nationality who have been listed in the United Nations War Crimes Commission Lists Nos. 1 - 50 who, so far as CROWCASS is aware, are still wanted.
4. It is considered probable that some of the persons listed have been detained, some tried, some sentenced and others may be no longer wanted. If that is so, CROWCASS has not been informed and the various Allied Authorities who can supply such information are requested to do so immediately in order that CROWCASS Records may be adjusted. It is also possible that some Wanted Reports went astray during the move of CROWCASS from Paris to Berlin and the names are therefore not included in this list. If such is the case new Wanted Reports should be submitted immediately and the names will be published in a supplementary List.
5. Names of persons known to be detained, and where the Wanting Authority has been informed accordingly, are not included in this list.
6. It is hoped that by now all authorities receiving a copy of this List will also have received and read the pamphlet entitled "What is CROWCASS?" in order that a better understanding may be reached concerning the functions of this organization and the service given to and required from all using agencies.
7. All recipients of this List are reminded of the following requirements as previously set out in the frontispieces of CROWCASS Wanted Lists:
 - (i) If any person listed should be located and detained the CROWCASS Detention Report (to be invariably submitted in respect of all Detainees) should be completed showing Reason for Arrest as "CROWCASS Consolidated Wanted List (Part I) CR.NO. ..." or "Possibly CROWCASS Consolidated Wanted List (Part I) CR.NO. ...". If a Wanted Person is located only and not detained as full a description as possible of the person located should be set out in letter form and forwarded to CROWCASS including the reason for non-detention.
 - (ii) In the event of CROWCASS thus receiving information of a match or possible match between a Wanted Person and a Detained or located Person the wanting nation is immediately informed, even although the Detainee may be held in the custody of that nation. In some cases where the persons name has not been listed by the UNWCC and where extradition is applied for considerable delay may be unavoidable. (See page (ii)). If and when the extradition of a CROWCASS Wanted Personality has taken place CROWCASS should be informed immediately.
 - (iii) If a Detaining Authority receives instructions to Release or Transfer any Detainee who is possibly or definitely a CROWCASS Wanted Personality a check should first be made with that Authority's War Crimes Group HQ. and a copy of the communication endorsed to CROWCASS.
 - (iv) The information given in this list about each person is all that is contained on the Wanted Reports filed with CROWCASS. The descriptions given are not summaries.
8. It is particularly requested that the War Crimes HQ.'s of all the Allied Nations endeavour to make special arrangements to have this List distributed to all Detaining Authorities, Prisoner of War Information Bureaus (or the equivalent) and all other HQ.'s or Formations which may be able to assist in locating the persons listed.
9. No doubt the Inter-Allied National policy as regards the probable duration of the Investigation of War Crimes will depend to quite a considerable extent upon the number of Alleged War Criminals "still at large" in the sense of not being in the custody of the nation who wants them. To help to reduce this period of duration and the enormous expenditure and man power involved all Allied Nations are again requested to exploit every means within their power to reduce this List as quickly as possible.
10. Pages 266 to 271 of Volume A-L include the names of persons (also A-L), especially listed under different headings owing to a lack of detailed information suitable for listing under the normal headings.
11. At Appendix "A" of Volume M-Z will be found a table showing the total number of persons included in this List who are wanted by each of the Allied Nations.
12. At Appendix "B" of Volume M-Z will be found a list of persons (herein listed as wanted) regarding whom Detention Reports have been received since the preparation of this List for publication was commenced.
13. CROWCASS has a teleprinter station in its office. It is "Station DFEP - Berlin". Using agencies are requested to make use of it as it greatly speeds up replies to requests for information.
14. CROWCASS holds large stocks of Blank Wanted and Detention Reports and they can be had on application by TPM, Signal or letter.
15. Whilst every effort has been made to eliminate error from this List there may still be left a few discrepancies which although unavoidable are regretted.

- CONCERNING THE UNITED NATIONS WAR CRIMES COMMISSION.

The following is quoted from Section X of Information Paper No. 1 issued by the Reference Division of the United Nations Information Organization, London:

INTER-ALLIED DECLARATION OF DECEMBER 17, 1942

On December 17, 1942, a Declaration was made simultaneously in London, Moscow, and Washington in connection with reports that the German authorities were engaged in exterminating the Jewish people in Europe. In this Declaration, the Governments of Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Greece, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, the United States of America, the United Kingdom, the Soviet Union and Yugoslavia and the French National Committee reaffirmed their solemn resolution that those responsible should not escape retribution and their intention to press on with the necessary practical measures to that end.

There was some delay in setting up the United Nations War Crimes Commission, but it was eventually brought into being by a meeting of Government representatives at the British Foreign Office on October 20, 1943.

COMPOSITION OF THE COMMISSION

The Commission consists of seventeen members: the representatives of the Governments of Australia, Belgium, Canada, China, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Greece, India, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, the United Kingdom, the United States of America and Yugoslavia. The representatives are all distinguished lawyers or diplomats.

If a representative is unable to act, or for some other special reason, he may be replaced.

The Commission may hear experts.

The first Chairman was the United Kingdom representative, Sir Cecil Hurst, Vice-President of the Permanent Court of International Justice, formerly legal Adviser to the Foreign Office. After his resignation on account of illhealth, he was replaced by the Right Hon. Lord Wright, Lord of Appeal in Ordinary, who represents Australia on the Commission. Lord Wright has been Chairman since January 31, 1945.

TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE COMMISSION

The Commission has limited functions. It is primarily a fact-finding body, though it has also advisory functions.

Its terms of reference were defined in the Lord Chancellor's statement of October 7, 1942. Its purpose, he said is to investigate war crimes committed against nationals of the United Nations, recording the testimony available, and to report from time to time to the Governments of those nations cases in which such crimes appear to have been committed, naming and identifying wherever possible the persons responsible.

After its creation, it was entrusted with advisory functions, namely to make recommendations to the Governments on the methods to be adopted to ensure the surrender or capture of the persons wanted for trial as war criminals and on the tribunals by which they should be tried.

HOW THE COMMISSION OPERATES

The United Nations War Crimes Commission prepares lists of war criminals on the basis of evidence submitted by National War Crimes Offices which have been set up to detect, investigate and record evidence of war crimes committed against the citizens or subjects of their own countries.

The lists are furnished to the apprehending authorities - at present the military authorities - in order that the persons accused of crimes against people or property may be sent back to the country against which they have offended. This was the procedure contemplated in the Moscow Declaration on Atrocities by President Roosevelt, Mr. Winston Churchill and Marshal Stalin which was issued on November 1, 1943 and by the Foreign Secretaries of their three countries, who had been attending the Moscow Conference of October 16 to 30.

After referring to the atrocities, massacres and mass executions which were being perpetrated by the Hitlerite forces, the Declaration said:

"The United Kingdom, the United States and the Soviet Union

... speaking in the interests of the thirty-two United Nations ... solemnly declare and give full warning of their declaration as follows: At the time of the granting of any armistice to any Government which may be set up in Germany, those German officers and men and members of the Nazi Party who have been responsible for or who have taken a consenting part in the above atrocities, massacres and executions will be sent back to the countries in which their abominable deeds were done in order that they may be judged and punished according to the laws of these liberated countries and of the Free Governments which will be erected therein. Lists will be compiled in all possible detail from all these countries ..."

Offences against members of the Allied armed forces will be dealt with summarily by military courts, in accordance with international custom.

The following is a Statement issued by UNWCC especially for incorporation in this Consolidated Wanted List:

"All Allied Authorities concerned are reminded that in order to secure extradition they should submit to the United Nations War Crimes Commission in London dossiers with charges concerning the offences committed by persons wanted. The United Nations War Crimes Commission in accordance with its terms of reference decides whether there appears to be either prima facie evidence sufficient to justify the handing over for trial of individuals accused of War Crimes or else sufficient ground to consider the wanted persons as suspects or material witnesses"

WHAT IS CROWCASS ?

1. It is apparent both from the personal experience of the members of the Staff of this Organization, and the official documents and inquiries transmitted to this Office, that a complete answer to that question is required by all interested authorities of the Allied Nations.

2. C.R.O.W.C.A.S.S. stands for The Central Registry of War Criminals and Security Suspects.

3. This account is divided into two parts:

Part I OBJECT

Part II SYSTEM

AND Appendix "A" -- Requirements from all Allied Authorities, with notes on Common Errors made in Submission of Data.

PART I - THE OBJECT OF C.R.O.W.C.A.S.S.

The end of the war in Europe gave the Allied Nations the opportunity thoroughly to consider the problem of tracing and bringing to justice War Criminals. Each Nation had its own particular, ever-increasing list of Wanted Criminals. Each Nation had in custody either as Prisoners of War, or Internees, persons who might possibly be wanted in connection with War Crimes by some other Nation.

The combined territory occupied by the Allied Nations was very large, and even if Allied H.Q. were able to co-ordinate information as to all persons Wanted and Detained by their individual Nations, the transmission of the information to each other would have been a most laborious and confusing undertaking.

To meet the necessity for some Central Inter-Allied Information Bureau, the Central Registry of War Criminals and Security Suspects was formed by SHAEF and began effectively functioning in Paris, approximately 20 months ago.

In the first instance, the Central Registry dealt with three types of persons: Wanted Persons, Detained Persons, and Prisoners of War, but subsequently the P.O.W. commitment was abandoned, leaving the Registry free to cope with Wanted and Detained only.

Efforts have been made, with fair success, to cover possible War Criminals amongst P.O.W., by maintaining close liaison with Allied Prisoner of War Information Bureaus circulating CROWCASS Wanted Lists to P.O.W. Camps.

The Object, then, of CROWCASS is to provide a pool into which information regarding Wanted and Detained persons can be poured, this information to be set up as a Register available to all Allied Nations, and at the same time, to provide the subject matter for the publication of Lists of Wanted and Detained persons.

SYSTEM

CROWCASS must be served in order to give service. CROWCASS, as a Registry only, cannot produce any information by the efforts or inspiration of its Staff.

The onus is therefore on all Wanting or Detaining authorities to provide both timely and efficient information to CROWCASS, in order that their opposite numbers of all the Allied Nations may be similarly served. For this purpose, two forms have been devised upon which to originate reports of Wanted or Detained persons - the CROWCASS Wanted Report, and the CROWCASS Detention Report. Particular notes regarding the completion of these will be found at Appendix "A".

The Operations Branch of CROWCASS is divided into the following Sections:

- a. Operations Control and Correspondence.
- b. Searching Section.
- c. Name Index Section.
- d. Publications Section.
- e. Report Filing Section.

Upon receipt of Wanted and Detention Reports, Operations Control scrutinizes them, records statistics, and passes the report to Searching Section.

The Searching Section compares each Report with the Name Index, which is sub-divided into Wanted and Detained, and contains the names of all subjects of Wanted and Detention Reports received previously. If a match, or possible match is made between a Wanted Report and a Detention Report, this information is conveyed immediately to the Wanting Authority via Operations Control and Correspondence. Whatever the result of searching, all reports are then passed to Name Index Section.

Name Index Section registers Wanted and Detention Reports, writes out Name Index Slips, and files them into the Name Index. With the exception of newly received Wanted Reports definitely matched with Detention Reports, all reports are then passed to Publications Section.

Publications Sections prepares typewritten lists of Wanted Persons and Detained Persons which are then reproduced as CROWCASS Wanted Lists and CROWCASS Detention Lists with an approximate distribution of 4,000 and 600 respectively.

When Publications Section have finished with Wanted and Detention Reports, they are passed to Report Filing Section where they are filed numerically and are available for future reference.

The foregoing paragraphs deal with the Routine System followed in dealing with Wanted and Detention Reports. In addition, CROWCASS received inquiries from all Allied Nations by letter, wire, or telephone, and transmits extracts from CROWCASS records as desired.

Notifications of persons no longer Wanted and Detainees who have been released, extradited to another Allied Nation, died, escaped, sentenced, or acquitted are also entered in CROWCASS records.

Security Suspects:

CROWCASS Wanted Lists Nos 1-3, Consolidated into the large printed Wanted List published in two parts (A-L and M-Z) dated July 1945 contained the names of some 80,000 Security Suspects. Although all Security Suspects listed were shown as such, considerable confusion arose as the result of these persons being listed as "Wanted". A person termed a "Security Suspect" is not known to have committed any specific crime nor has his name been quoted as a witness. He cannot therefore be properly classified as a Wanted Person. As the term implies, a Security Suspect is merely one whose past status, employment or associations classify him as one who may possibly become an active or passive sympathiser with any subversive effort to disturb the security of the post-war peace.

It was undoubtedly an initial error on the part of CROWCASS to publish the names of Security Suspects in a Wanted List. The realization of this has led to the setting up of a completely separate Name Index and Report Filing for Security Suspects. Extracts from this Index are now only transmitted in two instances:

(a) If a Detention Report is received upon which the sole Reason for Arrest is shown as "identical" or "Possibly identical" with a Security Suspect listed in the above-mentioned Wanted List. In such a case, a letter is sent to the Detaining Authority pointing out that the Detainee is a Security Suspect only and in so far as CROWCASS Records show is of no particular War Crimes interest.

(b) In reply to inquiries received from Public Safety Authorities who may perhaps be interested in the history of a Security Suspect.

Requirements from all Allied Authorities with notes on Common Errors
made in Submission of Data.

WANTED REPORTS.

To be completed and forwarded to CROWCASS in respect of all Nationals of ex-enemy countries who are wanted either as Alleged War Criminals, Suspected War Criminals, Witnesses to War Crimes, or for interrogation in connection with War Crimes. It is important to note that a Wanted Report should be filed with CROWCASS even if the filing authority is aware of the address or place of detention of the Wanted Person, as thereby an official claim is made on that person.

DETENTION REPORTS.

To be completed and forwarded to CROWCASS in respect of all Nationals of ex-enemy countries who are Detained as Alleged War Criminals, Suspected War Criminals, Witnesses to War Crimes, Automatic Arrestees, or for interrogation in connection with War Crimes.

A Detainee may be either a person who has been arrested in the first instance for one of the reasons stated above, or an ex-POW who has been re-classified as a Detainee as the result of Screening against Lists of Automatic Arrest Categories or Lists of Wanted Persons. In both instances, the CROWCASS Detention Report should be completed. It is important to note that this includes all cases of Detainees who are Wanted by the Nation detaining them, as the filing of Detention Reports will ensure that any other Allied Nation wanting these persons will be informed and that CROWCASS records will be properly adjusted.

COMPLETION OF WANTED REPORTS AND DETENTION REPORTS.

GENERAL:

Speciment copies of CROWCASS Wanted and Detention Reports are attached. At first sight, the lay-out of the reports any appear unnecessarily complicated, but there are very definite reasons for this.

a. An authority completing a Wanted Report is generally in possession of very limited information concerning the Wanted Person. Conversely, an authority completing a Detention Report has the Detainee himself and a mass of information concerning him which has to be summarized. The Wanted Report is therefore devised to extract every possible piece of information which may be available about the Wanted Person while the Detention Report provides what has been found to be the most useful and informative pattern into which the description and history of the Detainee can be summarized.

b. Although Allied Officers and Other Ranks assisted by English-speaking Germans supervise the processing of Wanted and Detention Reports, the work of Searching, Name Index. Slip writing and typing Publications Lists is carried out by a German Staff, few of whom speak much English. It is therefore necessary to work by "Rule of Thumb", so that information is available in a set form for Searchers, Name Index Slip-writers, and Publication Lists Typists. For these reasons, the following list of common errors made by compilers of Wanted and Detention Reports will be readily appreciated.

The correct completion of these section
of the Reports is of great value in com-
paring the records of Detainees and Wan-
ted Persons, also to provide a useful
history of every person listed in
CROWCASS Detention Lists. The mistakes
made in completing these section of the
Report are many and varied, ranging from
leaving the section blank to typing a
mass of information which is not
intelligible to the CROWCASS processing
staff. It may assist completing
authorities if a Detention Report is
compared with CROWCASS Detention Lists,
from No. 11 onwards, in which it will be
found, that the sections of the report
dealing with Occupation are listed under
the following headings.

1. Rank (Or Status)
2. Unit (Or Occupation)
3. Place.
4. Date.

Rank (or Status) should be easy to complete, Unit (or occupation) is meant to cover either Military, Naval, or Air Force Unit (if a member of the Armed Forces), nature of appointment and division if a Nazi Party member, or civilian Occupation. Place (town and country stationed in) and Date should present no difficulty. If the full history of the Detainee from 1 Jan 39 to time of arrest cannot be conveniently completed in the four sections provided, blank paper should be used to add any additional information which can be summarized under the four headings mentioned above.

RELEASES

A difficulty which often arises when Detainees are released, is that the Detaining Authority, who may have received the Detainee as a Transfer, may be unaware whether Detention Reports have previously been filed in respect of the persons released. Allied War Crimes H.Q. have been asked to make some provisions to cover this difficulty by an endorsement of the Detainee's documents being made whenever a Detention Report has been submitted.

Assuming that this procedure has now been adopted by all concerned, the notice of release need only include the full name of the person, his date of birth, the date of release and to where dispatched.

TRANSFERS

In view of the frequent transfers which must take place between camps in the same Zone, CROWCASS need only be informed of inter-zonal or international transfers. Requirements and comments are as for Releases.

DEATHS AND ESCAPES

As they occur.
Requirements and comments are as for Releases.

SENTENCES AND ACQUITTALS

Notices of these are invariably required, but only after confirmation. It is known that several Allied Nations have not informed CROWCASS as to sentences passed by their Military Tribunals, and these should now be listed retrospectively and forwarded.

GENERAL: 1. Language.

It will be appreciated that it is necessary for all correspondence and Reports to be originated in one language (English), in order that all Allied Authorities may receive equally efficient and speedy service from CROWCASS.

2. Submission of Wanted Lists to CROWCASS

It is considered that except for special internal reasons it should not be necessary for any authority other than CROWCASS to publish Wanted Lists. What is perhaps not fully appreciated is that a Wanted Report filed with CROWCASS constitutes not only an initial check against persons detained but the inclusion of the Wanted Persons name in CROWCASS Name Index provided a permanent guarantee that any Detention Report filed for the same person subsequently will be matched with the Wanted Report. Although it is not the function of CROWCASS to search other Wanted Lists against Records, this work has been undertaken by CROWCASS in order to be of as much service as possible to all Allied Nations. It is hoped that after perusal of this account, a clearer understanding of the CROWCASS organisation will lead to the elimination of other Wanted Lists.

It should be noted that when searching such lists, it is invariably found that a large proportion of the persons listed have not been made the subjects of CROWCASS Wanted Reports. This is particularly true of UNWCC listed persons. However UNWCC Lists are being checked against CROWCASS records and where a report on a person has not been filed with CROWCASS (and has therefore not been published by CROWCASS) necessary steps are being taken to publish the name and put it in the CROWCASS Name Index. Any information resulting from the check of UNWCC lists against CROWCASS records will be forwarded to the appropriate authorities.

All Allied Authorities concerned are reminded that in accordance with the decisions reached by the United Nations Conference held prior to the inauguration of the United Nations War Crimes Commission all Allied Authorities initiating Wanting Reports should invariably submit to UNWCC an account of the alleged charges with which the wanted person is concerned. The Commission then publishes lists of all persons wanted as perpetrators, witnesses or suspects in connection with charges which in accordance with the Articles agreed and laid down by the Allied Nations constitute Crimes against the Peace, War Crimes or Crimes against Humanity. If a wanted Person is not listed by UNWCC it may be found that his extradition from another nation's custody is difficult to obtain. Therefore CROWCASS and UNWCC should be served simultaneously.

IDENTIFICATION OF POSSIBLE MATCHES

After CROWCASS has informed a Wanting Authority of a Possible Match between a Detainee and a Wanted person, the Wanting Authority is invariably asked to inform CROWCASS whether identity can be established. It is very rare that this information is passed to CROWCASS whose records cannot therefore be adjusted.

Not Wanted by CROWCASS

The following matter is frequently sent to CROWCASS but is not required

1. Screening Reports: -- these should be submitted as Detention Reports.
2. Transfers, Releases, and other data concerning POWs. These are no longer required as records of POWs are no longer maintained by CROWCASS. The exception to this rule is the valuable assistance which can be given by Allied Prisoner of War Information Bureaus in screening CROWCASS Wanted Lists against their Indexes of POWs.
3. Any extraneous matter concerning Nazi Party members or War Crimes generally which has no direct reference to a Wanted Person or a Detainee.
4. Application for the extradition of a Detainee. - The function of CROWCASS is solely that of a Registry and does not include the authority to order or arrange extraditions. Such application should be made through the proper Liaison Channels.

IN CONCLUSION: --- Once again it is stated that CROWCASS exists for the service of All Allied Nations whether large or small and that only by following out the injunctions conveyed in this account can all be served fairly and equally.

This account is being published and distributed to all authorities on CROWCASS Distribution List and it is requested that all H.Q. who receive a number of copies for further distribution, will insure that every lower unit or formation interested in CROWCASS is duly served.

A directive issued in June 1949, apparently the only written guidance on the subject of use of former Gestapo personnel, acknowledged that there was "a certain amount of confusion" in the field on this subject and noted, "It should * * * be very firmly stated that the US authorities have not relaxed for one minute their moral rejection of War Criminals."

It continued:

It is the policy of this Headquarters to discourage the use of Gestapo personnel as further sources of this organization except in unusual circumstances. It may be necessary to use the Gestapo man for the following short term tasks:

1. To introduce the [CIC] Agent to other Gestapo personnel
2. To effect a meeting with former sources [of the Gestapo man]
3. To control an ex-source if the relationship is extremely well founded and it is practically

impossible for the agent to take over control of the source.

There is no objection to the use of the Gestapo man for purposes of 1 and 2 above provided the amount of time involved is short. A major project involving a long period of time * * * is to be discouraged. All requests for the use of Gestapo personnel to accomplish 3 above will be cleared and approved by this Headquarters. An extremely strong case must be presented and your report must show complete use of your existing facilities and techniques before the request will be approved.

of Gestapo Personnel

TO : See Distribution

1. This Headquarters has noted that insufficient attention has been paid to the interrogation of former Gestapo specialists on the KPD. IEI's cited under Paragraphs 111 B (1), 121 B (4, e, f), 121 B (3) of the O & O Report and the top priority list of the Target List have been either ignored or given cursory treatment by certain Regions. It is desired that appropriate attention be devoted by those Regions which have been delinquent in answering the cited IEI's.

2. Discussions with Regional operations personnel have indicated a certain amount of confusion regarding that which was desired and the policy of this Headquarters regarding further handling of ex-Gestapo personnel.

3. The inclosed brief is forwarded for your information and reference to the Operations, Intelligence, Security, and Political Subversion sections of this Headquarters.

4. Matters or situations not covered by the inclosed brief should be referred to this Headquarters for decision.

I Purpose: The purpose of such interrogations is the following:

A. To determine the history of the KPD in a particular area against which the current activities of the party may be evaluated.

B. To learn the methods and techniques used by the KPD which may be used in the future.

C. To determine exact background information regarding key personalities in order to evaluate their current importance or potential to perform "illegal" or clandestine activities.

D. To determine the identities of former Apparatus personalities, Moscow-trained members, secret KPD members who have deliberately remained under cover since 1945.

E. To determine which sources of the KPD may be possibly exploited as sources of this organization.

II What to Interrogate

There were three major sections of the KPD of key interest:

A. Section IV A1 (also called IV A1a): This section concerned itself with Communism and Marxism.

B. Section IV A2: This section concerned itself with Sabotage and espionage matters, including Soviet agents.

C. Section IV B: This section, set up in 1941 under orders of Gostape (if I recall R), was very similar to our own Technical Specialist section. It concerned itself with recruiting and control of sources. (Additional background information on the organization of the Gostape should be available in your local reference libraries or files.)

On the basis of interrogations conducted thus far, no hard and fast rule can be laid down as to which section was most knowledgeable regarding matters of primary concern to this Headquarters. It depends solely on the ability and background of the person interrogated. Thus, it has been found that in some cases the B Referent was better informed than the A1 Referent. In some cases the A2 Referent was better informed than the A1 or B Referent. Where possible, A1 should be interrogated. By and large, the most knowledgeable persons were those who had been former members of the 1st section of the German police, i.e. the Political Police prior to its absorption into the RSNA. These individuals generally had long backgrounds in police and anti KPD work and were the most capable of the Gostape personnel.

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III The Interrogation

A. Patience: Where possible the interrogations should not be conducted under the influence of laboratory instructions during the 1944-1945 period. The agent is to be instructed that his subject is to be given him with information. The subject, GUSTAPPE, was a professional brain, but the agent is required to talk to him. He is a professional, having served a 20 year period in the German Army. He is a professional, having served in various capacities conducted in 1944 and 1945 with various units of the German Army. GUSTAPPE, which was professional, professional, professional, in 1944 was used to exploit the technical capabilities of the German program until the war criminals could be captured. GUSTAPPE was merely his trade job.

Ideologically it might be stated that the U.S. has nothing against the political activities of any group, but the political of that group would not limit the freedom of other political groups. On the other hand, the U.S. is fully aware of the potential of the KZ as an espionage machine of the Communists and the USSR and such activities are of interest in order to protect the newly founded German State. It is to extract this message to both Germany and the U.S. that the GUSTAPPE man's cooperation in sharing his experiences is desired.

It should be noted that the U.S. authorities have not relaxed for one minute their moral rejection of the KZ. From a professional point of view, if an individual had to "work with his hands" or hold threat of a KZ over a person in order to obtain information, such actions were indicative of stupidity and lack of ability and training for the job. (It has been found that GUSTAPPE personnel take to this rationale quite well and use it to flatter their egos as well as to mentally dissociate themselves from the original stigma attached to the GUSTAPPE as a whole.)

The rationale outlined in the previous paragraphs is merely suggestive of its general nature. Variations, depending on the personality of the interrogator and local circumstances, are obviously necessary.

1. BARBIE's Affiliation With an Alleged Soviet Agent

a. BARBIE Contacts Fri. KUEHN on His Visit to HAMBURG With GUSTMANN

Early in February 1946, BARBIE accepted the invitation of a certain Wolfgang, GUSTMANN, one of his associates, to accompany him to

• BARBIE became acquainted with GUSTMANN during September 1945 in MURSELDE (near KASSEL) through Kurt BARNHAUSEN, a former Waffen SS Untersturmfuehrer (2nd Lt.).

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arrivals. GUSTMANN intended to call on his relatives, from whom he hoped to obtain clothing. Immediately upon their arrival in HAMBURG, BARBIE contacted Frl. Ellen KUEHN**, a former secretary in the PARIS office of the SDS (Chief of Security Police and Security Service in a Service Command touching a frontier of the Reich) and with whom he had become acquainted in PARIS in 1944. BARBIE had thought that they would be able to find lodging by contacting Frl. KUEHN. She refused, however, and they were forced to live in a nearby rooming house (BARBIE does not recall the name and address).

Before he left, Frl. KUEHN asked BARBIE if he was in possession of discharge papers and all other papers necessary for assuming normal civilian status. When BARBIE answered in the negative, Frl. KUEHN replied that she might be able to help him, as she had recently become acquainted with a former SS officer who might be in a position to help. This man, whose name was JOHNNY (BARBIE states that this is the only name he has heard used in reference to the man), and was a former officer of the Waffen SS Division Leibstandarte Adolf Hitler, had a friend by the name of WINTER, a former Oberstleutnant (Lt Col), who had excellent connections in the City Billotting Control Office and the City Labor Control Office. BARBIE says that he told Frl. KUEHN that he was very much interested in meeting this person, and that he requested her to arrange a rendezvous as soon as possible.

Frl. KUEHN had become acquainted with JOHNNY through her sister Frau WORSCH, (wife of Allgemeine SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) Dr. WORSCH, Moorweiden Strasse), with whose friend, a certain Frau PNEUSS (102 B Zallingborstelerland Strasse), JOHNNY was living.

b. BARBIE's First Meeting With WINTER

On the second day of BARBIE's stay in HAMBURG, he was contacted by Frl. KUEHN, who requested that he meet WINTER that same evening at 2000 hours in a cafe (BARBIE has forgotten the name, as he visited the cafe only once) near the Sternschance Station (S-Bahn). BARBIE appeared at the cafe at the appointed hour, and when he found that there was no one waiting for him, he questioned the barkeeper as to the whereabouts of WINTER. The bartender pointed to a table in one of the corners where three men and two women were sitting. It was apparent that they were all intoxicated.

BARBIE approached this table and introduced himself as BECKER, saying that he had been sent there by Frl. KUEHN. WINTER rose and greeted BARBIE with a pat on the back and a "Heil MOSCOW". He then introduced the other two men as HEINTZEL (HEINZEL ?) and JOHNNY and the two women as friends of Frau WORSCH.

HEINTZEL, who seemed to be somewhat more sober than the others, immediately asked BARBIE if he had been an SS officer; BARBIE answered affirmatively.

HEINTZEL then informed BARBIE that he was a former Waffen SS Sturmbannfuhrer (Maj), and that he had worked with WINTER in the Abwehr in the East. WINTER at that time was an Oberstleutnant (Lt Col) in FAK 101 (espionage field unit). Nothing more was said about such matters that evening. BARBIE was quite surprised when they started to sing the International, and immediately asked HEINTZEL the meaning of such conduct. HEINTZEL replied that they were doing that in order to camouflage their true status. Before departing, HEINTZEL and WINTER asked BARBIE to meet them on the next day at 1400 hours, to which he agreed.

c. Details of the Meeting Between WINTER, HEINTZEL, JOHNNY, GUSTMANN, the Former Stego Secretary, and BARBIE

BARBIE had become very suspicious of WINTER and his associates because of their behavior in the cafe the previous night. In order to

Minimize the danger, he requested GUSTMANN to accompany him to the point of rendezvous and to stay with him.

That afternoon, BARBIE and GUSTMANN went to the designated place, the Ebeluft-Brucke subway station. WINTER, HEINTZEL, and JONNY arrived about three-quarters of an hour late, and after a brief introduction and exchange of greetings, WINTER requested that they follow him to a house nearby, where they could conduct their meeting. On the way to this house (see Annex I), WINTER told BARBIE that it belonged to an old friend of his who was formerly a secretary of the Stepo (State Police).

Upon entering the building, WINTER led them to a room on the first floor, where the former Stepo man was waiting. BARBIE was introduced as BECKER by WINTER, who omitted the name of the host. The meeting lasted about two hours.

WINTER began the meeting by inquiring into the political background of GUSTMANN and BARBIE, and it was necessary for them to give a short review of their activities while with the SS. After that had been done, WINTER introduced himself as a former Obersturmführer of FAK 101, and said that he had become acquainted with HEINTZEL while engaged in intelligence work in the East. BARBIE believes that he also stated that he was of Russian descent.

WINTER questioned BARBIE on the subject of illegal groups and whether he was a member of one of these groups. When BARBIE answered in the negative, WINTER asked him if he would like to become a member of his (WINTER's) organization. WINTER stated that he was the chief of an organization doing intelligence work and composed of former Wehrmacht and SS officers. WINTER further stated that he (BARBIE) would be able to improve his position, obtain a decent place to live for his family, and earn a good salary.

BARBIE states that he told WINTER that he would have to consider his offer first and that he could not be expected to make a decision on such an important matter on the spur of the moment.

WINTER in turn told BARBIE not to worry about it too much, since in the past he (WINTER) had helped a great number of former members of the SS, such as HEINTZEL.

When BARBIE insisted that he be given time to consider the matter, WINTER started to question him on his political convictions in regard to the current rift between East and West. When BARBIE replied that a conflict between the US or the Western powers and Russia was inevitable, and that it was just a matter of choosing the advantageous side for Germany, WINTER seemed quite pleased. He then interrupted BARBIE by saying he was of the same opinion and that he saw a great opportunity in working for both sides: selling intelligence to the Americans and British on the one hand and to Russia on the other. WINTER claimed that he had, or could have, a sufficient number of agents to carry out this venture without either side becoming aware of the duplicity.

BARBIE told WINTER that this was a very dangerous game, and that it would be very difficult to establish contact with the Americans, British, and Russians.

