Reduic thorage and foring Ton any is a sla-slow, flat-roofed warehouse of reinforced concente and inick with lazze white and polycarome clauding and sculpture on the first and second stories of the west facade (street). The building is square snayed on a rechangular lot, with a one-story commercial publish, abutting the north side. built in neoclassical Tryptian style, most of the structure's floude projects slightly so that a butterd-sall effect is achieved. In polychrome teracotts cavetto cornice decorated with scrabe was removed in 1971 due to lightning damage and croud support: which indusped its collagse and that of the upper story fecade. (A frame of the cornice has been preserved in the warehouse.)

The ground story of white terms cotta slabs consists of five columns with polychrone collides of salm frames and lotus flowers and buds; the lower section of the shofts, without bases are sculpted lotus and papyrus rising from waters, represented by a saw-to-thod pattern. Deduced the columns and at the endy of the faced are five window and a doorway-encit terestal and renorming a tempor what a tice norizental terms cotts transom bar decorated with scarars and learning the words, "Recbie"(appears above windows at each end), "Fire roor", "Storage", the falless, and "kenovals". Senesth the sills of the two end windows, the leaf and papyrus design and its background become convex near the street pavement. Senesth the other three sills is wrought from work with spear-headed rails. Ground story windows are place glass.

The doorway includes a bronte door with plite glass inset and the following iron work: roll or rope-like molding and lotted and papyrus in grids in front of the sidelights and lower transom. The enframement for the doorway and two transoms is polychrome slabs and molded terms cotta. Feside the two transoms are two plaques (two heads cach) of the com-corrud Egyptien goddess Hathor, two searchs and two statues of pharach nameses II abop two encased prion-snaped pedestals. Each state wears the royal striped headdress, the kilt with cartouche buckle bearing the name in nieroglyphs, and carries a djed pillar (protection) and flail (authority). Toth statues and pedestals are joined to the terms cotta facade slabs.

Hieroglyphs on the front of the pedestal of the left statue are translated: "Forever I work for all of your regions in daylight and darkness"; the other, "I give protection to your furniture". Each side reads, "Reeble Frother" (Each pharach represents William and John, the founders).

The white terra cotts architrave has two molded scarabs. Formerly. "W.C. Roebie & Brother" appeared in the area between the scarabs.

The cornice between the ground and second stories bears a winged screent and sun disk and a partial heker (Egyptian royalty) pattern stretching across the length of the cornice.

of the 20 smaller recessed such windows of the facade, the four across the second story are designed with terra cotta roll or rope-like molaing and a winged scarab cavatto cornice window need. Also part of the enframement are two paryrus stems rising to the top of the cornics, and the papyrus heads extent beyond the cornier top.

Interior

The interior walls and denorative elements are planter compounds of v. rious textures and coloring.

The enclosed forer contrins from roll or ross-like molving and lotus and papyrus in gridwork on both sider of the inner braze door's sidelights. A tiffeng-tr o language of letts bude and fixed windows of letts and papyrus stoined glass and clear papes are also part of the enclosure. lobby side of the door beers a painted molded-plaster uninged sceres above the iron molding.

The warehouse lobby used and derigned an office space, contains four columns and abaci supporting a square section of recogned ceiling tand is recessed to hold a conscaled lighting track for illuminating the partial heker (Wrestien moyalty) pattern.

The cepitals are stylistic paperus and lotus with geometric and foliate forms; the length of such shaft is decorated with four no row strips topped with a leaf near the lowest case of the capital.

The southeast corner of the office is enclosed by a right-angular shaped counter with a rounded corner and a tlack marrie top. In wall of the counter is molded plaster in a repetitive pultern of steam, lotus bods and payvrus rising from a sau-hoothed pattern representing water. Above the design is a roll or rore-like moluing. A gate of brake designed with the two plants in a grid allows access to the enclosed area. The same design uppraise in icon in front of 411 ground story windows; the four on the south wall are framed by the roll or rope-like molding in plaster.

On each of the four walls are two rectangular engaged columns, like pilasters, with molded plaster lotus and papyrus on stalks stretching the length of the column. Firther three lotus or three panyrus plants decorate the columns. Ectween the upper Sections of the columns are 31 placter plaques of four different designs. There are 12 plaques with two identical heads each of the con-earred goldess Hathor with pylon headdress, and 12 with serpontine headdress (one plaque contains only one head so as to fit in a corner on the west wall). These plaques have a bottom

border of margnerites and mandrake roots.

Four sun bark panels deviat the same sail since in the microlypha translated: "Marsike pulls the daytime bork of he (the sun) again the lastern horizon, and hot (rod of the moon) turns to be in the sky. The sunlight reaches the welks of the pyramids and sails swiftly across the sky."

Three Rile bark penels depict the scene require: "Schold the cargoes swiftly sent upon the Nile Clood (the rod har!) in the time of the phoraons. Behold, here is the ship's captin salating the Lymptim conv. Upper Egyptian burley consigned to the belta is transported upon the Mile flood. Echold here is burley received in exchange for the game of the Aegean Islanders." Tenesth all panels is a concealed brock for lighting.

Two deers leading to the per-mouse are adorned with placter infrarements of real or logi-like molding and segret on a lintel-like form.

The vault for valuables consists of a bronze coor and whom frame with a tiffany-like lotus and lintern and winted specific cornice accessful or repe-like mulding adorns the pilaster-like projection that is part of the aufremement.


The north well contains panels of stained glace of lotus and paperus design and panels of clear panes. Five sections of glass are mixed stained and clear glass.

Alterations occurred on the exterior; brickwork on the upper four storic; was replaced when the cornice atop the structure was removed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This example of neoclassical Example architecture is unique in its terms cotta craftsmanship and its conception; namely, the morning business and security theme is carried out on the interior as well as the exterior. resigns were not merely copied, as is true of army existing examples of this generally eclectic style, but were imaginatively created and particularised for the deeble brothers. No other building of this true in Chicago it as elaborate in its detail and polycorome work, and wereaps vary few others in the nation are as whimsical or hour as much asserm for the ancient egyptian language or mythology.

Other than the removal of the upper cornice, the upper care of the interior and exterior remains to it was in 1923. Moveyer, vandalish to the terra cotta real stars on the exterior warrants restoration before carrags becomes too acute to deal with. Replacement of the cornics would complete the effect meant to be achieved during the Egyptian revival

Since terra cotta structures have passed as an era of architectural history and since the craftsmasship involved is now reaced to call our some or in the 'oftad State -- Canding clean-it seems in a specimens of this type should be evaluated. Also, since the use of the building has not changed, the "Newption" form has brilly followed function.

The building stands is a monument to the Raeble family, who sold the building in 1973, and to Fritz Albert, the Worth Western Wera Cotta Company sculptor (from the 1920's to 1930) who was responsible for the cerigo of the decorative elements and hierorlyons. That seems to be his own knowled, so of hieroglyphs and sources, as evidenced by other recently found works, makes the structure an even more personalized endeavor.

The consistent quality of the sculptural elements cannot be overlooked, even if they are not "high" art, nor can the craftmanship of the terra cotts processes be reparated from the sculptor's conception to belance an eclection style and an ancient source.
