Machine sell off likely as profits plummet

AMSTRAD FACES CASH CRISIS

Amstrad is in disarray after its latest figures show plunging profits, mush-rooming overheads, a cash deficit – and huge stocks of unsold machines.

Computers worth £200 million are sitting in warehouses, most of them PC2000s – the high-end range whose sales still haven't taken off for the company. This is more than twice what Amstrad sold this year. If Amstrad is going to shift them margins must suffer – which means cheaper top-end PCs in the shops.


After problems with one of its main High Street retailers, Dixons, which took the Olivetti PC much to Amstrad's annoyance last year, Amstrad may be forced to go cap in hand to ask retailers to shift stock at cut prices.

But Amstrad's Nick Hewer dismissed the possibility of giveaway PC2000s. He told Express, "People may try to beat us down on margins, but we shall try our best to sell the equipment at normal margins in the normal and orderly way. It's not a fire sale. There'll be no surprises."

SLUMP

The slump in Amstrad's fortunes is shown dramatically by its share price, down to 47p from its high of 208p last year. Relative to the FT All-share index, it has plummeted from 900 to 200. The present undervaluing of the company, which puts its total market value at £267m with its assets at £311m, means that the company could be bought for less than it is worth, and Sugar is threatening to buy all the shares himself, in effect buying back the company, which was floated in 1980.

Sugar, clearly frustrated by the low share price despite the company's still considerable profits this year, said "I see no necessity for remaining in the firing line if we are not being thanked for it by

any form of rating", and threatened to repurchase the stock. But to do this, Sugar needs cash, and the cash to buy the company back must come from sales – which would mean severe margin cutting to shift the stockpile of PCs.

But the reluctance of investors to put their money in Amstrad is easy to see. The profits halved last year and are likely to halve again; the company's cash position has turned from positive to £100m of borrowing; and perhaps most importantly the company's main market, the UK, has seen the consumer spending.

Sugar has dramatic proposals to make

the company more profitable again. First is the closure of Amstrad's audio division – the original business which started Alan Sugar off in the 1970s. Second would be a radical re-organisation of management.

The company's results to 30th June this year showed a profit of £76m on a turnover of £626m. But last year the same turnover produced a profit of £160m – and of the £77m it made this year, £75 was made in the first six months. In other words, profits this half were £2 million, on sales of £277m.

Alan Sugar's statement noted that expenses had increased "substantially as overseas sales and marketing activities have expanded, sometimes in advance of sales" – a reference to some of the advertising campaigns that produced few sales as the PC2000s had been delayed and were not available.

Pundits believe that things will worse for Amstrad before they get better.

• During the Stock Market ups and down on last Monday Alan Sugar was £17 million down by lunchtime. After the upturn later in the day his fortune had recovered to a more manageable £2 million loss.

PAYING THE PRICE

This has been a year of headaches for Amstrad's accountants:

- Amstrad paid £44m for a stake in US semiconductor manufacturer Micron in an effort to safeguard DRAM supplies. The stake is now worth two-thirds of its original value – a notional loss to Amstrad of nearly £15m if it decided to sell
- The company lost £15m through unavoidable write-offs and bad debts

- Advertising on PC2000s –
 which were not yet then
 available wasted £10m
- The PC2000 range was
 Amstrad's push into the

 market. Problems with the

• The PC200 was Amstrad's attempt last Christmas to sell a downmarket PC clone. The machine bombed, partly due to being hopelessly under-specified for the price, but it wasn't helped by a distribution fiasco which led to it being on sale without monitors, manuals or software. It's anyone's guess as to how much this has cost the company

THE EXPRESS PROGNOSIS

What you can expect for Amstrad's range of machines this Christmas

PC2000s: Price-cutting, but most probably disguised in the form of bundles, on the way PC200: Disappeared since last Christmas's disastrous launch. Possibly coming out before long as an 'MS-DOS PCW', a cheap word processing bundle with printer and software.

PC1512/1640: These low end PCs look due for a phase-out; watch for special deals CPC: Selling well. Still a good machine. Expect no special deals or price cuts. PCW: Still selling very well – recent ad campaign by Amstrad should add significantly to sales. Expect no price cuts or special deals.

Sugar denies Amstrad sale

Following Amstrad's poor performance and its current low standing in the City, the company's boss and founder Alan Sugar was earlier this week forced to deny the all but unimaginable - a sell off of some of his firm.

Various reports at the weekend suggested that Sugar is looking for a partner to help pull the company through a particularly sticky patch. Analysts were all looking toward electronics giant GEC which has enjoyed a good relationship with Amstrad in the past.

However, Sugar said that City watchers had got it all wrong. "We have absolutely no plans to link up with anybody we're determined to go it alone," he said. He claimed that analysts had misunderstood him during a meeting earlier last week. At the time Sugar had said he would be subcontracting some of his manufacturing to GEC.

"Analysts obviously put their fabrication hats on immediately after my meeting with them last Tuesday. They've dreamed up the whole thing themselves," commented Sugar.

"Of course if IBM offered us £5 a share we'd have to consider it. But the likelihood of that is rather slim." On Monday Amstrad shares stood at 48p.

See you soon

British Telecom has unveiled a videophone that they hope will be in action by the late 1990s.

The Viewphone can transmit a moving colour picture of the callers from a fixedfocus video camera attached to the phone unit to the other caller's four-inch LCD screen. Both callers must be in a 'reasonably lit' area and be sitting the right distance from the camera.

BT hopes that 85% of the population will be using videophones by the year 2000.

As reported recently in Express, some areas of France around Nice already have videophones.

Texas Instruments has spent the last 11 years developing a chip that features in the world's first talking advertisement.

Readers of the current edition of American journal Business Week turn over a page to find the tiny device embedded in a credit card sized plastic

casing. As they do so, the chip begins to speak about itself, unbelievably in a Bugs Bunny accent, and discusses its promise for use in creative advertising.

Unless the page is turned again, the chip will repeat this a further 650 times before its batteries run out.

With its built in speaker, the device costs only £2.50 to produce and is expected to have a big future in advertising posters, greetings cards, leaflets, business cards and record sleeves.

Perhaps its most far reaching implication could be in applications for the blind.

New Tetris launched

US software house Spectrum Holobyte has announced Welltris - the second game from Soviet author Alexey Pajitnov, creator of the award winning Tetris.

Like its predecessor, Welltris challenges the player to manipulate falling shapes, consisting of various configurations of squares into solid rows. This time though the pieces fall randomly, one at a time, into a four sided well with grid-like walls and bottom. There are three levels of difficulty, set by the number of squares in a piece - the most challenging has five squared objects and the top falling rate of five.

Pajitnov is a highly respected mathematician in the USSR but the success of Tetris has little to do with complex maths. The simplicity of the game caught most magazines reviewers on the hop.

Coming in CGA, EGA or Hercules resolutions on the PC, versions for the Mac and Amiga are also on the cards. Spectrum Holobyte games are distributed here by Mirrorsoft on 01 928 1454.

Across the PC Spectrum

Spectrum owners wishing to upgrade to a larger system but wishing to keep hold of their software collection have now had their wishes fulfilled. A Spectrum Emulator for the PC is now under development, allowing most software to be run. The emulator will even come supplied with its own tape leads. Citizen's tiny

Yet another pocket PC is to be launched, this time by Citizen.

The machine is being shown to trade customers around Europe and should be generally available early next year. Citizen is hoping to sell the machine at around £699 although the company could sell the tiny PC off to another manufacturer.

The Pocket PC weighs just under a pound and is fully IBM compatible. It is understood that a special version of spreadsheet Lotus 1-2-3 will be sold with it. It will run smart cards in much the same way as Atari's impressive Portfolio. Curiously, a light pen is also being planned for the machine.

Citizen's offering measures six inches by four inches by three inches making it slightly smaller than the Portfolio. That firm joins Poget, Zenith, Psion, Compaq and Atari into the pocket PC fray.





DOWN TIME FOR AMSTRAD

To the ordinary Amstrad owner in the street it looks as though journalists are out to get the company. How can we be so disparaging, people ask us, about a concern that has made £77 million this year? A company which employs hundreds of people and brings in taxes for the country?... etc etc.

First, the profits. Amstrad's figures for the last few years have been so ridiculously large that any downturn is a sign that something is wrong. Profits have halved in the last year and look set to more than halve next time: the £77 million profit for this year conceals a profit of £75 million in the first six months and just £2 million in the last – it doesn't take an accountant to see that something has been going wrong recently. So much for the profits.