WINTER immediately answered that this presented no problem, as he was already in contact with the Soviets. He said that he was at present in contact with an MVD agent in LUBECK, and that he had visited this man on several occasions in that city and had had missions assigned to him. WINTER also said that he had initiated contact with the British. He further stated that with the help of the KPD in HAMBURG he had penetrated Military Government and the Vehicle Control Pool, claiming this to be a big step towards his desired goal.

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After a short pause, WINTER asked BARBIE if he was willing to collect information for him on the following matters in the US Zone:

- (1) Name, type, and strength of all US units in all the larger cities.
- (2) Numbers of divisions and names of their staff officers.
- (3) Tactical information.
- (4) Names of leading US military and civilian personnel in Military Government.
- (5) Data on all troop movements.
- (6) Markings of all US Army vehicles.

WINTER told BARBIE that he would be paid generously for his services, and that he (WINTER) was going to LUEBCK the following week for funds. When BARBIE stated that he definitely needed more time to consider the entire matter, the meeting was brought to a close by WINTER and BARBIE and GUSTMANN left together.

COMMENTS

BARBIE states that his lack of interest in working for the Soviets and his mistrust of WINTER caused him to sever connections with him. BARBIE claims that he neither heard from nor talked to WINTER after the meeting, which took place in February 1946.

HEINTZEL attempted to contact BARBIE on two different occasions in July 1946, once in HAMBURG through SCHMITT, and once through Frau BREDE in KASSEL, but on both occasions BARBIE was absent. (SCHMITT is the name of the family with whom BARBIE lived in HAMBURG, while Frau BREDE's is a cover address used by wanted persons and black marketeers). Before leaving KASSEL, HEINTZEL borrowed 300 marks from Frau BREDE, which BARBIE had to repay later.

BARBIE contacted HEINTZEL in HAMBURG in August 1946 for the first time since the meeting. The purpose of this visit was to have HEINTZEL sell a stolen watch for BARBIE on the black market. During BARBIE's visit, HEINTZEL never mentioned WINTER, his activities, nor did he say anything about their last meeting. Later, BARBIE gave HEINTZEL's address to CLOEDE [redacted] so that CLOEDE could pick up 1000 marks, part of the sales money for the watch, from HEINTZEL. CLOEDE had intended to purchase a radio with this money (this will be covered in detail in a forthcoming report).

BARBIE states that while in HAMBURG in August 1946, HEINTZEL told him that he had reason to believe that JONNY had been arrested while reporting to the Russian Zone, but did not go into further details.

BARBIE knows that in September 1947, PETERSEN*, a CIC informant, had heard from one of his sub-agents, a certain [redacted] that a man by the name of WINTER was operating in the US Zone, where he was attempting to build up a radio net. WINTER was supposedly accompanied by a man named FRITZ.

The descriptions given were identical to those of WINTER and HEINTZEL. BARBIE further stated that, to the best of his knowledge,

WINTER was still living at 27 Freilegrath Strasse, HAMBURG - BLANKENESSE in October 1947 in spite of the fact that his connections with Selection Board personalities were known to CLODE.

BABIE has cooperated willingly. It is not believed that he has willfully withheld information or that he is in any way affiliated with WINTER other than indicated in this report.

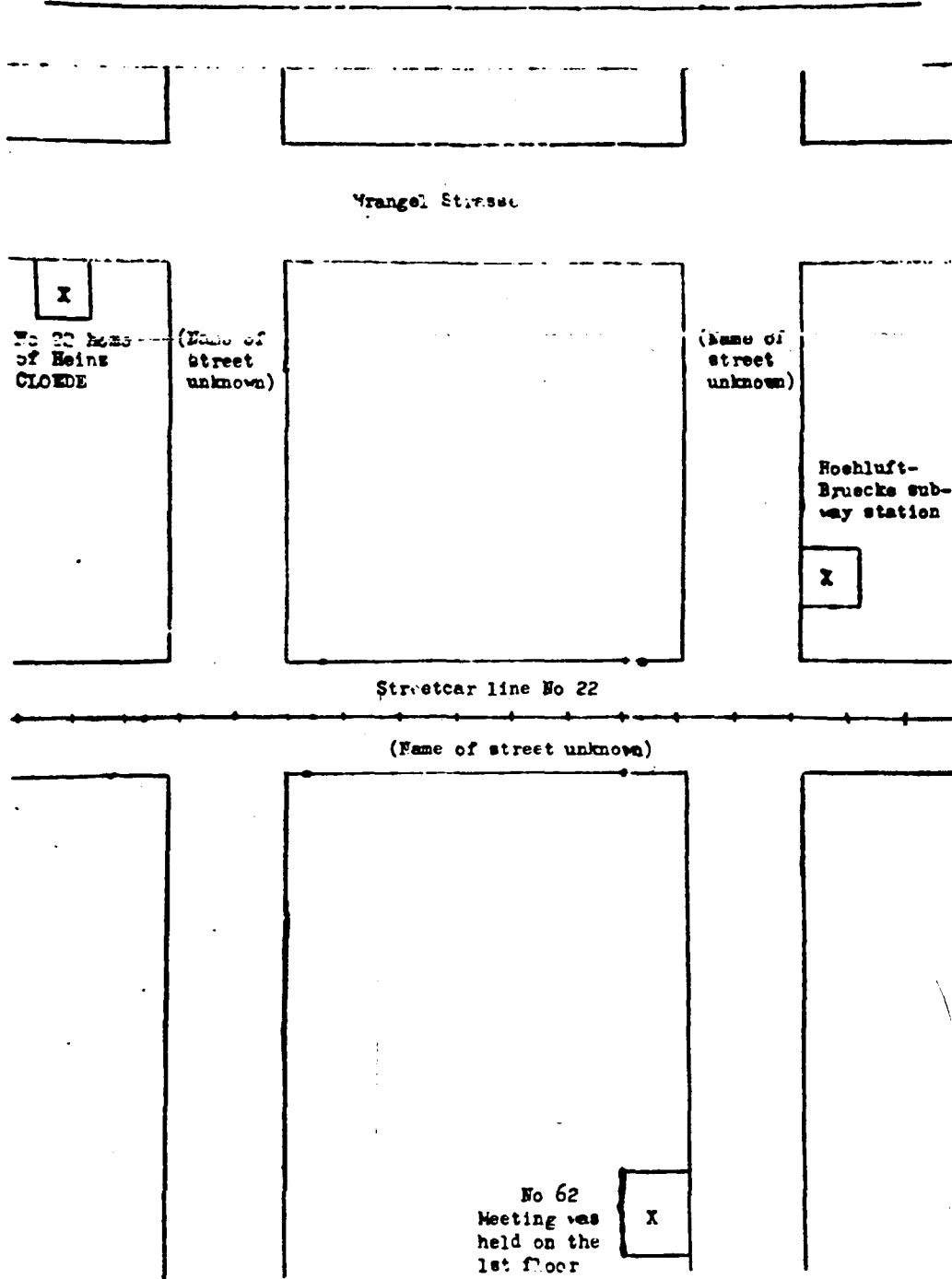

1. The following information is submitted regarding the net of informants presently run by Capt MERK.

2. Background: The net of Merk was originally established in 1946 by S/Agt. Robert S. TAYLOR. Through 1946 and 1947, Merk built up his net to include some sixty five persons, scattered all over the four zones of Germany, Poland, Yugoslavia, Czechoslovakia, Switzerland and Greece. S/Agt. Taylor ran the net through Merk who acted as the lay man. Although Taylor had personally met approx. eight to ten members of the net, his control was exercised entirely through Merk. The relationship between Taylor and Merk was one of mutual confidence extending into personal friendship. For example Taylor was in the habit of spending almost all his weekend off duty time with Merk at Markt Oberdorf (M48/Y11). The relationship between Taylor and Merk gradually moved to the plan of a true friendship established between two equals, rather than the relationship which should have existed between the American CIC agent and his informant. Late in June of 1947, when this agent was assigned to the Kaufbeuren sub regional office at Mempten (L48/X90), S/Agt. Taylor, who at that time was in the process of marrying a German national and was consequently making preparations to return to the AI, approached this agent and offered to turn the net over. At that time Merk's net produced approx. 90% of all intelligence received in Sub Region Kaufbeuren (M48/Y12). The net was known to subregional commander Capt. RAUER as well as to most other operational agents in that sub region, who held the net in high opinion. Similarly, S/Agt. Taylor received many encouragements from Region IV and was often praised for his superior work in connection with the net. When the top secret SOP regarding the running of nets was forwarded to Sub Region Kaufbeuren, S/Agt. Taylor made a staff study and a special trip to Region Reg, where during an interview with Lt. Col. GARVEY, it was decided that the net would be allowed to function as it then was, owing mainly to the high level of information which was produced by the net. The net at that time composed itself of approx. forty eight to fifty two persons. Shortly after the interview with Lt. Col. Garvey S/Agt. Taylor, whose departure date from the EC was rapidly approaching, decided to turn the net over completely to this agent. Upon taking the net over, this agent after several conferences with Merk decided to cut the net down to a reasonable size simultaneously with moving the remaining members into the US zone of Germany, and possibly into Region IV, so as to concentrate the activities of this net within the regional

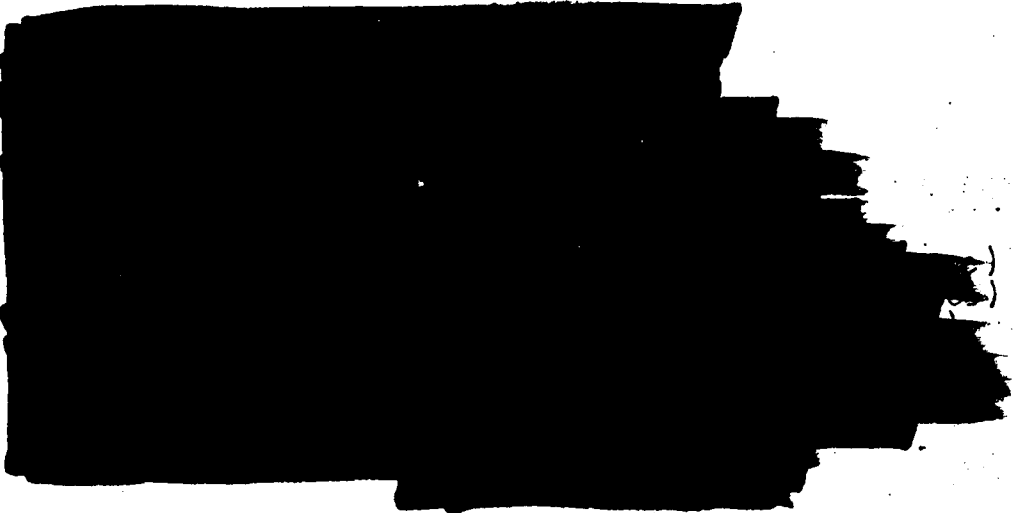
man. In the course of action. Four months the net was cut down to its present strength of four or five persons, who represent the most productive elements. Simultaneously, the relationship between this agent and Merk has been switched to a more healthy basis, whereby a more businesslike attitude prevails without, however, a complete curtailment of the necessary human relationship. It is natural that in the course of this change Merk has to some extent resented the fact that his status is no longer that of a boss man, who shares the private life of the agent for whom he works and who exerts a great deal of influence on that agent, even in his most private affairs. Despite this fact, however, it is considered that Merk has done far more efficient work than in the past and has produced much better results, especially with respect to the basic mission of this organization, namely the counter intelligence campaign. On the other hand, however, it can not be said that Merk has adapted himself completely to his new status as he retains a certain amount of independence, which, it is felt, is definitely detrimental to this organization. Merk for example does not hesitate to violate specific orders whenever he believes that he is right and the agent is wrong. It is believed that Merk as an individual represents no other value to this organization than that of being the key man of a good net. It is further believed that the net as it stands now, with possibly some minor changes, would become an extremely valuable source of information but that, however, Merk will have to be discharged within the next few weeks. His recent activities connected with the procuring of a radio in Berlin (NSZ/475), the fact that he concealed these activities from this agent and many other smaller violations of principles and of order directly given him, indicate without any doubt that Merk is not capable of adapting himself to a professional like standard of work. In fact, his recent activities have already caused a great deal of embarrassment to Region IV and it is not felt that he will in any way curtail those activities which are detrimental to this organization. With respect to the possibility of Merk being also associated with some foreign intelligence agency, a possibility which has also been envisaged, it must be stated that there exists to-date no evidence or even indications that such might be the case. Arrangements are presently being made to double up Merk in order that another informant may take his job over whenever the time will have come to terminate his connections with this organization. Simultaneously, arrangements are being made to split the net up into three different groups, headed by three different informants, unknown to one another, so that the removal of Merk will coincide with the breaking up the organization of this net. As regards Merk's status after his removal, it is urged in the strongest possible way that Merk be transferred to MCIC for a thorough and extended interrogation, after his removal. The reasons for this recommendation are a) the conviction that the interrogation of Merk would reveal information of extreme value regarding intelligence activities in the US zone b) the fact that the debriefing of Merk could not possibly be successfully undertaken

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here unless he was continued in his present position for a considerable length of time c) the debriefing of Merk, if done here and over a considerable period of time, would simultaneously cause the debriefing of his net d) Merk's presence in this area after his removal would be a constant security threat to the net, and finally, e) the firm believes that Merk, in his resentment of being removed would turn to a foreign nation for employment and would present a definite security threat to the United States.

1. Reference is made to MOIC originating from Region VIII, BERLIN, dated 16 February 1948; Subject: "Informant Recruiting in BERLIN by Region IV", classified Secret, with file no. VIII-9991. Copies of the MOIC referred to have been forwarded to this headquarters and to Headquarters 570th CIC Det., Euc. EUCOM, APO 757.

2. Concerning the allegations against this Region by Region VIII, it is necessary to review the past history of the informant and his worth to Region IV.

a. Informant has been an informant of Region IV since shortly after the cessation of hostilities and was carded with the code number of I-5037-IV-K.

b. Your headquarters is aware of his Abwehr background. (Ref. INX your Rpt. dated 18 February 1948; Ref. No. 6148).

c. The informant has been running a net of Sub-informants. Five months ago the net consisted of approximately sixty-five (65) Sub-informants and was handled by Special Agent TAYLOR of this Region. TAYLOR was redeployed and the Informant with his net was taken over by Special Agent HAJDU. HAJDU, knowing the SOP concerning the running of nets by Abwehr personnel, presented the problem to Lt. Col. GARVEY, who was then Commanding Officer of Region IV. GARVEY suggested the continued use of the Informant with his nets. HAJDU immediately started to reduce the size of the net and to concentrate their efforts within the American Zone of Occupation, something that had as yet not been done. In five (5) months the net has been reduced to sixteen (16) Sub-informants, all carded: I-5037-IV-K/X-3053-IV-K/X-3059-IV-K/X-3030-IV-K/X-3077-IV-K/X-3079-IV-K/P-3081-IV-K/P-3089-IV-K/P-3093-IV-K/P-3100-IV-K/P-3101-IV-K/P-3102-IV-K/P-3111-IV-K/X-3069-IV-K/O-3024-IV-K.

d. An acquaintance of MERCK is a radio repair man in BERLIN whose name is [redacted] was not a Sub-informant of MERCK's.

5. Several months ago (approximately in November 1947), MERCK approached HAJDU and asked if he were interested in illegal radio transmitters and receivers. HAJDU naturally expressed his interest and told MERCK that if he should hear of any such illegal communication systems he (HAJDU) should be notified. That was the last that was heard or spoken about radios until 10 February 1948 when a TTX from BERLIN to this Headquarters revealed that one [redacted] R-5111-IV-K, (a Sub-informant of the MERCK net) was in the BERLIN CIC office and had attempted to get a radio from [redacted]

a. Reference is made to paragraph 2 a. of the report mentioned in paragraph 1 above. According to the report, CIC BERLIN was aware of the Sub-informant's activity from the beginning of November 1947, yet made no mention of the incident until 10 February 1948; further, to assume that CIC MUNICH was establishing an illegal radio transmitter so that the informants of this Region can maintain contact, is somewhat far-fetched and beyond comprehension.

b. Neither this office nor the Agent running the Informant was aware of [redacted] presence in BERLIN.

c. Concerning the written FBI's of the informant; no written FBI's were given the Informant by HAJDU. However, in reviewing the background of the Informant, it is easy to assume that he would be aware of what the mission of the CIC is. His Abwehr training and employment in France as an Abwehr man would make it relatively simple for him, with any imagination at all, to make out FBI's which would correspond very closely to those given in the Orientation and Guidance Reports.

d. Reference is made to paragraph 2 d of MOIC from BERLIN. Jon LARSON and PETERSON are two (2) cover names used by MERCK. Mr. BRESE was the cover name of TAYLOR and Mr. STEVENSON is the cover name used by HAJDU.

e. As was mentioned previously, the former net of MERCK's was not concentrating within the American Zone. Since so much material was being obtained that would be of value to the War Department Detachment, liaison was made with the local WDD and it was decided that the information obtained would be turned over to the WDD, if it were the type of information they wanted. In turn, the local WDD would assist in the payment of the net. This practice has been working out to the advantage of both organizations.

f. MERCK still maintains contact with the EPD in the French Zone through his Sub-informants. Those contacts are, according to HAJDU, the most fruitful sources of information from the entire net.

g. HAJDU, the Regional Technical Specialist, and the Operations Officer are in favor of continuing the "debriefing" of MERCK

with the ultimate thought of dropping him. However, the following must be considered:

a. His value and this headquarters' commitments to WDD.

b. If he is dropped by this headquarters, will not some other agency pick him up (the French, for instance), and if he is picked up by some other agency, would he not take his net with him? Parts of his net are of extreme value to this organization.

c. It would be practically impossible to "debrief" MERCK to such an extent that this organization would not be compromised should he desire to work for another agency.

d. It is desired by this Headquarters to retain some of the Sub-informants of the net, but it is also desired that MERCK be dropped.

7. The following suggestions are offered:

a. The net with exceptions be turned over to WDD.

b. MERCK, who may be able to give valuable information under interrogation, be exploited by ECIC.

c. MERCK be turned over to the French, who want him as a War Criminal. However, the possibility exists that the French only want him as an employee of their Intelligence nets. From all indications, the man may not be a War Criminal. This point is suggested only as a last resort because should the French use him, he would be an extremely valuable asset to their organization.

d. Technical Specialist, Hqs. 970th CIC Det., comments are desired on paragraph 7 above. Copy of this letter has not been furnished CIC Region VIII.

On March 18, 1498, Vidal reversed the earlier instruction and told ECIC to interrogate Barbie about his recruitment, assignments and reporting responsibilities as a CIC informant, and whether "after he is released," he wished to "continue work for CIC." "An inducement to make subject talk," said Vidal, "can be given him by informing him that his release depends on completeness of his answers to the above questions." Vidal also advised ECIC to suggest, but not actually dictate, that Barbie not contact British intelligence.

1. Reference is made to IKS, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 19 December 1947, which is superseded by this correspondence.

2. It is the desire of this headquarters that subject be interviewed in the manner discussed by Mr. VIDAL, this headquarters, and Mr. SILVER, your headquarters, on 16 March 1948, as it pertains to subject's association with CIC. The interview will touch on the following points:

- a. How, where, and when did subject contact CIC?
- b. Whom did he contact and under what circumstances?
- c. What was the nature of the mission assigned him and by whom was it assigned?
- d. In whom did subject render his reports? What types? How and where did he render same?
- e. Who are the members of his net? How, where, and when were they recruited? Where are these members at present?
- f. How, how often, and how much was he paid? How much did each of his sub-sources receive?
- g. How, where, and when did he meet MERK? What does he know about MERK? Where does MERK fit in the net created by subject? Who is handling MERK? What are MERK's ideas concerning CIC and the agent handling him?
- h. Does subject wish to work for the British? Does he feel the British want to employ him? If so, in what capacity? Does he feel they would arrest him? Why?
- i. What does he intend to do after he is released? Does he wish to continue work for CIC? If not, where does he intend to go? Why?

3. It is desired that subject be interviewed in such a manner as to dissuade him from wishing to work for the British. This should be done through an intelligent and clever posing of suggestive questions, from which subject can deduce that it would probably be best that he not visit the British Zone. Under no circumstance should it be stated outright that he not contact the British.

REPORT

1. BARBIE's Initial Contact With Dr. Emil F. HOFFMANN, a British Informant

BARBIE heard HOFFMANN's name mentioned for the first time during the visit of Carl SCHAEFER to WARBURG in June 1946.

SCHAEFER is a former Waffen SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt), member of the SD, and adjutant of Leon DEGRILLE. BARBIE became acquainted with SCHAEFER through NAUFELT, in WARBURG, early in June 1946.

Christof WUENY, alias, CORNELIUS, is 34 years of age. He is a former Unterscharfuehrer of the SD and a captain in the army. BARBIE became acquainted with him during the early part of August 1946.

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It was not until July 1946, when BARBIE contacted SCHAEFER in BAD PYLOND (L-52/C-67), near HAMELN, that he became interested in HOFFMANN. On this visit SCHAEFER introduced BARBIE to a certain Dr. WILKENING, a f-SS Oberscharfuehrer of the SD and Untersturmfuehrer of the Taffen SS. SCHAEFER and WILKENING spoke highly of HOFFMANN, stating that he had been a well known student leader at the University of Marburg in the early 1930s and that he was supposed to have good connections now. (SCHAEFER did not say with whom).

Upon BARBIE's return to MARBURG, he questioned his landlord, SCHMITT in regards to HOFFMANN. SCHMITT told BARBIE that he knew HOFFMANN personally and that HOFFMANN had been very active in SA Sturm IV in MARBURG. BARBIE then gave to SCHMITT the address of HOFFMANN, which he had obtained from SCHAEFER, and requested SCHMITT to contact HOFFMANN.

In the meantime, however, SCHAEFER and WILKENING visited HOFFMANN again and told him about BARBIE, also informing HOFFMANN that BARBIE was living in MARBURG with SCHMITT. HOFFMANN immediately went to MARBURG to contact SCHMITT, but on his arrival he was informed by SCHMITT that BARBIE was away and that he was not expected back for some time. HOFFMANN left word requesting BARBIE to come to BERLEBURG (L-52/G-47-NW of MARBURG) as soon as possible.

BARBIE contacted HOFFMANN in BERLEBURG in August 1946, at which time HOFFMANN told him the following: Upon completion of his studies, HOFFMANN entered the German Diplomatic Corps, in which he held successively several positions. His last position was in BUCHAREST under SA Obergruppenfuehrer Von KILLINGER, the German Ambassador. Late in 1941, KILLINGER and HOFFMANN had an argument which resulted in HOFFMANN's transfer back to BERLIN, where he was assigned to the Foreign Office. In 1943, HOFFMANN was drafted. He served as a war reporter in the SS Standarte Kurt Eggers and was later placed in charge of the Propaganda Department of Radio Bratislava. After Germany collapsed, HOFFMANN was interned in a KZ cage for a period of six months before he was released through the efforts of a friend named MARKUS. (BARBIE believes that he was captured by the British.)

2. HOFFMANN's Association With MARKUS

BARBIE learned the following from HOFFMANN.

During HOFFMANN's employment in the Diplomatic Corps, he became acquainted with MARKUS, in BERLIN. MARKUS was advisor to SS Gruppenfuehrer SCHELLEBERG in Amt IV of the RSHA. HOFFMANN knew that MARKUS was under observation, since unconfirmed reports were on hand indicating that he was a British agent.

After the attempt on HITLER's life on 20 July 1944, MARKUS was arrested. However, because of HOFFMANN's intervention and his contacts with higher SD officials, MARKUS was released and drafted into the army. While serving on the Western Front, MARKUS deserted and reported to Allied Headquarters. Until the end of the war, MARKUS served under Lord VANSITTART in an English propaganda unit.

After the war MARKUS was appointed mayor of GLADBACH-REYDT (3-1 7-8) (near DUESSELDORF) and at the same time was given the task of forming for the British a network of agents in Germany. This gave HOFFMANN his freedom, since MARKUS intended to have HOFFMANN collect information about the activities of Communists and subversive personalities and recruit saboteurs.

Upon his release he was given quarters at 53 Poststrasse, BERLEBURG, by MARKUS and a stamped card stating that he was working for the city council of GLADBACH-REYDT. (This card was stamped and signed by MARKUS.) HOFFMANN also showed BARBIE the original and a photostat of a letter written and signed by MARKUS which stated that HOFFMANN had been an active member of the Jahnke resistance group during the war. This letter was for the purpose of making it easier to deal with German officials.

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Late in 1946, HOFFMANN and MARKUS broke their connection because of continuous arguments involving the wife of MARKUS. At first HOFFMANN told BARBIE that he broke with MARKUS because the latter requested him to divulge all the names and addresses of SS personalities known to HOFFMANN. Later, however, HOFFMANN confessed to BARBIE that MARKUS broke with him because of personal differences involving MARKUS' wife.

3. HOFFMANN's Attempt to Recruit BARBIE

Shortly before Christmas 1946, BARBIE visited HOFFMANN in BERLEBURG. HOFFMANN showed him a letter written by a certain Maj KRUK (COOK?) of the British Intelligence Service, stationed in BAD GODESBERG (near BONN). This letter requested HOFFMANN to report to Maj KRUK for consultation. HOFFMANN added that his position with the English was becoming less and less favorable, as he was not producing sufficient information concerning the activities of former Nazis and informants.

HOFFMANN requested BARBIE to work as a subagent and help collect information. BARBIE refused on the basis that he had just escaped from the British authorities in EMBURG and that they were most likely looking for him. HOFFMANN maintained that this was of no importance and that he would talk to Maj KRUK about him.

Late in January 1947 or early in February, BARBIE met HOFFMANN in MUNICH, as was planned in the previous visit. HOFFMANN told BARBIE that he had spoken to Maj KRUK about him and that Maj KRUK was very interested in obtaining BARBIE's services. HOFFMANN added that Maj KRUK wanted BARBIE to come visit him in BAD GODESBERG as soon as possible. Maj KRUK had also promised that BARBIE need not fear arrest or bodily harm. BARBIE stated he was not convinced of Maj KRUK's sincerity, so he told HOFFMANN to tell Maj KRUK that he was willing to meet him only in the US Zone.

In the beginning of March 1947, HOFFMANN again contacted BARBIE in MUNICH. BARBIE told HOFFMANN about his activities and how he had managed to evade arrest during Operation Selection Board.

At the end of March 1947, BARBIE met HOFFMANN for the last time in MUNICH. During this meeting BARBIE became very angry when HOFFMANN informed him that he had told Maj KRUK about BARBIE's activities and how he had managed to evade arrest. HOFFMANN again asked BARBIE if he had reconsidered working for the British. When BARBIE answered with a no, HOFFMANN requested BARBIE to work for him privately, on cases involving Communists as well as former German Intelligence personnel. When BARBIE again replied no, HOFFMANN departed, and BARBIE did not see him again. (HOFFMANN was arrested by the British in April 1947.)

4. Explanation of BARBIE's Activities

BARBIE avers that he was very interested in counterintelligence work with the Western Allies against the Soviets and has shown this by striving to contact Germans working for the Western Allies in that capacity.

When HOFFMANN told BARBIE about his connections with MARKUS and subsequently with the British, BARBIE became very eager to approach the British Intelligence Service through HOFFMANN and offer his services. However, he definitely made up his mind not to contact the British when he found out from OTTO, a former Waffen SS Hauptsturmfuhrer, and HIRSCHFELD (both supposedly working for a US Intelligence Agency), that a good friend of his, a former SD officer, was working for CIC. BARBIE immediately contacted this man, whose name is Kurt MERK, alias PETERSEN. MERK in turn contacted his CIC headquarters and received permission to make use of BARBIE's past experiences and contacts in the gathering of intelligence information from former SD officers now working for the French.

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COMMENTS

Although BARBIE claims to be anti-Communist, it is felt that the main reason for his great efforts and endeavors to work for the Western Alliance is based on a desire to obtain his personal freedom. BARBIE falls under the automatic arrest category, and his present employment offers him personal freedom, the liberty to be with his family, a decent wage, an apartment, and security.

Information pertaining to contacts BARBIE made through HOFFMANN and information concerning persons arrested by the British during Operation Selection Board will be covered in a forthcoming report.

Barbie stated that he had been arrested by the British after he was betrayed by a German who knew his whereabouts. He was jailed briefly in a house in Hamburg used by British intelligence but escaped after two days by sneaking past a guard. Barbie also provided ECIC with information on Germans whom Barbie believed were working for the British.

This report covers the purpose of BARBIE's trip to HAMBURG on 10 November 1946, the events taking place there, his initial contact with ACHER as well as the arrest of BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING by British authorities. BARBIE's version of their escape from a British Field Intelligence Hqs on 14 November 1946 and subsequent events until BARBIE's departure from HAMBURG have been prepared in great detail in order to obtain a detailed picture of what actually did take place.

REPORT

1. BARBIE's Explanation for Trip to HAMBURG

On 8 November 1946, Karl SCHAEFER and a Dr. WILKENING asked BARBIE to accompany them to HAMBURG to obtain some personal papers. (BARBIE does not remember what kind of papers.)

SCHAEFER is a former Waffon SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) and member of the SD, whom BARBIE met in HAMBURG in June 1946. Dr. WILKENING is a former Waffon SS sergoant whom BARBIE met through SCHAEFER in September 1946 in BAD PYLMONT (L-52/C-07, the British Zone).

Although SCHAEFER and WILKENING possessed employment certificates showing that they were representatives of the Overseas Press News Agency, they did not want to carry these papers with them to HAMBURG because they were issued by a Dr. HOFFMANN whom they considered a British informer. (Dr. HOFFMANN is a former Waffon SS Oberscharfuehrer (Sgt) who lives at Poststrasse 63, BERLEBURG, NW of HAMBURG, in the British Zone.) Therefore, before they left for HAMBURG, BARBIE made copies of their identification papers which he presented to authorities in HESSIAN OLDENDORF, near HAMELIN, British Zone, and obtained new employment certificates.

2. Activities of BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING in HAMBURG

BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING left BAD PYLMONT for HAMBURG on 10 November 1946. Upon arriving at HAMBURG, BARBIE contacted a Fraulein KUEHN (see CI-SIR No. 60, 7707 ECIC, dated 28 January 1948) who refused to house him.

(BARBIE originally met Fraulein KUEHN in PARIS in 1944, at which time she was the secretary of Otto ILGENFRITZ. BARBIE met her again in August 1945, when ILGENFRITZ, a former 1st Lt of Bds PARIS took him to her home.)

He then called on CLOEDE, a former Kreisamtsleiter and British informant, whom BARBIE met in September 1946 in HAMBURG, and stayed with him that night. SCHAEFER and WILKENING stayed with Fraulein Erna SCHROETER at Karlstrasse 127. Fraulein SCHROETER was WILKENING's secretary in BRUSSELS during the war.

During the evening of 10 November 1946, CLOEDE told BARBIE that he had recently met a former Waffon SS Fahnenjunker (Officer Cadet) and member of the SD, living at LUDWIGSBURG (L-49/S-03) near STUTTGART, by the name of ACKER, who wanted to meet BARBIE. CLOEDE further stated that he promised ACKER he would send him a telegram when BARBIE arrived in HAMBURG.

BARBIE told CLOEDE that he objected to having his whereabouts made known to a stranger, and to meeting ACKER. Although BARBIE objected, CLOEDE sent the telegram asking ACKER to come to HAMBURG.

In further conversations CLOEDE told BARBIE about his illegal activities and about 300 Walter pistols which his group possessed. He offered to give BARBIE one of the pistols, but BARBIE refused it. CLOEDE also mentioned that his group possessed a radio transmitter which he had recently obtained by paying the 1,000 German marks given to him by BARBIE, to several of CLOEDE's former SS comrades, who had stolen the transmitter from a British unit where they were employed.

CLOEDE told BARBIE that the weapons and the radio transmitter were preparations against a feared Russian onslaught.

WILKENING spent 11 November trying to obtain his papers while BARBIE and SCHAEFER contacted a friend (name unknown) of SCHAEFER who

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arranged for the sale of a piece of jewelry. In the evening, SCHAEFER and BARBIE went to CLOEDE's home where they heard CLOEDE tell more of his illegal activities.

