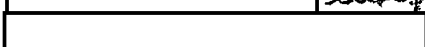

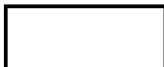

The first speaker was MADOLE. He spoke mainly about how the minority groups held so much power while pure Americans were suffering for it. He gave as an example the fact that the street meetings were moved from 84 St & 2 Ave. to this location; 85 St & 1 Ave.

BURROS spoke next. He gave his usual talk on the Federal Reserve System and how it was supposed to be temporary and how it is unconstitutional.

There were about 400-500 present. There were no incidents. There was however, a lot of noise trying to drown out the N.R.P. speakers. This noise was supplied by the Jewish War Veterans and by apartment house dwellers in the area.

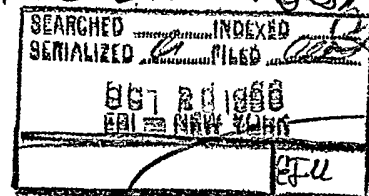

There were about 800 people present to hear this demonstration. About 300 of these people were friendly to the N.E.P.'s ideas. Some of these people had signs saying "White Power".

MADOLE was saying how South Africa's legal premier was killed because he wanted to run his country lawfully.

He also said that black Africans are pouring into South Africa because it is a better place to live because of white supremacy.

BURROS spoke about the Negro marches in the Mid-west. He got very emotional and said that everyone should carry signs saying "White Power".



meeting from 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM, on York Avenue
between 34th Street and 35th Street, New York, New
York.

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[redacted] advised there was a peak
attendance of approximately four hundred people. A
majority of the audience was anti-NRP and heckled James
Madole, National Director of the NRP, who was the
only speaker.

In addition to James Madole, the following
persons affiliated with the NRP were present:



In his speech, James Madole delivered his
usual anti-Jewish diatribe and called for abolition
of the Civilian Review Board in New York City.

[redacted] advised there were no arrests
and no disorders at the above meeting.

NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY (NRP)

On July 28, 1966, a source advised that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) was founded in 1949, by JAMES H. MADOLE, who continues to serve as its National Director and is in complete control of the NRP.

The source further stated that the NRP has its headquarters in the residence of JAMES H. MADOLE at 10 West 90th Street, New York, New York. Weekly meetings are held at this location on Thursday evenings.

The source described the NRP as an anti-Negro, anti-Semitic and neo-Fascist organization.

This source stated on July 28, 1966, that JAMES H. MADOLE, as of October, 1965, distributed a printed "program of the NRP", which program had as its announced purpose the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State". According to the program, this would be accomplished by calling a Constitutional Convention to ratify the necessary amendments to the United States Constitution in order to carry out the NRP program for the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State".

This source further advised that as of July 28, 1966, this "program of the NRP" remains in effect and that the anti-Negro and anti-Semitic nature of the NRP is exemplified by the following excerpts from this program:

1. Enact and rigidly enforce legislation to restrict the benefits of American citizenship to mentally and genetically sound members of the Caucasian race.
2. Enact legislation to prohibit intermarriage between white and non-whites.

2.

NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY (CONTINUED)

3. The Jewish race shall be deprived by suitable legislation of their American citizenship and shall henceforth be prohibited from holding any professional, political or educational posts within the Racial Nationalist State. The Jew constitutes an alien virus in our national bloodstream and, as such, he must be purged from our cultural, economic, and political life.
4. Enact legislation to hasten the repatriation of American Negroes to the newly independent black nations on the African continent under the auspices and guidance of black nationalist leadership in the United States.
5. The establishment of a selective immigration policy whose primary purpose is to attract the best European racial stock to the North American Continent in order to utilize their vast energy and talent in the task of creating a dynamic, expanding White Empire capable of withstanding the encroachments of the primitive, colored world led by the Oriental colossus, Red China.

On The East Side of the street with the N.R.P. there were approximately 75 - 100 people, on the other side with the Jewish War Veterans about 200 people.

The Rally ended between 9:45 - 10:00 P.M.

When I arrived at the above place at the above time, the street meeting was in progress. The National Renaissance Party was on the East side of 85th St. and York Avenue behind police barricades. The police did not allow anyone to cross the barricades on that side of the street. The Jewish War Veterans were on the other side of the street blowing whistles, shouting, etc. It was difficult to hear the speaker of the National Renaissance Party.

I did hear the following: The N.R.P. hates all minority groups especially Jews and Negroes, their dedication to a "White" America only, by violence if necessary. The speaker of the N.R.P. has dedicated his life to the destruction of Minority groups. He also stated, the Jewish War Veterans, have never disrupted a Communist meeting or peace rally, therefore he claimed most Jews are Communists and should be eliminated.

The N.R.P. hates Mayor LINDSY and all liberals. They are against the Police Review Board.

The Police Department was well represented to maintain order.

The next meeting of N.R.P. will be Sunday at 47th Street, First Avenue, either this coming Sunday or the next, and also next Friday at 85th & 84th Sts., 1st Avenue. I cannot be sure of the slated meeting dates

On November 8, 1966, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on November 4, 1966, the National Renaissance Party (NRP) held a street meeting at York Avenue and 83rd Street, New York, New York, from approximately 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM.

According to this source, there were eleven individuals representing the NRP in attendance.

James Madole, National Director of the NRP, was the featured speaker. Madole spoke against the Police Civilian Review issue in New York City. He urged those in attendance to vote against the Civilian Review Board in the forthcoming election on November 8, 1966. He cautioned those in attendance that if the Civilian Review Board is continued, the police might not do their best work because they would know their actions would be subject to review by a board composed of civilians.

This same source further advised that during Madole's speech there was a great deal of heckling from the audience. Regarding these hecklers, Madole stated during his speech that the Jews who were trying to shout him down were afraid to hear the truth. In his speech, he further commented that Jews could only shout him down in this country.

On November 5, 1966, [redacted] Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, advised that the above mentioned street meeting was attended by approximately 150 people. During the meeting James Madole, NRP leader, and a group of seven supporters displayed the American flag and also the flag of the NRP. James Madole was the main speaker and there were also comments by some of his followers. The general tone of these speeches were anti-semitic, favored white supremacy and protested the government's foreign policy in Asia and Vietnam.

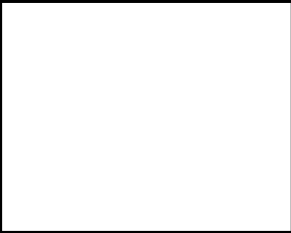

On December 1, 1966, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on Sunday, November 27, 1966, a group of individuals led by [redacted] picketed outside the New York Hilton Hotel for about one-half hour in protest of Israel's alleged aggression against Jordan. A dinner promoting the sale of Israel bonds was being held in the Hilton Hotel on Sunday evening, November 27, 1966.

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In addition to [redacted] others who participated in this picketing were identified as: [redacted] and [redacted]. They picketed as members of the International National Socialist League (INSL), a name manufactured by [redacted] for the purpose of this picketing. [redacted] further stated that if challenged by the New York City Police Department or anybody else during this picketing, the pickets should deny any association at all with the American Nazi Party (ANP). The pickets were challenged by no one. Members of the National Renaissance Party (NRP), who were scheduled to participate in this picketing, never showed up.

In his book "This Time The World", copyrighted in 1961, GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL identified himself as Commander, American Nazi Party of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (ANP - WUFENS), Arlington, Virginia.

The April 4, 1963, issue of "The Richmond News Leader", a Richmond, Virginia, daily newspaper, reported that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL had, on the previous day, again applied for the American Nazi Party to be chartered in the State of Virginia, but this request was turned down by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. This action was taken pursuant to an act of the 1962 Virginia Assembly which prohibits use of "Nazi" or "National Socialism" in a Virginia charter. This article further pointed out that ROCKWELL's Party is presently chartered in the State of Virginia as the George Lincoln Rockwell Party.

On August 14, 1964, a source advised that the ANP - WUFENS was organized by GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL at his residence in Arlington, Virginia, on February 26, 1959, as an international "National Socialist" movement based on the German Nazi Party headed by ADOLF HITLER. He added that ROCKWELL is the dominant force and personality in this party; that he is espousing a "line" of hatred against Jews and Negroes; and that he is seeking, through speeches, distribution of literature and picketing, to establish a cohesive and dominant political party in the United States and in foreign countries.

According to the "Stormtrooper's Manual", an official publication of the ANP, the phases of ANP struggle for power are fourfold, namely, first, "to make ourselves known to the masses"; second, "the dissemination of our

"program and truth about the Party"; third, "organizing the people who have been converted to our propaganda"; and fourth, "the attainment of power through the votes of the newly-won masses".

On August 19, 1966, the source advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL presently believes that he has completed the first two phases in his struggle for power and is well into the third stage, to wit, "the organizing of the people who have been converted to our propaganda". The source added that ROCKWELL had previously believed that he would be elected Governor of Virginia in November, 1965, and when defeated, he made the statement that he was not ready for stage four.

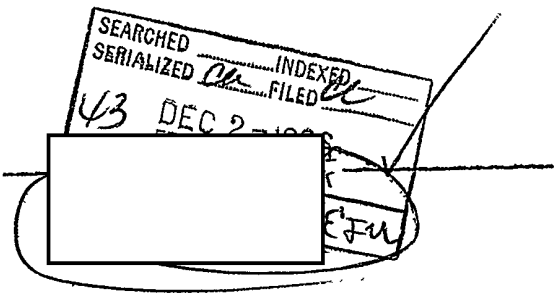

The veterans and reservist for peace in Vietnam held a rally today. The purpose of the rally was to protest American involvement in the Vietnam war. There were aproximately three to four hundred persons present.

The groups that took part in the rally were; Dubois Clubs, Students for a Democratic Society, YAWF, and the Committee to aid the National Liberation Front. These groups acted mainly as the defense guards against any would be attacks perpetrated by the Nazis who were visibly present. Their hostility was controlled mainly by a large force of police intent on order.

The speakers were; A.J. MUSTE of the Peace Parade Committee, FRED HALLSTEAD, of the Peace Parade Committee, OLIVER LEVES of CORE, and DIEDRE GRISWALD of YAWF.

In general, the speakers said that the war was immoral and illegal, and that the war was being carried on for the interest of big business, and that the United States was killing inocent women, children and old men in a war of agression. A sargent (former) from Wisconsin denounced president JOHNSON as a "mad man who should be in jail, not in the White house." He stated that the country was falling apart, and is being had by lunatics.

After the ravings of the "sane" were over, the Bread and Puppet Theater put on a skid depicting President JOHNSON answering questions at his last news conference.

After the skid was over, veterans gathered to burn their discharge papers. There were thirteen

taking part in this burning. When this finished, the people present were told to leave as quickly as possible. Despite this, a bystander and a nazi got into a fist swinging battle that only ended when the nazi was floored and the police realized what was happening.