Second, the management problems. Amstrad has grown too fast, opening up ten overseas subsidiaries in 18 months. The price of that growth is being paid now: 150 jobs gone in the audio division in Southend. So much for employment.

Third, the unsold stocks. Sitting on shelves somewhere, whether in warehouses or in cargo holds, is something like a year's sales of computers. And computers have a finite shelf life, just like strawberries or fashion clothes. Add this to Amstrad's cash deficit, snatched from the jaws of a huge cash surplus last year, and it spells very little to keep the Inland Revenue happy this financial year. So much for the taxes.

When Amstrad was on its way up in the mid 1980s, there were murmurings in the industry that their heavy-handed, occasionally bully-boy approach to business would lead them into grief one day. 'You've got to be nice to people on the way up,' one said, 'because one day you'll be on your way down. And you're going to need people to turn to.'

Is Amstrad finally on the way down? We very much hope not, because Amstrad's potential to create new markets and cash in on them is good for everyone. But if times are hard over the next couple of years for the company, and if it gets an unsympathetic reception from the rest of the industry, it only has itself to blame.

Neural network research brings micro of the future closer

CHIP TECHNOLOGY BREAKTHROUGH

A new 'artificial brain cell' based on a standard unmodified silicon chip has been designed by Britain's first Professor of Neural Networks.

Professor Igor Aleksander of Imperial College has developed a new type of neuron, called a 'G-ram', or 'generalising random access memory'. This makes standard silicon chips act like neural networks, in contrast to the approach taken by other researchers which require specially modified chips.

The G-ram is almost an ideal neuron, more powerful than other net chips. Pro-

fessor Aleksander believes that the new intelligent learning chip will make its way into home computers within a few years.

Neural networks are the silicon equivalent of linked brain cells, which can 'learn' by experience without having to be programmed or given explicit rules.

For example, a neural network for number recognition is given a few dozen examples of numbers and it works out by association for itself what defines the shape of a 3 or a 5 and so on. From then on it can recognise numbers by their shapes according to what it has learnt.

The more examples it encounters, the better it learns, in a similar way to a human brain.

Existing systems are very simple but there are already PC-based programs which can recognise and verify passport pictures, fingerprints and signatures with 98% accuracy. Speech recognition and artificial vision are potential areas where neural networks can be of great value.

Professor Aleksander was responsible for the first computer capable of recognising patterns, a neural network computer called Wisard, in 1981.

Compaq enters laptop fray

Compaq has entered the rapidly growing notebook computer market with two new 6lb laptops.

The 8086 based LTE 1 Model 1 and 286 based Model 20, priced at £1495 and £1995, both feature 640K RAM and a 640 x 200 backlit LCD screen. Incredibly, optional hard disks for both machines weigh only one pound. The company has predicted that 1990 will see laptops accounting for one in eight computer sales - a figure borne out by a recent survey by Romtec, a market research firm, which reveals that laptop sales are up 70% for the first six months of this year.

Sprouting problems

The Belgian Stock Exchange computer had clearly had enough of the recent market fluctuations last week. It crashed in the middle of a busy day, bringing all trading to a halt. An embarrassed Belgian broker said: 'International dealers have been ringing up and asking what happened to our Mickey Mouse computer system.'

Just a northern show

Sinclair QL fans should note that the third Northern Home Computer Show will be held on 2nd December at the Stokes Hall, Leyland, Lancashire. The organiser, Sector Software, is hoping to attract 30 exhibitors. Sector is on 0772 454328.■



The 27th Annual Amusement Machine Show, held in Tokyo earlier this month, featured over 350 new video games machines, 95% of them Japanese in origin. But in the absence of any significantly new processor technology, the product on show may as well have represented the state of the art a year ago since street fighting, space shoot-'em-ups and driving sims are still the predominant game themes. In the driving stakes, Namco's Eunos Roadster, based on Winning Run, Four Trax and Suzuka GP caused a stir, as did Jaleco's Big Run, but the stars were Stun Runner from Atari - a fast action bike sim - and Taito's driving shoot-'em-up Special Criminal Investigation. Old favourites drawing new crowds were Irem's upgrade of R-Type II and Capcom's Street Fighter '89 - both featuring enhanced speed and graphics.

Students get cheap loans for Tandy PCs

Tandy Computers has struck a deal with the National Union of Students to supply PCs, laptops and portables at special prices to students

Any NUS member is now able to borrow any amount from £350 to £1000 via Midland Bank to purchase a Tandy over a three year period for a fixed sum each term at a rate only 1% over base bank rate. As such a £500 loan would cost £16 per term.

The Tandy machines jhave been added to the list of approved machines for NUS loans. Others include Commodore Amigas and Amstrad PCs. More details from your local Students' Union.

Top quality output from Calamus

ST specialist Signa has announced a Linotype bureau service for its *Calamus* desk top publishing package.

The service enables ST users to send a Calamus document on disk to the bureau to be printed at a resolution of 2541 dots per inch - this trounces the standard 300 d.p.i. offered by Atari's laser printer. Images can also be processed to the same resolution and turn around is one day - although when the company introduce a facility to send material by modem this should be even quicker. Prices start at £7.50 for a typical A4 page. Signa is on 0252 341600.

Just the ticket

British Rail is testing out a new computerbased reservation and ticket issuing system in a bid to cut down queueing time.

InterCity reckons that passengers will currently tolerate queueing for three minutes, will get angry after five minutes, and will leave if they're still waiting after ten. Now Reading and Carlisle are the first stations to have a special system that answers timetable and routing enquiries, makes reservations and issues tickets all in one operation in seconds, via Opus PCIII terminals.

British Rail aims to have the system implemented everywhere by 1993, in time for the opening of the Channel Tunnel

 Meanwhile BR Has commissioned a research team to start work on an artificial vision system to be used on level crossings. The system will decide whether or not it is safe to lower the barriers when a train is coming.

£1 billion lost through fraud

Accountancy firm Coopers & Lybrand has estimated that companies this year will lose over £1 billion through computer data loss.

While half of this will be accounted for by accidental damage such as fire and flood, this still means £500 million going astray through deliberate acts. About 20 per cent of major companies, according to a recent police report, think that the most prevalent type of fraud is computer-based. Most fraud is not done by 'hackers' but by insiders, police believe.

How I lost £2 billion

A computer error led to a major British bank losing £2 billion in 30 minutes, it has been claimed.

The incident, which happened 'in the last few weeks' according to Computer Weekly, cost the bank more than its annual profits. It happened when a software error on a super-fast funds transfer computer caused the money to flood into accounts of companies across Europe.

It is not known how much of the money has been recovered, or which bank suffered the loss.


PROGRAMMERS AREN'T BORING

An academic study just published after five years research reveals that computer fanatics aren't just a bunch of boring terminal junkies talking in hex and obsessed with hardware.

Psychologist, Dr. Margaret Shotton's 330 page doctoral research project claims just the opposite - computer dependency is in fact therapeutic by providing an outlet for high levels of intelligence, curiosity and originality.

Although the report does note that some users do regard computers as the ultimate hobby, providing a controllable form of interaction which they are unable to find elsewhere, it concludes that most interviewees had increased their social circles, gained in confidence and improved their job prospects.

However, sociologists among you may not find the results so convincing. The research was based on a sample of only 106 recipients to advertisements placed in newspapers and magazines between 1984 and 85. One could argue that real dependents would be too obsessed to even notice the adverts let alone reply to them.

Japanese get their genes on

Japanese scientists working on artificial intelligence are to harness their 'thinking' computers for mapping human genes.

The fifth generation computers they are building will be able to converse, process visual images and reason like human brains. The
Japanese team, led by
Kazuhiro Fuchi in Tokyo,
believe that unravelling the
mysteries of human genes –
the chemical 'code' that
determines each individual's
physical characteristics such
as hair colour, intelligence,

 susceptibility to certain diseases and so on – is an ideal application for their creations.

This could lead to a better understanding, and perhaps prevention or even cure, of many diseases and disorders.

Computers open up options

WORKING AT HOME TAKES OFF

Between them, British Telecom and The Henley Centre for Forecasting estimate the UK has several million people working on computers from home rather than in their company's offices. And the number is increasing rapidly.