Though it was BARBIE's intention to leave HAMBURG for HANNOVER on 12 November at 2355 hours, he reluctantly agreed to meet ACKER at the Cafe Larrange in the Goensmarkt at 1700 hours. During that day BARBIE gave SCHAEFER and WILKENING 1,000 German marks each and agreed to deposit 5,000 German marks with Fraulein SCHROETER. WILKENING was not successful in obtaining the papers for which he came to HAMBURG. At 1600 hours BARBIE and SCHAEFER ate in the Faun restaurant where SCHAEFER convinced BARBIE that the appointment with ACKER should be kept.

When SCHAEFER and BARBIE arrived at the Cafe Larrange, WILKENING and Fraulein SCHROETER were there, and shortly after 1700 hours CLOEDE and ACKER appeared. After introductions were made, CLOEDE left and WILKENING, SCHAEFER, SCHROETER and BARBIE went to the Faun restaurant. ACKER appeared to be extremely nervous; at one time he left the party to make a telephone call. ACKER talked a great deal about himself and his association with the SD, and in order to convince BARBIE that he was telling the truth, he mentioned the names and whereabouts of several former SD leaders whom BARBIE knew. When asked by ACKER whether BARBIE was a member of any illegal group, BARBIE answered that he was not. ACKER also described his activities with the Wehrwolf group and told how he blew up a French Headquarters near STUTTGART. On saying goodbye, ACKER informed BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING that he too was leaving for HANNOVER that night. However, he was not seen at the station that evening by any of the others.

After supper at the home of Fraulein SCHROETER, the three men, BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING, went to the ALTONA railway station to board a train for HANNOVER. BARBIE states that he noticed a sedan with the markings of the British civilian police following their streetcar, but paid no particular attention to it. Just before the train departed, four civilians came into their compartment and arrested BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING.

BARBIE states that he thought a mistake had been made until they entered the RTO and a British Captain said to him, "Well, my dear friend, we are not Americans. You are not going to run away from us." BARBIE states that at this moment he realized that CLOEDE must be a British agent, inasmuch as only CLOEDE and BARFAUSEN, a former Staffon SS Untersturmfuehrer whom BARBIE had met in August 1945 in BURSPELDE/Essex and with whom he had been in constant contact up to the present time, knew about the MARBURG affair. (The MARBURG affair refers to BARBIE's arrest by American authorities in MARBURG on 28 August 1946. BARBIE states that the American authorities were informed about him by Frau Erika LOOS, a former secretary of Stapo ESSEN, Chief Krim Rat WOELLS. BARBIE escaped from custody by jumping out of the jeep in which he was being taken to headquarters.)

3. BARBIE's Description of British Field Secret Service House in which He, WILKENING and SCHAEFER were Confined

BARBIE was taken to the British Field Secret Service (FSS) at Alsterufer in HAMBURG. Upon entering the house, BARBIE recognized SCHAEFER and WILKENING in the hall. From the hall, he was taken into a large room on the ground floor, where, after stripping, all his clothes were minutely examined. His belt, suspenders and shoelaces, as well as his personal papers and briefcase containing toilet articles, were taken from him.

After descending the stairway leading to the basement, he came into a narrow hallway that made a 90 degree curve and led to an open air raid shelter door. This door could be closed and opened only from the outside. However, it always remained open (this open door was used in the later escape of BARBIE, WILKENING and SCHAEFER). After going through this

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door, BARBIE came into another part of the hallway, about 10 meters in length, along which he noticed built-in cells. From here he was taken through another air raid shelter door which was locked and which remained locked throughout his stay in the basement. (Though this door was locked and could not be opened by BARBIE once he passed through it to the room in which he was confined, it could be opened by anyone who wanted to enter his cell.) The door led to a small compartment in which there were three empty cells. BARBIE was put in the last of these three cells. Each cell had a grated door and was locked with an ordinary padlock.

4. Details of Plans to Escape and Final Accomplishment of Escape

During the night, BARBIE says, he heard someone cough and several people talking. He recognized SCHAEFER's voice and called him. SCHAEFER replied, and told BARBIE that he and WILKENING were in one cell located in the corridor between the two air raid shelter doors through which he had passed on the way to his cell. BARBIE also learned that there was a wall between them as well as an air raid shelter door which was locked from the corridor side. In spite of this, they were able to discuss the circumstances of their arrest. They all came to the conclusion that only CLOEDE or ACKER could have caused the arrest. Since they could hear the guards approaching, they always had sufficient time to stop talking before the guards could hear them.

On the first night (12 November) British soldiers came in pairs every half hour to check on them. When BARBIE wanted to go to the latrine, the guards went with him. The latrine was located beyond the corridor in which SCHAEFER and WILKENING were locked, so that BARBIE had to pass their cell on his way to the latrine. There was always a light in the basement, although the cells were blacked out.

On 14 November, about noon, SCHAEFER informed BARBIE that they had found a small iron bar and a flashlight in their cell, which they were going to use in an attempt to escape. BARBIE agreed to join them. SCHAEFER and WILKENING discovered that the padlock on their cell door could be broken with the 10 cm x 2 cm iron bar and that inasmuch as BARBIE's door had the same type padlock it too could be broken open.

As soon as the guards had made their half hour checks, they discussed the details of their escape. After breaking the locks, they planned to go through the glass door at the other end of the corridor that led to the toilet and the staircase to the next floor. During one of their trips to the toilet, they had noticed that a light switch, which they believed to be the main switch for the house, was located directly behind the air raid shelter door that led to BARBIE's cell. They planned to turn off all the lights in the house in the event the guards came down after they had broken out of the cells.

On the night of 14 November, they noticed that only one guard came to check them. This guard appeared frightened; He always drew his pistol in front of the cells and he refused to escort any of them to the latrine, stating that he was alone and could not do it. They finally decided to make the break around midnight. When they thought it was about 2:00 hours and tried to make their escape, they heard the guard playing the flute upstairs. In order to learn how much noise they could make without being heard, they shouted loudly for the guard. However, the sound of the flute became louder, so they proceeded with their plan to escape. SCHAEFER and WILKENING broke open their padlock and then BARBIE's. They all walked toward the glass door behind which outside steps could be seen. However, this door was locked and they could not open it. They then tried to escape through the boiler room as well as through other rooms in the basement, but the window in each room was blocked from the outside. After twenty minutes of futile work, they realized that getting past the guard would be their only means of escape. WILKENING took off his shoes and went upstairs. He soon reported that the guard was seated in a small booth the upper part of which was made of glass, and the lower part of wood. On reaching the top of the staircase they saw the guard about five meters

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army with his back to them, facing the front of the house. They sneaked behind the rear of the booth and opened a door three meters to the guard's left and entered a large room. The lights were out, but some light was coming from three large windows. After locking the door behind them with a key, they crawled through a window onto a small roof, and then jumped about three meters down into the park. They hid in the park for about ten minutes and then walked down a lane which led to the Alsterufer. From there they went to Fraulcin KUEHN's home on Moorvoidenstrasse.

5. Incidents After the Escape

After washing up at Fraulcin KUEHN's home, they contacted Fraulcin SCHROETER, who gave them 2,000 German marks. The next step in their plan was to stay with SCHROETER's friend in KIEL. On their way to a railway station outside MARBURG, they encountered a night watchman who invited them to stay with him. (BARBIE does not remember the man's name nor his address, but according to information on file the watchman's name is LUEDINGHAUS.) They stayed with him for four days. The day following their escape, BARBIE gave the following information to a former Gestapo-Fuehrer (Klaus PRUSS) of MARBURG, a former Gestapo-Fuehrer in the Staff SS, whom BARBIE had met in July 1946 in MARBURG. This letter contained another letter addressed to SCHEIT, an old party member and SA Unterfuhrer living at Barfuessersstrasse 35 in MARBURG, whom BARBIE had met in December 1945. The letter requested now discharge papers for BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING. Frau LUEDINGHAUS returned on 19 November accompanied by BARKEHAUSEN whom she accidentally met at PRUSS's home. BARKEHAUSEN gave BARBIE three discharge forms. BARBIE filled one out in the name of Klaus SPIEG, SCHAEFER filled out his in the name of FLITZ, and WILKENING filled out his in the name of FRANK.

BARBIE related their experiences to BARKEHAUSEN and expressed his suspicions that either CLOEDE or ACKER had been responsible for their arrest. To prove that BARBIE's suspicions were not justified, BARKEHAUSEN told him that he had questioned CLOEDE and that CLOEDE denied having had anything to do with the arrest of BARBIE, SCHAEFER and WILKENING.

COMMENTS

BARBIE states that he was treated roughly when arrested by the British authorities at the ALBEMA railway station. BARBIE professes complete ignorance as to why he was arrested other than that he was listed as a participant in the Selection Board Operation. He expressed surprise that he was not interrogated during his detention.

When questioned regarding the escape, BARBIE stated that the open air raid shelter door and the frightened, negligent guard greatly aided their escape.

When BARBIE saw WILKENING in LEVERKUSEN-IESDOFF on 21 December, WILKENING told him that a British agent who had interrogated his wife in BID PYMONT after the escape, had told her that the escape was successful due to outside assistance. Frau WILKENING agreed with him and said that the "organization" was well organized with a view to taking care of such problems. BARBIE strongly denies the existence of an organization, and insists that the escape was accomplished as related in this report.

It is felt that BARBIE has nothing to gain by making false statements as to his activities or those of other Selection Board Operation personalities.

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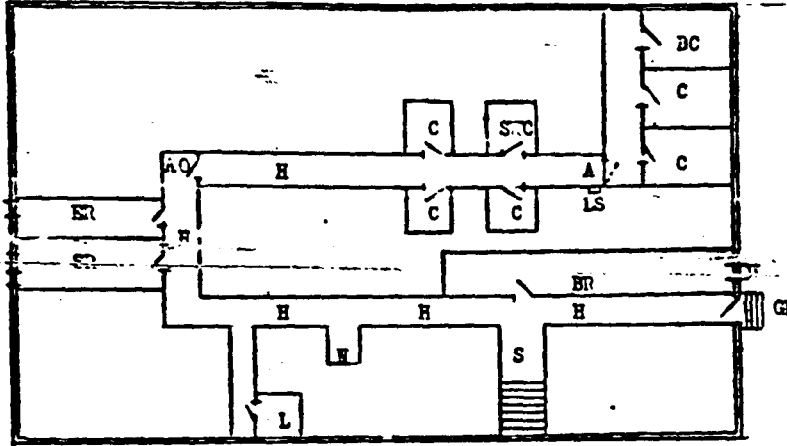
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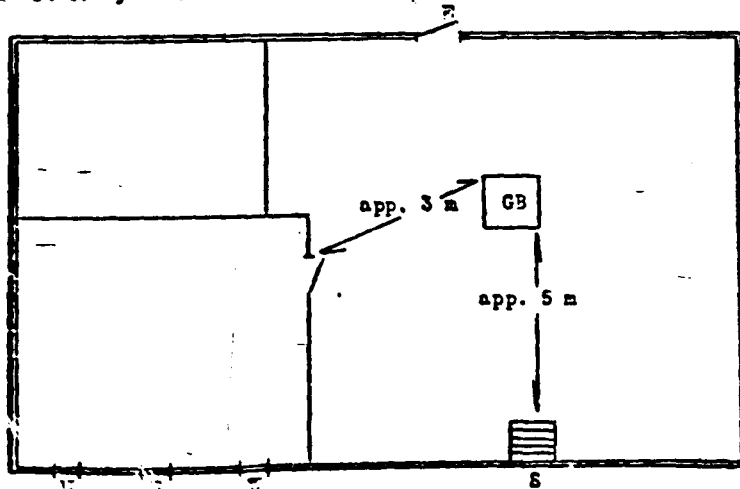

TABLE

1. Persons Suspected by BARBIE of Being Informants for the British
 - a. CLOTDR, Heinz

Either at the end of September or the beginning of October 1946, BARBIE became acquainted with CLOTDR through BAUMHAUSEN, former Staffon SS Untersturmfuehrer in Hamburg. During his association with CLOTDR (from October 1946 to February 1947, BARBIE gained information which he considers basis for suspecting CLOTDR of being an informant for the British Field Intelligence Service:

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(1) To all persons who contacted him, CLOEDE passed himself off as an old Nazi Party member and Antswalter (minor NSDAP functionary), and kept in his apartment photographs showing him in the uniform of an Antswalter of the NSDAP. BARBIE assumes that CLOEDE used these photographs as well as a pillow decorated with a swastika, to gain the confidence of other Nazis, as, under normal circumstances, CLOEDE, if known as an old Party member, would have been arrested by the British. When questioned by visitors to his apartment, as to his reasons for openly displaying these articles, CLOEDE replied that nothing could happen to him because he was ill.

(2) CLOEDE was continually asking BARBIE for written instructions or assistance in making up a black list of the names of members of the German Denazification Board, or in establishing a radio station, measures which BARBIE considered contrary to all common sense.

(3) CLOEDE tried in every way to determine possible connections between BARBIE and other Selection Board personalities (NAUMAN, Dr. GERICKE, SCHAEFER, WILKENING).

(4) BARBIE felt that CLOEDE forced upon him the visit of ACKER, an informant. CLOEDE, he believes, did not want him arrested at home and therefore used ACKER as a dummy for surveillance. The exact time of BARBIE's departure from HAMBURG on 12 November 1946, the night of the arrest of SCHAEFER, WILKENING, and BARBIE by the British authorities, was known only to CLOEDE and ACKER.

(5) BARKHAUSEN told CLOEDE the name and address (LUEDINGHAUS, Rostocker Strasse 10, HAMBURG) of the family that aided SCHAEFER, WILKENING, and BARBIE after they had escaped from the British authorities in HAMBURG on 14 November 1946. Later CLOEDE visited this family with BARKHAUSEN, and a short time after the visit, the LUEDINGHAUS family was arrested.

b. AHLERS, Welly

Through BARKHAUSEN, BARBIE became acquainted with AHLERS in HAMBURG, on 10 September 1946. For the following reasons, he believes that AHLERS was either an informant or a subagent of CLOEDE:

(1) BARKHAUSEN had met AHLERS in the spring or summer of 1946 at the home, near BUSCH, of his former company commander, Waffen SS Hauptsturmfuehrer DIETZ. AHLERS, who was employed in DIETZ's home as a maid, became BARKHAUSEN's mistress, and from that time on travelled with him wherever he went, thus becoming acquainted with all persons whom BARKHAUSEN contacted.

(2) Through BARKHAUSEN, CLOEDE met AHLERS and her sister, Frau THIELE, whose husband, a former Hitler Youth official, is interned in NEUBURG. Frau THIELE became CLOEDE's mistress and later gave birth to a child by him. BARBIE met Frau THIELE in October 1946 when he visited his wife, then living with AHLERS' mother in the LUENEBURGER WEIDE. At that time, charges had been preferred against Frau THIELE for the theft of ration cards from the local city hall in BUCHHOLZ. Later, AHLERS told BARBIE that CLOEDE had been very active in helping her sister and, through personal contacts, had been able to have the charges quashed. BARBIE assumes that in payment for his assistance AHLERS furnished CLOEDE with the names and addresses of the persons contacted by BARKHAUSEN.

(3) The most logical evidence, however, according to BARBIE, is the fact that his wife, upon leaving the maternity hospital in KASSEL-HARLESBERG in December 1946, noticed that she was under surveillance. The address of Frau BARBIE was known only to BARKHAUSEN, AHLERS, and Frau BREDE. BARBIE does not believe that BARKHAUSEN or Frau BREDE had anything to do with the surveillance, since they also were engaged in illegal activities. Another reason for his suspecting AHLERS rests upon a remark she once made to BARKHAUSEN's parents to the effect that BARKHAUSEN would be surprised to learn what would happen if he were to marry Frau MUELLER (another mistress of BARKHAUSEN, by whom he has a child) and not her.

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~~SECRET~~e. ACKER (fnu)

After their escape from the British authorities in HAMBURG, on 14 November 1945, SCHAEFER, WILKCHING, and BARBIE reconstructed the events of the past and reached the conclusion that they had been under surveillance from the moment that CLOEDE and ACKER entered the Cafe Lamm in HAMBURG on the night of their arrest. WILKCHING, for instance, remembered that when CLOEDE left the cafe, ACKER became extremely nervous, continually turning around and, on one occasion, leaving the table to make a phone call. Some time later, an Englishman in uniform with a green ribbon over his shoulder strap sat down at a table next to theirs. He was accompanied by three (3) women. WILKCHING and BARBIE again saw these persons sitting next to them in the F-un restaurant and later riding on the same streetcar. At first they thought this to be a coincidence, but later felt reasonably sure that they were under surveillance.

BARBIE believes that the English were tipped off by CLOEDE and ACKER. Before leaving them, ACKER asked the exact time the train would leave the ALTONA station for HANOVER, adding that he was going to travel with them. When ACKER did not appear and they were arrested, they assumed that he was an informant.

2. BARBIE's Relations With BARKHAUSEN

BARBIE states that he has often reproached BARKHAUSEN for his association with CLOEDE and AHLERS, especially because the last-named always accompanied him on his trips to contact other SS comrades. BARBIE told BARKHAUSEN that he distrusted CLOEDE because of his continual questioning and because of his boasting of having been a Nazi. BARBIE disapproved of BARKHAUSEN's association with AHLERS because BARKHAUSEN was also very intimate with Frau Cissi MUELLER, the wife of BARBIE's deceased cousin.

BARBIE further states that he had contemplated breaking off connections with BARKHAUSEN and his associates shortly before Operation Selection Board, as he feared BARKHAUSEN's loose tongue and tendency to trust strangers.

1 Dec 1934-1 Sep 1935 Did volunteer work with the HJ, in order to get necessary help from party for studies. On many occasions met with the Ortsgruppenleiter of Ortsgruppe Trier-Mitte, Karl HORRMAN, Palast Strasse, TRIER. HORRMAN knew BARBIE's financial situation

February 1935 Asked by HORRMAN whether he was interested in entering either the Gestapo or the Security Service (SD) of the SS. All members were supposed to get, almost free, an education in law. BARBIE immediately applied for membership

September 1935 Interviewed by the Chief of the SD, HEIDRICH, in BERLIN, 102 Wilhelm Strasse

1 Oct 1935 Became member of the SD, in the SI Hauptamt. At the same time became SS Mann (Private) with membership number 272,284. At first with Abteilung II, later III (Lebensgebiete). Joined Abteilung VI when it was formed in 1937. Received planning post with the rank of SS Sturmabfuhrer. (Belonged to Abteilung VI until the collapse.)

October 1935-October 1937 Received education in military, police, technical, and intelligence matters. Several times attended, for 6 to 8 weeks, the SD School in BERLIN near BERLIN, as well as the Fuhrerschule of the Sipo in BERLIN/Charlottenburg, 1 Schloss Strasse

June 1936 Promoted to SS Sturmabfuhrer (Pfc)

1 May 1937 Became member of the NSDAP, Ortsgruppe "Braunes Haus" Section A, MUNICH. At the same time entered the NSV.

April 1937 Promoted to SS Rottenfuhrer (Actg Cpl)

1 Oct 1937 Transferred to SD Oberabschnitt West DUESSELDORF, Goldsteiner Strasse. Member Abteilung VI (Intelligence Service).

1938 Served several times, for 4 to 6 weeks, with Stapo DUESSELDORF.

April 1938 Promoted to SS Scharfuhrer (Sgt)

1 Sep 1938-1 Dec 1938 Received military training with the Wehrmacht. Served with Infantry Regiment 39, III Bn, WISEL.

March 1939 Passed examination to become SS officer.

April 1939 Promoted to SS Oberscharfuhrer (S/Sgt)

Spring 1939 Passed examination for SD and became Referent of the SD, with the planning post of SS Sturmabfuhrer (Actg) in Amt VI (similar to Kriminal Rat with police).

1 Sep 1939-8 May 1940 Stationed with SD Abschnitt DORTMUND.

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20 April 1940 Promoted to SS Untersturmfuehrer (2nd Lt)

25 April 1940 Married in DUESSELDORF to Regina WILLES, of TRIER

May 1940-July 1940 Served in the Netherlands, Belgium, Northwest France

July 1940-December 1941 Served in The HAGUE as BGS

December 1941-January 1942 Passed examination for leading service with the Sipo and the SD in BERLIN/Charlottenburg

February 1942-April 1942 Served as BGS (local Security Police chief) in BRUSSELS

May/June 1942 Joined reserve for Operation Baku in BERLIN

July 1942-August 1942 Stationed at Swiss Border (GENEVA)

Sep 1942-Sep 1943 Served as BGS PARIS

Oct 1943-Dec 1943 Stationed in Northern Italy; BGS in Italy

January 1944-May 1944 Served in SE France; BGS in PARIS, Division Oberst SCHMER

June 1944-August 1944 Served on invasion front, Army Group G

28 Aug 1944 Wounded on southern invasion front

1 Sep 1944 Sent to hospital in BADEN BADEN

1 Dec 1944 Sent to hospital in HALBERSTADT

17 Feb 1945-6 Mar 1945 On convalescent leave

7 March 1945 Reported to Amt I in BERLIN

11 March 1945 Transferred to SD Leitabschnitt DUESSELDORF as Chief of VI. Arriving there, found that VI had been evacuated to ESSEN

17 March 1945 Transferred to Stapo ESSEN

1 April 1945 Reported on his own to SS and Police Fuehrer WAPENGAUS, and was immediately transferred to 12 SS AK. Could not find that organization and reported to Army Group B (LODEL), which he found by chance.

3 Apr 1945-16 Apr 1945 Served with Army Group B in a department for special orders under the command of Lt Col KLRLNKORRES

REPORT

(Note: The information contained in this report has been requested by 970th CIC Det.)

2. BARBIE's Activities From January 1947 until He Reestablished Contact with OTTO

Early in January 1947, a prearranged meeting was held at the home of Jaffen SS Obersturmfuehrer (1st Lt) Fritz PRUEHS in KARBURG (see CI-Flk/168, 7707 ECIC, dated 10 June 1947). It was attended by SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) Wolfgang OTTO, SS Unterscharfuehrer (Sgt) Christof MAULAN of the SD, SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) Von NORTHEIM, PRUEHS, and BARBIE. The purpose of this meeting, which had been called by OTTO, was not known to the others beforehand.

During the meeting, OTTO announced that NORTHEIM had a message of interest to some of those present. NORTHEIM stated that he was in contact with SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) HIRSCHFELD of the SS Verwaltungs and Wirtschaftshauptamt (Main Office for Administration and Economy) under Gruppenfuehrer (Maj Gen) Otho HIRSCHFELD, who at the time was employed as manager of the Breuninger Leather Co., in SCHOENWALD (northeast of STUTTGART), had succeeded in making indirect contact with a US Intelligence agency and was looking for former SS Intelligence personnel to help collect intelligence material about the Soviets for the Americans. HIRSCHFELD claimed to be cooperating in this field with SS Brigadefuehrer (Brig Gen) SIX and SS Sturmbannfuehrer (Maj) Dr. AUGSBURG, formerly of the Wannsee Institut (Eastern department). NORTHEIM concluded his announcement by asking MAULAN and BARBIE whether they would be interested in working for HIRSCHFELD. Both stated that they would have to look into the matter before committing themselves.

After the meeting, BARBIE returned to KASSEL, to the home of Fridolin BECKER, where he remained for approximately eight days. BARBIE then returned to KARBURG. There a letter awaited him requesting him to contact Dr. HOFFMANN in BERLEBURG, which he immediately did. He remained in BERLEBURG for three days. (For details as to BARBIE's dealings with Dr. HOFFMANN see CI-SIK/62, 7707 ECIC, Subject: BARBIE, Klaus, dated 15 April 1948.) HOFFMANN requested BARBIE to deliver a sealed letter to a Dr. KUNIGL, living in MELZREH (near STUTTGART).

Dr. KUNIGL invited BARBIE to stay as his guest for several days. During this visit, BARBIE became acquainted with a friend of KUNIGL, Dr. ZARP, a former SS Untersturmfuehrer (2nd Lt).

BARBIE then returned to KASSEL. Upon his arrival in KASSEL he met MAULAN, who was very enthusiastic about NORTHEIM's offer. MAULAN said that he and OTTO had contacted HIRSCHFELD and Dr. AUGSBURG, who had made a very good impression regarding their sincerity in attempting to contact former SS Intelligence personnel. On 10 February 1947 BARBIE departed for KUNIGL to contact OTTO.

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OTTO and BARBIE then went to SCHONENDORF to the home of Dr. AUGSBURG, where they were told that Dr. AUGSBURG and HIRSCHFELD had left for FUEKSTENRIED (near MUNICH) and could be reached at the Hotel Zur Post. BARBIE and OTTO returned to MUNICH, and BARBIE proceeded to FUEKSTENRIED alone. At the Hotel Zur Post, BARBIE saw HIRSCHFELD and Dr. AUGSBURG with an unknown woman. He approached HIRSCHFELD and introduced himself as BECKER, saying that he had been sent by OTTO. HIRSCHFELD, after questioning him as to his past, requested BARBIE to visit him in SCHONENDORF.

Upon his return to MUNICH, BARBIE went to SCHONENDORF, where he contacted HIRSCHFELD at his office in the Breuninger leather factory near the ER station. HIRSCHFELD stated that he was a former SS officer, that he had taken money from SS funds after the collapse of Germany, and that he, with SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) SCHLEIFER, had bought the Breuninger leather factory. Business was good, owing to the black market. Each had two vehicles and plenty of money.

HIRSCHFELD further stated that he was in contact with a group of former German Intelligence chiefs who were now active for the Americans and that he was acting as liaison for this group, in an attempt to legalize it as an organization of the US Forces. Brigadefuehrer (Maj Gen) SIX and Dr. AUGSBURG were the chiefs. HIRSCHFELD handled the financial problems.

Before BARBIE departed, HIRSCHFELD asked whether he would like to become a member of this group. BARBIE requested time to think the matter over. At this point HIRSCHFELD gave BARBIE a certificate stating that BARBIE was a traveling salesman for the Breuninger leather factory. BARBIE mistrusted HIRSCHFELD because he had heard from SS Hauptsturmfuehrer (Capt) SCHRIEVEK that SIX had been arrested. Because of this he wanted to contact SCHRIEVEK before committing himself to HIRSCHFELD.

BARBIE proceeded immediately to KASSEL to contact NAUMANN, from whom he hoped to obtain SCHRIEVEK's address. He arrived in KASSEL on the night of 22 February 1947. As he entered the BECKER home, the house was raided by CIC, being a target for Operation Selection Board. BARBIE managed to avoid arrest by jumping from a back window. The following day he left for MUNICH, where he contacted OTTO, who, however, was unable to give him the address of SCHRIEVEK. On 5 March, BARBIE met Dr. HOFFMAN (See CI-SIR/62, 7707 ECIC). BARBIE remained in MUNICH until 6 March, when, upon an invitation, he visited Dr. HIRSCH in MELZBECK.

On 12 March, BARBIE returned to MUNICH to meet OTTO as prearranged. They intended to make inquiries of Dr. AUGSBURG in regard to HIRSCHFELD's past. This trip, which took place on or about 16 March, was not successful, as Dr. AUGSBURG was unable to tell them more about HIRSCHFELD than they already knew. BARBIE and OTTO then called upon HIRSCHFELD, who stating that he had to leave on business immediately, requested them to meet him in the Loewenbrau Restaurant on 21 March.

OTTO and BARBIE returned to MUNICH. En route OTTO met an acquaintance, a former SS Hauptsturmfuehrer SCHULZ, who lives in BUCKLE (near AUGSBURG). Until then BARBIE had known SCHULZ by name only, since OTTO had already told him about SCHULZ's knowledge of a former Abwehr captain who was employed by the Americans. During the conversation BARBIE had SCHULZ describe this man, a Capt PETERSEN, who was working in MUELLINGEN. BARBIE recognized this person as LERK and inquired where he could be contacted. SCHULZ told BARBIE that PETERSEN could be contacted at the cafe "Weinsigel" in MUELLINGEN during the noon hour.

BARBIE and OTTO met again in MUNICH on 21 March at the Loewenbrau Restaurant, where HIRSCHFELD awaited them. HIRSCHFELD asked them to go with him to Schloss Fellafing, a suburb of MUNICH, where Dr. AUGSBURG was awaiting them. Upon arrival, HIRSCHFELD called BARBIE aside, saying that he had an assignment for him in SCHWABINGEN-GRUEND. The Communists there had built up a radio network and were active in the intelligence field. BARBIE was to move

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to this city and attempt to penetrate this organization. In doing so he would receive all necessary assistance from a certain KRAMER of SCHEUSDORF. HIRSCHFELD talked to OTTO privately in regard to his duties, which were unknown to BARBIE. OTTO and BARBIE then returned to MUNICH. BARBIE was to use his own judgment on completing this assignment, and was to report to HIRSCHFELD as well as draw his pay from him. No specific salary was set by HIRSCHFELD for BARBIE's work when the latter accepted the assignment.

On the following day BARBIE left for MERRINGEN, where he was unsuccessful in his attempt to contact LERK. From MERRINGEN, BARBIE went to SCHEUSDORF to contact HIRSCHFELD and KRAMER. KRAMER and BARBIE traveled together to SCHAEBISCH-GUELD to arrange for the quarters which BARBIE was to occupy during his stay in that city. They returned to SCHEUSDORF on the following day. HIRSCHFELD requested BARBIE to start his assignment approximately eight days.

On or about 28 March, BARBIE again went to MERRINGEN with the intention of contacting LERK. By chance he met LERK at the RR station, where LERK was waiting for one of his subagents (name unknown to BARBIE). LERK requested BARBIE to wait for him at the Weinsigel Cafe, where they met approximately three hours later. LERK instructed BARBIE to meet him at 20:00 hours in his office, at 36 Kaiser Promenade. They met and talked for three or four hours. LERK asked BARBIE to visit him again on 17 April 1947, saying that at that time he might have some good news for him.

After leaving LERK, BARBIE went to BAD MERISHOFEN (near AUGSBURG), where he met OTTO. BARBIE remained in BAD MERISHOFEN for eight days. He then went to WELZHEIM to see Dr. MINICH and from there to MURBURG. (See CI-SIR/62 for details.) On 15 April 1947, BARBIE went to SCHEUSDORF to see Dr. AUGSBURG. There he also saw KRAMER, who immediately told BARBIE that he had read in a newspaper of SIX's arrest and that he thought it obvious that HIRSCHFELD was double-dealing. In spite of that information, BARBIE went to HIRSCHFELD's office, where he met OTTO and SCHULZ. SCHULZ left after obtaining money from HIRSCHFELD. OTTO, HIRSCHFELD, and BARBIE, as well as BARBIE's wife were then taken to STUTTGART in HIRSCHFELD's vehicle, as HIRSCHFELD was very anxious for BARBIE to start on his assignment in SCHAEBISCH-GUELD. The following day BARBIE left for MERRINGEN for his appointment with LERK (BARBIE's wife often accompanied him but it is not always mentioned because it is of little importance).

2. BARBIE's Initial Contact With CIC Region IV

When BARBIE contacted LERK on 17 April, he was told to find himself a room and come back the following day at 18:00 hours, at which time he was met by TAYLOR, a CIC agent of MUNICH. TAYLOR assured BARBIE that he had nothing to fear, that he was not to be arrested, that TAYLOR merely wanted to have a few words with him.

TAYLOR inquired concerning BARBIE's past life, his activities while employed by the SD, and his assignments during the war years. (Later BARBIE wrote his biography for TAYLOR). TAYLOR asked BARBIE whether he would like to work for CIC as a subagent, collecting intelligence material. BARBIE immediately accepted this offer. TAYLOR then arranged for a room at the Bahnhof Hotel, where BARBIE was to stay until further notice.

3. Terms on Which BARBIE Was Recruited; His Mission

Eight or more days passed before TAYLOR requested to see BARBIE again. TAYLOR informed BARBIE that his appointment had been approved by the Chief of CIC in MUNICH and that he could start to work immediately on the following terms:

- a. To remain in Bavaria.
- b. To break off all connections with other SS or German intelligence personnel.

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c. To contact SS or German intelligence personnel only upon order of CIC.

d. To carry out all instructions given by CXC.

When BARBIE agreed to these terms, he was given a questionnaire to fill out and told to assist LEKK in forming an intelligence network to collect material pertaining to the Soviets. BARBIE was to be paid by LEKK.