The rally ended at eight o'clock.

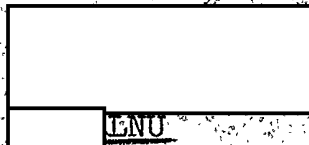

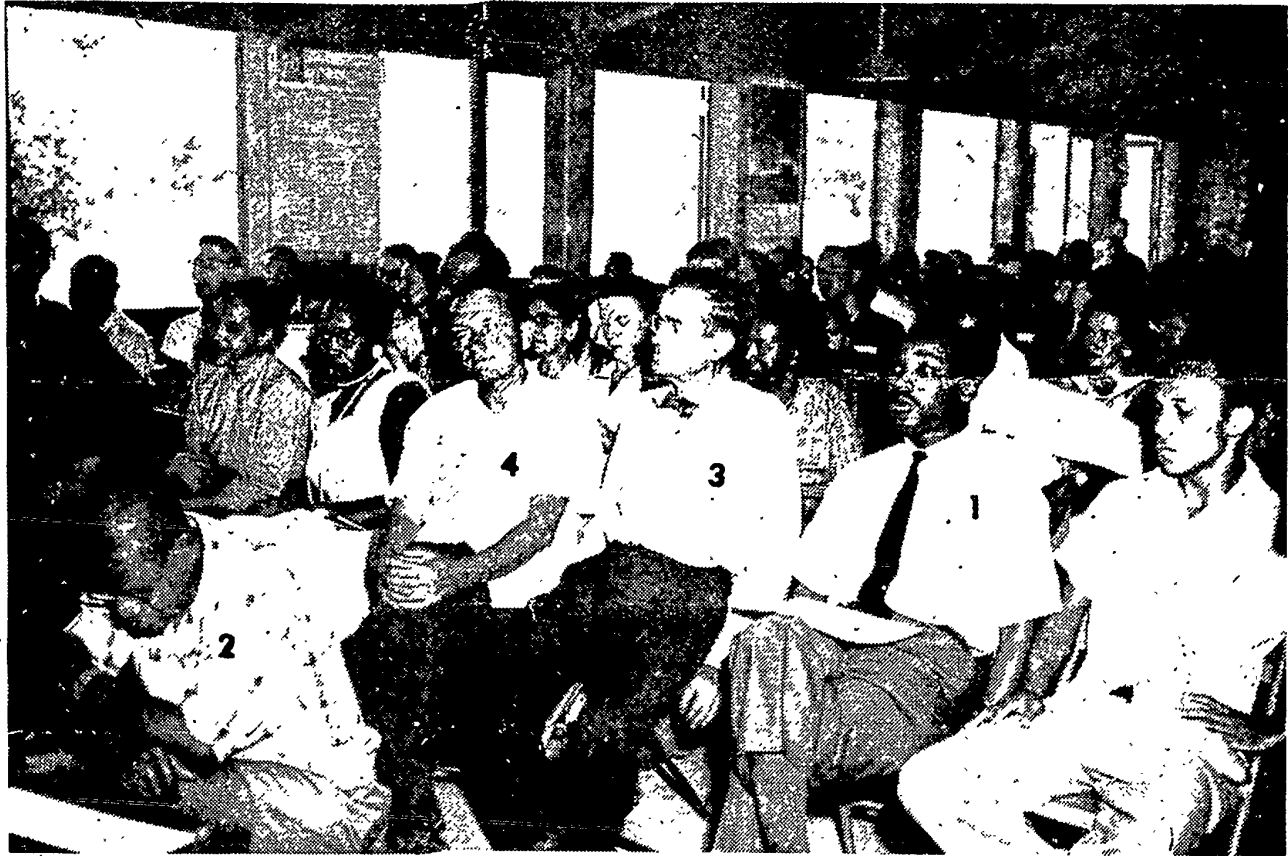

The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States. He is promoted and encouraged by the Kennedys.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

Civil liberties union bows out of Nazi case

GOSHEN

The New York Civil Liberties Union has declined to take up the National Renaissance Party's (NRP) battle with the City of Newburgh over the right to meet publicly.

The NYCLU, which already represents the neo-Nazi NRP in a legal dispute with the Orange County Board of Supervisors on the right to use the Newburgh Courthouse for a public meeting, does not have the manpower to take the Newburgh case, according to Henry Di Suvero, counsel.

The NYCLU lawyers are volunteers, Di Suvero said.

The Newburgh city attorney, Elliott M. Weiner, denied the NRP the right to use sound equipment at a rally this summer. The rally was called off as a result.

Weiner claims the city has to allow only authorized political parties to use sound equipment, and that the NRP is not a political party. This is also the question at heart in the NRP's suit against the board of supervisors: whether it is a political party.

On 1/20/67, [REDACTED] Brooklyn DA's Office, 186 Joralemon Street, Brooklyn, NY, telephone number 643-7550, telephonically contacted the writer concerning [REDACTED] a member of the National Renaissance Party (NRP).

The Brooklyn DA's Office had picked up [REDACTED] for questioning in view of the fact that he was distributing hate literature of an anti-Negro and anti-Jewish nature, which boarded on criminal libel.

He rents a Post Office Box in Brooklyn under the name of [REDACTED] and he is the only one connected with this organization.

In substance, the literature he disseminates makes remarks concerning various food articles and products and indicates "K" for Kosher on certain items, saying that these items are over-priced and the purchasers are being fleeced by the Jews because the distributor has to pay the Rabbi to get the Kosher seal.

[REDACTED] advised that he thought we might be interested in [REDACTED] and, if possible, send an Agent to the DA's office immediately and get in any further questioning, else [REDACTED] would be released immediately.

He was advised that we also knew that [REDACTED] was a member of the NRP and that we did not desire the DA's office to hold him until we got an agent familiar with the NRP out there since this would be at least an hour and one-half.

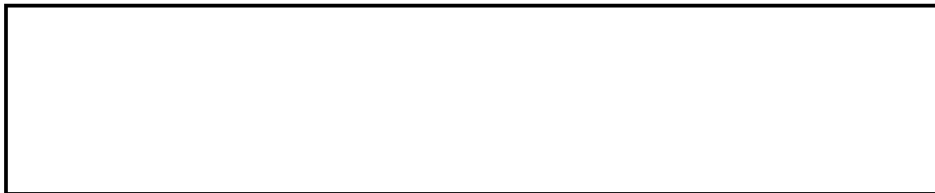

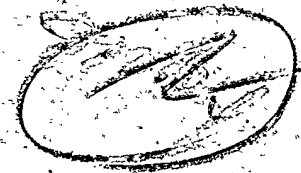

This is in answer to your request for a name check only on the above organization in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), New York.

On July 28, 1966, a source advised that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) was founded in 1949 by James H. Madole, who continues to serve as its National Director and is in complete control of the NRP.

The source further stated that the NRP had its headquarters in the residence of James H. Madole at 10 West 90th Street, New York, New York. Weekly meetings are held at this location on Thursday evenings.

The source described the NRP as an anti-Negro, anti-Semitic and neo-Fascist organization.

This source stated on July 28, 1966 that James H. Madole, as of October, 1965, distributed a printed "program of the NRP" which program had as its announced purpose the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State". According to the program, this would be accomplished by calling a Constitutional Convention to ratify the necessary amendments to the United States Constitution in order to carry out the NRP program for the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State".

This source further advised that as of July 28, 1966, this "program of the NRP" remains in effect and that the anti-Negro and anti-Semitic nature of the NRP is exemplified by the following excerpts from this program:

1. Enact and rigidly enforce legislation to restrict the benefits of American citizenship to mentally and genetically sound members of the Caucasian race.

3. The Jew constitutes an alien virus in our national bloodstream and, as such, he must be purged from our cultural, economic and political life.

4. Enact legislation to hasten the repatriation of American negroes to the newly independent black nations on the African Continent under the auspices and guidance of black nationalist leadership in the United States.

5. The establishment of a selective immigration policy whose primary purpose is to attract the best European racial stock to the North American Continent in order to utilize their vast energy and talent in the task of creating a dynamic, expanding White Empire capable of withstanding the encroachments of the primitive colored lead by the Oriental colossus, Red China.

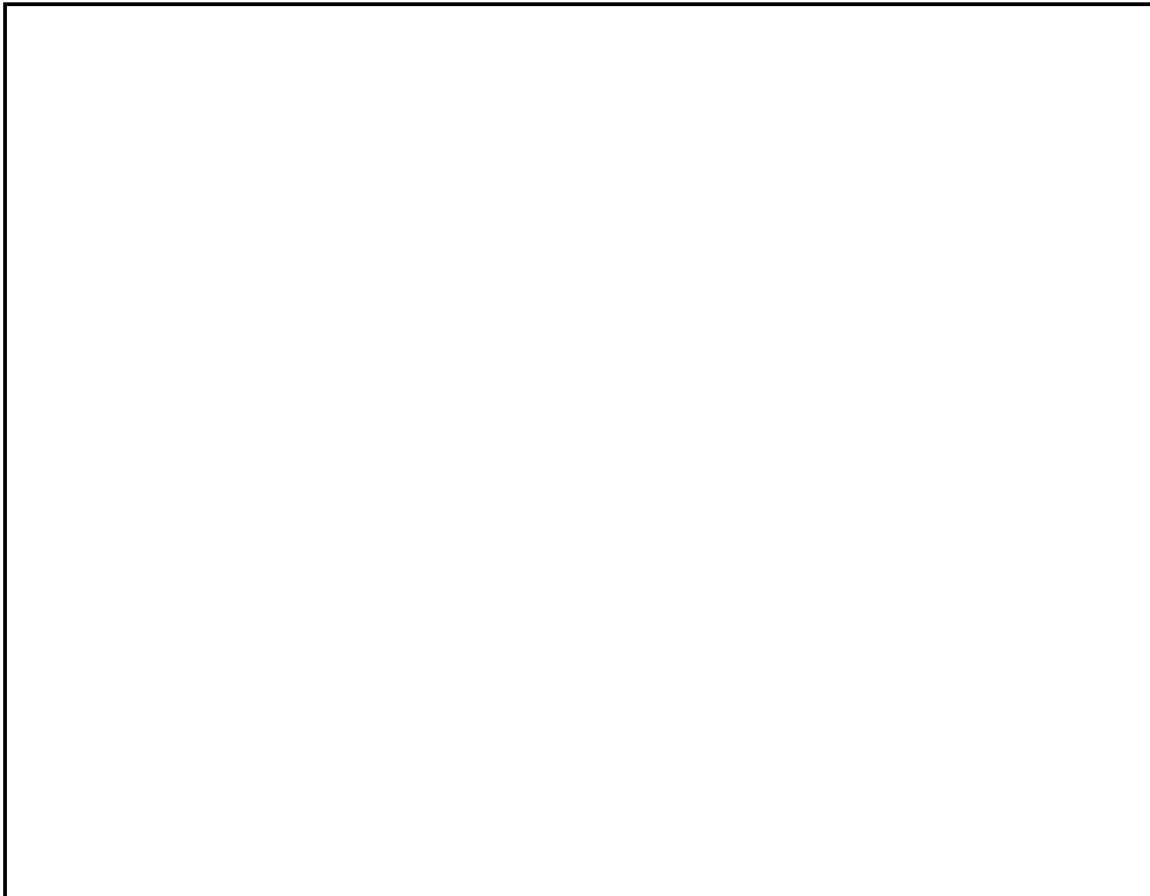

RH T-2 further advised that the meeting of the WPA was opened by Karl Allen who announced that the guest speaker for the meeting was James Madole, leader of the NRP.

