PPADEN SUSPECTED THAT MDS ENGINEERING WAS PREPARING FRAUDULENT CLAIMS TO THE GOVERN-MENT FOR PAYMENT BASED ON WORK PERFORMED ON NAVAL SHIPS PURSUANT TO THE CONTRACT. UTILIZING THE BENEFITS OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMA-TION ACT (FOIA), SHE WAS ABLE TO OBTAIN DOCUMENTS SETTING FORTH THE COST ANALYSIS PLUS SUBSEQUENT CLAIMS BY MDS ENGINEERING FOR WORK PERFORMED, WHICH WERE COMPARED WITH HER OWN RECORDS. THIS DOCUMENTATION, INCLUDING HER OWN RECORDS, WERE SUBSEQUENTLY SUBPOENAED AND SUBMITTED TO A FEDERAL GRAND JUPY IN SAN DIFGO.

ON NOVEMBER 4, 1981, OLLIE BRADEN REQUESTED THAT THE DOCU-MENTS FURNISHED BY HER AT THE REQUEST OF THE GOVEPNMENT BE FETUPNED AS EXPEDITIOUSLY AS POSSIBLE. 



Subject DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS SERVICE (NARS) APPRAISAL OF FBIHQ AND FIELD RECORDS

Reference is made to my memoranda dated 10/13/81 and 10/19/81, captioned as above.

### **PURPOSE:**

To advise of areas of disagreement between the FBI and NARS concerning the transfer (accession) of FBI informant files to NARS and other issues related to the proposed FBI file disposition schedules, which were submitted to NARS by Order of the U.S. District Court, Washington, D. C., on 10/16/81; also to attach a self-explanatory letter dated 10/26/81 from Dr. James E. O'Neill, Assistant Archivist for Presidential Libraries and Director of the NARS FBI Appraisal Project.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

1. That the Records Management Division (RMD) continue to follow and discuss this matter with NARS and promptly report additional developments.

### SYNOPSIS AND DETAILS:

### I. BACKGROUND AND IDENTIFICATION OF ISSUES

Referenced memoranda provided background regarding the NARS proposed retention schedules for FBI records and the FBI's proposed disposition schedules, which were developed by Order of the U.S. District Court, Washington, D. C., in the civil matter "American Friends Service Committee, et al., v. William H. Webster, et al.," Civil Action Number 79-1655. The FBI's proposed disposition schedules were delivered to NARS on 10/16/81 and contained two key proposals; i.e., (1) that FBI informant files be permanently retained by the FBI and not transferred to NARS and (2) that FBI administrative and investigative files designated for permanent retention because of their historical or archival value be transferred to NARS after 50 years.

After receipt of the proposed FBIHQ schedules, representatives of NARS voiced certain objections to our proposal that administrative and investigative files designated for permanent retention be transferred after a 50-year period. NARS representatives suggested that files in specified, obsolete and/or nonsensitive classifications designated for permanent retention should be transferred to NARS after a 30-year period. NARS representatives cited the statuatory authority delegated to the Archivist of the United States as contained in Title 44, United States Code, Section 2103 to direct and effect the transfer to NARS of records of any Federal agency which have been determined to have sufficient historical or other value to warrant continued preservation by the United States Government. (See Part III for details of the Legal Counsel Division's research concerning the applicable sections of Title 44, United States Code, and case law in this area.)

On 10/19/81, three senior members of the NARS Advisory Council visited FBIHQ and were provided with a detailed explanation of the FBI's position and justification for the permanent retention of FBI informant files. Members of the NARS Advisory Council expressed their hope that the FBI would modify its position and fix some definite time frame, no matter how far in the future, for the transfer of FBI informant files to NARS. Members of the NARS Advisory Council

indicated that the permanent retention of FBI informant files would be unacceptable, inasmuch as it would establish a precedent for the permanent retention of records having historical or other value by a U.S. Government agency other than NARS. Members of the NARS Advisory Council pointed out that census records, which contain sensitive personal background information on individuals participating in the census, are being transferred to NARS 72 years after the date of the pertinent census, since this period covered the general life expectancy of individuals participating in the census. Members of the NARS Advisory Council attempted to draw an analogy between the sensitivity of information appearing in the census records and sensitivity of information appearing in FBI informant files. This analogy was rejected by RMD officials and it was pointed out that while census records may contain sensitive and/or embarrassing information concerning the individual participating in the census, this information could in no way be equated with the degree of danger to an individual FBI informant or his descendents, which would result from the public disclosure of the informant's identity and the specifics of information provided by the informant to say nothing of the chilling effect that knowledge of future disclosure would have on informant development.