4. The Forming of Organization Lersen: Its Mission

LEKK's original intelligence network, called Buero Petersen to coincide with his cover name, was functioning on a very small scale. After a discussion about BARBIE's work, he and LEKK came to the conclusion that the network should be rebuilt on the basis of the mission it was to fill.

The following four main missions, taken as the basis, were broken down into various phases of intelligence.

a. Clarification of the activities of the RIS in the Soviet Zone of Germany and satellite countries

b. Clarification of RIS activities in the US Zone of Germany.

c. Information pertaining to the collaboration of the French Intelligence with the RIS.

d. Penetration of Soviet-sponsored organizations.

These four missions were sub-divided in the following manner:

re a. Clarification of the Activities of the RIS in the Soviet Zone of Germany and Satellite Countries

(4) Data on Soviet military intelligence, including plans and other documents.

(5) Other intelligence information from the Soviet Zone of Germany and satellite countries.

re b. Clarification of RIS Activities in US Zone of Germany

(1) To collect information pertaining to the activities of the RIS in the US Zone of Germany (military, administration, economy, politics).

(2) To uncover Soviet agents in the US Zone of Germany (their location, activities, contacts, etc.).

(3) To obtain information about the channels of operation of agent nets in the US Zone.

(4) To establish the degree of collaboration between the KPD (and other groups affiliated with the KPD) and the RIS.

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re c. Information Pertaining to the Collaboration of the French Intelligence Service with the KIS

- (1) Information pertaining to the degree of collaboration between the Soviet and the French Intelligence Services.
- (2) Degree of Communist penetration of the French Intelligence Service.
- (3) Activities of the Communist party of France in the French Zone of Germany and of the KPD of that zone.
- (4) Any information concerning the activities of French Intelligence for the Soviets in the US Zone

re d. Penetration of Soviet Sponsored Organizations

- (1) [REDACTED]
- (2) Secure military intelligence.
- (3) [REDACTED]
- (4) [REDACTED]

Using the above outline as a basis, LERK and BARBIE proceeded to build up an agent network, called Buero Larsen, with headquarters in KEIMPTEN, 38 Schiller Street. (See chart of the structure of Buero Larsen, Annex I).

5. Names of Sub-Agents; When, Where, and How Recruited

When BARBIE became part of Buero Larsen, LERK had approximately 15 agents working for him. Of these, BARBIE remembers the following:

- a. Two Russian emigrants living in OBENSTAUFEK who reported on Soviet activities in DP camps.
- b. [REDACTED]
- c. [REDACTED]
- d. [REDACTED]
- e. Two women living in the Soviet Zone of Germany (names unknown to BARBIE).
- f. An agent in BERLIN, friend of [REDACTED]
- g. [REDACTED]
- h. [REDACTED]

BARBIE does not recall the names of the other sub-agents but states that a record of their names and their code names is kept on file at Buero Larsen in KEIMPTEN. BARBIE states that all agents and subagents are known to CIC MUNICH and were recruited only after approval from either TAYLOR or STEVENS (both special agents of CIC Region IV).

In the course of time the following persons recruited by BARBIE were employed as subagents upon the approval of CIC MUNICH:

- a. [REDACTED] recruited 30 May 1947 through personal contact as a specialist on Eastern affairs.

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Some names BARBIE cannot recall. However, he states that CIC Region IV has personal data on all agents and subagents of Buero Larsen and that a duplicate copy can be found in KEAPTEN in the files of that organization. To the best of BARBIE's knowledge, Buero Larsen has approximately 35 to 40 agents and subagents.

6. Explanation of the System of Reporting

In most cases agents and subagents reported to BARBIE in MERLINGEN, 36 Kaiser Promenade. Their arrival was made known through a coded or pre-arranged text, in the form of either telegrams or letters sent under their code names. All such letters or telegrams went to BARBIE, who made the necessary contacts and arranged, whenever possible, for LERK to be present when the agent or subagent reported.

Upon arrival, the agent submitted a written report or wrote his report after giving it orally to LERK or BARBIE. The report was then reread by both LERK and BARBIE, who, in turn, evaluated, criticized, and questioned on points not clear. When this was completed, in most cases the agent or subagent was given new instructions and was either told to continue his mission or assigned a new one. In all important cases, CIC MUNICH (special agents TAYLOR or STEVENS) was contacted and new instructions received.

The report was then taken to KEAPTEN by LERK or BARBIE where it was edited and rewritten, either as a single report or as part of a consolidated report from various sources. These reports carried the name (code) of agent or subagent in the upper left-hand corner and the date of the report in the upper right-hand corner. Place of origin was never given. Each report received a number. Each report was evaluated by LERK in the following manner:

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- a. II - source reliable and information true.
- b. III - source usually reliable and information usually true.

Each report was concluded with comments by MERK, as well as recommendations as to what action should be taken.

These reports were taken to LUNICH by LERK once a week or at least every 14 days. There the reports were discussed by LERK and a CIC agent (TAYLOR or STEVENS), who made comments and instructed MERK on new missions to be assigned. (Two copies of each report were taken to LUNICH; a third remained in KEMPTEN as part of the files of Buero Larsen.)

7. Payment System Used by Organization Larsen

At the beginning of each month, MERK went to LUNICH, where he received a payroll for all agents and subagents in the amount of something like 10,000 or 15,000 Reichsmarks, as well as cigarettes and foodstuff in cans.

MERK paid most of the agents either in MERMINGEN or in KEMPTEN when they reported. Each person had to sign two receipts; one was turned over to CIC, the other was kept in KEMPTEN in the agent's or subagent's folder. The only payment made by BARBIE was to [REDACTED], who received 2,000 RM, a limited number of cigarettes, and foodstuff in cans.

[REDACTED] were not paid in marks for their services but received only cigarettes for their personal use. In most cases, agents were reimbursed for their travel expenses upon turning in their bills to MERK. The payment made to MERK by CIC varied each month, depending on the number of agents active in collecting intelligence information. It was often necessary for LERK to request additional sums to complete the payments of agents.

A record is on file in KEMPTEN of amounts of money, cigarettes, and food received from CIC LUNICH and to whom paid. To the best of BARBIE's knowledge, the following persons received per month the payments indicated below:

8. BARBIE'S Knowledge of MERK

After completing his service in the RLD, MERK entered the army. In 1934 he was sent to an officers training school and upon graduating was given a commission as 2nd lieutenant of artillery. When France collapsed, MERK came in contact with Abwehr officers who effected his transfer into that organization. MERK was transferred to DUNK, France, where he remained in the Abwehr until the German forces withdrew from France.

In Germany, MERK was captured by the US Army and taken to a PW cage in MERMINGEN. In 1946 he was discharged but was rearrested because he was denounced as a member of the Wehrwolf organization. This, however, proved

not to be true and MERK was transferred to OBERURSEL (MISC). There he was asked whether he was interested in working for CIC. MERK agreed and was taken by a CIC agent named TAYLOR to WELINGEN. In the autumn of 1948, MERK formed Bruno Peterson in WELINGEN, 36 Kaiser Promenade. (BARBIE's office is now at this address.)

According to BARBIE, MERK was denazified in 1947 and has full freedom in every way, as he was not affiliated with the Nazi Party or the SS.

BARBIE became acquainted with MERK in DIJON, France, in the autumn of 1942, when by chance BARBIE visited the Abwehr Office to obtain information in regard to the French underground. After this meeting they remained in contact. BARBIE avers that at no time prior to April 1947 did he ever work for MERK or MERK for him.

MERK formerly worked under special agent TAYLOR, who went to the US in August 1947. Since that time MERK has been under special agent STEVENS. Both are from the Region IV. MERK's position with MERK is that of assistant.

BARBIE states that MERK is of the opinion that CIC does not have sufficient power or freedom of movement to carry out its mission in Europe. It lacks the funds and other essentials to compete with present conditions in Germany. MERK would prefer, if possible, to work with a higher-level organization which could possibly remedy the situation.

On several occasions MERK has been asked to join other intelligence organizations run by former Abwehr or SD chiefs for Hqs EUCOM but has refused because he prefers to work directly for a US agency.

9. BARBIE's Attitude Toward Working for the British

BARBIE states that, after his contact with CIC, he is not interested in working for the British Intelligence Service or for any other organization. BARBIE avers that owing to the unjust treatment he received from the British after his arrest in HAMBURG on 12 November 1946, he lost all interest in the British as well as faith in the many promises they made him.

BARBIE says that, after Operation Selection Board, Dr. HOFFMAN, a British informant, repeatedly attempted to recruit him for the British (See CI-SIR/52, 47707 ECIC). BARBIE states that the British have recruited a friend of his, a former Sturmabfuhrer (Major) of the SS who was active in the SD, and it is possible that this man, SCHEER, has recommended BARBIE to the British.

BARBIE believes that the British would arrest him if he were to enter their Zone. He is sure that they know of his employment by CIC and would want to know more about what he is doing.

10. BARBIE's Intentions After his Release

BARBIE is ready to return to WELINGEN to continue with his work. He prefers to do so if at all possible, but he is also willing to transfer to another location or to any other department of CIC.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

It is believed by the interrogator that BARBIE has given a factual account of his activities as of January 1947 and that he has volunteered all the facts known to him concerning Organization Larsen. BARBIE states that although he is unable to remember the names of all agents and subagents, he has taken the utmost care to name as many as possible.

BARBIE's activities from May 1945 until December 1946 are not covered in this report, as there is sufficient background material on personalities and activities of Operation Selection Board. All events of intelligence

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value concerning BARBIE during this period have been published in a series of special interrogation reports at this Center. (See References for data on these reports.)

Because of BARBIE's activities with CIC Region IV during 1947, it is not deemed advisable to intern him for his affiliation with the Waffen SS. His knowledge as to the mission of CIC, its agents, subagents, funds, etc., is too great. If BARBIE were interned, it is the opinion of the interrogator that upon his release or escape (BARBIE has escaped from US authorities twice and from the British authorities once), he would contact either the French or the British Intelligence and work for them.

It is recommended that Hqs CIC, USCOM, check credibility of BARBIE's statements.

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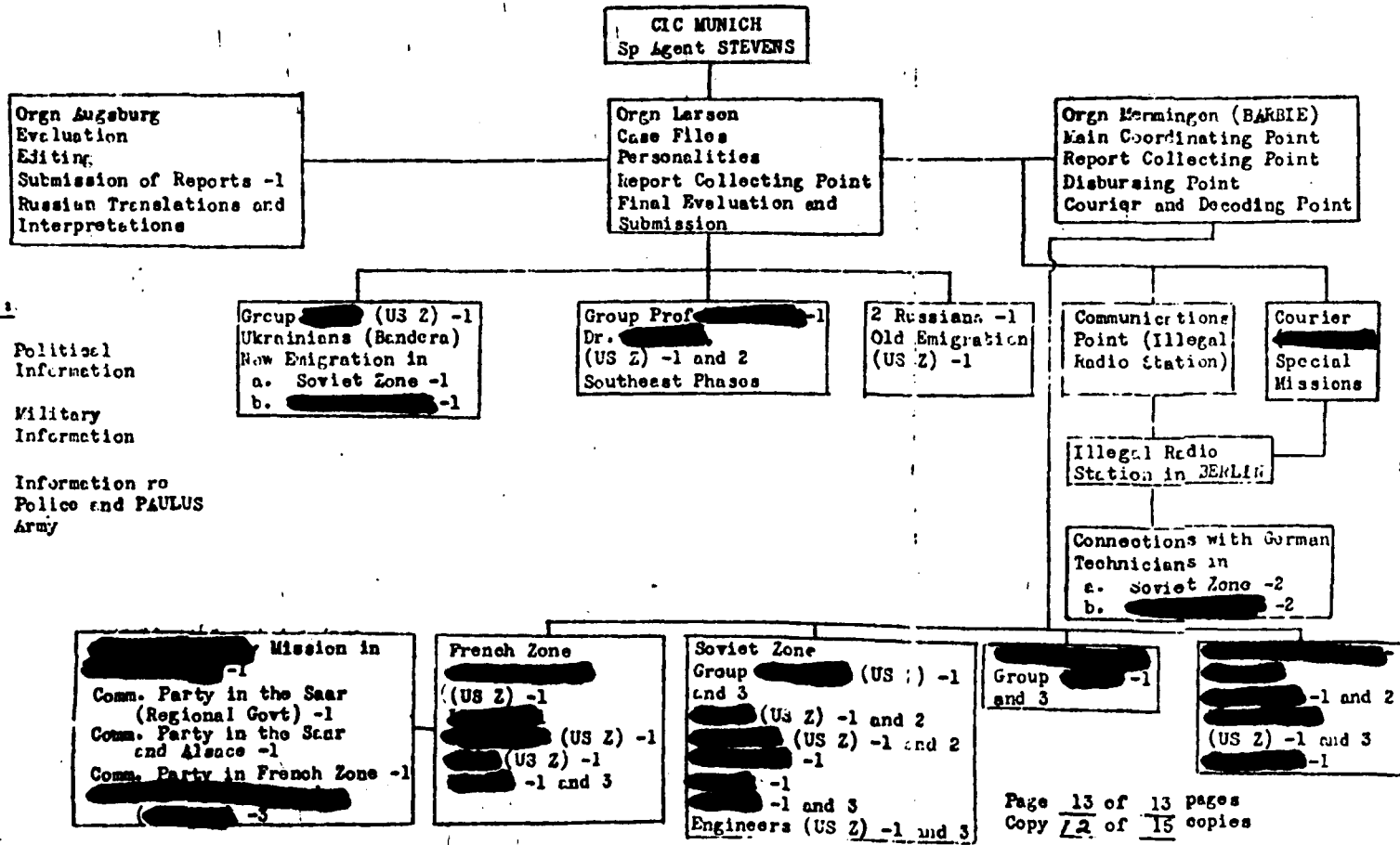

1. Reference is made to request from Operations Section, Headquarters Region IV pertaining to present status of informants net PETERSEN. On 4 June 1948 the undersigned Agent was requested to takeover the direction of above named informant and 15 June 1948 the first contact was made in AUGSBURG. The undersigned Agent has visited SUBJECT five (5) times in KEMPTEN and presently status of informant is substantially as follows:

a. SUBJECT informant has presently eleven (11) sub-sources under his direction and all personal data concerning these sub-sources will be submitted as soon as the undersigned has agreed to keep them under SUBJECT's direction.

b. Several of his sub-sources have apparently been compromised and are no longer productive. SUBJECT informant has been ordered to de-brief and drop all compromised sources.

2. A house has been secured for SUBJECT informant in AUGSBURG. This house is located at #10 Mozart Strasse, Stadtbergchen, AUGSBURG, on the outskirts of a dependant community and has been condemned for occupancy for US personnel by Post Headquarters. SUBJECT informant will occupy above quarters on or about 15 July 1948.

3. Only persons essential to the successful operation of SUBJECT informant's net will be brought into new address in AUGSBURG. These people include SUBJECT, SUBJECT's common-law-wife, mother of wife, and one secretary, and Dr. AUGSEURG and secretary. This involves six (6) persons in all.

4. SUBJECT's sub-source [redacted] has been approached by the undersigned and he will be directed separately as of 15 July 1948. [redacted] has two (2) sub-sources named [redacted]. The sub-sources [redacted] have each three (3) informants which is the complete net of SUBJECT's sub-source [redacted].

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5. Since the currency reform on 18 June 1948, SUBJECT informant has not produced any reports with the explanation that all his sources are without funds and unable to travel. On 29 June 1948 the undersigned paid SUBJECT five hundred (500) GERMAN Marks to continue operation. SUBJECT, however, indicated that he would need eight thousand (8000) to ten thousand (10000) GERMAN Marks to operate his net efficiently.

6. It is the opinion of the undersigned that SUBJECT can be of continued value to this organization if his net is directly and closely controlled by the undersigned Agent. All sub-sources should be personally known to the undersigned and all personal data regarding them must be available to this headquarters. Due to the FRENCH situation in which SUBJECT is involved by reason of his association with his present common-law-wife, SUBJECT can be easily controlled by offering him protection of the US Army. The undersigned Agent therefore requests permission to direct SUBJECT informant's net in the manner described above. All new developments will be reported immediately.

1. Reference is made to letter, your Headquarters, file D-14883, subject as above, dated 28 May 1948 and to telephone conversations between Mr VIDAL, Technical Consultant, your Headquarters and Lt LAVOIE, Technical Specialist, this office.

2. The following is a report regarding the present status of the informant network known as "Buro Peterson" under the overall direction of Kurt MERK (X-3067-IV-K).

3. Because information had been forwarded to this office indicating that the network of "Buro Peterson" in KEMPTEN (L48/X 90) had been compromised, the first move in the reorganizing of the network was the physical moving of the residence and offices of the "Buro Peterson" from KEMPTEN to AUGSBURG (M49/Y 37). In July 1948 Kurt MERK (X-3067-IV-K), his Common-Law Wife, his Mother-in-Law and Dr Emil AUGSBURG (X-3053-IV-K) were moved from KEMPTEN to AUGSBURG into a house located at 10 Mozartstr, Stadtbergen, AUGSBURG. This house, which was obtained through Augsburg Military Post, is located at the outskirts of a dependent community and had been condemned for occupancy by US personnel.

4. Office space for the operation of this network was obtained through the Town Major's office and is located in the "Schwimmbad" in AUGSBURG, which building gives access to both American and German personnel.

8. Attached hereto for dossier purposes is a brief personality report on each member of the network. Inasmuch as this intelligence network has proven to be one of the most fruitful sources of information for Region IV, it is requested that approval of your Headquarters for the operation of this group be forwarded in order that coverage of certain targets may be reinstated.

9. The undersigned desires to point out that this is an exceptionally well qualified intelligence net whose missions and targets can be changed at a moment's notice. It is essential, however, that contacts be maintained with the present members in order that the network which operates efficiently under the direction of Kurt MERK be not severed.

CIC HQ was cool to Lavoie's plan, however; Major Browning told Region IV on October 25, 1948 that "[a]fter due consideration by all concerned at this headquarters," it was the "consensus" that Merk's net "should be dropped as such by this organization."

Browning cited a variety of administrative problems in maintaining the net -- its huge size in the past with the likelihood that those since dropped might be working for foreign intelligence and still in touch with the remaining 12 members; the difficulty of direct control of sub-sources; interference with other CIC regions; the financial burden; and so forth. Browning also observed that "to continue employing subject net, we must protect an individual who is wanted by an Allied country for war crimes" an apparent reference to Merk. Browning suggested that the Department of the Army Detachment à a pseudonym for the Central Intelligence Agency "should be contacted for possible employment of subject net by [that] agency."

Headquarters agreed that individual net members could be retained as informants if they worked individually, had "specific potentialities" and had backgrounds that would not cause "undue embarrassment" to CIC.

Region IV did not like the idea. On November 16, 1948 — by which time the net had been operating for three to four months — Capt. Etkin, the region's operations officer, responded, pointing out that the net was being reduced again, to six persons, and was thus both secure and administratively workable. But the six remaining (including Merk and Barbie) insisted on working together, not individually. Moreover, warned Etkin, "[t]he three (3) key personnel of the net [Merk, Barbie, and a third man] will discontinue to trust or maintain contact with their former colleagues [apparently a reference to the dropped informants] because of fear of being left out in the cold, and they are firmly convinced that the U.S. authorities are going to help them in the event of trouble as they have in the past."

An informal report compiled by a Region IV agent in preparation for Etkin's reply to HQ stated "Merk and Barbie have both agreed and are currently working on a local basis by turning former Gestapo and SS informants known to them in former times." But the agent noted: "Barbie is concerned about the French and realize [sic] that if the French were ever to get control of him he would be executed."

CIC HQ and Region IV worked out a compromise, approved by Browning: a 3-month extension of the net, following which the matter of its "continued employment" would be decided.

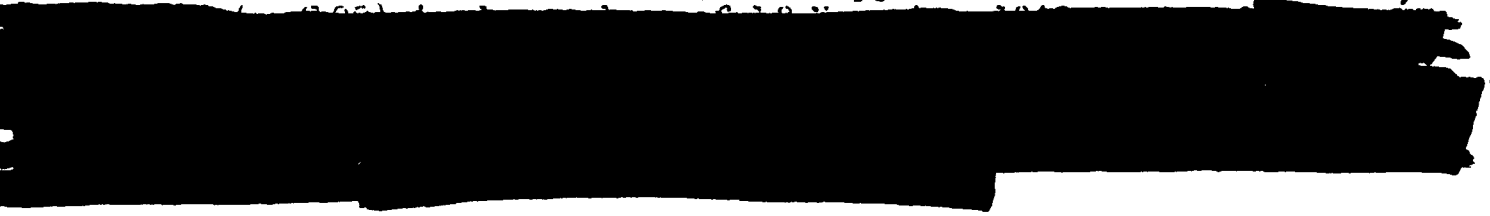
1. Reference is made to letter, your Hq, file D-14883, subject as above, dated 25 October 1948, as well as to previous correspondence from this office under the file and subject above.

2. This office does not concur with the suggestion offered in Paragraph 3.a. of letter of reference that "subject net should be dropped by this organization". The following reasons are given for the retention of subject net for at least three (3) months:

a. The net has finally after seven (7) months been cut down to a workable size and it is now confining its efforts to the Region IV area of jurisdiction.

b. Personnel previously in the net who were not in the Region IV area have been dropped or are in the process of being dropped or turned over to other CIC Regions or Sub-regions.

c. Emil AUGSBURG (X-3053) is dropped as of 12 November 1948,



d. With the dropping of the aforementioned personnel, it leaves but three (3) people in key positions in the net with three (3) others as sub-sources. With six (6) persons in the net, it is not considered in this office to be unwieldy but is considered to be at an efficient operating level. The security risk involved by using this small net is not considered to be any greater than using informants contacted individually.

3. Your attention is invited to Paragraph 3.c. of your letter of 25 October 1948 in which it is suggested that the sources of information work individually by direct or indirect contact with a CIC agent from the area concerned. It must be stated here that this suggestion has been attempted before with no success. A certain amount of success was reached at the very lowest echelon of the net; however, at the higher echelons the unit was very adamant in being kept together.

On the cutting out of the lower echelons of the net, this would preclude any of the remaining personnel to work as individuals. Further reference is made to Paragraph 4 of your letter of 25 October 1948 in which it is pointed out that the existence of the net and its contact with CIC is known to the French, the British, and possibly the Soviets. To this end, it can be stated that with the almost free flow of information in the higher levels between the French, British and American agencies this compromise would not be considered dangerous. The possibility that the net may be known to the Soviets is not unlikely. However, it can be safely stated that the Soviets have not penetrated this net as it now stands. Reference is again made to Paragraph 4.b. of your letter of 25 October 1948, pointing out that several members of the net have been dropped in the past and that those members were of dubious character having been recently involved in small-time black market activities, robbery, and smuggling. This statement is undoubtedly true. That is one of the primary reasons why they were dropped. In addition to that their illegal activities may have come out into the open when their source of supply was cut off by being dropped from our net.

4. Concerning the probable contact that the MERK net has with the TETSCH net in the STUTTGART area, the following is offered:

a. Mr. CANFIELD, Technical Specialist of Sub-Region AUGSBURG, made a survey of the MERK net and paid particular attention to the probable associations with the TETSCH net of STUTTGART inasmuch as he was thoroughly familiar with the TETSCH net. The following is quoted from an informal report of Mr. CANFIELD regarding the associations of the PETERSEN net with the TETSCH net, "BARBIE stated that Dr. AUGSBURG had been visited several times by a former SS General BERNAU of the STUTTGART SS net, who is allegedly working for TIB, the French, and the CIC. BERNAU stated to Dr. AUGSBURG that he would furnish the PETERSEN net EB's that he received from TIB and they could exchange information. BARBIE stated that if any information was exchanged it was through Dr. AUGSBURG, who was an evaluator on Soviet affairs. Dr. AUGSBURG has a brother who is with the STUTTGART SS net. However, this was not known to them until a short time ago because Dr. AUGSBURG introduced his brother under an alias. Dr. AUGSBURG has been dropped as an informant of this headquarters, and BARBIE after this discussion assured that his connection with Dr. AUGSBURG has been severed. BARBIE stated that their net has never trusted the STUTTGART SS net because of their connections with the French and possibly two (2) political factions within the SS net".

5. The net is no longer being employed merely to keep them from being used by an undesirable foreign power, but it is in reality working on local requirements as far as the Region IV area is concerned. The danger of overlapping into other Regions has been almost completely cut out so there should be no duplication of effort as far as the CI mission is concerned.

Summing up the entire case, we see that MERRI and BARBIE-- have both agreed and are currently working on a local basis having used contacts available to them within the jurisdiction of AUGSBURG Sub-Region. To date, they have accomplished a superficial penetration of the AUGSBURG Bezirksleitung and have also turned a former Gestapo informant who is the 2nd Secretary of the KPD in Kreis MEMMINGEN (L48/X83). The three (3) key personnel of the net will discontinue to trust or maintain contact with their former colleagues because of fear of being left out in the cold, and they are firmly convinced that the U.S. authorities are going to help them in the event of trouble as they have in the past. ?

7. Lastly, your attention is invited to the conversation between Mr. VIDAL, Lt. LAVOIE, and Capt. ETKIN on 8 November 1948, at which time it was proposed that a three (3) month trial period of the new net would be granted.

GENERAL NOTE

I. Report of Findings "PETERSON NET"

1. There are three carded informants, namely, Kurt MERK, Klaus BARBIE, and ~~_____~~. All other informants have been dropped and their connections have been severed with former members of the SS net.

2. In my personal visit I was impressed by their apparent honesty and sincerity in discussing other SS and Abwehr personalities known by this agent. They stated that former SS and Abwehr personnel could, in most cases, be considered as a risk for US intelligence for the following reasons:

- a. Mistreatment in 1945 and 1946 by the US Army in general.
- b. Some are the old nationalistic army line.
- c. National Bolshevism as a means for the preservation of a free Germany.
- d. Fear of the development of a new war and possible Russian victory.
- e. Others who have connections with the Freis Deutschlands Party in the Eastern Zone.

3. "Tetsch Net" in STUTTGART and their connections with the "Peterson Net":

a. Barbies stated that Dr. Augsburg had been visited several times by a former SS General BERNAU of ^{the} STUTTGART SS Net who is ^{currently} working for T.I.E., the French, and the CIC. BERNAU stated to Dr. Augsburg that he would furnish the "Peterson Net" BEIs that he received from T.I.E. and they could exchange information. Barbies stated that if any information was exchanged it was through Dr. Augsburg who was an evaluator on Soviet affairs. Dr. Augsburg has a brother who is with the STUTTGART SS net, however, this was not known to them until a short time ago, because Dr. Augsburg introduced his brother under an alias. Dr. Augsburg has been dropped as an informant of this Headquarters and Barbie, after this discussion, assured that his connection with Dr. Augsburg had been severed. Barbie stated that their net has never trusted the STUTTGART SS net because of their connections with the French and possibly two political factions within the SS net.

b. MERK and BARBIE have both agreed and are currently working on a local basis by turning former Gestapo and SS informants known to them in former times. They have to date accomplished in turning a former Gestapo informer who is now a functionary in the KPD Bezirksleitung, AUGSBURG. Other suggestions are as follows:

- 1. Recruitment of informants to meet the local requirements by recruiting persons in the intellectual circles in local political parties and city administration.
- 2. Screening of former Soviet PWs and female personnel returning to this area.

3. Penetration of the police to determine, if any KPD activity within the police force.
4. Penetration of any local Soviet agents operation in the AUGSBURG area.

4. Recommend that the three members be given an opportunity to build up their net on a local basis as stated in paragraph 3b.

OPINION: That these three men will discontinue to trust or maintain contact with their former colleagues because of fear of being left out in the cold in a future aggression and they are positive that the US authorities are going to help them in the event of trouble.

Farbie is concerned about the French and realize that if the French were ever to get control of him he would be executed.

It is my opinion that these three men can render valuable service to the local CIC in AUGSBURG for they have the background in intelligence and know our system and are already aware of our ERIs. Should this same penetration be affected by new recruited informants there would only be more informants cognizant of CIC's ERIs.

- c. To determine the security risk involved in employing the net.
- d. To determine the amount of funds necessary to maintain the net as compared to the information received.
- e. To consider the possibility of assigning certain members of the net to a CIC agent in the Region or Sub-Region concerned.

3. After due consideration by all concerned at this headquarters, the following is the consensus of this headquarters:

b. The [redacted] Department of [redacted] Detachment should be contacted for possible employment of subject net by [redacted] agency.

c. Retain members of the net who can fulfill the following requirements:

(1) Must agree to continue working individually by direct or indirect contact with a CIC agent from the area concerned

(2) Must justify his employment by specific potentialities in a specific field of intelligence endeavor which is of interest to this organization.

(3) His background is such that his employment will not cause undue embarrassment to this organization.

4. The reasoning behind this consensus is as follows:

a. The net has been compromised in the past. The extent of compromise is not known. Its existence and its contact with CIC is known to the French, the British and possibly the Soviets.

b. The net at one time consisted of at least 65 members extending over all occupied zones of Germany. It has been cut to a total of 12 members. However, it is safe to assume that the contacts have not been broken, since the contacts were based on professional and political intrigue. Several of the members dropped are of dubious character, having been recently involved in large scale black market activities, robberies, and smuggling. They are possibly working for, or are in contact with, foreign intelligence agencies. They are allegedly forming a Feme Organization which has as its objective the liquidation of those Germans who have worked against former SS personalities. In addition, it is strongly suspected that subject net has contact with the TETSCH net which was recently dropped in Region I. The TETSCH net consisted of former SS officers and at one time numbered approximately 125 members. The suspicion is based upon the assumption that ex-SS and Abwehr members residing in the same community will continue to maintain contact.

c. In order to continue employing subject net, we must protect an individual who is wanted by an Allied country for war crimes.

d. A centralized net is difficult to control from a security standpoint since there is no direct control of the chain of sub-sources by this organization.

I haven't been able to see Frazier on this as he has been out to the Court Martial school ~~assignment~~. However, we looked into this ~~FILE~~ organization once before and ~~was not~~ able to prove that it probably existed in the mind of Barbie but actually he was doing nothing positive to implement it.

The existence of such an organization is quite feasible in my opinion, as, if you remember, BARBIE was picked up by the British FSS right after we lost him in our sweep in SELECTION BOARD. When I went down to Region IV, I spoke to BARBIE at length as to his activities during SELECTION BOARD and immediately thereafter to include his arrest by the British. He indicated to me that he had ~~any~~ an intense hatred for the British because he had been physically mistreated by them. He at that time blamed his arrest by the British on some of his former SS comrades who had put the finger on him.

Note paragraph 8 in which the British request any information that is available on Barbie, Peterson or Zarp. We could give them plenty if you so desire, but of course we would be compromising our people. What thinkest thou???

1. Basis report is forwarded through this Headquarters for information and comment.

2. Contents have been noted and a verbal discussion was held by Technical Specialist and Operations Officer, this Headquarters, with Technical Specialist, Sub Region AUGSBURG, to determine in greater detail the proposed plan for handling new sources mentioned in Paragraph 8.

3. The handling agent has personally met all individuals concerned and present plans are to have MERR and BARRIE "run" these agents at least until they are through the vetting period. At that time, if it is deemed better, an agent may personally take over the handling of the informant.

4. This Headquarters still feels that the Peterson Net, if properly directed, is and can be a valuable source of information of CI interest for Sub Region AUGSBURG.

5. It is felt, however, that the actions of all persons involved must be closely guided with some individual attention by the handling agent and that the number of persons be limited to prevent compromise and coverage outside of the jurisdiction of the Sub Region.

1. Reference is made to basic letter, your Headquarters, file IV-9256, subject as above, dated 16 November 1948, and 2nd Ind requesting a detailed outline pertaining to the current activities of the "Peterson Net" and the advisability of retaining the net and confining their activities to Counter Intelligence matter in the AUGSBURG area.

2. On the 18th November 1948, a conference was held between Capt Spiller, Mr. Canfield, and Mr. Bechtold, the controlling agent to determine the advisability of changing the "Peterson's Net" positive Intelligence mission to the Counter Intelligence mission and confining their activities to the AUGSBURG area. It was agreed that all positive intelligence sources should be dropped with the exception of the Baden-Baden source. However, it became necessary to drop the Baden-Baden source due to the high cost of the information submitted and the difficulty in checking the veracity of the reports being submitted. Consequently that leaves Kurt MERK and Klaus BARBIE as the only two carded sources of the so called net.