Madole then took the speaker's stand and delivered a speech about the Negro and Jewish problems in this country. He explained to those in attendance that his NRP program will take care of this problem if he can get it into affective operation in the future.

Madole charged that the Christians of America are being exploited by the Jews. He further charged that the Negroes of America have all the power they have at this time because of the Jews, who control them. According to Madole, the Wall Street Jews do not want the war in Vietnam to end because if it does end they will lose many billions of dollars. He further stated that the Jews who control the pharmaceutical industry raise the prices of drugs which are used in Vietnam so that they can make even larger profits. According to Madole, President Lyndon Johnson does not want the war to end either because he feels he must keep the Jews happy.

Madole stated that the Gentiles also make up the entire American Armed Forces in Vietnam because all of the Jews of draftable age have college deferments. He noted that even the Young Conservative Americans for Freedom is filled with Jews.

Madole stated to those in attendance that Jews

are trying to take over this country with the Negroes as lackeys under Jew control. The Jews in 1913 started this take over of the government with the institution of the Federal Reserve Act as a result of which Jews had even greater control of the country's money even though control of this money should rest with Congress.

Madole then stated that the white people of America.. should be blamed for the takeover of this country. The country is being destroyed right under the nose of the white Christians and although the white people made America great, the white people are permitting the Jews to take everything away from them.

At the conclusion of this speech which lasted approximately 1 1/2 hours, there was a question period. An unidentified individual in attendance asked the question "what do you think of the Kennedy assassination? Madole answered this question by stating that the only person who had anything to gain from the assassination was President Johnson. In this connection, Madole pointed out that on the day of the assassination in Dallas, President Johnson did some peculiar things. As an example of peculiar actions on the part of President Johnson, Madole posed the question "why was the President not riding in the car with Kennedy as he was supposed to do?" During his discussion of President Johnson, Madole further stated that the President thinks its alright to accept things for himself, such as radio stations, even though it is unethical for him to do so. He further stated that President Johnson wants freedom for everyone in the Young Men's Christian Association men's room.

RH T-2 advised that following his speech, Madole received a standing ovation. Following this, [] [] announced that he, [] was going to run for Mayor

WHITE PARTY OF AMERICA

On September 16, 1965, [redacted] who identified himself as [redacted] the White Party of America (WPA), advised that he, along with several other former members of the American Nazi Party (ANP), formed the WPA during the early part of 1964, in order to advance the cause of the white man in the United States and eventually throughout the world.

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This organization was officially launched on April 11, 1964, when it sponsored picketing in Washington, D.C., Richmond, Virginia, and Baltimore, Maryland, in opposition to civil rights legislation and civil rights demonstrations. Its national headquarters was transferred from 1216 New York Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., to 1019 King Street, Alexandria, Virginia, on April 1, 1965.

It was initially the aim of the WPA to sponsor picketings and demonstrations where it was believed such would be of value and to publicize its program through pamphlets and similar media. The WPA has been inactive due to a lack of funds and its only publications to date have been the April and May, 1964, issues of its official publications, "The White Letter."

He added that the WPA is still in the formative stage but it will uphold the Constitution of the United States and will always act within the limits of the law. He noted that the WPA will serve as a "home for people who want to preserve the white race" and cannot find a home for themselves in either of the major political parties in the United States.

The American Nazi Party is characterized separately.

If still 'muzzled,' NRP won't run candidates

Unless the neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party wins its court fight to use public institutions for rallies, it plans to run no candidates in Orange County elections this year.

But if it does win its court battle, said James H. Madole, NRP's national director, its next move will be toward street rallies in Newburgh.

Madole, who estimates the party's strength in New York as 800 to 900, said the NRP does not plan to back any candidates in Newburgh who are already endorsed by the major political parties since they--the local candidates--are against him.

Madole said as soon as "we get this legal matter straightened out", there will "very definitely" be NRP candidates running for office in the county.

As for the present, "there is no point in having candidates, as we have discovered for two solid years, if they can't open their mouths any place."

In January 1965, Albert C. Howell, chairman of the Orange County Board of Supervisors, turned down an NRP request to use the Newburgh courthouse. The NRP filed another request shortly thereafter and Howell turned it over to the entire board at its March meeting.

At that session, county Atty. Thomas R. Hadaway, noting the use of the courthouse had been extended to other political parties and private organizations, said he doubted it could be denied to the NRP.

He told the supervisors, "The question is squarely up to you," adding that he would defend their denial in court, if necessary. The vote was 30-4 in favor of denial.

The anti-Semitic, anti-Negro NRP took its request to the state courts.

Madole said the case was heard in State Supreme Court last week, but a decision had been reserved for "three weeks to a month."

"Should we fail here, which I doubt, we will, of course, take it up to the U.S. Supreme Court," he said.

"If I should win in Albany, first of all, I shall immediately ask for the use of the courthouse. And, then, after having made use of the courthouse, I will start getting them used to street meetings on a regular basis."

Denied the use of the courthouse, in 1965, to the loud applause of minority groups that form the bull's eye on the NRP's target of hate, Madole and Robert J. Burros, a Newburgh native, turned their attention to the streets of Newburgh.

The party planned to run Burros for assemblyman from the 96th District. An application was filed with the city for a sound equipment permit. Madole, who has had much experience with large angry crowds, feels a rally without sound equipment is no rally.

The NRP planned to hold the meeting August 20 at Fullerton Avenue and South Street, next to Newburgh Free Academy.

It was never held. City Manager Paul L. McCauley barred the rally under a section of the city's ordinance that gives him the authority to set time and place for such gatherings.

There had been strong opposition not only to the rally, but to its location. Because of the proximity to school property, the school board had informed city leaders it did not want the NRP to trespass.

In barring the August rally, McCauley also noted the NRP application did not follow the prescribed submission procedure. The city requires permits for meetings of this nature. If sound equipment is desired, a subsequent application to the meeting permit must be filed.

no meeting permit had been sought.

Madole called this a stall. He said McCauley later granted permission for a meeting without sound equipment to be held November 15 "somewhere down near the city dump."

"Mr. McCauley was very generous in this," Madole said caustically, "and, of course, we told him where he could go with his generosity."

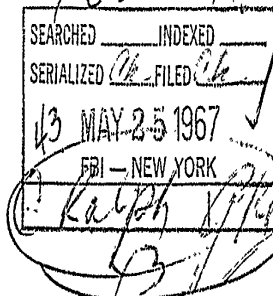
Taking a more confidential tone, Madole began to discuss the problems of a small party--apparently without making any connection between his and the minorities it attacks.

"All that we ask for is the same right--no more and no less--that every other political party in Orange County has.

"Even though we may be totalitarian and fascist--and I don't deny it--our point of view, we feel, is the correct point of view and if the people don't like it, they won't support us.

"Therefore, I don't see why the county fathers or city fathers are so terrified of having an organization appear in a rather nonprosperous community unless they have something to be afraid of.

"I am not afraid of getting a rock in the head or getting the Jewish War Veterans screaming at me as I do in New York."

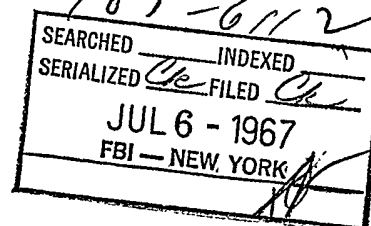

A source of information, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 3, 1967, that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) scheduled a protest rally to be held at 1:00 p.m. on July 4, 1967, at 192nd Street and Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York. According to this source, the participants were expected to burn a couple of Viet Cong flags and to generally protest the activities of other demonstrators who have been opposed to the United States policy in Vietnam. This source could furnish no additional information.

Attached hereto is a characterization
of the NRP.

[redacted] 46th Precinct of the New York City Police Department (NYCPD), 2120 Ryer Avenue, Bronx, New York, advised on July 5, 1967, that the above mentioned rally took place at 192nd Street and Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York, that there were only six persons who appeared, and that they marched around with the American flag properly displayed. [redacted] stated the rally was in protest of other demonstrations which are opposed to the United States policy in Vietnam. He stated the NRP was in favor of the United States policy in Vietnam, and added that the picketing was orderly, that no other groups were in the area, and that no rioting, arrests, or incidents took place.

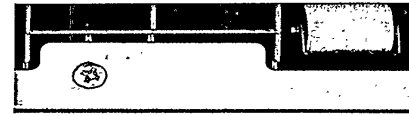

Appeals Court Grants Use Of Courthouse to NRP



By WARD POCHE
GOSHEN — A decision on an appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court on a ruling of the New York State Court of Appeals granting the National Renaissance Party (NRP) permission to use the Newburgh Courthouse will rest with the Orange County Board of Supervisors.

Thursday the court of Appeals, by a 6-1 vote, ordered Orange County to make the County Courthouse at Newburgh available to the NRP, a neo-Nazi group.

County Atty. Thomas A. Hadaway said today that he would probably discuss the decision — which he has not yet received — with the board's Building Committee next Wednesday. In the normal order of procedure, the committee would then recommend a course of action on which the full board would act.

Supervisor Burton C. Cosman of Newburgh, majority leader of the board and a member of the committee, declined immediate comment pending a report on the matter and discussion by the committee. He said that the committee would probably want to think the matter over.

James H. Madole, formerly of Beacon, the party's national director in New York City, said that he would await word on the county's decision on appeal before applying for use of the courthouse. An appeal would hold everything in abeyance until a decision was reached.

Previous applications from the NRP to hold a street rally in Newburgh with the use of loud speakers have been denied by the city. Mr. Madole said he assumed the decision relating to the Board of Supervisors would also apply to Newburgh.

Other political parties in Newburgh use loud speakers. "We have the same right," he said.

Mr. Madole said that the party would fight any appeal by the county to the U.S. Supreme Court and expressed confidence in winning. "For the county to win, the Supreme Court would have to reverse all its previous decisions regarding the Communist Party and the Socialist Labor Party," he said.

