e. STATION IDENTIFICATION - Stations are identified by letternumber-letter call signs obtained from the unit CEOI. The letters and numbers are spoken phonetically.

f. TIME - The originators' time of any message (DTG) is always spoken phonetically.

 b. The reply is similarly transmitted, preceded by the proword I AUTHENTICATE. It may be followed by a counter challenge.
