Dear Los Angeles Charter Leaders,

We write with today's updates and news coverage on the eve leading up to the sixth weekday of the UTLA strike in LAUSD schools, including the ongoing negotiations at City Hall, UTLA's announcements of activities next week, and notable stories that appeared over the weekend in the media.

- · Most importantly, please know:
  - We will continue daily 5pm member calls until the strike ends. We will send calendar invites tomorrow morning for tomorrow.
  - UTLA will strike tomorrow no matter what happens at the bargaining table tonight or tomorrow morning.
  - We should be prepared for an announcement at any time regarding "gives" on charter policy to help secure
    a deal and end the strike. While we are making every effort to fight back against such a "give" we know that
    the pressure being put on electeds related to charter policy is immense. We must be ready to mobilize as
    needed.
  - We therefore ask that you monitor your email throughout the day for critical bargaining updates.

Bargaining between LAUSD and UTLA is ongoing, and the process for approving a deal could prolong a strike. While the two sides spent more than 50 hours at the bargaining table, in confidential talks brokered by the Mayor and City Hall over the last 5 days, they have not reached a deal. Amidst the speculation on when a deal could appear, the union leadership noted that they would continue the strike until their full membership had a chance to vote on a new agreement. Bargaining is expected to continue at City Hall until a deal is reached. If a deal is reached tonight or tomorrow, UTLA has made it clear that there will still be a strike tomorrow while members ratify their contract. It is important to not that we should be prepared for the strike to continue throughout the week.

UTLA will hold another all-member rally in Grand Park tomorrow at 10:30am. UTLA members will again march from Grand Park to LAUSD headquarters at the Beaudry building, which may take activity away from picket lines in the afternoon. They are framing that this may be a rally to keep pushing for their contract, or a way to celebrate their win before going back to the classroom.