With office space becoming more and more scarce and expensive, employers are looking at other ways of cutting costs while maintaining productivity. Teleworking is seen to be a viable solution with a wide variety of employees either hooked directly into office computers or sending material in by E-mail.

At a recent conference organised by ACRE, a rural development charity based in Cirencester, the explosion in teleworking was held up as a possible saviour of the flagging fortunes of rural economies. For with EEC grants as subsidy, five 'telecottages' are soon to be set up as pilot schemes in Staffordshire, Derbyshire,

Wales and the western highlands of Scotland.

A telecottage is a community facility where high-tech gear will be made cheaply available for activities such as word processing, desktop publishing and bookkeeping. Each centre will cost around £10,000 to set up and will provide upto four PCs with hard disks, laser printers, fax and E-Mail facilities.

Distance working is becoming increasingly common in journalism and the publishing industry, where the common availability of modem links into national newspapers and other publications provides the incentive.

This trend in distance working follows the experience of Scandinavia where the 50 telecottages already set up and running have provided an essential service in remote areas as well as well-paid employment for those participating in the schemes.

Who ya gonna call?

Sega owners are to get their hands on the biggest selling computer game of all time – Ghostbusters.

Activision's four stage classic has notched up sales of more than two million on home computer formats and is set to score a hit with the Sega console. It costs £27.95 from Virgin/Mastertronic.

The firm has also launched American Baseball and Alex Kidd's High Tech World at £24.95.



EXHIBITION REVIEW

righton's Metropole Hotel is the annual venue for an expo on all things interactive. This year, 60 exhibitors showed their wares - everything from touch screen technology to voice-driven video recorders being perused by over 2000 visitors. All of the 30 main product launches were PC based, all were exclusively geared towards the corporate user. But beneath the business veneer lies a fascinating insight into tomorrow's technology for today's computers.

Although one could easily argue that all personal computers are interactive systems - all elements of their use entirely depend on a two-way communications interface - it's rather labouring a point. The key difference between the box and monitor at home and the Metropole machinery is the inclusion of multi-media mass storage devices. Stand after stand is full of Sony KXCP1 monitors with touch screen membranes that allow 'point and perform' operations on a bewildering variety of laserdisc and CD Video players. Moving video, CD quality audio, 24-bit colour graphics and text can all reside on a single source disk - interleaved across a half a gigabyte of storage space, each independently accessible.

But it's not just down to larger storage space and multi-format sources - Interactive is about multiple choice decisions. You navigate a series of pathways laid down in code which guide you through the subject at hand. I.T. for two is what it's all about - looking, listening and responding to integrated systems which allow you to obtain information, advice and entertainment in your own time, at your own pace. What's more the software required to author these productions seems to be as easy to develop as the resulting screens are to navigate. It's all very much a question of just pointing and clicking - from writing the software to using the system. When integrated interactive home systems finally become par for the course next decade, we'll all conclude that computing was finally a product of WIMPS.







The EEC-sponsored Esprit project was initially set up in February with a £2.6m budget to develop the next generation of CD ROM authoring workstations. he IBM PC was never really designed as a games computer. Especially lacking are quality sound effects, unlike its 16-bit counterparts the Atari ST and Commodore Amiga, and with software and limited add on packages costing almost twice as much, it has been a hard up hill struggle for the PC in the already overcrowded games machine market. But now American company Innovations

SOUND SYSTEMS

has produced a range of add ons at competitive prices to help overcome this, one of these being the SSI-2001 sound board.

One of the problems in the past with add ons for the PC has been trying to get the agreement of software houses to develop software that can run with the package. It appears that this is a problem that the Innovation SSI-2001 has overcome when you look at the vast range of household-name software companies that support this board – for example Microprose with its F-19 Stealth Fighter, Red Storm Rising and the recently launched M1 Tank, Activision's Enchanted Lands and Time Rift and many other software companies like Microdeal, Software Toolworks, Mindscape and Electronic Arts.

The sound produced is equal to that of the Atari and Amiga as it utilises the Commodore 6582 SID integrated circuit. This well-established chip enables the generation of three simultaneous voices of music or sound effects, giving a vast scope for real-life sound from music tospeech synthesis.

The SSI-2001 is a half size card that is easily fitted into any PC expansion slot. One of the nice things about the board is that it also holds a game port controller capable of supporting two joysticks (with a Y cable) The game port also has three adjustable levels of sensitivity.

If you are looking to add sound to your PC at an economical price then this could be the board for you. However the WYSIWYG principle does apply in this instance – for your £75 you get a get mono board with no software and limited instructions. It is worth noting that you do need an external amp and speakers to get any benefit from this rather effective board, unlike its more costly rivals. But with it it is possible for the computer literate to produce voice and music and with the aid of another identical card stereo is possible.

QUARTET Atari ST • £49.95 Microdeal • 0726 68020

ust about anyone with half a brain has released a sampler by now but when you've heard your ST playing Bing Crosby once, you've heard it all. There's certainly no way you could turn a sample of good ole' Bing into a Bon Jovi hit - you need a composing tool to do that and *Quartet*'s the job.

You can compose music using sampled instruments but what's really impressive is the way you can have four channels playing simultaneously. When you load *Quartet* you're given a main screen, consisting of an empty stave and a handful of icons. Using these you select which voice should be displayed at any one time. Alongside the voice icons are a series of notes from a hemidemi-semi-quaver to a dotted semibreve. By selecting one of these notes and clicking on the stave, the note will be placed in the score - the left mouse button replaces an existing note (for editing) while the right mouse button inserts a note.

At various points in the stave you can switch instruments so you could, for example, create a backing drum track and work the other three voices over the top of this. There are 11 instruments provided with *Quartet*, although you can import additional sampled instruments so there's no reason why you can't have more than this number. If you really want to make the most of

SEQUENCE OF DELIGHTS

Sampling sounds is nothing new but what can you do with them? Mark Higham finds out how Quartet lets you compose four-track ditties using sampled instruments.

Quartet then you can even set it to record MIDI input from a keyboard. The notes will be recorded as you play and you can choose which instruments are to be used in the playback.


When it comes to editing the tracks, you can select to play either one voice at a time - in which case the currently selected voice will be used, or you can play all four voices at once and listen to the complete track. By pressing [F2] during playback you can direct all output to a Replay cartridge if you have one. With an extra program

provided on the *Quartet* disk, you can even include sequences into your own programs.

What's particularly exciting about *Quartet* is that you don't need any musical knowledge to have fun with it. However, if you want to use it seriously then it is capable of the same kind of results as an Amiga. It's not ridiculously complex to use but it is capable of some brilliant results which make it a must for music enthusiasts. As yet, there's no other package available on the ST to touch it.

DISAPPOINTMENTS IN PROGRAMMING

As a graphic artist working freelance within the software industry, I am writing to offer some advice to those young people who may be considering starting a career in this field: don't!

Every year scores of young programmers, artist and musicians approach development houses and publishers, drawn by the chance to see 'their name in lights', their product on the shelves, their pictures in the magazines. They're fed constant stories of the programmer as a 'folk-hero', and mythical tales of whizz-kids, driving Porsches, waving gold cards and equipped with infinite streetcred pokes. I have actually seen people waving gold cards and driving Porsches, but they weren't the programmers.

Showtime just reinforces these myths, the huge, flash, (and incredibly expensive) stands suggest that the industry's walls are papered with ten pound notes.

Every year scores of young programmers, artists and musicians are ripped off by development houses and publishers offering paltry sums tied to incredibly biased contracts (if you are lucky enough to get a contract at all). Don't think that it won't happen to you, it will, there is no question about it. Of course the companies doing it to these kids don't mind, because they know that there will be another crop of young talent along soon.

This brings me to my second point, namely that the industry seems to be built largely on exploitation. The attitude seems to prevail that freelancers and small developers are fair game. The sums paid out may seem a lot to a teenager working in his bedroom, but they don't pay a mortgage and they don't clothe children.

The amount of money put into advertising and the aforementioned shows suggests that there is money being made by the producers, but it isn't getting back to the people who make it all happen, the small independent software author at the bottom of the heap.

OK by now you're thinking that this guy is some failure who can't get any jobs because of his appalling work, and he's decided to vent his frustration by screaming at your letters page. Well you're wrong; I'm frustrated alright, but not for those reasons.

I've been working in the industry for getting on for three years, since when I have achieved a consistently high standard in my work producing a good product, on time. This is witnessed by the fact that during all that time I have only been without work for six weeks or so. Most of my work has had above average reviews.

