Conceptions of Divine Love was written in 1577. St. Teresa wrote this with the idea of explaining why certain words were found in the Book of Canticles. When her confessor read the title of her work, he ordered her to immediately burn it, which, of course, she did. But one of her nuns had copied the first seven chapters, which was then published in 1612. Father John Dalton translated only four of those chapters in 1852. (Summary by Ann Boulais)
