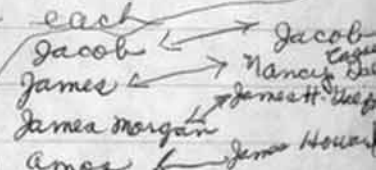

Margaret Ann Cassell, the wife of James Cassell, deceased, died in her 85th year at the home of H. L. Kesler, where she has made her home since 1886. She had been a member of the Southern Methodist Church for a number of years. Her illness was long and with the infirmities of old age made her suffering too great for her to stand. The end came peacefully though her suffering was intense. She expressed her willingness & desire to be free from this prison house and join those on the other side where old age & infirmities is not known. Aunt Margaret leaves a host of friends & relatives, 9 children all living, 60 grand children, with 7 dead & 52 great grandchildren with 5 dead. A few days before her death she requested that her old pastor, Rev. H. O. Burr, should preach her funeral at the home and that all her burial fixtures should be plain. Her wishes were carried out. Rev. Burr preached to a large crowd from the 4th Chapter & 9th verse of Hebrews, after which her remains were laid to rest by the side of her husband to wait the resurrection morning.

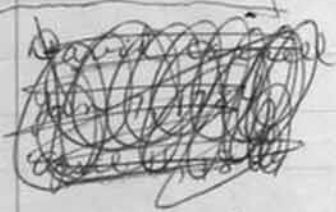

Mrs. Rachel Swink

On April 14, 1925, Mrs. Rachel Swink, a well known resident of the Wanless Community, near Cass, passed to her reward. Her maiden name was Cassell. She spent her entire life in that community. At the time of her death she lacked one month of being 68 years of age.

On October 5, 1876 she was united in marriage to Z. J. Swink by Rev. H. M. Strickler. Two sons, Charles L. and Price L. survive her. One child died in infancy. She had six sisters, four of whom survive her and one brother who died a year ago.

Mrs. Swink was converted in 1882, during the ministry of Rev. L. Fox and united with the Greendank M. E. Church South. In 1888 when a church was organized at Wanless under the ministry of Rev. W. H. Ballengee she transferred her membership to that church.

She lived a consecrated Christian life. She was always at the service of her church, day or night, summer or winter as long as her health permitted. During almost all her Christian life she was a Sunday School teacher. Her home was the preacher's home. For many years she had been a subscriber to the Baltimore Southern Methodist. She loved her Bible and read it through several times. She delighted in the companionship of God's people. When the Christians

of the community gathered at her home for worship. When she could no longer attend church she would give expression to her joy in shouts of praise.

In the autumn of 1922 she was paralyzed. Since then she had been practically helpless, she could not even change her position in bed without assistance. During her illness of two and one half years her son Charles and his wife cared for her day and night with a devotion that was most beautiful and praiseworthy. With the exception of one day Charles had not been out of her presence over four hours at a time.

Mrs. Swink had an attack of flu about two weeks before her death from which she could not rally. Her death was sudden.

The funeral service was conducted at the Wanless Church by Rev. L. E. Shires assisted by Rev. Fred Gray on April 16 after which she was laid to rest in the Wanless Cemetery to await the resurrection.