3. Unofficially the Headquarters that is currently being used is located at 1 Fuggerstrasse, Augsburg. This B.O.Q. apartment is assigned, as quarters to Mr. Bechtold, the controlling agent, and Capt Hoagland, assistant operations officer, this Headquarters. This operational post is ideal because it is located in a bank building, has a common entrance for both Americans and German personnel and is centrally located in the business district of AUGSBURG.

4. The "Peterson Net" at the present time is under the control of Special Agent Bechtold and under close supervision of the Sub-Regional technical specialist, this Headquarters.

9. It must be pointed out that the selection of the above named sources to be used in the target coverage as outlined, has progressed slowly but satisfactorily. The information submitted to date has not been sensational, but very informative.

10. At the present time the ultimate aim of "subject net" is penetration within an organization rather than to endeavor to recruit sources from the outside. Careful consideration has also been given to the security involved in organizing such an informative net to be used in KPD penetration. It is the opinion of the technical specialist when such an informative net is organized with careful supervision, and proper control is exercised, the security involved may be reduced to a minimum.

11. It is recommended that permission be granted to continue the effected plan of penetration with "subject net" as outlined. If permission is granted, all individuals concerned will be vetted in accordance with the new SOP.

Quite apart from HQ's decision, Merk was apparently getting restless in Augsburg. He had some medical problems, he felt constrained by the reduced scope of his net, and tension with Barbie was growing. Merk was inactive during the summer of 1949 because of his medical problems, and he was severed from the CIC in October 1949. He died in Germany in 1951.

4. REPORT OF FINDINGS

1. Reference is made to Top Secret letter dated 19 February 1949, SUBJECT: MARK, Kurt, BARBIE, Klaus--PETERSON Net to CO 7970th CIC Group, Region IV, APO 478, US Army, Attention Technical Specialist, File No. IV-A-4060, SUBJECT as above. Pursuant to instruction by Operations Officer, Region XII, the present status of SUBJECT is here-with amplified.


2. SYNOPSIS OF PREVIOUS INVESTIGATION: In accordance with directions received from Headquarters, 7970th CIC Group, APO 755, US Army, the organization known as Ruro PETERSON-PETERSON Net devoted itself mainly to "Operation Happiness" and procurement of positive information through sub-sources who had been recruited at the founding of this net. The organization was operated by SUBJECT, who handled sub-sources responsible for the positive intelligence and who was responsible for the over-all management of the net, and by Klaus BARBIE, who was responsible for Project "Happiness" and the sub-sources employed in this phase of investigation, under the direction of this agent.

3. PRESENT INVESTIGATION:

a. Background data previously forwarded.

b. The re-adjustment of the target picture by this Region and the dropping of all sources employed in gathering positive intelligence left SUBJECT without any actual assignments and created a momentary cessation of his activities. The utilization of SUBJECT within Operation "Happiness" was contemplated and discussed with him. SUBJECT agreed to concentrate his efforts on targets pertaining to the KPD but confessed that, nevertheless, he would feel out of place and consider himself not utilized to the best of his ability.

4. SUBJECT continued activities under direct supervision of this agent with satisfactory results. He was responsible for the procurement of two (2) new sources for the penetration of the KPD, and otherwise showed promising ingenuity in probing problems presented by his new assignment. During this time, SUBJECT approached this agent with the request that he be given an opportunity to undergo extensive medical treatment for a chronic gland condition, with which he had been afflicted for a number of years. SUBJECT explained that it would be most convenient at that time, since he was in a transitional period and could best be spared then. SUBJECT furthermore stated that, at the same time, he wanted to contact friends and relatives for a possible position in a civilian occupation. He explained his motive as a necessity, since he had no other source of income and would have to support himself and his dependents during the period of his convalescence. This agent informed him that SUBJECT's proposition would be discussed with the Operations

Officer of Region XII and that SUBJECT would be notified as to the decision.

5. During a conference among the Operations Officer and the Technical Specialist of Region XII, SUBJECT, and this agent, it was agreed that SUBJECT would be dropped temporarily by this Region, pending adjustment of his physical defects; however, prior to his leaving this organization, he would be turned over to Agent PLEDO, so that he could recruit sources of information for coverage of DP Camps and dissident groups. Upon completion of this assignment, SUBJECT would be free to go.

6. On 6 May 1949, SUBJECT informed this agent that he had completed his mission and would move out of the safe house which he had occupied as quarters with his dependents, as the final step in severing relations with this Region. SUBJECT expressed a desire to remain in contact with this agent and to keep this Headquarters informed as to his future actions. SUBJECT then established residence in OBERSCHAFFEN/ALLGÄU (M48/X90).

7. During an interview with this agent toward the end of May 1949, SUBJECT stated that he had contacted several specialists concerning his ailment. He had learned from them, that a major operation followed by a complete rest cure would be essential for his recovery. He also stated, that a position with a private enterprise, which would enable him to undergo such medical treatment, could not be obtained by him and that he had, therefore, contacted friends and acquaintances employed with US intelligence agencies on positive targets, for employment. SUBJECT stated that these contacts had approached him previously with offers of employment while he was still working for this organization, but that he had not exploited these contacts, considering the policy of Headquarters 7970th CIC Group. In view of his precarious financial position, he felt, however, that he would have to renew his intelligence activities, since this was his only means of making a livelihood. His potentialities were more in the positive field; but he wanted to know if any objections existed to his making contacts with US intelligence agencies operating in the positive field.



8. During a later interview with SUBJECT, this agent was able to ascertain that the following factors were responsible for his termination of services with this Headquarters :

a. SUBJECT felt that his potentiality in regard to intelligence gathering activities was no longer appreciated by this Headquarters, since he was a specialist of positive intelligence and the activities of Headquarters 7970th CIC Group did not include such targets. His attempts to reconvert to political targets had led to misunderstanding with Klaus BARBIE, who showed professional jealousy towards SUBJECT. If his employment by this Region on political targets had continued, serious misunderstandings between SUBJECT and BARBIE would have been inevitable. BARBIE had given him to understand that he was in complete control of all phases of political investigations, and that he did not welcome his assistance and did not want to share the responsibility with him. Rather than denounce BARBIE or cause an issue over these minor disagreements, he considered it best to leave and find employment with an agency which could best utilize his potentialities. SUBJECT stated that he did not want to inform this agent or any other person with whom he had come in contact in Region XII, as to his intentions, but that, in view of the delicate nature of his position with Region XII and his relationship to BARBIE, he thought it best to withdraw gradually and to acquaint the persons concerned with the true facts at the earliest opportunity.

b. SUBJECT had been prompted to interrupt his activities, at least temporarily, due to his state of health, and had seriously considered dropping out of the intelligence field altogether, in favor of a position with a civilian enterprise, but his lack of funds and the nature of his ailment, plus the present economic conditions in West Germany, had forced him to renew his activities, since this was his only available asset. SUBJECT stated that, at present, he was under treatment by a Professor, Dr. KIEHLMEUTNER, MUNICH, Marienstr. 8 or 12.

9. UNDEVELOPED LEADS AND FUTURE ACTION: None.

10. AGENT'S NOTES AND COMMENTS:

a. It may be pointed out by this agent that SUBJECT's statement concerning his misunderstanding with BARBIE may be considered true. BARBIE is a selfcentered personality who has demonstrated the same character traits to this agent.

b. It is the opinion of this agent that, although SUBJECT may have been activated largely by a desire to retain his position and re-

putation in the field of positive intelligence, the circumstances of his ill health, his desire to prevent gracefully any friction between agents and other sources utilized by this Region, also played an important role in his decision. SUBJECT has, at all times, served this agent faithfully and efficiently, and has displayed his loyalty to this organization under the most adverse conditions. SUBJECT has remained in contact with this agent, after being dropped by this Headquarters, and would willingly return if proper use of his potentiality could be accomplished. If the utilization of SUBJECT by another US intelligence agency could be arranged so that SUBJECT's possibilities could be exploited to a greater extent, this agent recommends that SUBJECT be transferred to such an agency.

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his headquarters) SUBJECT cautioned the handling agent against accepting the information as reliable, but his words of caution were evidently not heeded. In this respect SUBJECT's case parallels that of Klaus B. DIE. It is also evident, however, that SUBJECT controlled a net which was far too complex, widespread and intricate to enable good handling and control, and any one with any experience in intelligence work should have realized this fact. Again, however, the possibility exists that the fault lies not with SUBJECT but rather with his former handling agents.

b. Insofar as his usefulness and reliability was in connection with LINDEN, SUBJECT did not devote enough time to this Project to permit any good estimate.

c. SUBJECT's results in his effort to recruit sources for coverage of DP activities were not too good. In this respect he again showed a tendency to erect an intricate "network" of informants, and many of the sources he recruited were found to be unreliable. Again, however, it must be pointed out that SUBJECT was still under the impression that CIC desired such nets. It must also be pointed out that SUBJECT spent at most six weeks on this assignment.

d. In short, this Region believes that SUBJECT could have been turned into a valuable "X" type source for CIC, had he been properly handled. For this reason it is recommended that SUBJECT be dropped "without prejudice".

4. It is believed that formal debriefing of SUBJECT is neither possible nor necessary. Inasmuch as SUBJECT devoted most of his efforts to positive work, inasmuch as almost all of his former sub-sources have been dropped, and inasmuch as he is acquainted only in a general way with counterintelligence EMI's, formal debriefing is believed to be unnecessary.

5. SUBJECT's case continues to be classified as TOP SECRET due to his connection with another American intelligence agency.

1. SUBJECT is dropped as an informant of Region XII, without prejudice, for the following reasons:

a. SUBJECT is being utilized by another American intelligence agency.

b. SUBJECT is more interested in the field of positive intelligence than in counter intelligence.

2. Details regarding reasons for dropping the SUBJECT without prejudice are outlined in the attached Agent Report by the former handling agent. To briefly summarize, SUBJECT was formerly used as the control informant of the "Peterson Net" (Buero Peterson), a net engaged primarily in collecting positive information from Eastern and Southeastern Europe. This net was disbanded in the spring of 1949 due to the cessation of positive intelligence work by this Region, the extreme and widespread ramifications of this net, and the probable unreliability of many sources, sources and tertiary sources used by the net. SUBJECT was then for a time used for Project Happiness, with, however, only a fair degree of success. Inasmuch as this Region had virtually no reliable and productive sources for the DE and dissident field, in April - May 1949 an attempt was made to utilize SUBJECT to recruit sources for the coverage of DP camps in this area. This assignment, however, lasted only for a period of a few weeks, and SUBJECT was then "furloughed" for reasons of health. In the interim, SUBJECT, with the knowledge and consent of this office, has established contact with American agencies engaged in positive intelligence, and at present seems to be employed by MIS in MUNICH. Although the account of the manner in which SUBJECT was contacted by an agent from another intelligence agency (paragraph 7 of attached report) may seem somewhat farfetched, it is believed to be in character with the "modus operandi" of an MIS agent who was active in the MUNICH area in the Spring of 1949.

3. a. It is rather difficult at this date to give a true and valid picture of SUBJECT's reliability and past usefulness to this organization. The files of this Region are full of a large mass of positive intelligence reports which have been attributed to SUBJECT as source. In almost all cases, however, the material originated from now unknown sub-sources, tertiary sources, etc. Although the information contained in these reports cannot be evaluated at this level, it does seem in many instances to be rather farfetched and frequently imaginary. In all justice to SUBJECT, however, it must be noted that in a few known instances (where SUBJECT's original reports are filed together with copies of formal MOIC's forwarded to

Klaus BARBIE is a peaceable businessman in MUNICH, US Zone.

Two resistance organisations, the war veterans and the Victims of Nazism have just addressed a letter to the Ambassador of the United States in PARIS, demanding the immediate arrest of BARBIE and trial before the Military Tribunal of the 6th Region. The General Council of JURA has made a similar call.

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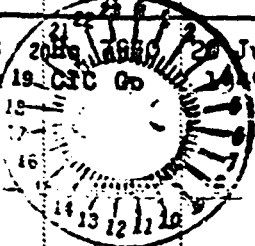

1. SUBJECT has been discreetly interrogated regarding the allegations in the newspaper article, with negative results. SUBJECT has upon occasion admitted that he used duress during interrogations ~~and~~ as continued interrogation over a long period of time, in the middle of the night, etc., but has never implied or indicated that he used torture.

2. In compliance with the directions contained in Minute 1, this office has no course but to administratively drop the SUBJECT as an informant. It is desired, however, for the record, to indicate the following:

a. SUBJECT has been interrogated on four (4) occasions by French authorities regarding his activities in France and regarding L'affaire Hard. French authorities know where SUBJECT is located, know where he can be reached, and probably know what his activities are here, yet no attempt has ever been made to extradite SUBJECT nor has any formal charge of war crimes nor any indication that SUBJECT was involved in war crimes been made.

b. If French authorities were interested in SUBJECT as a war criminal (and if his alleged crimes were as barbaric and well known as the newspaper article claims, they certainly should have been) it is almost certain that SUBJECT would have been extradited by now. It is pointed out that SUBJECT, under his proper name interrogated some very high French officials including Francois PONCET and LeBRUN.

c. SUBJECT has frequently been criticized by case officers of Group Headquarters because of the alleged misinformation he has supplied during the past. A check of SUBJECT's dossier reveals however that he was alleged to be the source for a considerable number of reports for which he served merely as a cut-out. On many of these reports SUBJECT in his own notes and comments frequently warned his handling agent regarding the low reliability of the information. In many cases SUBJECT stated that the original source was suspected of inventing sub-sources as well as concocting the information. In most of these instances, SUBJECT's low evaluation and his warnings were ignored, the information was forwarded (frequently under a high evaluation) and SUBJECT was listed as the source. It is quite evident that such action was taken on the part of some of the handling agents in a desire to swell production totals. Such improper use of SUBJECT has long since ceased. SUBJECT is now considered to be the most reliable informant this headquarters has. SUBJECT has in the past two (2) months been used mainly to effect penetration and to "turn" certain targets. He has been quite successful in the accomplishment of most of these missions.

3. The Operations Office of this region as well as the handling agent of SUBJECT have frequently watched SUBJECT interrogate certain suspects. Based on these observations it is the belief of both that SUBJECT is intelligent and skillful enough to accomplish a successful interrogation by use of his head and consequently did not require the use of his hands. This office consequently feels that while the charges against SUBJECT may possibly be true they are probably not true.

1. Reference is made to Secret IRS, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 24 May 1949.

2. It is desired that contact with subject be continued as indicated in the IRS referred to in paragraph 1 above. In answer to the specific questions posed in paragraphs 2-4 of Minute 1 above, this headquarters desires

that, in addition to keeping contact with subject, all efforts be made by your Region to keep him in the area in order to make him available in case BDDG wishes to reinterrogate him or the French formally request his extradition. It is, therefore, desired that subject not be made aware that his status with this organization has been altered. Since subject's sole income is derived from CIC, it is felt that to discontinue paying him would not only make him aware of his changed status but would also force him to seek employment elsewhere in the only trade which he knows, intelligence. The latter possibility will be avoided, lest this organization be further embarrassed by subject. Your Region is, therefore, authorized to continue paying subject the same salary as in the past in order to obviate any undesirable acts on subject's part. It is not felt that subject will leave the area if your Region continues to assist him financially.

3. Subject's case will be kept in the Top Secret category. In order to facilitate the maintenance of administrative records by your Region on subject, it is desired that where necessary, subject be referred to by his code designation.

4. Your Region will be informed of any further developments in this case.

1. It is requested that this office be advised as to the proper method and scope of maintaining contact with Klaus BARBIE, a former source of this Region.

2. This office has previously been advised to maintain contact with SUBJECT, and if possible to retain him in this area, so that, in the event of any request for his apprehension and/or extradition, he could easily be located and apprehended. However, this office has been aware of indications that SUBJECT may leave this area and assume a new identity. Advice is therefore desired on the following points:

- a. Is contact with SUBJECT still to be maintained so that SUBJECT could easily be located and apprehended, should the occasion arise?
- b. If SUBJECT attempts to leave the area, should he be apprehended?
- c. Is this Region authorized to provide SUBJECT with some funds in a further effort to keep him in this area?

3. It is desired to add that SUBJECT is still under the impression that he is viewed by this office as a source, and is not aware of the fact that this office is only maintaining contact with him to keep track of him, in view of the fact that French authorities desire to try him as a war criminal.

On or about 3 April 1950, Josef KALTER, one of SUBJECT's associates and an employee of the AUGSBURG (M49/57) City Police Force, afforded SUBJECT an opportunity to scan the contents of the Fahndungsnachweis der Lander Bayern, Hessen, Wuerttemberg-Baden, Wuerttemberg Hohenzollern, Baden und Rheinland Pfalz, Number 52, published in STUTTGART (L49/302) on 1 April 1950. The action by KALTER was not considered unusual, since he frequently makes official police records, documents, etc., available to SUBJECT.</p> <p>3. While scanning the Fahndungsnachweis, SUBJECT discovered the following entry listed on page 13, "BARBIE, Klaus Hptst Fuehr?? LKE STUTTGART WEP 154/50". SUBJECT immediately called the attention of his handling agent to the above mentioned entry.</p> <p>4. Upon receipt of the above information, the S-2/S-3 of this CIC Region requested the CIC Region I, by employing entirely discreet means, endeavor to determine name of the person, persons and/or agency requesting that SUBJECT be arrested, and the reason for the request. Soon thereafter, CIC Region I reported that the SUBJECT's name was entered in the Fahndungsnachweis at the request of the "Prosecutor", LYON, France and that SUBJECT was wanted in France for murder. CIC Region I subsequently informed a representative of this CIC Region that the request for SUBJECT was forwarded to the Land Police Wuerttemberg-Baden through the French Surete Nationale.</p> <p>5. Neither CIC Region I nor CIC Region XII has been able to obtain additional information, concerning the "Surete's" request regarding SUBJECT, nevertheless, the information disclosed in paragraph 4 above, though incomplete, may be sufficient to indicate a new "Surete" tactic, since, to date, there is no information to indicate that French officials have attempted recently, to initiate extradition proceedings in SUBJECT's case.</p> <p>6. In a recent conversation with the S-2/S-3 of this CIC Region, Lt. LAVOIS, Headquarters 66th CIC Detachment, suggested that perhaps certain "political elements" had been responsible for the request and had made the request for "sho.", to convince opposition political elements that serious attempts were being made to locate SUBJECT, whereas, in effect, there was no desire that SUBJECT be taken into custody or returned to France.</p> <p>7. Despite the underlying motives in SUBJECT's case, it is felt that the above mentioned facts should be brought to the attention of the Technical Specialist 66th CIC Detachment, since it has been indicated that SUBJECT may be required to make a trip to France for the purpose of giving testimony in the "HARDY" case. The trip to PARIS is a matter of concern to this CIC Region, since it would seem presumptive, in the light of a possible murder charge, to assume that French authorities could promise SUBJECT would be safely and promptly escorted to PARIS and returned to the US Zone of Germany.</p>

8. A matter of more immediate concern, is the possibility that SUBJECT may obtain details as to the reason for his desired custody. In view of the serious nature of the charge, it could become difficult for representatives of this CIC Region to assure SUBJECT's continued presence in the AUGSBURG area. A second and perhaps embarrassing possibility could arise if SUBJECT were actually apprehended by the Wuertemberg-Eaden Land Police and if subsequent legal action were taken by French officials, to extradite SUBJECT. In this case the resulting publicity could prove most embarrassing and damaging to CIC, since the resulting publicity would probably completely neglect the fact (see previous correspondence) that SUBJECT was dropped by this Region as soon as allegations of possible war crimes was made. The fact that this Region has maintained contact with SUBJECT only to keep track of his whereabouts and to keep him in this area would be either completely ignored or distorted to indicate that CIC in particular and US Forces in general were protecting a war criminal.

9. In view of implications associated with the development of either possibility noted in paragraph 8 above and in view of the fact that the "Surete" may have exceeded its authority, when it requested a German Police Agency to apprehend SUBJECT, it is requested that the legality of the "Surete's" action be studied carefully. If such study reveals that the "Surete's" action was without legal basis, it should impose no serious problem to have SUBJECT's name deleted from the Fahndungsnachweis, and to advise French authorities of proper extradition procedures involving alleged war criminals.

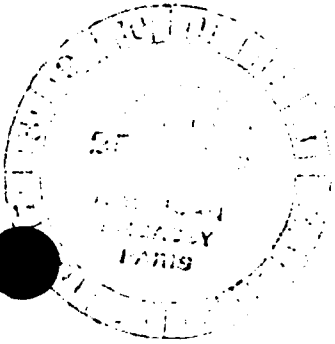

TRANSLATION FROM FRENCH

LYON, 25 March 1949

His Excellency the Ambassador of the United States of America, Paris

Dear Mr. Ambassador,

The undersigned associations of former resistance workers and victims of Nazi repression, gathered together at the office of the Rhone Section of la FRANCE COMBATTANTE, 1 Cours Lafayette, LYON, have been informed that Klaus BARBIE, former assistant to KNAB, who was the commander of the Gestapo at Lyon, is now free in the American Zone, where he is even carrying on a commerce at MUNICH, in spite of all the crimes which he committed in the Lyon Region during the occupation, and are deeply indignant at this impunity.

This war criminal is completely and personally responsible for the death of more than 5,000 persons (resistance workers and hostages) in the Lyon region.

The associations signing this letter recall that BARBIE had particularly to his credit:

1. The rounding up of Jews, which lead to more than 10,000 deportations and numerous deaths.
2. The Easter operations of 1944 at St. Claude (Jura) - 350 deported and 250 dead.
3. Operations at NANTUA (Ain) - 200 deported and 150 dead.
4. The repressive operations of OYONNAX (Ain) which had as a consequence numerous executions, arrests, deportations and deaths.



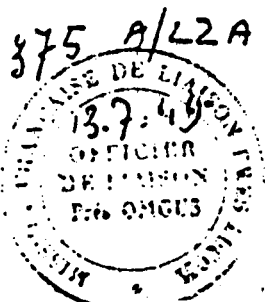

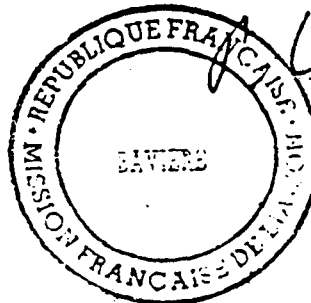

1. On 30 July 1947 at the Sixty-Seventh Meeting of the Allied Control Authority, the Military Governor stated that he had been instructed by his Government to announce that all requests to U.S. Military Government for the extradition of alleged war criminals should be submitted by 1 November 1947, and that all evidence pointing to their guilt must be submitted not later than 31 December 1947. After that date he was authorized, if the facts warranted to make exceptions in individual cases. In proper cases, where it is shown that reason exists for the request not having been filed prior to 1 November 1947, and where there are reasonable grounds to believe that the acts charged are violations of International Law or the domestic law of the place where the act or acts were committed, the Director, Legal Division, OMEUS, will entertain requests for extradition of alleged war criminals from the American Zone of Occupation, including Land Bremen and the American Sector of Berlin.

2. Subject to any directions which may be issued by the Military Governor or the Deputy Military Governor in specific cases, the Director, Legal Division, OMEUS, is authorized to act for the Military Governor

a. for the delivery of persons in the U.S. Zone, including Land Bremen and the American Sector of Berlin, wanted for trial for war crimes;

b. for the delivery of persons in the U.S. Zone, including Land Bremen and the American Sector of Berlin, desired as witnesses in the trial of war

crimes, or the taking of depositions of such persons;

c. for the delivery of evidentiary material in the U.S. Zone, including Land Bremen and the American Sector of Berlin, for use in such trials.

3. Incident to such authority, the Director, Legal Division, OMGUS, shall issue instructions and take such action as may be necessary in the name of the Military Governor relative to the apprehension and delivery of persons, the taking and delivery of depositions, and the collection, copying and delivery of evidentiary material.

4. Before taking in any case the action specified in paragraph 2, the Director, Legal Division, OMGUS, will clear the request with the United Nations War Crimes Commission, the Central Registry of War Criminals and Security Suspects, the Historical Division, the Office of the Deputy Director of Intelligence and the Civil Affairs Division, EUCOM, the Office of the Chief of Counsel for War Crimes, and the Office of the Director of Intelligence and the Office of the Director of Political Affairs, OMGUS. In no case will a request be granted unless it is accompanied by a statement of the law violated, the acts charged as violation, evidence affording reasonable support to the charge, and evidence of personal complicity therein.

5. Requests must contain, as a minimum, all information outlined in Inclosure 1. No action will be taken upon the request unless such information is submitted in the English Language.

6. Requests for delivery of persons desired as witnesses may be granted upon principles consistent with those governing the delivery of persons wanted for war crimes. Responsibility for consultation or clearance with other agencies will be as prescribed in cases of persons wanted for trial for war crimes.


7. The Director, Legal Division, OMGUS, may grant requests for the taking of depositions and for the delivery of evidentiary material upon such conditions as appear adequate to protect the interests of the United States.

8. The Director, Legal Division, OMGUS, shall file with the Deputy Military Governor a report of the number of requests filed and decisions made, and shall make his decisions within the scope of further policy statements which may be issued from time to time by the Military Governor or the Deputy Military Governor.

9. The Deputy Judge Advocate for War Crimes, European Command, will deliver to the Director, Legal Division, OMGUS, all pertinent records in his possession relating to war crimes extradition matters as soon as practicable following 1 January 1948.

MEMORANDUM

The Department of State acknowledges the receipt of the French Embassy's note of November 7, 1949 regarding the desire of the French Government to have the German national, Barbie Klaus, surrendered to it for trial as a war criminal.

Accordingly, it is suggested that the matter be taken up by the appropriate French authorities with the United States High Commissioner.

SUBJECT: BARBIE Klaus

As kindly suggested by Mrs. Lange to Mr. Zaquin, on her recent visit to Baden-Baden, I beg to state the following:-

1. The above-named, BARBIE Klaus, former Obersturmfuehrer, Chief of Section IV of the GESTAPO in Lyons, is being charged before the Military Tribunal of Lyons.

Two warrants for his arrest had been issued: vis. on August 31 and on September 12, 1945, but could not be carried out to date.

It was on the prompting of Barbie that the Lyons Gestapo proceeded with a very large number of summary executions, the result being several hundreds of victims. It has been ascertained that Barbie himself took part in such massacres.

His activity appeared particularly intense in the Departments of Ain, of Jura and of the Rhone. It can, therefore, be readily understood that the populations of these districts were deeply stirred by the information published in the Press to the effect that Barbie was residing at liberty in the U.S. Zone.

2. Extensive and thorough searches were undertaken in 1946 in the endeavor to locate Barbie either in the French, or in the Allied Zones.

3. Such searches were continued in the Soviet Zone, when at the beginning of 1949, the Press announced that Barbie was at liberty and was carrying on a trade in Munich.

Investigations were then made in that city by agents at my service, but they proved unsuccessful, the same as those undertaken at Kempten, Bavaria, where according to certain information received informally, it should have been possible to locate Barbie's whereabouts.

4. On March 25, 1949, the Associations of former 'Resistants' of Lyons basing themselves on information published in the Press, regarding the presence in Munich of Barbie, wrote to the U.S. Ambassador in Paris, requesting that the Gestapo torturers of Lyons be arrested and brought to trial before the Military Court of the 8th Region, which had been the theater of his innumerable crimes.

5. On June 7 and July 12, the French Liaison Branch, at my request, got in touch with the U.S. Public Safety people, in order that new investigations might be proceeded with.

On 13.7.49, the Chief of the Public Safety Branch forwarded with a letter, under cover of the 'Civil Administration Division' in Bad Nauheim, a report dated June 26, 1949, from the German Police authorities in Munich, recording that the searches undertaken in that city had not given any results.

To this report was attached the petition of the former 'Resistants' of Lyons, which the U.S. Ambassador in Paris had forwarded on to the U.S. Occupation authorities in Germany.

6. However, the presence of Barbie in the U.S. Zone was confirmed, in a way, by the fact that he had been examined on several occasions, in 1949, by French Police Inspectors, such examinations having taken place in official U.S. premises, without it being possible for these officers to obtain the slightest indication as to the place where he had found a refuge.

7. Considering the unsuccessful results of the various searches and investigations, as well as the fact that the existence of Barbie in the U.S. Zone is virtually a certitude, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, whose attention to this case was drawn by the Military Judicial Authorities, issued instructions to the French Ambassador in Washington to intervene with the U.S. Government.

At the beginning of December 1949, the State Department advised that the Office of the U.S. High Commissioner in Germany had received no request from us concerning this matter.

8. It is a fact that we did not request from you the extradition of Barbie. In order to enable me to file such a request, I must be in possession of the certificate of residence which is indispensable for making up the record of extradition, as required in accordance with Circular of November 17, 1947, of U.S. Headquarters European Forces.

Since it was not possible to apply to the competent Public Safety Officer for this Certificate, I was not in a position to file a regular request for extradition.

9. I should like to call your attention to the fact that, quite regardless of the importance and the seriousness of the crimes committed in Lyons by the Gestapo under the command of Barbie, there are other considerations which militate in favor of the arrest and extradition of this notorious war criminal.

As a matter of fact, several of Barbie's subordinates, some of whom may have been only carrying out agents, are at present imprisoned in Lyons pending their trial by the Military Tribunal; the judicial investigation, however, has been impeded owing to the absence of the main criminal charged.

The degree of responsibility of said agents in the various crimes in which they participated can actually be determined only when their chief is summoned to answer, at the same time as they do, for the crimes committed.

Furthermore, public opinion in France, and especially in Lyons and its vicinity, is now aware of the presence of Barbie in the U.S. Zone, and if this individual were not brought to trial, it would not fail to create a strong and legitimate emotion among the population.

Lebegue addressed this letter to Elizabeth Lange, a line attorney responsible for processing extradition paperwork in the Administration of Justice Division at HICOG. A few days later, on March 6, Lebegue sent a copy of his letter to Robert Bowie, General Counsel of HICOG, with a request that Bowie look into the matter personally and seek a quick resolution.

Bowie forwarded Lebegue's letter to Assistant General Counsel John Bross; Bross sent it down to Jonathan Rintels, who, as Director of the Administration of Justice Division, was Lange's superior. Rintels sent it to Lange.

Every indication is that no one in the HICOG General Counsel's office, including the Administration of Justice Division, had ever heard of Barbie. Mrs. Lange, who was handling the case, sent a copy of Lebegue's letter to McCraw of the Public Safety Branch.

Reference telephone conversation (Lange-Perry) 30 March 1950 concerning search for Klaus BARBIE the following comments are forwarded.

Pursuant to the request of the French Mission dated 7 June 1949, submitted to OMG Bavaria, investigations were conducted in Munich for BARBIE. The request of the French Mission contained no other information than the statement BARBIE is residing in Munich.

A letter submitted by a group of citizens of Lyon dated 25 March 1949 thru diplomatic channels stated that according to the press BARBIE was engaged in business in Munich. This letter was referred to OMG Bavaria on 23 May 1949. Results of the investigation were forwarded to French Liaison Mission on 13 July 1949.

The foregoing information is extremely sketchy and provides little basis on which to conduct a thorough search. However the Munich City Police did conduct a search to the extent the information permitted and submitted the following report dated 21 June 1949 which is quoted here

"SUBJECT: BARBIE, Klaus.

The whereabouts of the above-mentioned BARBIE, Klaus could not be found out. He is neither registered with the General Registration Office of the Police Praesidium as a resident of Munich, nor with the Municipal Office for trade licenses (Gewerbeamt) and the Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Industrie und Handelskammer) as carrying on a trade. In order to find out his whereabouts, his promulgation in the Bavarian Police Gazette has been caused.

Please note that the German police have placed his name on the "Wanted List" with all police departments in the Federal Republic. A telephone check on 23 November 1949 with Wiesbaden confirmed this action.

A letter dated 2 March 1950 signed LEBEGUE alleges in para 6 that BARBIE has been interrogated by French investigators in official U.S. premises on several occasions during 1949. However, no identification is provided as regards these premises or their locations or U.S. personnel present, if any.