However, at the moment I'm owed money by a lot of people who think the freelancer doesn't matter, having a contract doesn't mean the companies are going to pay up. Look what happened to Software Horizons. Of course you could take them to court (I have done in the past) but that takes time and sours relations with other sources of work if they hear about it. Surely nowhere else would anyone have to wait for anything up to six months to be paid after fulfilling a contract, or not get paid at all. No other industry treats its professional workforce with such contempt.

At the PC show there were probably only 30 or so programmers - the rest of the crowd were middle men making a good living on the backs of the people doing the real work. That situation seems to sum up what this whole business is about.

I'm not dumb enough to believe that writing letters is going to change this situation, but I hope that this will warn off at least some of the potential victims of the corporate sharks.

Sorry not to put name and address but I'm in the middle of projects and if the publishers found out I might be in the mood to stop trading, they would be difficult to get final payments out of and if I keep going, any future contracts might be difficult to get. A programmer

 You didn't mention any specifics in your letter, but if you'd like to get back to us with names and figures, we'd be interested in pursuing this further - all in strictest confidence, of course. Meanwhile, how about an employer's view on this?

MONEY MATTERS

RIGHT TO REPLY

I would just like to take this chance to reply to Peter Calver's letter concerning software piracy in Express 47.

A user group and its owner are two separate entities - similar to a limited company which is able to be sued as a 'person' in its own right.

Providing the owner of the user group does not allow the group to be involved in any of their less savoury practices (the previous example I gave was that of using the club to find new people to swop pirated software with) the two may be treated as being entirely separate.

In other words, if the Federation Against Software Theft, FAST, decided to pay the owner a visit, they would only be able to collar the owner - only in his capacity as a private individual - and not the club as it would be guilty of nothing.

He makes the analogy of a landlord allowing drug abuse in his pub because if he doesn't, the customers will go elsewhere.

This has absolutely nothing to do with the point in question, but I will use his analogy to clarify the situation further.

The landlord would be perfectly justified in not allowing drug abuse on his property, regardless of the financial loss he would make when customers left to use other pubs.

This comparison is not valid to the point however. I have already said that the club not be involved in any illegal or immoral activity.

What if the landlord closes the pub for a night, goes into town and attakcs an old lady? Would the police turn up, dig out the foundations of the pub and move it brick by brick to a nice cell for the night?

No. The owner, in his capacity as a private individual - not as a landlord would be in the cell.

Perhaps I did not make myself clear enough, or perhaps my point was just a little too subtle for Mr Calver to understand, but this is the crux of the situa-

Now let me make it absolutely clear: I never said that software piracy was right, nor do I say so now. I do say that it is easily justifiable by some people and that, unfortunately, it is a fact of life.

A user group that does not allow

piracy etc. will not stop pirates all. As I said previously, they will just go out and find another club or another method that allows them to do it.

That's not to say that clubs should allow such behaviour; after all, someone has to be responsible for setting moral standards somewhere.

My final observation is one that I think would help to stop the greater evil of corporate pirates - companies that have a single user licence but that make literally hundreds of copies.

Perhaps a system whereby the software company not only guarantees confidentiality but that also pays some sort of reward (perhaps even a percentage of damages won or enforced licence fees) would perhaps discourage company piracy more than an education campaign. P Bocij, Derby

PROGRAM?

A. Basically, a sequence of instruc-

tions, just like a recipe or piano roll. If you think of those old pianolas as the musical equivalent of a computer, the piano roll is the equivalent of a program. The effect is to play a tune, but the instructions themselves are just notches on paper. Similarly, the program itself just consists of a sequence of blips representing 1s and 0s.

Q. HOW DO YOU GET THE COMPUTER TO DO WHAT YOU WANT?

A. Suppose you want the computer to print 'Hello' on the screen. To the computer, the instruction that makes it do this might be a sequence of numbers – 45, 65, 23 and so on. This is machine code. Obviously this would be tedious to do all the time, so there have evolved various computer 'languages'. In one language, the command to print the word 'Hello' on screen might be PRINT "Hello", and in another, PRINTF ("Hello"/n). The language then takes care of the 'translation' into numbers for you.

Q. HOW DO YOU WRITE A PROGRAM?

A. By preparing a list of your commands as a normal text file in a word processor or text editor. A simple program to calculate VAT on an amount you type in might be in BASIC

10 INPUT amount

20 VAT=amount *0.15

30 PRINT "VAT on this is"; VAT

The line numbers are there to tell the computer in what order to take the instructions. In many languages there are no line numbers and the sequence is taken in the order it appears in the file.

After you've prepared your program like this, you run it through a compiler (if the language is an interpreted one) or compile it (if the language is a compiled one).

Q. WHAT ARE 'INTERPRETERS' AND 'COM-PILERS' THEN?

A. An interpreted language translates each command as it turns up. A compiler 'translates' the whole program into machine code and then runs it.

Q. WHY ARE THERE THE TWO SYSTEMS?

A. In an interpreted language, developing a program – ie, writing and testing it bit by bit until it does what it's supposed to – is easier. You can stop the program in mid-stream and type in an extra line or adjust the next one just before it is executed, then carry on, because the interpreter works one instruction at a time. With a compiled language, every little adjustment requires you to re-compile the program before you can run it and see what effect it has. This can be really tedious. On the other hand, compiled programs run a lot faster, so it's better from the user's point of view if commercial software is written in a compiled language.

Q. WHAT'S ASSEMBLY LANGUAGE?

A. If you like, assembler, or assembly language, is halfway between machine code and a normal language. Printing just a single character in assembler might look like this:

wrtchar move d0,-(sp)
move #con,-(sp)
move #conout,-(sp)
trap #bios
addq.1 #6,sp
rts

Only really clever people use assembler. The advantage over a normal language is that it can be a lot faster, and you have more control over just what each individual bit of the computer is doing, so some commercial programs (graphics routines and games, for example) are better written in assembler. There's no need for the beginner to worry about it at all.

Q. WHAT SORTS OF LANGUAGES ARE THERE?

A. The most popular is the interpreted BASIC, or 'Beginners All-purpose Symbolic Instruction Code'. Though designed as a beginners' lan-

BEGINNERS PROGRAMMING

Writing your own programs is easier than you think, even if you're a total beginner. Michael Allerby answers your



guage, it's evolved so much that it's a perfectly legitimate language now.

Other popular languages are C (a compiler used to write many commercial packages) Pascal (another compiler) and Logo (an interpreter originally written to teach children programming).

Q. HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

A. There will probably be a free version of BASIC with your micro, so it's probably the best one to start on. Languages cost anything from £20 to £100. You'll have to get a manual as well; there isn't space here to list any but your local bookshop will be full of them. A good BASIC manual would only cost you a tenner or so.

Q. WHAT CAN YOU WRITE WITH THEM?

A. Anything that can be done on a micro. Games, accounts routines to run your business, purpose built databases to store and manipulate information about your customers or club members, educational programs — anything, and it doesn't really matter which language you choose.

Q. CAN YOU SELL PROGRAMS YOU'VE WRITTEN?


A. Yes, and many people do, though you might have problems if you used an interpreter such as

BASIC to write it. To run the program, users will need the same version of BASIC. You can't give them a copy or you'd be breaking the licensing agreement, of course. You're best sticking to versions that come free with the machine. With compiled languages there's no problem; you just sell the compiled .COM or .EXE file or whatever and users run that as per any other program.

You can either sell them yourself, through mailorder perhaps, or send them to a software publisher who would market them for you. Probably your best chance of making any money out of a program you've written is if it fits some special professional niche – a utility for accountants that you know doesn't currently exist, perhaps, or that special train spotting program you wrote because you couldn't find what you wanted commercially.

Q. WHAT'S THE BEST MACHINE TO BUY IF YOU WANT TO PROGRAM?

A. Any really, but there are probably more languages available – especially the sort of languages that you'd use in a commercial programming environment such as COBOL, UNIX and so on – for the PC and perhaps ST than any other machine.

UNDERNEATH THE ARCHIES

Often maligned as the gap in Archimedes marketing, the Archie software industry continues to grow apace. Arch supporter Bertrum Carrot takes stock as the Archimedes comes of age...

the original launch of the Archimedes, there was a lot of excited talk about the machine's potential, and precious little in the way of applications written for it. Acorn had handed out development machines to a selected few, including Minerva, Clares and Computer Concepts, but in the main there were spectacular graphics demos and a few hastily ported packages.