Mr. Madole said that the purpose of the courthouse meetings and rallies would be to field candidates in political elections.

The NRP is currently preparing for an "Arab-American Friendship Rally" in support of the Arab states which it will sponsor at Times Square on June 24.

Denial of the use of the courthouse by the Board of Supervisors on the grounds that the NRP is not a political party has gone through all of the state's courts since it came up early in 1965. The Supreme Court granted permission to use the courthouse, the Appellate Division reversed the Supreme Court and finally — Thursday — the state's highest court reversed the Appellate Division.

It held that regulations by the Board of Supervisors limiting outside use of the building to recognized political parties was unconstitutional.

Veterans groups, especially the Jewish War Veterans, vigorously objected to NRP holding a rally in the courthouse, it was recalled.

Chief Judge Stanley Fuld wrote the majority opinion, in which all judges concurred except Associate Judge John Schlipf, who voted to uphold the Appellate Division.

In trial court, the justice held the NRP had the right to meet in the courthouse. The Appellate Division agreed with that, but sent the case back to determine if NRP's was a political party. The highest court re-

versed the Appellate Division and reinstated the trial justice's view.

Mr. Madole, who is national director of NRP, brought the action against the Orange Board of Supervisors and the building superintendent.

Madole, told the court his group is "an unincorporated association which advocates the preservation of American national sovereignty, racial nationalism and the establishment by constitutional means of a government composed of an intellectual, managerial and military aristocracy."

"There is no doubt that the board's rules governing use of the court houses for nonjudicial purposes were unconstitutionally discriminatory against small political parties," Chief Judge Fuld wrote. "The county is not obligated to make its buildings available for public gatherings but, when it does so, both state and federal constitutions require that it be done 'in a reasonable and non-discriminatory manner.'" This means that, if the use is limited to groups of a particular type or in a particular category, there may be no discrimination within the category.

"In the case before us, the record reveals no justifiable purpose for excluding minor political parties from holding public meetings in the Newburgh Court House," Judge Fuld wrote.

"Furthermore, it was error for the Appellate Division to order a hearing on the issue of whether the NRP is a political party. For political purposes, a 'party' is defined as 'an organized group of the electorate

that attempts to control government through the election of its candidates to office.' (Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary).

"As the petition makes clear, the NRP calls itself a party; its purposes are of a political and governmental character and it nominates candidates for public office. The denial by respondents in their answer of knowledge or information sufficient to form a belief as to the accuracy of the petitioner's description of the NRP's political character was 'obviously perfunctory and raised no issue whatever.' Accordingly, since the respondents have alleged no 'evidentiary facts' to the contrary, a trial on the NRP's status as a political party is not warranted.

"Nor is there any basis for a hearing as to whether the 'expression' of the NRP's views will 'immediately and irreparably create injury to the public weal.' No such reason was given by the respondents for denying the NRP a permit, and the only hint of any such issue in the pleadings is an allegation in the petition—denied by the respondents in their answer—that members of the Board of Supervisors had charged the NRP and its members with being 'Fascist' and 'subversive.' Even if it were found that the NRP's political philosophy represented the unpopular views of a small and extreme minority, the petitioner would, nevertheless, be entitled to use the county court house.

"As this court reaffirmed only a few months ago, 'the expression of controversial and unpopular views . . . is precisely what is protected by both the federal and state constitutions.

"It is an 'unlawful restriction of the constitutional right of free speech,' we wrote . . . to exercise prior restraint on the expression of such views 'unless it is demonstrable on a record that such expression will immediately and irreparably create injury to the public weal—not that such expression, without itself being unlawful will incite criminal acts in others'.

"We fail to see the remotest possibility, in the case before us, of danger from speeches delivered in a room inside a courthouse building to a presumably sympathetic audience. No one has suggested that the NRP intends to advocate the use of violence as a means of achieving its objectives or that a 'clear and present danger exists that the audience would immediately act to implement such an unlawful proposal. Nor does anticipated opposition by certain veterans groups to the NRP and its program present a hazard of 'immediate and irreparable injury to the public weal.' Were there to be a disturbance, the fault would surely lie with those who objected to the views expounded and not with the speakers of the sponsoring NRP. It has been well said that 'the measure of the speaker is not the conduct of his audience.'

"In short, there is nothing in the record to justify censorship of the NRP upon the basis of possible public injury—to be inflicted by the speakers and not by their audience—and we do not believe that the appellate divisions, on its own initiative, may call for an investigation which, in a roundabout manner, imposes a restraint on the constitutional right to free expression."

NRP wins fight with Orange

The neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party has won the latest, and perhaps the last, battle with Orange County to use the Newburgh courthouse for rallies.

The Court of Appeals Thursday reversed the lower court 6 to 1 and granted the NRP the right -- as a political party -- to use the county's Newburgh facility.

Unless the county appeals, NRP National Director James H. Madole said, the anti-Semitic, anti-Negro organization will hold its first Newburgh rally in late July or August.

Albert C. Howell, chairman of the board of supervisors, said he did not know if the county would appeal. "We'll have to appraise the situation and decide what to do," he said.

Part of this appraisal, Howell said, would be hearing the advice of County Attorney Thomas R. Hadaway. Hadaway could not be reached last night, nor could the board's majority leader, Burton C. Cosman.

Madole said after several meetings in the courthouse, the NRP will again ask the City of Newburgh for permission to hold rallies in the

streets.

The NRP battle to gain use of the courthouse began in early 1965. Its first request to use the facility was turned down by Howell, but a later request went to the entire board for a decision.

The board said a loud "no" in a 30 to 4 vote that followed impassioned pleas by minority group representatives. The NRP, they said, was no more than a new bearer for Hitler's flag.

In the high court's decision Thursday it noted that the board in June, 1965 promulgated rules for the use of the court houses in Goshen and Newburgh for other than judicial purposes.

These rules made the buildings available to political parties as defined in the election law, which states a party is any political organization that polled at least 50,000 votes in the preceding election for governor.

The NRP, which Madole says has 800 to 900 members in the state, failed to qualify under this vote test and went to court.

The state Supreme Court ruled that a permit should be issued, but the Appellate Division disagreed.

The Court of Appeals said the rules governing the use of courthouses for non-judicial purposes were "unconstitutionally discriminatory against small political parties."

The high court pointed out that the "county is not obliged to make its buildings available for public gatherings, but when it does so

both state and federal constitutions require that it be done in a reasonable and non-discriminatory manner.

"This means that if the use is limited to groups of a particular type or in a particular category there may be no discrimination within the category."

The majority opinion, based on the hearing of the case in mid-May, was written by Chief Judge Stanley Fuld. The dissenting vote was cast by Associate Judge John Scilleppi. The American Civil Liberties Union represented the NRP.

Madole who greeted the decision as "good news," predicted that the county would not appeal. "It must be getting rather costly for them by this time," he said.

The NRP will use the first rally to review the litigation surrounding the use of the courthouse and "the attempts to prevent us from having the freedom of speech" Madole said. Steps to build the party - "to take the ball away from the Democrats and Republicans" - will also be outlined.

Details for the rally have not been worked out fully, he said, because the party has been preparing for an "Arab-American Friendship Rally" in support of the Arab states it is sponsoring at Times Square June 24.

Madole said he hoped New York would reverse its decision banning the NRP security contingent's uniforms within the next two weeks so they could be worn at the Newburgh rally.

Court order due in Orange on NRP's use of courthouse

GOSHEN

Orange County may be directed by the courts Wednesday to allow the neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party (NRP) to use the county's Newburgh courthouse for its party rallies.

Unless Orange decides to appeal a Court of Appeals decision on which order rests, the NRP may hold its first rally at the courthouse in July or August.

The order is scheduled to be presented Wednesday to Supreme Court Justice Leonard J. Supple, according to Asst. County Atty. James Tamsen.

Tamsen, who represented the county in its two-year battle with the NRP, said the county received a copy of the order Monday. It directs the county to issue a permit to the NRP.

Tamsen said he presumed the NRP will present the order to Supple for his signature Wednesday.

After that the NRP may apply to the county

for permission to use the courthouse, which the county must grant, he said.

If the county decides to appeal, Tamsen said, the order would automatically be stayed.

Supple was the justice who originally heard the NRP case in 1965. At that time he ruled that the NRP, as a political party, could legally use the courthouse. Orange County supervisors had passed a ruling that only political parties could use the courthouse, but denied an application from the NRP on grounds the NRP wasn't a political party.

The Appellate Division upset Supple's ruling and agreed with the county's contention.

The Court of Appeals, however, recently ruled that the NRP is a political party, even though it does not qualify as such under the election law. The court held that the county could restrict the use of its courthouse in any way it pleased, but that if it opened the courthouse to any groups, it must allow any group in that category to use it.

Order signed, NRP maps rally plans

The neo-Nazi National Renaissance party made plans Wednesday for a rally July 29, in the Newburgh Courthouse.

Over the last two years, the NRP has been embroiled in a running battle with Orange County, both in the courts and out, over the party's right to use the Newburgh facility.

Wednesday, there were a number of indications that the NRP had won its fight.

Supreme Court Justice Leonard J. Supple signed an order based on a State court of Appeals decision directing the county to grant permission.

Observers, including some connected with the county position, say they thought the county would not decide to take the case to a higher court.

James H. Madole, national director of the NRP, filed a formal request and a check for \$10 for use of the Courthouse with Smith Barnes, superintendent of buildings.

Madole, a veteran of numerous NRP court battles, said he would not bother filing the application or writing the check unless he had information that permission would be granted.

In his letter to Barnes, on red, white and blue stationery, the head of the anti-Semitic, anti-Negro party noted the Court of Appeals had ruled 6 to 1 in favor of the NRP.

He said he enclosed a check for \$10 and asked for Saturday evening, July 29, between 7:30 and 10:30.

"I trust that we need not continue this futile battle in the courts," Madole said, "since it is not my intention to bring endless legal expense to the people of your county."

(Note: Asst. County Atty James Tamsen, who has represented the county in the NRP case said he could not estimate what the cost had been beyond court costs and disbursements -- \$583)

'Deny political party'

"It is their tax money," Madole said, which is being recklessly squandered to deny a political party with new ideas its legitimate constitutional rights."

The NRP has not incurred legal costs in this case. It is represented by the American Civil Liberties Union, which makes no charge of its clients.

"Why not let the people hear our ideas and form opinions of their own without these endless and futile attempts

to suppress our rights to use the same facilities as Democrats and Republicans?

"We are willing to place our beliefs up for acceptance or rejection by the American electorate, and you can surely do the same."