On 10/22/81, RMD Section Chief Robert W. Scherrer and Assistant Director Finzel met with Dr. James E. O'Neill, supra, and his Deputy, Dr. Charles Dollar, in order to discuss issues related to the proposed disposition schedules. The specific issues discussed are outlined in Dr O'Neill's letter, which is attached. Two key issues surfaced during discussions with the aforementioned NARS officials. We insisted (1) that FBI informant files be permanently retained by the FBI and not transferred to NARS and (2) that FBI administrative and investigative files, which have been designated for permanent retention, be transferred to NARS after 50 years. Drs. O'Neill and Dollar urged that files in certain obsolete and/or nonsensitive classifications designated for permanent retention should be transferred to NARS after a 30-year period. It is believed that an accommodation with NARS can be worked out for such a transfer after 30 years in these specified classifications, instead of the 50 years recommended in the FBI's proposed disposition schedules.

The most difficult issue is the position of the FBI that all informant files be permanently retained by the FBI and not transferred to NARS. Both Drs. O'Neill and Dollar indicated

it would be advantageous for the FBI to set a definite time frame for transfer of informant files to NARS, no matter how extended that time frame might be. For example, the suggestion was made that FBI informant files be transferred to NARS 100 or 150 years after the informant had been discontinued. The FBI's position opposing the transfer of any informant files to NARS, as outlined in Part II of this memorandum, was presented to Drs. O'Neill and Dollar. An additional meeting has been scheduled with Dr. O'Neill for 11/2/81, at which time further discussion will be held concerning the transfer of informant files to NARS.

II. FBI'S JUSTIFICATION FOR PERMANENTLY RETAINING INFORMANT FILES

There are numerous reasons for not transferring informant files to NARS. Specific reasons are outlined below:

- A. The obvious chilling effect which would result when our informants learn that their files will be transferred to NARS and subject at some future time to public scrutiny.
- B. The potential danger to our informants and assets and/or their descendents when the fact that they had operated as an informant for the FBI was publicly disclosed.
- C. The disclosure of information to the public regarding the methods by which the FBI operated informants would damage future informant operations by the FBI and harm the law enforcement and intelligence communities.
- D. By the FBI's turning over informant files to NARS, a precedent would be set which no doubt would carry over to Federal law enforcement and other agencies of the intelligence community. In this connection, the Central Intelligence Agency has already expressed concern informally.

III. LEGAL AUTHORITY OF THE ARCHIVIST TO REQUIRE THE DIRECTOR OF THE FBI AND/OR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO TRANSFER RECORDS TO NARS

The following background concerning the provisions of Title 44, United States Code, Sections 2103 and 2104 and related case law was provided by the Legal Counsel Division:

Pursuant to Title 44, United States Code, Section 2103, the Administrator of the General Services Administration may direct and effect the transfer to the National Archives of the United States of records of any Federal agency that have been in existence for more than thirty years and which have been determined by the Archivist of the United States to have sufficient historial or other value to warrant their continued preservation by the United States Government, unless the head of the agency which has custody of the records certifies in writing to the Administrator that they must be retained in the agency's custody for use in the conduct of the regular current business of the agency.

Once transferred to the National Archives, the Administrator of the General Services Administration, pursuant to Title 44, United States Code, Section 2104, is responsible for the custody, use and withdrawl of records transferred to him. However, this custody may be subject to certain statutory restrictions which are applicable to the head of the agency which originally had custody of the records. Secondly, the head of the agency transferring records to the National Archives may place certain restrictions on the use and access to these records, provided the Administrator of the General Services Administration concurs in those restrictions. The above section, however, does not indicate what avenue is available to the agency head involved if the Administrator does not concur in the restrictions imposed.

The only applicable case law in this area is <u>"American Friends Service Committee, et al., v. William H. Webster, et al.," 494 F. Supp. 803 (D.D.C. 1980) which holds that failure of the Administrator to perform the above duties gives rise to judicial review to redress such abuse of discretion.</u>

### IV. POSSIBLE SCENARIO SHOULD THE FBI REFUSE TO TRANSFER INFORMANT FILES TO NARS

A. Should the FBI refuse to transfer informant files to NARS even after an extended period of time, the Archivist, acting under his current authority, could compel either the Director of the FBI or the Attorney General to transfer these files.

B. U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene, after reviewing the NARS proposed retention schedules and the FBI's proposed disposition schedules in connection with the above-cited civil matter may order that the FBI transfer informant files to NARS at a given time. Judge Greene has generally held that the Archivist of the United States has not exerted his statutory authority over the FBI with regard to the disposition of FBI records. He has also stated that the FBI historically has been able to manipulate and coerce NARS to acquiesce to the FBI's position concerning records disposition. Realistically we must expect that Judge Greene would rule in favor of whatever transfer period NARS establishes for informant files. Should this be the case, the only alternative would be to appeal Judge Greene's Order.