This start was to an extent fuelled the press byline 'nice machine, shame there's no software for it'. Software has been slow to come, partly due to Acorn's concentration on the machine for educational use.

More importantly though programs written specifically for the Archie and its multitasking operating system RISCOS, are big, serious applications which need time to get right.

Acorn's 'jousting tournament' stand at last month's PC Show demonstrated admirably that things are at last changing. A wealth of new software was given it first showing and convinced plenty of die-hards there was actually life in the machine. A parallel can be drawn between the growth of the Archimedes market and that of the Amiga, which started life in much the same way and is only now, several years after its launch, being taken up as a mainstream home personal computer. As ever, a price cut from the boys at Cambridge could provide the extra kick needed to boost the Archie into the same position.


Tasks for multi-taskers

There are now over 550 commercial programs specifically written for the Archimedes. They cover a wide range of applications, with particular emphasis on education. There are also thousands of programs available for the BBC micro and IBM PC, the vast majority of which will run on the Archie. The PC emulator is needed to run PC applications, but the Beeb emulator is supplied with the machine.

Several areas of application are showing particular prominence in Archimedes software, most

reflecting the machine's strong hardware features. Graphics programs have featured well from early days, and recent releases include Atelier from Minerva and Artisan Professional and Artisan 2 from Clares. These products use the full colour range of the machine and include sophisticated effects like colour masking and graphics wrap. Clares also market the Render Bender raytracing package and there are several video accessories like genlocks which can be slotted into the back of the machine as podules.

New products on the sound front include the SoundSynth and Studio 24 Plus from Electromusic Research, as well as MIDI podules for control of other instruments. Armadillo Systems also produce a range of music products, including stereo

sampler cards and the modular *HighNote* music software.

Desktop publishing is another area that's flourishing. As well as Acorn's own DTP, there are new products from Computer Concepts (Impression), Clares (Tempest) and BEEBUG (BEEBUG DTP). Of these, Impression will probably be the most sophisticated, though its yet to be released in its final version. On a related theme, CAD packages are beginning to appear, with LinCAD Archimedes a major contender.

Acorn's set of scalable fonts and system-wide printer drivers mean that any properly written RISCOS program can produce high quality output on the majority of popular printers including dot-matrix and lasers.

ISN'T it strange how computers seem to attract a "following"? The early eighties put the "microcomputer" (as everyone called them in those days) in the bracket of those people that professed to be techno-boffins or science freaks. Even playing video games was considered scientific. Back then it was the BBC micro and suchlike that ruled, but soon came a little rubbery machine called the Spectrum. It had really nice things like cheap games to play and found a lot of friends in the public. Then came the good old Commodore 64, with its great graphics and sound, wowing the new trend of games players.

Straight away all the new computer fans started slagging off the "archaic" micros and said how amazing their games machines were. The scene remained the property of these two machines for a while, until a few years ago when news of a new breed of 16-bit machines appeared. The Amiga from Commodore promised extremely pretty pictures and even better sound, but was pipped to the post by the Atari ST machine.

The thing is, now that these two machines are around, the good old Spectrum and C64 are the targets for everyone's derision. So how long will it be before the St and Amiga fall foul of the 32-bit ideal, left to be made fun of in the corner? It's a thought...

On the subject of old machines, after the news story last week complaining of the minuscule amount of Beeb games available, what happens but a host of new releases descend upon my desk. First is Blast, a shoot-'em-up from ASL for the BBC B and Master machines, but most noticeable is a batch of games from Impact software, featuring E-Type - a 3D racing game, UIM - a sort of underwater Elite, White Magic a mystical arcade adventure, Holed Out - a golfing game and Arcade Soccer - speaks for itself really, doesn't it? All these should be available now, apart from the Archimedes version of UIM, which is due in December. Just goes to show that you can't kill off a machine that easily!



A new version of the ACC control program has been developed and must be activated by dropping it on enemy installations. This is where you come in. You must use all the tactical systems available to you on your carrier to infiltrate the enemy positions and revert them to their friendly state.


The tactical elements of Carrier Command are very well implemented, with clear and concise control and information screens. It's very easy to get into the swing of the game and start deploying drones and Manta flyers all over the shop. DRAGON SPIRIT

Dragon Spirit has been available on the PC Engine for a while now, but now - thanks to Domark the game is no longer limited to that small clique if video gamers. The game features a large blue dragon, flying over a vertically-scrolling prehistoric world, attacking all manner of foes with its fiery breath. Dotted about the scenery are blue and red eggs, which release special pods when bombed. These pods give additional power to the dragon, with additions such as extra heads whirling fire-flies or a huge stream of flame - very useful for those end of level nasties.

The presentation of Dragon Spirit is rather on the sparse side - the title sequence only appears when the game first loads, thereafter the game just carries on ad infinitum. The in-game appearance, on the other hand, is well done, with a clear info-panel and well animated sprites flying over nicely drawn landscapes. Again wimpy sound has let us down. What has happened to the days of the powerful soundtrack? Has everyone forgotten Starglider?

But what of the gameplay? Well it's a basic shoot-'em-up - and quite a playable shoot-'em-up at that, with the difficulty set at just about right - which makes a change! Having said that, I can't say I found myself drawn to the machine time after time to play Dragon Spirit, maybe because (in the words of that famous detective) it's good...but not that good!


First-person race games seem to be making a comeback these days. What with Hard Drivin' on the way and Powerdrome a big hit, the days of perspective speed are far from over.

Unfortunately, the C64 version of Stunt Car Racer falls rather short of the mark set by the two aforementioned games. The documentation gives the impression that there is a load of facets to the actual game, but when you look more closely, most of the text is padding - referring to motor sport in general rather than elements of the program.

What we actually have is a typical 3D zoom around a bumpy track with the odd jump for added "excitement". The only sensation I can sense while driving around is frustration when the horizon does a flip in the most unrealistic way imaginable and I find myself in a heap at the side of the track. Add to this a strange control system, uninspiring, three colour graphics and you're heading towards one of the most infuriating race games available.





Back in the mists of time, Sega released a vertically-scrolling coin-op, which placed you in the role of a special agent in a highly armed car. This game was called Spy Hunter and at the time it attracted quite a bit of attention.


Years later and Sega have come up with a game which is not entirely dissimilar to Spy Hunter. Action Fighter is a vertically-scrolling shoot-'em-up, with you in control of a motorbike - which later turns into a car and then a spy plane.

Actually, the game is more like a cross between Spy Hunter and the classic Xevious, with the first section comprising of a race along a busy road evading enemy agents, collecting bonuses and going into a truck for extra weapons.

The later section has you flying along, destroying airborne baddies and dropping bombs on ground targets.

Although the baddies on both sections are quite nasty and lives are lost at an alarming rate, this game proves quite compulsive. The scrolling is remarkably smooth and fast and the sprites are neat and colourful.

The main problems lie in the sound and



variety of gameplay stakes. Each level bears a striking resemblance to the one before, with a few more landscape features added. I would prefer more of a change. As for the sound, the effects consist of vague beeps and crunches - not the most realistic in the world.

For me, these problems question the viability of twenty five pound price tag, but if you like the classic arcade game then give it a whirl. It could be just your cup of dry leaves suffused in boiling water.

Written by Steve Bak, the game should be available at the beginning of November at a price of £19.99 on ST and Amiga. I wonder how it'll fair against the

StarBlaze is a filled 3D shoot-'emup, featuring "colourful backgrounds and scores of fiendish alien attack waves." Sounds thrilling! Bad Company should be available at the beginning of December, while Star-Blaze will appear slightly earlier in November.



Budget bonanza

Even though the marketing people keep assuring us that £25 is a very reasonable price for an Amiga game, most of us still can't afford to lash out every time another block buster is released. Thankfully, this is all set to change (no, we aren't all going to be given a loan!).

As you've probably seen in a recent issue of *Express*, Virgin Mastertronic has announced the arrival of its new budget label, 16 Blitz which will be selling a whole range of Amiga games for a mind blowingly low £4.95.

As well as the infectiously addictive *Infection* (reviewed three weeks ago in *Express*), Virgin have the following titles coming to an Amiga near you very soon –

Little Computer People – Re-release of the curious Activision game in which you adopt a 'computer person' as a pet. The original £25 price tag was a bit steep, but for £5 you can't got wrong.