It is to be pointed out that these official premises could be those of CIC, CID, CIS, MID, MIS or some other investigative unit. In this connection it must be pointed out that the German police are denied access to these agencies. While Public Safety Branch normally does not conduct investigations of this type we will endeavor to secure such information as is available provided the information furnished this Branch is adequate.

The inference of the several communications from the French authorities that BARBIE is being granted refuge in the U.S. Zone is unjustified and unwarranted. That BARBIE is, or was, in the U.S. Zone is supported only by the statements of French investigators who allege they have interrogated him somewhere in the Zone. The allegations of the citizens of Lyon can be disregarded as being hearsay only.

Finally a review of all the material submitted by the French reveals the sole identifying mark is the name Klaus BARBIE and his rank and position in the Gestapo when these crimes were committed.

Pending the receipt of more and detailed information regarding BARBIE this investigation and search must be considered as temporarily blocked by the lack of sufficient information.

We are well aware that you are extremely anxious to arrive at a speedy solution of this matter, and therefore the case was referred to the Internal Political and Governmental Affairs Division, Public Safety Branch, which, although it does not normally conduct investigations of this type, endeavored to ascertain the present whereabouts of Barbie on the basis of available information. Their efforts proved unsuccessful, however, and we have been asked to supply more data as follows:

1. The office in which French police inspectors interrogated Barbie in 1946, such as OIG or CID or CIS, etc., and United States personnel present at interrogation, if any.
2. A statement, hearsay or otherwise, regarding Barbie's alleged place of refuge in the United States Zone.

We shall appreciate your furnishing any of the requested data which may be available.

Lawyer Assails U.S. Army At Hardy's Trial on Treason

Says It's 'Scandalous' for Authorities in Germany To Call War Criminal 'Useful to Them'

Maurice Garçon, criminal lawyer and member of the French Academy, declared yesterday that it was "scandalous" for the American military authorities in Germany to say that a notorious war criminal was now "useful to them for security reasons."

M. Garçon made this statement at yesterday's session of the trial of former resistance leader René Hardy on treasonable charges. The man he referred to was a German named Barbier, now a tradesman at Augsburg, in Bavaria, who was Gestapo chief in Lyons and Marseilles during the German occupation in France.

Barbier, said M. Garçon, who is Hardy's defense lawyer, "took pleasure in torturing French patriots, and often executed them with his own hands."

"He was a participant in the bloody reprisals at Chambéry and Aix-les-Bains," he said. "Near Dié he had thirty persons executed under his eyes. At another place he watched the agony of 120 Frenchmen, and it was he who ordered five patriots to be shot in the Place Bellecour, in Lyons, to give an example of his repressive methods."

Barbier was summoned to give evidence against Hardy, but the American military authorities refused authorization on the ground of security reasons. A French police commission was sent to Augsburg to question him, and its report was read yesterday in court.

"It is this man, who is now committing the same crimes against his German compatriots in the service of foreigners, whom justice has implored to give evidence," M. Garçon said. "It is an outrage to French justice."

While deploring the fact that Barbier had not been arrested and punished, both the presiding judge and the public prosecutor insisted on Barbier's evidence being read in court "for what it was worth." The public prosecutor said Barbier had shown "a friendly attitude" toward Hardy in his replies to the police commission's questions.

"A friendly attitude?" shouted the defendant, red with rage.

"Shut up!" his defense lawyer shouted back.

The reading of Barbier's evidence took up most of yesterday's session and will be continued today. The judge said he hoped that the hearing of witnesses, including ten Germans, can begin tomorrow.

IX - Resistance Leader Contests Statements On Role in Occupation

By Vincent Bugeja

Three German Gestapo documents, tending to show that René Hardy gave information leading to the arrest of several of his resistance comrades, were read yesterday in the Paris military court which is trying the thirty-seven-year-old former resistance leader a second time on charges of espionage.

One of the reports, drafted by Kaltenbrunner, Gestapo chief in France who was later convicted of war crimes at Nuremberg and hanged, declared that M. Hardy, who was a railway engineer and head of a railway resistance unit, delivered to the Gestapo the "Green Plan" for railway sabotage in France during the German occupation.

Another absent German witness against Hardy was Barbier, Gestapo chief in Marseilles. He was not present in court, but his evidence was taken in Germany by a French police commission. Judge Meiss, who is presiding at the trial, described Barbier as "a sinister torturer and a war criminal" whom the Americans refused to allow to come to France to give evidence, "saying that he was useful to the security of the United States."

Hardy Contests Statements

M. Hardy vigorously contested the statements made by Kaltenbrunner and Barbier, as well as those contained in other German reports. One of these reports, according to Maurice Garçon, criminal lawyer who is defending M. Hardy, was false.

M. Hardy is accused of having given information to the Gestapo after his arrest at Chalon-sur-Saône in May, 1943, as the price of his release a few days later.

At his first trial, in 1947, when he was acquitted, he denied he had been arrested at Chalon. Judge Meiss, who referred to this denial at the end of Tuesday's session as M. Hardy's "first lie," asked the defendant to reflect on "a second lie" he told in the course of the Tuesday hearing. Yesterday M. Hardy told the judge he had "lied," but that he was not conscious of being guilty of "more espionage."

Judge Finishes Questioning at Trial of Hardy

Defense Attorney Says That Nothing Has Been Said to Prove Treason

By Vincent Bugeja

The fifth session of the trial of former resistance leader Rene Hardy yesterday was devoted to the judge's questioning of the accused, which according to French court procedure precedes the hearing of witnesses.

Judge Meiss, who is presiding over the military court trying M. Hardy, questioned the defendant yesterday on a series of incidents which took place between June, 1943, when he escaped from a Red Cross hospital while still under German surveillance, to May, 1944, when he escaped to North Africa.

The defense maintained that no proof had been produced to substantiate the suspicions which some of M. Hardy's superiors and certain resistance men entertained about him during this period.

'Let Us Have Proofs'

Maurice Garçon, Paris criminal lawyer who is defending M. Hardy, declared he agreed with the judge that his client should be questioned even on matters which had no bearing on the charges against him in the present trial. "But then," he continued, "let us have proofs. We should not forget that Hardy is being tried for treason and nothing has been brought forward so far to prove that he has betrayed anybody."

The hearing of witnesses, who include ten former members of the German Gestapo, will begin today. Meanwhile, eight former members

of the French resistance who have been summoned as witnesses have written to Premier Georges Bidault asking him to take steps to bring to trial the Lyons Gestapo chief, Barbier, whom the military court described as "a war criminal" at Wednesday's session of the Hardy trial. Barbier is now in Bavaria, in the American Zone, but the United States Army authorities have refused so far to permit his transfer to France.

CIC Liaison Officer - please send to Col Erskine:

1. The following is pertinent to our telephone conversation this morning:

a. Public Information Division this Headquarters requested information, for transmission to Mr. Louis DeRoche, French Correspondent, as to whether KLAUS BARBIER was a CIC agent and whether he was living in Munich. PID stated that inquiry arose from story in "Figaro" relative to Hardy trial in Paris. It was stated that Barbier is a principal witness and was described as a former member of the French underground, later a member of the Gestapo and now an agent for the CIE in Munich.

b. The Intelligence Division reply was "no comment".

c. Subsequently, PID advised that the statement had been passed to DeRoche and intimated that "the statement is bound to result in a derogatory story in the French press, slanted to the effect that by "no comment" statement we have admitted allegation". PID further recommended giving DeRoche an off-the-record briefing.

d. Reply was made that it is against the policy of this Division to comment on matters of this nature and that AR 380-5 precluded an off-the-record briefing.

e. This morning a representative of the United Press in Frankfurt called the Intelligence Division stating the "new developments" and French public opinion make it necessary that we open up on the case. He also stated that CIC Augsburg had indicated to him that information was available but could not be released without authority from this Division. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~

~~XXXX~~ f. In subsequent conversation with PID today it was brought out that French newspapers are making a large splash stating that Barbier is guilty of war crimes and is being held by the Americans for security reasons. We know

1. On or about 10 April 1947, Kurt MERR, an ex-informant of Region IV, informed Special Agent Robert S. TAYLOR that he had met quite by accident an old friend of his from France (MERR was an Abwehr officer in France) named Klaus BARBIE who had excellent connections to sources of CIC information. The name of subject was immediately recognized by Special Agent TAYLOR as being one of the chief personalities wanted by the British and by this headquarters under OPERATION SELECTION BOARD.

2. OPERATION SELECTION BOARD had as an objective the identification and apprehension of certain elements of the SS who, by reason of their illegal status established at the NUREMBERG trials, were quite naturally intent upon justifying their inevitable underground existence, thereby hoping ultimately to escape internment by the Allied Powers. Among these elements were ambitious men with a gift of leadership and certain intellectual background, enthused with a fanatic interest in the future danger to Europe which would inevitably come from the East. These SS elements believed that it was essential for the major powers of Western Europe to unite politically, economically, and materially in order to save themselves from destruction when the inevitable day came of war with Russia. These SS personalities used this political theme, the theme of "a strong and united Europe in the West" as a lever to force the Allies to recognize them as an integral part of the German community, conveniently forgetting their past history. All were sincere if not fanatic anti-communists and anti-Russian. The threat to allied security at that time in Germany was the possible union of all Nazis and others with hostile aims to the occupation. Not to be discounted was the fact that so large a proportion, particularly of young people in Germany, were sufficiently distrustful of democracy and disillusioned with the existing political parties as to subscribe most readily to a plausible form of neo-Nazism under the guise of a Federalist or Pan-European Movement.

3. After a conversation between Special Agent TAYLOR and Lt. Colonel GARVEY, Commanding Officer, Region IV, on 14 April 1947, it was decided to use BARBIE as an informant if he would agree to the following conditions:

- a. That he clarify his statements concerning the British use of SELECTION BOARD personalities as informants.
- b. That he break off all his connections with illegal SS elements and SELECTION BOARD personalities.

4. On 18 April 1947 Special Agent TAYLOR met BARBIE in HEMMINGEN; BARBIE agreed to the above conditions, and was employed as an informant. BARBIE provided CIC at that time with extensive connections to French Intelligence agencies working in the US Zone and high Russian circles in the US Zone.

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5. Since BARBIE was wanted by CIC and the British in connection with SELECTION BOARD, Region IV requested this headquarters in May 1947 and again in November 1947 that BARBIE be allowed to continue as an informant of Region IV. By virtue of the fact that case officers at that time were handling problems concerning informants, and by virtue of the fact that the Technical Specialist office was not established as such but was responsible only for Production Group informants, the case was not brought to Mr. VIDAL's attention until October 1947. At this time, Mr. VIDAL covered the entire case and ordered Region IV to arrest BARBIE and to send him to ECIC for detailed interrogation.

6. Upon interrogation of BARBIE, it was discovered that he was very closely tied in with SELECTION BOARD personalities; that he had been arrested by the British and had escaped; and that he had made overtures to the British to work for them as an informant through one of the SELECTION BOARD personalities by the name of Dr. HOFFMANN.

7. Since this headquarters had not notified the British that BARBIE had been located, it was deemed inadvisable to inform them at this time that the reason they had not been so informed stemmed from the fact that BARBIE was employed as an informant. Therefore, when BARBIE was released from ECIC in early 1948, it was deemed advisable to continue using him as an informant in Region IV because of his detailed knowledge of CIC modus operandi and because of the apprehension of this headquarters that BARBIE, if not employed, would continue his overtures to the British to work for them as an informant. If BARBIE had been allowed to make these overtures the British would have found out that the reason CIC had not turned BARBIE in or reported him in connection with SELECTION BOARD was based on the fact that he was employed by CIC as an informant. At that time the revelation of subject's connection to CIC as an informant would have been a serious blow to CIC's prestige in the eyes of the British. His continued employment then with CIC was based on his utility and the desire of CIC to obviate an embarrassing situation.

8. BARBIE continued as an informant of CIC throughout 1948. Subject and Kurt MERK, under the direction of Special Agent DABRINGHAUS, developed an informant network to cover communist activities in the US Zone, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] French Intelligence activities in the French Zone and their agents operating in the US Zone, and Russian emigre activities in the US and French Zones. The net consisted of ten (10) sub-sources, four (4) of which were residing in the French Zone, had very close connection with French Intelligence, and were penetrating same for CIC. The information supplied by the net was considered at that time very valuable and justified the retention of MERK and BARBIE as informants as well as the individual members of the net.

9. The operation of MERK, BARBIE, and the net continued during all of 1948. Between the latter part of 1948 and early part of 1949, relations between BDOC, ID and CIC strengthened to a point where it was possible to discuss mutual problems on a friendly basis and to arrive at decisions which were to the mutual satisfaction of all concerned.

10. It was during this period that Colonel BELL of ID, Lt. WHITEWAY of BDOC, and Mr. VIDAL, this headquarters, entered into the discussion of

the HARDY case. This case involved the arrest and forthcoming trial for treason of HARDY, a French citizen who, according to charges, was responsible for the liquidation of a French resistance movement against the Germans occupying France. It is alleged that HARDY was the person who gave information to the German Gestapo which lead to the arrest of the members of the French resistance movement.

11. BARBIE during the alleged denunciation of the resistance movement on the part of HARDY, was the chief of the Gestapo at ~~DEPON~~ LYON, France.

12. Lt. WHITEWAY informed Mr. VIDAL that he was aware that BARBIE was employed by CIC although he admitted that he did not know whom BARBIE was employing in the French Zone. He also stated that he had conclusive proof to support his stand. He also warned Mr. VIDAL that the French Government might serve a summons on BARBIE to appear as a material witness in the HARDY trial. Realizing that BARBIE was employed by CIC, Lt. WHITEWAY considered this warning as a friendly gesture. BDOC made a verbal request through Colonel BELL to CIC for BARBIE.

13. Knowing that BARBIE and MEK had developed an informant net to penetrate French Intelligence, this headquarters again deemed it advisable not to release BARBIE to the French. If this headquarters had released BARBIE to the French, he would have been interrogated in the usual French manner and forced not only to reveal information pertaining to the HARDY case but also to reveal information pertaining to his activities and connections in the French Zone. In order to avoid turning BARBIE over to the French, Mr. VIDAL suggested that perhaps a deposition for BARBIE would serve the same purpose as his presence in the court as a witness. Lt. WHITEWAY and Colonel BELL concurred in this plan. On 21 January 1949, Lt. WHITEWAY and Monsieur ~~LA GARD~~ ^{LAGARD} interrogated BARBIE in detail in Region IV ~~headquarters~~ and procured in this and two (2) subsequent interrogations of BARBIE sufficient information to satisfy their needs. During the interrogation of BARBIE by Monsieur ~~LAGARD~~ ^{LAGARD} and Lt. WHITEWAY, Lt. LAVOIS, then the Regional Technical Specialist of Region IV, who speaks French fluently, was present during the interrogation to insure that the French did not query BARBIE on matters not related to the HARDY case. This was done in order to insure that the French did not start questioning BARBIE on the net that had been established in the French Zone nor on BARBIE's general activities with CIC.

14. During 1949 this headquarters received no further request for permission to interrogate BARBIE although during this period the French Surete sent various and sundry individuals into the Zone to contact CIC for information concerning BARBIE. In all instances, they were informed that such requests had to be cleared by BDOC and DED before CIC could comply with same. The canalization of such requests to CIC through BDOC and ID was agreed upon by Colonel BELL, Lt. WHITEWAY, and this headquarters. It must be pointed out at this time that the French Surete in every instance failed to follow channels and attempted to procure information concerning BARBIE without notifying the proper American authorities. Lt. WHITEWAY was in all instances informed of the irregularities of the Surete. Corrective measures were taken by BDOC to correct these irregular approaches to CIC and German officials.

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15. The unilateral actions of the Surete indicated that they wanted to kidnap or lure BARBIE into the French Zone in order to arrest him. These actions made this organization even more desirous of protecting BARBIE from being taken into custody by the Surete.

16. It has been common knowledge to ID, to CIC, and to BDOC, that the French Surete has been thoroughly penetrated by communistic elements. BDOC readily admitted this weakness on the part of the Surete. The possibility that the communistic elements in the Surete were behind the plan to kidnap BARBIE could not be over-looked. Lt. WHITEWAY reported that the Surete was doing everything possible to embarrass CIC.

17. During negotiations with BDOC by ID and CIC, no mention was ever made by BDOC that BARBIE was wanted as a war criminal. All requests up to *date* on the part of the French Surete and BDOC had been centered on BARBIE as a material witness.

18. On 13 May 1949, this headquarters received its first indication that BARBIE was considered a war criminal by the French. This indication was contained in an article that appeared in a French newspaper which stated that during the occupation BARBIE burned his victims with an acetylene torch to make them confess. during interrogations which last more than forty eight (48) hours. The newspaper article also stated that subject was responsible for the tragic days of Easter, 1944, when the Region of Saint Claude was literally terrorized. Two (2) resistance organizations, according to the newspaper, the War Veterans and the Victims of Nazism, addressed a letter to the Ambassador of the United States in PARIS, demanding the immediate arrest of BARBIE and trial for the Military Tribunal of the 8th Region. This article was forwarded to Region XII as an inclosure to an IRS, requesting that BARBIE be interrogated to determine the truth of the allegations and also ordering that subject be dropped as an informant but that relations with him be maintained until necessary action is dictated by the State Department and/or Department of the Army. Region XII felt that the charges against subject were probably not true. This headquarters has received no evidence in any form to substantiate the allegations contained in the newspaper article.

19. In January 1950 Lt. WHITEWAY through ID proposed to Mr. VIDAL that he be allowed to take BARBIE to PARIS to serve as a witness in the HARDY trial. Lt. WHITEWAY stated that if he were allowed to take BARBIE to PARIS as a material witness he would insure the speedy return of BARBIE to the US Zone. Mr. VIDAL and Colonel BELL saw no objections to the plan and concurred in same. Region XII was alerted not to inform BARBIE of the trip to PARIS but to insure that he would be available upon a minute's notice. Lt. WHITEWAY promised to inform this headquarters at least five (5) days before the departure date. Several telephone calls were received from Lt. WHITEWAY, informing this headquarters that he had received no word from PARIS to indicate when BARBIE's presence at the trial was required.

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19. It was not until 28 April 1950 that Lt. WHITEWAY informed this headquarters through Colonel BELL that he was washing his hands of the whole affair since he could not keep the original promise. He clarified this statement by saying that if he took BARBIE to PARIS he could not guarantee the return of BARBIE, since BARBIE was to be arrested if he appeared in France. Lt. WHITEWAY felt that since he was not able to keep his word he would not therefore take BARBIE to PARIS.

20. While CIC and ID were negotiating with Lt. WHITEWAY for the transfer of BARBIE to PARIS, the Surete again entered into the picture. The French Liaison Officer in WIESBADEN contacted the Director of Intelligence, OLCB, on 21 February 1950, requesting the present address of BARBIE. A query by this headquarters as to the reason for this request revealed that the French Liaison Office was required to locate BARBIE and to obtain from him in writing of consent or refusal to appear as a volunteer witness in the HARDY trial. A similar request was made by the French Surete to OLCB. This headquarters informed OLCB and OLCB that we were already negotiating with the French Government on this case and that the requests from the French Surete were duplication of effort.

21. Two (2) articles appeared in the Herald Tribune on 28 April 1950 wherein Maurice GARGON, criminal lawyer and member of the French Academy, declared that it was "scandalous for the American military authorities in Germany to say that a notorious war criminal was now useful to them for security reasons". The person he referred to was BARBIE.

22. Based on the negotiation between ID, CIC, and BDOC, the newspaper articles of 28 April 1950 can be interpreted as a malicious distortion of fact.

23. By virtue of the fact that this headquarters has had time to liquidate the net operating in the French Zone, CIC sees no reason for denying the French the extradition of BARBIE. However, it must be pointed out that never has there been a written request for the extradition of BARBIE on the part of the French. Secondly, no evidence has been presented to this headquarters in writing to substantiate the allegation that BARBIE is a war criminal. Also, prior to May 1949, this headquarters had had no indication that BARBIE was wanted by the French for war crimes but had always gone on the assumption that he was wanted merely as a material witness against HARDY.

Specific guidance is requested in view of the importance of the case and of the probability that there are ramifications at higher echelons of which this Region has no knowledge.

Memorandum to the Commanding Officer

SUBJECT: BARBIE, Klaus

1. This memorandum is submitted to summarize the past history and present status of SUBJECT as a CIC informant. It is based on the contents of SUBJECT's dossier, this officer's personal knowledge of the case, and this officer's past conversations with SUBJECT and with the handling agents.

2. SUBJECT was born on 25 October 1913 in BAD GOESBERG, Kreis BONN. After completing his education, he became a member of the SD in October 1935. After training in intelligence and political police matters, as well as military training, he served with various SD and Gestapo units in the Ruhr and in the Low Countries. In 1942 he was transferred to France, where he served with the SD and Gestapo in PARIS, LYONS, and MARSEILLES. In 1944 SUBJECT was wounded in combat, and thereafter his active service for German intelligence and police agencies virtually ceased. Sometime in 1942-1943 SUBJECT made the acquaintance of Kurt MERK, who was employed by the Abwehr and SD in France.

3. Although SUBJECT was not used as a CIC informant in the AUGSBURG area until April 1947, previous discussions with SUBJECT have indicated that he was used by CIC personnel in the KASSEL - MARBURG - FULDA area during early 1946. In April 1947, through the intervention of Kurt MERK, a former carded source of this Region and a former Abwehr operative in DIJON, France, SUBJECT, who had been acquainted with MERK in France, was employed as a source by what was then Sub-Region KEMPTEN, SUBJECT at that time was integrated into what was then known as the "Peterson Net" headed by informant Kurt MERK and controlled by Special Agent Robert S. TAYLOR. In July 1947 SUBJECT became assistant to MERK and controlled a substantial portion of this "Peterson Net".

4. SUBJECT continued in this capacity for CIC until late December 1947 or very early 1948, when, in conjunction with "Operation Selection Board", he was temporarily held in custody at ECIC for interrogation. He was released after several weeks or months, returned to the KEMPTEN - MEMMINGEN area, and resumed his old position in the "Peterson Net" for CIC.

5. The contents of SUBJECT's dossier, as well as the dossier of Kurt MERK, indicate that during 1947-1948 this "Peterson Net" comprised approximately 50 to 70 sources, sub-sources and tertiary sources. Its scope was not confined to the KEMPTEN - MEMMINGEN area, but extended throughout Europe. Although much of the information supplied by this net was highly imaginative, if not completely false, the dossiers indicate that the information produced by this net comprised anywhere from 70% to 90% of the information submitted by CIC in this area. Most of the information produced was of a positive nature. Throughout 1948 the net gradually

whittled down in size, but the information acquired and submitted still consisted mainly of positive information, and was in some cases of dubious value and reliability. In June 1948, when control of the net was taken over by Special Agent Erhard DAERINGHAUS, the "headquarters" of the net was moved to the CIC Liaison house on Mozartstrasse 19, AUGSBURG, and its size was reduced to approximately 20 persons. In late 1948 or early 1949, the operations of the net were finally reduced to the area of Swabia (Region XII), and were confined for the most part to CIC targets and missions. During the period March - April - May 1949 the net was finally completely dissolved, and individual worthwhile persons within the net were used as individual sources on specific CIC targets. Since approximately October 1948, SUBJECT's specific target has been SPD activities in the Region XII area.

6. According to SUBJECT's dossier, and according to the knowledge of all personnel presently assigned to Region XII, during the period 1946-1949, there were absolutely no indications that SUBJECT was wanted by the French, either as a witness or as a defendant. Late in 1948 or 1949 it appeared that SUBJECT was wanted by the French as a witness in the treason trial of Col. Rene HARDY, a French resistance leader who had been "turned" by SUBJECT during the war. French interrogator, after clearing with Headquarters 7970th CIC, appeared in AUGSBURG and interrogated SUBJECT in connection with this case. HARDY was subsequently tried and found not guilty of the charge.

7. In late May 1949, this Region received an IRS from Mr. VIDAL's office, stating that an article had appeared in a French newspaper which alleged that SUBJECT had been guilty of war crimes, and which alleged further that certain French organizations (presumably left wing) were addressing a demand to the US Ambassador to France for the arrest and trial of SUBJECT. Mr. VIDAL's IRS requested that in view of the article, "SUBJECT be dropped administratively as an informant but that relations with same be maintained as in the past...." to Headquarters dated 20 July 1949, however, this Region stated:

"a. SUBJECT has been interrogated on four (4) occasions by French authorities regarding his activities in France and regarding L'affaire HARDY. French authorities know where SUBJECT is located, know where he can be reached, and probably know what his activities are here, yet no attempt has ever been made to extradite SUBJECT nor has any formal charge of war crimes nor any indication that SUBJECT was involved in war crimes been made.

"b. If French authorities were interested in SUBJECT as a war criminal (and if his alleged crimes were as barbaric and well known as the newspaper article claims they certainly should have been) it is almost certain that SUBJECT would have been extradited by now. It is pointed out that SUBJECT, under his proper name interrogated some very high French officials including Francois PONCEP and LeRUH."

8. SUBJECT was nonetheless dropped as a carded source. Upon instructions from the Headquarters Technical Specialist, however, contact with SUBJECT was maintained, in an effort to keep track of SUBJECT and, if possible, to keep him in this area, so that if a demand for his arrest and/or extradition were to be received from the French, SUBJECT could be easily located and apprehended. Correspondence regarding such contact is contained in IRS dated 12 January 1950 (minute 1) and 27 January 1950 (minute 2).

9. In late February or March 1950 this office was verbally informed by Headquarters that HARDY was to be tried again, that French BDOC had requested permission to transport SUBJECT to France for several weeks as a witness, that this request had been granted, and that it could be expected that SUBJECT would be required to leave almost any day, but that he definitely would be returned. After several weeks, nothing happened. In April 1950 this Region discovered that SUBJECT's name appeared on the "Wanted List" of German Police, and that his name appeared on this list because of a request received by WB German police authorities from the French Surete. This information was communicated to Mr. VIDAL. This office was then informed by Headquarters that French BDOC no longer could guarantee SUBJECT's return to Germany if he were transported to France, and was therefore "stepping out" of the case.

10. During late April 1950 this officer, through items in the PARIS edition of the "New York Herald Tribune", learned that HARDY was again being tried by a French Military Tribunal, and that SUBJECT was desired as a witness. These articles further alleged that HARDY's defense lawyer had alleged that SUBJECT, who resides in AUGSBURG, was wanted as a war criminal but that extradition had been refused by US authorities on the grounds that SUBJECT "was useful to the security of US Forces in Germany".

11. During the first week of May 1950 Special Agent Herbert BECHTOLD of this office was informed by a casual source employed by the AUGSBURG newspaper "Schwaebische Landeszeitung" that several correspondents and photographers were in town seeking a Klaus BARBIE and were desirous of interviewing BARBIE. The source questioned Special Agent BECHTOLD about BARBIE. Special Agent BECHTOLD informed the source that he had no information other than that which had appeared in the PARIS Tribune, and that the only agency authorized and qualified to give out information was EUCOM Headquarters in HEIDELBERG. During a later telephone conversation with Mr. VIDAL it was learned that the casual source had talked to the press representatives, and that the latter had gone to EUCOM Headquarters and twisted Special Agent BECHTOLD's statement to source to indicate that Special Agent BECHTOLD knew of BARBIE but refused to give out information concerning him.

12. SUBJECT's case rests at this point at present. No written instructions regarding SUBJECT's disposition have been received since 27 January 1950.

13. In summing up SUBJECT's case, it is desired to add the following comments:

a. Debriefing SUBJECT has proven to be an impossibility. SUBJECT was associated with CIC in a key capacity from 1946 through June 1949. Due to the handling methods adopted by the former handling agents during the period 1947-1948 (S/A TAYLOR, S/A HAJDU, S/A DAERLINGHAUS), due to his position as key agent in nets formerly employed, and due to this long association with CIC, SUBJECT knows more about CIC targets,modus operandi, EEIs, etc., than most CIC agents. SUBJECT also knows the identity of most KPD penetration sources used by this office, due to the fact that he either handled these sources prior to the dissolution of his net (March-April 1949), or because he recruited or turned such sources.

SUBJECT was an extremely valuable source, who had been very successfully used to recruit and "turn" other sources (who were then handled directly by


agents), and who was used as an X-type source on particularly difficult cases in the political field and occasionally in the CE field.

c. As far as this office knows, no request has ever been made by the French for extradition on a war crimes charge. The French know where SUBJECT is located, what he is doing, and who he is working for, but the only action ever taken by them (as far as is known here) has been to interrogate him as a witness in the HARDY case.

d. According to Lt. LAVOIE, who is thoroughly familiar with the case, this entire HARDY BARBIE affair is being pushed as a political issue by left-wing elements in France. No strong effort has been made by the French to obtain BARBIE because of the political embarrassment his testimony might cause certain high French officials.

e. As far as this office has been able to establish, SUBJECT was not guilty of any war crimes. It is further believed that the termination date set by the Allies for extradition demands for war criminals has expired.

14. It is believed that Headquarters 66th CIC Detachment should be requested to give this Region close guidance insofar as the nature and scope of contact with SUBJECT is concerned. Elements hostile to CIC and/or to the US could easily misconstrue SUBJECT's case and by distortion of the facts assert that CIC is employing and protecting an alleged war criminal.

Reference your cable 49627 dated 23 April 1950, subject BARBIER or BARBIE, KLAUS.

HICOG Public Safety Authorities and German police who were engaged since May 1949 in search for subject individual, report negative results. French authorities requested arrest of subject but sole identifying mark submitted by them was the name Klaus BARBIE and his rank and position in the Gestapo when alleged crimes were committed.

That Barbie is or was in the US Zone is supported only by statements of French investigators who allege they have investigated him somewhere in the US Zone. At no time was it specified where, when and in the presence of whom was such an investigation conducted.

German police have placed name of subject on "wanted list" with all police departments in Federal Republic. Check by Public Safety Branch HICOG on 23 November 1949 confirmed that name of subject was still on wanted list. The inference by French Press and French authorities that Barbier is being granted refuge in US Zone, unjustified and unwarranted. Pending receipt of more detailed informa-

Reference attached cable and our telephone conversation on subject of Barbier or Barbie, Klaus, this Branch has been in constant touch with the Public Safety Authorities at Munich, Bavaria, who have activated the German police in the search for subject.

Other than the mere mention that subject was somewhere in Munich, no other identifying data was ever presented by the French authorities. The allegation that French agents have interrogated subject, is rather vague, and to this date, no statement was submitted by the French authorities as to where, when, and in whose presence subject was interrogated.

On July 13, 1949, results of the investigation on the search for Barbie were forwarded to the French Authorities.

A check was made by this Branch on 23 November 1949, which revealed that the German police authorities have placed the name of subject on the "wanted list" with all police departments in the Federal Republic.

The inference from the French press, and from the several communications from the French authorities, that BARBIE is being granted refuge in the US Zone is unjustified and unwarranted. That BARBIE is, or was, in the US Zone is supported only by the statements of French investigators who allege they have investigated him somewhere in the ZONE. As stated, we have yet to learn, where, when, etc., such interrogation took place.

A complete review of all material submitted by the French reveals the sole identifying mark is the name KLAUS BARBIE and his rank and position in the Gestapo when the alleged crimes were committed.

Pending the receipt of more detailed information regarding BARBIE, this investigation and search must be considered temporarily blocked by the lack of sufficient information.

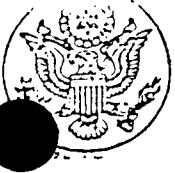

BARBIER or BARBIE, Klaus

Reference is made to the following cables on the subject of BARBIER or BARBIE, Klaus, a German national alleged by French authorities to be a former Gestapo agent and sought by those authorities for trial on war crime charges.

Paris to HICOG - CN38327
HICOG to Paris - CN6802
Paris to HICOG - CN38588
HICOG to Paris - CN6877

This case has been the subject of considerable correspondence between this headquarters and French authorities who have sought his whereabouts since March 1949 and who presumably will formally request his extradition should his whereabouts be established. Public Safety Branch has since that time directed the conducting of police searches for the individual throughout the area of the Federal Republic. These searches have been without results. The subject's name continues to be posted with all police agencies.