Part III of this memorandum has been provided by Legal Counsel Division.

Legal Counsel Addendum: WR: don 11/4/81

It is recommended that the Director be advised of the following possible scenario along with those listed on page 6 of the above memorandum. Should the Attorney General certify in writing to the Administrator of General Services, pursuant to Title 44, United States Code, Section 2103, that these files must be retained in the Department of Justice's custody for use in the conduct of the regular current business of the department, then the Administrator of General Services or his designee, the Archivist of the United States, would not have authority to direct the transfer of these files. It should be noted that the NARS believes that such a certification once made can still be rejected by the Archivist. Further, the possibility exists that either NARS or the plaintiffs could seek from United States District Judge Harold H. Greene a determination of whether the Attorney General's certification can be overruled by the Archivist or if not whether the Attorney General's action is arbitrary and capricious.

Dear Bob:

Thank you for taking the time for me to review with you and Bob Scherrer the overall progress of the NARS FBI Appraisal Project and to share with you our initial reactions to the draft S.F. 115 submitted to NARS on October 6, 1981. The discussion cleared up some ambiguities and identified several critical areas where the position of NARS differs from that of the FBI. Although these differences involve differing agency concerns, the draft S.F. 115 by and large reflects the recommended disposition instructions NARS submitted to the FBI on September 28, 1981.

Since we have not yet received all of the written comments of the non-Government experts, both our records retention plan and your draft S.F. 115 are still subject to revision and modification. As I indicated to you, the non-Government experts tend to favor retention of all index cards and numerical abstracts. I recognize there are several problems when the case files associated with the retained index cards have been authorized for disposal. I plan to examine in more detail than I did earlier both the index cards and the numerical abstracts.

You will recall that our draft records retention plan called for a transfer of permanently valuable FBI records to NARS 30 years after the closing of such records. Your draft S.F. 115 with a few exceptions sets the transfer date at 50 years. As you know, the Federal Records Act (44 U.S.C., par. 2104) stipulates that the Administrator of General Services Administration (this authority has been delegated to the Archivist of the United States) may effect the transfer of permanently valuable records when they are 30 years old. This portion of the statute also provides for a delay in transferring records that must be retained "for use in the conduct of the regular current business of the agency." It will be necessary to document that the records are needed for the conducting of regular business before agreeing to the retention of the records after they are 30 years old.

I expect that it would not be difficult to document this for some classifications; for other classifications, especially those that are obsolete, it would be very difficult. To reiterate a point made in our discussion, I think there is merit in the FBI transferring records in some classifications before they are 50 years old. Listed below are categories is in the of case files and other material where such a transfer would seem to be in the interest of all concerned--the FBI, NARS and researchers.

1. Selected obsolete classifications - 13, 19, 21, 22, 30, 34, 37, 41, 53, 57, 59, 68, 83, 84, 85, 96 and 99

2. Case files from classifications 7, 25, 26, 42, 44, and 91

- 3. Nazi saboteur album (Quantico)
- 4. Interesting case summaries

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5. 62-24172 "FBI Early History" 62-504 & 62-1184 "Palmer Raids" 62-29777 "John Dillinger" 66-1723-1 "WW II History of the Bureau"

A matter of particular concern is that the S.F. 115 calls for the permanent retention by the FBI of informant case files and "informant-related" case files. The latter requires an explicit definition acceptable to NARS. Bob Sherrer's affidavit of April 22, 1981, offers a definition of a criminal informant and asset (see paragraphs 4 and 5, especially) that is both reasonable and defensible. It is our understanding, therefore, that this narrow definition of "informant" will be followed in implementing the S.F. 115.

The matter of the FBI permanently retaining all informant and "informantrelated" case files is troublesome. We understand your concerns about the possible impact--the "chilling effect"--that transfer of such case files in the foreseeable future to NARS might have on informants, and we are sympathetic with those concerns. Nevertheless, we believe that a date for transfer, however distant, would be desirable. We would be quite willing to discuss a lengthy period of time for informants involved in foreign counterintelligence whose family and descendents might reside in a country unfriendly to the United States and for organized crime informants whose descendents' lives might be jeopardized.