Sorcery + – Now this really is the business. Fight to get your hands on this game if you have to – for £5 this is an absolute must! The game involves you travelling through a mystical land rescuing your sorcerer friends. RoadWars – Old Melbourne House game that was originally produced for the Arcadia super select systems. From what I say at the PC Show, the game has been enhanced and is also worth investing in.

Pub Pool – As the name seems to strangely suggest, this is a pool game which will be of interest to those of you who like pool (isn't logic wonderful!).

World Darts – Another Arcadia super select game that goes down particularly well at my local, the Mason's Arms (now the most famous pub in Britain!). Do I really need to tell you what this game is all about?

Kelly X – If my memory serves me well, I'm almost certain that this was the working title for what eventually became *Xenon*. Anyone know any different?

First there was A-Max

After years of build up, we have seen Amiga emulators for such mundane machines as the PC and Macintosh, but now the seemingly impossible has finally been achieved; the Amiga has got itself a Sinclair OL emulator.

Unlike other emulators, the most astound-

ing thing about this particular emulator is that it is PD (let's face it, who's going to actually pay good money for the thing!). Unfortunately, I haven't got any OL software (and I don't want any) and so I haven't been able to actually test the emulator, but from what I've seen, it looks pretty complete. The author claims the emulator will run the vast majority of QL software and it will even allow you to read QL disks directly (you could have a problem with Microdrives though!).

The emulator is available for £3 from UGA software in Holland who can be contacted on 010 03404 52987. I haven't got a clue as to whether there is a UK distributor for the UGA disks.

A friend indeed

After last weeks preview of Brown-Wagh's up and coming Amiga word processor *Pen Pal*, you'll be glad to hear that, after a week's solid use, the program more than lives up to expectations.

As reported last week, *Pen Pal* is another of the new breed of 'word publishing' packages that combine the editing power of a dedicated word processor, the data handling capabilities of a database with the kind of layout power only found in up market DTP systems. The program features one of the friendliest user environments I've seen for many moons, which more than evidently owes a great deal to the Macintosh. If you are considering treating yourself to a word processor, or even a simple DTP package for producing forms, notices etc, then Pen Pal is worth considering.

For the definitive review, check out the next issue of *Amiga Format* which will be on sale on the second Thursday of next month (I know, it's a long time to wait!). The UK distributors, DLL, can be contacted on 0983 405600.

NEWTEK-nology

NewTek, that Kansas-based producer of state of the art Amiga hardware and software, is soon to release a major upgrade to its ever popular digitiser system, *Digi-View*.

NewTek has been working through the night to finish the system in time for a November release (it was 4.30 in the morning, his time, when I spoke to Paul Montgomery, president of NewTek). Among many other enhancements, the most astounding feature is that Digi-View 4 will allow you to digitise 4,096 colour pictures in high resolution. Yes, you did read that last line correctly - 4,096 colours on screen at once in high resolution (640 by 512 pixels). According to Paul, this impressive feat is achieved by using the Copper to alter the colour registers after every scanline, therefore allowing upto 16 colours to be used per line. Unfortunately, pictures produced using this system will not be compatible with currently available paint packages, although existing screen modes are still supported.


For enhanced HAM pictures, NewTek has also developed a new HAM system that allows far sharper images than are possible with currently available digitiser systems.

Also due for release soon from the darker depths of NewTek (or 'Alcatraz' as it is known by the programmers that work there) is a 3D rendering package from that pioneer of Amiga 3D graphics, Alan Hastings, creator of the critically acclaimed *VideoScape 3D* animation system from Aegis.

Thoughts of Chairman Bob

You'll recall last week I was speaking to Atari UK's boss Bob Gleadow – OK, so he's not Chairman, but I've got to get a headline somehow! – about the prospect of an Atari show to be held in the first half of next year.

My next questions to Gleadow concerned the STE: is it merely a minor enhancement? When will it be available? "The ST is going be around a long time," Gleadow replied, "and like General Motors we've got to keep improving. I would like to hope that we'll get some of the 1040 product out – the STE 1040 – before Christmas.

"Logistically, Christmas for Atari is a nightmare, but if we can slot the STE deliveries, produce them and deliver them, we will. It's a very delicate time for us.

"The STE's been announced about four times. And if you read back in the press we've had a lot of criticism about our showing and not delivering. So yes, we do show our new products, we do get market reaction to them, and it's a question of policy: we don't believe that we prematurely show, but definitely if we showed a product and the world hated it, we'd kill it. So to us it's a very worthwhile marketing exercise.

"During the time that the STE, in its various names, has been shown, it has been further developed. So what we showed at Dusseldorf for the 1040, we believe we will deliver on. It's final, it's frozen, it's been sent to manufacturing level."

But will programmers take advantage of its capabilities, when the non-enhanced ST user-base must be their primary concern? "The ST as it is now must have a user base of around 200,000. That's a stand-alone viable market. If ten per cent of that base bought a game you'd have a 20,000 seller and the game companies would be ecstatic; five per cent, 10,000 seller and the game companies would still be ecstatic. So I'm not unduly concerned, because I believe that the STFM market is now large enough so that

"I also believe that because the STE is totally STFM compatible, the soft option today is left to exploit the new features. Some programmers will, some won't and there'll be a crossover. And as the STE base develops, you get more and more software exploiting its features."

people will keep writing for it.

Looking further into the future, I wondered whether the TT might be the kind of machine ST owners would be buying in three or five years time: "The TT allows a second or third time buyer an upgrade path," Gleadow replied. "It's a machine you can expand: you can change the size of the drive, you can increase the size of the memory, you can use the half-height expansion slots. So it's a flexible, open architecture machine.

"I believe the initial market for the TT will be in universities as a very fast workstation, a very fast terminal, as a text and graphics engine. There's a number of products which will run significantly faster on a TT and therefore make a much more attractive proposition for professional use. So the Calamuses, CAD packages: the TT gives them a performance benefit which makes them more than respectable. So we do see it moving into a professional market as a text and

graphics engine.

"So yes, we do see a number of ST users upgrading to it, because it will run their peripherals, it will run their software, and they'll be familiar with the look and feel of the machine when they're driving it."

In the US, incidentally, Atari's president has been talking up a good fight between the TT and Steve Jobs' NeXT system, saying that he expects it to "clobber them." We shall see.

Tales from the computing twilight zone, 1

It was just an ordinary day when Mike Gerrard – who incidentally writes for *ST Format...* £2.95... all good newsagents... astonishing value... Where was I? Ah yes, it was just an ordinary day when Mike bought the excellent *Protext*, a sound move for someone, like him, moving up from the Amstrad PCW (or CPC). Or so he thought.

Anyway, Mike has an early single-sided drive ST, and Arnor were commendably swift in changing them for single sided disks. But that's not the problem, though it's part of it. When he'd installed *Protext* to run with his Star LC24-10 all seemed well until he tried to use underlining, italics or any other typeface than that currently in use on the printer: "The software and printer were battling for control," as Mike melodramatically puts it: "and the printer was winning!"

"This was puzzling," Mike goes on, "since the correct printer driver had been installed, as was confirmed by the *Protext* Status Line. Arnor were puzzled, too, since they'd had no similar complaints. And even a lengthy chat at the PC Show with these ever-helpful chaps failed to suggest a solution.


"It was then I noticed something odd: the printer driver on my start-up disk was smaller than the printer driver on the master disk. Funny, I thought." Funny indeed. Mike tried to re-install the driver, and a notice flashed up briefly that the disk was full and installation unsuccessful. As Mike points out, the fact that the disk was cataloguing as full was not initially that noteworthy, since some software companies use the "0 bytes available" as a protection device – indeed Arnor's dictionary disks are a little like this.

What had happened was that the printer driver had been opened and partly transferred, which was why it appeared on the Status Line. But not all the driver commands had gone across. Moral: in order to get the full driver on a single-sided start-up disk you have first to remove the CONFIG.PRG file and put it on another disk.

Mike is now living happily in Huntingdon, his *Protext* printer driver experiences a thing of the past. Yet it really happened...

ROM screen fonts

The nature of a PC text screen was brought home to me the other day when I received a VGA card on loan. The card in question was a pukka job with 512K of video memory, so it should be just right for reviewing some VGA only products, such as AutoDesk's Animator. It installed OK, and seemed just the job, apart from some rather odd colour switches and one other unfortunate feature.