If the county decides to appeal, a decision the building committee will presumably make shortly, the court order directing the county to let the NRP use its facility will be automatically stayed.

Madole, contacted at his home in New York, said plans for the rally were well under way. He said he intended to speak. Henry Nuessleine, a member of the party's "security echelon," also might speak, Madole said.

The security echelon, garbed in storm trooper-like uniforms until they were banned New York last year, provides the "muscle" to protect party speakers, Madole said.

Several carloads

He said he expected to bring "several carloads" of "SE" members with him to Newburgh.

Nuessleine also heads a group called "consumers and taxpayers," a Brooklyn-

based NRP affiliate.

Madole said both intend to discuss "party views" at the July rally.

Along with copies of the letter to Barnes, were two flyers outlying NRP and CAT viewpoints. Both were vehement attacks against Israel and American Jews.

Madole said the handouts were similar to those passed out last week at a Times Square NRP demonstration in support of the Arab states.

The NRP flyer "in the name of justice" demands the United States take such moves as blockading Israel until Israel withdraws to the Palestine partition boundaries; rearm Jordan; prosecute all Zionist officials and fund-raisers for Israel under the foreign agents registration act; and try Israel leaders like Gen. Moshe Dayan, for "Crimes against humanity."

'Wanted for murder'

The CAT flyer shows Dayan's picture with those of other leaders like Abba Eban, under a banner reading "Wanted for Murder."

Both handouts point to the Israel attack on a U.S. communications craft in which 34 Americans were killed.

Orange committee may act on NRP

GOSHEN

The Building and Insurance Committee of the Orange County Board of Supervisor will meet in Goshen Wednesday, possibly to consider the question of the National Renaissance Party.

The NRP is not yet on the agenda, committee chairman Adrian DeWitt, R-Town of Crawford, said Thursday. But he said if the committee is asked for a recommendation concerning the NRP, it would make one.

The neo-Nazi NRP has been given the go-ahead by the courts to use the county's Newburgh courthouse for its party rallies. NRP national director James H. Madole said the party plans to hold a rally July 29.

The county has the choice of appealing a recent State Court of Appeals decision, or allowing the NRP to go ahead with its rally.

DeWitt, said County Attorney Thomas R. Hadaway would be at the building committee's regular meeting Wednesday. The committee is in charge of all county buildings, and would be the one to make a recommendation to the supervisors concerning the NRP.

The strongest voice, however, may prove to be Hadaway's and it is expected he will advise the county not to fight the NRP. This is the advice he gave to the board of supervisors two years ago, and which the board chose to ignore.

Since then, the county has met the NRP in court battles three times, losing the last in the State Court of Appeals.

Orange committee ignores appeal avenue in NRP case

Orange County probably won't try to halt a scheduled National Renaissance Party rally at the county's Newburgh courthouse. The board of supervisors' influential buildings and insurance

committee Wednesday decided to submit to a court order directing the county to let the NRP use the courthouse.

After a meeting with County Attorney Thomas R. Hadaway, the committee declined to recommend that the board take its

only remaining out-an appeal of a state Court of Appeals decision on which the court order is based.

The committee's action, or lack of it, is an indication that the mood of the board is to let NRP go ahead with its rally, set for July 28.

The buildings committee has jurisdiction over all buildings in the county and had the task of recommending whether Orange should take action.

A resolution calling for appeal may still be introduced at the supervisors' July 14 meeting, but it apparently would not have the backing of the buildings committee or county attorney.

Burton C. Cosman, R-Town of Newburgh, committee members said, "As of the present time, we're inclined to go along with the court order." He added, "The court more or less made up our minds for us."

The Court of Appeals in a decision last month, ruled that the county had to allow NRP--as a political party--to use the courthouse. The board in 1965 passed a resolution barring any group other than a political party from the courthouse. It then turned down an NRP application, on the grounds that the neo-Nazi organization is not a proper political party.

After a two-year battle in three courts, NRP finally won its case. The Court of Appeals ruled that NRP "is" a political party and should be allowed to use the courthouse.

Dutchess County Supreme Court Justice Leonard Supple shortly afterwards signed an order making the decision effective.

If the county does decide to appeal, it will have to go to the U.S. Supreme Court.

For approximately three weeks news items have been appearing in papers in Orange County that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) would hold a rally in the court house in Newburgh, N.Y., on 7/29/67.

According to an article which appeared in the 7/12/67 issue of the "Times Herald-Record", Middletown, NY, daily newspaper, the Newburgh Chapter of the NAACP had made plans to hold a mass protest at that rally.

The article related that a meeting was held on Tuesday (7/11/67) at which the housing chairman urged that the "people of Newburgh stand up against these bigots, the worst kind of bigots". It was also stated that "the national organization (NAACP) is ready to come into Newburgh at the drop of a hat".

The article further relates that at the meeting it was stated that if the NRP takes it upon themselves to hold a rally they must be prepared to pay the consequences.

It appears that this is a situation which is basically explosive. Liaison has been established with the NY State Police and with the Newburgh PD in order that the NYO may be kept appraised of developments prior to the actual meeting as well as what transpires at the rally itself.

At this time there is some contradiction as to where the rally will take place, either in the court house or on the court house steps. If it is the latter and held in the open, the writer plans physical coverage while if it is held inside coverage will be afforded through State Police representatives.

Newburgh NAACP maps protest of July 29 rally by neo-Nazi NRP

By ED KLEIN

NEWBURGH

The Newburgh National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Tuesday voted, unanimously to stage a mass protest at a July 29 rally of the Neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party (NRP).

The local NAACP chapter will be bolstered by members from other areas, acting President Tyrone Crabb said. The protest, he said has the endorsement of the national NAACP.

In a meeting that moved like greased lightning, the chapter also:

Claimed discrimination against negroes employed at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point; Strengthened its stand against Broadway merchants who do not hire non-white personnel; Took issue with the city's Human Relations Commission.

The NRP, which, after a series of court battles won the right to use the Orange County Court house in Newburgh for a rally, should not be allowed to "preach their hate without resistance," Crabb said. He called on the local chapter to demonstrate in protest.

"We must let them know that we don't like what they stand for," Crabb said. "We must not allow ourselves to be lazy."

Crabb, who took over the NAACP helm in a recent fast sequence of events triggered by the resignation of Ellsworth V. Potter, promised the chapter that "the national (NAACP) organization is ready to come into Newburgh at the drop of a hat."

Wilfred Sayles, chapter housing chairman urged that the people of Newburgh "stand up against these bigots, the worst kind of bigots."

"Let them know," he said, "that we won't tolerate what they stand for."

Sayles said that the chapter should exert every force to stem the NRP rally and keep the neo-Nazi political party from gaining a foothold in Newburgh.

An earlier move to urge everyone to stay away from

the NRP rally, leaving the neo-Nazis to preach to empty streets, gained little support. Crabb, in objecting to the stay-away method, said: "The black man, in the past, has always taken the path of least resistance and if he does it now he will lose. If the NRP is going to take it upon itself to hold a rally in Newburgh, it must be prepared to pay the consequences."

Raymond Davies, a member of both the NAACP and the City Human Relations Commission, suggested that the NAACP place rebuttal speakers on the platform with the NRP. The suggestion was taken under advisement.

With the groundwork laid, Sayles moved the following which met with unanimous chapter approval:

That the Newburgh NAACP chapter is "going to confront the National Renaissance Party to protest and demonstrate against what the NRP stands for."

That the Newburgh NAACP does not "want to see a hate group like the NRP get a foothold in this community."

The Newburgh chapter will do everything in its power to prevent an influx of neo-Nazi ideology.

The NAACP executive committee, Crabb in the chair, appointed itself to serve as coordinator for the demonstration. The committee will map plans Friday at 7 in the Plaice Cafe, 87 Water St., and invited the public to attend and participate.

In accusing West Point of discriminatory practices, Crabb said that he and Newburgh Attorney Otto Williams had met with a representative of the State Civil Service Commission and alleged discriminated in hiring civilian personnel and the assignment of military staff.

Crabb charged that the West Point Band, which he called a "showpiece of the country," contained no Negro members. He noted that indigorous proficiency in music is one of the Negro's attributes and said that West Point

could not claim that there were no qualified Negro applicants. He said that if integration and opportunities to Negroes are not opened up at West Point "we will be forced to take action."

Turning to Negro employment opportunities in Newburgh, the group strengthened a previous stand concerning economic sanctions against merchants who discriminate in hiring.

The group pledged to put pressure on "the uptown stores" to hire Negroes and to concentrate its attention on Broadway stores.

"Outside of a few," Crabb said, "The stores are all lily-white. We want to see some black people working there."

We want action. And if it means throwing up picket lines and tying up banks I want to see it.

We will march and continue to march until we see some black people working on Broadway.

The formal motion said the local chapter "will embark upon a selective trading campaign, discouraging trade at places which practice discrimination and unfair employment while encouraging business in those businesses that hire on an equal basis."

Police Plan Readied for NRP Rally

Newburgh City Manager Paul L. McCauley said Thursday that preliminary plans for police disposition at a rally of the National Renaissance Party have been completed.

The neo-Nazi organization plans to hold a rally at the Orange County Courthouse in Newburgh on July 29.

The Newburgh Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People plans to demonstrate because the NRP is anti-Negro as well as anti-Jewish.

Mr. McCauley said that final police plans will be completed shortly before the rally takes place.

City and state police as well as deputies from the Orange County Sheriff's Office will be on hand to maintain order, Mr. McCauley said.

The Sheriff's Department has jurisdiction on the county grounds while the city is responsible for actions on city property.

Executives Of NAACP Plan Protest

Tyrone Crabb, acting president of the NAACP, had no comment for newsmen following the meeting at the Plaice Cafe, 87 Water St.

During a membership meeting Tuesday, the NAACP voted to begin plans for a "mass demonstration" to protest the rally by the NRP. The NRP has been described by Mr. Crabb and others as a "neo-Nazi, anti-Negro, anti-semitic political organization."

The NRP recently was awarded court costs in a battle with the Orange County supervisors over use of the court house for NRP meetings.

The New York State Court of Appeals ruled that the board must allow the NRP, as other political parties, to use the courthouse facilities.

Mr. Crabb indicated that final plans and a statement for the public would be made available next week.

ALBANY, June 15 (AP). — The state's highest court ruled today that the National Renaissance party was entitled to use the Orange County court houses for meetings.

The Court of Appeals overruled, 6 to 1, a lower court decision that upheld the county's refusal to make the facilities available.

The County Board of Supervisors in 1965 made the court houses in Goshen and Newburgh available for meetings

by political parties. When the Renaissance party sought to use them, the supervisors refused on the ground that it was not a political party but a "fascist" and "subversive" organization. The case then went to court.