We were somewhat surprised that our definition of a multisection file was changed from two sections to four sections. I assume that four was chosen because it is the high side of one of the volume measures on the data collection sheet. Our analysis of the data base indicates that the breaking point is closer to two sections than to four sections. We believe that a prudent course of action is to err on the conservative side. Since the multisection measure was intended in part to identify unnamed "exceptional cases," it is important that the lower figure be used. Consequently, our original definition of a multisection file as consisting of two or more sections must be retained.

The other remaining issue we discussed that merits attention is legat files. If I correctly understood Bob Scherrer's comments, he questions the accuracy of our assessment of these files and would like to review some of the case files we examined. I have asked Charles Dollar to get this information together and deliver it to Bob within the next day or so.


As we noted in our conversation, there are several places in your draft S.F. 115 where our instructions were not correctly interpreted or where our instructions were inconsistent. We are in the process of correcting these "errors" and "omissions" and will incorporate the corrections into a final draft we will forward to you for your review. In this context, I should point out that the final draft will contain detailed recommendations about implementing the schedule and monitoring adherence to the criteria for identifying "exceptional cases."

In response to the Bureau's request to make an archivist available to review documentary evidence relating to two pending cases, Ed Barrese of the FBI Appraisal Project Staff evaluated the materials in the Bureau's Headquarters offices on November 4, 1981.

The first case involves alleged unauthorized withdrawals of funds from a credit union. The office of origin is Columbia, South Carolina and the Field Office case file number is 91C-4364. The evidence reviewed consists of a small collection of withdrawal slips which the victim institution wants returned. The second case concerns a request for a passport using a false identity. The office of origin is Salt Lake City and the Field Office case file number is 40-17. The evidence reviewed consists of a briefcase containing pills, vacation photos, credit cards, checks, address books, travel brochures, bills, and a few business papers.

Under the criteria the Task Force has followed in appraising FBI records neither the evidence nor the related case files have sufficient research value to warrant preservation in the National Archives. In addition, neither case deviates from established Bureau procedures and consequently would not document important changes in investigative methodology.

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The evidence may be returned without duplication, since the records retention plan recently submitted to the FBI provides for preservation of a substantial number of Bureau case files from classifications: 40 and 91. I believe that the case files to be retained under the records retention plan will be sufficient to meet the anticipated needs of researchers,

Pursuant to the August 26, 1981, Order of U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene in the civil matter "American Friends Service Committee, et al., v. William H. Webster, et al.," U.S. District Court, Washington, D. C., Civil Action Number 79-1655, I am writing to request that you make an archivist available to the FBI Honolulu Office to review a volume of documentary evidence consisting of video tapes of copyrighted films, which, by Order of the U.S. District Court, Honolulu, Hawaii, may be destroyed and/or erased and utilized by the Government.

The case involved is cantioned, aka "Red"; ITOM; ITSP; RICO (A); OO: Honolulu," Honolulu file 183A-105, FBI Headquarters file 145-5882.

By way of background, on August 15, 1980, a ten count indictment was returned by the Federal Grand Jury, Honolulu, charging the subjects with Conspiracy, Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property, Child Pornography, and Copyright violations. On February 5, 1981, subjects pled guilty in U.S. District Court, Honolulu, to four counts, including Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property, Child Pornography, Conspiracy and Copyright violations. In entering guilty pleas, subjects agreed to forfeit all equipment involved in video reproductions of major motion (7) pictures and pornography.

Subsequent to the indictments and issuance of search warrants, a large number of video tapes of copyrighted films were seized. A subsequent Order was issued by U. S. District Court, Honolulu, upon completion of trial and sentencing, that the video tapes of copyrighted films be forfeited to the Government and Exec AD Inv. \_could be either destroyed or erased and the tapes made use of by

NARS also noted that several archivists had been RIF'd and the availability of qualified archivists was limited. During discussions with NARS, Dr. Charles Dollar, Deputy Director of the FBI Appraisal Project, advised he would be traveling on personal business through the midwest during the week of 1/10/82, and would pass through Chicago during the evening of 1/12/82, on his return to Washington. Dr. Dollar volunteered to stop over in Chicago and visit the Chicago Office on 1/13/82, in order to review the documentary evidence, provided the FBI would pay his per diem expenses during the period of his stay in Chicago (1/12-13/82). Since Dr. Dollar's visit to the Chicago Office to examine documentary evidence will be of definite benefit to the FBI, his per diem expenses for the period 1/12-13/82 will be paid by the FBI from Records Management Division's account.

This matter was coordinated with Inspector-Deputy Assistant Director Clyde Groover, Administrative Services Division, and with the Chicago Office.

On 12/13/81, Mr. Robert Matchette, Navy and Old Army Branch, NARS, advised that as a result of the new guidelines, the 246,000 page backlog had been reduced to 10,000 pages located in the Declassification Branch.