The characters that appear on any PC text-mode screen are drawn from a ROM attached to the video card. As well as being based on a different dot matrix, text for Hercules, CGA, EGA and VGA screens is dependent on the design of the characters in the video ROM. Those on this VGA card are so horrid, I'll be glad when the loan period's up. No attempt is made to account for the monospaced nature of the text, so capital 'i's are left wallowing in a sea of blank space, while 'm's and 'w's crowd out the other letters. 'C's are badly formed and the descenders on 'g's and 'y's look bitten off.

I'm not just being a typography bore - a screen of text on this card looks really messy. There's a lesson to learn, which I shall certainly bear in mind when I have to buy a VGA card. Check you can live with the text which appears on a text mode screen - after all, it's the mode you'll use most.

Timeworks DTP 1.2

The new version of *Timeworks DTP* has arrived. Among the heralded changes to the program, like support for extra text and graphics formats and increased font usage, is another goody which GST haven't said nearly as much about. It is, nonetheless, of great importance to anyone loading a lot of text into a *Timeworks* document, and adds another Ventura-style feature to the program.

You can now add paragraph style names to a text file by enclosing them in angle brackets, <>, and *Timeworks* will automatically assign the style of that name to all succeeding paragraphs, or until another style is marked. This means that consistent use of embedded style marks can format a manuscript completely automatically - a great boon in producing longer documents.

TopDOS 'Editor'

Having sung the praises of *TopDOS*, the MS-DOS improver which makes working with the operating system tolerable, I have to report a nasty which cost me not a few hours

work the other day. The builtin editor, which is very handy and produces nice clean ASCII files, is not so clean when editing a file from a nearly full disk. When you come to resave the edited file, all seems to go well until you exit the editor and check the disk directory. The filename's there but the filelength is 0 bytes.

The file has not been saved and the old version has been erased. A pretty effective way of losing the data, as some sort of overwrite is performed on the disk, destroying the cluster links which would help a program like Norton Utilities from

undeleting it. The batch file which controls the *PC Plus* SuperDisk underwent this 'backup' the other week and had me working til one in the morning. NewStar need to do something about this.

DOS batches

It's very easy to add new commands to DOS in the form of short batch files. These can easily be tailored to offer just the facilities you need. One function I've always wanted is to create and move to a new sub-directory in one operation. Typical use of such a function would be to create a directory when installing a new application. The following batch file, which you might save as NEWDIR or something similar, will do the trick:

echo off

cls

echo Making and moving to directory %1...

MD %1

CD %1

You would run it by typing NEWDIR <directory name>.

BASIC 2 Plus


This morning I received a full production version of Locomotive Software's BASIC 2 Plus, the new version of the GEM-based language which was originally supplied with Amstrad PC 1512s and PC 1640s. It is a complete revamp, with lots of extra structures and commands, and gives many other modern languages a very good run for their money.

Perhaps the biggest single advance is in the use of modules. In many ways similar to a module in Modula 2, BASIC 2 Plus can pass parameters to separate pieces of code, which can themselves be in BASIC or machine code, and return values from them to the main program. Modules can be loaded and unloaded as needed while a BASIC 2 Plus program is running, and gives scope for larger programs than before.

The editor has also been overhauled, with full search and replace, auto-indentation of source code, an outline view of the program structure and a clipboard for moving sections of code around. The editor has been combined with a comprehensive set of debugging tools, including breakpoints, single stepping and an autotrace mode which bounces the cursor from one command to the next as the program executes.

Existing BASIC 2 programs may need some minor amendments, as the syntax of the new version of the language is in some places tighter than before. Most will show some speed improvement, though. When I've had the chance to become more familiar with the language, I'll let you know how well it lives up to the foregoing claims. You can also see a review of the product in the next issue of *PC Plus*.

Shareware club





Crashing QL

My OL recently started playing up; crashing a few minutes after being switched on. Following my own advice in this column, some months ago, I checked the obvious things like the mains plug, and the voltage regulator, but couldn't find anything wrong. I then pressed all the socketed chips firmly into their sockets and tried the machine out. As expected, this cured the problem.

This is well worth trying if your QL suddenly becomes unreliable; it only takes a few minutes, and could save you an unnecessary repair bill of £25 or more.

Sinclair used "cheap and nasty" sockets in the QL, to save a few pence, and chips sometimes work loose, because of thermal cycling. IC pins also get oxidised, resulting in intermittent contact problems.

Another Hard Disk Interface

The latest issue of the Quanta newsletter mentions yet another hard disk system for the QL, produced by West German firm ABC-Elektronic. This plugs into the QL expansion port, and has a buffered through-connector for another peripheral card, Like the Miracle Systems interface, the ABC product is designed to take a low-cost PC/XT controller card. The cost of the inter

face, with controller card, will probably be around £130.00.

This makes a total of four hard-disk systems for the QL (three commercial offerings and one DIY design). Not bad for a "technical oddity, not worth buying", as the QL was recently described in this magazine!

Disk Firmware Upgrades

If you bought a disk interface for your OL a long time ago, or you have recently fitted a second-hand interface, it might be worth checking with OJump that you have the latest version of the firmware, in the EPROM on the interface. OJump can either re-program your old EPROM, or supply a new one. If you use one of the Micro Peripherals interfaces, with its non-standard firmware, OJUmp can provide an upgrade that makes the interface compatible with everyone else's. Apart from Micro Peripherals, all other interface manufacturers used AJump firmware.

Passing Shot is supplied on cassette, and upon loading asks you for a skill level. An opponent is picked for you and it is than onto the game. You are presented with a back view of your player, which then changes to an overhead view immeadiately after service. The first thing that strikes you as odd, is the fact that you only see part of the playing area, the screen scrolling as you move your player around.

Now on the MSX this isn't too bad, as our computers offer a fairly large on screen picture. I can imagine the Commodore and Spectrum versions of this game are far harder to play due to there smaller playing area. Positioning your player for a return shot could be pretty difficult for a novice, and the scrolling playing area does take some getting used to. Graphics and sound are both pretty good, the sction scrolling very smoothly. I have read reviews of this game on other formats, and it was only given a luke warm reception. My main criti-


cism is that it might be too easy, as I reached to semi final on the hardest level the first time I played the game, (must be years of playing Konami's version). Otherwise Passing Shot is a fari game, not as good as Konami's, but reasonable value at £9.95.

News time

It's also faster than any other hard disk, taking just 80 seconds to transfer a 1Mb file! It costs £465 for the 32Mb version or £545 for the 48Mb.

Other possibilities are the WEB (20Mb, £499, Timatic 0329 236727) or the System

2000 (40Mb, £499, Ideal Hardware 01 390 1211) - either would suit any small business or heavy private user fine.

Minerva multistore

Another offering at the PC Show, and there were plenty, was the new database from Minerva. Not content with having one of the leading products in the Archie database market, MultiStore is a fully RISCOS program with some definite advantages over the company's earlier release, System Delta Plus. Firstly, it's fully multitasking. This means you can lift data from MultiStore straight into a RISCOS word processor or DTP (memory permitting). Secondly, it's fully relational, so you can link fields between databases and avoid storing the same data twice. You can, of course, display cards from more than one file on screen at once. Existing System Delta Plus files can be loaded directly into MultiStore.

The price of the product, £299, puts it firmly into the professional league, but that cost does include a report generator and mailmerge software for your mailing lists. Being RISCOS compatible also gives it access to Acorn's outline fonts and these are supported within the product for producing fancy labels and the like. Mandelbrot zoom

It can get rather tedious when envious own-

ers of other micros continue to deride the Archie as only good for school kids and Mandelbrots. Nonetheless, it has to be said that Acorn's super-PC is very good at Mandelbrots.

There's a program called Mandelbrot Zoom in the public domain which illustrates this excellently. Starting with a picture of the entire set, which it draws in a couple of seconds, it lets you zoom in on any area, drawing new screens in well under a minute (unless you pick a completely black section). The display is in 256 colour mode 13 and looks more and more spectacular as you increase magnification. Being a Mandelbrot set, of course, you can zoom in as far as you like, revealing ever greater detail. The core calculation is written in ARM code, but everything else is in BASIC V.

I have a similar program, written in compiled C code which I occasionally run on my PC. This is a fast machine as PCs go, with an 80386 processor running at 25 MHz. The program does much the same as Mandelbrot Zoom, with one small difference - it takes up to an hour to draw each new screen!