Chief Judge Stanley H. Fuld of the Court of Appeals dismissed the argument that hostility by veteran's groups toward the party's activities would cause a disturbance. If there was one, Judge Fuld wrote, "the fault would surely lie with those who objected to the views expounded and not with the speakers."

A member of the NAACP and the City Human Relations Commission, suggested that the NAACP place rebuttal speakers on the platform with the NRP.

In addition, CRABE accused West Point of discriminating practices in hiring civilian personnel and the assignment of military staff and charged that the West Point Band "show-piece of the country" contained no Negro members. He stated West Point could not claim there were no qualified Negro applicants because music is one of the Negro's attributes.

The group pledged to put pressure on "the uptown stores" to hire Negroes and CRABE said that "Outside of a few.....the stores are all lily whites." He stated he wanted action and if it means throwing up picket lines and tying up banks, he wanted to see it.

[redacted] advised SA [redacted] on 7/19/67, that the NRP planned a demonstration at the Orange County Courthouse, Newburgh, NY, from 7:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. on 7/19/67.

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SA JOHN J. TUCKER, JR., Resident Agent at Suffern, NY, as of 7/13/67, was maintaining liaison with the NY State Police and the police department at Newburgh, NY, for any developments.

Since the NAACP plans to demonstrate to the point of tying up banks, and inasmuch as the NRP plans its rally starting at 7:30 p.m., it appears the NAACP is using the NRP rally as an excuse to bring people to Newburgh, as the banks are not open at 7:30 p.m.

In the event the foregoing NRP rally takes place, the NYO will submit an LHM, under this caption, however, in the event no activity takes place, which has been the case of previous scheduled NRP functions which are later cancelled, no LHM will be submitted under this caption. The Bureau will be advised by separate communication of the results.

Newburgh mayor to supervisors: 'Appeal NRP decision, halt rally'

NEWBURGH Mayor Joseph X. Mullin, Tuesday asked the Orange County Board of Supervisors to prevent the neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party (NRP) from meeting in Newburgh July 29.

In related action the Newburgh NAACP met secretly with City Manager Paul L. McCauley, who apparently tried to convince NAACP leaders not to clash with the NRP.

The NAACP had planned to demonstrate against the rally. After the session, NAACP President Tyronne Crabb reaffirmed the NAACP's intention to rally.

In a third action, the city's human relations committee dispatched telegrams to community leaders calling them together to discuss possible conflict between the NAACP and the NRP.

In his letter to the Supervisors, Mullin cited the possibility of "strife and violence" if the NRP were allowed to meet in the county courthouse on Grand Street. He urged them to carry the county's case against the NRP to federal courts, thus forestalling the July 29 rally.

The State Court of Appeals recently ruled that the supervisors could not deny permission to the NRP to use county courthouses if it permits major political parties to use them.

Mullin said he was "very much concerned" about the county giving permission to the NRP to use the courthouse.

"We are now faced with a very serious problem because we have been advised by the (NAACP) that it intends to picket the courthouse at the time of the meeting," Mullin said.

"As you are well aware, this could lead to all sorts of strife and violence in the City of Newburgh and . . . could conceivably result in the type of incident which has been occurring in cities such as Newark, Rochester, Cleveland, and other areas."

The mayor asked the supervisors to call a special meeting to carry out the wishes of the residents of Newburgh and stall, if not cancel, the planned rally.

"Since your remedies and the state courts have been exhausted," the mayor wrote, "the board could direct the county attorney

to seek redress in the federal courts.

"On behalf of the citizens of the City of Newburgh, I cannot urge you too strongly to take immediate action along these lines. I feel that all of us must do everything in our power to prevent any possible incident occurring . . . which could cause injuries and possible loss of life to citizens of the City of Newburgh."

Albert C. Howell, R-Mt. Hope, chairman of the board of supervisors, said, "Up to the present time it has been the policy not to go further with the matter."

"It is a matter for our legal department, and they will have to look into it."

"We have not been in communication with the NAACP. All our dealings have been with the NRP. This letter of the mayor's will be given consideration."

Supervisor Joseph Gaynor of Newburgh's Sixth Ward, said he would favor preventing all political parties from using the courthouse to prevent the NRP from using it.

Newburgh bars rally by NRP, cites fire laws

NEWBURGH

The City of Newburgh Monday barred the neo-Nazi National Renaissance Party (NRP) from holding a rally at the Orange County courthouse in Newburgh Saturday, but the NRP said it would defy the ban and hold the rally anyway.

"We'll meet on the courthouse steps or lawn if necessary," NRP national director James H. Madole of New York said.

"If he does, he'll be arrested," declared City Manager Paul I. McCauley.

Earlier in the day a team of city fire and building inspectors checked the county facility, McCauley said, and found it does not conform to city safety regulations. Since it does not, he said, the rally is off.

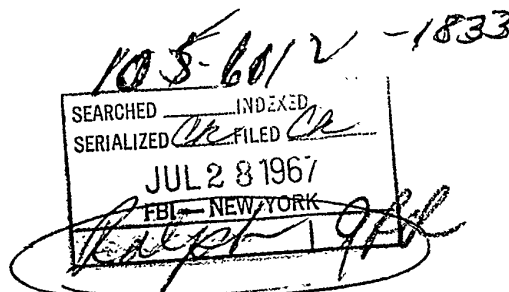
McCauley explained that under the city's fire prevention code, the responsibility for insuring that the building is safe when used by other than its principal tenant is the city's. He said there are not enough fire exits in the building and "fire-prevention-wise, it's generally unsuitable."

Madole said the city's action was not more than a tactic to block the rally. The denial, he said, is an attempt to get around a state Court of Appeals ruling granting the NRP the right to use the county facility. Legal action, he said, will be taken.

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) several weeks ago had announced plans to stage a protest rally if the NRP rally went on as scheduled. There was no immediate word Monday from the NAACP as to whether McCauley's ruling would alter NAACP plans.

City and state police, as well as the Orange County Sheriff's office had been alerted for possible trouble during the rally and counter-rally.

(D) INVESTIGATIONS OF KLAN AND HATE-TYPE ORGANIZATIONS AND ASSOCIATED INDIVIDUALS - (DISSEMINATION OF KLAN REPORTS AND LETTERHEAD MEMORANDA) -- The Counter-intelligence Division, Directorate of Special Investigations, Department of the Air Force, and the Commander, Naval Intelligence Command, have requested that the Bureau modify its policy for dissemination of Klan matters to their agencies.

In accordance with the requests made, all future dissemination to the Air Force of Klan reports should be limited to organizational reports, and reports and letterhead memoranda showing significant trends and developments within the Klan groups. Dissemination of Klan reports and letterhead memoranda concerning individuals should no longer be made to the Air Force with the exception of those containing information of Air Force interest, such as the involvement of U. S. Air Force military or civilian personnel.

In the event there is any doubt as to whether Klan reports or letterhead memoranda on individuals should be disseminated to the Air Force, resolve the doubt by disseminating.

The Navy made a similar request of the Bureau, however, stated that this request pertained only to dissemination of Klan matters to Naval Headquarters in Washington, D. C. In view of this, you should continue disseminating all Klan reports and letterhead memoranda to the regional offices of the Navy.

Concerning hate-group organizations and members, dissemination of all reports and letterhead memoranda should be made to the Army, Navy, and Air Force.

In the event information is developed which is of interest to another agency in the Executive Branch of the Government, this information should be disseminated to that agency.

D. Security Echelon (SE)

The SE is selected from the membership of the NRP. The purpose of the SE is supposedly to protect the leaders of the NRP when they are speaking at public rallies. The SE also joins in NRP picket lines. The SE uniform consists of black shoes or boots, black socks, gray pants, gray shirts, black tie with NRP emblem on a tie pin, gray cap with NRP emblem, black Sam Brown Belt, arm band with NRP insignia, and shoulder epilets with various devices to indicate rank. There is also a women's division in which the dress is the same, except that a gray shirt and stockings are worn in place of the pants and socks. Although these uniforms continue to be the official uniforms of the SE, since approximately July 1, 1966, they have not been worn in public in conformity with Section 1484-A of the New York State Penal Law.

C. Public Gatherings, Demonstrations
and Literature Distributions

"The Times Herald Record" a newspaper of Middletown, New York, in its issue dated December 23, 1966, on page 10, columns 1 and 2, contained an article entitled "Civil Liberties Union bows out of Nazi case". The article stated that the Newburgh, New York, city attorney denied the NRP the right to use sound equipment at a rally during the summer of 1966, and as a result the NRP rally was called off. The city attorney claimed only authorized political parties are allowed to use sound equipment and that the NRP was not a political party. The article continued that the New York Civil Liberties Union (NYCLU) which already represents the "Neo-Nazi NRP" in a legal dispute with the Orange County,

New York, Board of Supervisors, on the right to use the Newburgh Courthouse for a public meeting, declined to take up the NRP's battle with the city of Newburgh, New York, over the right to meet publicly because the NYCLU claimed it did not have the manpower.

On January 11, 1967, a few NRP members set up a picket line in front of the American Jewish Congress (AJC) on East 84th Street between 5th Avenue and Madison Avenue, New York City, because the AJC was holding a meeting with the German Consul concerning the rise of Neo-Naziism in West Germany. The pickets were holding signs such as "Communism is Jewish", and "Fight Communism, Join the NRP". The demonstration lasted from about 7:15 p.m., to 8:30 p.m., with no incidents taking place.

[redacted] Brooklyn District Attorney's Office, Brooklyn, New York, on January 20, 1967, advised that a single individual who claimed to be a member of the NRP, was distributing literature of an anti-Negro and anti-Jewish nature on the streets in Brooklyn, New York, on that date. In substance, the literature made remarks about food articles and products indicating "K" for Kosher on some items which stated the Kosher items were over-priced and the purchasers were being "fleeced" by the Jews because the distributor had to pay a Rabbi to get the Kosher seal. [redacted] stated this individual had been reprimanded by him and released.

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Several individuals from the NRP demonstrated on February 4, 1967, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m., in front of Random House Publishers, New York City, and passed out leaflets against the book "The Passover Plot" which was being published by Random House.

An NRP sponsored demonstration was held on the 50th Street side of the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, New York City, from 8:30 p.m., to 10:00 p.m., on February 10, 1967,

protesting a meeting of the Urban League. Most of the signs were anti-Negro such as "Race-Mixing Breeds Mongrelization" and "Negroes Want Everything". No incidents were reported.

On February 23, 1967, it was announced that on Saturday, February 25, 1967, from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m., members of the NRP would distribute anti-Semitic literature at Rockefeller Center at 50th Street and 5th Avenue, New York City.

On February 25, 1967, several members of the NRP distributed anti-Jewish and anti-Negro literature on "The Passover Plot" and the "Urban League" at Fifth Avenue and 49th and 50th Streets, New York City. The source could furnish no additional information.