Notwithstanding the present French allegations that American authorities are giving the subject refuge, and are refusing to deliver him, the French have not as yet filed a formal request for arrest and extradition nor complied with the requirements of our headquarters regarding the filing of such requests. The matter has been before the Extradition Board for some time. The Office of General Counsel is presently addressing a letter to the French authorities with regard to the extradition matter calling to their attention the failure to properly present the request for arrest and extradition.

The information contained in our Cable CN-6802 of 2 May to Paris is correct, excepting that sentence which reads: "The inference by French Press and French authorities that BARBIER is being granted refuge in US Zone, unjustified and unwarranted". The quoted sentence is accurate insofar as any official information is available to this headquarters.

Notwithstanding the statement in the paragraph next above, I consider it would be extremely unwise to release to the press any statements whatsoever regarding this case, on the grounds that such statements may later prove embarrassing to our government since there are indications that the French government may raise the question with the U.S. government.

Dear Monsieur Lebegue:

In accordance with the request in your letter of March 6, 1950, I have investigated the matter of BARBIE Klaus. A thorough search conducted by the Public Safety Branch of the Office of the United States High Commissioner failed to locate BARBIE's whereabouts. On April 25 the Chief of the Administration of Justice Division wrote you asking for additional information concerning the details of the interrogation of BARBIE by French police representatives in 1946. I have just now been informed of rumours that BARBIE has been seen in Munich. ~~If these rumours are confirmed and BARBIE can be found and apprehended, I shall issue a warrant for his detention.~~

Unfortunately, as you point out in your letter of March 2, 1950, no formal request for BARBIE's extradition meeting the requirements of the circular of November 17, 1947, has ever been submitted. In addition to the requirement which you mention of information as to the residence or location of the person whose extradition is requested, this circular also provides that requests for the extradition of war criminals submitted after November 17, 1947, shall be accompanied by evidence showing that the request is justified by extraordinary circumstances. As you are doubtless aware, ~~one~~ procedure under this provision has been to require an explanation as to why the request for extradition could not reasonably have been made before November 17, 1947, and also evidence, including affidavits of witnesses, that the individual in question is guilty of a serious crime.

We would normally refuse to issue a warrant for the arrest of an alleged war criminal in the absence of such evidence. In view of your personal assurance that BARBIE is identified with the perpetration of serious crimes including the murder of representatives of French Resistance in Lyons, I am prepared to issue an order for

BARBIE's arrest if the rumours that he is in Munich are confirmed. As in doing this I will be deviating from our normal procedure, I should appreciate word from you that material evidence, sufficient to establish a prima facie case of BARBIE's guilt, will be available immediately in the event of BARBIE's arrest. This evidence should, ~~in any event~~, be forwarded together with a formal request for BARBIE's extradition, pursuant to the provisions of the circular of November 17, 1947.

I have been somewhat disturbed by reports in the Paris press to the effect that the American security agencies have been deliberately responsible for the fact that BARBIE could not be produced at the trial of Rene Hardy in Lyons. Probably these reports have no other inspiration than the desire of the lawyer representing the defendant in that case to create a diversion. I assume that your Government appreciates the fact that diligent efforts have been made to locate BARBIE's whereabouts and that as yet the material submitted has been inadequate to constitute compliance with the procedures established for the extradition of war criminals.

Dear M. Lebeque:

This is in further reference to your letter of March 2, 1950 addressed to the attention of Mrs. Lange in the Administration of Justice Division and concerning Klaus Barbie whose extradition you request.

On March 21, 1950 Mr. Kintala acknowledged the request and on April 25 we communicated further with you to advise that Barbie's whereabouts had not been ascertained and to request additional information which might enable us to locate him.

It has just come to my attention that the Paris press has recently carried one or more critical articles stating or suggesting very strongly that the United States had denied the request of your Government for Barbie's extradition. In order to set the record straight and to demonstrate to you that we not only have not denied the request but are most anxious to cooperate fully with you if Barbie can be located and a proper case for extradition made out, I take this opportunity to review the position to date and to request your further assistance in enabling us to deal with the merits of the request.

The case first came to our attention in November of 1949 by cable from our State Department requesting information concerning an alleged request for extradition to which we replied that no such request had ever been submitted to us. We understand that informal representations had earlier been made to our Public Safety Branch in an effort to locate Barbie so that a formal request for his extradition might be submitted. But I would like to emphasize that

until your letter of March 2 reached us nothing that could be treated as a request was in our hands. Your letter of March 2 could be and was treated as an informal request, but as you know, our requirements include the submission of sworn statements or other evidence tending to establish that the alleged crimes were committed and that the wanted person in fact committed them, and further include statements as to the personal data of the accused person and his present whereabouts. We have never received any of this information. Nevertheless, we have made diligent inquiries in your behalf as to Barbie's whereabouts and have recently received clues which may enable us to find him.

Our position would be a good deal stronger in terms of acting on your request if we were to receive a formal submission supported by the usual data. We would then be able to arrive at a prompt decision as to whether the man should be placed in provisional arrest pending ultimate decision on the question of extradition. Without being in any sense critical, I would also like to point out that the effect of the publicity which I understand the matter has received in the French press may be disadvantageous, and may have the effect of giving notice to Barbie that his extradition is still a matter of interest to the French and that the United States authorities are interested in locating him. It would be unfortunate if this publicity were to render it impossible for us to locate Barbie and to proceed in disposition of the request.

Secret information brought by Riddleberger indicates Barbier case has highly embarrassing possibilities to put it mildly. There has been little comment on it here since May 3, but case may flare up again during final hearing of Hardy trial today. Furthermore, MRP senator has given notice of question to be asked National Defense Minister in Council of Republic tomorrow as to French efforts to obtain Barbier's extradition.

In event French bring case to Department's attention in Washington, suggest Department limit itself for the moment to line set forth following press release issued by Frankfort May 5:

"The case of Barbier is now the object of study and investigation by the American HQ in Germany."

It is barely possible that matter will die down after verdict in Hardy case tonight. However, we will inform Frankfort in event American angle is revived.

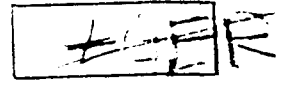

Following is summary Council of Republic exchange on subject. Gasparo Agent Barbier following oral question put to government by IRP Senator Leo Hamon speaking unofficially for Senators formerly members of French Resistance.

Senator Brune, PTT Minister speaking in place of absent Minister Atlantic Defense Pleven reviewed French efforts find and try Barbier as war criminal beginning August 31, 1945 and ending with declaration of April 25, 1950 by American occupation authorities to French High Commissioner declaring US authorities ignorant Barbier's hideout. Minister added that when Barbier cited as witness in Hardy trial French Foreign Minister notified US by diplomatic route and that latter unofficially replied they could not accede to demand. He declared "government will continue its action in order get Barbier turned over to justice".

In reply Hamon reviewed very briefly Barbier's record as torturer and executioner and declared that Barbier could be found if one really wanted to find him, since, on November 25, 1948 officers of the DST of French Surat "interrogated Barbier in Germany at official American Officers as is proved by document read at trial". Hamon declared that replies of American authorities in Germany "do not give, to put it as mildly as possible, the impression of perfect uprightness". Hamon continued however that he did not wish to accuse any one and paid tribute to American sacrifices in winning common victory. He closed with

following sentence: "One can punish assassins; one must also have the firm purpose never to make use of them". Lively applause followed.

Minister replied as follows: "Government associates itself with words just spoken by Hamon and will not recede before any step in order to obtain surrender (Livraison) of a war criminal who deserves to be punished".

Franc-Tireur (Independent-Leftist) "Americans have shown obvious and repeated bad will. Barbier is said to be missing. He wasn't missing on November 25, 1948, when (Defense de Service Territoriale) questioned him in American zone, nor in May 1949 at time of second inquiry commission.

"It appears that every demand for his extradition since January 1949, including intervention by French ambassador in US, has been without merit in view of declaration by French HICOM in Germany that his extradition had not been asked before March 2, 1950.

"This joke has gone far enough.

"Barbier is missing because it is desired that he be so. It is the government's business to insist on his surrender."

Communist "Humanite" in long blast at "scandalous acquittal of resistance leader Hardy. Barbier has been drafted by American Secret Service. Why don't these phony defenders of persecuted innocence publicly insist on Barbier's surrender to French justice, because, after his acquittal, they want to use Hardy's Gestapo training for their own dirty ends."

Exaggeration for Barbier's release also reported in European edition Herald Tribune, and French radio 3 PM newscast over national network reviewed case at some length making point Barbier had been interrogated by French in Germany "on official American premises."

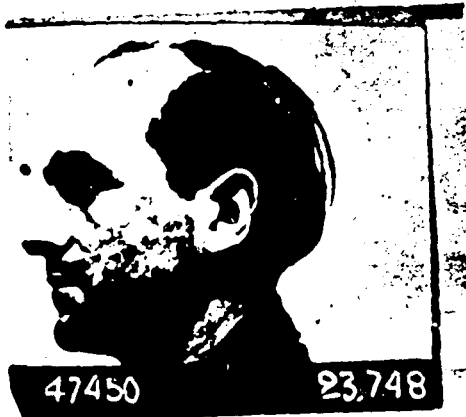

It is a fact that Barbie has been questioned 3 times successively in American offices by American CIC officials.

Since my last letter I have been informed that Barbie has been questioned

at Frankfurt/Main on May 14, 1948

at Frankfurt/Main on May 18, 1948

at Munich on July 16, 1948

On the other hand I am able to state that these different hearings have taken place in the offices of the CIC without being able to cite any names of American officials who have taken part in them.

Concerning the place of refuge of Barbie I can only recall that inquiries have been made at Munich and at Kempten. In the meantime I inform you that a newspaper in Paris has indicated that this war criminal is said to live at Augsburg where he is running a hardware store at 33 Schillerstrasse.

Further more, Barbie, of whom I enclose 2 photos from front and profile, is born on 25 October 1913 at Codesberg, from Nikolaus and Anna HEES.

I hope that these complete informations will enable you to find Barbie and to place him with the French authorities who think his delivery of utmost importance, as I may recall.

P.S. I would be much obliged if you would acknowledge receipt of this letter to me.

In compliance with instructions received earlier this afternoon I requested Mrs. Elizabeth K. Lange, Office of General Counsel, HICOG, Extradition Board, by telephone to answer the following two questions:

a. Has an official request ever been submitted by French authorities for the extradition of Klaus Barbier?

b. Has such a request ever been denied?

Mrs. Lange told me:

a. That the Extradition Board was first apprised of the matter by letter of 2 March 1950 in which French authorities refer to certain previous correspondence addressed to various agencies and requesting information in regard to the location of Barbier. Mrs. Lange stated that the letter of 2 March 1950 was not in the usual form of an official extradition request but might be considered as such. No decision has been made in that respect. This letter was answered on 21 April 1950, requesting information concerning the whereabouts of Barbier and the nature of the charges against him. Among the correspondence mentioned in the French letter of 2 March 1950 is a letter of 7 June 1949, addressed to Political Affairs Division, OMGB, attention: Public Safety; and another letter of 12 July 1949, apparently addressed to OMGB. A third letter that might have gone to Bavaria is dated 19 July 1949. A fourth letter of 13 July 1949 was addressed to Civil Affairs Division, OMGUS. Mrs. Lange does not know the contents of these letters except that they request information concerning Barbier's whereabouts. She will forward copies of this correspondence upon receipt.

b. Extradition Board, OMGUS, has not denied any French extradition request concerning Barbier. She pointed out several times during the conversation that the Extradition Board first learned of this matter on 2 March 1950. Public Safety, HICOG, is allegedly investigating the entire affair.

Mrs. Lange was good enough to assure me that I will be kept informed of all further developments.

Transmitted herewith is Memo setting forth facts developed by telephone inquiry to the HICOG Extradition Board in the matter of an alleged denial of extradition of one Klaus Barbier.

The only document as yet before the Extradition Board is a letter of 2 March 1950 in which French authorities refer to certain previous correspondence addressed to various agencies requesting information as to the whereabouts (sic. location) of Barbier. If this letter be treated as a Request for Extradition, as the Extradition Board is inclined to do, it still does not meet the procedural requirements for extradition, which require an Indictment by the War Crimes Court and written documentation (affidavits) sufficient to establish a prima facie case.

It is apparent that the Extradition Board has at no time denied any French extradition request.

To date, from the correspondence which was sent to various agencies as indicated in Mr. Moeller's Memorandum, the matter appears to have been entirely a Public Safety question of determining the whereabouts of Barbier.



"Following is summary Council of Republic exchange on subject Gestapo Agent Barbier following oral question put to government by MRP Senator Leo Hamon speaking unofficially for Senators formerly members of French Resistance.

"Senator Brune, PTT Minister speaking in place of absent Minister Atlantic Defense Pleven reviewed French efforts find and try Barbier as war criminal beginning August 31, 1945 and ending with declaration of April 25, 1950 by American occupation authorities to French High Commissioner declaring US authorities ignorant Barbier's hideout. Minister added that when Barbier cited as witness in Hardy trial French Foreign Minister notified US by diplomatic route and that latter unofficially replied they could not accede to demand. He declared 'government will continue its action in order get Barbier turned over to justice'.

"In reply Hamon reviewed very briefly Barbier's record as torturer and executioner and declared that Barbier could be found if one really wanted to find him, since, on November 25, 1948 officers of the DST of French Surete 'interrogated Barbier in Germany at official American Officers as is proved by document read at trial'. Hamon declared that replies of American authorities in Germany 'do not give, to put it as mildly as possible, the impression of perfect uprightness'. Hamon continued however that he did not wish to accuse any one and paid tribute to American sacrifices in winning common victory. He closed with following sentence: 'One can punish assassins; one must also have the firm purpose never to make use of them'. Lively applause followed.

"Minister replied as follows: 'Government associates itself with words just spoken by Hamon and will not recoil before any step in order to obtain surrender (Livraison) of a war criminal who deserves to be punished'.

"Franc-Tireur (Independent-Leftist): 'Americans have shown obvious and repeated bad will. Barbier is said to be missing. He wasn't missing on November 25, 1948, when (Defense de Service Territoriale) questioned him in American Zone, nor in May 1949 at time of second inquiry commission.

Mr. Consul General:

I have the honor to call your attention to a matter of exceptional importance, which may have a disturbing influence on Franco-American relations, particularly in the Lyon region.

It is the case of a certain BARBIER, former head of the Gestapo at Lyon, who arrested, tortured and massacred with his own hands a large number of our comrades of the Resistance.

The activities of BARBIER are well-known in Lyon. The war criminals executed after the Nuremberg trial look like second-raters next to this individual.

But, it is known officially that he is living at liberty in the American zone in Germany, and all demands for his extradition made to date, have been rejected on the pretext that he is being employed as an informer by your military police. All police forces may use bandits as informers, but the employment of this one, famous as a torturer and a murderer causes a veritable scandal in Lyon.

At all reunions and congresses of the Resistance, everyone is unanimous in protesting against this and the comments we hear have a deplorable and distressing effect for your friends. The Communist Party exploits this scandal to the utmost, pointing out that the Americans protect the worst bandits and the murderers of our comrades and we are unable to reply in any way to these accusations.

As Honorary President of the Confédération Nationale de la Résistance, it is my duty to point out to you, as representative of the American Government in the region where BARBIER carried

out

out his activities, the extreme gravity of this fact, and I ask you in the name of all the French Resistance, to insist to Washington that this individual be delivered to French Justice. It is a vital question for Franco-American friendship in the Lyon Region.

Knowing the value you set upon this friendship, you will no doubt use all your influence to safeguard it, and I beg you to believe, Mr. Consul General, in my sentiments of sincere affection and very high consideration.

The American Embassy in Paris presents its compliments to the United States High Commissioner in Germany and wishes to advise that the American Consul at Lyon has been recently addressed by General F. Ruby, Honorary President of the local chapter of an important organization of former resistance fighters (Confederation Nationale des Maquis et des Militants de la Resistance, Federation du Rhone), with respect to the former Gestapo agent BARBIER who has been the subject of the several communications under reference.

This matter has been the subject of HICOG's telegram to Paris no. 333 of May 2 (repeated to the Department as no. 3737); HICOG's telegram to the Department no. 3790, May 3 (repeated to Paris as no. 335); and the Embassy's telegram to the Department no. 2238 of May 10 (repeated to HICOG as no. 320).

General Ruby states in the letter under reference that "it is officially known that (Barbier) is at liberty in the American zone of Germany" and that all requests for his extradition have been "refused on the grounds that he is being used as agent by (American) military police." The letter stresses, in strong terms, the gravity with which the matter is regarded in the Lyon area where Barbier is said to have been guilty of numerous acts of torture and massacre.

The American Consul at Lyon has advised General Ruby that the matter is now being considered by the appropriate French authorities in Paris, but that copy of his letter was being forwarded to the Embassy. The Embassy, in turn, has advised the Consul that the Barbier case has not been the subject of any official approach by the French Government in Paris up to this time; that according to press reports demands for the man's extradition had been made by French authorities

Dear Al:

The Ambassador has received a letter of protest (copy attached) from an organization of former members of the Resistance in Lyon, on the subject of Barbier, the former Gestapo chief in that city. This letter comes from a different organization than that which recently addressed a letter to our Consul in Lyon, the general tenor of which was communicated to HICOG in our note of May 16. In each case, of course, the essence of the matter is that these organizations believe the reports according to which Barbier not only was employed by us at one time in the past but continues in our employ and that we are interposing difficulties to his extradition,

Without going into Barbier's record (I have seen the memorandum which you gave Jimmy Riddleberger and which he transmitted to us on the occasion of Mr. McCloy's visit here early last month), we should very much like to have some word of advice from you as to how to handle this kind of protest, for it seems obvious that the matter is not dying down, certainly not in the Lyon area. Our note of May 16 has given you indications of our attitude toward the letter addressed to our Consul in Lyon: We advised him that no official approach has been made to us here in Paris up to this time; that, according to press reports, a demand for the man's extradition has been made by French authorities in Germany; and that, likewise according to press reports, American authorities in Germany have stated that the matter is under investigation.

It will sooner or later become necessary, if indeed it is not already necessary at this time, to go beyond that kind of off-hand treatment in dealing with the situation. Although there have been no recent developments in the matter on the national level, you are aware from our telegram No. 320 of May 10 that reactions to the persistent stories about Barbier being employed by us have reached into the Council of the Republic and may be expected to rebound in Parliament. I am restating these facts because we are anxious that it be understood in HICOG that the matter continues to be embarrassing to us. We should indeed be very grateful for some advice.

Specifically, we do not know whether any recent move has been made by French authorities in Germany, looking for the apprehension and extradition of Barbier. Your telegram No. 333 of May 2 made it appear as though no such move had been made since a year ago. Have there been any developments since that time? And are any of these developments of the kind that might lend themselves to use by our Consul in Lyon in dealing with public opinion there? The only thing we have been able to tell him, so far (beyond what is stated in the second paragraph above), has been

that "...the publicity that has attended the Barbier case may well make it all the more difficult in Germany to apprehend the man, who presumably has received knowledge of the fact that his extradition is being so strongly demanded."

I feel that in dealing with this matter there is no need to go further into the aspects discussed in your memorandum to Jimmy Riddleberger, which are appreciated here. The problem is what to do about the apparently widespread French belief that Barbier not only was employed by us in the past but continues to be employed by us at present, and that we are blocking his extradition.

We should appreciate your assistance in dealing with what promises to become a constant and convenient source of anti-American propaganda.

We are not replying to the attached letter until we hear from you.

SUBJECT : Minor Incident at Villefranche-sur-Saône, June 6, 1950.
Public Protest against Alleged American Protection of Gestapo Agent.

On June 6, 1950, the Consul and Public Affairs Officer, Lyon, attended a gala sponsored by the Confédération Nationale des Maquis et des Militants de la Résistance at the Cinéma Eden in Villefranche-sur-Saône, Rhône. The Consulate has for a long time enjoyed very friendly relations with the small (20,000 inhabitants) manufacturing and commercial town of Villefranche-sur-Saône, capital of the wine-growing district of Beaujolais. Together with the British Consul General, the Officer in Charge was invited to preside at the gathering organized by the Confédération des Maquis to celebrate the anniversary of the Allied landing in Normandy.

BARBIER CASE

The American Consul sat next to the Sub-Prefect of Villefranche, Mr. JANIN, in a place of honor. Shortly before the meeting, the Honorary President of the Confédération, General F. RUBY, showed Consul DUR a copy of a letter he had written the Principal Officer Consul Horatio MOOERS, on May 6, protesting against the alleged presence of the former Gestapo chief, BARBIER, in the American zone of occupation in Germany. General Ruby also showed Consul Dur the reply to his letter by Consul Mooers on May 10.

According to General Ruby the American authorities in Germany were sheltering Barbier and using him as a double agent. General Ruby declared with considerable emphasis that this situation was placing a great strain on Franco-American friendship, not only in the Lyon district but throughout France. As Officer in Charge, Consul Dur replied to General Ruby that he would be glad to discuss the matter with him privately and would transmit to the proper authorities any evidence he could bring in support of his charges. General Ruby appeared to be satisfied with this answer and promised to call at the Consulate in Lyon with all the necessary documents.

When he got up to speak, however, General Ruby seized the occasion to read aloud to the audience of about 700 people gathered in the Cinéma Eden his letter of May 6 to Consul Mooers. This letter contained the charge that Barbier is employed as an agent

of the American military police in Germany and that the American authorities have consequently rejected all demands for his extradition. Reading this letter at the close of his speech, General Ruby was rewarded with mild applause.

After the General had finished speaking, the sub-Prefect of Villefranche turned to the Officer in Charge and remarked that he proposed to deal with the matter on the spot. As soon as the General had returned to his seat, the sub-Prefect proceeded to give him a thorough dressing-down, rebuking him for his effrontery in using a social gathering as a political forum, and trying to gain personal popularity at the expense of friendly international relations. As Mr. Janin observed, public reunions are not the proper place for diplomatic negotiations. The Officer in Charge heartily agreed with the sub-Prefect, and told the General that if he desired an interview on the subject he might write and ask for an appointment.

Consul Dur stayed on for the rest of the evening's program which unfolded without any further mishap in a spirit of real cordiality. During the intermission, the active, as distinguished from the honorary, President of the Confédération, Colonel Jaubert-Jonage, came up to the Officer-in-Charge and apologized for General Ruby's indiscretion. He also stated that plans were on foot to remove the General from his position of Honorary President.

The incident may thus be considered closed. The amount of damage done was negligible. Lyon's two principal newspapers Le Progrès and L'Echo-La Liberté carried accounts of the gala of the Confédération des Maquis at Villefranche without mentioning the General's allegations concerning Barbier. The Communist-line paper La République has not yet published an account of the proceedings at Villefranche. Far from making a sensation by his charges against the U.S., General Ruby seems rather to have courted oblivion. It is doubtful whether even among those who heard him the General made much impression with his remarks. As interpreted by the Sub-Prefect, the General's actions indicate a desire to cultivate his popularity with the left-wing elements of the Confédération led by Mr. Bourricand, a former deportee. Apparently the General is not sure of his position in the Association and therefore is angling desperately for support.

The case of Barbier, former Gestapo leader in Lyon, is now an old story, which was recently revived by the trial of Colonel Hardy. At that time, a month or two ago, the newspapers and radio disseminated the rumor that Barbier had taken refuge in the American zone in Germany. The Communist press played up the story, but public response was rather apathetic. Resistance days are now long past. Public opinion is tired of the long agitation over the problems arising out of the occupation. There is no doubt that the

mass of the people would like to see justice done swiftly. Otherwise they would prefer to forget past shame and wrong. There is a grain of cynicism in this attitude, but even more of fatigue.

Many of the people who have heard the charges about Barbier undoubtedly believe them. If they are not more concerned, it is because they are accustomed to scandals of this kind. The U.S. thus benefits from the general disillusionment of the French. It is unfortunate, however, to let the contest go by default, and to rely on public apathy to cover up our mistakes. The case of Barbier is an instance where a positive statement of American policy was needed. The Officer in Charge who, as Public Affairs Officer, receives a great deal of policy guidance from the Department on general questions of international relations has unfortunately only vague indications of the official American attitude toward this burning issue of local importance. It is impossible with the evidence supplied by official sources to make any sort of effective answer to the charges brought against HICOG in the Barbier case.

Our records indicate the following with respect to steps taken to secure Barbie's extradition: On June 7, 1949, the French Mission communicated with the Land Commissioner's Office in Bavaria requesting that efforts be made to locate Barbie. This request was initiated as the result of protestations from the French association of former "Resistants" of Lyons demanding the arrest of Barbie because of his alleged complicity in Gestapo activities in Lyons during the war. An investigation in an attempt to locate Barbie was conducted by the German police who reported on June 21, 1949, their inability to discover his whereabouts.

On November 15, 1949, the State Department cabled HICOG about a request received from the French Ambassador which stated that Barbie had been interrogated as a result of letters rogatory issued in connection with the trial of certain alleged war criminals in Lyons. The French Ambassador requested Barbie's arrest and surrender. The Department expressed its intention of informing the French that the matter should be taken up with HICOG.

On March 2, 1950, the French legal adviser to the French High Commission, A. Lebegue, wrote the Administration of Justice Division at HICOG a letter in which he again requested that efforts be made to locate Barbie. He acknowledged that no formal request for extradition had been filed. He justified his failure to submit a formal application on the grounds of inability to comply with HICOG extradition procedures which require that a request for the extradition of an individual be accompanied by a statement of the individual's residence or location.

M. Lebegue's letter referred to the war criminal trials pending at Lyons and indicated that Barbie's presence at these trials was essential both as a principal in the crimes allegedly committed and as a witness. Lebegue refers in his letter to announcements in the press to the effect that Barbie was at liberty and carrying on a trade in Munich. He further states that the presence of Barbie in the U.S. Zone was confirmed by the fact that he had been examined on several occasions in 1949 by French police inspectors, such examinations having taken place in official U.S.-premises. M. Lebegue's letter was acknowledged on April 25, 1950, and M. Lebegue was informed of the police report dated June 21, 1949, which showed that the police had been unable to locate Barbie. In view of the failure to discover Barbie's whereabouts, M. Lebegue was asked to submit further information concerning the alleged interrogation of Barbie including information as to the office in which the French inspectors interviewed him and identification of any U.S. personnel present at the interrogation.

On May 9, 1950, the French replied stating that, according to their information, Barbie was questioned three times in American offices by American CIC officials. Dates of interrogation were given as May 14, 1948, and May 18, 1948, at Frankfurt/Main, and July 16, 1948, at Munich. The letter stated that the writer was unable to give the names of the American officials present. It went on to state that a newspaper reporter in Paris had indicated that Barbie lived in Augsburg where he is supposed to be running a hardware store at 38 Schillerstrasse. This address was investigated by the Public Safety Branch but Barbie was not discovered.

On May 31, 1950, the Administration of Justice Division wrote the French again stating that efforts to locate Barbie were being continued and pointing out that as yet no evidence such as affidavits of witnesses or other documentary material had been supported to justify the claim that Barbie was in fact a war criminal. Under existing procedures, with which the French are familiar, a prima facie case of guilt is required as a prerequisite to a request for extradition.

Dear Woody:

I enclose a memorandum received from the General Counsel's office in reply to your letter to me of June 2 regarding Barbier. The memo is a factual presentation of the case as known to that office which handles all matters of extradition for the High Commissioner. I am told that there is no objection to your using any or all of this memo for purposes of calming down the French organizations who continue to be excited about this case. It seems to me, however, that parts of the memo referring to interrogations of Barbier in the presence of US (CIC) personnel might well be considered confidential.

It all seems to boil down to the fact that the French authorities have only recently formally requested his extradition, that all formalities required to effect extradition have not as yet been complied with by the French, that in the meantime, despite the lack of such information, the Office of the US High Commissioner has as an exception conducted a search for Barbier, but so far without result. While Barbier is known to have been residing in the US Zone and in fact was interviewed there by French officials on several occasions in 1948, the fact that American authorities have been unable to locate him during the course of their recent investigations is hardly extraordinary in view of the wide publicity that has been given to the French extradition demands. This publicity undoubtedly was known to Barbier himself, since he has disappeared from the place where he had been residing. The American authorities, with the cooperation of the German police, are continuing their search in an effort to take this man into custody for extradition to France in the event that the prima facie evidence submitted in his case should justify this action.

I hope this information will be useful to you.

Dear Woody:

Since writing the attached letter a new angle was raised in the form of a request by the Department for information for its use in preparing a reply to a note from the French Embassy. Mr. McCloy directed that we smoke out EUCOM on the matter to see how far they would go in helping to find this character, and to get more details as to just how embarrassing it would be to them (CIC) if he were turned over to the French. The result of this approach was better than we expected and it is probable that Mr. McCloy will in fact now ask for EUCOM's active assistance in locating the guy. (Up to now HICOG public safety people and the German police have not been able to find him).

The ambiguity in the General Counsel's memo as to the dates when Barbier was seen and interviewed has now been cleared up since it seems that he was interviewed on the dates mentioned in 1948 and also in January and February 1949. Another point of interest is that the CIC dropped this man like a hotcake the moment the war criminal charges were brought to their attention (in connection with the Hardy trial). This was in May 1949. After that date they maintained some contact with him but he was no longer in their employ. They claim they did not know until then that he had had such a record (sic).

This is to fill you in on last minute details as received from EUCOM. I doubt if you should use any of this later information and suggest you stick to the lines furnished in the attached letter.

This memorandum is supplemental to the memorandum on the same subject dated June 13, 1950, from Mr. Gross to Mr. Lightner, which states the EICOG part of the Barbie story. Set forth below are the facts with respect to the relations of U.S. counter-intelligence with Barbie, as related to me by General Robert Taylor, Director of Intelligence, EUCOM and Major Wilson of Counter Intelligence (CIC), on June 16, 1950.

1. SUMMARY.

Barbie worked for CIC from early in the occupation until May 24, 1949, but has not worked for CIC since then. CIC has not been in touch with him since late April 1950 and does not know his present whereabouts. Among several targets of his small net of informants were French intelligence activities in the French and U.S. zones. Since presumably Barbie would disclose everything to the French if he were delivered to them on war criminal charges, the policy question is presented of whether U.S.-French relations would be more damaged by delivery of Barbie, assuming we could find him, than by non-delivery. We are in a position to make a statement to the French about our termination of his employment and about our loss of contact with him and take a chance that the German police will not pick him up even though we make a formal attempt to have that done.

2. FACTS.

Barbie was picked up by CIC at a time when he was on the wanted list of ex-SS officers. In April 1947, CIC decided to use him as an informant and he continued in that employment from April 1947 until May 1949. He developed a net to cover communist activities in the U.S. zone, the Soviet mission in Baden Baden in the French zone and French intelligence activities in the U.S. and French zones. Several of the members of his net were located in the French zone and were close to French intelligence personnel.

During 1948 the French liaison officer at EUCOM became aware that Barbie was working for the Army and asked permission to interrogate him in preparation for the Hardy trial. CIC cooperated with the French and Barbie was interrogated in the U.S. zone by

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French officials in November 1948 and in January and February of 1949. In each interrogation a CIC officer was present.

On May 24, 1949 his employment by CIC was discontinued, following publication in France of charges that Barbie was a war criminal. He has not been employed by them since that time, although they did keep in contact with him until late April 1950. In January 1950 the French requested CIC to send Barbie to France to be a witness in the Hardy trial. CIC offered to make him available if the French could guarantee his safe return to Germany and the matter finally ended on April 26, 1950 when the French intelligence officer concerned said that he could not provide such a guarantee.

A complete disclosure by Barbie to the French of his activities on behalf of CIC would not endanger any present intelligence operations, but would furnish the French with evidence that we had been directing intelligence operations against them.

It is understood that at least one French intelligence office would prefer not to have Barbie turned over to the French. Apparently there are some internal politics mixed up in this problem.

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As you know the Department cabled on May 26 that it had received a strong note from the French Embassy on May 15 regarding the Barbier case, requesting the Department to instruct HICOG to deliver this character to French authorities in Germany. On June 13 we cabled the Department we were still investigating and hoped to send our views within a few days.