Economy drive

I'm in the process of putting together a second floppy for my Archie. I've got together an old tape streamer case with power supply and a 40/80 track switchable 5.25-inch from a friend in the trade (I will pay you, honest, Tim). 





HELP! Driving on home

Here is an Amiga A500 problem that I would like you to solve for me.

Can I connect a CBM 1570 disk drive to my Commodore Amiga A500 and Datel twin external drive? If so, how much will the hardware and software cost?

Please advise where the items required can be purchased and also if there are any limitations.

I'm afraid not J. J., the 1570 is a serial drive with a lot of on-board controlling electronics that make connection of the drive to other computers very difficult. A nice idea, but it just won't work.

HELP! Horse 'n' SCART

Recently I have heard and seen about a socket connection called

SCART. From what I gather, this allows you to connect your computer to a television giving better resolution. Could you please give other readers and myself all the information on this system?

SCART is not a system. It's just another one of thousands of attempts to find the perfect connector between two electronic devices. A SCART plug looks like a slightly misshapen D, with a series of pins contained within. The SCART connector is used extensively on the continent to connect videos to TVs etc., and started to make in-roads into computing a few years with the advent of home computers. Unfortunately for the persons responsible for SCART (and who they are I have no idea - and care less so don't write) the connector standard has remained relatively obscure when compared with DIN and other methods of connection.

SCART in itself will not provide your computer with a higher resolution display on a a standard television. What it will

do, is to allow you to connect a computer to a television offering composite or RGB input. Using these display standards you will get a clearer, sharper picture than with ordinary TV pictures which rely on the input signal being encoded then decoded (thereby deteriorating the picture quality).

HELP! Creating a DIN?

I would be very pleased if you could help me with a small problem I have. I currently own an Atari ST, accompanied by a Philips TV/monitor with an RGB DIN connector. For some time now I have been using the TV display, and to be honest I don't think my eyes can take it for much longer.

I use this machine for graphics and for most of the time I find myself squinting at what I am doing (dark colours are the worst). For a couple of months now I have been looking for a lead which will fit the DIN connector and I still can't get hold of one. I would be very grateful if you could tell me of a place that can supply a suitable lead/DIN connector

The trouble is, I've not got a clue where to get these drives, so could you please print the address of someone who supplies them and give me an idea of the price?

Siren Software (84-86 Princess Street, Manchester M1 6NG) are the acknowledged leaders in drive supplies for the Amstrad CPC range. The company's 3.5-inch drive including *Ramdos* (which you'll need to get anything out of the drive) costs a reasonable £109.99 and comes with everything you need to get going.

If you're really bent on being difficult, you could buy the Siren Software offering, tear out the parts you don't want, throw them away and build your own. Alternatively, and I'm not being facetious, consult the Leicester Yellow Pages wherein you'll discover a veritable Alladin's cave of computer suppliers who can let you have a drive. Cost should be about £70. Then you'll need to talk to

I am looking for a portable or a laptop computer with a disk drive and a printer port. I dare say I will need a fair amount of memory or the possibility of expanding at a later date. What I want the computer to do is to handle lists of text, dates, years, and valuations and word processing.


As I am working on a small budget I intend to go to an auction, so if it is possible to suggest a few models that would fit the bill I would be very grateful.

As to the software, can you name any for the particular tasks in question or would I need some custom software written? If so how do I find a programmer?

Although you don't specify the fact, a portable/laptop computer with a disk drive almost certainly means a PC compatible portable or laptop, which means you're instantly transported to the over-£500 price bracket, and that's for the very cheapest, very flimsiest, most poorly specified machine you can find. However, buying a PC compatible portable does mean that you will have a least 512K (probably 640K) of valuable RAM memory to play with so the applications you wish to use will run quite happily.

So what's available, that's cheap, easy to use and

provides all of the features necessary for competent computing? The Amstrad PPC range of machines are very usable, don't cost a great deal (they're the cheapest portable by far on the market), and are very well specified.

The range begins with the PPC512, a 512K RAM,

single floppy disk portable with a full size keyboard, printer and external monitor and user ports. Moving through a twin drive version, there's the PPC640, and it is this machine that has aroused the interests of jaded computer hacks everywhere. There's a built-in V21, V22, V23, V22bis modem of incredible quality which is almost worth the price of the computer alone. 640K RAM, a full size keyboard and more ports than you can shake a stick at complete the specifications. You can pick up a discounted PPC640 for around £600.

The idea of visiting an auction is a good one and should produce the desired result, although Amstrad computers do tend to hold or even expand their price a little at auction. But don't worry. Fix a ceiling on the amount of moolah you're prepared to part with, and don't sneeze or scratch your nose, or you may end up with more than you bargained - and bidded - for.

You won't need to employ the services of a freelance programmer. They charge anything from £20 per hour upwards and anyway, there are commercially available programs covering everything

If money is a little tight, have a rummage in the public domain for some freebies. Details of PD suppliers can be found in the back of Express and our sister magazine PC Plus.

Maplin Electronic Supplies (01 748 0926) to get the requisite parts for the power supply (probably about another £20). And finally you'll have to buy a copy of *Ramdos* or *Rodos* in order to make use of the drive. Are you beginning to see how the Siren Software deal is the best? Take some sound advice from your dear old Uncle - buy the Siren Software drive (can I have my palm crossed now please, Siren?).

HELP! Looking for adventure

I have owned an Atari STFM for about two months now and so far I'm impressed as I used to have a Commodore 64. I am however, having problems with various aspects of word processing and programming. I am trying to start writing my own programs, adventures and such for the public domain. I know the basics of programming but I need to understand certain points in order to complete the adventures, so could you please explain the following points:

1. When writing an adventure how do you stop the computer from printing all possible choices? At the moment the text scrolls up the page before there is time to read it. Could you please show me a program that would pause the scrolling with a MORE> prompt at the bottom to give the adventurer time to read the text.

2. Could you also show me a program that would protect any unauthorised personnel from listing the program or in some way reviewing the program.

3. When I bought my computer the company provided disks with various programs to use running from GEM. On all the disks there are data files as well as program files. This really shows how uneducated I am at programming. I assume that most of these data files contain information that has to be printed out before it can be seen or used. But is there any way of actually accessing the program? On one disk there is an adventure game that I simply cannot gain access to. I would be very grateful if you could tell me how I can use such pro-

grams.

1. and 2. As you are obviously a novice programmer I don't think writing adventures is a good way to begin on the great road to programming proficiency (!). Begin by paying a visit to your local book store and buying a book detailing programming in BASIC which will help you to understand the finer points, and make solving the problems adventure writing present.

That doesn't solve the problem of giving vent to your adventurish creative bent does it? So why not invest £20 or so in STAC (ST Adventure Creator) from Incentive Software (call the company on 0734 817288). This program allows you to create wonderful adventures which can also feature pictures imported from graphics and paint packages, simply by defining the text you wish to print out, the locations and descriptions you wish to use etc., the program does all the hard work. It's an excellent package which received deservedly good reviews.

3. You can't just have access to the

programs on the disk. What you must do is to fire up the Atari BASIC program which came with the machine (full instructions in the ST's manual) then RUN the program from within BASIC. However, you may still encounter problems because the adventure program was written with an early version of ST BASIC which featured one or two wrinkles not supported by later versions. So if you encounter error messages when you try to run it, don't worry! It isn't the computer, but Atari's lousy programming.

HELP! Colour micro?

I am about to make up my mind about which PC compatible to buy but I am a bit confused about monitors.

My main use will be word processing but I would like to progress into graphics and games later. Should I go for a colour monitor? Can I use my existing Hitachi TV for colour?

I'm afraid you won't be able to use the Hitachi television to display colour on your PC compatible. If you can afford it, buy a machine with a colour monitor (there are many manufacturers offering deals on colour displays at the moment). If not, then buy a standard PC compatible and upgrade it with a CGA colour adapter card and colour monitor at a later date (many machines are shipped as standard with a CGA card).

A CGA adapter will cost you about £60 and a colour monitor will cost about £250. If you can stretch to a machine with colour monitor now, then expect to pay about £700, maybe less. The moral is 'shop around'.

TVs cannot be used to display signals output from PC compatible computers directly, although several companies do produce TV modulators which plug in to the expansion slots of the Amstrad range, reflecting their more games oriented image.

HELP! Power PC?

IIIP Joystick japes