The NRP held a counter-picketing with other unknown conservative groups at 44th Street and Broadway, New York City, on June 3, 1967, to protest the picketing taking place across the street by individuals who opposed the war in Vietnam. One of the signs carried by the NRP read "the only Communist is a dead one, Victory in Vietnam". The anti-Vietnam demonstrators were described as "Peace Creeps" and "Beatniks".

The NRP planned to picket the Biltmore Hotel, 43rd Street and Madison Avenue, New York, New York, on March 16, 1967, in protest against DAVID BEN GURION, former premier of Israel, who would be the honored guest at a B'nai Brith banquet at the Biltmore Hotel on that date.

The picketing of DAVID BEN GURION was called off by JAMES MADOLE, NRP leader on March 16, 1967, just prior to the time it was scheduled to commence. No reason was given for this action.

A planned picketing of DAVID BEN GURION, to have been held at the Biltmore Hotel, New York City, on March 16, 1967, where GURION was staying was cancelled. It was stated that the demonstration was to be held because GURION was in the United States to ask for money for the State of Israel but when JAMES MADOLE of the NRP could not find out the time he would make the appeal for the money, the picketing was called off.

There would be a counter-demonstration by the NRP on April 15, 1967, at 59th Street and Sixth Avenue, New York, New York, at 11:00 a.m., to counter the demonstration and march for peace to be staged by the "peace creeps".

On March 28, 1967, "The Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper, indicated that a committee entitled "Committee for the 81st celebration of May Day" had been formed and would sponsor the annual May Day celebration in Union Square, New York, New York, on May 1, 1967.

On May 1, 1967, Special Agents (SAS) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed the annual May Day proceedings at Union Square, New York, New York, which proceeding began at 4:30 p.m., and terminated at 7:15 p.m., the estimated crowd being between 1,500 and 2,000 people.

A counter-demonstration was conducted by about 10 individuals of the NRP who shouted anti-Communist and anti-Jewish slogans. The counter-demonstration began at about 5:00 pm. A scuffle developed between the NRP group and people from a building occupied by the International Ladies Garment Workers Union (ILGWU) at which place a union election was in progress in that building. The individuals from the ILGWU saw an individual carrying a sign with an anti-Jewish slogan, singled him away from other NRP members and began beating this individual. The New York City Police Department (NYCPD) disbanded the scuffle with mounted police. No arrests were made and the NRP was forced by the NYCPD to move their counter-demonstration to the opposite corner. The NRP group departed at ;

Some of the signs carried by the NRP read as follows:

"Zionism is treason"
"Kill the Red Peace Creeps"
"America for Whites"
"KARL MARX was a Jew".

Literature in support of the United States troops in Vietnam would be distributed by the NRP on May 13, 1967, during the parade to support the Vietnam War to be held in New York City on that date, at 12:30 p.m., at 62nd Street and Third Avenue, New York, New York.

The NRP scheduled a protest rally at 192nd Street and Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York, at 1:00 p.m., on July 4, 1967. Participants were expected to burn a couple of Viet Cong flags and to generally protest the activities of the individuals who oppose the United States policy in Vietnam. The NRP is in favor of the United States policy in Vietnam and want to exhibit their support of this policy.

According to the records of BSS, NYCPD, which were checked by SA GENE R. RALPH on July 5, 1967, there were a few individuals at the above mentioned demonstration, all of whom paraded in an orderly fashion. According to BSS, there were no incidents, no burning of any Viet Cong flags, and no arrests were made as the activity lasted for a very short period of time.

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At 6:05 p.m., on July 15, 1967, there were six unidentified white men distributing literature on Myrtle Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, in the area bounded by Gates Avenue and Fresh Pond Road. One circular was captioned "Has your mother been Raped yet", and set forth various crimes committed by Negroes. A notation at the bottom informed the reader that further information was obtainable by contacting the National Renaissance Party, 10 West 90th Street, New York, New York.

Forthcoming Activity

"The Evening News" in an article entitled "Police Plan Readied for NRP Rally", which appeared in its July 14, 1967, edition on page 2, indicated the NRP planned to hold a rally at the Orange County Courthouse, Newburgh, New York, on July 29, 1967, and that the Newburgh Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) planned to counter-demonstrate because the NRP was anti-Negro and anti-Jewish. The article continued that Newburgh City Manager PAUL L. MC CAULEY stated preliminary plans for police disposition at the rally have been completed and that city and state police as well as deputies from the Orange County Sheriff's Office would be on hand to maintain order.

The "Times Herald Record" in its edition of July 12, 1967, on page 8 contained an article "Newburgh NAACP Maps Protest of July 29 rally by neo-Nazi NRP". This article related that the acting president of the Newburgh Chapter of the NAACP, TYRONE CRABB, said the protest has the endorsement of the National NAACP and that the local chapter will be bolstered by members from other areas. CRABB promised that "the National (NAACP) organization was ready to come into Newburgh at the drop of a hat". The NAACP local chapter also claimed discrimination against Negroes employed at the United States Military Academy at West Point, and strengthened its stand against Broadway merchants in Newburgh, New York, who do not hire non-white personnel. The NAACP took issue with the city's Human Relations Committee. A member of the NAACP and the City Human Relations Commission, suggested that the

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NAACP place rebuttal speakers on the platform with the NRP. In addition, CRABB accused West Point of discriminatory practices in hiring civilian personnel and the assignment of military staff and charged that the West Point Band "showplace of the country" contained no Negro members. He stated West Point could not claim there were no qualified Negro applicants because music is one of the Negro's attributes. The group pledged to put pressure on "the uptown stores" to hire Negroes and CRABB said that "Outside of a few... the stores are all lily white." He stated he wanted action and if it means throwing up picket lines and "tying" up banks, he wanted to see it.

The NRP planned a demonstration at the Orange County Courthouse, Newburgh, New York, from 7:30 p.m., to 10:30 p.m., on July 29, 1967.

Small contributions are received from NRP members at meetings and JAMES MADOLE obtains some money from the sale of books written by other individuals and recommended for reading by MADOLE. There is also some profit made from bulk orders of reprints of pamphlets and leaflets distributed by the NRP.

V. PUBLICATIONS AND LITERATURE

1. An 8½ inch by 10 inch printed leaflet bearing the name of the National Renaissance Party, New York, New York, contained a sketch of a young Negro male attacking a white female child with the following printed thereunder: "The Right to Rape Your Daughter". The leaflet reprinted articles which appeared in various newspapers pertaining to Negro crimes of rape and knifings which occurred in the recent press. At the bottom of the form appeared the following statement, "White Man,

How much does it take to make you Fight? Join the NRP and Fight for your race". The leaflet then states for more information communicate with the National Renaissance Party.

2. An 8½ by 10 inch printed leaflet containing a photograph of the cover of the book "The Passover Plot" as written by Dr. HUGH J. SCHONFIELD plus an article which states that the above book is being distributed by Random House. This leaflet reprinted an advertisement for the above book which is as follows:

"The Passover Plot" asserts - and presents detailed documentation as proof - that Jesus planned his own arrest, crucifixion, and resurrection; that he arranged to be drugged on the cross, simulating death, so that he could later be safely removed, revived and thus bear out the Messianic prophecies. Never before has a book stirred so mighty a tempest as this. We urge you to read it first, then argue - Washington News".

The leaflet then attacked the above reprinted advertisement by claiming the above book was "The Plot to Destroy Christianity" claiming that Satan and his invisible force hate the name of Jesus Christ more than anything in the universe. The leaflet stated that Satan in these latter days has employed every seductive and deceptive force at his command, to destroy your belief in Jesus Christ.

3. An 8½ by 10 inch printed flyer soliciting membership in the NRP contained the following information:

"The National Renaissance Party which has the reputation of a direct action organization rather than a debating society or a right-wing letter writers club is addressing this recruitment leaflet to every physically fit White American between the ages of 16 and 40. The Security Echelon (SE) section of the NRP is being organized to defend White neighborhoods from rampaging Black Mobs and

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to counteract the hordes of filthy Jewish Beatniks, sexual deviates, and Communist organizers whose Peace Parades in all major American cities are stabbing our heroic fighters in Vietnam between the shoulder blades.

"The John Birch Society will not free America from these marching hordes of malcontents by writing letters to their Congressmen which are promptly filed in the waste paper basket or answered by form letters. The Conservatives and BILLY JAMES HARGIS will not pray these marching columns of American Reds out of existence. Nearly half the world has fallen under the Red Banner and still these nincompoops keep hollering out their prayers interspersed with fund raising appeals.

"Our elected officials will only pay heed to their right-wing constituents when they see the blood-crazed hordes of Black revolutionaries which have spread a reign of fear and terror in Los Angeles, Chicago, Cleveland, Philadelphia, Rochester, et cetera, beaten into the ground by thousands of equally fanatical young white men in the gray, black, and gold uniforms of a militant white man's party. When the fanatical disciples who shriek "Burn Baby Burn" and "Let's Kill Whitey" are driven back into their primitive Black environment by infuriated thousands of Whites, politicians will stop licking the boots of their Jewish taskmasters and help the National Renaissance Party to build a White Man's empire from the Arctic Ocean to the Gulf of Mexico.

"Only uniformed masses of young White Patriots can hope to achieve the unity of purpose to force our politicians to mend their traitorous ways. Apply for an interview to join the SE of the NRP....."

VI. NRP WINS COURT CASE

"The Evening News", a local newspaper of Newburgh, New York, in its issue of June 16, 1967, on page 1-A, contained an article entitled "Appeals Court Grants Use of Courthouse to NRP", which related that the New York State Court of Appeals granted the NRP permission to use the Newburgh, New York, courthouse. A decision of an appeal to the United

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States Supreme Court was made inasmuch as the permission to use the Courthouse was resting with the Orange County Board of Supervisors. County Attorney THOMAS A. HADAWAY stated he would discuss the decision with the Board's Building Committee so the committee would recommend a course of action on which the full board would act. JAMES MADOLE, National Director of the NRP in New York City, stated he would await word on the county's decision on appeal before applying for use of the courthouse. The appeal would hold everything in abeyance until a decision was reached.

The "Times Herald Record", a local newspaper of Middletown, New York, in its issue dated July 6, 1967, on page 5, contained an article entitled "Orange Committee Ignores Appeal Avenue in NRP Case", which related that Orange County would not try to halt a scheduled NRP rally at the Newburgh, New York, courthouse. The article related that the board of supervisors' influential buildings and insurance committee decided to submit to a court order directing the county to let the NRP use the courthouse and County Attorney THOMAS R. HADAWAY declined to recommend that the board take its only remaining out, an appeal of a State Court of Appeals decision on which the court order was based. The article related that after a two-year battle, and in three courts, the NRP finally won its case.