On the basis of your report on your interview with the EUCOM officers in Heidelberg, it appears that EUCOM would be willing to go out and look for Barbier and to turn him over to HICOG for delivery to the French. I have talked the matter over with Sam Leber and we feel that we should ask EUCOM to do this only as a last resort. We suggest that you talk the matter over with Hank Byroade and show him the factual data contained in your memorandum and in Bross' memorandum of June 13. These documents will give the Department all the necessary background for a reply to the French note. On the other hand, we suggest that it may be that the French will not officially press this matter (particularly if rather persistent rumors are true that several influential French officials would be embarrassed by Barbier's extradition to France). Hence we feel that the Department might well decide to let the French note go unanswered for the time being in the hope that the whole business will blow over.

This may be a vain hope in view of the continuing blasts that various French organizations are emitting. Our officials in France are considerably embarrassed by these public statements and newspaper articles since up to now they've had no information to put out to counter the allegations. My recent letter to Wallner in our Embassy in Paris may be of some help to our people there. On the other hand, if the French Foreign Office continues to be subject to similar other pressures it may be forced to press the matter vis-a-vis the State Department.

We should naturally be interested in knowing how the Department intends to handle the matter and I gather we will do nothing here until instructed by the Department to request EUCOM to join in the search for Barbier.

I handed to Mr. de Marterie of the French Embassy this afternoon our memorandum of today's date relating to Harpie Klaus. In doing so I explained that this case appeared to consist of an unfortunate series of mistakes in that Klaus had at one time been employed by us in Germany and that this fact was known by the French authorities when they interrogated him May 14, 13, July 16, 1943 and February 1949. I emphasized the fact that Klaus was dismissed in May 1949 and disappeared completely early in 1950. I emphasized that every effort was being made to locate him now and that upon his apprehension consideration would be given to his extradition.

Mr. de Marterie inquired whether we would extradite him to France when he was caught to which I replied that no answer could be given at present in that the documents submitted by the French would have to be the subject of further examination. Mr. de Marterie said he understood that the documents submitted with the French note of June 19th were still incomplete and that further information was available on his wartime activities.

I took this occasion to point out that, as the French had not requested his extradition before the cut-off date, we would probably ask for a statement as to the reasons for their failure to request his extradition prior to 1949.

MEMORANDUM

The Department of State acknowledges receipt of the French Embassy's notes of May 5 and June 19, 1950, requesting the extradition to France from the American Zone of Occupation in Germany of Barbie Klaus, a German national who is wanted for trial for the commission of war crimes.

Owing to the fact that efforts by the United States authorities in Germany to locate Klaus so far have not resulted in success, no previous reply has been made to the Embassy's notes under reference. The Embassy is, however, advised that the search for Klaus is being continued and as soon as he has been apprehended, prompt consideration in conformance with the regular procedures for the extradition of persons from the American Zone will be given to the request made for his extradition.

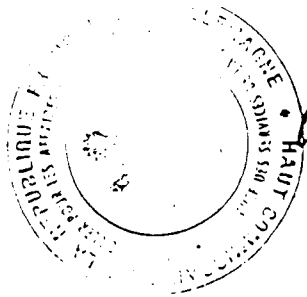

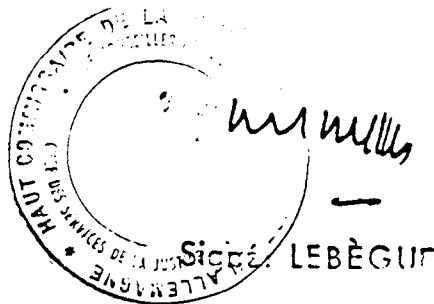

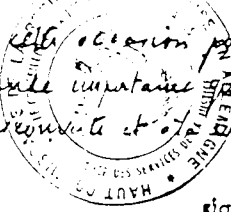

It should, moreover, be stressed that, whilst

Hardick in the Intelligence Division of EUCOM, who followed the conversation with a cable to CIC stating: "It is proposed that this Division notify HICOG that it has no objection to the extradition of Barbie. Further propose that HICOG be notified informally that Barbie is no longer under control of any agency of this Division." Five days later, Vidal spoke to Hardick and memorialized the conversation as follows: "On 14 Sept 50 Mr. Vidal informed Lt. Col. The Extradition Board has lately been concerned with the request of the French government for the extradition of Klaus Barbi. I have been advised by Mr. Cunningham and Mr. McGreevy that for the past five years the location and extradition of Mr. Barbi has been a matter of dispute between the French War Crimes Commission and our CIC. Last month the Intelligence Division, EUCOM advised the Extradition Board that it had no objection to the extradition of Klaus Barbi but "had no information as to his present whereabouts". I was also advised by telephone conversation that it was the policy of the commanding general, EUCOM, that CIC would not attempt to locate any war criminal suspects.

It is the ordinary practice of the Extradition Board to return requests for extradition of war criminal suspects unless they are accompanied by a statement of the address of subject in the American Zone. However, in view of the delay caused to the French authorities by the attitude of CIC and the importance which the French government places on this case it is the view of the Board that in this instance the American authorities should attempt to locate Mr. Barbi to facilitate his extradition. I am advised by Mr. Lisle that this is also the view of the State Department and we are in receipt of an airgram from the department which states that it has advised the French Embassy that a search for Barbi is being conducted. This is not the case at the present time and it is my suggestion that every effort should be made here by your office and the operations division to enlist the efforts of CIC. In view of the past attitude of CIC in this matter and the practice of EUCOM to discontinue all war crimes investigations, it is probable that negotiations on this subject should be conducted on a high level, perhaps by yourself.

Mr. Gaines informed me that Oberstaatsanwaltschaft at Kassel had issued a warrant of arrest for Klaus Barbie charging him with larceny or obtaining money under false pretenses.

Warrant was issued July 26, 1950 on the affidavit of one Dr. Hoffmann who stated in 1950 that he met Barbie in Camp Eselheide in the British Zone in February, 1947, and at that time Barbie admitted unlawfully impersonating an official and obtaining such property in June, 1946.

Further reference is made to your letter of September 19, 1950 and our interim reply of October 12, 1950 concerning Klaus Barbie whose extradition to France for trial as a war criminal suspect has been requested. We have received a report from our Public Safety Branch, Office of Political Affairs, concerning efforts being made to locate Barbie and herewith advise you of the current status of the search.

Investigations conducted at the Office of Criminal Investigation in the several Länder on or about November 2, 1950 reveal that Barbie is carried on the wanted persons' list. All persons coming in contact with any of the German police agencies in the United States Zone are checked against this list which will remain active until 1952. Barbie is wanted on three different entries:

(1) By the Oberstaatsanwaltschaft, Kassel, on charge of impersonation of an official. A warrant of arrest was issued on July 26, 1950.

(2) Listed in an entry received through channels of the United States High Commission on a charge of war crimes committed in France.

(3) Listed in an entry made by the Zonal Crime Office at Ramburg, information having been received through channels of the ICPC, charged with murder in connection with war crimes in France.

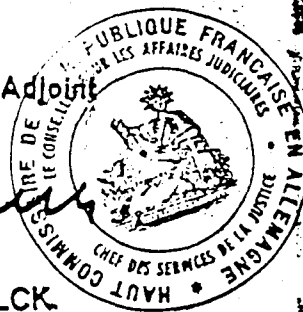

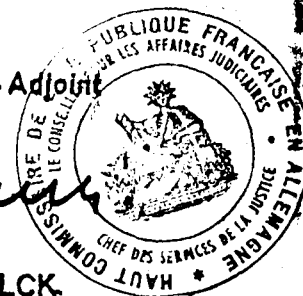

SUBJECT: Rat Line from Austria to South America.

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

1. In accordance with instructions from the Office of the Director of Intelligence, USFA, these agents have attempted to establish a safe means of resettlement of dependents of visitors and VIP personalities.

2. Through the Vatican connections of Father Dragonovic, Croat, DP Resettlement Chief of the Vatican circle, a tentative agreement was reached to assist in this operation. The agreement consists of simply mutual assistance, i.e., these agents assist persons of interest to Father Dragonovic to leave Germany and, in turn, Father Dragonovic will assist these agents in obtaining the necessary visas to Argentina, South America, for persons of interest to this Command.

3. It may be stated that some of the persons of interest to Father Dragonovic may be of interest to the Denazification policy of the Allies; however, the persons assisted by Father Dragonovic are also of interest to our Russian ally. Therefore, this operation cannot receive any official approval and must be handled with minimum amount of delay and with a minimum amount of general knowledge.

4. On 3 July 1948, these agents contacted the Austrian representative of Father Dragonovic in Salzburg, as prearranged. Through the assistance of CIC Salzburg, transportation was obtained and the representative was escorted to Bad Reichenhall, Germany, where he was to meet the German representative of Father Dragonovic's organization. However, due to unforeseen circumstances, the German representative did not appear. The Austrian representative was escorted back to Salzburg to await developments.

5. On 4 July 48 these agents received a telegram from the U.S. contact in Rome (Fred Martin) that the German representative was arrested while crossing the German/Austrian border on or about 3 July 48. It was the desire of these agents to go to Bad Reichenhall, Germany, to make the necessary investigation, however due to transportation difficulties, this was not deemed advisable.

6. The status of subject rat line is not settled at this time, however it is felt that with CIC connections in Germany these agents can assist the German representative and continue their progress as outlined above.

NOTE: It is suggested to the Chief, 430th CIC Detachment, USFA, that a reassignment of jeeps be made, and that two detachment jeeps be assigned to headquarters. These jeeps could be stationed and utilized by Land Salzburg and Land Upper Austria but be prepared to move upon call from representatives of CIC headquarters. In this manner most of the difficulties in obtaining transportations for such operations can be avoided. Also the responsibilities for incorrect use of said vehicles, i.e., police violations, utilizing Government vehicles for pleasure, will be the responsibility of the driver and not the Land Section to which the jeep is originally assigned.

It is believed that in this manner considerable time, personal difficulties, and personality differences could be avoided and assist in the speedy completion of similar missions.

In December 1950, the 66th CIC Headquarters learned about the rat line operation. Lieutenant John Hobbins, who was in the Technical Specialist section at 66th CIC Headquarters, traveled to Salzburg and met on December 11 with officers of the 430th CIC and of the G-2 (Intelligence Branch) of United States Forces, Austria.

He filed a report that began as follows:

"a. The 430th CIC Detachment has been operating what they term a "Ratline" evacuation system to Central and South America without serious repercussions during the past three (3) years. At the cost of approximately \$1,000 each adult (US legal tender) 430th CIC is transferring evacuees to Italy where they are provided with legal documentation obtained through devious means there. Overall supervision and conduct of the operation is the sole responsibility of Mr. NEAGOY, CIC Landsalzburg. Actual procurement of the documentation is handled by the 430th 's contact man in Italy.

"b. Representatives of the 430th CIC state that, if necessary, they are prepared to undertake the

following action upon request. If an informant will agree to emigrate to any available South or Central American country, Mr. NEAGOY will visit this headquarters to be briefed on the individual case and interview the emigrant. Upon being provided with the necessary funds, the 430th will assume responsibility for transferring the individual to Italy and arranging his emigration. The estimated time requirement for completion of a case is six (6) to sixteen (16) weeks."

Hobbins outlined the mechanics of the transfer. When the 66th decided on a candidate for the rat line, it was to notify the Intelligence Division, EUCOM, which in turn would "merely inform G-2, USFA [its counterpart in Austria], that it has approved the request of this headquarters for the resettlement of the emigrant. No details of the case are needed and none are desired by G-2, USFA, which will inform 430th CIC that a resettlement is to be initiated."

At that point, Neagoy would come to Germany, be briefed on the case, and interview the emigrant. He would pass on the emigrant's "basic personal data * * * to the 430th contact man in Italy," who would determine "the name to be assumed by the emigrant for the balance of the operation." Using this assumed name, the 66th CIC would then obtain from the Combined Travel Board (a branch of the Allied High Commission for Germany) travel documents to enable the emigrant to travel through Austria to Italy, accompanied all the while by the agent from the 430th.

"Upon arrival in Italy," Hobbins continued, "the emigrant will be placed in a hotel, and, on a day to day basis, provided with sufficient funds to live until embarkation. Upon embarkation, the emigrant is given \$50.00 in green backs. He is given no further assurances and is strictly on his own. From the beginning of the processing, the 430th tries to create an atmosphere which leads the emigrant to believe that he is being treated with great consideration; that everything within reason is being done to provide for his welfare; that he is entitled to nothing further and has no right to ask or expect further assistance after boarding ship."

Hobbins' supervisor, Major Gilbert C. Russi (who had replaced Vidal as head of the Technical Specialist Section at CIC HQ in October 1950), forwarded Hobbins' memo to the Deputy CO of the 66th, noting that "[w]e have four (4) disposal cases at the moment, all of which suggest that emigration of some sort or another should be applied to."

SUBJECT: Informant Disposal

RE: Emigration Methods of the 430th CIC Detachment.

1. The following information was obtained on 11 December 1980 during discussions with S/A WEAQOY and Lieutenant Colonel Melville MILLER, Commanding Officer, CIC Landsalburg, and Lieutenant Colonel DOBSON, Assistant Operations Officer, 9-8, USAF. All of the information was coordinated among the aforementioned individuals and the undersigned.

2. Brief summary of system:

a. The 430th CIC Detachment has been operating what they term "Pipeline" extraction system in Central and South America without serious repercussions during the past three (3) years. At the cost of approximately \$1,000 each adult (US legal tender) 430th CIC is transferring evacuees to Italy where they are provided with legal documentation obtained through devious means there. Overall supervision and conduct of the operation is the sole responsibility of Mr. WEAQOY, CIC Landsalburg. Actual procurement of the documentation is handled by the 430th's contact man in Italy.

American country. Mr. BRASOY will visit this Headquarters to be briefed on the individual case and interview the emigrant. Upon being provided with the necessary funds, the 430th will assume responsibility for transferring the individual to Italy and arranging his emigration. The estimated time requirement for completion of a case is six (6) to sixteen (16) weeks.

3. Limitations of System:

a. Utilization of the 430th "Railline" is conditioned by the willingness of the emigrant to leave Europe and to accept resettlement in an undetermined South or Central American country. No prior assurance can be given the emigrant that he will be able to enter a specific country. An attempt, however, will be made to comply with his stated wish in this connection.

b. Single persons, male or female, and/or families can be handled.

c. It is desirable that the emigrant be under 50 years of age, although with extra effort and perhaps a little additional money, the problem of age generally can be solved.

d. The emigrant must be able to meet the legal health requirements for such processing.

4. Mechanics of Disposal:

a. When this headquarters determines that solution of a disposal case is emigration, and it appears that emigrant is suitable under

The limitations listed above, if in any way, it is only necessary to obtain the concurrence of Intelligence Division, USA.

b. If Intelligence Division concurs, it will advise inform 0-2, USA, that it has approved the request of the emigrant for the resettlement of the emigrant. No further action is required and none are desired by 0-2, USA, which will inform the emigrant that a resettlement is to be initiated.

c. That the emigrant has been approved, the emigrants will internally coordinate the balance of the emigrant's case with the CIA.

d. Through lateral coordination, arrangements will be made for Mr. BRAGG, 430th CIC (whose sole responsibility is resettlement problems) to come to Germany for briefing by this organization on each subject. 430th CIC does not desire a complete case report, but Mr. BRAGG must have sufficient knowledge of the case to arrange for any special considerations that may be necessary to insure the personal security of the specific resettlement. After being briefed, Mr. BRAGG wishes to interview the emigrant to further ascertain his attitude toward resettlement in particular areas, and to prepare a questionnaire containing basic personal data. Mr. BRAGG also requires sufficient copies of passport type photos.

e. Following interview of the emigrant, Mr. BRAGG will pass certain basic information to the 430th contact man in Italy. This will consist of the emigrant's approximate age, nationality, and a brief physical description. The contact man will then inform Mr. BRAGG of the name to be assumed by the emigrant for the balance of the emigrant's case.

MEMORANDUM TO COLONEL STEVENS

SUBJECT: Klaus BARBIE Case

1. Klaus BARBIE has been an informant of this organization since 1947, operating in the Region XII area. BARBIE was formerly a high official of Gestapo in LYON, France, and during his period of service is alleged to have tortured and killed many French patriots. Because of these alleged acts, BARBIE is wanted by the French for trial as a war criminal. Reference is made to Tab #1 which outlines the overtures made by the French for the return of BARBIE to France for trial.

2. In January 1950, Region XII communicated with this headquarters and requested information as to the disposition of SUBJECT. By Minute 2, this headquarters ordered Region XII to maintain contact with SUBJECT; to keep him in the area; and to continue paying him from Confidential Funds, as it was necessary to have SUBJECT available in case the French desired to re-interrogate SUBJECT or to have SUBJECT extradited to France. (See Tab #2)

3. In April 1950, SUBJECT's name appeared on the German Police Want List. It was determined that the Surete had sponsored this request, and apparently had done so without clearance at a higher level, i.e., Surete contacted Wuerttemberg Police directly, contrary to existing regulations. Region XII at this time sent an IRS to this headquarters, which IRS was never answered. (See Tab #3)

4. In May 1950, Region XII S-3 sent an NOIC to this headquarters again outlining the BARBIE case, together with possible ramifications. The Regional Commander placed a 1st Indorsement to this NOIC approving the S-3 comments. Region XII requested a decision coupled with guidance from this headquarters in the BARBIE case but no information was forwarded to Region XII either giving guidance or outlining the action the region should take. (See Tab #4)

5. In May 1950, the HARDY treason trial started in PARIS. HARDY was a member of the French Resistance and had given information to the Gestapo - namely to BARBIE. The French wanted BARBIE as a witness against HARDY - it is noted that the French papers stated the American authorities refused to allow BARBIE to appear as a witness. The truth is that the French did not make a proper request, and that Lieutenant WHITEWAY of BDOC was the initial party to ask for BARBIE's appearance as a material witness. When WHITEWAY discovered that the French would not return BARBIE to Germany, WHITEWAY withdrew his request. No additional requests were made at that time. It is pointed out that apparently two factions in France are involved in a political maneuver. The Communists want BARBIE to return, while other factions would prefer to have him remain in Germany. The latter faction have good reason, as many influential Frenchman, who presently hold high positions, were interrogated by BARBIE during the early days of the occupation of France. For example, POUCET and LABRUN (POUCET, I believe, is presently High Commissioner in Germany). Note Tab #5 which indicates the unfavorable publicity on this matter which was forwarded by letter to General TAYLOR.

6. On the 18th of May, 1950, a TWX was received from Major COLLINS, ID, indicating that the German police were looking for BARBIE, and had requested the cooperation of this detachment. No action is indicated. (See Tab #6)

7. On 21 August 1950, a SRI was received from ID requesting the extradition of BARBIE. This SRI was replied to by letter this headquarters, dated 30 August, which stated that this headquarters was complying with original decision made in May 1950. The decision referred to is notated on Tab #1 and indicates that Colonels ERSKINE, ECKMANN, LIGON and JOHNSON, Majors WILSON and DANIELS, and Mr. VIDAL agreed that BARBIE should not be placed in the hands of the French. (See Tab #7)

8. The most current document in SUBJECT's dossier is a TWX from ID, dated 9 September 1950, which indicates that Colonel ERSKINE had informed I.D. that this headquarters has no objection to the extradition of SUBJECT. A Memo for Record indicates that Colonel HARDICK, I.D., was informed that we are no longer connected with BARBIE, and therefore, have no objection to the extradition. No other explanation is given for the reversal of decision. (See Tab #8)

9. A problem is therefore presented in view of the above decision. Region XII is still harboring SUBJECT and his family in a Liaison House, and is not only supporting SUBJECT, but is utilizing him as an informant. Region XII is acting properly under orders of this headquarters inasmuch as the region was informed in January 1950 to keep SUBJECT on the payroll. Region XII has pointed out to this headquarters on several occasions

since that date the problem involved and has requested guidance but no definite action has been taken by this headquarters thus far to alleviate Region XII's problem.

10. During recent discussions with Region XII representatives, the BARBIE case again came to the attention of this section and Major RUSSI in turn ordered a review of the dossier as outlined above for further consideration at this time by Colonel STEVENS.

11. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is deemed important that this organization immediately disassociate itself with BARBIE. If this action had been taken a year ago, a time cushion would by now have been employed to our advantage and would have somewhat minimized any possible repercussions to this unit. Undoubtedly, Colonel ERSKINE's decision to allow I.D. to have SUBJECT extradited must have been founded on a strong basis, which is however not indicated in the written record. (It is presumed that Colonel ERSKINE believed the implications of Tab #8 to this memo be carried through.) However, it is pointed out that SUBJECT, if extradited, is still in a position to:

a. cause a great deal of adverse publicity to CIC in particular and to the Armed Forces in general. In short, in order to vindicate himself, BARBIE will point out that he has served CIC faithfully against Communism for the past several years; this in turn, will expose the fact that this detachment failed initially to arrest him as an automatic arrestee, later failed to turn him over to the British who also wanted him; this unit has probably used the services of a war criminal and protected such person from legal authority.

b. expose this organizations modus operandi, many KEI's, and compromise sensitive penetration informants who are still active in the AUGSBURG area.

c. point out the names of several unsavory "personalities" that have been protected and employed by CIC.

In reality, BARBIE was "pressed" into service by this organization when he was arrested for having been associated with SS underground movement. BARBIE at that time was made to swear that he would sever connections with the SS movement and serve this organization. To date SUBJECT has fulfilled his portion of the contract and has apparently served this organization well. The following plan of action is proposed:

PLAN

(1) This organization completely and with all finality sever all relations with SUBJECT. It must be pointed out firmly to SUBJECT that he has no alternative but to adhere to our desires, as his life is at stake as well as his future security.

(2) SUBJECT must be given a debriefing payment in order to enable both he and his family (wife and two children) to be financially independent until absorbed and lost in the German economy.

(3) This unit may then either:

(a) passively assist SUBJECT in processing himself through several refugee camps as an Illegal Border Crosser in order to enable him to obtain legal documentation and that way completely lose his identity, or

(b) Inform SUBJECT that this unit no longer desires him to remain in the AUGSBURG area because the French are exerting pressure in their search for him. Also inform him that this headquarters will no longer protect him from the French and that he is completely on his own, to do what he pleases.

By following plan (a), it is noted that we will be assured that SUBJECT will completely lose his identity. CIC need not even appear on the scene, other than to watch the developments from the side-lines. However, by following plan (b), in addition to disassociating ourselves with SUBJECT we would also be able to preclude any possible further tie-in with SUBJECT. It is pointed out that SUBJECT has on two occasions escaped from the British and on one occasion escaped from the American authorities. SUBJECT is a professional intelligence man who is very capable and qualified to take care of himself - unless this organization persists in remaining his guardian angel.

13. Recent conference with Region III indicates that SUBJECT is very cooperative in his frame of mind and is willing to follow any procedure set forth by this organization inasmuch as he is living in constant fear of being apprehended by the French.

14. It is believed that if SUBJECT is disassociated with this organization, given a debriefing sum to rehabilitate himself, it is not believed that he will be apprehended in the near future by either the allied or German authorities. Further, based upon past experience, it is believed that the moment the German government receives a portion of its authority under the "technical peace" the function now performed

The Combined Travel Board issued "Altmann" a "temporary travel document" No. 0121454 on February 21, 1951.

Such documents were in common use at that time "in lieu of passport for stateless persons and persons of undetermined nationality." It was valid for travel to various European countries, including Austria and Italy, if visas were obtained, but was not valid beyond Europe. A second travel document was issued for "Altmann's" wife and two children.

On the same day, the Italian Consulate in Munich ("Monaco di Baviera") issued Altmann a transit visa for travel through Italy.

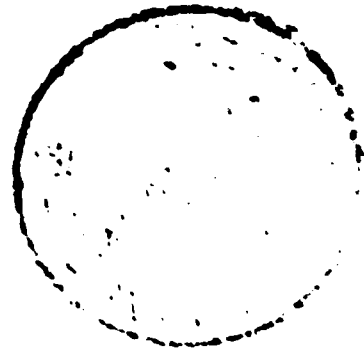

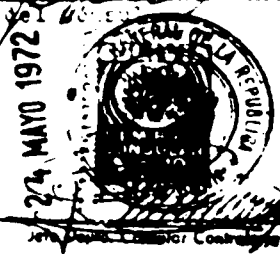

This document was only valid for limited travelling, but not to leave Europe. However it permitted our delegation to issue Red Cross travel documents for Altmann Klaus, his wife and their two children. After arrival at destination the travel documents should have been returned to us; however these 2 documents never reached ICRC.

May we mention too, that generally ICRC divulges any information in its possession only on request of the person concerned or to family members. All our information is treated as confidential. However in this special case we make an exception.

1. Pursuant to instructions received from Lt. Col. J. W. Dobson, Chief of Operations, G2, USFA, these Agents undertook the mission of disposal through Operation RAT LINE of Subject and family.
2. On or about 9 March 1961 the following persons were transferred from AUGSBURG, Germany, to SALZBURG, Austria:
 - a. ALTMANN, Klaus, born 25 October 1915 in KRONSTADT, Rumania
 - b. ALTMANN, Regina, born 7 December 1915 in KRONSTADT, Rumania
 - c. ALTMANN, Ute, born 30 June 1941 in KRONSTADT, Rumania -
 - d. ALTMANN, Klaus-Joerg, born 11 December 1946 in EASSKL, Germany
3. On or about 11 March 1961 the above-mentioned persons travelled from SALZBURG, Austria, to GENOA, Italy, by train using Combined Travel Board documents issued by CTB, MUNICH, bearing Austrian transit visa, Italian transit visa, and a TRIESTE Military Entry Permit.
4. The family arrived in GENOA on 12 March 1961 and was housed at the Hotel NAZIONALE, at which time the family was taken over by the Italian representative of Operation RAT LINE.
5. On 16 March 1961 the above-mentioned representative obtained the following necessary documents and visas for travel of family to its destination:

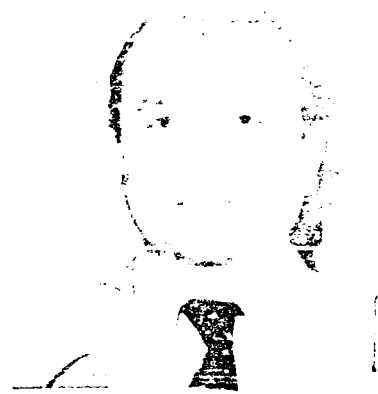

1. Reference is made to your teletype message 14-105, dated 27 December 1951, requesting a summary of the resettlement activities conducted by this detachment.

2. At the present time, persons of resettlement type in this detachment are as follows:

- a. Emigration to Chile
- b. Removal to a relatively non-sensitive locality in the US Zone of Germany
- c. Rehabilitation on the German economy, usually by grant of money for settlement, assistance in obtaining employment, assistance in obtaining living quarters, or a combination of these methods.

3. An additional method of resettlement used by this detachment on one occasion is a procedure established by the 437th CIC Detachment US Forces, Austria. By this method, resettlement is effected in a country outside of Germany. This detachment has no knowledge of the methods employed by the 437th CIC Detachment to effect resettlement. The one instance wherein the 437th CIC's aid was solicited involved a highly complicated disposal problem which the 437th CIC Detachment accommodated this Detachment on a temporary basis.

4. Attention is invited to the fact that the only realistic procedure available in resettlement of highly sensitive individuals is emigration to Chile. This detachment has established effective liaison on a personal basis with [redacted] who has been most cooperative in assisting this organization. However, it must be emphasized that continuation of such resettlements cannot be guaranteed should [redacted] be transferred or replaced by his government.

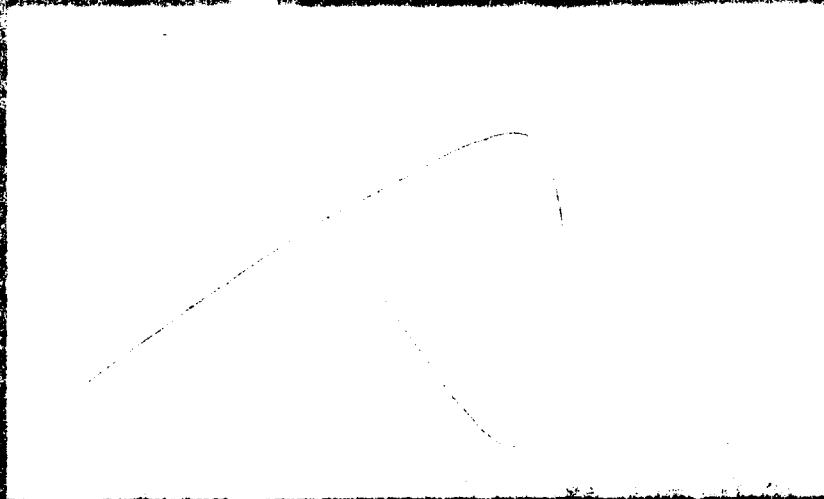
Records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) establish that Altmann came to the United States twice -- once in July 1969 and again in January 1970. On both visits, he took a day trip to the Bahamas (July 26, 1969 and January 21, 1970), each of which required a separate entry record when he returned to Miami later in the day. Thus, while there are four INS entry cards, there were essentially only two visits to this country:

1. On July 19, 1969 Altmann entered Miami from Panama, departing on July 26 for the Bahamas. He returned to Miami from Freeport that day, and departed the United States on July 27 for La Paz.
2. On January 21, 1970, Altmann entered Miami from La Paz, immediately transferred to a flight to Freeport, and returned to Miami the same day.

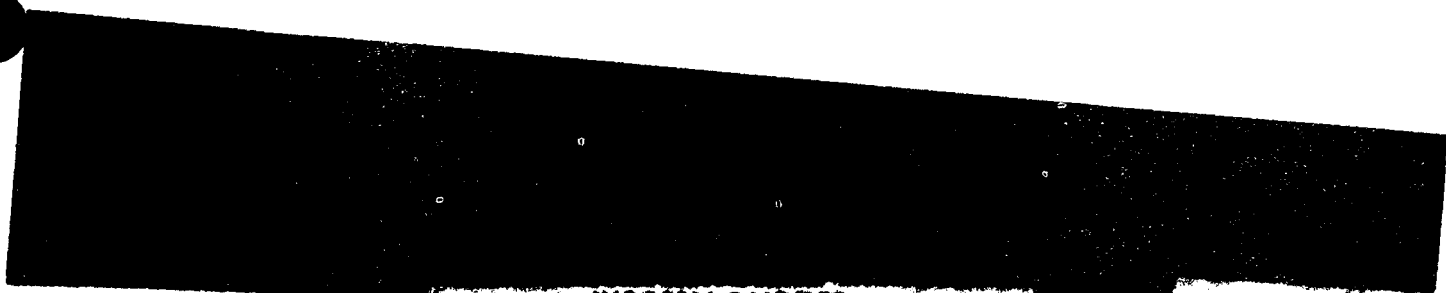

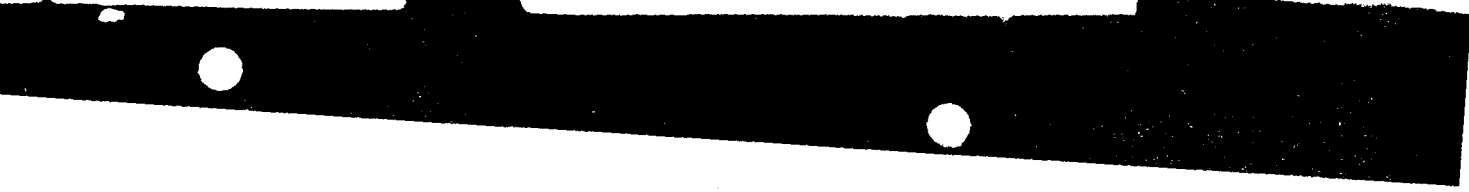

Dear Mr. Ryan:

I have received your letter of March 28 asking for information concerning visa lookout entries in the names of Klaus Barbie and/or Klaus Altmann.

The name Klaus Barbie was first entered into the Visa Lookout System in November 1980. The source for the entry was listing of that name in the volumes of lists of SS officers furnished by your office. There is no entry in the system in the name of Klaus Altmann.

Names of aliens included in earlier editions of Visa Lookout books were incorporated into the Automated Visa Lookout System. Those names remain in the system until removed because the ground of ineligibility is overcome or until the alien is deceased.

In addition I have had the Lookout System checked for the names of all the known aliases Barbie used, according to your memo of February 23, 1983. There are several entries in the name of Becker. Most came from the lists of SS officers you provided; none was made as early as 1969 or 1970.
