Mindy-Is She Too Good To Be TRUE?





She's Mindy of Mork & Mindy, the lovely costar of crazy, zany Robin Williams. As he describes her, "Pam is much more than a 'straight lady' for my antics. She adds warmth." But if she keeps Robin's madness earth-bound, what keeps Pam Dawber so selfassured?

"Well, actually, I wasn't too very self-confident a while ago. It was Warren Beatty who convinced me to continue acting," Pam recalls.

Before that fateful meeting with the super handsome star of Heaven Can Wait, Pam was a talented but floundering amateur. Born to a father, who is a commercial artist, and a mother, who runs a photography agency. Pam knew there was talent in her blood. But in what direction should she go? This was her mystery.

Growing up in suburban Detroit. (Robin grew up there, too, but they never met), Pam possessed a four-

octave voice, a need to entertain. but very little confidence in her own worth. She attended a local junior college to study vocal music and art, but it was a friend who suggested she try her talents professionally.

Still a bit frightened by the success of the show, Pam says, "I was afraid of being boring as Mindy, but with Robin, I'm beginning to feel looser."


Swept away by all her recent success, Pam keeps


Birds of feather flock together is the expression—and it's certainly true in the case of Robin and his pet double yellow-headed Mexican parrot, Cora.

Valerie also encourages Robin to do his daily jog, four miles a day, and joins him at yoga.

Val Joins Robin when he performs live, and she admits, after a live show, she practically has to drag him home because he loves watching other entertainers.

Beside the live comedy clubs, Robin finds plenty of comedy material right at home. He has a pet parrot, who talks, Cora; two iguanas, Mr. E. and Truman Capote (named because "he has no neck!"), and the couple has another lizard, too!

MORK SHARES OUT-OF-THIS-WORLD RECIPES FROM ORK!

Just for fun, we've put together some Mork influenced recipes you might like to try in your kitchen. Watch out for flying gleems and bad cases of laserbreath!



4 eggs \star 1 pkg. hollandaise sauce mix \star $^{3/4}$ cup milk \star 2 GLEEMS BENEDICT English muffins, split and toasted * 2 Tbs. butter or margarine * 4 slices cooked ham or Canadian bacon

Fill a large frying pan with at least $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches of water. Add 1/4 tsp. salt. Bring to a boil. Break eggs one at a time into a saucer and slip into simmering water. Cover. Reduce heat and cook 3 to 5 minutes to desired doneness. In a small saucepan combine sauce mix and milk. Cook as directed on the sauce mix package. Butter English muffins and arrange on a serving plate. Place a slice of ham or Canadian bacon on each muffin; top with poached eggs. Cover with hollandaise sauce. Serve immediately. 4 servings

LASERBREATH DIP (& Laser Beams)

1 pkg. onion dip mix * 1 cup of sour cream or cream cheese.

Place dip mix into a small bowl, add sour cream or cheese and mix well. Cut celery and carrot sticks to use as dippers. These are your laser beams. Eat dip until your mouth tastes very oniony. Now you have laserbreath!

1 pkg (8 oz) cream cheese softened * 1/3 cup chopped GREEN CHEESE MOON stuffed green olives * ¼ cup chopped black olives * 1 Tbs. instant minced onion * 1/4 tsp. Tabasco sauce * 1 cup of chopped parsley * 3-4 drops of green food coloring

In a medium mixing bowl, combine softened cream cheese with 3-4 drops of green food coloring. Add both types of olives, onions and Tabasco sauce.

Mix thoroughly. Set cheese mixture in refrigerator for 15 minutes to harden slightly for easier handling. Take out and shape mixture into a ball (moon). Roll in the chopped parsley to coat evenly. Return to refrigerator and chill 15 to 20 minutes or longer. Serve with assorted crackers and chips while you watch Mork & Mindy on TV. Makes 1 Moon

VENUS & MARS MEATBALLS

1 lb. ground beef \star ½ cup dry bread crumbs \star 1/3 cup cooking wine * 1 Tbs. minced onion * 1 Tbs. chopped parsley * ½ tsp. salt * dash pepper * 1 egg * 3 Tbs. oil or shortening * 1 package brown gravy mix * 1 1/3 cups

In large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients except oil, gravy mix and water. Mix thoroughly. Form into 1 inch balls. Brown in hot oil in large frying pan. Drain excess fat. Reduce heat. Combine gravy mix with water; add to meat balls. Stir gently occasionally for 10 to 15 minutes until meat is done. Serve with gravy.

4 servings

NANO NANO NUGGETS

1 roll of slice 'n' bake sugar cookies * 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine * 2 cups chopped pecans * Red and green M&M's

Preheat oven to 375°. Slice cookie dough ¾ inch thick and cut each slice into four quarters. Roll each into a ball. Dip in butter, roll in nuts. Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375° for 6 minutes, then take out. Place one or two M&M's in center of each cookie. Return to oven for 6 more minutes or until golden brown. Cool.

Makes 48 nuggets

MORK'S GLEEMNOG PUDDING

1 package instant vanilla pudding * 1½ cups milk * ¼ cup eggnog flavored beads * 1 cup frozen whipped topping thawed

Prepare vanilla pudding as directed on package, decreasing milk to 11/2 cups and adding eggnog mix. When mixture thickens, fold in whipped topping. Pour into individual serving dishes. If desired garnish with a sprinkle of ground nutmeg. Chill 15 minutes until serving time. 4 servings

FLYING SAUCERS

6 tomatoes halved * ½ cup bread crumbs * 2 Tbs. Parmesan cheese * 1/2 tsp. salt * 1/8 tsp. pepper * 2 Tbs. margarine

Preheat oven to 400°. In small bowl combine bread crumbs, cheese, salt, pepper. Mix well. Sprinkle several Ths. crumb mixture over each tomato half. Dot each half with 1 tsp. butter. Place on cookie sheet. Bake uncovered at 400° for 15 to 20 minutes. Serve hot.