VI. AFFILIATION WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

JAMES MADOLE of the NRP of New York City, was expected to be a guest speaker before a group called the "White Party of America" in Alexandria, Virginia, to be held on March 19, 1967. The source could furnish no additional information.

On March 13, 1967, [redacted] the White Party of America (WPA) visited the FBI office at Alexandria, Virginia, and advised that his office would be campaign headquarters for the "WALLACE for President" campaign commencing on March 20, 1967. He stated the WPA is a racist-type organization with approximately 50 members, the majority of whom are from the Metropolitan area of "Washington, D.C. He stated the WPA is political in nature,

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non-subversive, and adheres completely to the constitution of the United States.

[] stated JAMES MADOLE of the NRP in New York City, and nine others would attend a WPA meeting in Alexandria, Virginia, on March 19, 1967, where MADOLE would be a guest speaker.

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On March 19, 1967, JAMES MADOLE the leader of the NRP from New York City, gave a principal speech before the WPA, Alexandria, Virginia, at which time MADOLE's speech consisted of words of hatred against the Communists in the United States.

A group of ten men, from the NRP in New York City, visited a meeting of the WPA on Sunday, March 19, 1967, in Alexandria, Virginia, and JAMES MADOLE, the NRP leader gave the principal speech which consisted of words of hatred against the Jews, the Negroes, and the Communists, in the United States. No other racist organizations were represented at this meeting and no plans for rallies or other functions were formulated for the future.

At the WPA meeting held on March 19, 1967, at Alexandria, Virginia, JAMES MADOLE, leader of the NRP gave a speech. He spoke about the Negro and Jewish problems in the United States, stating that the Christians of America, are being exploited by the Jews. He stated the Negroes of America gained their power through the Jews who control them. He stated the Wall Street Jews do not want to end the war in Vietnam because they will lose billions of dollars. He added that the gentiles make-up almost the entire army force in Vietnam because the Jews of draft age, have obtained college deferments. He stated President JOHNSON does not want to end the war in Vietnam in order to keep the Jews happy. He said the Jews are trying to take over the country with the Negroes as "lackeys" under their control. He added that the Jews in 1913, started to take over the government by the institution of the Federal Reserve Act whereby they could have greater control of the country's money even though Congress should have this control. He stated the white people of America are to be blamed because this country is being destroyed right under the noses of the white Christians. He added that the white people made America great, but they are letting Jews take it away.

After this speech, MADOLE got a standing ovation.

1.WHITE PARTY OF AMERICA

On September 16, 1965, [redacted] identified himself as [redacted] the White Party of America (WPA), advised that he, along with several other former members of the American Nazi Party (ANP), formed the WPA during the early part of 1964, in order to advance the cause of the white man in the United States and eventually throughout the world.

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This organization was officially launched on April 11, 1964, when it sponsored picketing in Washington, D. C., Richmond, Virginia, and Baltimore, Maryland, in opposition to civil rights legislation and civil rights demonstrations. Its national headquarters was transferred from 1216 New York Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., to 1019 King Street, Alexandria, Virginia, on April 1, 1965.

It was initially the aim of the WPA to sponsor picketings and demonstrations where it was believed such would be of value and to publicize its program through pamphlets and similar media. The WPA has been inactive due to a lack of funds and its only publications to date have been the April and May, 1964, issues of its official publications, "The White Letter."

He added that the WPA is still in the formative stage but it will uphold the Constitution of the United States and will always act within the limits of the law. He noted that the WPA will serve as a "home for people who want to preserve the white race" and cannot find a home for themselves in either of the major political parties in the United States.

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Racist Speakers Taunted During Boisterous Rally

By ROBERT RICHARDS

In a furious, disorderly, chaotic shouting and screaming session, the Renaissance Party met at the courthouse and argued its racial program Saturday night in Newburgh.

James Madole, director of the NRP and Robert Burros, Newburgh area director, were the only speakers. When they opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. there were 26 Negroes in an audience of 40.

After 10 minutes of shouting and disturbances, many of the Negroes moved out of the meeting to the cry of "Let's Go, man!"

It was only 8 p.m. — the meeting barely 10 minutes old — and the audience had dwindled to three Negroes and nine whites. In the torrid opening 10 minutes, sheriff's deputies had to close around one Negro who had been demanding that the NRP shut off its phonograph records.

Throughout the next hour and 40 minutes groups of persons came in by the half-dozen and left by the half dozen. At no time after the walkout and until the wild session ended one hour and 40 minutes later did the audience number more than 19 persons.

The neo-Nazi speakers, as expected, pounded away on racial

themes and Madole claimed the white race is menaced by a colored revolution throughout the world led by 740 million Chinese.

He said the destruction of Hitler paved the way for the world colored revolution. Madole infuriated the Negroes in the audience when he compared them unfavorably to the Chinese in the United States.

He said the Chinese were hijacked off ships and worked as slaves in the United States but today they own their own businesses, keep to themselves, speak their own language and keep up their heritage while the Negro has lost his heritage and burns down cities. He said the Chinese achieved their success in the United States without the help of the white race.

Madole told the Negroes, "You need a black national community but it doesn't come about by burning cities."

Madole said he is proud of being a white man and white racist. He said black and white leadership must work together to build up separate black and white communities. He said the integration program has brought nothing but trouble to the Negroes.

Burros pounded away against the Newburgh urban renewal program. Once again, as expect-

ed, he ranted against what he called was Jewish domination of urban renewal and liberal programs.

He claimed that Alan Lasher's appointment as administrator for the city UR Agency was made on basis of his being the son of Mrs. Sadie Lasher, assistant City Court judge. He said it was also made because Mrs. Lasher is Jewish and a "Democratic liberal."

At one point in the wild session, Jeremiah Gutman, New York City attorney who represents the NRP for the American Civil Liberties Union, clashed verbally with Burros. The flareup came when Burros continued with his ridiculous assertions of Jewish domination which he claimed even extended to the control of boxing.

Gutman, who is Jewish, said, "I represent the Civil Liberties Union and I got a court order to get you crackpots in here. There are no Jews in control of boxing and I challenge your statement."

He told Burros, "The fact that your father was Jewish doesn't mean that you talk for all Jews."

Burros did not answer Gutman.

Burros said he believes in "white power for white people in white neighborhoods and black

power for black people in black neighborhoods." At one time, in the worst Hitlerian fashion, Burros heaped blame on the Jews.

A white man stood up and said he was Christian and took exception to these remarks by Burros. He asked what Burros intended to do with the Jews and Burros said he would answer later but did not.

Madole said he had fought for 2½ years to speak in Newburgh and now that he was speaking Negroes were starting riots. As the meeting continued to go around in circles there were shouts from the streets below surrounding the courthouse.

Several times during the meeting the deputies had to restrain Negroes. One man made for the NRP with a cane but the deputies turned him back.

The speakers stood behind the judge's bench which they draped with a large green banner centered by a golden eagle with stiffly spread wings which was a reminder of the Nazi symbol.

Their flag was red with a white ball in the center parted by a black lightning bolt. They also had an American flag and opened the meeting with the playing of the Star Spangled Banner.

The NRP showed up with 11 men and a boy. All stood at attention in a single line in front of Madole and Burros as they spoke. They wore no uniforms. All had white shirts with black ties and NRP buttons on the shirts. They wore black trousers and black shoes.

The man who first spoke as a Christian identified himself as a Baptist minister. He told the NRP, "You said that you were warned that if you came to Newburgh it would be a tinder box and there would be riots. Why did you come?"

Madole said, "Others besides the Democrats and Republicans should have a voice."

One Negro asked if they could join the NRP.

Madole said, "No. Not any more than I could join the Black Muslims. I told you I am a white racist and proud of it."

"Do you have the same belief as Hitler?" a Negro woman asked.

Burros said, "We are not the same but we believe in a strong authoritarian government." He added that he was dedicated to defending the white race.

"What do you call the white race?" a Negro asked.

Madole replied, "The Anglo-Saxon, Nordic, Celtic, Slavic and Latin."

One Negro said the reason Detroit was burned down is because the Negro people are seeking recognition. Madole nodded in agreement but told them burning was not the way to achieve.

"Do you think the white race is better than us?" another Negro asked.

Madole replied, "The white race has achieved more and is more advanced culturally than the Negroes. I'm proud of being a white man and you should have pride in being a Negro."

He said the Negroes have no pride when they seek to integrate and admit that they can't teach themselves with Negro teachers in Negro schools.

One Negro woman asked, "Who made us all?"

Madole answered, "I don't know. I wasn't there."

The NRP director warned that 25 million Negroes could riot and burn cities but said the country's population is 200 million. "What do you think is going to happen to you when they turn on you?"

An EVENING NEWS reporter asked Madole after the meeting, "What do you think you accomplished by coming to Newburgh?"

Madole said, "I accomplished something in the sense that I did not allow the city manager to prevent me from meeting. The city wouldn't let white people into the meeting but the blacks came and evidently they have more privileges here than whites. The only thing that showed up was a rampaging mob."

(This was not so, according to City Manager Paul McCauley, who stood at the entrance to the courthouse before the meeting to make sure that any orderly person could enter. Firemen were stationed in the building and additional no-smoking signs posted in accordance with the city's contention that the building is a firetrap.)

(Prominently posted signs noted that the legal capacity of the room was 127 persons, although the attendance never approached that figure.)

(The only attempt to exclude anyone from the building came a few minutes before the rally began, when Sheriff Hbrace Ketcham temporarily restrained a small group of Negroes from entering. But at the suggestion of Mr. McCauley, he let them through.)

In answer to other questions, Madole said he plans to come back to Newburgh and said that no city has ever driven him out yet. On another question, Madole said that he has never said he was a Nazi.

"Then why are you against Jews?" he was asked.

Madole said he was opposing Jews only because he claimed they financed the civil rights movement and added, with satisfaction, "But it backfired. Negroes are destroying all the Jewish-owned stores. I'm not singling out Jews. If Irishmen financed the civil rights movement I would want to bash their heads in, too."

He added, "The NRP is opposed to Jews for their financing and their dual loyalty to Israel. If a German in the United States had dual loyalty to Germany, I would be against him, too."

Madole said if there was any other way to stop Negro violence without an authoritarian government he would like to hear about it. He said, "If the blacks have their way in this country no human being will be safe. It will be the same as the Congo."

When Burros was not speaking he sat with his mother, Mrs. Marion Burros and another woman who identified herself as Julia Lashowski of Newburgh.

When questioned by THE EVENING NEWS, Mrs. Lashowski said she was born in New York but was "from Austria" and had returned to Austria before the war and left it after the war. Mrs. Lashowski said she had reasons for attending the meeting which she could not discuss.

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
